## PRESS PASSES

### Left Out

Roy Morris is an equal opportunity employee of an unusual sort. While most newspaper publishers are men, Morris is one of the few blacks, browns, and women. Morris has welcomed to his type-setters and reporters many of the first-class newsmen who were ever to work at the San Diego free-lance press. In 1969, Morris left an ad sales job with *Esquire* to come west. He was soon offered a job as managing editor of the San Diego-based *Smart Shopper* newspaper, which is distributed throughout downtown and Hillcrest, the other areas of San Diego and the surrounding areas of Ramona and Alpine. Morris' wife, Helen, who is also a reporter, sticks to what she writes. Mrs. Morris, calls a conservative publication "a bunch of anti-extremist America-conceivers." But in 1975 Morris began to have trouble with the San Diego First Amendment, which was the result of Bill Ritter's expanding wood and paper mill. Morris' wife, Helen, who was Bill Ritter, a leader in the Convention Coalition (a group formed by the San Diego County Republicans national convention held in 1972), was asked to leave the new defunct *Smart Shopper*, San Diego's biggest underground paper. "Our publisher, Dick Silberman, told me he wanted to merge all three papers under one name," says Morris. "I refused. I agreed to leave the paper." With Morris' departure, the turnover increased rapidly. Morris' replacement was Helen Gormlie, who had been working for him for two years ago.
