If the John Birch Society didn't like the thought of fluoride in the drinking water, wait till they hear about B-1 in the booze. That proposal — to supplement the nation's a locoholic beverages with the vitamin thaimine — is the brainchild of two UCSD researchers who expand upon it brainchild of two UCSLI researchers who expand upon it in the August 10th issue of the prestigious New England Journal of Medicine. According to epidemiologist Michael H. Crigui and Strandon Centervall, at least 1200 alcoholics are institutionalized every year nationwide as a result of a devastatine neurological evastating neurological lisease called the disease called the Wernicke-Korsakoff Syndrome (in its advanced stages, the disease causes irreversible brain damage and severe amnesia). The researchers note annesia). The researchers note that patients who develop the syndrome tend to use alcohol as their main source of nourishment — but an adequate amount of thiamine in the diet can prevent the disease. Thus, the men figure that while the annual care for the syndrome's victims amounts to about \$70 million a year, it could cost as little as three million dollars a year to fortify all acholoic beverages with B-1. If alcohol distributors passed on the cost intermediate them.

with B-1. If alcohol distributors passed on the cost to consumers, the researchers figure wine would cost only a petny or two more per quart. Although food producers already add thiamine to some bread, milk, and other common products, Centerwall says he and Criqui don't yet know whether drinkers will be able to taste the recommended supplement in their cocktails, so in the next few months the men will work with a number of taste-testing panels. Results will determine whether they press the issue politically, the medical student says. Opposition to the plan already has emerged, however, via a spokesman for the alcohol industry. According to Centerwall, the spokesman "said they'd be opposed to the idea on the grounds that it

In 1980 the pipe organ in Balboa Park that John Spreckels donated to the people of San Diego will be sixty-five years old. Built for some \$35,000 and housed in one of only two structures. only two structures intended to remain intact after the 1915 exposition in Balboa Park (the other one is the California Tower), the organ has never really had a major overhaul But the dusty old bag of whistles may now be in for restoration and maybe even addition of new, post-1915 musical capabilities. Revitalization doesn't promiseffort, however.
The Committee of 100, which is dedicated to the

preservation of the Spanish Colonial architecture in the colonial architecture in the park, sparked the rejuvenation drive with their plan to revamp the organ pavilion structure at a cost just under a million dollars. But the committee is staying out of the effort to revitalize the instrument itself. revitalize the instrument itself, which is the largest outdoor organ in the world, according to afictionados. One of these, Edward Barr, reasoned that it would make no sense to rebuild the structures around the organ without fixing up the instrument, so he is going strument, so he is going before the city council's Balboa Park Committee September 11 to tell of his intentions to rebuild it. Barr, who founded Organ Power Pizza, says his services as prime mover and fundraiser (he estimates it'll cost between \$150,000 and \$200,000) are contingent upon two prerequisites — that music

Blackinton is a pipe organ builder and is taking care of the instrument. Jacobsen is the organist. Both feel the organ is orimarily an historical instrument which should be maintained as a monument of artistic achievement in 1915. Jacobsen, who makes \$85.70 for his Sunday afternoon

men, Barr, Blackinton, and Jacobsen, are quick to point out they're not looking for a battle. A tour through the innards of the organ is a trip back to a time when mechanical marvels were just that — marvelous. The venerable old producer of "tuned thunder," proud in her intricacy and precision, resides behind a ten-ton steel door. Blackinton explains that the pipes, with the exception of the look of the pipes, with the exception of the look near their bottoms by the force of their own weight. The larger ones, which are as much sa thirty-five feet long, are as thirty-five feet long, are nade of zinc and are getting a little tired of standing up. The pipes are divided into four separate rooms, each room hooked up to a separate

Being a wind instrument, the organ requires a large volume of pressurized air to blow through the pipes. This is delivered by a twenty-horse power blower located in the asement of the building. The air is pumped up into the "chest," which is the nerve center of the instrument located above the basement but below the pipes. The chest is where much of the remodeling work would have to be done. To get into it you have to walk through an air lock. This is a small room that is sealed off from both the outside normal air pressure and the increased ressure inside the chest Depending on which way you're going, you get inside the lock, close the door, and open a small aperture to qualize the pressure. Going

in, the rush of air fills your ears, and you step into a room of varnished wood. If the organist is playing, a series of small sticks running across the

roof move back and forth, clattering as they open small valves and emit air into the pipes set in rows above. At the end of each stick, which is no

bigger than the fuselage of a fifteen-cent balsa wood glider is a leather diaphragm which collapses to move the stick. These are what need releathering. It was partially done in the early 1940s and some of the leathers have been patched, but most are very brittle and close to

disintegration.

Standing in the chest and listening to the wood and leather responding like tendons to the touch of the organist's fingers on the keys, you wonder at the ingenuity, the craftsmanship which carried this machine through six decades. It is true that a lot has happened, musically, since 1915. But Blackinton doesn't see that as a reason to supercharge the organ. He says, "This may well be one of the last remaining organs built on the artistic concepts of

Dear Matthew Alice: Why is there magnetic disturbance of as much as five degrees around San Clemente Island? Don Betts

That island, sixty miles west of San Diego, probably contains enough iron ore to attract your compass needle away from the magnetic pole where it would normally point. But that's only a guess. Nobody knows exactly what accounts for local deviations from the normal lines of magnetic force. Sun normal lines of magnetic force. Sun spots, solar wind, and eddies in the molten core of the earth are all said to affect the magnetic field, which itself is not aligned with the north and south poles of the earth. In this coastal region, of the earth. In this coastal region, magnetic lines generally point fourteen and a half degrees east of true north. Geologists call this difference between true north and magnetic north the declination, while navigators call it the variation. Local disturbances, listen ones around San Clemente Island and elsewhere, are called deviations. A mapphilished by the U.S. National Ocean Survey shows the deviation around San Clemente to be two degrees west of the Clemente to be two degrees west of the normal reading toward magnetic north. It is because of such deviations, incidently, that modern ships are equipped with gyrostatic compasses which do not depend on magnetism to find direction.





At official gourmet dinners, often served to a select few of critics and epicureans, guests are forbidden to have alcoholic beverages because they dull the palate. Lest anything detract from the main courses, appetizers are never served. Indeed, they are so fromeed upon that they have become the source of snobbery. Some food writers have labeled appetizers as a mark of inferior sensibility and have castigated hostesses for serving them before a large sit-down dinner. Purism saide (and l agree that too many appetizers can detract from the main

course), appetizers can be provocative, especially those from foreign lands. At Machupicchu and at El Chalan, both Peruvian restaurants, the anticuchos (marinated beef hearts), the escabeche (fried fish vinaigrette), and the papa rellena (stuffed, deep-fried potatoes) are more exciting than the entrees. To mention more familiar fare, few Americans fail to order egg rolls or spring rolls in Chinese restaurants, and crisply fried won tons often whet, rather than inhibit, appetite. Everyone is also familiar with Italian antipasto, consisting of olives, salami, cheese, lettuce, and tomato, all dripping with olive oil and vinegar dressing. I am also very partial to Greek appetizers, spanikopita, or spinach puffs, and taramosalata, made from red

Most Americans, however, do not associate Japanese cooking with appetizers, and I would like to suggest that you have an orgy at Kiyo's by trying

that you have an orgy at Klyo's by trying every appetizer on the menu. Unless you were told about Klyo's or chanced to be walking along Fifth Avenue, you would fall to know off existence. We had gyoza, or steamed fried dumpling filled with pork and vegetables (\$2); yakitori, or marinated chicken on a skewer (\$2,75); and sashimi, or sliced raw fish (\$3,25).

A word should be said about sashimi.

Eating raw fish is an acquired taste. Sashimi is not the same as raw fish which is marinated, as in ceviche, which tastes somewhat cooked due to its immersion in the marinade of lemowlime juice. The Japanese call fish that is completely raw. It is sliced thin and arranged in rows, often on a bed of shredded white radich, and always served with waushi, or hot green horseradish paste. The paste is then diluted with say succeed and the fish in diluted with say succeed and the fish and the paster of t is marinated, as in ceviche, which tastes expectation, very fresh raw fish does not taste "fishy," and if consumed in small quantity, refreshes the palate. To be sure, in Japan, sashimi is considered an excellent main dish, but for most of us, a

small order should suffice.

At Kiyo's we had a marvelous assortment of tuna, abalone, scallop, and red snapper, the last of which was curled like a flower. The cost was \$3.25, recently raised from \$2.25, and the disk was beautiful to behold as well as delicious. If you go to Kiyo's with a large party, be sure to order the sashimi, because one order will handily serve several people. The gyoza was also fine, and the yakitori as good as any I have eaten, including at Michi's in Escondido.

As for the main dishes, I ordered the tempura and my friend had the teriyaki beef. The beef comes in large or small orders, and I assure you that the small (\$3.95) will satisfy your appetite. Miso soup, made from fermented soy bean paste and tofu, or fresh bean cake, is served as the first course, and while it was sweeter than most, it was quite delicious. In addition, Kiyo's serves marinated fish and onions instead of "pickles," the generic name for pickled vegetables, such as Oriental cabbages, celery, chard, or mustard cabbage. The cooked, marinated

faulted, though it proved the least interesting of the dishes we ordered.

Alas, it wasn't until we were nearly finished that we saw an order of sushi (35.50) and regretted not having ordered it. In Japan, "sushi bars' are very common (they are the Japanese equivalent of American sandwich stands), and the of American sandwich stands), and the offering is vinegared rice which is served with vegetables, raw fish, and prawns. Sometimes it is rolled in seaweed or an egg pancake and served in slices. Kiyo's sushi includes a variety of seafood. I asked for a single slice, but the sushi is prepared by the "roll," and obtaining a taste was not possible. But it looked

to try it.

A vegetarian was seated at the next table, and she had a large salad, tofu and rice, and sushi. The meal was stunning to gaze upon — the radishes are dipped in juices that are pink in color, and the cucumbers are cut like small fans. All of our dishes were served on individual trays and each was pleasurable to the eye.

and each was pleasurable to the eye.

The menu at present is fairly limited, especially in terms of the entrees: teriyaki beef or chicken, ginger beef and chicken, teriyaki fish, tempura, and sushi. The fish and chicken dinners cost only three dollars and include soup, rice, pickle (marinated fish), and green tea. One bargain such meals are, not to mention their beautiful preparation. Should you have a favorite Japanese

dish, just ask for it and chances are that it will be prepared for you. Next time I will forget the menu and have the waitress

suggest items to me.

Recently, a few angry letters have arrived from owners of restaurants implying that I am never satisfied. I will implying that I am never satisfied. I will not address myself to these charges from people who have such obvious vested interests in their product. But I was immensely pleased with Kiyo's: the food is very reasonable in price, nicely prepared and served, interesting to the taste, and pleasing to the sight. When I left, I did not feel ripped off by outrageous prices or careless service.
Above all, I prized its authenticity. Even
though it occupies one-half of a noisy bar.
Kiyo's has managed to sequester itself
and to place before diners genuine Japanese cooking. The offerings are limited, to be sure, but that in no way detracts from those dishes which are now

OWL HURT

Last week the Fiesta Dinner Theatre opened its production of The Owl and the Pussycat. It makes for a pleasant evening. The theater itself - for those of you who have not been there — is located in Spring Valley, in a building that serves nicely for Valley, in a building that serves nicely for both eating and play-watching. The tables are arranged in tiers around an area sporting buffets of food, which later give way to a roll-out stage. As to the food, I dare not instude into the balliwick of my colleague the restaurant reviewer, but I will simply report that it consists of roast beef, spaghetti with meat sauce with green shaled, fruit saled, jello, and chocotate manual stages of the summitted in quantity and edible. The waitressee, who serve coffee and drinks, are young, friendly, and edible. He succeeds, thus showing up the vacuity of the British class system, but much to Higgins' chagrin he story thus possesses a universal truth and exerts a never-ending power over the human imagination.

Eliza Dolittle, his Galatea, resists: she wants to be valued for herself and loved as a unique human being, not as a successful experiment in sociolinguistics. Professor Higgins sociolinguistics. Professor Higgins ultimately is brought to understand that there are more potent forces in the world than social snobbery or intellectual manipulation. Beneath everything else, there lies the irresistible biological attraction of man for woman and woman for man: it is that that makes us human and ites us from gods, statues, ideas

Now we come to The Owl and the Puszycar. This latest version of the Pygmalion story is but another example of the horrible degeneration of the popular arts in our century. Even the name of the author gives us a sense of how far down things have come. Playwrights used to be amened George Bernard Shave, now they are named Bill Manhoff. Similarly, the title Pygmalion presupposes some kind of minimal classical learning on the part of the audience. The Owl and the Pussycar demands no Inowledge of anything—except the slang equivalences of "owl" except the slang equivalences of "owl"

and "intellectual," and "cat" and "prostitute" (Edward Lear's poem, from which the title comes, is irrelevant). Indeed, the whole play is a dreadful vulgarization of Shaw's Pygmalion, with everything dragged down to the lowest level of humor, of feeling, and of world view.

Professor Higgins — who, for all his faults, is an intelligent man, with high culture and real human dignity — has been culture and real human dignity — has been compressed here (like a Lincoln Continental at the car wreckers) into Fred Sherman, a prissy, talentiless, marcissistic idiot working in a San Francisco bookstore: he is a person of not the slightest depth or interest. Liza Dolittle has become a cheap prostitute named Doris, whom the playwright attempt to research whom the playwright attempts to present as complicated, tender, earthy, vulnerable, endowed with a heart of gold, vulnerable, endowed with a heart of gold, and plagued with an identity problem. He fails — but then he is not really interested in character; what he wants is situations that will give rise to one-line jokes. There is one intolerable (and endless) episode in Act Three where the clerk and the whore discuss the clerk and discuss a suicide pact, and what is so remarkable about this scene is that not for one instant do the characters bear any resemblance to living human beings; they

are themselves nothing but animated

Pygmalion satirizes British snobbers and at the same time gives us an insight into great creative nature. The Owl and the Pussycat has no social awareness: the larger realities of American society that help to shape our characters and limit our help to shape our characters and limit our options are totally ignored. There are a lot of contemporary references — no one could take this play for anything but American and contemporary — but while Pygmallon makes us see a whole class system, with its injustices, its inequities, and its supplicities, The O. d. the P. makes us see nothing at all beyond the apartment where the action is taking place. And as to the moral of the piece, it seems to be that everybody is little, helpless, talentless, and a self-deceiver, but that sex makes all equal. In Pygmalion the moral is that everyone has a natural grace dignity, power, and spirit; that education can reveal these noble characteristics; and that sex

caps this fairly lofty picture of humanity by integrating us into the large productive processes of nature. It's a long way down

processes of nature. It's a long way down from that to owls and pussycats complimenting each other about their prowess in bed.

None of this ought to keep you from having a good time at the Fiesta Dinner Theatre, if you carefully bear in mind that what you are watching is junk.

A brief word about the San Diego Opera's production of Aida, which inaugurated the annual Verdi Festival. This was a most respectable Aida, although nothing sensational. The only really outstanding contribution was from conductor Antonio Tauriello, who here as in the later performance of the Verdi Requiem — showed himself a musician of a completely Verdian stamp, with a control of rhythmic pulse and flexibility

that the composer himself would have acknowledged as just right. Soprano Martina Arroyo was her usual self: a gorgeous voice, an inconsistent vocal gorgeous voice, an inconsistent vocal production, and a generalized emotionality that never seems to get to the marrow of the text and the music. Carlo Bini, who sang the hero Radames, has a powerful, crude delivery, reminiscent of Mario del Monaco, but with less thrilling heroism in the voice and with strangulated tops. Carol Wyatt (Amneris) and Norman Mittelmann (Amonasro) were exceptionally dramatic, and the excitement produced by their acting managed to obscure some of their flaws in vocal production: for example, Miss Wyatt's constant changing of gears as the vowels changed, and Mr. Mittelmann's excessive covering of the voice in the higher range. The stage direction, by Tito Capobianco, was restrained, classical, and in good taste, in contrast to the usua in good taste, in contrast to the usual grandiose spectacle that swamps most productions of Aida. Altogether, this was an Aida for which San Diego can be grateful, but it must be confessed that a true Verdi festival, of international stature. would need singing of considerably higher quality than what was offered us this summer.
