When Lester Bangs moved to Detroit to join the staff of Creem magazine, we kept in touch with letters and phone calls that came less and less often. After he moved to New York I lost contact with him, and whatever lifestyle he lived or adventures he got into I only heard about long after the fact. If the rumors and hearsay about him are accurate, however, I am not surprised.

Because it became common knowledge, I will not be spilling any beans if I let it be known that Lester drank a bit. In fact, this matter of his drinking and drug taking is crucial to understanding his life story. I am reluctant to write about it. I was hanging with "Grand-stand Jack" at the start of the 1977

stand Jack" at the start of the 1977 winter horseracing season in Florida when he declared that we were packing and going to California for the winter; the big gambler couldn't operate in the dwindling mutuel pools of the Sunshine State anymore. Once in California, I caught on with a visiting Eastern praiser, named iting Eastern trainer named Sonny Hines; we won the Malibu with a horse named Cojak We shared a barn at Santa Anita with a California trainer, and I kept seeing these black-haired figures, with their brush boxes, slid-ing low from one stall to another without opening or closing the webbing that fronts a hone's stall but crawling under the webbing from one stall to another. They were doing this to save time. They wouldn't low-ride under the webbing when you were hot-walking a horse because it would startle the animal. They would

startle the animal. They would wait until you passed and the row was calm to low-ride under the stall webbing.

As a stranger for a new outfit in town — as a new hotwalker is likely to be — I was leery asking questions about the low-riding tactics of the California trainer's Mexican grooms. I remembered Mexican grooms. I remembered when I was green in Florida, I kept seeing a female hotwalker go in and out of an empty stall, and I thought she was going to the

bathroom to save time (the re-strooms were a hundred yards from the barn and your text room). Green! It turns out she had a fifth of liquor hidden in a corner of the vacant stall. 

"This is a story that hasn't been told," said Terry Weiner, co-chair of the Sierra Club's landchair of the Sierra Club's land-use and water committee in San Diego." It's tife story of our crummy municipal code that has changed recently from bad to worse. Weiner thinks Pep-perview Canyon is a wetlands, too, based on some arroyo wil-lows, shells, and puddles she photographed there a few months ago. The canyon may be a tributary of Paradise Creek, which feeds Paradise Marsh. Weiner also took photos of such native plants as California sage, laurel sumac, lemonade berry, and Mojave yucca. Whether the canyon hosted

any threatened or endangered wildlife and plants would be hard to prove now that part of it is bare, Weiner said. "Mind you, this is not a pristine wetland. This is what you would call a degraded canyon, but I was very upset by what I saw. If the canyon was revegetated again, it could be restored." Instead,

could be restored." Instead, "They made a mess. They flat-tened the hillside and ruined the natural contour." While admitting his confu-sion in dealing with various city agencies, Montgomery said he has tried to follow the rules and

not harm the environment.

"This is not a wildlife preserve," he said. "I find it ironic that community activists raise environmental issues when you have il-legal dumping." 



oot. Children, hippies, and kung fu masters do it, and since they're smarter than the rest of us, there must be something to it. Plus, what's the first thing we take off when we get home? Still, we despise bare feet in this country, and that, according to the Dirty Sole Society (www.barefooters.org), is criminal.
"We are a group of people," society founders

explain, "who love going barefoot pretty much everywhere, all the time (not just around the house or at the beach), as a lifestyle choice, including out and about on streets, stores, in the country, and hiking. We enjoy walking barefoot as nature intended, taking delight in feeling the many tex-tures the world has to offer, like having tough, callused soles and even think it's cool to get then dirty. We also hate wearing shoes and, if we had our way, would never wear them again."

The society's website is surprisingly thorough - part civil-rights manifesto, part compendium of scientific data and health-code law pertaining to feet, and part gibberish (e.g., "We work towards regaining the freedom our parents and grandparents had to go barefoot anywhere. We do this for ourselves and our children"). The site is not, however, a "sex thing" or a dating service. Foot fetishists, they point out, already have

Even more false is the belief that state laws prohibit employ ees and customers from being barefoot in restau rants and retail businesses. The California Department of Health Services responded that food handlers must wash their hands, wear clean clothes, and refrain from spitting and smoking but along with patrons have no restrictions regarding footwear. And though businesses in California may "impose whatever restrictions they wish as long as they do not deprive anyone of their civil rights," the state does not mandate footwear.

"Occasionally you do step on something uncomfortable, and it especially hurts if it presses into the soft arch."

What about hot surfaces such as asphalt?

"In general asphalt is either pleasantly warm or at least tolerably hot, unless the ambient air temperature is 90 degrees or over and it's mostly sunny. In such cases, there isn't much you can do. On particularly hot days, I will go from shade patch to shade patch and hang out until the burning subsides. 

The Experiences of San Diego Indians,

JULIE CHRISTIN EDSON MASTER'S THESIS

The History of San Diego County, California, written in 1888, alaims that "1833-1850 may be set down as the golden age of the native Californians.... Never before and never since did a peo-

ple settle down under the blessings of more diverse advantages." Julie Christin Edson's thesis looks beyond this sunlit rhetoric and sees a different picture.

When the missions became secular-ized, the Indians dispersed. Some went inland,

to the mountains and valleys. Others staved in the pueblos, looking for work. Others became laborers on the ranchos. Those goin inland could preserve native traditions and culture for a longer period of time. Those who stayed near the coast worked for belowaverage wages and experienced "rapid integration with Anglos and Mexican

The men became vaqueros; the women domestic servants. Work was so scarce that urban Indians throughout the region emerged as the poorest segment of society," earning at best two or three bullock hides per

Low wages put the Indians in an "ongo-ing cycle of debt." Rancheros would lend n food, then required work to repay the "loan." The cost of food was so inflated, the Indians owed weeks of labor for the dona-tion (one Indian worked one month to pay


off a two-dollar debt). An Anglo trave in 1834, observed that, on the ranchos, "the stock was herded by the Indians, who cost them but a trifle more than they eat; in fact, they always contrived to keep the poor Indian in debt, or at least to make the poor devil think

They ate "a pittance of food, boiled wheat or something of the kind, is fed to them in troughs, and this is the only compensation allowed them for their services."

Treatment of Indian laborers — who worked "under the worst circumstances for the slightest compensation" — became Cal-ifornia's version of slavery. In 1853, Father Narcisco Duran described the Indians living on the outskirts of Los Angeles: "All in reality are slaves, or servants of the white men who know well the manner of securing their services by binding them for a whole tries to flee experiences the full rigor of the

The Act for the Government and Protection of Indians, passed by the California legislature in 1850, demonstrates this "full

rigor." For example, any Indian found loitering or "strolling about, or frequenting public places where liquors are sold" could be arrested by "any resident citizen of the county." 


1. In 1852 an observer wrote that the Indians "...are a miserable and squalid-looking set, squat by the Americans; on the contrary, the effort seems to be to exterminate them as soon as possible.

2. Occasionally hungry Indians killed horses, sheep, and cattle, after which the robbed rancher rganized a party to hunt down the guilty Indians. This typically resulted in the killing of a number of Indians and the "taking of women and children as 'prisoners of war' to be sold as 'apprentices.'

3. Some estimates put the legal sale of Indian minors in California at 10,000. The illegal sale of Indian minors occurred at least as frequently, which places the figure at roughly 20,000. Furt the sale of minors did not end in 1863 but continued into the 20th Century

4. Indian women had no rights or privileges under law. In April of 1872, the San Diego Union reported that an Indian woman who had charged her husband, William Cant, with threatening to kill

Edson comments: "Rape and forced concubinage were accompanied by incidents of voluntary cohabitation and occasionally marriage of Indian women to white men. Desperate economic circum stances typically defined the foundation for these unions."

In Diegueño Indian society, for example, women enjoyed "equality and auton-omy" in marriage. I am dying, like all of us, a day at a time Yet, the dialogue with death that I sev ered when I was an adolescent has begun again. It must have been around the age of 12 that I began lying awake in bed at night and letting the darkness whisper to me about extinction: my own, my parents', my grandpar-ents'. Many children have these imaginings. What I remember about then is they were all terrestrial - they involved being totally, existentially alone, or sealed undead in a coffin, or becoming an onlooker at my own funeral. They had a dramatic quality that no longe interests me, that no longer attracts me. Then I put death away and got on with the business of being a teenager put all my money on the red, lived as if I were immortal.

For years the dialogue lay dormant. Death had little to tell me per sonally - it spoke more clearly and abruptly through the deaths around me. When I thought of death or spoke of it in reference to myself it was abstractly, as if death were a philosopher, could instruct. I often say that, You ave to live life from the angle of death; I already know that when I die I won't wish for another dollar, what I'll wish for is more free time, more picnics. 

not subject to the morbid curiosity of onlookers. But without addressing it, there is no way to understand Lester at all.

In some respects, not much has changed in El Cajon over the past 37 years. It's a little more crowded, a little seedier, perhaps, with more transients and with the lowlife population that comes when a city overbuilds apartment houses and the tax base is inadequate to halt the disintegration of the urban core. El Cajon is a bedroom community of greater San Diego, less affluent than some areas, rather more



WITH

integrated than it was in 1963. Back then, it retained traces of its agricultural past, the open lands and farm plots that got filled in with tract houses, strip malls, body shops, and the ubiquitous apartment houses. I remember horse pastures and vineyards in places occupied these days by parking lots and condos.







The Rolling Stones didn't

make the Woodstock festi-val. But they were determined to make up for that blank spot in their musical résumé by hosting a free concert when they finished their mega U.S. tour in the winter of 1969. Then the announcement came down that the Stones would have a multi humongous gathering of the tribes complete with hot opening acts, including the Airplane, the Dead, the Animals, all the San Francisco groups, and a lineup maybe even bigger than Woodstock.

It was a cool Decemb night at Roger's house in El Cajon when Roger, Jim Bovee, and Lester heard about the concert on TV or radio, and they all agreed to go north and make the scene. (I wasn') there that night, thank God. The three of them counted out their change, grabbee their cigarettes, six-packs and drugs, and piled into Roger's car for the drive to a hazily defined destination somewhere east of Oakland I believe that Lester wrot about the trip, probably included in his poethumoush collected book of his writings, Psychotic Reactions.

Roger was funny. In high school he played flute in the orchestra and was into clas sical music. Born into a family of amateur musicians Roger knew some of the most complex, sophisticated music in the classical repertoire, and he used to harangue me challenging me to turn away from that pop shit and learn about real music. He kept after me to play Bartók's Con over until I "got" it, likewise Varèse's Arcana. Roger knew his stuff and didn't much like the rest of the crap out there, until he got loaded the first few times and Lester blasted him with White Light/White Heat and Rolling Stones albums. Roger turned into the most fanatical convert and the classics were dis carded. The Rolling Stones were God. Roger slavered over the Stones, the Velvets, and Led Zeppelin, the louder the better. Personality changes were happening all around, as everybody got progres-sively twisted on drugs. Think-ing back, I find it interesting how important the mu was to us, how it mixed w the dope and the sexual rela ships and the politics.

an Diego boy Lester Bangs liked to rattle America's rock and roll cage any chance he got, and he's still doing it from beyond the grave. In the new biography from Broadway Books (a division of Random House), Let It Blurt: The Life INTERVIEW

a division of Bandom House, Let It Bluer The Life and Time of Letter Bang. America's Greatest Rock Critic by Jim DeRogatis, the reexamination of the Bangs mythos and a whack at the facts in the mater is getting more attention than might seem warranted. It is the story of a guy who wrote about rock and roll. And as Bang pointed out in his easy "How to Be a Rock Critic." Rock in "Toll's basically just a bunch of and gone tomorrow, so the only thing that can possibly trip you up is if you begin to reflect that if the mass?' that trivial, can you imagine how trivial what your doing is?"

Ever since, say, Procul Harum (just the first example that springs to mind, not necessarily the

ample that springs to mind, not necessarily the earliest), rock music has had a dangerous tendency to take itself so seriously that it is now reeking of to take itself so seriously that it is now recking of deazy, signs of livididy are pooling in to buttooks, and Bangs diagnosed it early. So it is that Tom Sinclair in Entertainment Weekly, armed with a lack of irony (EWis a bastion of anti-Lesterism—that is, a masturbatory promo-fis of bite-sized reviews noshing on the industry tit), writes: The final chapters of Burr, which document [Bangs] free fall into an alcoholic alyss, are as rivetting as the last third of Mantin Sconese's Good Pellal (and

When DeRogatis had annoyed his journalism teacher mough with questions about actual journalism, the teacher sent his student out in the field to interview a hero. "Just to get me out of his hair, basically." Shortly afterward, the high school senior sat in Bangs's living room.

"He was the sweetest, nicest guy in the world.

I spent a couple of hours after that. He was as interested in me as I was in him. It was not a testament to me, he was like that with everybody. He wa to me, he was like that with everybody. He was very generous and wanted to know what people were seeing and hearing and listening to. I was, like, 'Don't ask me.' He told me, 'When I was a kid in El Cajon, I took two friends and a big reel-to-reel tape recorder up to L. A. to interview Charles Mingus, who was a big hero. He was supposed to





his year marks the 250th anniversary of Johannes Sebastian Bach's death, so you will excuse me if I make something of a fus. His life and works were full of abundance, and it would take a lifetime to properly discuss his achievement. A number of brave souls have

A number of brave souls have deoted their musical energies to interpreting his enormous ocuvre, be it secular or religious, inatrumental or choral, keyboard or orchestra; or, for me, the most remarkable works of all: his Sonatas and Partitus for Vollim and Suites for Cello. I'm not sure which of the two I find more moving and brilliant, but more moving and brilliant, but I know the cello suites a bit bet-

ter, so let's go there. Bach, who was born in 1685,

Bach, who was born in 1685, reveived a dream appointment to the court of Prince Leopold of Anhalt Cothen in 1717. One would be hard-pressed to find an equivalent level of cre-ative production in any of the arts, not merely

music.

But it was something of an ideal situation for the ideal person at the ideal time. The young Prince Leopold, only 23 when he hired the 32-year-old Bach, "not only loved music," as Bach was to write of his patron, "but understood it." The composer was not loose with compliments of this kind. Bach's chief responsibility during this period was to con-duct the court orchestra, in which the Prince himself would on occasion sit in to play the viola himself would on occasion sit in to play the viola de gamba and to provide compositions for it. Bach, up to this point, had been regarded chiefly as an organist of great skill and for the remainder of his career would never be regarded as a composer of any great consequence, as was, for example, his contemporary Telemann.

At Cothen, not only did Bach enjoy the sup-

port of an enlightened young prince, but he was given a superb orchestra to work with, unusual given that Cothen was a small town in the hinter-lands. But at the time, a number of fine musicians were available after the dissolution of Berlin's most important orchestra, and the prince was willing to spend money to get them. Further-

more, the prince provided Bach with a formidable library of with a formidable library of whatever musical scores he could possibly want. Finally, Cothen was a Calvinist town, not Lutheran, so Bach was pretty much compelled to write secular as opposed to sacred

The cello had existed since roughly the middle of the fold. Century in more or less that popular instrument, especially in Germany. The first solon written for it were by Domenico Gabrieli in around 1675. The first concert for the cello were written by Jacolin in 1701. During Bach's lifetime it was the viola da gamba, the bear vol. that served the function of the cello and was the inserved the function of the cello and was the in-strument of choice, as it was with Bach's field Prince Leopold. And surely it would not have been lost on Bach that his explorations of the cello as a solo instrument would have captured the close in-terest of the prince. It is likely that the first performances of the Suites were given by the resi-ident cellist at Cothen, Christian Bernhard. Others suggest the Suites were composed for Christian

Ferdinand Abel or Christan Lingue, also available to Bach.

Whichever the cellist, he had never encountered anything remotely similar or of such extraordinary difficulty before. Of all Bach's traits, his sense of humor is not well documented, but he may well have been amused by the cellist's extraordinary difficulty to the may well have been amused by the cellist's extraordinary.

Bach's Suites for Cello remained largely unperformed or even discussed for nearly two hundred years. Even after the revival of Bach's music around 1830, the Suites for Cello were considered academic exercises and not worth serious attention, And it was not until 1914 or 1915 that any new compositions for solo cello were undertaken. ince this is my anniversary column, it gives me pleasure to tell you about a Japanese and continental restaurant downtown that and continental restaurant downtown that prepares exquisite food. The cheflowner of Octopus Garden is Taka Satate. Chalk up the familiarity of the name to Taka Restaurant, up the street on Fifth Avenue, in which this chef was a

REVIEW Avenue, in which this chef was a partner. Ideological differences caused Taka to leave — among other things, he wanted a space that could accommodate large parties. At his new location, an entire second story is available for banquest. What makes this lapaneer restaurant different from all others is that Taka, who trained in the country of the count ELEANOR WIDMER

Tokyo, also did a stint at the Marriott Seaport Hotel, where he learned to become a saucier. Ev ery one of his sauces is influenced by French uisine, and that's what provides unique flavor

to the most well-known Japanese dishes.

The sushi rolls are not inexpensive, but they are miniature works of art. We had a battera roll, which is made in a press box. Rice is placed at the bottom of the box, and then in layers are seaweed, white fish, crab meat, red caviar, and salmon. The top of the box presses these ingre-dients together, and when they are released, the dients together, and when they are released, the obbong is cut into squares. The salmon tops the roll, which is served with made-on-the-premises ory sauce that 50 win salt. The absence of a too-salty soy allows flavors to come through when mixed with wassile (green horseradith purvel and fresh slices of ginger (\$9.50). The second roll is called special eel roll and contains avocado, crab, cucumber, and barbecued eel, a crunchy ribbon that encircles the roll. hen we last spoke with John Hawley—
a winemaker who rode the rising tide
of collifornia wine through Jobas at Preway to the winemaker's paradise, total control in

"We were making Sauvignon Blanc, and [Lou Preston] was barrel fermenting all fo fit, which I thought was pretty neat, be-cause there was a lot of talk about barrel fermentation, usually within a kind of negative sense. At Davis, they told us that white wines shouldn't ever go into barrels; you could do it so much more easily in tanks." They had a point. Barrel fermentation is messy






