He doesn't look like a rain-maker. Bald and big, middle-aged and round, John Kenton walks with a cane. He could no walk without it. He could no walk without it.

But he claims he can bring water to parched California, and end the process of unemployment, solve the energy crisis, make productive soil out of waste land, and end the U.S. of typhoons and floods forever—all at no cost to the taxpayer.

But no one's listening.

For the last eight years, Kenton has been a high-profile living in Encino, has lectured at high schools and universities, written syndicated news and talk shows, and even written Presidents Nixon and Ford. He has a proposal and a plan that he terms "too practical to be believable."

Scientists, engineers, and manufacturers are attempting to understand the Kenton's know-how, but Kenton wants to do things the way he believes "intuitively," he says.

It involves moving a mountain. Or rather, part of one.

"I want to take out the mountain west of San Pablo Bay in San Francisco," Kenton says. "It's the wettest, the moist ocean air, salt particles, and smog (the combination) that causes the most rain inland. At night when it got cold, the moisture would fall in the form of fog."

Kenton's idea hinges on the concept of orographic rain. As the moist air from the Pacific falls over the mountains to rise, as over a mountain range, the water vapor becomes a cloud. As the air rises, it ascends, the heavy load of water deposited part way up the mountain slope produces a rain shadow on the other side of the mountain, where there is little rain. This is largely the reason for the Mojave Desert, "the driest place in the world," Kenton says, the San Bernardino Mountains.)

"My plan began 36 days left."

After a year of research, everything was green and came out west where all the country was dry, Kenton says. "I asked myself, 'I wondered—why can't they make it rain here? Then, in the back of my mind, I thought, Hawaii where it rained every night. The head meteorologist at the time said, 'No, it can't rain there.' So I started/envisioning how that orographic rainfall could work for California and the rest of the U.S."

According to Kenton, the removal of mountain storm fronts across the country by removing low pressure areas will stop the "lazy boys," he says. "They do things the easy way. They head straight to a low pressure area and sit there until cold front keeps storm churning, and rain would cost a huge expense, instead of flood damage."

"When the eye of a storm moves into a mountain cut, it not only goes through the mountain that's been there for centuries. Instead, that mountain is going to move right out of the way of the winds," he explained. "The storm becomes nothing but rain, sun, and moves inward."

The Canadian cut would divert the winds to the open ocean. "Strong winds will go around Puget Sound region with gale force winds, will catch storms coming out of Canada, and take them eastward to the Atlantic Ocean. There they will be turned southward by the North Atlantic Current, which is mostly tropical storms," he said.

"This will prevent all deep snow and snow and smog from New York City. "We only want to move it to the coast, so that we can do two things: one is to continue right of way, and the other is to give us more go-ahead. We want Big Money. That's the trouble with our government now. It's too big. Get it back to the people, and back to our founding fathers Free enterprise."
