The unicheers and claps. formed band sings out the city song. Kids from the colonia song. Kids from the colonias, many of them recent arrivals from central Mexico, look up wide-eyed. "We are one city!" shouts Francisco Vega de Lamadrid, the mayor of Tijuana. "The government and the peo-ple are one!" His words blast out through loudspeakers. The chil-dren and their parents and their grandparents try to catch a glimpse of the most important man in town — except he's not crayons, and paper. a tall, imposing ganadero like Fox. Vega is short, with an ami-able, moonish face, prematurely gray hair, and metal-rimmed

But once he gets to the mibut once he gets to the mi-crophone, his physical presen-tation is not a problem. "You have the right to study!" He punches his words into the mike. I prefer free verse; though, when I'm composing for a lady, rhyme seems to do her a better service. Q: How influenced are you by the actual Romantics, the English poets from the end of the 18th Century and the be-ginning of the 19th Century? A: In feeling, I am influ-enced by poets such as Robert Burns, William Wordsworth,

Wordsworth, and Coleridge, for nstance — certainly took Wordsworth, and Coleridge, for instance — certainly took flights of fancy and were seduced by idealism, fantasy, and their poetry was also political, in that it used a language and heroes more in keeping with etime's vernacular. It sought to shrug off the irrelevance of casical poetry and classical poetry and classical heroes. Does your poetry attempt a Does your poetry attempt a similar conversation with its time? Is it political?

A: Absolutely! I have a A: Absolutely! I have a chivalric nature and love an old chivalric tale, but I deal with the heroes and issues of our time. For instance, I wrote a poem about the O.J. Simp-son trial called "O.J and vodka." Can't wait till that one makes the headlines! It bor-ders on the absurd. O.J. is the hero, but like the heroes in Byron's plays, is he innocent, or does he suffer from some guilt? Then again, was O.J. on trial, or was it justice?

Q: Liberty is a theme that Q: Liberty is a theme that pops up in your poems. Your poem "Highway 101," for instance, opens with imagery that recalls the Beats, on the road and all that. But it closes with the narrator driving away from a bum, blowing a plume of smoke in his face. Is liberty a

privilege or a right in this poem?

A: It is a modern "flight of fancy." I'm sure Burns or Wordsworth would have loved to have been in my jeep the day I stripped it and took flight down one of the most scenic drives in the world. It's all part of that carpe diem spirit. However, neither my jeep nor the 101 were around then. Liberation? Well, liberation is one of those few mo ments, a spiritual thing. You can argue that it's a right or a privilege, but then again, some people who have the right or the privilege — which their forefathers sweated and toiled for - seldom use it. So many people spend their lives in front of a television, isn't that a form of imprisonment?

In the words of Gandhi, "A coward is words of Gandhi, "A coward is incapable of exhibiting love, it is a prerogative of the brave." If we were to replace "love" with "affection" — I'm sure Gandhi wouldn't mind — we can begin to see my point. Generally speaking, in this day and age, affection in a man is viewed as a weakness. cation, which the national gov-ernment approved in 1993. The accord passed responsibility for school administration to the inschool administration to the in-dividual states — though the control of syllabus and pro-grams stayed in the federal gov-ernment's hands. But the National Action

Party-dominated Baia Califor nia wants even more say in run-ning its schools, says Franco. His mission in Tijuana is to unite the previously separate federal, state, and local school systems under and local school systems under one state organization. "It's a more efficient use of funds," he says, though he admits elimi-nating the duplication of jobs is "tough in human terms." But the result is that teachers and ad-ministrators don't have to take their problems to Mexico City their problems to Mexico City or Mexicali for resolution. "We

or mexican for resolution. We can resolve them right here in Tijuana," says Franco. And they can take initiative, as Vega de Lamadrid did last year when he set up Tijuana's first program to help disabled chil-dren get an education. Franco now wants Mexico City to let

Baja create its own syllabus.
"The majority of new students in Tijuana are immigrants coming from other states. They don't know Baja California. We want them to know the state they're living in. We're teaching them our history and geography and ecology. We also have started classes for the parents, so they can involve themselves in the ed-ucation of their children. That's booming! We have also estab lished an accident-insurance program for Tijuana pupils, as a piogram for Tijuana pupils, as a piogram for the children pays 11 pesos a year [just over \$1]. I think it's the first program in the whole country. And this will benefit the poorest."

Maybe the biggest boon for poor secondary-school pupils will be getting assistance in buying textbooks. Franco's department has allotted 20 million pesos (just over \$2 million) — 90 sos (just over \$2 million) — 90
, percent of it state money — to
pay for books. "That will pay 60
percent of the cost of school
textbooks," says Franco. "Next
year it will be 100 percent."

For one person at the city hall today, there might not be a next year. The crowds of moms and dads have gone, but Marlene Camacho Verduzco is still sitting in Silvia Labastida's cubicle. Now that she's taken her hat off. the change is taken her hat off, the change in Marlene's appear-ance is shocking. She's lost most of her hair to chemotherapy. She and her mother and brother sit in silence, waiting to talk to Labastida again. Marlene says tabastica again. Martene says she still hopes to get her liver transplant in San Diego. But down here in Tijuana, she says, she's not getting the money quickly enough. The giant check that Mayor

Vega presented her, the one made possible by 2000 poor kids, sits against the wall, Markids, sits against the wall. Mar-lene's ten-year-old brother Rolando looks up at the big writing: \$12,000 is a lot of candy sold. He says it's "great," but he doesn't smile. He knows it won't



st down the street from Chicano Park sits a stark white building with a neoclassical facade. Painted in blue above its tiled entry are the vords Iglesia del Dios Vivo, Columna y Apoy de la Verdad. La Luz del Mundo (Church of the Living God, Column and Support of the Truth, Light of the World). The men, women, and chil-dren who go there call

it simply Iglesia La Luz del Mundo (Light of the World Church). Once inside you

first notice that men si on the church's left women on the right All the women cover their hair and wear skirts below the knee. Stars of David are carved into the aisle side of each wooden pew. A large menorah stands to the left of the podium at the church's front. There's no crucifix, no cross. There are no musical instrument The congregation sings hymns a cappella, full-voiced, in perfect four-

part harmony. The church holds services three times a day, seven days a week day, seven days a week, and these hourlong ser-vices follow a pattern: prayer, hymn, Psalm reading, prayer, hymn, prayer, sermon, hymn, and prayer. The prayers themselves follow a dis-

themselves follow a dis-tinct order. The first, for example, is always a petition for forgive-ness; the last is always a prayer for the church's needs or the needs of its members. Last Wednesday, when I stopped by for the 6:00 p.m. ser vice. I spoke with Julio Orellana, who joined the church about a year ago. Orellana told me that in the dozens of Iglesias La Luz del Mundo churches around the world, services follow the same order. Orellana did not use the word

Founded in Jalisco, Mexico, in 1926 by Aaron Joaquin Gonzalez, Iglesia del Dios Vivo, Columna y Apoyo de la Verdad, La Luz del Mundo regards itself as the literal restora-tion of the primitive Church. Rituals, icons, statues, crosses, crucifixes, and the use of musical instruments during worship are con sidered unbiblical. "We baptize kids when they're about 14," Orellana explained. "The Holy Spirit, well, that

can come before or after water baptism. You can pray for it to happen, but only God can decide when."

What makes Iglesia La Luz del Mundo particularly interesting is that its clergy play a limited role in worship. Of the 21 semons given weekly at the Logan Avenue church, only the Sunday-morning sermon is deliv-ered by Pastor Aurelio Zawaltas. Church mem-bers give the rest. At the beginning of each month, Pastor Zawela draws up a schedule, assigning church members a dete and time for their sermon.

As Oreliana said, "We beneve everyone can be inspired by God to speak from and interpret scripture."

ou know how easy it is to forget the origins of words and phrases, to let what they have come to mean erase what they once meant. Take "marshmallow," for instance, which today means first a spongy confection and second a pond perennial, the "marsh mallow," from whose roots the stuff is made. The same goes for "Library of Congress,

which has come to signify "big library in Washington D.C." and not "the library belonging to the United States Congress." Granted, such finicky etymology is usually the domain of cranky high school English teachers who are unwilling to let words assume new purposes. But it's relevant in this case because, as its ample website www.loc.gov) demonstrates, the Library of Congress is the repository of those texts, pictures, and items of our heritage that we call ephemera. The Smithsonian museums house weighty national icons, while the Library of Congress catalogs thin sheets and small notebooks. But, in theory anyway, these articles are important enough to influence legislation: the Library of Congress is supposed to be where politicians go to research the bills they vote on.

The bicentennial of the Library of Congress just passed with hardly a note of fanfare. The library is the world's largest and the nation's oldest federal cultural institution. Since its creation in April 1800, it has preserved its items - which now number 119 million — in service of the legislative branch of the American government. "The library," the site tells us, "was established as the fledgling legislature of the new Republic



prepared to move from Philadelphia to the new capital city of Washington. On April 24, 1800, President John Adams approved legislation that appropriated \$5000 to purchase 'such books as may be necessary for the use of Congress.' " On January 26, 1802, President Thomas Jefferson defined the role and functions of the new insti tution. His measure "created the post of Librarian of Congress and gave Congress, through a Joint Committee on the Library, the authority to establish the Library's budget and its rules and regulations. From the beginning, however, the institution was more than just a legislative library, for the 1802 law made the appointment of the Librarian of Congress a presidential responsibility. It also permitted the president and vice president to borrow books, a privilege that, in the next three decades, was extended to most government agencies and to the judiciary.

Other exhibitions include the African-Amer ican Mosaic — which posts documents pertaining to slavery and the peculiar interracial effort beginning in 1817 to colonize Liberia with the country's free blacks - and Sigmund Freud: Conflict and Culture. The Freud presentation includes materials relating to his most famous case histories, like those of the Rat Man and the Wolf Man, in which the doctor tells the story of Sergei Pankejeff (1887-1979), a wealthy Russian aristocrat who is described as "suffering from

debilitating compulsions and fears resulting from his sexual development having gone awry at an early age. Freud focused Pankeieff's attention on a childhood dream which seemed to encapsulate his early traumas and current fears: a dream of wolves perched in a tree outside his open bedroom window." The library is wise to present Freudian psychology as an embattled practice. "It strikes me as strange," Freud himself wrote in 1895, "that the case histories I write should

read like short stories and that, as one might say, they lack the serious stamp of science." Two years ago, Oliver Sacks said of him. "Freud regarded memory and motive as inseparable Recollection could have no force, no meaning, unless it was allied with motive. In 1951, Vladimir Nabokov was less kind about Freud: "Let the credulous and the vulgar continue to believe that all mental woes can be cured by a daily application of old Greek myths to their private parts."

The library's site is a good place to consider what's at stake in memory When it was founded, it was designed to preserve the memories of a great democratic project. But like Thomas Jefferson — the man who did so much for the library and who said that he could not live without books - the Library of Congress is a venue for various recollections. Also like Jefferson, the library loves many kinds of people. Too many to tell one story. - Justin Wolff

Mine came in a tube. I had forgotten it was on the way. The endgame had been abrupt, and after I walked off campus I hadn't thought much about the degree. ton, graduate students have to pass their language requirements before they can take their master's exams and begin to write a dissertation. The tests, which are administered by professors from the appropriate language departments, are designed to determine one's reading proficiency. Students are given a passage and one hour to trans late it, with the help of a dictionary, into English.

This requirement scared me more than any other when I enrolled in my program. I am an American-- meaning that my area of specialization is American art, specifically 19thcentury painting and pho-

ing that I'm not one of those urbane art-history people who smokes imported tobacco and speaks French. In fact, I have a very poor ear and will never speak another language with any fluency. For my tests, besides the required German, I chose French and Italian. French because I had studied it in high school, and Italian because I supposed that the professor giving the test would be nice — which she was. I managed to pass both exams during my first year in graduate school, My German exam waited for me

when I returned for my second. To the English speaker, German is a confounded language - counterintu-

itive and rigid. I had one summer to learn enough of it to pass my test. I came home to Rhode Island and enrolled in the Goethe Institute, a program hosted by the University of Rhode

They spotted some horses lagging behind the rest, driven by Americans and Californios. The deputies secured the horses and moved on

A mile and a half down the road, Kriss saw a man unsaddling his horse, beside which were two more, apparently from the herd. Kriss ordered the man to surrender his arms. The man had none. For safekeeping, Kriss turned the horses over to a Mr. Cline, who was driving a wagon down the road with his A half mile later, the deputies found a

man and Indian boy with three horses and a pack mule. Kriss said, "Drop your guns." They had none, so he made them unsaddle their horses, and he headed for a large fog of dust up ahead.

The herd plowed through an area thick with tall brush. Visibility was so limited, the deputies devised a plan: Ries and Rodriguez would circle in front and turn the herd around. As they rode, however, Kriss spotted a man and ordered him to stop. They exchanged words in English. Kriss drew his pistol, fired, and missed. The man moved away, then shot at Kriss. Missed, Kriss fired, Missed. The man rode behind a tree, took careful aim, fired, and galloped away.

"I saw Mr. Kriss's horse walking off



with Kriss in the act of falling," said Ries in court testimony, "and I saw a man between me and Kriss driving the hindmost drove of



The copper-roofed, neo-Mission-style building gleams in the spring sunshine, and small trees and bushes along Lincoln rustle in the gentle breeze. I park my car and walk through the open back door into the high-ceilinged garage area — I later learn to call this the "apparatus area" — where three fire rigs are parked. "Hello," I call. "Hello," returns a voice, and a tall, mustachioed man in blue shorts and blue T-shirt approaches from around the front of a glistening red truck. "You must be, Ernie," he says, shaking hands with me. "Welcome. I'm Bill. Had lunch yet?"

kitchen, where half a dozen firefighters are filing past the counter straight ahead, putting together pastrami sandwiches. McDonald, who has joined us in the kitchen, tells me, "Make yourself right at home here. Just

dive in and get yourself a sandwich." I follow his instructions and walk through the buffet before taking a seat at the square table in the din-

Station 14 has stood at this location since 1943, but this building was built in 1991 and, like modern homes, has an open floor plan. The kitchen flows into the dining area, which in turn flows into the living room, or "bullpen." Other than a high counter between the kitchen and the dining room, no walls separate the three rooms. Decoration is nonexistent and furnishings are utilitarian. The living room has no couches or coffee table. Instead, 15 identical recliners, arranged in two rows, face the TV. Conversation wasn't what the firefighters had in mind when they set up this room.

Not that they don't converse. As I sit at the dining room table with the members of Station 14's A Shift.

I realize this is the primary conversation spot in the firehouse. The six men and two women talk freely about work and nonwork topics and rib each other constantly. I've heard that firefighters, maybe because they spend too much time together, often end up disliking each other and interacting as little as possible. None of that is in evidence here, where everybody takes part in the conversation, everybody laughs and jokes with each other, and, as far as I can tell, everybody gets along.

To my right at the table is Captain Larry Carlson, a 29-year veteran of the fire department. McDonald sits to Carlson's right around the corner of the table. I ask them about rapport among the crew members.

"We basically all get along in this little 24-hour family that we've got going here," McDonald says. "We've got all different backgrounds of people, different interests, different hobbies, different personalities. Some of us have grown together through our careers. I've known Larry for the 23 years I've been on the job. We don't hang out together outside of work, but we're family here. It's funny, we've got an eight-man double house here and we all get along, where sometimes you have only four guys, in a regular single-engine house, and those guys can't stand each other. They can change stations, try to find an environment they like. But sometimes it takes a while for that to happen. In the meantime, they don't eat together or talk much to each

"Is how well you get along just left up to chance?" I ask.

Bill leads me through a doorway on the north side of the apparatus area into the firehouse section of the station. Immediately on the right is a chest-high counter with an office behind it. On the other side of the counter sits a tan, dark-haired man in his 40s. "This is Captain Jon McDonald," Bill says without stopping. We exchange greetings and I keep following Bill through another doorway and into the

I remember seeing three rigs when I walked in

"The third," says fire engineer Bob Buie, who has been listening, "is a rerve engine — the one against the far wall. We just store it there in case some-

thing breaks down." In the last ten years or so," McDonald explains, "when they've started to rebuild old stations and build new ones, they've made them multiple-truck, with

front and rear access - instead of the conventional two-door stations we used to have that you had to back the rigs into. So now we have space for reserve rigs. Instead of keeping them out in the sun somewhere, we keep them indoors."

I ask how the shift system works. Carlson points to an official calendar

hanging on the wall behind him. The numbers on the calendar, which is showhanging on the wail benind nim. I ne numbers on the calendar, which is show-ing the month of March, are either red, green, or blue. "We're the red days," he explains, "so you can see we worked the 5th, 7th, 9th, and then the 11th. Then we had four days off. Then we worked 16th, 18th, 20th, and today, the 22nd. Then we have six days off. If you break it down, it works out to a 56-hour work-week over a year. Tomorrow morning, B division will be coming in. They work all of the blue days. When we're on our four and six days off, B and C divisions will alternate. This is a perpetual calendar, so say you were going to work ten more years, you could sit down and figure out every shift you were going to work

"It's a nice schedule," adds McDonald, "because, unless we're working over time, we never work consecutive days. You work for 24 hours, then you go home for at least 24 hours

"That's a normal shift," Carlson explains. "Now, obviously if there's something going on in the morning maybe there's a fire at 7:30 and we go on it - well, even though our shift technically ends at 8:00 a.m., we could stay there all morning. If there's a grass fire, we may go out there and stay over all that next day. Sometimes we may stay out there for a

"And it's so flexible," McDonald says, "it's been worked out through our union and the city that we can do trades. The guys who work on the green or blue days, they can work for me on March 5th, 7th, and 9th and I can take those days off. Then, I can work for them on three of my nor-

"Another nice thing, Carlson adds, "is after 15 years, you begin accruing vacation at the rate of 22 hours a month. So over the period of a year you earn about ten shifts of vacation. So you can see," he taps the calendar, "ten shifts is pretty much a month off." "I just took a month

off," McDonald interjects.

"Of course," Carlson continues, "our annual leave is also our sick leave, so it behooves you not to use i all up at once.

"A lot of people get hurt on this job, not big in juries, but you're constantly hurting yourself. There's a lot of lifting, a lot of twisting, a lot of awkward positions: you're in areas where you can't see. There are a lot of knee and shoulder injuries and backs that go bad over the years."

"And you're exposed to a lot of sickness," Mc-Donald adds.

"I don't know anybody," Carlson says, "who hasn't been dinged in some way on the job.

By 1:30 p.m., McDonald, Carlson, and I are the only ones left at the table.

"We like to think it is," McDonald answers. "And, in fact, nobody is here jus because they were stuck here. They asked to be

"This is the secondbusiest station in the city." Carlson adds. "So if you like to be busy and you like a real diverse neighborhood, this is the place to be. That's why I'm here. I love this place. A lot of firefighters want to be here. The young guys want to be in a busy house because they want to build experience."

"And." McDonald

adds, "a lot of the real senior guys on the job don't like it. They've probably some point in their careers. but when they start getting older they think 'Let the younger guys work the busy houses. I'll go out to the beach or I'll go somewhere it isn't too busy.' But that's not always the case. Larry's got close to 30 years on, I've got almost 24 on, and we're

still doing the busy stuff. Captain Carlson nods in agreement. "I can't work in the slower stations. I'd go "What is considered "Well." Carlson an-

swers, "it's different now. In the old days, when we jus did fires, there were a lot of runs for weeks. But with medical aid being such a huge part of our business now, every station gets medical runs. Here, we get around 10 or 11 calls a day on the pump and 3 on the truck. Some days, we'll do 20 on the pump, but 10 or 11 is the average. There are several stations out there

that average 3."
"When did the fire department go from just putting out fires to answering medical calls as well?" I

[emergency medical technicians] since 1980," Mc-Donald says, "so here we are 20 years later. Before that, just a handful of guys were EMTs. We thought they were surgeons. When Larry and I came on, it was a ba sic Boy Scout first-aid class: stop the bleeding, direct pressure, Band-Aid, good luck."

Lask if the medical rev

olution on the job came about because the department was looking for some thing for firefighters to do. as smoke alarms, sprinklers, and fire codes made fires more rare.

"Well." Carlson answers, "filling the dead time was part of it. But the sec ond thing is that medical technology took off at about the same time and it allowed you to put all kinds of really high technology in an ambulance or a fire engine It's all portable now. All of those tools that used to be big lumbering units in a hospital we carry around in a little bag now. Two people can carry an enormous amount of medical equipment into a house."

"Everything that's on a tray and table at the ER room," McDonald explains "The oxygen, all of the drugs, all of the trauma stuff, the defibrillator — two

That would give us two pumps and a truck. We'd be pretty busy. The first one of us that gets there will take command. Then the battalion chief will come in, the commanding captain will make a face-to-face with him, and he'll take command. That frees you up to go do other things. In a really big fire, we may call in additional resources and he's in charge of tracking those resources and asking

"This is a great area to work in. Any one of these, he points out this station and stations in Golden Hill, City Heights, and Hillcrest. "This is the heart of the city and it's the place to be, in my mind. The interesting thing is, you can feel change in this district more than anywhere else. I've felt North Park, the last three or four years, turning around. People are starting to really take care of the neighborhoods. Two or three years ago we were going to stabbings and shootings and beatings constantly. We're hardly seeing them anymore. The last year it's been so quiet as far as violent crime goes. We still get the occasional beating or stabbing, but not any-

thing like it used to be. Two or three years ago, New Year's Eve, you could hear automatic weapons all over the place. This last year, I heard a couple of shots. It's kind of cool to watch the transformation happen and see all of the new development along University Avenue. There were a couple of developers, they started tearing down these little houses and putting eightunit buildings on those 50 by 100 lots. They just tacked them up and they were garbage. the structure. That's what we use to put car fires out. That's what we drag down into canyons to get to fires.

"In the back here, we have our two-and-a-halfinch and our four-inch. Years and years ago, we used two-and-a-half-inch hose for all of our supply lines; supply line brings water from the hydrant into the engine, which pumps it out through the hoses. As far as what hose we use to put out the fire, when we do school presentations, I put it like this: if your house is on fire, we use an inch-and-a-quarter to put it out. If your school is on fire, we go to a two-and-a-half-inch line. The bigger the fire, the big-





How do you feel?"



says as we walk, "they're the ones who do all the work on a medical-aid run like this. The captain usu ally writes down everything, gets all the medical history, gets whatever information he can from the patient and the family. The paramedic makes contact with the patient. She's trying to talk to him to find out what's wrong, what his problems are, what the signs and symptoms are. That's Kerin. Then Leilani she's the firefighter, her role is to assist Kerin as bes she can and help in getting information. Although she's not a paramedic, she's exposed to this kind of thing o much that she knows the questions to ask, she knows the information, and she helps the medic. Then I. as the engineer, am like a backup. I stand in the background, and if they need something, I get it. I go back to the rig and get the equipment. I go get the gurneys or backboards. If something else is needed, the engineer goes and does it. So we all work together as a team with specific roles. In our station, we switch ries. Larry and I stay together all of the time whether we're in the truck or the pump. Kerin stays on the pump all the time because she's the medic. The other three fire fighters rotate. 

occurs when scavenging birds, accustomed to finding elk carcasses abandoned after wolf kills, must search all the harder for food, or die.

"In California, no wolves are known to exist in the wild," says Patrick Valentino, executive director of the California Wolf Center. It's been that way since the mid-1930s. At the center, however, there are 13 captive Alaskan gray wolves. There are also six Mexican wolves, a subspecies so rare that scientists can count them exactly. At the noment, in the whole of North

America, there are 199.

The six at the center include a eeding pair that produced an "estimated" three pups on April 20. "We don't count them officially until much later," says Valentino, "due to their high

mortality rate. It's higher in the wild, obviously. Still, we don't count them at all for over six months."

The Mexican wolves are part of a

potential "release pool." Successful candidates would be released someday in Arizona or New Mexico - not by the enter but by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife center but by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, which has designated the center part of its Species Survival Plan. For now, they live in two enclosures, measuring a combined 1% acres, and are fed a zoo-brand diet, along with donated road-killed deer. But it's not a zoo situation. Pack members aren't exhibited. In fact, they have minimal human contact, enhancing their odds for survival, when (if) release becomes

"We caution people: we're not a circus; we're not a commercial venture." But last Saturday a group was treated to the sight of six or group was treated to the sight of six or seven emerging from dense brush, "I couldn't have predicted it; I certainly didn't plan it; I didn't call their names. One came right up to the fence line. At a narrated slide show prior to

the walk, Valentino tries to correct misconceptions. "Probably the most common one is that wolves kill people common one is that woives kill people. It's completely false, born of myths and movies. "We have no confirmed instances of woives killing anybody in North America. You're more likely to be killed while sitting at a sidewalk café than even encountering a wolf. We could go into the state with the most wolves,

Alaska, and never see one."

People who have romanticized woives are "not especially helpful," either. Nor are those who interpret the animals' instinctual behavior as moral or immoral. "They see some wildlife as good and other types as bad. They don't like coyotes because they're a — quote unquote — problem. But they like



wolves because they're fuzzy. That wolves because they're fuzzy. That doesn't make any sense to me. They fall in love with the photos. But we don't reintroduce wolves because they're safe to be around little kids. We introduce them because they're critical predators, selective killers. They take weak, sick, diseased and old, and without the

diseased, and old, and without them, we're out of balance. It's all part of the rhythm of the ecosystem." Wolves, in short, are neither heroes nor villains. They're wild animals that

nor villains. They're wild animals that deserve our respect and, Valentino would argue, our legal protection until they have recovered their numbers. At the same time, they need us to keep our distance. Their fur is not for petting. It may take us down a peg to realize the truth of it, but they'd be content if they never saw another human

Which was surprising to me, even as a child, that people were still thinking about the Civil War. I guess if you win the war, you just don't think about it anymore. They were envious of people who had led these remarkably wretched lives.

Take It Easy, Louis!

Chopin's compositions need space around them.

his has been a signal year for piano recitals in San Diego, with most of the concerts sponsored by the La Jolla Chamber Music Society: Eduardus Halim, Ivo Pogorelich, Jean-Yves Thibaudet, Minoru Nojima, Dubravka

Tomšič, Louis Lortie (the subject of this review), Wu Han, and Ionathan Biss. The selection of all

these artists was thoroughly rea-sonable, for they are highly trained JONATHAN SAVILLE professionals of considerable reputation; but, as t turned out, among the pianists preceding the Lortie recital none of them except the magnificent Tomsic gave me unalloyed pleasure. A matter of

Tomse gave me unalloyed pleasure. A matter of personal taste, perhaps? In any case, Lortie's all-Chopin concert at Sherwood Auditorium continued the pattern, for while the Canadian pianist is a brilliant tech-nician, he seemed to me to lack (at least to a significant degree) the sensitivity, poetry, and in wardness that give meaning to the performance of Chopin's music. I first encountered Lortie's of Chopin's music. I first encountered Lortie's playing in his CD of the Chopin Etudes (1986), which took my breath away with its pyrotechnics. His aggressive, driven, fiery style, along with his dazzling mastery of this music's difficulties, were just right for the Etudes, so many of which emphasize virtuosic display. It was exciting merely to listen to the superb evenness of his runs! But Lortie also showed himself a formidable artist in in his beautifully proportioned rendering of the A Minor or the E-flat Minor). Certainly, this was

little tone poem; but the playing had such vigor, clarity, firmness, and powerful intelligence that it often reminded one of Maurizio Pollini, a Chopin pianist also quite unlike Cortot, but an equally legitimate exponent of this music.

A decade and a half has

REVIEW passed, and in the meantime Lor-tie has had extensive further ex-

AVILLE perience with Chopin, not to mention composers such as eethoven and Ravel. But whereas Pollini's Chopin, over the years, has acquired greater emotional complexity and depth, Lortie's - to judge only by his Sherwood concert - has be judge only by his Sherwood concert — has be-come rather hard and rigid, generally incapable of reflection or relaxation. In a program includ-ing Waltzes, Impromptus, the Andante spianato et Grande Polonaise, and an unusual selection of early concertante pieces (such as the Grand Fan-tasy on Polish Airs), there was a rather wearying monotony of loudness, explosiveness, and speed monotony of rounness, exprosveness, and speed, which eased up only intermittently. Of course, there were moments of delicacy, in which Lortie allowed the music's spirit to breathe at its own pace (the A Minor Waltz, Opus 34, No. 2, for example). But, without any gross distortions (for Lortie is too good a musician for anything like that), much of the music on this program seemed to beat with the heart of the "Revolu tionary" Etude.

The program was interestingly arranged, in groups determined largely by key relationships: first an *Impromptu* and a *Waltz*, both in A-flat; then a group of four works, alternating G-flat

and its dominant D-flat, and ending with the Fantasie-impromptu in C-sharp (equivalent to D-flat) Minor); and so on. Only the Andante spianato (in E-flat, fol-lowing Waltzes in A Minor and E Mi-nor) fell outside this type of pattern. nor) tell outside this type of pattern Such key-coherence provided a certain sonic stability for listeners with per-fect (or well-developed relative) pitch. But it also encouraged Lortie to bound forward from the end of one piece to the beginning of the next one, so as to make the key-relationship one, so as to make the key-relationship clear (applause was severely discour-aged within the groups), and that tended to weaken the character of the individual pieces, and to suggest factitious relationships between works that really had nothing to do

with each other. Chopin's compositions, even the smallest of Chopin's compositions, even the sma-them, create unique worlds of expressi-which, in order to achieve their full ef-fect, need space around them. One of the reasons Chopin's Sonatas sound so loosely constructed is the quality of complete and indepen-dent universes projected by the separate movements. That is the separate movements. That is the genius of Chopin: limiting his mu-sic in length and at the same time expanding its inherent identity to astonishing size. Lortie's program-ming device, while mildly ingenious, proved to be in conflict with the essential nature of Chopin's the essential nature of Chopin's music, and it contributed to the pervading atmosphere of mono-tonous, breathless rushing that characterized so much of this

any of us develop a resistance to certain kinds of art. I don't mean in mark. Mughal pains planters of judgment I rate. If I say laper Johns is a dull, overrated painter, it's an act or judgment. I mean art that seems locked in an opaque glass box, so psychologically, culturally, or formally other that what begins as ignorance on our part in time harders into resistance. We WS DI PIERO

I've been trying to overcome my resistance to Indian art. It expresses a view of existence so un-like the Judeo-Christian view that, however exquisite or strong its imagery, I don't know the cipher that would release its meaning and liberate my merely formal appreciation into something more intellectually and emotionally compremore interfectually and emotionally compre-hensive. It's no more important to be familiar with Hinduism in order to appreciate an Indian picture than it is to know Christian theology to appreciate Giotto's frescose. But in each case the more you know about the civilization, especially the stories it tells to represent itself, the close you are to true understanding. Imagine spend ing hours looking at classically painted ewers and ing hours looking at classically painted ewers and kraters without knowing the Homeric stories or Greek mythology. The San Diego Museum of Art's current exhibition of South Asian paintings from Edwin Binney III's collection, "Power and Desire," is a boost to those of us who need to further our education.

The show illustrates patterns of power and desire in court life, erotic relations, and human desire in court life, croftic relations, and human-divine inferactions. The pictures, mostly watercolors, were made between the 16th and 19th Centuries for the rulers of kingdoms that comprised premodern India, Pakistan, Nepal, and Kashmir. In 1526 the Mughals (or Moguls) stablished a Muslim empire in India. The school of Mughul painting began when two Persian painters were brought to the court of Humayun and developed an Indo-Islamic style that would dominate Northern Indian art for centuries. Mughal painting originated the tradition of court art, consisting mostly of portraits of the emperor and his retinue. Later, under the 17th-century

and his retinue. Later, under the 17th-century rule of Jahangir, it produced crisply modeled album studies of birds, flowers, and animals. The conventions of court painting spread over the years to the Raijut domains in Northwest India and the Deccani court in the century of the convention of the co tral peninsula.

Court imagery has rigorously observed pro-tocols. The ruler is positioned above or apart tocols. The ruler is positioned above or apart from his courtiers and visitors. He's often the only one seen sitting; the others are spatially de-ployed to indicate rank. There's often a halo around his head to indicate rule by divine right, and around him, like books and armor in a Renaissance portrait, are the emblems of kingship a sword, shield, parasol, or fly whisk made from

In Jahangir and Sufis in a Garden, the king is elevated on a low dais fenced by trees that sepa-rate him not only from his attendants but also from the holy men. In the more egalitarian Raij put and Deccani courts, the king is sometimes set on a level with others, but even then his casually crossed legs distinguish him from others, whose legs are tucked under, an "at attention"

position. Less easy to read, because it's more embedded in Hindu theology, are images about the relation between human and divine orders. The core idea is multiplicity. No individual exists as what we is multiplicity. No individual exists as what we would call a "self." Each is a fluctuating entity defined by the relationships that contain it, relationships that are themselves constantly changing. A human exists not in isolation as a self-deterconnections. 

And Act Two opens with "Jeanette's Blues," a litany of showbiz horrors sung by vet-eran Kathleen Freeman, who may have lived each one.

Ours has been the Age of the Spectacle Musical: slick shows, with negligible content using a gimmick to bring in auusing a gimmick to bring in au-diences. It makes sense, in this climate, to create a musical in which people make a spectacle of themselves. The Full Monty has a built-in hook, but that's all. I can't imagine audiences sitting through any ten min-utes of this thing without the lure of men going all the way. The Question — will they? is the only edge the show has And the Answer will come as a relief to some, and turn others into graven pessimists.

Celebration of the Lizard, a mu-sical based on the Doors' opus, never sets "the night on fire." Much of the Doors' music explores uncharted territory Lizard, by contrast, is numb ingly familiar. The plot, the characters, the situations are so derivative, so pseudo, and, frankly, so pretentious they're

The music, throughout, is oddly watered-down. Only two songs get a fair shake: "The End," a harrow of feeling sung by Alysa Lobo; and "Tell All the People," with which Danny Peck brings down the house But "The End" gets sung for the demise of Antonio, a tyrant who doesn't merit such an el-egy. Peck encourages everyone to "follow me down," then dies. In these and other instances, the songs and the plot bumper

thud. We're in post-apocalyp-tic L.A., where "the brutal streets are here to stay," and all that's left are "fists and blood." that's left are "fists and blood." Whoa! Undaunted, our hero seeks a better way. After all, he shouts, "The future is all we have left!"

High and Dry

"Then there is my time - which is priceless."

et's get over this poor ruined band and move on to bands that are heading a revolution in the music industry. Bands that dare to be different, bands that are open-minded, bands that appreciate their fan base instead of laughing at them or saying that every female fan wants their penis...

And so reads the site at local

And so reads the site at local hand Buckats Superbee's domain name: www.buckfastsuperbee.com.

What started out as a helpful project by a friend of the band is now a defamatory site bashing the group. The website proclaims, "The gateway to bands better than Buckfast Superbee.

The Web designer, Mary Erin, was a Buckfast In the Web designer, Mary Erin, was a Bucklass fan. She came to practices, attended most of their shows. She approached the band with the idea of creating their website. Lead singer TI recalls that he was incautiously supportive of allowing her to register the domain name, saying, "Yeah, sool, some an horn whatmer sensions." cool...you can have whatever you want

Erin was introduced to the band in 1997 by their original bass player, Brian Thompson, who eventually was asked to leave the band. "But she eventually was asked to leave the band. "But she was supportive of us when we asked him to leave,"
TJ explains. "Because she understood what the situation was." The replacement bass player and Mary Erin didn't get along, however.

"[He] seemed to have a problem with me go-

ing to band practice," Erin explains. She says she was "hombarded with attitude"

and felt the entire band dismissed other bands

and felt the entire band dismissed other bands she liked.
"Nick and I were talking about the band Orgy," TJ recalls. "She's a really big Orgy fan. We were talking about a video I saw of theirs — it was a cover of New Order's 'Blue Monday.' And I was, like, 'It really bugs me when a band breaks through with a cover song,' She got really upset. She wigged out that we didn't like the band that she liked. She started really getting antisocial after that."

When the band began working on their new

album, TJ says he called her to suggest updating the site. "That's when she said, 'Well, I never got any money for anything,' And I was, like, 'Well, I didn't really know you wanted money. I had no idea how much it cost. If you wanted money you should have just asked. We're cool with that."

Erin remembers it differently: "I got an e-mail from TJ reporting that if I didn't update the page soon there were lots of people waiting to take my place. Needless to say I was kind of hurt and pissed off."

Erin explains that all the ex penses for the webpage came out of her pocket, including "\$70 for the domain name, about \$10 a SCENE TROY JOHNSON month for nearly two years for

upgraded hosting, about six roles of film and de-veloping costs...then there is my time — which

Erin admits, "I never wanted payment for the site.... I never wanted to be jacked around either." Buckfast was having problems with its drum-mer, Matt Burlile (whom Mary Erin had befriended). Dealing with the birth of a child and unable to commit to band practices. Burlile finally quit the band two weeks before their tour to Ore-gon for the North-by-Northwest Music Festival.

"We begged him to stay in the band," TJ ex-plains. "He just left us high and dry two weeks before we were supposed to leave for this big

The band picked up current drummer Milos Jahudka and made the tour. "There was no ten-sion in the band whatsoever anymore....We were like a unit. At this point, [Matt] called and said, 'Hey, man, maybe I should come back to practices.' And I was, like, 'I don't think it's going to tices. And I was, like, 'I don't think it's going to work out.' He got really upset. So he called Mary Erin, saying how we were manipulative jerks... and how we always hated her and never appreciated her for anything she ever did. Which wasn't true whatsoever, but she took all this to heart because

At this point, Mary Erin deleted the entire website from the Internet. "I obliterated it...two years of work. So a few minutes later, guess who calls? TI. Never ever called me before. [Fleasked.] What happened to the website? I told him! wasn't doing it anymore, and he got very threat-ening, so I told him off and hung up. Then I had a field day on my computer. What I wrote the first time through may have seemed petty, but in my

opinion it was and still is true."

After seeing the defamatory remarks on the site, TJ called his record label — Walking

Records — and suggested there must be some sort of legal action to take. "We looked into it a little bit. It turns out that there's not much you can do if they own the domain name, which she did. I knew nothing about Internet rules. I have a computer at home, but I barely ever turn it on "

The only possible le-gal precedent for the band is the Anti-Cybersquatting and Consumer Privacy Act of 1999, which prevents people from buying domain names of high-profile corporations with profile corporations with the intent of selling the do-main to the company later. However, as TJ says, he gave the domain name o Mary Erin in good faith which grants her rightful ownership of the site.

The label's lawyer sent
Mary Erin a few letters
suggesting they may take
legal action. "I think the
whole point of the lawyer thing was that they thought I was stupid and would crumble," Erin says. "I know what own-ership is — they had no ownership in the page whatsoever." "I didn't want to sue her." TI ex-

want to sue ner, IJ ex-plains. "I didn't want any money out of her. I didn't want to cause her any harm. I just wanted her to take that shir off of there. I didn't care if she owned the website name. I was thinking about buying it from her, but she blew the price of it out of pro from her, but she blew the price of it out of pro-portion." According to T1, Erin wanted \$3000 from the label for the Buckfast website. "So I just threw my hands up in the air and went out and bought Buckfastsuperbee.net." Buckfastsuper-bee.net is under construction. The band paid \$70 for the domain name, \$125 for the server, and a monthly fee of \$20.

TI wishes Mary Erin would listen to his side of the story. "If she wants to hate our band, she can. It really bothers me that she didn't take the



time to get the whole story, because as a person, she was a nice girl. We liked having her around— she's a really talented Web designer. We were always impressed with her, but she never really wanted to make up with us. I hate being blamed for shit I didn't do."

As for Mary Erin, she now operates her site in dedication to Burlile and Thompson and includes bands like Coal Chamber and Orgy on her site. The site remains anti-Buckfast (though it is currently nonexistent because she hasn't paid her renewal fee). She says that the band will neve name, claiming, "I get too much joy out of it."

Guitar and double-bass go very nicely, thank you, and there are quite a few splendid partnerships.

the double-bass (or contrabass, string bass, or just bass) began its jazz career pretty much as the stepchild in the ensemble, doubling for the trombone or tuba, even the cello. Its function, from the 1890s to the early 1940s, was consulted to the keep. he double-bass (or contrabass, string bass,

generally restricted to the keep-ing of time. It was — and remains — a large, unwieldy in-strument, difficult to manage strument, difficult to manage. Until the 1950s the strings of the double bass were made of gut and sometimes wound with steel. The bridge of the instrument was high ("high action" and a bit off the fingerboard which didn't make it any easie

which didn't make it any easier for elaborate fingering. And it was simply not very loud, often being drowned out by the other instruments. It was an important member of the rhythm section, particularly in the hands of some one like Walter Page (former leader of the Blue Devils) in the Basie band, where his playing pro vided one of the principal engines in the driving

vided one of the principal engines in the driving four-heat sound. It was Duke Ellington's brillant and short-lived basist limmy Blanton who achieved some of the first memorable solos on the instrument, making good use of its

strument, making good use of its arco (bewed) and pizzicato (plucked) possibili-ties with a technique that outstripped his predecessors. In his wake came the brilliant Os-car Pettiford, who also played with Ellington (and about everyone else worthwhile), who lived 14 years longer than Blanton but died 2 years short of his 40th birthday. Both players struggled with the instrument's high action and low amplification

It was with the advent of bop and "modern" jazz that the younger musicians began exploring the possibilities of expanding the range of the double-bass, lowering the bridge and toying with different sorts of amplification techniques; all that in tandem with more complex left-hand fin-

gering, which helped provide not only more involved rhythmic possibilities but also melodic ones that resulted in longer and more satisfying solo lines. The children of Blanton, artists like Ray Brown with the Gillespie band and the great Charles Mingus on the West Coast, were to bring the double-bus sour of the sculler-and

ble-bass out of the scullery and out front to the family table out front to the family table. The double-bass, and a succession of major figures on the instrument, had arrived. I find the big fat chocolatey

tones of the jazz double-bass especially with piano, or piano and drums - one of the most Bill Evans satisfying sounds in all of mu-sic. And so, apparently, do any number of other musicians and fans, because the discography for those two for-

mats is immense, almost always with the pianisi as leader. Which is not to say the bass doesn't do marvelously well in all manner of formats. With playing proin the driving

exceptions: there are not many, but there are several collections that consist of only double bass
or two double basses or doublebass and saxophone or doublebass and trumpet. Avoid these.
Guitar and double-bass go very

nicely, thank you, and there are quite a few splendid partnerships, two of which spring immediately to mind: Ron Carter (on bass) with Jim Hall, or Philip Catherine, a Belgian, with the Dane Niels-Henning Orsted Pedersen, more economically known as NHOP. There are plenty of others (like Joe Pase, for instance), but I'm not crazy about jazz guitar, Hall and Catherine be

ing exceptions.

A guitar can serve some of the melodic and harmonic roles of a piano, or many of them, which is why the tenor sax player Lucky Thompson's sessions with Skeeter Best on guitar and Oscar Pettiford on bass, an unconventional trio format, is one of the great swinging small com-bos available anywhere. It was recorded in 1956

and makes up half of the program of *Tricotism* (the other eight cuts having piano, drums, and trombone along for the ride). This is a disc that deserves an entire column (it's on my list of top-20 all-time iazz albums) but it's also a marvelous showcas

jazz albums) but it a salo a marelous snowcase for Oscar Pettiford; in fact, as good a showcase as he finds in his brilliant, truncated career. However, if you develop a taste for this swingingest of bass players, you might prefer the First Bass compilation from IAJRO, which is made

up of rare recordings and concert dates between 1953 and 1960 with a battery of wonderful groups and players. By the 1950s steel strings had replaced the less resistant gut, and the amplification of the dou-

ble bass also improved. A new generation of young bassists. generation of young bassists, picking up on the innovations of Mingus, Brown, Pettiford, and Blanton, continued their explo-ration of the instrument harmonically and percussively, with double-stop (playing two

notes simultaneously), using the instrument's notes simultaneously), using the instrument s body for percussive effects, plucking or bowing the strings between the bridge and the tailpiece, and also experimenting with electrification, as their contemporaries were doing with the guitar. One of the great young bassists (who was to die at age 23, only a year older than Blanton) was

Scott LaFaro, whose most notable work came with Bill Evans and Ornette Coleman, A good bass player's first job was and continued to be bass player's first job was and continued to be the keeping of time, but now the younger artists like LaFaro were able to add all manner of coun-termelodies, played in free rhythms. You can't go wrong listening to him on the Bill Evans al-bums Sunday at the Village Vanguard or Portrait in Jazz, from 1961 and 1959, respectively. The two collections make for some of the most beau

two collections make for some of the most beau-tiful listening in jazz.

Mingus in one of his rare trio formats can be heard at his thunderous best on Duke Ellington's Money Jungle, with Max Roach on drums. The three weren't getting along on this session, but it didn't spoil the result. You can hear the ferocity

didn't spoil the result. You can hear the ferocity of attack on the parts of all three players.

Ray Brown's career spans 55 years and is still going with his own excellent trio these days. A first-rate compilation of his career highlights can be found in the Verve "Ultimate" series, the 16 tunes here chosen by the ace young bassist Christian McBride, Ray Brown can also be heard on two of the great duo albums involving bass and

A surprisingly good compilation of various bass players in assorted formats is provided by *The Art of Bass* on the Justin Time label from Mon-treal. Whoever put this one together knew what he or she was up to. Go Git It!

annins play an important role in the ag-ing of wine, particularly red wines where pigmented tannins are crucial to the colour and sensory properties. Handling tan-nins during red wine-making is one of the most critical rere; a positionistic of the colour and the colour and

critical steps in optimizing the quality and character of a red wine, yet the process is based almost totally on experience and intuition because our understanding of the principles involved is still rudimentary."

As I reported last week, 1995 saw the addition of Alexander Mountain fruit to Stonestreet's of Alexander Mountain fruit to Stonestreet's Legacy meritage (a blend of Bordeaux varietals). When the fruit came in from those mountain vineyards, it inspired terror in Gilian Handelman, then an enologist for Kendall-Jackson, the com-pany that owns Stonestreet, "The Cabs coming off the mountain were so black before they'd even been extracted - they had just been crushed even been extracted — they had just been crushed into the tank." (The grap juice that becomes red wine derives much of its color — and some flavor — from contact with the grape skins after crushing, part of the process known as maceration.) The teeth of that monster were virulent tanribons and then sucking it dry. Such tannins might be tamed by extended aging — an uncommon practice in the American market — or they might simply doom a wine to life as a mas-

sive, unapproachable beast. Mountain fruit is characteristically more annic than valley-floor fruit, because "the soils are extremely thin and rocky. What that does is reduce yield size, but it also reduces berry size. Therefore, you have a higher skin-to-juice ratio," and since the tannins reside in the skins and seeds and stems, you have a higher tannin-to-juice ratio as well. But mountain fruit is

process seems counterintuitive;

since tannins are derived from skin contact, why would you ever seek to reduce tannin by increase ing time on the skins? But experience (experimentation?) wins out, as Handelman describes. "What happens, basically, MATTHEW LICKONA

is the tannins increase every day until it's almost unbearable. About three weeks into it. your palate is so screwed up because it's the most tanine wine you've ever tasted, and you get freaked out. "Though the total tannin content, by typical analysis, continues to rise, the thought is that the concentration of tannin is so high that you now have an opportunity for some of those molecules to polymerize, or somehow alter their shape so that they're no longer detected as as snape so that they re no longer detected as as-tringent compounds on the palate." Also, as Handelman noted, some chains lengthen to the point where they become too heavy to stay afloat, and so drop out of solution.

Handelman resumes the account. "The tannin chains polymerize and they drop out of solution, but the cool thing is, they don't all drop out. There are still a ton of them hanging out in



olonel William F. Cody (a.k.a. Buffalo Bill) came to San Diego to present his Wild West Show in September of 1902. Those were "sultry" days, according to a 1957

Union piece by Jerry MacMullen. "Special trains were...packed. Young and old forgot everything except the famous plainsman and buffalo-hunter, with his bronco-busters, his Indians and his troop of Cossacks. Everything which had to do with fancy riding went into that show, culminating with a spirited portrayal of the Battle of San Juan Hill, featuring Teddy Roosevelt's Rough Riders....

"In San Diego, as elsewhere, the show had been a financial success. When they got to Yuma, however, Cody showed that he could think of things other than gate-receipts. Word got to him that there were many Indians in the surrounding country who wished to see the show - but no show had been scheduled for that town. Cody ordered their special train to lay over: they unloaded their wagons and the rest of their gear, and in a canyon outside of town, to the delight of every Indian for miles around, he put on the entire show - for free."





As far as I can tell, my generation doesn't fly flags. Perhaps our distance from war has left us nepotists, on the outskirts of patriotism. My father's generation did fly flags, and does to this day. I remember how Dad would scramble out my second-floor bedroom window to ble out my second-floor bedroom window to fly the flag on appropriate holidays, and how two or three profanities would slip between his lips as his feet slipped out from beneath him. We had only one parade in our town, on Memorial Day, Dad was a retired Air Force captain, and his face would be lit with pride or these occasions, his cheers at their loudest Out of respect for Dad, and out of a desire to remain untainted by generational malaise, I decided it was time to outfit my new home with

a flag. I marched off to Home Base to nab Old Glory. They sold only one kind: a U.S. Flag Set by Seasonal Designs (\$7.99). It included a 3 x 5 polyester flag, a 6 steel pole, and a plastic gold eagle ornament. The flag looked cheap; the fabric was stiff and felt like paper. The pattern was printed on; the red stripes

bled into the white, the blue into the stars. The pole, being made of steel, would surely

rust. This was no good.
I traipsed around

to get a flag and pole for eight bucks. Prices to get a flag and pole for eight ducks. Prices have gone up. I've been flying my flag for 15 years. I put it out every morning and take it in every evening. I've had both nylon and cotton, but both seem to last only eight months to a year. The color fades, and they just seem to disintegrate. But I love to have a flag, so I keep buying them. Just think of all the money I've spent over the years. If you put Scotch

I've spent over the years. If you put Scotch-guard on it, you can get five or six more months out of it.
"I like the nylon better, because the color is richer, and it flows more fluidly in the wind. The cotton just kind of hangs there." Still unsure, I went home empty-

I decided to make some phone calls in order to procure more flag facts. I called custom-flag maker Prestige Flags in Mission Valley to inquire about the price of a 3' x 5' flag — the standard size for normal

the standard size for normal
use. I spoke with Elsa. "I can
only give you a tentative price
for a 3' x 5' flag," she warned, "because it varies with the work that is involved. It depends on whether the flag is going to be silk-screened, cut and stitched, or embroidered. You have to tell us what you want. A 3 x x5 tentative price would be \$70," and since their flags are custom-designed, there is a \$50 one-time

setup fee.

She gave me some general flag stats.
"We do all of our flags in 400 denier nylon.
That's just the range of the nylon itself—there's 200 denier, 100 denier—400 is the best. We also use an ultraviolet coating on th flag, which protects it against the sun. It will fade — all flags fade — but it won't fade as fast fade — all flags fade — but it won't fade as tast as others." I thanked her for her help but decided to look for something a little less expensive. Next, I called Stars and Stripes Sur-plus Store in El Cajon, to find out about flag etiquette. I spoke with a sales clerk, Chad, and he had this to offer: "If you're flying the flag t your residence, you can fly it any day you want to, except when it's raining. It should be brought in at night, folded, and stored in a clean, dry place. The military way to fold it in to fold it in half lengthwise, then fold it in half lengthwise again, and then do the triangle folding of it. If it's dirty or torn, it should be discreetly burned "Stars and Stripes Surplu discreetly burned. Stars and Stripes Surpus sells two 3' x 5' flags, a nylon (\$12.98) and a heavy-duty cotton (\$20). I rang up Flagship Distributors in Hill-crest. Laurie filled me in on the different flag

fabrics and qualities (all prices are for a 3' x 5

flag). "There's a whole variety of different flag). There's a whole variety of different-quality flags. The U.S. Flag you can get in three basic fabrics. You can get nylon (\$24). Peo-ple like it because it has a nice sheen to it. If you're going to fly it day to day, it's a good choice. Then there's the bulldog cotton (\$24), which a lot of people like because it looks traditional. But the problem with cotton is that it fades faster than any of the other fabrics. At the very top

of the line is the most durable fabri

which is the two-ply polyester (\$30).

That's the one we recommend
if you're going to fly the flag
night and day, where they
really take a beating." All these flags have embro dered stars and double

dered stars and double sewn stripes.
"There are a lot of flags that are Taiwan imports; they're printed on thin fabric that has an almost papery feel. It's a really thin polyester,

and the stars and stripes are printed rather than embroidered and sewn. The heading, which is that white stripe that runs along the edge of the flag and has the grommets in it, will be a really thin fab has the grommes in it, who so a really thin tab-ric, as opposed to the heavier cannot that the big manufacturers use to do nice-quality flags. If you would like to fly your flags every day, go with a nicer-quality flag, because the printed ones will rip in a matter of weeks."

Laurie explained that no flag will last

forever if it's flown all the time, even the high forever if it's flown all the time, even the high-quality ones. "Some people come in an tiell me that they've had their flag for 20 years, but they probably only fly it a few times a year. Oth-ers go through them much faster, especially those that live in the desert or really windy areas. What will happen is the flag will begin to fray on the fly end, which is the far end that whips in the breeze, or if wind isn't really a fac the colors will start to fade

tor, the colors will start to fade.

I decided I wanted to take a gander at these finer flags and headed to Old Town for a visit to All the King's Flags Discounts. When I arrived, manager Jane Cushman offered the same information on flag materials as Laurie but offered this about cotton and general longevity: "The cotton (\$28) is great for indoor use or light outdoor use. But the funny thing

about cotton is that it does really well in the

desert area — it really holds up well in hot con-ditions — but it doesn't do well on the coast.

"Depending on the area in which you're going to fly the flag, the longevity will vary. Gov-ernment recommendations say that a nylon flag will last only three months. However, in most cases, we're noine to find that a LIS. flag will last only three months. However, in most cases, we're going to find that a U.S. nylon flag will last anywhere from six months to a year. Some people get two, three, and five years out of them, but that's with limited use.

years out of them, but that's with immed use.
And if you're flying the flag 24 hours a day, up high on a flagpole, you'll be lucky to get three months.

"The important thing for flag longevity is keeping the fabric clean. We tell all our customers to wash their flag if it's out all the time. Wash it every two weeks in cold water with a mild detergent, then just rinse it out and hang it out to dry. This will take all the pollutants and dirt out of the fabric fibers. When dirt gets in, it rubs against those fibers and weak-ens them. Now, with fading, there's no way to get around it." Cushman had heard of the Scotchguard remedy and told me, "others say that if you soak the flag in vine

gar, it will slow down fading But nothing is going to stop it [altogether], because it's fabric." All the King's Plags Discounts sells the

embroidered stars-sewn stripes flags in 200 denier nylon for \$23.90 and two-

ply polyester for \$32.20. If you need the whole kit 'n caboodle, Cushman highly recommends the deluxe flag set by Valley Forge which includes 3' x 5' nylon flag, 6' aluminum pole, gold-plated plastic eagle, and flag brack-ets with flag fasteners (\$38.25). If you're on a budget, they sell a lightweight printed polyester

for \$10.

They also offer free UPS delivery and a free flag-disposal service. "A flag is to be ceremoniously incinerated. I have people send the flags to me from all around the country. the flags to me from all around the country. Sometimes, they'll even overnight the flag to us for disposal. Drop them off, send them in, whatever. We will take any size. We get them from the little-bitty ones to the massive ones. We collect them, and about twice a year, I take them down to the Elks Club in El Cajon. They have a ceremony out in the desert where they take all the U.S. flags and dispose of them






