

During fielding practice before the first game of the 1962 World Series between the American League champion New York Yankees and the National League champion San Francisco Giants, a ten year old boy sitting in the Yankee Stadium bleachers called Mantle that he had come to see which of the centerfielders. Mantle or Giant great Willie Mays, was

out to Yankee centerfielder Mickey better. In the top of the fifth inning, after both Mantle and Mays had struck out, Mantle heard the young voice yell that he had changed his mind and was now trying to decide which centerfielder was worse. When the final out was recorded ending a game in which both Mantle and Mays had played feeble parts, a tiny voice could be heard over the Stadium roar screaming, "Hey, Mantle, you win."

Mickey Mantle was one of the

handsomest baseball players ever to play the game. Besides this, he fifteen individual major league baseball records, played in more signed than any other New York Yankee, and once co-owned with deLaughlin, California Hardteammates Whitey Ford and Yogi edge/Minimalist/Abstract painter Berra, the largest bowling alley in New Jersey. 


