Jeff Smith was far too gen-erous in declaring Sledge-hammer Theatre's keelhauling of Samuel Beckett's Krapp's Last Tape a "masterstrok Last Tape a "masterstroke" (Theater Review, September 14). Substituting videotape for audio diaries was an intriguing "director/auteur" gambit; unfortunately for the play, the overwhelming visual stimulation of identifiable locales and nucle female flesh locales and nude female flesh on the video monitors served on the video monitors served principally to distract the audience from the live pro-tagonist's reactions to his

dant lobbying efforts in that regard. We are contributors to a fund that is trying to eliminate the estate tax,' Hal Puson, Copley's chief counsel, told us. 'There was nothing particularly surreptitious about it.' "Copley was not alone as a media lobbyist. "An investigation by CJR and the Center for Public Integrity found that since 1996, the 50 largest media companies (defined as companies that derive half or more of their revenues from broadcasting, cable operations, publishing, online media, and their content providers. and four of their trade associations have spent \$ 111.3 million to lobby Congress and the executive branch of the government."

▲ ■n late 1985, we fled Kabul and crossed from Afghanistan into Pakistan in the dead of winter. We walked ten days and nine

nights. There were about 60 peo-ple in all. Friends, neighbors. Eight members of my immediate family. We walked through mountains, going from village to village. It was bitterly cold. I still have nightmares about that trip, about the cold. It's funny how something that happened so long ago can still give you bad

Driving west on Adams Av-enue near the Texas Street bridge, Hamed Alemi stares straight ahead. He sees sunlight glint off the tops of tall palms. The blue, blue sky. He clears his throat and

points downward at the driver's seat of his blue San Diego Cab. "The minute I sit down in here, whatever I did yesterday or ten years ago, whatever it is I do before or after my shift, doesn't matter. I put it all aside. I put the past aside. I put my ego aside. I'm

For the past 20 or so years, taxi driving has been the eco-nomic point-of-entry for hun-dreds of the city's best educated, or at least most ambitious, im ants As Barbara Lungo who migrants. As Barbara Lupro, who heads the Metropolitan Transit Development Board's taxi-administration office, explains, Whenever there's trouble in the world, we feel it in this office. If may be, we get an influx of li-cense applications. Often, the ap-plicants are well-educated, highly motivated people. Engineers. Academics. One gentleman from Iran had owned a factory and employed hundreds of people. They come to this country and their degrees are useless. They

want to get ahead. And, if you think about it, taxi driving provides an excellent introduction to American life. You learn about economics and city government It's sort of an advanced course in

works." Before Alemi got a taste of the American system, he and his family spent 18 months in refugee camps in Pakistan. He and one of his four brothers found work with the Salvation Army, administering first-aid and teaching basic sanitation. "In Kabul, my father was an

attorney and worked for the cen-sus bureau. We belonged to the educated middle-class. We weren't wealthy, but we had enough to eat. In the refuge camps, we were among the fev being able to read and write wa a tremendous advantage. "We certainly never dreamed

that we would end up in Ame that we would end up in Amer-ica. We were glad to get out of Afghanistan with our lives. So, we did the best we could. Then one day we got word of an un-cle who had disappeared during the war with the Soviets. We had no idea where he was. A friend of his came to Pakistan and York City, to Brooklyn. It was by chance that my uncle's friend found us.

"And so we went to Brook and so we went to Brook-lyn, and we were there for only about two months. On the sec-ond or third day after we arrived, we went into Manhattan. It's

hard to describe what a shock it was, having gone from Kabul to a refugee camp in Pakistan to, suddenly, New York City. It was ove to Clairemont. Five of us move, to Clairemont. Five of us living together. I had to go to work. At first I washed dishes, worked in fast food. I got a job an amazing thing. But we didn't working for a credit union. First I worked as a teller, then I adhave enough money, not even have enough money, not even for a security deposit for an apartment in Brooklyn, so we went to Rochester, New York, where housing was much cheaper. The people there, espe-cially our English-as-a-second-language teachers, were wonder-ful to us. They encouraged us. I was 16 years old and had basically finished high school in Abbanistan My ESI teachers. I worked as a teller, then I ad-vanced until I was working with loans. A bank environment is a friendly one. You have to smile all the time. Smile at everyone. Some of the smiles are sincere others aren't. I knew I didn't want to spend the rest of my life smiling at people. I wanted an education. But I was providing as much as 60 percent of my Afghanistan. My ESL teachers family's income

"My parents, however, were very homesick. It was difficult for them to be so far away from an Afghani community. A friend of ours encouraged us to come to San Diego, where there were more Afghanis. We made the

understood that I very badly

wanted to go to college. They helped me. They gave me books to read. They helped me get into

"A friend of mine suggested I try working as a taxi driver. I de-cided to try it. I went down and passed all the tests and got my license. I started at Yellow Cab which is where most immigrant drivers start. At that time, Yellow Cab charged only \$70 to lease one of their cabs for a day. I started working on weekends, and I liked it. For an immigrant starting out in America, there's probably no better job. Where else could I work three to four days a week, 10 to 15 hours a day? Driving a taxi allowed me to work full-time and go to school full-time. Also, I was making almost twice as much as I ing almost twice as much as I was making as a loan officer at the credit union. Of course, I had to set everything else aside. I had no social life. I was either at work or I was at school or I was studying. When I was driving for Yellow Cab I even chose to work at the airport, which a lot of drivers don't like because you have to wait in line. But waiting in line

gave me time to study."

Two years ago, Alemi switched to San Diego Cab, an Afghani-owned company with about 100 drivers, 60 of whom are, like Alemi, refugees from

Afghanistan.
"I'm very proud to work for

San Diego Cab. Akbar Majid, the owner, has done a lot for the Afghani community. I'm very proud of him. He's done very well, and he's built a good com pany. We have a lot of loyal cuspany. We have a lot of loyal cus-tomers, mostly in the beach communities. We're known for having the cleanest cabs, the po-litest drivers, the lowest rates. It's a good example of what we Afghanis are capable of, We've been in America for only a short working people, I'm proud that we kicked Russia's butt. Here in America, in five to ten years you're going to see Afghanis in all walks of life. You're going to see a lot of Afghani businessmen like Akbar, a lot of Afghani doc-

tors and lawyers and dentists. "I just graduated from San Diego State with a degree in bi-ology. After all these years of driving a cab and going to school, I've been accepted at the dentistry school at UCSF, which is one of the best dentistry schools in the country. Very strong on research. All those years of not having a social life have finally paid off. I'm mar-ried now. I have a one-year-old son, Imron. UCSF has helped us get into married-student hous ing. A two-bedroom apartment not far from the school for only not far from the school for only \$1000 a month. So, it's all worked out. You know, we work and study so hard for the second generation. That's why we do it. For our families."

As Alemi drives up High 15 toward Kearny Mesa, he talks about the celebrities who've ridden in his cab — famous ath-letes, Governor Deukmejian, William Bennett. When I express surprise that he recognized Bensurprise that he recognized Ben-nett on sight, Alemi laughs and waves a hand in the air. "Of course, of course, I rec-ognized him. I saw him on C-

SPAN all the time. I love Ameri-can politics. I've followed all the elections very carefully. I think I have a good understanding of both parties. I was very happ when Bush won in '88. At first you know, the Republican Party seems very attractive to Muslim immigrants. The talk about the family, family values, responsi-bility, abortion. But if you pay close attention, it's all just talk close attention, it's all just talk. They say one thing and do an-other. Newt Gingrich. Bob Liv-ingston. Very disappointing. I've been following Al Gore for years, and I'm definitely going to vote for him. I think he has the expe-

rience to be a good president."

Alemi pulls into an industrial park and stops in front a nondescript blue building. He gets out of the cab to stretch his legs.

"This is the Afghani Cultural Center. It also functions as a days for prayer. They come here during Ramadan. I've been here so many times. It's nice to get to

From where he stands, Alemi can see the mountains to San Diego's east. It's very quiet in the

"Kabul is in the mountains you know. High up. We're far away from open water. It used to be such a beautiful city. And out-side Kabul, some of the villages were the most beautiful pla you've ever seen in your life. Peo nle tell me that my family's village is abandoned. There's no one there to take care of it. I want one there to take care of it. I want to go back someday, I want to go back and do something to help ym yeople. When I hear about my village, or when I think about what happened to Kabul, it was as as did but not said that I don't want to go back. The said is the next."



discusses her childhood difficulties. "I was 13 when I got pregnant with my daughter. I had her when I was 14, so my mom has raised her. I had a

rough childhood. My father shot himself in front of me and

my brother, and he shot my mother too. We were in a car, driving down a freeway. My fa-ther died and my mother hung

on. She was Mormon and he was in the military when they

started stripping at 18 and get-ting into drugs. Before I only smoked pot and drank, but the day I turned 18, I started stripping and getting into cocaine. My mother never accepted me back home, and I've never been able to live with her. We still don't get along to this day."

It becomes apparent that Stewart lives a complicated life. Jail is just one more complicado what you're supposed to, you're treated fairly. There's a lot of times when I question the way the deputies act and how things are done, but I have to say that when you first come in no matter what your charge is — they treat you as guilty un-til proven innocent. It's unfair and inhumane the way they treat you when you first arrive They treat you like you're a criminal the minute you walk

in the door, no matter what you have done. You're stripped of your rights, you're stripped of

your morals, you're stripped of everything. Your pride, your in-tegrity, everything you have about you is stripped at the front door once you walk in.

"Once you've gone through the first six hours of jail, the rest can either get better or worse. It just depends on how you act the first six hours you are here." This last stay was not as bad as in the past, she says. "I know the routine. I keep my mouth shut, and I do what the deputies tell me. I am not looking for any trouble, and this is not a place where you want to have any "I've been here a few times, and each time has been differ-

ent. Things are getting better. Five years ago, when I was in on drug charges, things were very, very bad in here, very inhu-mane. People were treated very badly, inmates weren't listened to, they wouldn't let you be clean. They still don't give you products that you should be getting. I understand that they pay jails \$50 a day for each in-mate from the taxpayers, yet we

have a hard enough time get-ting toothbrushes when they're stolen.
"There are fights in here. The really mean girls are kept in a different section, but if the eigh fight, they are immediately. in a different section, but it the girls light, they are immediately taken apart, and everybody goes on lockdown. Things have gotten better. But as far as deputies being somewhere when they're supposed to be, doing what they're paid to do, I don't see that happening a whole lot. For instance, earlier

"I gotta say this, out of the I gotta say this, out of the 100 percent of the deputies here, 20 percent of them do their job. That's it. The other percentage come to work and hate their job. If I came to work with the attitude they have, I'd I'm just speaking personally,

because I'm so different from a lot of these people in here. I'll think, 'What can I do not to get myself in this situation aga

again."

Stewart makes no excuses for her past. "I've served time on drug convictions, but I no longer do drugs. I used to be a dancer, and to stay skinny we all did crystal. There's been no all did crystal. There's been no more drug convictions in five years, and I should have gone to my classes for domestic vio-lence or I wouldn't be in there Unlike most newly released

prisoners, Stewart has a law and-order ethic that colors her view of jail. She credits her jail erybody just wants to get out

and do their dope — just go back to the same old bullshit that got them in here before. They're reducing everyone's sentences here, which I think is kind of bad. Honestly, there were two girls in here that I was in court with today. They were caught at the border with 100 pounds of marijuana. You serve one day for every pound. These girls will be out in a month! There are women in here who are total drug addicts. They re-lease people with no teeth, people who look anorexic. A lot of these people are in here for

for drugs years ago, I got stuck to the wall with my sentence. I got no slack, no leniency, and no reduced time. I was in here

o reduced time. I was in her

for five months one time. That and losing my child — that's what got me off drugs. I said, 'Enough is enough.' That line

was not worth losing my one-year-old child to him." She laughs and points to the young man. "He's the one who called the police on me! He's totally the opposite of me. I try to date guys that are totally the oppo-site of me. They don't smoke. site of me. They don't smoke, they don't do drugs, they don't drink or do anything I've ever done in my life. It kind of leads me down the right course." The young man smiles. Currently, Stewart works

Copley's devotion to Nixon is shown in a series of letters, housed in the National Archives,

that he wrote to Nixon during his presidential campaign in the fall of 1960.

September 16, 1960

Dear Dick: As you know, I am going to do everything possible through the Copley Newspapers to assist you in your campaign I feel so vehemently that we need you as the next President of the United States.

In your campaigning, I certainly hope you will not overlook San Diego. It is now the nineteenth city [sic] in the country. I believe I can swing a lot of the votes into your column. However, I feel it is imperative that you include this city on your schedule to be sure you will get the full support you deserve. I discussed this with [Union editor] Herb Klein. He assured me you were going to come here, but I thought I would take this opportunity to personally give you my sentiments on the subject. I wish you Godspeed, and am rooting for your election in November. Please do not hesitate to call on my orga

nization if we can help you.

On September 26, 1960, Copley wrote to Herb Klein, the San Diego Union editor then "on loan" to the Nixon campaign, complaining of Nixon's

vised debate with John F. Kennedy the night before: Dear Herb:

As a personal letter to you, I wish to say that I think Dick came out second best in the "debate" last night. I think the campaign played up Kennedy, Kennedy looked fresher; Dick looked tired, and I thought it was a shame that his suit did not appear too well on the set that I was look-

Also, Kennedy's expression seemed to indicate that he was ready for anything,

whereas Dick's expression was very studious but to the point where it looked almost like he was mad or disturbed. I cortainly hope we can do better

That same October, Nixon wrote back to Copley, expressing gratitude for his support:

Dear Jim: I want to thank you for your letter of September 22 and tell you how much I appreciate your efforts toward insuring a big turn out on October 11. Needless to say, I regret that we won't be able to get togethe during my trip to San Diego.

papers had "delivered" San Diego to Nixon during the closely fought 1960 presidential campaign, was long dead. But Klein, Smith, and others survived.

Q. So how did you finally catch up with C. Arnholt



The reason I've gone on about it at length is that this interview was conducted very early on in a five-year project that included more than 1200 interviews. It took on a special significance for me when I finally started to look at the area that has been getting such hoo-hah in terms of instant media frenzy: the allegations that things got so bad that Richard Nixon hit his wife in 1962.

Most people say Nixon never played around with other women. I have looked into indications that he did on occasion. I have found virtually nothing, and I have looked hard. [Nixon was] a tormented personality whose emotional problems most certainly affected his career and his behavior at key times and including during the presidency. Of course, the personal life is legitimate territory for a biographer.

Arnholt Smith, who had

known Nixon from childhood, recalled an episode during another party in California. "I was looking for my wife and - jeez! -I couldn't find her. 

spiracy. But the story behind why it was called conspiracy is that, as often happens with

books, late in the day I was sitting in McGraw-Hill's office in New York with my editor and publication team. They were saving, "What are we going to call it?" I was coming up with various ideas. They were saying, "No, no. The vogue these days, it's got to be one word." They wanted, you know, one-word titles, like Epic or Legend or whatever. On the assa tion, what was it to be? So I said, "Well, that's very hard to say, you see. " but this was just after the House Assas sinations Committee had come out with the conclusion that Martin Luther King was killed as a result of a con-

spiracy and that John F.

Kennedy had probably been

killed as a result of a conspiracy. So as the author, I piped up from my chair, "A Conspiracy Probably," And, you know, when they finished throwing tomatoes at me and bad eggs and saying, "You can't call a book Conspiracy Probably." The editor or the publisher said, "That's it! We call it Conspiracy." So over my protests it was called Conspiracy. And the rest of the inside of the book makes it completely makes it very clear that I take no particular view and that the view, the word "conspiracy" comes from the ver dict of a congressional

But when the book was

reissued two or three years ago, I insisted that the title be changed and it has been republished as Not in Your Lifetime. That's the title. So I had it republished as Not in Your Lifetime because when after the Warren Commission report was published, Chief Justice Earl Warren was asked whether all the information they'd had would be published. He said, "It will be published in due course, but there are some matters involving national security and they, I think, will not be released in your lifetime." And hence, Not in Your Lifetime

Nearly 40 years have seed If it was so simple that the one lone wacko hit killed the president from the book sitory that day, and with the Cold War over and all intelligence methods and sources long since redundantly out of date, it's an insult to the intelligence of the American people to say that anything should be withheld and, of course, numer ous intelligence things that have to do with the assassi nation are still withheld. So my view is simply that if there's nothing there being hidden that's of substance, then let the whole thing out.

is extraordinary. There's a passage on that. It's quite extraordinary because, of course, there were long, long ons of the Senate Intel ligence Committee, in which estioned people high and low from the Eisen hower administration, from the Kennedy administration, from the Johnson administration, about who knew what in the White House. 



Disobey's very simple purpose is to line up all the Internet's wunderkinds against a brick wall and mow them down. The site purports to be an antidote to the rampant hype and shameless media strokes buttressing the online industry. Indeed, the good news is a scourge. As if the pathetic interactive segments on the evening news — wherein we're forced to listen to Peter Jennings cue cuts to Web pages rather than old-fashioned video clips — isn't embarrassing enough, now we're faced with Dennis Cass's essay, "Let's Go: Silicon Valley!" in the July issue of Harper's.

The essay annuls that magazine's 150 years of incisive, intellectual cynicism, substituting for it a gross endorsement of optimism and capital. Cass says that his years of chortling at the "punishing hours, overvalued stocks, the webheads" has been "neutered by all those delicious

millions and the meaty pull of destiny." The essay massacres everything that is sacred to the resistance.

"Every age has its Left Bank," Cass writes at the beginning of his exposition, "the place where hot, restless souls test their capacity for adventure, the place, like Silicon Valley today, where people are more alive than you or L" Rather than people are hander any email you or L. I want that the lake it is market out of this preposterous insult, Cass concludes, "Regardless of what happens to the market in the short term, we're all signed up for a Silicon Valley existence in the long term. Someone needs a shot in the arm.

Disobey's medicine comes in two forms. First are its Net Slaves pages — "dedicated to every-one who's been burned by the incompetence, moronic planning, and hysterical management of New Media companies" — which are successful enough to have spawned a 1999 book by

the same name. Subtitled "Horror Stories of Working the Web," Net Slaves gets its potency from its accuracy. Most of the content here comes from present and past employees of Internet companies, many of whom are bent on undermining the main commodity of their employers — that is, the myth that tech jobs are

asked Dennis Wills, proprietor of D.G. Wills Books in La Jolla, how he came to be a bookseller. "That's a very long story," he said. "It involves espionage intrigue, years working for the National Security Agency and for Zbigniew Brzezinski - right before he became Jimmy Carter's national security adviser - encounters in Europe with great bookstores like Blackwell's in London, and, especially, two books that made a deep impression on me, Somerset Maugham's Razor's Edge and James Hilton's Lost Hori zon. It also involves my father's illness that brought me back to Southern California after all those years away. Where should

"How about at the beginning," I said.

Dennis has been selling books in La Jolla for 20 years, first in a tiny, narrow converted office space on La Jolla Boule. vard, and later in his present location on Girard Avenue. He collects photos of authors with books in their hands, statues and figurines of people reading books, book presses, and all sorts of other paraphernalia associated with books. There are several paintings and photographs in the store based on a famous painting called The Bookworm by the 19th-century German genre painter Carl Spitzweg, which shows an elderly man, apparently a scholar, on a ladder in front of a row of book shelves with a book under each arm, one tucked between his knees, and yet another open in his hands. This is a man who can't get enough of book knowledge, and he seems emblem atic of Dennis himself.

When I suggested to Dennis that he consider developing a website or at least catalog his rare and valuable books for one of the many used-book sites on the Internet, he looked at me as if I had gone loony. "You know," he said, "someone walked in once and asked if we had our inventory online. 'No,' I told him, 'our books are on the shelves. We walk over to the shelf and look.' Imagine that!"

One of Dennis's colleagues, Chuck Valverde of Wahren-brock's Book House, at 726 Broadway, San Diego's oldest bookstore, recently underscored the feeling many independent booksellers have today. He likened book dealers to dirigible pilots or carriage makers. Some dirigible pilots learned to fly airplanes, and some buggy makers started manufacturing automobile chassis; others went out of business. Dennis shows no sign of adapting to the new technological realities of bookselling, but his bookstore remains a gathering place for the literati and a must destination for serious book lovers throughout Southern California. As I looked around the splendidly disarrayed yet orderly chaos of his one-of-a-kind La Jolla institution, I felt like I was in the middle of an archaeological dig.

Nearly every square foot of space in the store is used. Yet Dennis et " manages to host regular literary readings — aisles

crammed with folding chairs, usually spilling out into the street — where speakers carry the word to faithful attendees. There is bric-a-brac everywhere: small Chinese sculptures, hand-carved busts, tribal ceremonial masks, a Laurel and Hardy poster, baseball caps, and, tacked all over, photos and letters and ellowed, curled newspaper clippings. Next to the arm of six or seven thick dictionaries proclaims the prominence of words in this place. Over the archway that connects one part of the store with another hangs a huge two-man crosscut saw, symbolic I think of the trees sac rificed to produce the books Dennis has sold. As if to emphasize this symbol, next to the counter is a circular five-foot-long shellacked as a podium for authors at his Friday- and Saturday-night readings. Among the writers who have stood at that podium are Allen Ginsberg, Gary Smyder, Norman Mailer Gore Vidal, Yevgeny Yevtushenko (three times) and Nobel Laureates Francis Crick and Derek Walcott.

Dennis talks about writers with reverence, and he obviously feels honored to have had these literary figures read and sign books in his store. I asked him why he held them in such esteem. "Because it's knowledge," he said. "We're surrounded here by knowledge. To whatever extent members of our species are capable of understanding our failures or our potential is through knowledge. Our brains are capable of creating the symphonies of Beethoven or Brahms, or works of art that will excite us like those of Picasso or Michelangelo or Da Vinci, or words, stirring words that stimulate our thoughts and carry forth ideas about justice or freedom or individuality, as in the

works of Thoreau, or Emerson, or Plato. And then there are characters in novels, plays, and short stories that give these ideas that acts in moves, pays, and mort stories that give these locas flesh and bones. While Hegel or Kant write very difficult books that only a handful of philosophers are going to fully under-stand, a character in a Tolstoy short story contemplating good and vil can speak to many more people who do not have serious, rigorous philosophical training. "As I listened to Den-nis talk about books, philosophy, art, music, and religion, sur-rounded by his tens of thousands of books, I nearly became convinced that hordes of people are rummaging through The Death of Iwan Illych, hungry for ideas, instead of staring at

Who Wants to Be a Million aire on TV. For him, books have a transformative power and they certainly have trans formed his life.

"I wasn't always inter ested in books," he told me. Especially as a young man. I was born in Los Angeles in 1946. My parents came out from Nebraska during the Depression to Los Angeles and I was their only child. My dad went to medical school in the Los Angeles area, and my mother worked at Newberry's department store. My parents, I guess were Presbyterian. We didn't go to church that much because my dad was mainly at the hospital on Sunday mornings, and he was inter ested in sports medicine and sports in general. He ran track and was a pole-vaulter back day we were never church goers in a formal sense.

"I went to California Military Academy for sever years and had a pretty good education there, I guess, Small not board And I went to Lutheran High School, which was then in Inglewood. I played football, in great part ause my dad had played football, so I became very interested in sports. I loved football and particularly the Rams." Dennis looks more like an auto mechanic than a bookseller. The flattened oily, nondescript baseball cap he nearly always wears seems to match his frayed khaki shirts his stained and unkempt jeans, his heavily worn brown walking shoes with tears between the sole and tops. These details com bine to produce the image of a man who is, let's say, casual about his appearance. His friends and employees kid him about being so "fashion" conscious. His graving goatee and dark-rimmed Clark Kent glasses are the only professorial touches about him, and even they blend into his artfully careess sartorial ensemble

Lots of things in the interests. One of the first things you notice when you walk in is several huge pulleys and hooks suspended across wooden beams near the ceiling. 




It's parked in the 'Bat Cave,' a few blocks from here. My friend John Hughes came up with the Bat Cav name because the Model A Ford lives there and there's an automatic garage door. The Model A is black and it looks sort of like the Batmobile. I also have most of my private library over there mainly some works of philosophy that I used in Oxford and some works in Soviet studies from my Columbia days. Some works inscribed to me from Brzezinski and other professors of mine. Some books inscribed to me from people who have read here - Mailer, Ginsberg, Gore Vidal, Françoise Gilot, Oliver Stone, et cetera I keen them together on a shelf. I don't look at them that much, but from time to time if there's something I want to review I'll pull it down. Books in my own library consist of books

"As it turns out, perhaps I'm a failed blacksmith or caretaker of a 19th-century hardware store from a John Ford movie, I sort of like the notion of the cracker barrel-potbelly stove-hardware store phenomenon. It has a lot of historical roots in America. So I've tried to make the bookstore like a bar, or combination bar-hardware store And I think any bookstore can function in that way. It's a place to hang out, browse around, and talk. And so that's why the store looks the way it does." It's also a little bit of a gas station and barbershop (there are two barber chairs and a gasoline pump in the store), two other traditional hangouts where male members of a community gather to trade observations about sports, politics, religion, as well as "life, the universe, and everything.

"How come you have "Well, I'm down to two at one time I had four and a

half barber chairs. There was a half a harber chair that I picked up that I was going to finish in wood, but I ev tually gave it away and I had another that I also sold, bu now I'm down to two barber chairs — the original one, which is over there, and ther the newer one. A barber chair because, well, again, a barbershop is a place where a lot of oral history occurs, and barber chairs are sturdy. Children can't break them. Lots of kids come in and like to run around and touch every thing, of course, as we would at that age. For them it's sort of like Tom Sawyer's island here because there are a lot of artifacts and it's a perfect place to run around and hide So I like the barber chairs because they remind me of, oh, I don't know, that crackerbarrel, community-store barbershop phenomenon in which oral history occurs.

"As to what I read? Peo ple in the book business tend to be an inch deep and a mile wide. Just in the course of shelving books on every conceivable subject we might learn a little bit about some-

thing. For example, since we've been talking about the Bat Cave, this morning when I was ordering books, I ordered a book called Bas Bomb from the U of Texas Press for a number of reasons. There's hardly anything you can thinl about that somebody hasn't written a book on. that kind of a book. Some one was probably looking for a dissertation topic and spent a few years researching the potato famine in Ireland and it went from there. We learn something new every day in the book business. It's the uncommon books that we like to discover and grab."

I reminded Dennis that I still wasn't clear about how he got into bookselling, "How come vou didn't open a hardware store or bar?" I asked.

"Well, I think the beginnings of that are my experi ence in the Air Force I would have been drafted into the Army, but I enlisted into the Air Force, I was attracted to the Air Force because I heard about a language program that they offered. I went down, took some preliminary test and passed them. And so I was able to go into the Air Force And in California Military Academy I had three years of Latin and then one year of Latin at Lutheran High School. So I must have had a linguistic facility to some extent. I enlisted in the Air Force in September of '67 and went to Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio Texas, when I was 20. I got at the end of '68 and then went to intelligence school at a little place called Goodfellow Air Force Base in San Angelo, Texas. It's a little hole in the wall in the middle of nowhere, so intelligence tra ing can take place and it's hard for people to approach it without being seen

"The funny thing is that in San Angelo, like many of my classmates, I wasn't sure what I was being trained for At first when we were in language school we thought that we might be using the Russian language in some diplomatic capacity to help in some aspect of Soviet-American relations. 



Or they re like me: they have some pets and one or two kinds of breeding birds." Many members' birds live indoors, but often breeding pairs are kept outdoors. That's why there are so many breeders in Southern California because most exotic birds come from tropical or subtropical environments, and they can adapt to our relatively mild climate." The Runyons' mousebirds are native to sub-Saharan

Africa.

Don't imagine that bird-breeding resembles, say, dog-breeding. Studs need not apply. Some smaller birds, like canaries, will switch maters. But most birds, especially parrots, mate for life. They really have to like each other. Then they have to lave a cage that's comfortable and a nest box they like.





Williams said that Sin Boldly! began as a text "just for my students without any though to foulbilsing. It's grown in these funny little leaps. Originally it was just Xerox copies put on reserve in the library. I told the students, I didn't want to have to waste time explaining all this nonsense to them. Finally, I said, 'What the heck, if they're going to Xerox it, I might as well put it together and sell it to them. Why should the Xerox company make the money?' So I had this little thing that I made myself and stapled together. That was called, Making It or Faking It. Then somebody persuaded me to try to sell the darn thing

at bookstores. So she helped me do a self-published edition that was enlarged and called Sin Boldly!" This latter edition, said williams, came out in 1992. The publication wasn't a great success. "Stores," he said, "wouldn't handle self-published books; magazines wouldn't review them. You have to be part of the dis-

tribution pipeline."
Williams had sought out an agent to help him publish a book he'd written on the '60s. The agent was not enthusiastic about the book. Because it wasn't memori, it wan't history, it wasn't quite literary criticism. And then the agent asked, 'What about this other little book you have, this writing book? Let me see a copy of it. 1 sent it to him, and he started trying to find a publisher for it. So I put the '60s book aside and spent the last two years rewriting, fixing up, and adding to Sin Boldly!"

The book's title is taken from a statement made by Protes-

The book's title is taken from a statement made by Protes-tant reformer Martin Luther — "Sin boldly, but believe more boldly still." Williams writes in the chapter, "Choosing a Voice". "The only difference between Harvard students and commu-nity college students is that Harvard students think they are right even when they are wrong, and community college studes think they are wrong even when they are right. The amount prior knowledge or the ability to think are about the same, belie me. I've been there. The students who get into Harvard are t ones who adopted (or were given along with their trust funds) self-confident voices early in their careers and stuck with them They are not self-confident because they are smart; they are what we call 'smart' because they are self-confident. So be assertive

Don't be a wimp."

Williams said, "I've always been convinced that many people seem to be smart simply because they have an ideology against which they can bounce ideas. And so they come off as being smart. And if you have a dogma, it doesn't really mean you're smart at all. And sometimes people who don't have a dogma are

a lot smarter because they didn't just fall into the first ideology they stumbled across. They kept their minds open. But because they keep their minds open, they're not sure what to say, what to do, and I must say, when you're reading all these sophomore papers, it's rally tedious. When you come across somebody who ctually has an opinion and who's willing to stick their neck out

it's really quite a delight."

American dergyman Jonathan Edwards's doctrine of justification by faith, said Williams, is useful in thinking about writing. "Edwards's whole idea of justification by faith is that, "Hey, we're all sinners, and you can't be justified. Once you accept The state of the s

You've got to get used to the idea of speaking up, and if you can't speak up and make a fool of yourself, in front of 19 other students, in a crasy little college classroom, how are you ever giot stand up in a big hall at the board of supervisors meeting, or write a letter to the editor that's printed for thousands of peo-ple to see! In order to participate in the democracy and to make the system function, people have to be willing to stand up and make fools of themselves.





Bach may have invented the concerto for key-board and orchestra, but the form itself—as well as its types of melodic and harmonic invention— he modeled on the three-movement Italian inhe modeled on the three-movement stansars in-strumental concerto. Just as in composing his keyboard partitas and orchestral suites, he took the French tradition as his model (and in many the French tradition as his model (and in many ways surpassed i), so in these concertos he made the Italian idiom his own, outvivalding Vivaldi (so to speak). The propulsive, electrically energized fast movements, often virtually in perpetuam mobile, and the supremely lyrical slow movements, with their moving affect and the delightful sonorities of the string accompaniments (the pizzicato movements are particu-larly outstanding in this regard), regularly make one think of Vi-valdi and his compatriost, though with the special touch of individual genius that Bach brought to all his "imitations" of national styles. What is completely new, how-ever, is the unique interplay of timbres and textures made possible

when the solo instrument is not a when the solo instrument is not a violin or an oboe but a harpsi-chord. The quality of innovation is carried even further when, as is carried even further when, as in so many modern performances of the Bach concertos, the harpsichord is replaced by a piano. As always in such substitutions, there are some losses and some gains—a loss in historical authenticity and in irreplaceable sonorities of the harpsichord, a gain in dynamic expressivent and in the different but equally attractive

and in the different but equally attractive colors of the piano. There is, above all, the wonderful timbral effect of the treble notes of the piano playing in unison with the violins. Bach can never have heard this delectable sound, and the Romantic piano concerto rarely offers occasion for it. But it was fully and gloriously in evidence at the Neurosciences Institute and no interior with real musical instincts could have wished it otherwise.

This is not to say that the concert was an ideal one. Bach certainly never intended for five of his



Greeks Have Only Pain

Want antiwar relevance? They don't make it like they used to.

n a way, Greek tragedy has the form of a late-night talk show: an always-present central figure (Oedipus, or Hecuba in *The Trojan* Women) and a series of guests. On TV, the guests come, in order, from strongest to weakest, biggest name to smallest, and the host en

REVIEW tertains throughout. In Greek tragedy the arrivals rank from weakest to strongest. Each is a JEFF SMITH

messenger. Each has worse news

messenger. Each has worse news for the central figure who, in the end, will "curse the light that proves you're still alive." Euripides's Trojan Women begins where Homer's litad ends. The Wooden Horse, its belly full of Greeks, fooled the Trojans. The city's now in flames. The victors divide the spoils, which include the women of Troy. During the 90-minute drama, Queen Hecuba becomes as embattled as Troy itself. She watches her children killed or carried off and suffers with Lear-like intensities

ried off and suffers with Lear-like intensities.

The women of Troy experience unthinkable upheaval. Life in prewar Troy was Edenic. The tenyear-war sheltered them from the world. Now the survivors, still hearing the cries and curses o dving comrades, not only must leave their beloved e, they will become slaves to the Greek generals. Almost to a person, they naïvely cling to

It's hard to find words for what Hecuba at-tempts. To say that she helps the women "cope," for example, reduces her majestic compassion to psychobabble. She consoles them, assuages their

grief, and, at the same time, toughens them for a griet, and, at the same time, toughtest until the ahorrific tomorriow. Hecuba also has her own losses to mourn: husband Priam, valiant son Hector, a city in ruins, countless others murdered (the Iliad, though an epic, has a small-town, intimate

acquaintance of practically everyone). Also, she must confront her

slave. She knows — a hallmark of
ancient Greek tragedy — that the
dead are far better off than the living. Nonetheless, she fights her own war, throughout, to keep a manger of hope alive.

was discovered on the Internet by Star 100.7 DJ Mark Jagger. "In my 20 years of radio, I've never experienced anything like this," said Star program director Tracy Johnson. "The first time we exploded.

Johnson said he had long
wanted to pluck a song from
the Internet. "My motivation
was to find something that nobody else had, to give me a competitive advantage." But



Johnson said wading through the sea of songs available on MP3.com and similar sites made the search futile. "It's so time-consuming. Most of it isn't very good.

Then he spoke with a longtime friend who now works at Farmclub.com, a website that signs artists like record companies. He gave Johnson a list of promising artists, and Johnson in turn

artists, and Jonnson in tur gave the list to Jagger. "I' was amazed at her voice, The lyrics are incredible," said Jagger. "I'm not a big ballad

queen, but the song is almost haunting in its beauty," said Kristi Knight, Jagger's on-air partner. "You don't get raw emotional purity like that

The song was first played August 29. A week later it was added to the Star playlist. Fisher is singer/ songwriter Kathy Fisher and producer/keyboardist/cowriter Ron Wasserman. When it became clear the song was a hit on Star, the

L.A.-based couple was invited to perform it live on Jagger and Kristi.

"When they were on, people called up and started crying," said Knight. "One woman said her husband was cut on deployment and the woman said her husband was out on deployment and the song reminded her exactly about how she felt about him. Another woman said she just sent her son off to college, and the song reminded her how much she missed him."







"And that day I suddenly realized the people standing around me could not name the notes without seeing the piano. It was a great surprise.

Perfect pitch, or absolute pitch, is defined as the ability to produce or identify a par ticular tone without reference to an external standard. It includes not only the ability to iden

standard. It includes not only the abully to iden-tify a note but to sing one too. According to The Concise Oxford Dictionary of Music, "Absolute pitch is really an innate form of memory," Absolute pitch is a universal term, even though in America, "A" is 440, and interna-tionally, "A" is 435. "It's a five-hertz difference... If you have a sensitive ear, you can tell the dif-ference. It's also true that different orchestras, both in the U.S. and elsewhere throughout the world, will tune differently from each other. So it's not really between Europe and the U.S. Cer tain conductors are known to tune their orchestras sharp...they sound brighter that way. There's an overall tendency for orchestras to tune sharper and sharper... Some orchestras to tune sharper and sharper... Some orchestras tune even sharper than 440, and this is hap-pening in both Europe and the U.S." Hertz is a cycle-per-second, which can be thought of as a wave. Deutsch likens it to the

effect that occurs when a light is attached to the wheel of a bicycle. If the bike is then driven in a straight line, it will form a slight up-down

"A sound is a large number of simple waves; it's a complex tone consisting of many simple tones," she says. Pitch usually corresponds to the lowest component of that complex tone.

Because of the characteristics of perfect pitch, when a note is heard it is heard "categorically," she says. "When I hear the note C, it can be flat, sharp, whatever. It doesn't matter to me because

I perceive it as a C. There is a range which is C, and out of the range is the next step up...
"White notes are more readily identified, even if you have perfect pitch, than the black notes. If your earliest lessons are on the piano, notes. If your earliest lessons are on the piano, you would have started off with the white notes. So we believe it has something to do with early training. People will claim perfect pitch that barely have it, and there are different degrees of having it. The other thing is that people are better with the notes around the center of the piano keyboard than pitch. In general, people with perfect pitch do better identifying white notes in the middle range than in the extremes. People tend to do better

than in the extremes. People tend to do bette on piano notes than on notes from other in struments, especially if that was their first

Relative pitch, on the other hand, is a musical skill that can be learned. It is the ability to produce every other note once a reference note has been played. People with perfect pitch don't

need a reference note.

Perfect pitch is rare. It's estimated less than
1 in 10,000 people have the ability. They are often musical prodigies or harbor exceptional
musical abilities (among the autistic, the incidence of perfect pitch is 1 in 20 — all musical savants appear to have it). Mozart, who could name the note of a bell or timepiece, had it; Nat King Cole had it; Andre Previn has it; Deutsch's son has it. She says when he was a toddler he tapped on a balloon and told her, "This plays F sharp."

Why some have it and others do not is a mat-

ter of scientific speculation, but many researchers believe it can be inherited. Others believe early musical training can develop it. Deutsch's study - conducted with the help of Trevor Henthorn, a UCSD researcher, and Mark Dolson, a researcher and audio engineer — consisted of two experiments conducted with native speakresearcher and audio Signitude with native speak-ers of the tonal languages Vietnamese and Mandarin. Vietnamese-speaking subjects were tested individually in two sessions, which were held on different days. In each session the sub-

"It showed that speakers of Vietnamies and Mandarin have an exceptional form of perfect pitch. It's from their early acquisition of tone language," says Deutsch. When I ask Deutsch if this means that past a certain age, one will never be able to learn a language like Chinese, she tells me, "I'm not qualified really to comment on questions about learning Chinese, but Can saw that tions about learning Chinese, but I can say that there is literature on westerners learning tonal language, such as Chinese, Mandarin in particular, and definitely the literature shows that westerners have difficulty with learning it."

In Japan, where language is not tonal, there is a higher than average prevalence of perfect pitch. Deutsch says many young children re-ceive Suzuki music training early, and this could

be the answer.
"It's not unusual for Japanese children to start their musical training at two years old, and start their musical training at two years old, and the Suzuki method emphasizes listening rather than looking at notes on a sheet of music and pressing the appropriate key. speech.
"The first year of life, babies learn a great deal of speech that later on [if they haven't acquired it] they are

never quite able to acquire. It's a critical year. I'm assuming that along with many other aspects, and perfect pitch is one of them, that in the end it's a characteristic of speech, which can be acquired if you expose the baby to it.

In a paper presented to the Acoustical Society of America. Deutsch writes. "Our findings lead us to conjecture that the potential for acquiring absolute pitch may be universal and that it can be realized by the association of pitches with meaningful words very early in Ilic." In other words whe theories that anyone can get perfect pitch if they start early enough.

Deutsch says she frequently gets calls from parents desperate to help their child achieve perfect pitch. Deutsch says it's rare to find someone
