The gray-colored meters were manufactured by Duncan Industries, a division of the Oonaar Corporation, in Elk Grove Village, Illinois. Had they made a mistake? If these meters gave extra time, was it just as likely that others gave less time than paid for? Not according to Dave Wood, who is the deputy director of the communications and electrical division of the city's general services department. It is the responsibility of Wood's division to collect the meter money and to ensure the





(Marquis charges rents of between \$160 and \$500 to the people who live in the seven cottages on his India Street property behind the theater.)

the regional director of the regional director of business affair, for the General Services Administration in San Francisco, confirms that the local cafteria does receive a type of indirect subsidy. He says under the terms of Mannings' contract with the GSA, Mannings pays no real-instead, the company pays one and a half percent of its gross sales in return for the use of the space and facilities (utilities are also included for that cook.

Perlmutter says, "You know the cafeteria isn't particularly intended to serve the public. It's there for the convenience of the government employee The whole idea is to provide reasonable food at reasonabl prices for the people in that building." He adds that the contract limits Mannings to making a nine percent profi

making a nine percent profit over the company's general and administrative costs. Metcalf bristles at mention of that arrangement. He cites Bank of America figures relating to operating ratios for the food service industry which indicate that the average cafeteria pays four to seven percent of its gross for rent, two to four percent for utilities, and one and a half to two and a

half percent for repairs and maintenance. He says if the fee Mannings pays also includes insurance, that means the company is effectively getting a fifteen percent subsidy. Metcalf says he recently got the clearest proof of the effect

of the cafeteria's presence on his business when the cafeteria his business when the cafeteria closed down for a week of plumbing repairs. In that week, Metcalf found 350 to 400 Metcalf found 350 to 400 people a day turning to the deli, instead of the normal 150 to 200. He took in a thousand dollars a day instead of his usual 400 or so. "That was out best week ever." he says. But the business withered as soon as the cafeteria reopened. Metcalf says the experience has made him consider taking legal action to challenge the competition, which he sees a
