

n October 26, 1999, the county Board of Supervisors voted to approve a \$644 million, seven-year contract to "outsource" smoothly as the supervisors planned, according to a series of internal documents, memos, and e-mails recently produced

the county's computer and tele-phone operations. The move was heralded by the supervisors as a bold step that would save taxpayers millions of dollars and provide the citizenry with new technological marvels, such as walk-up computer kiosks to provide automated ways of pay-ing taxes and fees. The arrange-ment was opposed by the county employee union. Service Employees International Union, Local 2028, which argued to wages and benefits for workers and result in degraded services. 



Elain Marks has been waiting 25 months for a new set of lungs. Cystic fibrosis (CF) has left her dependant on oxygen and has limited her once-active life.

of the game. "The average wait for a set of lungs is two years, so it should happen pretty soon now. Since I'm

so small, I have to face that my lungs will probably come from a younger person. I just pray that whoever that person is, they'll go to heaven." Her condition helped her decide not to have children. "I've been married seven years. If you're going to have a transplant, they want you to decide whether you want to have hildren or not, because they don't know how the drugs affect the fetus after the transplant. Besides, a lot of my friends were

adopted, and I always thought that I'd want to adopt."

A native of Fort Collins, Colorado, Marks has lived in San Diego for ten years and currently resides in Chula Vista's East-Lake. "I always wanted to live here. I went to Arizona State and made a road trip here, and after college I moved here." It wasn't until five years ago that her condition worsened enough that she sought a transplant. "Cystic fibrosis is something you're born with. The lungs get worse as you get older. We have a gene missing somewhere, and it causes us to produce thick mucus and it's hard to cough it out. It affects the sinuses, the lungs, and the pancreas. The pancreas has a hard time keeping a hold of all the nutrients in the body, so a lot of CF people are thin. When we get sick, we don't have a lot of reserve to fight off infection. Then that affects the lungs — on top of the fact that we have to cough all the time. The coughing scars your lungs, and as you get older it just gets worse.
"I always liked playing sports. Softball, volleyball, water-

skiing, snow skiing, surfing. I remember the first time my hus-band took me surfing, it was the first time in my life that it hit me how serious [the CF] was getting. I just couldn't catch my breath. That was a scary moment. Then I went to the doctor.

Marks explains how anyone can be a CF carrier. "You could have the CF gene — the father or the mother and they

just have to match — but no one else in my family has it. We don't really know, because this is a pretty newly discovered dis ease. I was diagnosed when I was 7, but at first they didn't know what was wrong. When I was a baby, I was sick a lot and cried all the time. Once I got a little older, I did pretty good. Until I hit 30 — then I started going downhill.

"I was playing sports and I worked out a lot, but I started to get sick more often, about every three or four months. Because of that, I had to be on antibiotics daily. That started to make me feel like I was addicted to drugs — but without those drugs I wouldn't be alive today. I'd been pretty healthy all of my life but then I started to get worse, and when it was presented to me, I mentally hit a brick wall. I was always healthy and suddenly, I'm not healthy. I was, like, Wait a minute! I didn't know this was going to happen to me! No one really warned me as was growing up about this, because they wanted me to live a normal life. I mean, would you want someone to tell you that when you're 12? That's just how younger people are. It's like they'll have sex and think. Oh. I'll never get AIDS, then they ge

"I started to cough a lot more. When you're sick, you mucus changes color, and that was happening. I got tired. And I got a pneumothorax, which is a hole in the lung. That was a drag! I healed, but every three months I'd get another little hole in there again that would heal up with antibiotics.

"I always knew I had CF — they started telling me as soon as I was diagnosed at 7. At that time, the average age for someone with CF was 12 years old. It was the number-one child killer in the nation. When I reached 17 years old, the average age was 20. I didn't worry about it because I didn't have it that bad — I didn't have to be hospitalized — and that's how I went through life. You can get the disease at varying degrees."

But life has changed since Marks's health has declined "Right now I don't work — I used to be a manager of a retail clothing store. I go in for 'tune-ups' every three or four months You do IV therapy, respiratory therapy, and they feed you. I've had a collapsed lung. I've had sinus surgery.

"I have to have oxygen around the clock. I started out jus

using it at night in '96. In March of '98 they told me to start wearing it 24 hours a day." She carries her oxygen supply in a daypack, "I've had to have a feeding tube put in my stomach. In order to get a lung transplant I have to keep up a certain weight. After they put the tube in, I gained 7 pounds over a year and a half I was under 100 and now I'm about 117. Obvi ously. I'm not that healthy. since I've got this [oxygen], but I've been so much better since

they put in the feeding tube. Marks lifts her blouse a bit and shows a gauze-encir cled plug just above her waist on her left side. "You just hook it up at night and go to sleep. I use a product like Ensure. It's a supplement. It goes right into my stomach, and I get about 1500 calories a night. With this tube, my life is normal. I can even wear a two-piece bathing suit.

"During college I weighed about 115, which is about normal. Then I got married and I dropped to about 100 pounds. Then right before I got on the transplant list. was struggling to keep 100, and it was so hard! I got down to 90." When told that mos women would envy her weight. she disagrees. "It's not good You can't find anything to fit you. I'd rather be chunky or even a little overweight and healthy than be like this.

people with CF is that we lose a lot of salt. Especially in the summertime. So we're told o drink Gatorade and put salt on our food. And they want us to eat high-calorie foods. So I was always told to eat fried foods. But I like veg etables and healthier foods. could be a vegetarian if I had to. I can eat anything I want right now, but after the trans plant I'll have to watch what I eat. You see, most of us with CF aren't hungry very often but we're supposed to eat. I'll gain weight after the trans plant because my lungs take o much energy and burn a lot of calories now. When have my new lungs, I won't be working so hard."

Cystic fibrosis has changed the way Marks looks at herself. "I think about my lungs more than I used to. The humidity this past sum-mer — it was the first time it's ever really hit me. I'd be walking my dog and have to stop to breathe or I'd start cough ing. That's frustrating. I can be doing fine right now, and

next week I could catch a cold and go into a serious downward spiral.

"I'm not really afraid of the transplant surgery because I've had two years to decide. When my doctors first wanted me to get on the list, I was, like, 'Oh no...I'm not going to do that. I'm going to quit work for a year, and I'll just get healthy and get back to my old self and be fine. Well. that didn't happen. I quit work and just focused on get ting healthy and it wasn't working. It was, like, 'Helloo-o! You have a disease you can't control.' That's when I said, I give up. Jesus, you have my life. You do whatever you want with it. But please tell me what to do! I didn't know whether to get on the list or not. I just didn't know. Then I went water-skiing — that's one of my favorite sports. I got up and fell down. And instead of going again, like I normally would, I said, 'My lungs are just too tired.' And I was only

But he saw a bigger picture than I did at the time. It was harder for me to deal with, because it was happening to me. But he and my whole family support me. My parents and my older brother live in Colorado and they're happy with my decision. I'm very lucky.

"I still think it will be vesome after the transplant. I won't have to have as many treatments as I do now. I'll be hungry when I'm supposed to be. I'll be able to do sports. I'll be able to go visit people and travel places. Right now it takes me half an hour to make up the bed and an hour and a half just to vacuum. I'll be able to do those things and carry things up the stairs. I'll be able to live like a normal human being. It's all in God's hands." .





This time they came unannounced at about 10:00 a.m. and it took repeated knocking on both the front and side doors to rouse the occupants. I noticed a poured and then forgotten glass of milk on a windowsill - a few inches of it evaporated, leaving a dusty white ring around the inside of the glass. Phil awakened the woman's boyfriend, who was sleeping in the garage. He sat with his elbows on his knees and his head in his hands, as if nursing a massive hangover. Ruth spoke gently to the woman. Phil checked the refrigerator for edible food and also the bathroom to see if it was operable and clean enough. Lthought, given the way the place looked, that the kids would be scooped up and removed on the spot. Instead, after explaining to the woman that they'd be checking (ditto social services) on her and the kids again, we left. When I asked, Ruth said that the place was much improved, cleaned up considerably. I said I couldn't imagine how it looked before and Phil said something like, You should have seen the place I went to once.

The mother told Collum that a second child, a daughter, was in the other room. (The other two children were not at home at the time.) "I located the child in what appeared to be a master bedroom. She held her hands clasped together near her mouth with her elbows out. She was spinning with her torso back and forth as she sat. She appeared very stressed and extremely frightened. I called to her and tried to speak with her but she was completely noncommunicative." 

Officers in the Chula Vista Police Department work patrol for several years after they graduate from the academy, and then as they pass tests and openings occur, they can be promoted to agent (which is equivalent and more or less synonymous with the rank of detec tive) and serve for fours years in one unit and then rotate back to patrol (but still with the rank of agent and with wider duties than regular patrol) until they move again to another investigative unit

whole different ball game there, like Mayberry compared to New York City." He's always impeccably dressed, in his early 40s, wears his graying hair straight back, sports a neat brush musache, and is fairly recently divorced, with a 16-year-old son. When he spoke of his son, whom he sees six days a week, I saw in his eyes the pain of the divorce itself and the pain he knows it caused his family. Talking of his son is also when his eyes light with joy. At one point, he handed me a poem he'd written. It's about a young gir in the hospital in a coma after massive head injuries The poem is in metrical quatrains and the second and fourth lines of each stanza rhyme. It's heartfelt and com passionate. He's not ready to quit his day job and make a living on the poetry circuit (everyone who has tried has starved anyway), but how many cops (or how many grown men, is more the point) do you think would have the guts, the heart, to write a poem like this?

One case that haunts Ron involved a special-needs kid in foster care. The kid was normal in most respects but had to be fed intravenously — he couldn't digest food properly. At bedtime he gets hooked up to a machine that feeds him over eight hours. One night his caretaker decides to go out and leaves the boy with a person who doesn't know how to operate the apparatus - he was given cursors instruction. Result is kid gets fed in one hour what nor mally would take eight hours. Result is the kid is dead. And died horribly. No criminal charges are filed. Only his license to provide foster care was revoked. Another child under his care had died before this incident. Ron's keeping tabs on the guy. His latest information puts him in Mexico — "Working in orphanages or some kind of ster-care employment there.

I went with Agents Lederla and Munch one day to Children's Hospital, to the ward where children are taken if they are abused, molested, raped. Lederle seems to have a particularly good rapport with the people here. He was showing Munch the ropes, places, procedures. He introduced

It's called a colposcope, and it's used for examining and pho tographing even minute damage inside, say, a child's anus or vagina. (Note: I'm glad we have tools like this to prove sexual abuse in children, but it makes me sick when I think that we must have them)

Not long after this I went with Agent Ruth Hinzman to meet Floyd Richardson, senior social work supervisor with Child Protective Services at the Children's Services Bureau, which is part of the county Health and Human Services Agency. How the Family Protection Unit works with the people at Children's Hospital and Floyd and his colleagues is one of the things that makes this unit different from others. Agent Hinzman said at one point, "I consider myself a social worker with a gun. Another time she said, "I've cleaned up vomit. I've cooked breakfast for a man who ouldn't do it for himself It's not in my job description but I do it." Floyd said he sometimes had to act like a police officer, but without a gun. Most crimes don't involve social workers. Nor nally, a crime happens, some body is arrested, tried, found guilty, or acquitted. When the issue is child abuse or plicated, and to take a child proof that the child is endangered — an equivalent amount of proof to prove murder — danger for the child is the guideline," Richardson said when Lasked

This referral is cross reported to the cops. The cops check it out and see if any laws are broken. The social worker checks it out and determine if the child is in danger. "Children get hurt without the law being broken...some times," Floyd said, and added. "It's black-and-white for the cops, gray for us. A social worker needs an education life experience, and a philosophy to fall back on, an idea of what things should be." hristopher O'Riley, who gave a recital of Russian compositions in the La Jolla Cham-ber Music Society's Revelle Series, is a pianist of numerous gifts. He is an excellent col-laborator. He produces a beautiful, floating tone.

Even the virtuosic 19th-century display piece that ended the program, Balakirey's Islamey, received a less than convincing performance. Yes, O'Ri ley played the fast sections at top speed, leaving ity played the fast sections at top speed, feaving the audience gasping at his superhuman dexter-ity. But often enough that top speed got away from him, with rushed phrases tumbling over each other. Instead of the steel-sharp rhythmic precision Balakirey's brilliant writing demands, the pianist repeatedly lost control. (The same thing happens — with considerably more dele-terious effect — in the first and last movements of O'Riley's "Waldstein" on the Beethoven sonata disc I mentioned.) This is nervous, tense music, perpetually searching, perpetually on the qui vive, with in

stantaneous changes of course like an animal fitfully hastening through a branching underground burrow. A singing lyricist, dwelling on each brief episode as though it were a lovely little aria, will never find his way to the goal. Furthermore, there was little in O'Riley's per-formance to suggest he knew — or felt — what the goal was. The mode of late Scriabin is breaking out, breaking away, breaking through: "from the invis-ible to the visible" (as the composer himself said). O'Riley's mode was glid-ing along, sliding over surfaces. That just won't do. Anyone incapable of ex-periencing the mystical, supra-rational, depth-psychological, cosmic-con-sciousness, Symbolist-poetry thrust of

depth psychological, commercions. Scrabba English Sonner unglish not to play it. To hear what it ought to sound like, you might listen to John Ogdon's recording, where the pianas's own unbal-anced psyche makes him the perfect vehicle for Scrabbn's strange new muscal language. Thelonious Monk had just returned to live performing in New York after losing his cabaret license in a trumped-up drug bust.

A remarkable year, 1957. The USSR launched Sputink I and II. John Glenn broke the speed record from California to New York in a jet, making the trip in 3 hours, 23 minutes, and 8.4 seconds, lack Kerouac published On the Road. Eugene

O'Neill's Lone Day's Journey or Night was posthumously produced and won the Pulitzer. Dr. Seuss published The Cat in the Hat. The Giants oved from New York to San moved from New York to San Francisco, and the Milwaukee Braves won the World Series. Humphrey Bogart died, and at the movie theaters you could go see Bradge on the River Kwai to T Weelee Angry Men. Hutricane Audrey wasted the Gulf Coasts of Louisiana and Texas, and Joseph McCarthy died

Sevilla charges just \$23 for the house selection of four tapas (a light meal for two) or \$32 for their six-tapas taster.






