The foreboding stillness is like a mountain that kills all sound. Just a mile away stands a medium-security county jail. When compared to the state prison, the George F. Bailey Detention Facility is as benign as an elementary school

playground.

I turn in to the parking lot, which is almost full in early afternoon, Men and women are lounging in their cars, windows down and doors open, their faces greasy with the heat, clothing loosened. Children are listless and cranky. I park and lock the circulation of the care the c

It is estimated within two years that those incarcerated in the U.S. prison system will number more than 2,000,000, according to a recent NPR new report. In San Diego there are six other county jails bestick George F, Balley, as well as a federal and a state prison, two juvenile halls, and a few probation camps. The seven county jails bold a total of approximately \$300 men and proximately 5300 men and women. On the day I drove out to George F. Bailey, 11,567 in-dividuals were incarcerated in the San Diego facilities mentioned above

From news reports, televi-sion, and movies, I know some of what their lives are like inside prison. What I don't know is what it's like for the prisoners' what it's like for the prisoners' families. In the magical Fauré Quartet, the four musicians similarly brought out both the music's late-Roman-tic flair (played with heated concentration) and its charac-teristic blithe sadness, which I have rarely heard embodied so poignantly as in this exciting and

The remaining item on the program was Schwmann's Toccata, played by planist Cecile Liad. Once again, I found the programming of a solo plane work among the various chamber ensembles to be somethow not quite right; it altered the atmosphere in an uncomfortable way and just dish'fit. (The Schumann also compilated in the rather excessive length inst didn't fit. 

Now that trains run up to speech of 320 mph (France's TGV—I Frain a Grande Vitese) and 277 mph (the Japanese bullet train), today's railways undergo looses far greater than your standard 15 mph dairy collision. 





"So in case there's an acci-dent, they can look at that?" "Well, if it's an 'accident,' it would mean that it was possi-bly human error. What we have out here when we hit people on the tracks or in the grade cross-ing, those are 'incidents.' Those are all preventable... On grade crossing incidents, they don't normally use the black box..."

"You were telling me about an incident up towards Irvine? What happened there?" "That was a very intentional

I hat was a very intentional act [on the driver's part] when I struck him. Witnesses said he went through the grade cross-ing. As the gate came down, he made a U-turn and came back made a U-turn and came back around the gate and got up on the grade crossing. In fact, I have pictures here. Lawrence pulls a stack of pictures from his bag and hands them to me. The remnants of a white Dodge Caravan are melded to the charred front end of a train. "It caught on fire after we

stopped."
"Do you carry a camera?"
"I didn't used to carry one,
but I put a disposable one back
in my grip again."
"Does that help for insui-

ance purposes?"
"No. It's strictly personal."

[The guy took off when he saw that his car wouldn't move and that the train was approaching. Lawrence speculated that the man had probably been drink-ing, or that he was going to claim to his insurance that his car had been stolen.] Another time was right out of Old Town for me. At Tecolote Road, a gentleman stepped out of the bushes underneath the overpass and committed an intentional act."

"He committed suicide?"
"Well, there was no note, but it seemed like that. "That's got to be hard psy-chologically, because you're the one who sees this happen."

"In a way it is, but in an other way, I know there's not much I can do. All I can do is stop the train... I've seen some incidences where people made some careless moves, [and] I've felt bad for that — also if there's

"If there's someone in a car, can you see them as you're ap-proaching, see the look on their

faces?"
"Sometimes. The first incident I had, back in '87, was up
in Spokane [Washington]. That
was my first hit after operating
trains for ten years... The girl
made an intentional act. After
the travels of the grade of the grade. the stopped at the grade cross-ing with only the lights and bells, she motored ahead, and our Amtrak engine struck her right dead in the center of the driver's door. I remember her blonde hair, blue eyes, and white sweater. I got to see that,

and you never forget. "When something happens and you have an incident, does Amtrak provide any kind of psychological counseling?

"Yeah, we have a good men-tal health program; we get professional counseling. We also have an in-house employee-peer

support program.... We've passed Sorrento Val-ley and are now heading past the Torrey Pines hill into Del Mar, Lawrence mentions that he will use the echo of an over pass to amplify his horn volume. "Last week I came around that curve, blowing the whistle, and a lady with her litwhistle, and a lady with her lit-tle bey and Boogie board just cleared the tracks to my right. A little boy — that really would ve pissed me off if we hit him! He had a Boogie board hanging from his hand, drag-ging it. It just cleared the tracks



l ask Robidoux about some yellow warning signs that I've been seeing along the tracks since we left the Santa Fe station. "They've been around since the Coaster went into service. Robidoux stops in mid-sen-tence and gives three loud blasts of the whistle as two surfers with boards tucked beneath their arms saunter across the tracks, a mere 50 yards in front

of us.

There you go... "I oisserve.

just kind of tip-toeing over the rocks. You know they're not going to be moving that quick — railroad rock is very jagged. They're kind of idiots to be walking around like that to begin with." They were burying their money in the sand because they didn't trust the banks. And so did the Italian fishermen - they kept it on their person, but stashed in their sash on the left side as a rule. And on their right side they carried a large stiletto, and they knew how to use it. I never did hear of an Italian fisherman being robbed or accosted in any way."




