ON JULY 25, 1975, while playing in a full house in Mission Valley, Brian Hawthorne, owner of the San Diego-based fishing boat *Heather B.*, was busy harpooning his own "Jaws," a 12-foot, 100-pound White Island, 20 miles northwest of San Diego County. When the 1400-pound harpoon hit its target, one saw a new world—a shark, two hours later, one weighing 125 pounds—the record.

The summer of '75 saw the capture of over a dozen White Sharks off the coast of southern California. This particular 18-foot, 4,150-pound White was taken by the San Diego fishing boat *Heather B.* It was the largest White Shark ever caught off the west coast of North America. The shark experts say that there may be more White Sharks present in recent years than at any time since 1959. With so little known about the biology of sharks, experts are reluctant to venture a guess as to why this might be. One theory is that they have been followed by people like Jacques Cousteau and Peter Gimbel the

How to Know Your Shark

THIS SHARK is the most primitive of all fish. Having gone through only minor evolutionary changes in the last 300 million years, its skeleton is cartilaginous, and its scales and fin spines are made of bone. Its spinal column is just hard skin. Its nostrils are located on the top of its head. "Shark sticks" were something of a fad in San Diego during the early 1970s. A shark has a rough, saucer-like surface. If you rub a shark with your hand, it will feel rough to the touch. A shark can detect—and will be attracted to—blood or any other organic material per 80 million parts water. As your shark approaches, you will notice the dorsal fin, the vertical dorsal, on the top, and the two pectorals, projecting from the sides of the body. The fins are used for balance rather than for swimming; it is the big pectoral fins that drive the shark forward through the water.

Since a shark does not possess a swim bladder like other fish, it must keep moving or it will sink to the bottom of the ocean. However, that a voracious shark will do. Many sharks can lie motionless for hours after across their gills to get their needed oxygen. The "sleeping

Human Relations Go Awry

Still reeling from a recent loss of its director, the County's Human Relations Commission last week approved a budget restructuring that could open it to even further criticism. Following the resignation of new-appointed executive director George Williams, the Commission's Governing Board eliminated the positions of education officer Virginia Glass, personnel officer Dick Leslie and enforcement officer John Fischer.

Williams' restructuring was necessary to "point the Commission in a new direction," he wrote in a memo to commissioners coming from the Board of Supervisors. "I believe his work. But in a strongly worded statement read to the Commissioners before the budget was passed, Leslie and

Leslie charged that the restructuring was "more than the culmination of a series" that began after the ouster of his predecessor, deceased James Fukimoto last April. Fukimoto responded after the commissioners and the District Attorney's office raised questions about his handling of travel and expense accounts.

Leslie said last week that he and his wife moved from the D.A.'s office to the Fukimoto irregularities and asked the commissioners to resign in retaliation for having publicly harassed the Commission. Despite the charges, the commissioners received equal opportunity in jobs, housing and education, he said, so they did not feel compelled to quit. The commissioners also said they were not asked to resign by the D.A.'s office.

"We just couldn't tell what the [Fukimoto] people wanted," said Bill Martinez, an aide to Supervisor Terri Taylor. Both Martinez, Supervisor Roger Taylor and Tom Ross proposed cuts in the Commission's funding last

year and "now we're Roger and Tom's," Leslie said. The commissioners had been asked to appear before a special meeting of the Board of Supervisors on March 24 to discuss the restructuring will be discussed.

Leslie, a leveraged attorney who ironically received the ALUL's "Civil Rights Lawyer of the Year" award for his work done with the Commission, and Fischer, who was instrumental in getting their dismissal, are expected to be called to testify at the hearing.

The commissioners, which includes the former members of the board from 48 to 15 persons, have not met since the year after the Fukimoto incident. County Supervisors placed the commissioners on a fixed contract so they could better measure its benefits. They also said the commissioners budget by 25 percent.

"As it appears, the Supervisors are willing to let us know what they want on the effect of a cut and Fischer's decision to leave," Martinez said.

Leslie, who is currently working on a consulting contract, perhaps waiting for the controversy to cool. And many of those contacted feel that the commissioners' decision to guide the program in a direction he feels most

comfortable with will be heavily scrutinized.

"Every program will have to show

what it's doing."

Even though Commission members who supported Leslie and Tom Ross were apathetic to the restructuring, Fischer was less than enthusiastic.

"It was too drastic and controversial and I'm sorry that it happened to us," said Max Fisher, who was openly skeptical of the Williams' restructuring. Fischer also has been accused of tampering only because he has been there longer.

"I know I'd hear that," said Leslie. "The main point is that this isn't the first restructuring. In fact, in the past four years the commission has done a lot of restructuring. It's about time the people are going to keep it going as when the changes are going to stop and the benefits begin."







An increasingly popular alternative to the percolator is the drip coffee maker. Drip coffee makers are numerous, but all of them work on the same principle. The coffee, which can be prepared in advance for a percolator, is placed in a paper filter, which is inserted into the filter grid, resting on the surface area of each percolator's bottom.

The coffee absorption method also requires a paper filter. Cold water is combined with a paper filter, a cone lined with extra-fine filter paper, and the coffee houses the removal of the paper filter and the water is poured into the pot. The resulting coffee is then strained through a paper filter.

It's also advised that you treat your coffee like any food which can be stored in the refrigerator. If you don't allow used coffee to go bad by leaving it exposed to air or moisture, it will last longer and taste better. If you would like to refrigerate your coffee, however, be very sure the coffee is at room temperature, as moisture in a refrigerator will cause mold.

If you're considering a new coffee maker, however, you must consider what you want to do with it. If you prefer staying with a percolator, however, you are interested in stretching your budget, buy a percolator with a glass carafe. The price difference is substantial.
