Absolutely Despicable

Having moved here recently from Colorado, the issue of corkage never affected me, as Colorado does not permit corkage by law. However, as a former sommelier at a San Diego restaurant, the issue soon became one that I had soon became one that I had to address. I can empathize greatly with the waiter who got stiffed by the "cheesy people" ("Crush," January 20). If the restaurant where he works is truly one of the finest restau truly one of the finest restau-rants, I would upgrade the act of bringing such inexpensive wine into a restaurant from "cheesy" to "absolutely despi-cable." Chefs take a great deal of pride in the food that arrives at your table. They source the freshest produce and ingredi-ents possible so that flavors will ents possible so that flavors will be bursting from your plate. The simple fact is, generally speaking, a \$6 wine is not go-ing to win any food/wine pair-ings when tasted with a \$36 rack of lamb.

Wines at this price point are often unbalanced and poorly made, stressing either too much acid or tannin or both, and ultimately, overpowering the cuisine. However, I find it un-believable that the waiter in this case was actually expecting the guests to tell him that they were going to tip him higher because the wines were cheap. This would necessitate the cheesy people to fully acknowledge eir outright cheesiness. But their outright cheesiness. But this is my point, in a less so-phisticated dining market like San Diego, people just don't get it. This isn't San Francisco, where high entertainment for an evening revolves around

noting the subtleties in aroma between 1978 and 1990 Chatesu Rayas Chatesneuf du Pape. Here, it appears to me that people think corkage is their God-given right and are totally oblivious to their disregard for the high costs of running a restaurant. Lean't tell you how many times I saw diners come in toding their cheap, discount-bin wines to accompany their 325 curree.

Of course, there are well-Of course, there are well-made wines in the \$10 range, but are they appropriate to match with a highly talented chef's usisine! I think not. Thank-fully some people in San Diego did get it. I opened many great bottles of wine for guests who had gone through their wine cellars hoping to find some-thing truly appropriate for the occasion of dining in our rest-aurant. And on top of that, aurant. And on top of that, were happy to pay the minimal \$15 corkage fee. That is the dif-ference between the two groups: total unsophistication and outright cheesiness vs. ap-preciation and the elevation of food/wine to an art form. In a word, the art of dining vs. cat-ting for susterance. It is just by ing for sustenance. It's just hu man nature. I can't say I'll he man nature. I can't say I'll be sad to leave San Diego. How-ever, the mere act of creating a forum for this issue is good for San Diegans.

What have you been doing so far in the year 2000? If you're Jennifer Morrison, age 23, you surf every day, work

in an Ocean Beach surf shop, and mark off the days until you'll leave for a three-and-a-half-month trip to ride the best waves on South and Central American

When the alarm clock rings in the darkness of January mornings, what does it take to pull a girl out of a flannel co-coon? What it takes is the calling. In the morning gray, Jen-nifer rises like a dancer called to the floor; it is like a dance, espe-cially if you're pulled by the un-predictable rhythms, the danger,

A water temperature of 57 degrees is the kind of cold that gives an ice cream-freeze headache. len rubbery, cold wetsuit over morning skin. "I'm wearing an Elita long, full suit. 

"That's just completely wrong," says Severin Borenstein, a business professor at U.C. Berkeley, director of the University of California Energy Institute, and a member of the PX's tute, and a member of the PX's board of governors." Those "bad investments" were alternative power sources that the government pushed power companies like SDG&E to invest in during the '70s and '80s. The cost, Borenstein says, proved high, and the investments often

The act's purpose was to get utilities to not generate all their own power. Then, says Borenstein, the price of natural gas collapsed, making generation by any other means expensive by comparison. Peace's legislation allowed utilities to pass on to customers the "stranded costs" of those contracts with "competitive transi-tion charges." That wiped out the 10-percent reduction in resi-

But SDG&E has now sold off its interests in the San Onofre its interests in the San Onofre nuclear-power station and two other gas-fired generating plants, in part to meet deregulation re-quirements that utilities separate themselves from the power-gen-eration business (though Sem-pra is building a power plant in Nevada).

Nevada).
"San Diego's [bad invest-ments] were probably propor-tionately smaller than San Fran-cisco's Pacific Gas and Electric and L.A.'s Southern California Edison's," says Borenstein. He's not surprised that with proceeds

from the sale of its nuclear and

from the sale of its nuclear and other power plants, SDG&E is the first of California's "big three" utilities to pay off that debt. So why has this good news gotten the PX's Jesús Arredondo— and UCAN—nervous? Because they worry that, led by SDG&E, the utilities could bust out and go back to their old biout and go back to their old bi-lateral dealings, once they've paid off their bad investments. If SDG&E decided to leave the Cal-ifornia Power Exchange, and PG&E and Southern California en and Southern California on followed, the PX would look anemic. Despite the involvement of the 69 other companies (from California and seven other western states, Canada, and Mexico), Peace's baby may not survive abandon-ment by the "big three," which the PX says still serves 80 percent of California's electrical demand.

"[SDG&E] think they might be able to cut a better deal work ing with somebody outside o the power exchange," says Borenstein. "They have covered their stranded investments, but the law was unclear on whether that was sufficient for them to have the right to buy outside of the

power exchange."

The good news, says Boren-stein, is that SDG&E has been negotiating a deal they've submit-ted to the Public Utilities Com-mission for approval; it still in-volves them buying most of their

power through the PX. But for Shames, Peace's law leaves too much opportunity for utilities to get out of hand. And San Diegans, he says, are the test

monkeys.

"San Diego is the first region in the state, and in the United States, to emerge from the transition to deregulated competi-tion. No other utility will expose its customers to the unfettered prices of an electric market be-fore 2001," he writes in his report. "The lessons learned in San Diego will determine whether California's experiment with deregulated electricity results in more competition and better service or a consumer nightmare of a stronger unregulated monopoly that is accountable to



do not have to disclose much about the way they operate. whom they hire, and how much money they make. Players and their agents vie for millions in contracts; owners wheel and deal for taxpayer-financed stadiums; sponsors arrange endorse ments; and bookies lay odds on the World Series - all determined behind the closed doors of executive suites. The men who own the teams are drawn from America's well-con nected, men who have a direct line to the media, which deflects inquiries into how the sport does business

On occasion, however, sordid aspects of the sport seep into public consciousness, mostly when players get careless with their taxes. Hall of Famers Willie McCovey and Duke Snider were forced to pleaded guilty in 1995 to federal income tax evasion. They failed to report millions of dollars derived from the autograph-signing and memorabilia circuit, a business largely transacted in cash that some estimate at a billion dollars a year or more. In 1995, Yankee great Darryl Strawberry pleaded guilty to failing to report some \$350,000 of au tograph and memorabilia income he'd raked in over a fouryear period. He paid a fine and served six months of home

In July 1990, Cincinnati Reds star Pete Rose, banned from baseball for life for betting on Reds games, was sentenced to five months in federal prison and fined \$50,000 for failing to pay taxes on \$350,000 of income he'd made at baseball card hows, personal memorabilia sales, and through gambling from 1984 to 1987. "I really have no excuses, because it's all my fault," Rose told the judge before sentencing. Blaming his problems on his addiction to gambling, he continued, "I have een able to stop gambling. But I will need help for the rest of my life. I have a sickness.

However egregious Rose's transgressions, some feel that he has been made a scapegoat for baseball's owners and its corporate sponsors, agents, and attorneys. Corruption connected to the sport of baseball, they say, is broader and goes much higher than the few players the IRS has corralled.

Especially these days - with team owners hungering for larger and better stadiums financed by taxpayers — the prac-



tice of trading cash and other favors for political influence has come commonplace. Campaign contributions and gifts to public officials are de rigueur. San Diego Padres owners John Moores has given thousands of dollars to campaigns of San Diego city councilmembers and county supervisors. He has furnished them with extravagant gifts, such as dinners, drinks,







So writes Shep, in an essay titled "Inside the

Criminal Mind," which is posted at a site called Prison Writers and Poets (www.prisonzone.com/writers) Shep's essay is an anomaly, online and print anthologies of prison writing rarely include pieces that are so bluntly confessional. The preferred tone for such collections is somber and political. Shep, by contrast, describes his criminality without apologizing for it. He adds: "An ancient Chinese warrior/philosopher once wrote that 'to know thy enemy is to know thyself.' Recognizing the enemy is hard, especially because so often the enemy is yourself. You may raise your fists against time, or love or society or something else, but it is only because we fight ourselves that we waste our energy. Because when you stop and turn that energy inside, you become strong." Shep, who is 42, disdains the various kinds of prisoners he has met during his 20 years in prison. "Slicks," he writes, "are the dandies, the hustlers, who seem to glide through the system, gaining the most and suffering the least. Con-men. Movers and shakers. Slobs pass through the system as best they can on the scraps;



they are the petty opportunists, many of whom are oned for some substance-induced idiocy, like passing out during a burglary.... To the judge's list I would add Fiends and Predators. Fiends are those whose lives revolve around the use and abuse of mind-altering substances; predators are those whose lives revolve around victimizing others, often sexually, but sometimes not."

The most celebrated anthology of prison writ-ing in recent years is H. Bruce Franklin's Prison Writing in 20th-Century America. Franklin's anthology is about the struggle of the incarcerated spirit, and its goal is reform. Most of the writings he excerpts, including The Autobiography of Malcolm X and Chester Himes's 1934 essays for Esquire, highlight prison brutality and the failings of America's judicial system. For instance, one Himes story, titled "To What Red Hill," describes a prison fire from the point of view of a white prisoner named

Blackie: "Smoke rolled up from the burning cellblock in black, fire-tinged waves.... Flames, seen through the mist of smoke, were devils' tongues stuck out at the black night.... When Blackie turned left by the dining room he had an odd feeling that he could hear those men a hundred yards away cry-ing, 'Oh God! Save me! Oh God! Save me!' over and over again." Jack London also railed against his unjust incarceration in Erie County Penitentiary for vagrancy: "As for me, I was dazed. Here "I know I will not

I'll try to be as sincere as I am capable, but I'll be the first one to advance the concept that truth can be selective. and I want to own up to my own limitations of truth before I proceed. If they're honest, anyone who has killed humans on more than one occasion will tell you it becomes easier with each death. It's a powerful truth, strong words just to hear: now imagine living this truth, feeling this truth, intimately embracing this truth.... I know I will not ever fully understand the sanctity of life, not like normal people do - do they realize how lucky they are?" Walker never found out. He committed suicide on November 18, 1997 in his cell at San Quentin State Prison. Is that what we wanted him to do?





MADE 473 DRAWINGS ON ONE ASSIGNMENT IN VIETNAM. February and March of 1967, in Dong Ha in the DMZ. Sometimes I could use art to shield myself from what was going on around me. When you're drawing, you can concentrate on your subject and shut other things out." The videotaped interview plays continuously in one gallery of the MCRD Command Museum. Retired Lt. Col. Charles Waterhouse describes his active duty that ended with a shoulder wound on Mt. Suribachi, his career as a magazine illustrator, and his return to battle 20 years later as a Marine Corps combat artist.

Waterhouse is now best known for his carefully researched paintings of 18th- and 19th-century U.S. military history. Dozens of California-related works, from small stud-

ies to battle panoramas, are on public display in the Command Museum. But 30 years ago he was among the artists selected to live with American troops at their various billets around the world and to record his impressions

The U.S. Army has had combat artists in the field since World War I. Navy and Marine Corps programs came early in the next war. On a limited scale, the programs still exist, with combat artists assigned to Desert Storm, Somalia, and

snia. Their work is collected in the history museums of each branch of the service - millions of images of the terror and tedium of military life interpreted through an artist's eye. Robert Watts today makes his living as an architectural illustrator, working out

of his home in El Cajon. In the late 1960s, after training at Pratt Institute and what is now the Art Center in Pasadena, he was an illustrator with Ryan Aeronautics, painting glamour shots of military hardware intended to impress the "I did a lot of airplanes from engineering drawings, planes that hadn't been

built yet, for government contract competitions. But I also did advertising illustration, landscape paintings for the executives' walls, portraits of admirals that they were trying to impress, all manner of things.

"One day one of the Ryan PR people came to me and said, 'How would you like to be a Navy combat artist?' This was about 1970. I said sure. They send you off somewhere for a couple of weeks. At the time I was in my early 20s. still young and stupid enough to be fascinated by the dramatic mood of war rather than the real stuff. Little boys are like that. They only see the fireballs and planes.
"So we sent samples of my work to the Salmagundi Club in New York, an

old, distinguished artists group that had among its membership some of the biggest names in American painting and illustration. They were kind of the liaison with the Navy. The program was called NACAL, Navy Art Cooperation and Liaison. And by then I had been painting long enough that my work showed some promise, and they said okay.

"Then they put you on the list, and it goes into some mysterious bureau cratic process, and at some point they say okay, we have two billets for Viet-nam in June and we have two for the Mediterranean in September. Would you

be interested? Then you get written orders from the Navy telling you to report to a certain location on a certain date.

"The Navy never told you what to paint. We got some printed literature with the application that explained what the goals of the program were. And you knew that your job was to depict, hopefully, things that people weren't aware of that captured the professionalism, the drama, the daring, the selflessness, seriousness of it all. But nobody ever said to adjust your outlook so we look good in this situation. You could basically do anything you wanted, anything that wasn't absolutely classified, like nuclear weapons, a couple of guidance systems, things like that were off-limits. But virtually anything else you wanted to do, they would make it happen. If you wanted to get into a helicopter and hover five feet over the water, they would fit your request into something they already had planned. If you wanted to see a guided missile cruiser that was in the battle group, the next time they had a helicopter going there, you could go

On his Vietnam assignments, Watts spent time on the *Independence*, the Forrestal, and the Oriskany, plus a number of guided missile cruisers, destroyers, and LSTs on combat operations in the South China Sea. "I was never inshore in Vietnam," he admits. "My feeling at the time was, it's not worth getting shot for a sketch " You can still hear the

awe in his voice as he describes his introduction as a civilian to his first aircraft carrier. "That environment is so much larger than life that I frankly couldn't believe it. You see photos, and they look impressive, but when you get out on the deck with the mouse ears and hard hat and Mae West, and you're standing out between the front catapults, and the wind's blowing across the deck at about 45 miles an hour, so hard you have to lean into it, and there's a huge plane beside you blow ing full-bore exhaust —

"The noise is incredible. But with the mouse ears and helmet on, you can't hear anything. It's absolute stone silence. To talk to someone else, you have to put your helmets together. The sound goes through your skull and into the helmet, then into the other guy's head.

"And it's so dangerous One day a guy grabbed me by the back of the shirt and pulled me out of the way of the jet exhaust. You can't see it in the daytime, and I almost walked right into it. Plus they're handling fuel, bombs, rockets, live ammunition, missiles, all kinds of stuff. And in all weather, some of the worst weather you can imagine, night and day, seven days a week.

"On one trip I went to

the Philippines, then they flew me up to the Indepen dence. On the deck there was a smoldering A-7 attack iet cut in half. They'd just put out the fire. A propeller had come off a Hawkeye radar plane, which has big 18-foot-diameter turbo prop fans on each side. A shaft had sheared on one, and the prop dropped to the deck spinning at about 1800 rpm and just went yeeeeeeow across the deck and cut the A-7 in half, then went off into the sea. The damage control officer on the Independence had a builtin tremble in his hands. A little shimmer in his hands all the time. A wonderful man, but a nervous wreck.

"But for an illustrator it was a visual field day of

things that you could paint. Very moody, high-key, very dramatic, lust everything you could hope for. The polar opposite of painting a still life of flowers. Everything moving, everything exciting. The red light at night. The only lights on

the deck at night were red. "I liked to go out on the LSO platform, where an officer would stand during landing to help the pilot it he had any problems. One night it was low overcast, no stars, black as a hat out there. All of a sudden vou would see this form drop out of the mist in the distance behind the ship, with three lights on the nose gear, red, vellow, and green. It would come down out of there. wobbling, the wind is blowing 45, 50 miles an hour just from the movement of the ship. It would slam on the deck. They hit full afterburner, and the nonskid on the deck — sand mixed with asphalt or something - would break loose from the jolt of the after burner, and you'd get hit with this pelt of sirocco wind full of hot sand. And everything is bathed in this hot red light.
"I carried a camera,

because a lot of things happened too fast to do any thing on the spot. And to record details. But you get the smell and taste in your blood and a feeling for what it looked like, and if you're a decent artist, you have good recall and certain high points will stand out in your memory. That will vary from artist to artist, of course, depending on what strikes you as important. Then you go back to your quarters and start working on pencil roughs and draw ings and some compre hensive color studies. I didn't do any finished work over there. I did watercolor and gouache sketches, a lot of pencil work. I brought a fair amount of supplies with me in a kit that I could carry

There were times when that privileged treatment became almost a source of embarrassment because you haven't earned any of it. You haven't paid your dues. I was in my early 20s, probably the same age who had all that responsibility."

His worst moment came on his last flight out of Subic. "I'm signing out, trying to find out what plane I'd be taking to go home. And there's this Air Force C-141 that was leaving, a huge transport. I get done with the paperwork and finally get to the airplane, and it's been sitting there -130 people in the heat and the humidity - for three hours waiting for the rankthat was. Me. And I get on and everybody's looking, like. 'This is who we've been waiting for?' You just want to crawl in a hole."

The largest room of MCRD's Command Museum com memorates the history of Marine Corps operations in displays of uniforms and weapons, ribbons, medals maps, field packs, all the Storm diorama features a jump-suited, helmeted mannequin on a motorcycle in matching shades of sandy beige. But among the hardware are a few art works. some drawn in the field, some completed long after - a gaudy painting of battle action, a sketch of a catnap in the shade of a tank, portraits of refugees memories committed to canvas both by combat artists and by ordinary soldiers who lived with these

Before enlisting in the Army at age 19, Indiviglia was already an accomplished illustrator and painter. He was one of the few American artists trained in the exacting techniques of fresco painting. 

In fact, Joplin is believed to have studied composition and theory at a small Methodist college in Sedalia, Missouri, which was founded to educate former slaves, always considered himself to be a classical composer, and is listed as such in the Schwann catalog. Anyone ex-periencing the plangent strains of his seldom-produced but sublime opera *Treemonisha* or the complex rhythms of his syncopated piano works will certainly understand why he

belongs in the pantheon of

first-rate American masters.

That Saville was hoping to hear Chopin or Brahms instead of Joplin demonstrates a disquieting but perhaps understandable predisposition for the "Old Masters," but, hey, the "Old Masters," but, hey, Jonathan, I haven't seem too many little Wolfgangs or Lud-wigs running around the mu-sic scene these days either. It's the year 2000 now, so perhaps you should dismount, chill out, and, as Cab Calloway said, set "hen to the iive."





To readers at the time, the Beecher-Tilton Scandal was an irresistible mystery. Richard Fox puts his readers into that same reverberating story, while offering it as a timeless tale of love, deception, faith, and the confounding indeterminacy of truth. *Trials of Intimacy* revises our conception of nineteenth-century morals and passions. And it is an American history

Author: Richard Wightman Fox grew up, he said, on the morning that we talked, mainly in Los Angeles. "I started in Boston, my parents were both from Boston. My father, after World War II, went into television, first in New York City. Then he got a whiff of what was happening in Hollywood and went west in 1952. 



His manner of playing had some of the same qualities: Jofly refinement, delicate restraint, a refusal of all Bamboyance or vulgarity, a self-confinement within the bounds of good taste, a continement within the bounds of good taste, a noble alsoiness, the manners of a high-born courtier as the court of Louis XIV. Everything he did that evening at Sherwood Auditorium was assured, polished, shaped by cool intelligence, and — in its way — perfect. How sad that the result, for all the composers and all the music, was a monotonous grayness, without highlights, without differentiation, and ultimately without life.

N SAVILLE | new harmonies, and daring compositional principles; and fragmentary insights into Debusy's own most intimate imaginative life, his tastes, his whims, his memories, his dreams, his private jokes. When the tutles of the individual pieces suggest specific visual images, those images are regularly of objects or experiences that are essentially ungraspable fluid, vague of contour, fuzzy, immarerial — nuances rather than tuzzy, immaterial — nuances rather than hings. Book II gives us mists, dead leaves, heather, moonlight, dancing fairies, fireworks, and a water nymph who is herself the rippling, bubbling spirit of water. At the same time, in the midst of these dissolving pictorial evocations, the odd, ebullient Debussyan sense of humor rises like a vulgar Triton out of the waves: Debussy the fan of popular music-hall entertainment (Général Lavine, commemretrainment (General Lavine, commem-orating an American juggler and clown of the period) or Dickensian comedy (Hommage à S. Pickwick Esq.), Debussy the wry hispanophile poking fun at the cliches of the Spanish style poking fun at the cliches of the Spanish style even while reveling in the opportunities they offer for textural experimentation on the keyboadr (La puerta del vino), or Debussy the anti-Impressionist jokester leaving one (and only one) of the Priludes with a purely technical title ("Alternating Thirds"), as though slyly daring us to come up with a typical "Impressionist" picture. What we are hearing, in most of these pieces, is a Tontrolled jumble of sounds, allusions, contrasts, jumble of sounds, allusions, contrasts, eruptions, interruptions, disruptions, incomplete thoughts, sudden changes of direction, frustrations of expectation — all governed by a supremely passionate,

supremely ironic mind intent on seeing whether music can be expressive and satisfying when its form is purely spontaneous, dictated only by the unpre-dictable shifts of an active creative


These essential characteristics of the Préludes — irony, spontaneity, vulgarity, extremity — were precisely what was missing in Thibaudet's meticulous and refined performance of Book II. For the sake of gracefulness, all contrasts were toned down and all abrupt changes of mood were smoothed out. The mists were indistin-guishable from the heather or the moonlight; the jokes were underplayed to the point where they were virtually imperceptible; the challenging modernity of the late Debussy manner was tamed. reduced made civilized - and uninteresting. Instead of 12 distinct bizarre auditory worlds, each bizarre in its own idiosyncratic each bizarre in its own idiosyncratic way, we heard a single (and seemingly unending) world of exquisite (and exquisite) (and exquisite) and or playing. How different all this was from our last local performance of the same music, by lean-Efflam Bavouet, a French pianist of quite a different character, whose electrifying concert at the Athenaeum a few years ago made the audience constantly aware that the Préludes constitute stunning breakthroughs

rretues constitute stunning oreakthroughs into a new way of making art. The Chopin half of Thibaudet's recital was as disappointing as the Debussy half. Once again, the playing was skilful and intelligent, but excessively restrained and overly conscious of elegance, reducing the selection of Nocturnes, Valses, Etudes, and Préludes to the Nocturnes, Valses, Etudets, and Préludes to the level of pleasing salon pieces, and failing to find — or even to search for — the unique emotional and compositional individuality in each. There has been an enormous amount of Chopin-playing lately (some of it occasioned by the sesquicentennial of the composer's death), and by the end of this concert I confess death), and by the end of this concert i contess that I felt heartily sick of Chopin and hoped not to hear any more of him for at least a year. No, the feeling didn't stick with me. It was Jean-Yves Thibaudet's fault, and once away from his influence I found it rapidly



## Surreal in the Extreme

ne of the curious social pastimes of the early 1960s was sitting around and listensive the entry of comedy routines on the hi-fi. This was 20 years before the explosion of comedy clubs in the larger American cities. material for that still rather tame era. The audience for the sort of comedy that was available on records, as opposed to TV, was urban in character but now living in the sub-urbs, inconveniently distant from live entertainment.

Among the popular recorded comes with
Mort Sahl, Shelly Berman; Woody Allen, BillCosby, Elaine May and Mike Nichols, Bob
Newhart, Jonathan Winters. Sex was alluded to in an oblique, nervous, peculiarly American
way. Lenny Bruce was around, harassed, already
more pathetic than funny, his best material certainly not available on major labels for popular

tainly not available on major labels for popular consumption. A typical persona among the comics was that of the introverted, self-depre-cating neurotic, regaling the audience with social encounters gone terribly bad. Americans are not the funniest people in the world. We may like to think so, but we're not. The French, the Germans, and the Chinese aren't terribly funny either. Of course, they can be, but as a race or culture, not especially. Now, you can say to me: how about Texas humor or Jewish humor or Mark Twain? And, by God, Jewish humor or Mark I wain? And, by Good, you've got me dead to rights. But generally I'd say the Irish, the Italians, or the Russians (whose humor has affinities with Jewish humor) are funnier. And, of course, the English.

A British revue called "Beyond the Fringe" was a great hit on Broadway in the early '60s and

a rare form of Parkinson's disease.

If it's on our wine list, fine: if it's not, fine - it's just a straight wine list, fine; if it's not, fine—it's just a straight fee." For my part, I've heard of places that sim-ply do not allow wines on their wine list to be brought in and others that allow no corkage of any kind. One La Jolla restaurant allows a scant one bottle per table.

"You've got to have at least something equal You ve got to nave at least something equal to what we sell," begins Rolf, responding to my question about how to gauge a wine's worthiness before bringing it in. "We have other patrons in here; when they look and they see this [cheap] wine, it's an insult not only to our patrons, it's an insult to everybody in here." ing to achieve. We have meetings, we sit down together and we taste. We've got experience in pairing, that the daily person doesn't have. There are a lot of wine connicaeurs and food people out there, which I'm very glad to see, but..."







On G Avenue between Third and Fourth in the Gaslamp, Fumari and Fourth in the Gastamp, Fumari is a place one can go (and Friday nights are packed) to smoke flavored tobaccos out of water pipes, hookahs...you know, like bongs with a water tank. This past Friday I arrived and the room and sidewalk seating area were jammed with a roughly equal division of mideasters and kids in their 20s.

You select a tobacco — double apple is the most popular, though you can smoke apricot, cherry, you can smoke apricot, cherry, mixed fruit blends, etc. — and a waiter will bring over this thing that looks like a smoldering floor lamp with a hose. 


