The national organization and its San Diego leader mostly have concerned themselves with battling "deprogrammers," those who employ novel and sometimes illegal methods for retrieving from various cults the children of fretful parents. Bartlett is especially contemptuous of Ted Patrick, the flamboyant deprogrammer who hailed originally from Chula Vista and whom Bartlett refers to as "a known criminal." But Bartlett says his recent concern over the Guyana ncident fits right in with

incident fits right in with APRL's general purpose. "The whole purpose is to keep religion clear and free," he intones. "I'm only interested in Guyana because I don't want religion to be blamed for something it didn't do. APRL literature traces the origin of its organization to 1975, when a New York nur was outraged by what she'd learned at a deprogramming seminar. She founded the seminar. She founded the group, and chapters soon sprang up in Washington, San Francisco, and Tucson. Bartlett's introduction to APRL was less conventional. A Baptist minister, he had founded the Oak Park Baptist Church on Fifty-second Street near Highway 94 twenty-eight

Bartlett says he figures they were impressed by his religious credentials, which include having received degree in theology and religion, and founding and serving as president of the Southwestern Bible College. Italian, German, Spanish, and French. Straight from the Hip MATTHEW ALICE

Dear Matthew Alice:

At a Vietnamese resiaurant not long ago I had my first taste of litchi tea. I liked it so had my first taste of litchi tea. I liked it so well that I bought some at an Oriental food store and brought it home. But now that I'm pregnant, I want to know if it contains caffeine. Do I really get wired after six cups, or is that my imagination? What else might the tea contain? R.D. Miny Mars.

Mira Mesa

I could find no chemical analysis of tea made from the leaves or flowers of the litchi tree, and so I can't tell you exactly what it contains. However, you may be right in suspecting that the brew contains caffeire. Well known for its sweet, trans-lucent fruit, the litchi tree belongs to the Sapindale family of tropical trees and shrubs, one of which, the Brazilian Paulshrups, one of which, the brazilian Fain-ling cuppant, is a potent source of caffeine. From the roasted seeds of this woody vine, Brazilians prepare a stimulant called guarana. (The natives have also found that the vine's crushed leaves, seeds, and branches, when thrown into a pool, stupefy fish, making them easier to catch.) This relation to the guarana plant suggests that litchi tea contains caffeine; and if it contains even a small amount, your drinking six cups a day is likely to evoke

Great Moves

What is the difference, in the field of performance, between fine art and populat art? It is not a matter of technical mastery: the shallowest popular singer or actor may have a perfect command of all the tech-nique needed for the sort of thing he does. Nor is it always a matter of popularity: the preciative public. What distinguishes these two kinds of performers is their relationship to truth, the truth of what it means to be human. Marcel Marceau, whose recent mime recital at the Civic Theatre was one of the major theatrical events of the San Diego season, is a prac-titioner of fine art, and a very great artist

indeed Mime is an exceptionally demanding art, both for the performer and for the audience. Especially with so subtle an artist as Marceau, you have to keep your attention at knife-edge sharpness through-out; otherwise, not only will you miss the nuances of expression, but you may even fail to figure out the basic meaning of what tail to figure out the basic meaning of what is happening. In music, dance, theater, there is no disaster in letting your mind wander occasionally. This will interfere with your understanding of the total struc ture of the piece, but even after a long divagation you usually have little trouble in reorienting yourself to what is going on at the moment you rejoin the artist. In music and dance, the abstractness of the form will help you to feel at home wherever you come in, and in the theater you have the dialogue to give you hints as to what you have missed. In mime, you are on your own. In Marceau's performances, there is often a great deal of formal beauty. almost as if he were a ballet dancer; but the almost as if he were a ballet dancer, but the beauty is always tied to some specific ex-perience drawn from everyday life, read-ing a newspaper, playing chess, skating-drinking, handling delicate china. And as an aid to identifying this experience and following its various actions, the only words you have are in the brief tile given on a neueral. For the rest, you have to use on a placard. For the rest, you have to use your imagination, and you dare not let it slumber for an instant. It is astonishing that Marcel Marceau has such a powerful popular appeal, for there can be few stage artists who demand more active participa-

tion from their public. Marceau entices you with his cornedy, one of the staples of all mime performances. We seem to sense an innate con-nection between miming and making people laugh. In our own lives, we conduct serious business by means of words. The silent language of mime becomes useful to us when we want to mock someone, or to indicate a comically exaggerated reaction of our own; for the moment, we abandon of our own; for the moment, we abandon adult, rational discourse, and we play the clown. Marcel Marceau is, of course, a master at this game of pre-verbal comedy: especially in its role of Bip, the inept little fellow who always flops at whatever he tries to do, Marceau's ami is to arouse our laughter by showing us the way the human body (and the character attached to it) its body (and the character attached to it) is unable to cope with physical and social reality. Bip the skater cannot keep his footing on the ice; Bip the china salesman footing on the ice; Bip the china satesman exhausts himself trying to satisfy a finicky customer; Bip at a society party gets drunk and makes a fool of himself. Even in this humor, however, there is a note of pathos—a pathos characteristic of Marcau and of all the greatest mimes (Charlie ceau and of all the gratest mimes (Charlie Chapin is the best known of them). In Marceau's world, no one is ever really successful at making ag of fife, being human means being foolish, and the roolishness of our human nature—whether we are trying to ice skate or vaunting our selves on our generosity, humility, aloof-ness, or power—makes everything we do periably fram van di inversiable substitution ness, or power—makes everything we do inevitably funny and inevitably pathetic. At bottom, we are governed by the seven deadly sins (this is one of Marceau's most brilliant pieces), b_L, sins are in fact less

A serious art is one that makes a fixed smile, he makes its meaning change fixed smile, he makes its meaning change totally, so that finally it seems to be ex-pressive of pure suffering. "The Maskmaker" is Marcel Marceau's analysis of his own art. on the outside entertainment, comedy, clownishness; and on the inside a profound identification with suffering humanity—for, like the terms rus are all of us trooped inside the meaningful commentary about the human condition, that makes us more aware of our possibilities and limitations. In the hands (and face) of a lesser artist, mime is often (and face) of a lesser artist, mime is often no more than entertainment. But Marno more than entertainment. But Mar-ceau's power of expression and serious-ness of intent are so great that he can even persuade us to accept mimed episodes in which the element of humor is extirely extinguished. One of the most famous of these is "Youth, Maturity, Old Age, and Death," in which the actor shows us the entire course of a human being 's life in less with suffering numanity—tor, the the actor, we are all of us trapped inside the false identities we use to fend off a con-sciousness of our mortality. cellence and highly finished quality of this dancing was in itself a sign of the unreality of what we were watching on stage. These were not folkdancers but highly trained professionals ballet dancers, as it were, who were performing to less demanding choreography. One of the most impressive of the dance scenes was the "Ukolodsta," in which long-skirted, pail-carrying girls glided with miraculous smoothness in symmetrical patterns around an imagined well. This gliding movement, which has been treated in a more dramatic and politi-cal way in a famous dance of the Mois-seyev company, sums up the nature of the present troupe's performance in general. technically astounding, and at the same time extremely slick. You would look in vain here for real experience, real under-standing, real emotion: the Festival of Russian Dance tells you nothing about what it means to be an Uzbek, or a Rus what it means to be an Uzbek, or a Rus-sian, or-forthat matter-a human being. It is a purely surface art, one which we can respond to passively an i effortlessly, and while it often annares, it never touches the heart or makes demands on the mind. In short, this dance show was virtually an archetype of what is meant by popular and build on its one its one nerves. It was ter-

art. Judged on its own terms, it was ter-rific, and the audience was right to respond to it with such enthusiasm. But of course an art that asks so little of us cannot give us in return anything but a momentary enporticit. Marcel Marceau has given me a permanent insight into myself and my des-tiny; the Festival of Russian Dance left me with nothing more than a pleasant mem-ory, already fading If we want an insight into the reality

behind this program of pleasing, colorfu dances, we would do well to take note of the little flier handed out by some neatly dressed and respectful students standing outside the theater. It read: "We sincerel hope that you enjoy the Festival of Russian Dance. We are sure that these performers represent the finest of Soviet culture and art. But please try to remember that the same country which produced these fine dancers also persecutes 3½ million Jews, as well as other minorities, simply because they wish to exercise their right to believe as they please or because they want to b as they please or necause they want to be reunited with their families in other coun-tries." What this soberly realistic note did not mention was that Russian creative ethnic minorities—has been so stunted by the Soviets that in fact the charming, sume Soviets that in fact the charming, su-perficial, antiseptic festival of Russian Dance*does* represent "the finest of Soviet culture and art." Steve Cushman had even gone up to Los Angeles that day to film his television ads for the general election. So when the votes for the general election. So when the votes finally were tailed the results were daz-zling indeed. Maureen had taken 27.3 per-cent of the vote compared to Cushman's 22 per percent, and she trailed Ridgeway by only 126 votes. "And there was another little miracle," she says. "We were the under-dog. Here 'the kids' almost made it. But not quite.

The reporters no longer ignored her. Political writer George Dissinger of the *Tribune* (he's now assistant managing editor there) crowned her "the Cinderella girl of San Diego politics." When the O'Connor twins called a second press conference, reporters jammed the au-

ditorium and for the next two months they dished up a plentiful helping of Maureen's promises. She talked a little about limiting growth, but mostly she talked about re storing people's faith in the government. "I would set up volunteer sources where they would actually come in and work right with the city and see what is going " she confidently asserted. "This is the way you develop trust." Naive words, perhaps, but they were words which sounded just right to city res-

idents who had nine months before seeing half their city council members tainted in the Yellow Cab scandal. The vote totals of election night in November reflected the election night in November reflected the desire for new, young leaders. Thirty-year-old Jim Bates swept into office that night, and Pete Wilson, thirty-eight, bested his fifty-three-year-old opponent. Ed Butler. Maureen made history, be-Ed Butter. Maureen made history, be-coming, at twenty-five, the youngest per-son ever elected to San Diego's governing body, beating Ridgeway by 8546 votes. The campaign had left its mark on her. It had exposed her to some of the ugliness that Sister Jeannette had feared. "People ceil aeroble thoses (durine the campaien) said terrible things [during the campaign] There were rumors about her having af-fairs with people," the nun recalls. "I re-member Maureen sitting in that campaign member Maureen stuttig in that campaign office in tears. She'd say, 'How can they say that about me?1'm a nice person!' 'It had also begun to nibble away at Mau-reen's personal privacy, but she says the serious intrusions didn't come until after she got into office. And in the first months

she got into office. And in the first flohings she had more pressing worries than the loss of privacy. "I was scared to death," she whispers today, in recollection. At the time she was elected she had never attended a single council meeting. "I didn't know what an R-4 lot was. I knew nothing about government. I had taken only one political science class in college and that was because I had to." Yet there was no choice but to draw a deep breath and dive in. "I went to my first

breath and dive in. "I went to my first council meeting and looked around and I said, I'f they can do it, I can do it! " Every morning, she would take the bus from the eighty-dollar-a-month Ocean Beach apartment which the shared with Mavourneen and another girl. She'd arrive a round eight, eat one meal a day, work until eleven or twelve at night. In those first months she seemed determined to fulfill her promises of open government. On Valentine's Day, for example, she and Mavourneen spent the morning passing out red carnations to the elderly residents out red carnations to the elderly residents of five downtown hotels, inviting them to call Maureen's office if they had any problems. In fact, she does own the furniture that surrounds her, the apricot-colored Oriental rug under her feet, the bright orange upholstered chrome-and-wicker chairs. owner, who wore shorts, tennis shoes and socks, and a lightweight zippered "shell" (a jacket with a hood). Moreover, every waitress had on running shorts with the scalloped edges and the stripes going up the side, T-shirts, tennis shoes and socks. One comer of the room was dominated by a screen on which were played video tapes of local athletic events, "Maybe you'll see yourselves in one of the events." the owner said enthusiastically. Knowing that the likelihood of this was slim, to say the least, we opted for a table as far away from the screen as possible. The tables had been designed so that

pictures of athletes and various athletic events could be viewed from the surface. My place mat covered a woman weight litter, and Aunt Bertha looked down on cyclists in helmets and marathon runners in the agony of the last seconds of a race. Aunt Bertha cleared her throat. "Look

how clever they are. The phone number on the menu is listed 276-SWIM. It's like one of those fancy license plates you see of those tancy iterase parts you are around here. All you have to do to re-member the number is to say 'breast stroke' to yourself. That way you won't

get it mixed up with 'bike. By this time the waitress had come to take our order. I decided on the chicken served with brown rice, and Aunt Bertha wanted the fish of the day, which proved to be mahi-mahi.

be mahi-mahi. "Of course, I'm not presuming to say what should be prepared in a health-food restaurant, but what are they doing with mahi-mahi? It comes from Hawaii and so it has to be frozen '

The waitress in her running shorts ran to check it out and came back with the news that Aunt Bertha was correct-mahi-mahi is flown to the States frozen. Nevertheless. Aunt Bertha decided to chance it with the fish since the other choices were omelette. fresh fruit salad, or the vegetarian entree As she breezily admitted, "So dedicated I'm not.

We began with a lentil soup, which we shared (our waitress was excellent and shared (our waitess was excented and brought us an extra soup bowl and salad dish so we could both try the opening courses). The soup consisted of lentils that had been boiled in water with no salt or any herb added. The salad likewise had nothing in the dressing to either titillate or dis-turb the palate. It really isn't necessary to have salt or any herb on salad, but the soup was more difficult to swallow. However,

the purity had only begun. This is how the chicken was prepared: the breast had been flattened and placed under the broiler. Period. To my knowl edge, dill is perfectly fine, even for joggers, even for swimmers, but none was on the chicken. Nor did it benefit from lemon juice. Accompanying the chicken were grated carrots and brown rice without salt.

Aunt Bertha tasted her mahi-mahi, "It's so healthy, I can't tell you. I have a dieti-cian friend who would love it here. She works in a hospital in Chicago and always

talks against salt, against butter, against anything on food but the food itself. We were both starving, and since everyone had eyes only for the screen, on which runners ran an endless marathon against a background of pale pinks, we doused our food with salt, causing the tops to be too salty and the bottoms without flavor

Of course, I don't presume to know how to run a restaurant, but on cold nights they should let the waitresses wear jogging suits. Then they would be warmer and the customers wouldn't feel so guilty." The particular shot under preparation required Scott, or his stand-in, to exit an establishment named Wild Mary's, the doorframe of which was an upside-down "V" formed by the straddling legs of a psychedelically painted woman two stories tall, and to go perhaps fifty feet down the sidewalk. th camera tracking alongside, and to duck into a place called Stairway to Love, sen-tried on either side of the doorway by two live streetwalkers. Midway through this shot, a bit of "business" was to be created by a black pimp, garishly outfitted in car-dinal red, dishing out verbal abuse and the back of his hand to a white streetwalker. This shot was so tryingly long in its preparation, as the crew had to keep tow-eling off the rain-sprinkled surfaces, that

everyone in the crowd of onlookers must have sooner or later marvelled that neither Schrader nor any of his confidants, on sec-ond or third thought, were stricken by a painful revelation of the trashiness of the shot and to hell with it. Every so often. some intrepid soul in the crowd would step beyond the police cordons, intending perhaps to gain a closer look at the on, or to take refuge inside the brightly lit greasy-spoon located between Wild Mary's and the Stairway to Love, or to put a solicitous arm around Paul Schrader's shoulders and advise him, in

As for myself, I can imagine nothing more dull and dispensable than being subjected to a session of textbook psychologizing about lack of love in the home, seeking of same elsewhere, etc., which is in fact the explanation hinted at throughout Hardcore and is at last plainly spelled out in the climactic father-daughter confrontation The reason such explanation is withheld till then, furthermore, is that the father's assumption all along is that his daughte has been abducted-which may also ac count for why the actress picked for the part looks like Patty Hearst (another point of general accord among the critics), and one wonders idly whether Schrader is wonders they whether schadel is sneaking in a Calvinist theory about Hearst's culpability for her actions —The notion that a fictional character

ought to be shaken, tempted, altered, or in some way bent out of shape is one of the many phantom rules of "good drama." (This rule is the inverse of the one that states a fictional character ought to remain states a netrona enfancter ough to remain consistent, and a critic on the warpath can almost always invoke one of these two rules whenever the other doesn't apply.) The notion, in this particular case, that a staunch lifelong Calvinist ought to have his head spun around by the ugly world of sex for sale—that he ought to be softened or hardened or humanized or dehumanized or something—seems to me a bit disin-genuous. The critics' feigned belief in the powerful alture of the porno-prostitution meat market is typical of their tendency to overdramatize—as witness their penchant for employing such terms as "searing," "breathtaking," "eye-popping, "gut-"breathtaking," "eye-popping," wrenching," "pulse-quickening," and "heart-stopping." when they are de-scribing a movie which they have in fact sat through in utter equanimity. —It is a safe bet that, if Schrader had
