She lights up a New-port: "This is the first one I've had for 48 days!" She is slightly built, with short, reddish hair and an infectious smile. "Today was my court date - it was my fourth one. I was released on ime served with a stipulation of three years' probation, 18 months of alcohol meetin's months of alcohol meetin's and...somethin else, I forgot. I have to read my papers. "You wanna know why they

arrested me? They said I stole a car. "San Diego is losing out. I never noticed that until I went down there to those meetings in San Diego." During his stay at a downtown hotel, Armenta asked downtown hotel, Armenta asked a produce deliveryman where he was from, and the answer was Los Angeles. "Truckload after truckload of produce crosses the border from Mexico, comes up

border from Mexico, comes up here to Los Angeles, and goes back to San Diego."

Local merchants estimate that Los Angeles distributors now supply about half of the produce consumed in San Diego. In the initid 1980s, annual sales by fruit and vegetable wholesalers coun tywide surpassed \$300 million according to a 1988 U.S. Depart-ment of Agriculture report, Riaccording to a 1988 U.S. Depart-ment of Agriculture report. Ri-vals have emerged from the so-called full-service companies, such as Alliant and Sysco, that sell all varieties of food along with all varieties of food along with produce. Many national super-market and restaurant chains have eliminated local purchases of fruits and vegetables. "The produce industry has changed dramatically in the last

ten years. The competition is fierce in San Diego, and there's no cohesion among the local companies at all," said Dominic Moceri, president of Moceri Pro-duce. "The big issue isn't that produce vendors are moving out of downtown. The big problem is that there are locally owned hothat there are locally owned ho-tels, restaurants, and grocery stores that aren't supporting the local produce vendors. Some of these businesses are members of the San Diego Chamber of Commerce, and they're buying produce out of the Los Angeles

market."
Given such fragmentation, Moceri questions the effectiveness of a large produce terminal in San Diego, but he is not opposed to the concept.

Redevelopment in the East Village probably, represents the city's last chance to reclaim a business that's being lost to Los Angeles, say Tim Crabtree and Mohammad Zaidi, co-owners of Premier Produce Co. at \$26 J. of Premier Produce Co. at 526 J Street. 



young couples with children, waits patiently. The old folks smile at the babies, wave at them, kiss them. And the babies are, on the whole, quiet. Which is good because the sanctuary is small, the pews are close together.

oving is the hardest thing we do. It's less the leaving behind of family and friends how far away can we really get from somebody these days? — than the abandon ment of a nest that's so agonizing. Prospects of SIGHTSEER of having to wear a new atmosphere on your skin can seem less like prospects than caprices of evolution. Or worse even. A self-described teenage introvert turned prolific minstrel, the Gus, now 32, maintains a personal website (surfin.spies.com/~gus) that serves as a filing system for countless journal entries, writings, musings, and anecdotes pertaining to his life, which he's spent moving from place to place and abusing the narcotic properties of Robitussin cough syrup. Whether in Silver Spring, Maryland; a farm in Virginia's Shenandoah Valley; Oberlin, Ohio; Char-lottesville, Virginia; Ann Arbor, Michigan; or San Diego, the Gus has drifted between being a computer nerd, redneck, hesher ('a Philadel phia-area term used to describe someone who



listens to metal or thrash music'), hippie, envi ronmental radical, punk rocker, art fag, and even goth" with an "indifference to the opinion of others."

Despite what he describes as an anarchic spirit and a youth spent in "Redneckistan," the Gus was always an ambitious boy: he was obsessed with computers and attended Ober lin, the prestigious liberal arts college. In February 1996, he began work on a massive documentary project — a glossary of words that were peculiar to the vernacular of the transient residents of Big Fun, a youth commune in rural Virginia. His progress was soon interrupted, however: "I had," he writes, "a massive alter-







The Man Who Turned Fact into Fiction

One of the most famous bits of literary advice in the 20th Century was Sherwood Anderson's suggestion that William Faulkner write not about aviators and New Orleans bohemians (the subjects of his first two novels) but about that "little postage stamp of native soil" he knew so well, Jefferson County, Mississippi, which he called Yoknapatawpha County and which became the subject of his life's work. Lorenzo Madalena is no William Faulkner, but he also knew "a little postage stamp of native soil" well, and that spot is located here in San Diego, bounded by Kettner Boulevard (called Water Street when Madalena lived there) on the west, Columbia Street on the east, Ash Street on the south, and Laurel Street on the north. It is, of course, San Diego's Little Italy, and its main thoroughfare is India Street, where the air is charged with the savo traces of provolone, baccala (dried codfish),

continued from page 25 novel illuminates the dynamics of Italian family life, its melodrama and emotional turmoil, as he lived it coming of age in Little Italy in the '40s and '50s. He shows us what an insu lar network of repressive and interwoven feelings of pride, guilt, shame, longing, devotion, and loyalty an Italian fam-ily can be. This is probably true of any family, but Madalena that is distinctly Italian.

Madalena died of lung cancer in 1985, his novel long out of print, his work virtually forgotten. Lorenzo's older brother Angelo Guido Madalena, now 84, lives in a single-family brick house in University Heights. He told me about his family's history.

"My father emigrated from the Piedmont region of Italy when he was 18 because his family was poor. All they could do was milk a few cows and grow a few vegetables; there was no manufacturing. My mother also came over at 18 but a a different time because my dad was older than my mother. He came in about 1890 or so, roughly, and my mother was still a child then. As it turned out, the French Overture proved triumphantly successful, while in the Goldberg Variations the brilliant playing was somewhat undermined by an unsettling attitude toward the work's overall structure. In general, Romero's Bach has steered an au-

thoritative course between the past and the present. He is thoroughly aware of the authentic performance traditions of Bach's keyboard muperiormance traditions of bacin's keyboard mix-sic. He plays these pieces on an instrument unknown to their composer, the modern grand piano; but he keeps in mind the fact that Bach imagined them on the harpsichord. Where ap-propriate, he imparts a crispness of articulation to the piano sound, a certain discreet emphasis on non-legato or staccate playing, that recalls the sonorous world of the harpsichord without at-tempting to imitate it literally. His tempi are sensitively judged but tend more in the direction of briskness than of languor, as would suit an instrument restricted in its ability

erably greater diversity of colors idiomatic to the piano. It is the intelligent compromise we have become used to in informed modern performances of Bach on the piano: not Bach as his contemporaries Bach as his contemporaries would have heard him, but not Bach grossly and un-musically distorted. Indeed, a pianist like Romero finds authentic

constructive depth and ex-pressive complexity in scores pressive complexity in scores which, in Bach's time, may have sounded like lesser achievements. Shall we call this "virtual Bach," whose reality had to wait for the modern piano and modern, flexible approaches to Baroque music, in order to manifes

The French Overture, played this way by an artist of this caliber, is a great work indeed. In its formal relationship to the tradition of French keyboar suites, it belongs with the six Partitas. But here Bach tried out some rather But here Bach tried out some rather extensive experimentation with the form, more on the line of his orchestral suites. The result is less a harmonious unity and more a succession of inspired diversions. The writing itself is always at the peak of the suite of the superior of the super inventiveness; and - when played by artists like Richter, Schepkin, Kon-stantin Lifschitz, or Romero — the French Overture exhibits a special energy and wit, full of surprises, that give the work as a whole an identifiable tone. Street Smart

For every shot of hot religiosity or other sorts of pained yearnings there's a cool poised shot of momentary grace.

n 1955 and 1956, supported by two Guggen-heim Fellowships, the Swiss émigré Robert Frank traveled from New York to California, taking pictures that would make up The Ameri-cans, a book that has become a kind of national

album. In his fellowship proposal he said he intended to make "a

naturalized American finds to see in the United States that signifies the kind of civilization born here and spreading elsewhere." During the trip he took 20,000 pictures, selected and printed he took 20,000 petures, selected and printed 1000, then assembled a final group of 83 into a maquette he brought to the Parisian publisher Robert Delpire, who published it as Les Américains in 1958. On the back cover of the maquette Frank had written "America, America."

When Grove Press brought out an Ameri-

can edition in 1959, it was denounced and oraised for the same reasons: Frank's street part technique sometimes resulted in jarringly smart technique sometimes resulted in jarringly cockeyed angles, wooly focus, and perversely obscure lighting; his representation of American life was grim and grotesque, either cruelly aloof or creepily invasive; he was an outsider trying to show the truth of the American character. Frank's response to all this was to say that criticism can come out of love

come out of love.

The roughcut idiom of The Americans didn't come out of nowhere. Frank had served time as a fashion photographer for Harper's Bazaar and had illustrated stories and done portraits for Life, McCall's, Look, Vogue, and Ladies' Home Journal. One of the pictures I've looked at a dozen times yet never really saw until now is of a Hollywood starlet at a premiere. Her carved platinum hair and alabaster features rhyme with the theatre's art deco façade looming behind. It's an elegant allusion to the fashion photography Frank once practiced but one that humanizes and breaks the mold of its exemplar. In its way, the

Frank is rightly considered the artist who gave definitive shape to a new vernacular or common vocabulary. He rejected the facked hauntings, auras, and woory suggestiveness of air photog-raphy and turned nervousness into a photographic virtue. 

hey say the Actors Alliance of San Diego is like the movie It's a Wonderful Life. The Al-liance offers so many programs, for members and nonmembers, that actors can't imagine what life would be like without it. Not

long ago, the Alliance received a free computer from Technology for the Arts. How the computer came to Actors Alliance is a series of George Bailey Wonderful Life scenarios, links in a chain of service that goes

back 20 years.

It all started because some people wanted a theater festival. In the late 1970s, Kit Goldman, Sam Woodhouse, and Bill Purves, among others, me Woodhouse, and Bill Purves, among others, met at the Cassius Carter Centre Stage to plan the event. The only person not affiliated with a com-pany was Purves. He d been stationed in the Navi in San Diego, in command of USS Molala (ATF-106). A grad student at the Yale School of Drama, Purves wanted to return to theater. When he left the Navy, he volunteered his services.

The group met often. Beneath the question, how to put on a festival, lurked another: don't you need an organization to produce it? In time, the idea of an organization became more important than the festival

"Everyone else had a full-time job," says Purves, who had "no pressing need for employ-ment." For the next two years, he toured the country. "Every mature theater community has country. Every mature theater community mag a nonprofit organization that helped sell tickets. Some, like TKTS in Times Square and the BOSTIX in Boston, had centrally located booths. Some also sold tickets by mail. But each produced money

By 1982, inspired by Purves's research, the group developed the idea of an organization for San Diego. Purves began attending opening nights, from the Old Globe Theatre to the Pine Hills from the Old Globe Theatre to the Pine Lodge, and asked their representatives: If we a league of theaters would you participate?

a league of theaters would you participate:
Many wondered, in private, what the deal
was. An organization to sell tickets and raise visibility of theater? What's the agenda? After a
period of speculation — and, several heads of

period of speculation — and, several neads of companies confess, some frantic phone calls— the theaters agreed.
"No one said no," says Purves, "Who knows what they thought it would turn into, but there was no downside. The ticket booth would give them a check every week." Purves adds, "New ideas do not gain support quickly in San Diego. We're lucky the city is full of people who don't

It's one thing to have an idea, quite another to follow through. It took two years, from 1982 to '84, for the San Diego Theater League to have its first official meeting, several more to raise funds, find a site for the Arts Tix booth, and and notice. an executive director. In 1986, a temporary booth opened. Alan Ziter, who became ex-INTERVIEWS

ecutive director in 1986, says of Purves, "He looks at things in ways JEFF SMITH

Purves, "He looks at things in ways others don't. He saw the value of theaters working together — why didn't they realize it themselves? Bill was beaten back a number of times: lack of funding, people skipping meetings, abdicating responsibility. I give him credit for saving with it. He could've walked away ten times and nobody'd have faulted him."

and nobody d have faulted him."
The organization has since become the San Diego Performing Arts League, a model for similar institutions around the country. To this day, Purves swears he was "just a facilitator. It was never my show. It was always our show." He simply wanted to "make a contribution to this city."

ply wanted to "make a contribution to this city."
Sam Woodhouse respectfully disagrees: "Bill
was one of the early enlightened heroes. He
stepped forward, in the dark ages, and helped
make San Diego a more viable theater community. His advocacy was visionary."
Every year the San Diego Performing Arts

League celebrates the George Baileys of local the-ater: its volunteers. One hundred twenty-five arts organizations name their behind-the-scenes
"star of the year." No recipient works professionally in the arts. "They're dry cleaners,
accountants, businesspeople," says Ziter. "They've
found a way — and the time, which is remarktound a way — and the time, which is remarkable, that people spare that kind of time — to give an organization 5. 10, even 20-plus hours a week." Volunteers paint flats, telemarket, track down props and costumes, usher, or serve on boards. The show must go on, and wouldn't, in countless cases, without them.

The Defroncing Art; Leagues calls it is honor.

The Performing Arts League calls its honor the Star award. Each year, it also gives a single Gold Star award to an individual whose efforts benefit the entire community. By unanimous vote, Bill Purves received the first Gold Star in 1992. Bill was a natural, saps Ziter. Take most of us, he came from somewhere clee, wanted to enrich San Diego's cultural environment, and made an inestimable difference.





o really understand this music issue, you have to understand the geography of Sweetwater Unified. It stretches from the Coronado Bridge and the 5 freeway east to 5 pring Valley. It is huge. The majority of the population is Latino or Hispanic," says Keith Ballard, music instructor in the SCENE

The ones who use their craft to make a living are the ones who re-ally respect what I do because they know the real world does not revolve around traditional band and orchestra.... One music administrator told me that he felt there was no interest in mariachi music in this community. He said, 'That music

belongs south of the border."

When Ballard started at Montgomery High, he was in charge of band, marching band, and choir." I took the idea [of a mariachi band] to the president of the school board, Mr. Bob Griego.

Mr. Griego and Dr. Ed Brand [su-

perintendent, Sweetwater district] said, 'Let's go with it' and found \$100,000 in scholarships. Mr.

Griego is also president of the San Diego Mariachi Foundation. This rifoney is to pay for the instruments, music books, and instruc-tion. Each kid who signs up automatically gets a

\$1000 scholarship." In May, the school board approved an additional \$100,000 to start a mariachi program at Southwest Junior High School. Over 130 kids have igned up for the new school year. Only 25 students





Openness of the World for God

These meditations for organ will not sound terribly familiar to you.

Bach walked 200 miles from Arnstadt just to hear him play) might be surprised to learn of the extensive litera-ture for the instrument in the 20th Century. To be sure, Bach and the Baroque are the Bach and the Baroque are the Golden Age for the organ, but there are significant works for the instrument throughout, including 12 concerti for organ by Handel, and then, in the 19th Century, a good-sized body of work from Liszt, Saint-Sagns, Frank, Widor. Saint-Saëns, Frank, Widor, and Bruckner, an organist himself who incorporated the instrument into his orchestral symphonies.

Its pertinent that three of the above — Saint-Saëns, Frank, and Widor — are French, because two of the most consequential composers for organ in the 20th Century, Poulenc and Messiaen, are French

However reli gious its inspiration, the gious its inspiration, inconcerto (with string orches-tra and timpani) is never solemn, though in its slower sections there is a reverential mood. of Burgundy. It is clearly 20th-century in conception, but one is able to make out borrowings from the Baroque, Classical, and Romantic eras, also some early 20th-century English melodic motifs in the string sections. All in all, it's a most curious 22

It's a most curious 22 minutes of music, gal-loping, then prayerful, and concluding with a grand, dissonant flourish of or-gan and timpani. It is charming, and Poulenc cannot help but be, but it is haunting as well, a bit surreal at points, and unformertable.

Messiaen is something else altogether. Charmmessaen is onceining este and entering has nothing to do with his oeuvre, not least his extensive works for organ. He is the century's greatest ecclesiastical composer, and his Native de do Seigneur (The Birth of Our Lord) is, I think, the most magnificent of his dozen or so com-

positions for organ.

after Débussy, Messiaen was himself an impor-tant organist, like Bach, holding the post at L'Eglise de la Trinité in Paris for 20 years, beginning in 1931 with an extended break during World War II, when he served in the French

World War II, when he served it army and spent two years in a German prison camp. All of Mes-siaen's music is in the service of "the theological truths of the Catholic faith, human love, and Catholic faith, human love, and nature." He was dogmatic, chauvinist in his musical tastes (Debussy, Honegger, and Milhaud above all others, no matter how superior) and a genius.

Messaien's harmonies are unique, deriving from bird song and Hindu music among other exotic sources. His rhythms are

irregular in meter, and like a num-

irregular in meter, and tise a num-ber of composers who followed him, he employs dense, static textures of sound. The Nativité du Seigneur was composed in Grenoble in 1935, and its mountains inspired certain passages among the nine movements, which are intended as an homage to Mary. which are intended as an homage to Mary.
I'll limit myself to a few general observations
about Messaien's procedure, because his Nativité du Seigneur truly requires an extended, learned
essay that incorporates, among other things, the
composer's own theological meditations. Messiaen didn't think of
harmony like his contemporaries, not Iruly

temporaries, not truly making a distinction be-tween consonance and dissonance. Rather, Mes-siaen envisioned chords as colors and considered there to be a formal re-lationship between the lationship between the two, certain sounds and chords providing him

Further, Messaien sought to extend the vocabulary of rhythm with borrowings from the ancient Greek and Indian rhythms, which open up the possibility of rhythm and thereby express ropenness of the world for God." To put it more plainly, these meditations for organ will not sound terribly familiar to you (like Bach or Poulenc, say) but are completely organized and amount the most recompletely organized and amount the most are complexly organized and among the most beautifully prayerful compositions of the West.

(One particular performance is worthily done by Hans-Ola Ericsson on the Grônlund Organ in Sweden's Ludea Cathedral.) It may be out of print, but if you can find it, there is a magnifi-cent recording of La Nativité by Jennifer Bate on the organ of Beauvais Cathedral from Unicorn

(DKPCD 9005), which Mes von't be easy to find. Two of my favorite liv

ing composers have also written for organ with wonderful results. Sofia Gyong Ligen

woke Christian symbolism, such as her piece for cello and organ. In Croee, which can be inter-preted as "cross on a cross." In the piece, this crossing is achieved by the organ, with its con-templative mode, and the cello, with its estatic mode. Like all Gubaidulina compositions, her use of unusual instrumental combinations prouse of unusual instrumental combinations pro-vides unique and hypnotic timbres, harmonies, and textures of sound, always managed with a controlled but powerful intensity. Ligeti, on the other hand, is fascinated with tone clusters and densely chromaticized sounds. He has achieved these effects orchestrally as well

He has achieved these effects orchestrally as well as on the organ, which fascinated him with its "awkwardness, its stiffness, and its angularity." He compares it to an artificial limb and was "intrigued to know how one might learn to walk again" with it. In his composition for organ, Volumina, Ligeti explores the dynamic possibilities of the instrument, specifically the "feasibility of continuous crescendi and diminuendi." The result is a wall of sound with shifting colorations of tone, a sound that washes over the listener moving him, if not closer to God, moving him regardless.

s it a new season yet? A new mil-lennium? Nothing less than a new era, a new epoch, would be welcome, but a calendar will not announce it.

LaBute wades into the mainstream, above the ankles, over mainstream, above the ankles, over the knees. He, as we learned from In the Company of Men and Your Friends and Neighbors, is a filmmaker uncommonly tough of mind and of hide. That toughness, along with that almost reptilian coldness, is patently of less use in a less "realistic," a sillier, a screwballier comedy, where laughs a screwballier comedy, where laughs are a more accurate measure of suc-cess. (Less use, I should say, unless in coping with the consequent criticism.) The increased silliness is here unaccompanied by increased laughs.

The idea, in its barest bones, sounds The idea, in its barest bones, sounds 'as if it ought to have had some laughs in it: a small-town soap fan gets it into her head that she is the one woman in the world for the furrowed-browed neurosurgeon on A Reason to Love. But each piece of flesh, each article of clothing, added onto those bones will

has less to say about soap fans in general, and about their blurred borderline
between reality and fantasy, when the
fan in question suffers
a psychotic break. And
the event that precipitates the break — the
literal scalping of her

cient ugliness to put a damper on laughs for the duration. Maybe this is laughs for the duration. Maybe this is LaBute's signal to us, as the waters of the mainstream climb up his calves, that he has not lost his toughness. And maybe the husband (LaBute regular Aaron Eckhart, with a white-trash "shlong" haircut: short on top, long in the back) is himself of sufficient ugliness that we are expected to be able to enjoy his mutilation. But then again, maybe this is simply a sign of LaBute's insensitivity (distant synonym of "toughness"), comparable to his seeming blindness to the monstop

his seeming blindness to the #Gnstop ugly photography.





or the past couple of weeks, I have been or the past couple of weeks, I have been writing about Ray and Loretta Falkner's recent purchase of Temecula Crest Winery and their hopes for national recognition through improved production and marketing. New land management, new varietals in the

vineyards, new barrels, and new equipment have all been elements in their initial efforts at improving production. On, then, to marketing. Their first efforts have been

concentrated on the existing MATTHEW LICKONA

concentrated on the existing INVALITIES structure. When I arrive, Lorest leads me through a section of the winery that has been converted to a meandering shop, chockfull of wine paraphernalia. Past the shop, temporary walls have been set up to create a private tasting room. Grape stencils abound, sprucing up the wooden walls. On the other side of the building, an outside tasting bur has been built, so that customers enjoying the lawn may sip out-of-doors. Construction will soon be ur derway on a new patio along the front of the building, one wide enough to accommodate ta-bles, so that visitors will be better able to enjoy

Ah, yes, the view — west-southwest, look Ah, yes, the view — west-southwest, look-ing back down the valley from a commanding height. We feel we have the only winery that's on a hillside, a crest, "explaint Loretta. We want to market the view." Ray tells me that "one as-pect of the whole marketing plan is to make this very much a tourist destination. One of the ma-jorassets of Temecula is that, within 15 and 20 niles, there are somewhere between 15 and 20 million people. That's not true in Napa. It would million people. That's not true in Napa. It would be a foolish marketing plan that doesn't take that into consideration." He admires Thornton's jazz concerts as a model for attracting visitors with events that allow them to come out and make a day of it — rather than just cruising about and sipping at each stop — and hopes to turn Falkner Winery into a similar sort of

What Thornton doesn't have is the view. What I hornton doesn't have is the view, and the Falkners aren't stopping with an expanded porch. They unroll sketches of an additional facility, built into the hill alongside the original. Two stories—a catering and reception area on top, barrel and

"We want to design it so it's

Temecula didn't spawn the GWS — it is supposed to have arrived in Southern California on ornamental plants shipped from the Southeast — nor did it send the devastating insect northward to destroy its more celebrated sect northward to destroy its moc celebrated neighbors in Sonoma and Naya. (Egg shave been shipped north, but by nurseries, not wineries.) But as the articles detailing new sightings of the GWS pile up — most including some mention of Temiculus as the first region to suffer the bug's effect — the region to suffer the bug's effect — the region runs the risk to being seen as Patient Zero: where I all started. And even if



the threat is successfully contained, the words "Temecula" and "Pierce's disease" may becoming inextricably intertwined in the public

imagination.

Falkner have their work cut out for them. They
want national recognition, but to get it, they
may have to contend with a national reputation that precedes them. They can take comfort, how-ever, in the fact that so far, marketing remains ever, in the fact that so far, marketing remains their biggest problem. "It goes without saying that, in every vineyard in the area, there is some occurrence of Pierce's disease," says Ray. "We didn't like that...nobody likes to know that you're losing some of your vines. Fortunately, there is a relatively small occurrence in this vine-ture. Here again, Falkner Winery is fortunate. Pointing to the cit-rus behind his vineyards, Ray comments, "They spray those pretty regularly. One of the other reasons we liked this property is that this citrus reasons we liked that this citrus in particular has gotten extensive spraying. It's part of their experiment. You should hear some of the other owners, saying. Why didn't they pick the citrus behind my [vineyards]!". Adds winemaker Steve Hagata, "Callaway had a certified organic citrus orchard [behind them], and they weren't going to spray there.

But I swear," he says, pointing to a vineyard or the next ridge, "as you went up to the top where it butted up against the orange grove in the win-tertime when there were no leaves on the vines, you could go and shake it, and there would be clouds of these things coming up. It was really


