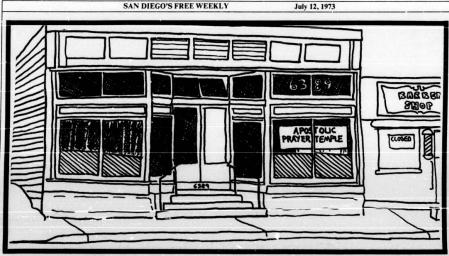

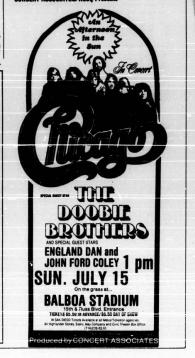

This is an aristocracy alienated not only from work, as all aristocracies, are, but from the responsibilities of leadership as well. They do not believe in God or the Devil, they do not believe life has any meaning at all; it is just an aimless meaning at all; it is just an aimless though amusing party, which one had better enjoy while one may, before youth passes by and the body begins to rot. All these two party-goers have is each other, and there is a deep poignancy to their relationship—so strong and yet so effish, so desporate so description. so desperate, so devouring. In this play, Noel Coward gave

us the supreme expression in dramatic literature of a world view that has become epidemic in the Western world, one which is by no means confined to the class of the means confined to the class of the idle rich. That, along with the play's wittiness, perhaps accounts for its staying power. The audience at the Carter not only laughed continually during the performance; they seemed genuinely moves. The present production is fortunate in having H.L. Mark Dempsey and Jennifer Henn in the principal roles, an actor and an actress of exceptional endowments. How elegant they look, how wittily they talk, how ferociously they fight, how repulsively snobbish they seem, and how pathetically vulnerable! How beautifully, ex-pressively flippant they are pressively flippant they are throughout-responding with the most delicate sensitivity to Coward's text and to the expert master at modern British comedy

The audience is well served by this production, and so is Noel Co ard—or his ghost. That ghost. flitting about the spirit world in an etherial tuxedo, must smile a wry assent when he hears once again Elyot Chase's command to be flip-pant. Being flippant was the essence of his art, and it was also his way of life. It was the only way he knew of staving off the desperate suffering that comes from total loneliness and total skepticism. 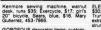
