




### The Logic of a Landslide

By Joe Deegan

rian Burke was agonizing over whether to appeal the court's decision in the Mount Soledad landslide case. "Have you

ever been too close to something to decide wisely about it?" he asked. He raised the question less about himself than of the attorneys who lost the Mount Soledad landslide case against the City of San Diego. "If I do appeal the verdict," said Burke, whose home was one of three that were completely destroyed in the slide, "I'll probably get new legal advice." Burke was the only plaintiff among the three who would speak with me. attempt to collect damages from the City. He must have been confident, for only 75 days prior to the October 3, 2007 Soledad slide, Catalano had won a \$12.5 million settlement from the City of Carlsbad and the Carlsbad Municipal Water District in an apparently similar case. Both cases hinged on whether negligence in maintaining underground pipes caused water to trigger landslides.

As Catalano went to work

cies is what leads to lawsuits against governments and public agencies. But litigant beware. "Handling earth movement cases is full of traps for the unwary," wrote Burg. "Getting a skilled expert involved early on is essential to determining whether a theory of liability exists. Counsel need to think like a geotechnical Soledad Mountain Road that ruptured in July, August, and September 2007, only a short time before the catastrophic slide. "I believe the evidence is unequivocal that without the water from the waterline, this landslide would never have happened.

"Interestingly," Hearn continued, "this slope existed for

Too bad attorney Patrick Catalano wasn't as cautious as Burke in the first days after the slide. That's when Catalano signed up on contingency to represent 3 of 65 eventual plaintiffs in their

on the new case, he told the press that the City of San Diego "breached their duty" in allowing pipes on Soledad Mountain to leak. He then noted, "You can get an expert to say anything you want, you've just got to go around and find the expert that will say what you want." He neglected to mention that the City would do the same.

In an April 2005 edition of Insurance Journal, Edward Burg explained that an earthmovement exclusion on homeowners' insurance poli-

years before the condo oversupply is worked down.

On that score, Fabiani mentions tax increment financing, or the use of future property tax revenues. But those nearly empty hotels and condos are causing the value of high-rise buildings to go down — along with future property tax receipts. Since construction won't start for at least five years, Fabiani says, "Our expectation is that the current economic downturn will have ended by then." Probably, but will property tax receipts have rebounded enough to use tax increment financing? Will the overbuilding be sufficiently worked off?

If the Qualcomm site is

used for something else, "Who is going to pay to rip down the stadium?" asks Henderson. And there is a plume at that site too.

Fabiani says the Chargers "have proposed from the start that the team be allowed to operate and maintain the new City-owned facility." I reminded him that the team also claimed that the stadium would be privately financed. This led to a snappy colloguy in which each of us challenged the other's personal honesty. I kept thinking to myself: even if the Chargers pick up maintenance costs (and I will have to see that to believe it), who pays the servicing on the bond? The Chargers have already answered that one. It won't be the team. "Since the total servicing costs for the \$60 million bond issue of 1997 for Qualcomm improvements is \$5.8 million a year, then servicing costs on a bond of over \$600 million could logically amount to about \$60 million a year," says Henderson, who is including sinking fund costs. Maintenance expenses would be a fraction of annual bond costs.

The Chargers argue that they need a new stadium to be competitive. But between 2004 and 2008, the team had a 54–26 regular season record. It is doing even better this year. In reality, the team wants more money for itself. I am not against companies wanting to boost profits, but I do resent it when the money will be sucked out of a bankrupt city.

Sums up Mills, "Anybody who considers spending this kind of public money on a

football stadium has to be a moron."

Henderson thinks the suggested deal may be so moronic that the team wants to lose the election; then it can tell the National Football League that San Diego closed the door, and the Chargers should be able to move to Los Angeles or elsewhere. Not so, insists Fabiani: "We want to find a solution here in San Diego County," he claims. But the team has been saying that as long as it has been claiming...oh, never mind. ■

son imagined the water not to have been a cause. And, as Hearn argued, California law had long established that municipal infrastructure does not have to be the only cause of a catastrophe for a city to be held liable. This was an important point because all the experts called in the trial agreed that Mount Soledad has been for centuries an unstable geological formation.

As the trial closed in mid-August, the plaintiffs were optimistic. But superior court judge Ronald Styn came to see it otherwise. The plaintiffs' attorneys had needed to convince the judge by a preponderance of the evidence that the leaking water was a substantial contributing cause to the landslide. In an October 1 document explaining his decision, Styn wrote: "The court finds that the Plaintiffs have not carried their burden of proof."

Analysis of Styn's reasoning indicates that he came to two major conclusions that devastated the plaintiffs' case. The first was that the water from the City's leaking pipes did not seep deeply enough into the ground to trigger the landslide. Second, even before the pipes broke, the landmass was already creeping forward, probably causing the pipe

damage.

Styn acknowledged an important plaintiff contention, that "the average moisture readings within the slide area are greater than the average moisture readings outside the slide area. This is most noticeable in the area around the July 18 leak. However the average moisture at the toe of the slope is not as high. Logically there would be some elevated moisture around the area of the pipe leak but apparently significant amounts of moisture did not migrate down to the toe of the slope."

Outside the landslide area, where there was no water, the ground held firm. "Plaintiffs conclude," wrote Styn, that "the only difference is the leaking pipes which must be the cause of the landslide. While there is logic to this argument, the evidence does not support the theory because there is not significant free water in the landslide mass."

So what happened to those 100,000 gallons of water that leaked out of the pipe on July 18, 2007? Did they evaporate? "The photographs taken of the July 18 leak indicate that an enormous amount of water bubbled to the surface and



came out near the manhole cover. This means the path of least resistance was up and sideways, not down. Therefore it appears that most of the water bubbled to the surface and ran off," wrote Styn.

Greg Axten, an expert witness for the plaintiffs, had argued during the trial that a process called "dilation" had allowed water to enter the slide mass. "If dilation caused the water to go into the slide mass," maintained a skeptical Styn, "the water would have had to come out or it would have been evident in the borings or piezometers [instruments that can detect hydrostatic pressure in the ground]. Since the borings (with two exceptions) and piezometers showed no water, there is no persuasive evidence that dilation occurred."

All parties acknowledged that a clay seam deep in the slide mass had become wet. It was on this wet seam that the land slid.

But Styn doubted that the small cracks in the landslide mass would have allowed enough water from above to make the seam as wet as it became. At any rate, "It would be a very small amount," he claimed, "and it would take a very long time for a significant amount of water to get through these tiny cracks. The longer time span of irrigation might allow this to happen and therefore it is more likely that water from irrigation caused the increase in moisture rather than water from the water main leaks."

CITY LIGHTS

The plaintiffs' attorneys wanted to know, of course, why similar patterns of irrigation in the closely surrounding areas did not cause landsliding there.

Key to the City's position, argued by San Diego attorney Douglas Butz, was a crack in Soledad Mountain Road that appeared in March 2007, four months before the July 18 leak. "When the landslide occurred," wrote Styn, "the head scarp at the northern end was exactly at the site of the March, 2007, crack. The March, 2007, crack lines up with the Burke house forming the northern edge of the slide. The Burke house suffered cracking which was first noticed on July 30, 2007. This is consistent with the slide originating at the March, 2007, crack and moving towards the Burke house on the northern edge."

Styn found it telling that vertical displacements — drops in the pavement — were noticed at both the March 2007 crack and at the July 18

pipe break. "The landslide began moving before water from the leaks could reach the slide plane, weaken the clay and start the landslide. The July 24 photographs also reveal cracking in Soledad Mountain Road. This is further evidence that it is likely movement of the landslide began before July 18.

"The movement at the surface would not necessarily be as great as the movement going on subsurface during the early stages of the landslide. If the movement below was much greater than at the surface a 3 inch drop in Soledad Mountain Road could be sufficient to cause the water main to move and cause a corporation stop to pull out."

A corporation stop is a valve that fits over the service line. It was a corporation stop pulling away from the main line that caused the massive leak on July 18, 2007. Indicating how far the argumentation went during the trial, the plaintiffs maintained that the City improperly installed the lateral pipes, not allowing for goosenecks. The purpose of the gooseneck is to allow flexibility in the pipes should ground movement

Attorneys sparred as well over the existence of "spalling" on the pipes where several pullouts took place. Spalling is a process of breaking small fragments off the face of a material, in this case making the pipe smooth. The plaintiffs argued that the spalling indicated the leaking had been going on for a long time. But the City's expert, wrote Styn, "testified the spalling could take place very rapidly because the force of the water coming out after a pullout would create a turbulent area and there would be water mixed with dirt which would sandpaper the pipe and create a smooth area." Styn sided with the latter interpretation and concluded that "the spalling does not support the theory of leaking for a long period."

I am standing at the site of the landslide that took place two years ago and looking out at the gorgeous view to the east. The street that was once a virtual bowl containing broken pavement has been built up and repaved.

Only moments ago, I came up from the Desert View Drive alley, where the Burke house, having slid down a slope that for years has been steeper than safety standards recommend, crashed into a home owned by the McCormick family. The City demolished the Burke house. There are signs all over the McCormick house warning intruders of the danger therein and advising them on pain of law to keep out. At the northern corner of the house, bunk beds with sheets still on them can be seen through a gash in the outer wall.

My mind goes back to Patrick Catalano's remark that "you can get an expert to say anything you want" - and to a final detail from the trial. In the explanation of his decision, the judge mentioned two geotechnical firms, one named Ninyo and Moore and the other Helenschmidt Geotechnical, which the City had hired to investigate the slide. (Neither firm agreed to talk to me.)

Judge Styn noted that the City never called witnesses from either Helenschmidt or Ninyo and Moore. He then quoted from the California Evidence Code that "if weaker and less satisfactory evidence is offered when it was within the power of the party to produce stronger and more satisfactory evidence, the evidence offered should be viewed with distrust."

But the judge went on to conclude: "Notwithstanding this rule, the evidence is more consistent with the opinions of the City's experts than the opinions of the Plaintiffs' experts."

Meanwhile, Brian Burke says he will not appeal the judge's decision. Other litigants and their attorneys are still thinking it over. ■





presume that they are also grown in horse manure, since that substance would naturally be a part of it. I have a mushroom cookbook which states that you should not wash mushrooms because it destroys some of the flavor. Just wipe them off with a damp paper towel, it says. Well, I like mushrooms, especially raw ones in a salad and I have always washed them thoroughly with cold water and sometimes a brush. My question is, are commercial mushrooms contaminated

One store that I frequent has mushrooms with a label that says they have been washed. What assurances do we have that even the washed ones are clean? And what of the other ones, the ones that are not washed? Is it likely that we have been ingesting horse manure?

with horse manure?

You'll be glad to know that the mushroom industry has anticipated your hysteria and done something about it. Commercially grown mushrooms are pretty clean eatables. The Mushroom Council is ready to pat you on the head and give you a reassuring shoulder-squeeze and lay out the precautionary steps involved in popping 'shrooms out of their commercial growing medium.

Each grower has his own recipe for mushroom medium, but you can bet it includes a lot of straw, maybe taken from the stalls of horses. maybe not. Then add a dollop of manure (horse or chicken is best), then various grain meals, gypsum, and possibly some exotics like molasses or peat moss or wine-making leftovers. Make a big compost pile of this stuff, add some water, toss it around every couple of days, then let the natural bacteria do their thing. The temp inside the pile should rise to 150 to 160 degrees, killing off a whole slew of bad bacteria in a week or two.

Step two is pasteurization, usually done by shooting steam into the mass. After a day or so, we've got clean, clean medium. Yeah, there's still horse poop in it somewhere — hard to tell where, since the medium's been reduced to a dark, soil-like material — but there are no bad horse-poop bugs. I suspect you're as worried about the clean poop as you are about the bac-

teria, but I'm sorry, unless the grower has used a synthetic medium, you gots poop.

there are plenty of air holes) or put your loose mushrooms in a brown paper bag (not plastic!) and put them in the fridge. On cooking day, dust off any loose medium (check under the cap). Give 'em a quick rinse, then pat them dry if

it makes you feel safer. And there you have it. Nontoxic, non-gross-out omelet filling.

I have to congratulate you at not being so horrified by mushrooms that you peel them. Some people actually peel mushrooms. Mushrooms don't have skins. What do they think they're removing?



## **Look What Santa Brought**

The filmmaker has taken an intensely personal film and depersonalized it.

he last of the last.

A Single Man. The Christmas movie for holiday depressives (who after all deserve one, too), an adaptation of the Christopher Isher-

wood novel detailing the planned last day of a homosexual English professor grieving his dead lover, anally-com-

pulsively tying up loose ends, saying his guarded goodbyes, practicing the proper posture to shoot himself in bed, laying out his burial attire with the helpful note, "Tie in a Windsor knot." Not to be confused, please, with A Serious Man despite the bespectacled academic protagonist (an exquisitely tortured Colin Firth) and the Sixties setting, the ongoing Cuban Missile Crisis providing another incentive to end it all. Fashion "guru" Tom Ford, in his directing debut, sees to it that the dumps are très chic, almost to be envied and emulated. He demonstrates con-

vincingly a photographic eye to go along with a curatorial taste in the period, although the total ambience resembles that of a retro pictorial in *Harper's Bazaar* rather than an accu-

> rate depiction of a gloomy Brit in sunny So-Cal during the Kennedy Era. And he controls the color sat-

uration of his imagery as if through an IV, maintaining gray drained faded tones for the present tense, pedantically contrasted with florid flushed flashbacks; and any passing sensory sensation in the faded present, any flicker of life, any tremor of reanimation, any stir of passion, will bring a sudden surge of saturation. It's a definite idea, even if a transparent one.

*Nine*. Former choreographer Rob Marshall's third directorial effort, a restaging of the Broadway musical based on Fellini's 8½. Not to be confused with 9, luckily no longer in cir-

culation. In essence the filmmaker has taken an intensely personal film (so named as it was Fellini's eighth and a half opus, counting three collaborations as halves) and depersonalized it, trivialized it, into nostalgic cinephilia *circa* the mid-Sixties and secondarily into generic Italophilia, the cultural divide highlighted by a principal cast of non-Italians, Daniel Day-Lewis as the Fellini figure, Penelope Cruz, Marion Cotillard, Nicole Kidman, Kate

Hudson, Judi Dench, pop singer Fergie, excepting only Sophia Loren, not all of them pretending to be Italians. Each gets to perform at least one would-be showstopper. Cruz (dubbed? — it scarcely matters in her scanties) and Fergie (whom I at last understand is not one and the same as Sarah Ferguson) come closest to attainment of that goal, and Cotillard outside of her would-be showstopper attains a loftier goal of tangible humanity. Somehow the notion

of a Broadway show of this origin seems less objectionable because it's in a different medium and not in direct competition, as well as because I had therefore had no prior awareness of it nor of any of the songs in it. Dion Beebe's rich ripe cinematography is commendable on its own merits when not dipping into directly competitive black-and-white.

Broken Embraces. Almodóvar, as is his wont, gives you splatters and splashes,

swatches and swaths, of vibrant color, and he gives you the occasional rockyou-on-your-heels image (a teardrop on a ripe tomato, lovers writhing within a white-sheet cocoon), and he gives you deliberately over-the-top domestic melodrama played steadfastly straight: a blind filmmaker (shades of Woody Allen's Hollywood Ending, albeit darker shades), a kept woman turned movie starlet, a manipulative millionaire, his conniving gay son, etc. He doesn't, however, give you much to believe in, except in this instance the undoubted radiance of Penelope Cruz (once more), who in her mid-thirties would appear to have yet done nothing surgically to disfigure herself. It's a sad comment on our times that that's worthy of comment about an actress of her age.

The Young Victoria. And the young Albert. (Psst, wanna see the Queen in her teddies?) The story of the first occupant of the spanking new Buckingham Palace is a story of protofeminist liberation — "Even a palace can be a prison"—and a testament to the capacity of British thespians, specifically Emily Blunt, Rupert Friend, Paul Bettany, Miranda Richardson, Mark Strong, Harriet Walter, Jim Broadbent, among others, to play any dry and droning history lesson as if it were Shakespeare. (Don't look to Miss Blunt to do what Dame Judi Dench didn't do in Mrs. Brown, speak the Queen's English as a second language. Herr feerst vass Churman.) The rather bland love story ultimately nudges out the pungent family relations, and the only goose bumps come courtesy of Handel and high volume.

Sherlock Holmes. Horrors! A Sherlock Holmes for the 21st Century, a man of action, a martial artist, more of a 19th-century James Bond or alternatively an urban Wild Wild Westerner, with a pretty-boy Dr. Watson (Jude Law) and a megalomaniacal archenemy (Mark Strong) who foretells "a journey that will twist the very fabric of nature," not to mention the re-colonization of America. The worst of it, worse than the hero's unseemly number of brushes with death or his embarrassing gullibility to feminine wiles, worse even than the blanketing darkness and the teeth-rattling sound and music imposed by director Guy Ritchie, is the insouciance of Robert Downey, Jr. (never mind his bad accent) in the title role. In a rare bow to discretion, he at least lays off the cocaine.

Did You Hear about the Morgans? Did you hear about Did You Hear about the Morgans?? Well, it's not as bad as you may have heard. The premise of a splitsville Manhattan couple whisked away together to wild, wild Wyoming in the witness protection program is

no worse than that of many a screwball comedy of the Golden Age. Hugh Grant and Sarah Jessica Parker as the fishes out of water are simply staying limber without really stretching themselves; and their contrasting styles, ingratiating vs. grating, yield a semblance of discord. Grant's reeking insincerity is rather unbecoming in the role of a marital penitent and supplicant, but the increasing creases in his face add poignance even to insincerity, not only to ingratiation. Filmmaker Marc Lawrence, who with Two Weeks Notice and Music and Lyrics has never directed in absence of Grant, always cares enough about the work to employ a topflight cinematographer. This one, Florian Ballhaus, applies a high shine.

It's Complicated. The Nancy Meyers comedy with Meryl Streep and Alec Baldwin and Steve Martin is the one thing I am lacking. Alvin and the Chipmunks: The Squeakquel does not look to be a thing. It looks to be nothing.



Avatar — Ambitious merger of live action and computer animation, with at least one groundbreaking 3-D effect: English subtitles for the language spoken on the celestial body of Pandora inserted on a plane in the middle distance between a foreground figure and an upstage figure, as if the foreground one could look down and read the subtitle himself. This effect is silly, is pretentious, is pointless, and nonetheless is fun. Much the same could be said of the movie as a whole. Silly, pretentious, pointless, and fun is surely less than writer and director James Cameron had in mind for his first feature film since Titanic twelve years before, a two hour and forty-five minute "visionary" science-fiction epic that dishes up an allegory on globalism, a warm-over of the old science-versus-military debate, a dose of Noble Savage romanticism, a Capt. Smith and Pocahontas culture-clash romance, an ecological message, and a treefelling that insistently recalls the toppling of the World Trade Center. There appears little doubt that Cameron drew upon all his mental powers, yet happily those powers prove too feeble, too reliant on convention and stereotype, or if you wish to make it sound better, on tradition and archetype, to ruin the fun. The powers themselves, with their rumble of self-importance and their straining for significance, are part and parcel of the kitschy fun. **Brothers** — Jim Sheridan's Hollywood do-over of Susanne Bier's Danish original is a wartime soap opera served up as kitchensink realism, photographed by Frederick Elmes with a clear and cold albeit clichéd eye for Middle American mundanity. The Good Brother (Tobey Maguire) is off to war in Afghanistan, currently the Good War, a week after the Bad Brother (Jake Gyllenhaal) is out of prison. Then, in a contrivance every long-running daytime drama will have at some point resorted to, namely the Presumed Dead scenario, the good one is erroneously reported KIA, and in his absence the bad one, showing signs of getting better, moves in to provide aid and comfort to his sister-in-law (Natalie Portman) and two nieces. A reserved Maguire, saving up the vein-popping hysterics for the final reel, looks alarmingly pale and frail on his rescue from captivity and his return home, but the slobbery empathy for the maladjusted veteran sets a near impossible standard, as if to imply you mightn't come in for empathy unless you'd been forced to beat one of your buddies to death with a lead pipe. (Just to tighten the screws, the widow and rug rat of the bludgeoned comrade will turn up one day in your living room.) The film's most interesting material, the two young daughters' shifted affection from their zombified father to their barrel-of-fun uncle, demonstrates that interest can be generated without heat and hoo-hah. Sam Shepard, Mare Winningham, Bailee Madison, Taylor Geare. 2009.

A Christmas Carol — Disney's re-do is probably better the fewer times you've read, seen, or heard the story. With or without 3-D, this is nevertheless a lavishly, lovingly, and imaginatively illustrated edition of the Dickens holiday classic, in a graphic style congenial to a Victorian ghost story, and in a motion-capture computer-animation technique which director Robert Zemeckis has made his personal domain (The Polar Express, Beowulf, 2-D and 3-D respectively). There are amusingly recognizable caricatures, to go along with the voices, of Gary Oldman, Colin Firth, and Bob Hoskins, while Jim Carrey is sufficiently disguised by a pickax nose and scratch-awl chin, and by an acceptable British accent, so as to be no distraction. The guttering candle-flame head of the Ghost of Christmas Past is a marvelous effect, soon topped by the dissolving transparent floor in the airborne house piloted by the Ghost of Christmas Present. The Grim Reaper shadow of the Ghost of Christmas Future is not bad, but his section gives way to the grandiose spectacle of a chase by horse-drawn hearse, to say nothing of the spectacle of an Incredible Shrinking Scrooge, that rather tramples the gloom of the forecast. We don't want excitement there; we want despair. In the end, all the emphasis on the technology of the telling tends to outbalance the sentiment, such that there remains a bit of a chill even after Scrooge warms up. 2009.

The foreseeable end is a bit of a slog, but the film in the early stages is very good on the pretensions of intelligent youth, and very good on the heady intoxication of growing up fast. Peter Sarsgaard's British accent is hit-and-miss; and the prim schoolmarm of Olivia Williams, a beauty disguised in eyeglasses and pulled-back hair, is strictly stock; and the comic portraits of the heroine's hidebound dad, a same-aged fumbling suitor, and a blond bimbo (Alfred Molina, Matthew Beard, Rosamund Pike, in order) are sharp but narrow. Keeping things fully alive throughout, however, is Carey Mulligan in the lead, showing off, among her other talents, the freshest smile since Eleanor Powell: plenty of teeth with a demure downturn at the corners of the mouth. And Sally Hawkins, back to reality from the giddy heights of Happy-Go-Lucky, has a tiny but vital part to play. With Cara Seymour, Dominic Cooper, Emma Thompson; directed by Lone Scherfig. 2009.

Fantastic Mr. Fox — Wes Anderson's wised-up children's film, a labor-intensive stop-motion animated adaptation of the Roald Dahl animal tale (reportedly he never visited the London set, but directed from Paris by E-mail) about a vulpine sophisticate who moves up in the world — out of a hole and into a tree — but can't escape his animal nature. (See him, for example, drop the act and rip into his food before regaining his composure: "Dinner was pitchperfect.") Though the droll result has its charms, such as the use of "cuss" as an allpurpose cussword, as in "I sure the cuss hope so," it's not so much for children as a group or adults as a group as it is specifically for devotees of Anderson, who is able to pursue with puppets and miniature sets his standard visual predilections: squaredup and flattened compositions, lateral action and tracking shots, a clump-clump editing rhythm. On the eclectic soundtrack (the Rolling Stones, the Beach Boys, the Wellingtons, Burl Ives), the director resorts to thievery from the film scores of Georges Delerue, like Scorsese in Casino, for the moments of peak emotion. With the voices of George Clooney, Meryl Streep, Jason Schwartzman, Eric Anderson, Bill Murray, Michael Gambon. 2009.

The Hurt Locker — Fictitious countdown of the final six weeks in the twelvemonth tour of an army bomb squad in Baghdad. The living and working conditions in a color-free wasteland appear perfectly credible, and the quasi-sciencefictional details of the job — the spaceman protective suits, the remote-control bombsniffing robot, the tangle of colored wires, the hide-and-seek triggers — are highly enlightening. And the defusing of bombs the constant prospect of their blowing up in our faces - carries a guaranteed tension, as witness such forerunners as Robert Aldrich's Ten Seconds to Hell or Michael Powell's and Emeric Pressburger's The Small Back Room. The ambush in middesert, outside the squad's normal sphere of operations, is if anything even tenser: more unpredictable, more open to possibilities. Kathryn Bigelow, one of the rare female action directors, dead-set on matching any man in muscle, favors here the combatfootage filmmaking style of jostles and jars to the camera, punchy zooms, whiplashing pans, and a chronic shaky hand, not necessarily restricted to scenes of combat. This is trendy at best, a tired cliché at worst. (The amplified heartbeat and the slo-mo explosion ought to be put to bed for a rest period of not less than a generation.) She takes a lot of time on the action scenes, or more broadly the tension scenes, and not much time in between, so that the three principals — Jeremy Renner, Anthony Mackie, Brian Geraghty, each of them looking the part — are thin on character, static in development, no more than generic as opposed to individual soldiers. With Guy Pearce, Ralph Fiennes, David Morse. 2009.


Invictus — Doubtless not the sort of project that fans of director Clint Eastwood want from him, a Big Statement, no matter how characteristically understated, Marrying elements of the Great Man biography and the inspirational true sports story, it tells of Nelson Mandela's first years as the first black president of South Africa timely parallel to somebody closer to home — and his outwardly frivolous, inwardly farsighted interest in his country's hosting of the Rugby World Cup, 1995, as an opportunity to unify a divided populace. (An anti-revenge film, a reconciliation film. it could have been titled Forgiven to round out the course of contrition Eastwood undertook way back with Unforgiven.) The extensive speechmaking does not get in the way of the director's serene craftsmanship, the slanted compositions solidly hinged together and unfolded at a steady and imperturbable pace, stretching out customarily to a wieldy and evenly balanced two and a quarter hours. Morgan Freeman as Mandela (put a batik shirt on his back and a smile on his face and it's amazing how well he can pass) and Matt Damon as the rugby team captain, François Pienaar, struggle to outdo one another in stoical underplaying, and neither struggles noticeably with the accent. Eastwood, meantime, has his own struggle in making an unfamiliar sport comprehensible ("So, it is very important that we beat Australia"), and although he fails at that on the field of play, he succeeds stirringly in the stands and on the streets and in front of the nation's televisions. 2009. \*\*\* (CARMEL MOUNTAIN 14: CHULA

Me and Orson Welles — Filmmaker Richard Linklater fictionalizes, mythologizes, the Mercury Theatre's mounting of a modern-dress Julius Caesar in 1937, the titular "me" being a stagestruck high-schooler who in one week lands a small speaking and singing part in the Broadway production, falls head over heels for the company secre tary, sees her stolen out from under him by the titular Orson, gets fired and rehired and refired, falls back on a nicer girl for a happy ending, and at least has something to tell his grandchildren. As a coming-of-age tale, it isn't much, but as an exhibition of old-fashioned studio filmmaking, luxurious sets and costumes lusciously photographed, it is more than adequate. In eye and in mouth, in glance and in cadence, the unknown British actor Christian McKay magically conjures the Welles we know, although given his age it would be the Welles of, say, The Third Man or Othello. (Other Mercury players we know, Joseph Cotten, George

Coulouris, Norman Lloyd, are not rendered with such fidelity, or indeed any fidelity, outside of perhaps the choppy waves on Cotten's head.) It ought to give us serious pause when we calculate to ourselves that the actor who fills the role of the teenager, Zac Efron, is in real life the same age as Welles would have been in 1937, and in that pause we can reflect that we are getting the Welles of myth and legend instead of the Welles of a particular time and place. The performance remains more impression than characterization. Claire Danes, Eddie Marsan, Ben Chaplin, Zoe Kazan. 2009.

The Men Who Stare at Goats - The first film directed by character actor Grant Heslov has a promising premise (paranormal military research), plenty of script troubles (an investigative reporter's blathering narration, the disruptive channelswitching between periods twenty years apart, a sputtery and rudderless last act), and a couple of tickling performances by Jeff Bridges as the hippie-haired architect of the New Earth Army, a new breed of supersoldiers and psychic spies, alias Jedi Warriors (thus a new emphasis in the slogan, "Be All You Can Be"), and by, in a larger part, George Clooney as his most ardent disciple. It also has Ewan McGregor and Kevin Spacey. 2009.

New Moon — Second installment in "The Twilight Saga" from the best-selling girls' books by Stephenie Meyer, a vampire movie sprinkled with pop songs, long and slow and slack. (New director: Chris Weitz.) Whatever may be the attributes that make this franchise a "phenomenon," they seem to ensure that it will also have a significant silly factor: e.g., the extracurricular alignment of Team Edward against Team Jacob. Hardly has the lipsticked bloodsucker (a narcotized Robert Pattinson as Edward) given his human girlfriend the kiss-off for her own good — "Leaving you," he will later allow, "was the hardest thing I've done in a hundred years" - than his only romantic rival (a bulked-up Taylor Lautner as Jacob) turns into a werewolf and, again for her own good, gives her another kiss-off. (Further silliness: he and his bare-chested pack are good werewolves, preying only on bad vampires and leaving humans as well as good vampires untouched.) Kristen Stewart, who looks now a little different, as if possibly she spent summer vacation getting

by Sapphire — A bit of well-meaning manipulation, unevenly photographed, alternately oversaturated and washed-out and glossy and grainy, centered around a Harlem African-American illiterate obese unwed teenage mother of a Down's daughter, now pregnant again, expelled from school, abused and battered at home by her welfare mother, an incestuous rape victim of her absentee father, and oh, HIV-positive. We don't find out all of that at once. It piles up. Some interesting effects are gotten from the heroine's first-person voice-over, interwoven at competitive volume with the dialogue, such that it plays as interior monologue rather than expository narration. The fantasy scenes almost attain a similar musing quality, triggered as they are by the heroine's urgent desire to escape, but

the actual content of these fantasies — a red-carpet Hollywood premiere, a mirror reflection of a slender beautiful blonde in place of a fat black, a subtitled black-and-white takeoff on a telecast of De Sica's *Two Women*, etc. — exhibit a consistent inanity which works to rob sympathy from either the film's heroine or its director, Lee Daniels. One or the other. You choose. With Gabourey Sidibe, Mo'Nique, Paula Patton, and Mariah Carey. 2009.

The Princess and the Frog — Throwback Disney cartoon, a blessed retreat from plumped-up computer animation and smart-aleck anachronisms. The songs, though they mostly stay true to the place and period, are unmemorable, and the ending approaches the endless. 
**The Road** — From the novel by Cormac McCarthy, a post-apocalyptic road movie of a man, a boy, a gray wasteland, and roving bands of ragtag cannibals whom Mad Max would have blown away with a sneeze. Naturalistic science fiction, it amounts to an anti-2012 (careful what you wish for) from the maker of the Australian anti-Western, *The Proposition,* John Hillcoat, a small-scale spectacle of unrelieved grimness and gloom, short on characters, thin in incident, thick with sallow grimy hairy closeups

(Viggo Mortensen and a barely recognizable Robert Duvall among them), a spitting-up of blood here and an upchuck there, a gun held repeatedly to the head of a child. The boy's cultivation of morality and charity, in defiance of his father's stony-hearted defenses, offers a hint of dramatic interest. With Kodi Smit-McPhee, Charlize Theron, Guy Pearce, Molly Parker. 2009.

A Serious Man — At bottom, the Coen brothers' most "personal" work. To be sure, they've never been reduced to hired hands. They've always had the good fortune to be able to make the films they wanted to make, films that reflected their personal tastes and personal attitudes and personal interests and personal viewpoints. Still, in the strict autobiographical sense, this one must be acknowledged as extra personal, set as it is in the Minneapolis suburb of their adolescence (Jefferson Airplane on the soundtrack to fix the date, 1967), in a Jewish household headed by a university professor with a son on the brink of his bar mitzvah. The film-

makers bring to their subject the unkind eve of the caricaturist. They demonstrate an acute and excruciating body awareness, the girth, the ear hair, the sebaceous cyst on the neck, the protagonist's half squat at the classroom blackboard, his outthrust butt, his pant cuffs riding up to his calves. And their subtly bulging face shots and torso shots, fronted and centered, approach the freak-show aura of the photographs of Diane Arbus. The parade of surnames has a Dickensian grotesquerie all its own: Gopnik, Finkle, Marshak, Nachtner, Schlutz, seldom a simple Shapiro. And the three rabbis of three different generations are hilariously ineffectual in three different ways. But to complain that the character portraits are not rounded, are slanted, would be to complain that a caricaturist is not a classicist, that Daumier is not Ingres. This is, it bears stressing at this point, a personal film. It is also - unexpectedly enough, as unexpected as the superstitious Old Country folk tale of the prologue and its old-fashioned 4:3 aspect ratio — a religious film, a film concerned not just with the specific re-





**2012** — Roland Emmerich's widest view of disaster to date: the sky-high eruption of Yellowstone (Old Faithful gone Vesuvius), the toppling of the Washington Monument and St. Peter's Basilica (the Statue of Liberty and the Eiffel Tower would be so old-hat), the block-by-block collapse of Los Angeles

(a rented limo outrunning the spreading crevasses and sinkholes, dodging the crumbling high-rises and overpasses), the monster tsunamis that engulf the White House and even, very far from sea level, the Himalayas. All of that is quite something — quite a lot of things — to see. And the plot attempt to update, to technologize, to science-fictionalize the Biblical story of Noah's Ark is something worth trying. The human drama, such as it is, strives to be no more than serviceable. As elsewhere in Emmerich's oeuvre (Independence Day,

Godzilla, The Day after Tomorrow, chiefly), the degree of glee in the destruction appears more than equal to any shock and awe in it. And a viewer might well rebel at a test of his humanity measured by his willingness to hold his breath for the survival of the star of a Hollywood blockbuster, and never mind the billions who missed the literal boat. Still, in the inadequacy of its response to its chosen subject matter, in its merry refusal to think about the unthinkable, in its whistling past the graveyard, the film after all seems only human. Strange to say about an FX extravaganza. **Up in the Air** — A comedown from Jason Reitman's auspicious first two features, *Thank You for Smoking* and *Juno*, narrowly centered as it is on a narrowly self-centered hero, a travelling corporate downsizer, a hired hatchet man, now a potential dinosaur whose way of life is threatened — by long-distance terminations via the innovation of video conferencing — before he can reach his lone life's goal of becoming just

the seventh man in history, and the youngest ever, to log ten million air miles and to reap the benefits that come with that milestone. The smirky smugness of a backsliding George Clooney, back at least as far as Danny Ocean if not all the way to Dr. Ross on ER, makes him an unlikely candidate to be handing out pink slips, unless as a grotesque expressionistic subjective projection of the pink-slip recipients. The recipients themselves, while widely varied in type, many of them having been downsized in real life, are for the most part penned up in bum's-rush montages. And the movie overall seems to share rather too much of the protagonist's glibness and frigidity. Waiting for a crack to appear in his facade is a sufficiently conventional plot hook, and patching up the crack afterwards is an insufficiently unconventional ending. 

a napkin, and a sandwich. Some sandwiches got turkey, some got ham, all got a slice of cheese, a broad leaf of iceberg lettuce, and a thin layer of mayonnaise.

Back to the photograph and my son's bowed head. It's bowed because he's unhappy. This is not how he wants to be spending his Saturday afternoon, even if he does see the point in feeding the hungry. He'd rather be doing what he wants with his free time and who wouldn't? (Here I am reminded of a splendid bit from C.S. Lewis's Screwtape Letters. The devil Screwtape advises his nephew Wormwood that a great way to ensnare a man is to trick him into thinking his time is his own, so that every request made of him — regardless of its goodness — is an impingement, a source of irritation.)

These bagged lunches are bound for the homeless, you see, and my son would rather be doing this particular kindness from afar. It's not like when he participates in the Christmas pageant for the old folks at Little Flower Haven on La Mesa Boulevard. There, he gets up in front of the crowd and says his lines loud and clear and generally brings delight, but as soon as it's over, he gets to eat cookies and hang out with his fellow actors. He doesn't have to, you know, talk to the Olds, the Strangers, and the Possibly Loopy.

Here, he has to look people in the eye. Here, he has to talk to people. And not just people homeless people. Suffering people, who may be unfriendly, or too friendly, or smelly, or intoxicated, or crazy, or ungrateful, or just deeply embittered. Couldn't he just do some jobs, get paid, and donate the money to charity? No, he could not. Because his father wants him to meet his Neighbor — the one Christ told him to love, the one lying in a ditch like the Jew found by the Good Samaritan. (G.K. Chesterton has a great bit on this in his essay "On the Institution of the Family": "We have to love our neighbor because he is



Here there were the poorest of the poor, but even more than this; here were people whose lives and hopes have been crushed, many of them fallen victim to drug and alcohol addiction, a small way of them dealing often with a lifetime of rejection, abuse, and the struggle with mental illness. We assembled there to feed the poor a Christmas Day lunch. The poor lined up outside and

came into the hallway, with tables set in rows so people could sit down and have a meal. Inevitably, there were problems on the line, and Jeff Dietrich and his time. And this despite the fact that the hotels just blocks away were probably only half full.



I think, that I'd put the sugar in the soup. Not my best day, but I was a volunteer novice, especially as compared to those who worked the line each and every day. Making the big soups took quite a while, an hour or more; and the other Catholic Workers seemed to combine elements of recipes with on-the-spot quick decisions based on what leftover food they had gotten from the local markets. The big pots of soup fed hundreds and hundreds; how they always seemed to have just enough, we never knew. It was just as Jesus and Catholic Worker founder Dorothy Day said (in her Loaves & *Fishes*), "He took the five loaves and the two fishes; and looking up to

heaven, He blessed and brake and gave the loaves to his disciples, and the disciples to the multitudes. And they did all eat and were filled.... Matthew 14:16-20."


There were hundreds of homeless who stood in line. We who served them stood over vast pots, cooking up a marvelous meal. The Catholic Workers were an unlikely bunch. Part anarchist, part communitarian Christians like during the time of Jesus, when the church was dedicated to nonviolence — their iconoclastic ways make it a small miracle that they are able to live together, serve the poor, and keep a monthly paper. The anarchism and communitarianism was of a strange sort, inspired by

cofounder Peter Maurin, who wrote, "The best kind of government is self-government. The best kind of organization is self-organization." Though the Catholic Worker desired governments to help, they believed that the people should do the works of mercy themselves.



feeling. While I stood off in the distance, or across the street, he'd spoken with men and women, sober and drunk, happy and sad: greeting them, offering them lunch, saying goodbye and God bless you. (His younger brother and sister were smiling as well, having taken part in the same mission.) He even said we should do this more often.

And we did — one more time, not long after. And then we didn't do it again. The Christmas Spirit, God help me, faded away, at least as far as lunch distribution went. Life took on its normal shape, with its normal set of middle-class familial concerns closer to hand. Enough of "my

time" had been taken up helping my son help his neighbors that I was relieved to have the whole business behind me. Still, when I look back, it's clear that it fection after a couple of months. A lot more time and effort went into it than ever went into bringing lunch to the homeless. And for what? Along with that

There was the niggling feeling that it was the only thing I did today that was worth a damn.

was worth more than most of what I did last December. My son's bigtime Christmas present from 2008 sits in a box in the garage, a bunch of plastic and wires that lost its luster when it stopped working to per-

Christmases are going to have to go by before you learn that simple lesson?

Thomas:

The famous Jewish German émigré Theodor Adorno, in his "Articles May Not Be Exchanged," expressed the importance of giftgiving perhaps more poignantly than anyone else: "We are forgetting how to give presents.... Real giving had its joy in imagining the joy of the receiver. It means choosing, expending time, going out of one's way, thinking of the other as a subject: the opposite of distraction... Every undistorted relationship...is a gift."

The Christmas spirit, at its best, is filled with that spirit of giving. It's a time to remember, a time to appreciate and be grateful for what we have in this life. When I think of my own life, many things are brought to mind. Before my conscious memory, I was the recipient of the gift of giving and care. After I was abandoned by my parents in New York, I was taken care of, along with my older brother and sister, by Catholic nuns in the City.

We associate Christmas these days so much with gift-giving. Yet when I think about the greatest gifts I've been given in my own life, they have not been material things. Perhaps my most memorable Christmas Eve, many years ago, was shared with my parents, in the most unlikely of places, a place I never would have imagined they would ever come to. During my years growing up, my parents, though Jewish atheists, celebrated Christmas as a kind of secular holiday. But festive occasions in

my family were marred by my parents' drug and alcohol addiction. Since I was a little kid, I knew that the day would come when I would take my kid brothers and sis-

ter from them to raise them in part myself. That day came when I was about 21. My parents screamed and yelled from far away, calling me every name

in the book. Yet, a year later, on Christmas, they took me to their new home, an Alcoholics Anonymous meeting. I couldn't believe it; it was indeed a Christmas

miracle.

They told me that they had been dying from alcohol abuse and that, in retrospect, my taking my younger brothers and sister away had saved their life. That certainly wasn't my intention at the time my focus was on my younger brothers and sister — though I was pleased it had such a

and nobody would be poor

if everyone tried to be the poorest.

And everybody would be what he ought to be

if everybody tried to

what he wants the other fellow to be."

The late novelist David Foster Wallace put it this way in an address to the Kenyon College graduating class of 2005: "And I submit that this is what the real, no-bull value of your liberal arts education is supposed to be about: How to keep from going through your comfortable, prosperous, respectable adult life dead, unconscious, a slave to your head and to your natural default-setting of being uniquely, completely, imperially alone, day in and day out."

What's that got to do with the price of eggs? More to the point, what's that got to do with Ricky Bobby's favorite Jesus, the Christmas Jesus with the golden fleece diapers? I mean, consider Dave Bry, who writes the "Public Apology" column for the online magazine The Awl. Recently, he apologized to God for not believing in Him. Take it, Dave: "I don't mean to insult anyone who does. It's an intellectual position, that's all. I know the thought of You brings great comfort to many people. I realize lots of good gets done in Your name. Charity organizations, etc. You've inspired some great architecture, too. And books and sculpture and painting and music... But taking into consideration all the war and mass murder that people do for You, all the unbridgeable division and entrenchment of

thought that irrational faith leads to, all the ending of discussion and diplomacy, all the forsaking of responsibility for human action, I happen to think the world would be a better place if no one believed in You. Even if You do exist. We're better off thinking, even if incorrectly, that we're on our own. Maybe people would take care of each other better if they believed they were really in charge. Maybe people would clean up after themselves."

Except, well, maybe not. Because as the man says, without God, nothing is forbidden. And conversely, nothing

much is required either. If we make our own meaning, who's to say it has to include the poor bastard lying in a ditch by the side of the road, beaten and bleeding? That's them over there, this is me over here, and my neighbor is the comfortable gentleman next door who knows to leave me alone — so I can go about my business and worship my private household gods. As Wallace puts it, "Here's something else that's true. In the day-to-day trenches of adult life, there is actually no such thing as atheism. There is no such thing as not worshipping. Everybody

worships. The only choice we get is what to worship. And an outstanding reason for choosing some sort of God or spiritual-type thing to worship — be it J.C. or Allah, be it Yahweh or the Wiccan mother-goddess or the Four Noble Truths or some infrangible set of ethical principles — is that pretty much anything else you worship will eat you alive. 





## Strawberry Fields, Central Park, New York

John Lennon was one of four British teens who forever changed the face of rock and roll. An advocate for peace, politically outspoken, and senselessly murdered, Lennon's words continue to inspire.

For these reasons (among others), in 1981 the New York City Council allocated 2.5 acres in Central Park for Strawberry Fields, a tribute to Lennon's music and vision. Yoko Ono's donation made it possible to redesign the landscaping and continue its maintenance. On the day that would have been Lennon's 45th birthday, October 9, 1985, the city's mayor dedicated Strawberry Fields at the opening ceremony. Since then, the attraction has drawn thousands of visitors from all over the world, and 121 countries have sanctioned it a Garden of Peace.

Sit for a picnic, stroll through its

paths, or enjoy the street performers covering Lennon's lyrics. Strawberry Fields invites you to imagine — not just the possibility of a world at peace, but your own potential and that which was stolen from John Lennon.

The teardrop-shaped section of park landscape is located on the West Side between 71st and 74th streets. Annual daylong vigils take place every October 9. For more information, visit *centralpark.com*.

A Guide to Unexpected San Diego and Beyond | by Jerry Schad

## **ROCKHOUSE CANYON AND VALLEY**

Venture into Anza-Borrego's most remote and least-visited place.

Distance from downtown San Diego: 110 miles

Hiking length: Up to 10 miles round-trip on a dayhike; potentially more for backpacking • Difficulty: Strenuous

traddling the San Diego-River-Straddling the Con. 2 Side county line, Rockhouse Canyon and the broad, sloping alluvial basin drained by it - informally known as Rockhouse Valley constitute one of Southern California's truly forgotten places. Not much more than a century ago, Cahuilla Indians carried on a traditional way of life here. After the Indians moved to the nearby Santa Rosa Indian Reservation around 1900, a few hardy prospectors made forays into the area, traveling along centuries-old footpaths. Never has a road penetrated farther than the lower reaches of Rockhouse Canyon. Up in the silent valley itself, you might as well have stepped into a time warp. Only the distant glints and rumbles of high-flying aircraft provide evidence of the modern

You'll need several hours to dayhike Rockhouse Canyon as described here. Two or even three days of backpacking suffices to explore the spacious valley lying beyond. Don't forget, even on a day trip, to pack along essentials such as water, food, and extra clothing. Anza-Borrego Desert State Park has jurisdiction over the lower (San Diego County) section of the canyon, while the Bureau of Land Management oversees the upper (Riverside County) canyon and the valley beyond. For the latest information. phone Anza-Borrego at 760-767-4205 or 760-767-5311.

To get to the starting point from Borrego Springs, drive several miles east and north on Highway S-22. When you reach mile 26.7, just past the Pegleg Monument, turn north on Clark's Well Road. Pavement soon ends and you continue driving on dirt, bearing left at 1.5 miles onto Rockhouse Truck Trail. After nine miles

of dirt-road travel, you arrive at a point where roads into Butler and Rockhouse canyons diverge. This is the absolute limit for vehicles not of the high-clearance, 4-wheel-drive type. Three more excruciatingly slow miles of driving in the appropriate vehicle might or might not take you to the Rockhouse Truck Trail terminus (depending on road conditions).

From the road-end, walk a half mile up-canyon to Hidden Spring on the left, which isn't much more than a small puddle of stagnant water next to a grove of mesquite bushes. The canyon narrows ahead, and over the next 3.5 miles you trudge uphill on soft sand through a narrow gorge flanked in many places by soaring rock walls.

At a point just south of the San Diego–Riverside county line, you'll come upon a granite dike (barrier) forming a 20-foot "dry fall" (a true waterfall only during rare floods). Huge boulders litter the canyon floor, mute testimony


to the power of flash flooding.

Eventually, the canvon broadens and you enter Rockhouse Valley, named for the ruins of some rock houses probably built by miners over a century ago. Follow the main sandy wash up the west side of the valley until you reach the base of a boulder-strewn ridge 0.6 mile northwest of the valley entrance; then go 0.2 mile due north

to find the three rock houses, all of which are roofless. They're spaced along a low, elongated ridge with a view of the entire valley. Mud used as mortar still clings to some of the walls. Each house had a cozy fireplace inside.

You've now come nearly five miles — assuming you left your car at the end of the Rockhouse road. (The spacious Rockhouse Valley, with its ancient Indian trails and more rock houses, lies ahead — beyond what this brief article can describe). If this is to be your turnaround point, you'll find the return to be faster and easier, assisted by gravity all the way.

This article contains information about a publicly owned recreation or wilderness area. Trails and pathways are not necessarily marked. Conditions can change rapidly. ## **OUTDOORS**

The Fabled "Green Flash" at sunset or sunrise can sometimes be seen on crystal-clear days in December and January. At the instant the sun's upper rim is last visible at sunset, and also at the instant when it is first seen at sunrise, a flash of emerald-green color may be observed, especially on a flat horizon. Physicists explain this peculiar phenomenon as due to color-dispersion (as in a prism) and scattering of sunlight through the earth's atmosphere. Binoculars (or a small telescope) are helpful in spotting it. For green-flash hunting at sunset, any site with a view of the ocean horizon suffices. For the sunrise green flash, any spot overlooking the low desert (Sunrise Highway in the Laguna Mountains, for example) is good.

Cross-Country Skiers are in for a short-lived treat late this month through February if winter storms intense enough to drop several inches to two feet of snow hit San Diego County's higher mountains. As the clouds are clearing, you may be able to take advantage of good skiing conditions along Highway 79 through Cuyamaca Rancho State Park and along Sunrise Highway through the Laguna Mountain Recreation Area. More limited opportunities for cross-country skiing may briefly exist on Palomar Mountain. Farther north in Southern California and higher in elevation, the forested crests of the San Gabriel, San Bernardino, and San Jacinto Mountains offer more dependably good snow conditions.

Tree Aloes, the familiar succulent plants with red-hot-poker-like flower clusters, are at their showy best this month. Large clumps of aloes can be seen at La Jolla Cove, Mission San Diego de Alcalá, and scattered along the embankments overlooking Highway 163 in Balboa Park.

6th centuries BC, during the classical period of ancient Greece. They were performed in the nude. Women were not allowed and even threatened with a penalty of death if found at the site during the games.

As I entered the site of the ruins, I was overwhelmed by a sense of history. The stadium, which once seated 45,000 spectators, includes a field not much larger than a high school track — but with an aura unlike any I had felt at an athletic or historic site. Looking out at the 192-meter-long field, I had a sense of the competitions that took place here. I felt a little chill at the back of my neck, as if the ghost of one of the ancient competitors was whispering hello. It's a particular thrill to do a little running on the ancient track. You can even see where the original starting blocks once stood.

Among the most notable ruins on the site is the temple to Zeus. The huge ivory-and-gold statue dedicated to the king of the gods that once stood here was named one of the seven wonders of



the ancient world. Next to it is the ruin of the Heraeum, dedicated to Zeus's wife Hera, where the garlands were presented to the victors of the athletic competitions. It is also here where the Olympic torch was lit. To the west are the ruins of the Palaestra — the wrestling school — and the Gymnasium, where the competitors trained for weeks before the competitions.

Two museums, the Archaeological Museum and the Museum of the Olympic Games, help the visitor better navigate the logistics of the site and understand the historical context of the ruins. An artist's rendition of how the site likely appeared in ancient times helps one time-travel while wandering amid the ruins.

"I just got a book by James Allen called As a Man Thinketh. The main thing in it is that your thoughts pretty much determine the outcome of your life. If you're thinking negative thoughts, you're just going to get negative results. If you think positive thoughts, then your assets are going to follow that. 33 Strategies of War. The 33 Strategies of War was from more of a business standpoint. This was more like psychology, more manipulative. This is the first time I've been moved into metaphysics. I was listening to a lecture, and the lecturer mentioned James Allen and tied it into the

metaphysics, and I thought, Okay, I'm going to check that out."

## Who is your favorite author?

"I've got so many books, it's crazy. Right now, I'd have to say Robert Greene. But I like Donald Goines. He's an African-American novelist; he wrote *Never Die Alone* and *Daddy Cool*. Once you start reading him, you can't put him down — you can visualize what's happening, actually happening in the real world. I think he writes about a lot of stuff that happened to him — he just turned it into a story."

## What book has been most life-changing for you?

"I would say As a Man Thinketh. I've always been a hard worker and everything, but that book just put things in perspective for me as far as thoughts determining actions." What magazines or newspapers do you read?

"I read *Heavy Hitters* cover to cover. The majority of magazines are about movie stars or athletes or something, but this is more about business owners — showing how they

got their success. And I read the *Union-Tribune* every other day — I read the front page, and I always check the sports, because I like basketball."

## Do you talk to your friends about reading?

"I try to share books with my friends because my friends don't read a lot. They're just not used to it. But I expose them to a lot of books. I came across this one book called *How to Hustle and Win: A Survival Guide for the Ghetto* by Supreme Understanding. That's another book that changed my life because, on a personal level, it was about how you can get through everything in life, the struggles and everything."

Chicago clubs were more receptive to women DJs. For the record, Noble spun vinyl records. She calls the skill of matching beats a sport as well as an art form.

"Everybody's watching you, and the expectation is that you're gonna blow it even more if you're a female. But," she says, "there's only so much satisfac-

tion you can get from mixing two records. I killed it, like, pretty hard for three years, and I felt that everything I had wanted to achieve I pretty much did." Noble went back to school and finished her master's degree in 2007.

"That's when I learned production and let go of dance music."

These days, Noble calls herself a sound artist and a producer. "I mess around with a lot of toys," she says, meaning various noisemakers, such as a kalimba, or thumb piano, and a zitherlike bowed instrument.

"There are pickups on them and they're running through [electronic] devices, and then I'm overdubbing and looping them and mixing textures and lavers."

It's music, but can you dance to it? "I don't like to alienate people," she says, "but I want to challenge them on some level. I want anybody to be able to walk in and get something. But I don't want to be so soft and so pop that it's generic."

Noble, 37, teaches digital



Reel Big Fish has been playing ska-punk since the early '90s and is best known for the 1997 hit "Sell Out," but to me they will always be the band that created one of my favorite album titles of all time: Why Do They Rock So Hard? The cover of the 2001 album featured the band members in silhouette against a background of stars, a little like the logo for Charlie's Angels. Front and center was a guy playing a doubleneck guitar and flashing the devil-horns sign. Around him were other musicians in various poses of severe rockitude. I didn't notice at first that

most of these metal maniacs were holding not Flying Vs but trumpets and trombones.

Reel Big Fish dipped into the well of ironic metal again early this year with Fame, Fortune, and Fornication, an album of tonguein-cheek covers including not one but two Poison songs. The concept doesn't take a lot of imagination: Reel Big Fish began as a cover band, and throughout their career they have been alternating their sarcastic originals with ironic covers. Their version of "Mama Weer All Crazee

Now" sounds exactly the way you would think a ska-punk take on the Slade/Quiet Riot song would sound like.

But the whole album is redeemed by "Talk Dirty to Me," a duet between lead singer **Aaron Barrett** and guest Tatiana DeMaria. In the Reel Big Fish version, the Poison song is stripped down

to little more than vocals, a minimal drumbeat, and some rockabilly-ish guitar. What once seemed like a boneheaded hair-metal hit turns out to be a great pop song.

Camper Van Beethoven is a California band and were somewhat big in the '80s. CVB integrates country rock, psychedelic, and faux ethnic things with violin. Imagine the Grateful Dead doing a Strawberry Alarm Clock retrospective with a little ska beat here and there. I sat in radio-programming meetings back in the 1980s in which we openly made fun of CVB and groups like them. What they did to earn our disdain I don't recall because Camper Van Beethoven had had the kind of chart success with a cult following that cannot be denied (or explained).

Their cover of "Pictures of Matchstick Men" was a radio hit and smart going at that. No better band for them to cover than Status Ouo, a forgotten British garage band from the 1960s with more hit records in their day than just about anyone. But that was the high-water mark for the first decade of Camper Van Beethoven. They went missing in the early '90s, with bassist-founder David Lowry having gone on to form a more popular band called Cracker.

Twenty-five years older now, the members of CVB are back out on the road. Revived in 2000 (they recorded their first studio CD in 15 years in 2004), they've all grown up. Yet







#### Phrazes for the Young

A throwback to '70s arena-rock with '80s synth-pop dropped in for good measure, this melodic, angsty, and ultimately upbeat solo debut from Strokes frontman Julian Casablancas

manages to find its modern sound. At points, one hears Trans Am's Futureworld, but Phrazes evokes even more of a carnival-midway feel than that 1999 indie-rock staple.

Casablancas's voice drones through the bitter to some occasionally sweet lyrics. Lines such as "Everything seems to go wrong when I start drinking" and "Somewhere along the way, my sadness turned to bitterness" suggest that the 31-year-old pop star's life isn't all we might imagine it to be.

The album's title comes from Oscar Wilde's "Phrases and Philosophies for the Use of the Young." Wilde says, "The first duty in life is to be as artificial as possible. What the second duty is no one has as yet discovered." It seems Casablancas might be searching for that answer in this collection.

At about five minutes each, the songs are longer than the average pop track, but the time goes by quickly and, too soon, this engaging eighttrack album ends.



Morrissey was in a fine mood at Copley Symphony Hall, After a few songs, he acknowledged to the crowd of over 2000 that his last two San Diego performances were "a bit rough." (Morrissey walked off the stage at his last San Diego show due to sound problems and a vicious security squad.) He then thanked the crowd for coming and for their loyalty. He and his band tore through 19 songs to an enthusiastic crowd that never

took their seats

Morrissey introduced his band members one by one. They all dressed and looked alike in black



pants and shirts, and had haircuts that could've been shorn on any military base in town. The guitar players changed instruments for nearly every song. They played mostly vintage Fender guitars, with one Gibson Les Paul thrown in for some extra punch. The Smiths' songs ("This Charming Man," "How Soon Is Now," "Is it Really So Strange," "Death at One's Elbow," "Cemetery Gates," and "Ask") seemed to garner the loudest applause, but the new songs shined, especially a rockabilly number where a standup bass was slapped.

At 50 years old. Morrissey still puts on an energetic show. For the encore, he and the band joined hands at the front of the stage, took a long, low bow, and returned to their positions for the final song, "The First of the Gang to Die." As the song neared its end, he ripped off his shirt and threw it into the audience, where a brief shirt fight ensued.

#### **Paula Goes** to Powav

When Paula Cole performs, it's part concert, part group meditation. Fans were entranced watching the singer-songwriter croon her poetic, selfrevealing lyrics at the Poway Center for the Performing Arts. Between songs, Cole's emotional interludes further connected her and the audience. whom she conversed with from stage and thanked for "this family reunion."

Dressed in a black tank dress over tall

zippered boots, the Grammy-winning soprano opened her show by playing a lingering clarinet solo before she delved into the soulful, melancholy



"Suwannee Jo" and slowly pumped a steel pedal to back it with a tribal, hypnotic beat.

Guitarist Ben Butler and drummer Ben Wittman added dimension, playing the backup tools with a style as to make the common instruments unrecognizable. In a ten-minute improvisation of the sensual "Feelin' Love" (surprisingly, the top choice of female pole-dancers, Cole prefaced), Butler's guitar solo inspired the audience to erupt in lengthy applause. The jazz-trained Cole accompanied her band on grand piano, pumping through the fiery indie rock of "Mississippi" and playing the delicate melodies of "Me."

Cole is best known for "Where Have All the Cowboys Gone?" and the Dawson's Creek theme "I Don't Want to Wait." from the feisty album This Fire, so she teased fans by exiting after ten songs, coming back onstage to encore both hit songs.



# Milan Modern

Bice (pronounced "BEE-chay") had been open only five weeks when I ate there, because I didn't have the patience to wait the standard, tactful three more weeks before trying it — not just because the menu offered so many dishes I wanted to sample, but also because it's a sophisticated international chain with a chef who has opened several other locations (including Bice Beirut). I figured they wouldn't need much time polishing up the choreography here. Besides, if the food was a shuck, I could title the review, "Life's a bice, then you diet." Instead, my posse and I were charmed, delighted, excited, wishing we could come back the next night to delve deeper into the vast choice of authentic Italian artesanal cooking.

Founded as a mom 'n' pop restaurant in Milan in 1926, Bice became a local favorite and a half-century later evidently acquired corporate backers, expanding to locations in ultra-competitive New York (1987), plus Beirut, Kansas, Dubai, Los Angeles, etc. (Downtown San Diego even had a prior incarnation back in 1990, until the Paladion Shopping Center, where the restaurant was located, went belly up.)

Even with remarkably moderate prices (here in San Diego, that is — not in NY), Bice more closely resembles chef chains (such as the international empires of Wolfgang Puck, Nobu, Jean-Georges, et al.) than suburban fill-'er-ups. Urbane Italian cuisine mingles past and future with sleek, chic decor, but the cuisine looks lovingly backward to rural foodways. It's traditional Italian "slow food" unfussy dishes showcasing seasonal fresh vegetables and full-flavored craftsmanly products, such as arresting local cheeses (and condiments to complement them), cured meats from specially fed pigs, hand-crafted pastas with personality, breads with character. For barely a few dollars more than at our unspeakable mall-Italians, you can enjoy some of those legendary ingredients that celeb chef Mario Batali touts and that generally can't be found in San Diego at all.



The site is a start-from-scratch former industrial building remade as a restaurant. You enter via a lounge with low white couches for awaiting your party, set near a busy bar with dramatic lighting, which offers a serious bar menu. (Wagyu beef carpaccio, anyone?)

A few steps up, the dining room carries through the Milano-moderno neutral scheme of black, white, and grey, including charcoal

carpeting (grazie!, we're so sick of restaurant din). One wall of the dining room is dedicated to a cheese-and-salumi bar, a boon to singletons and couples eating casually but well. Choices from this bar (not the booze-bar) are also available at the tables; just ask your server for the menu. The diners mainly ran over the age of, say, 32; the men wore changed-my-shirt business casual; the women were a tad dressy, like back when "eating out" meant putting on something niftier than office clothes.

The bread plate is a class act. It includes large, delicate, golden house-made crackers, house-made focaccia, and Bread & Cie baguette slices and comes with a lush, soft mascarpone cheese blend ringed with balsamic. So we're already on the

path to glory.

Our server (from Naples) was terrific by nature, by training. Above all, Bice seems dedicated to giving pleasure. When we asked

for the cheese-bar menu, he brought the booze-bar menu, too, and my eyes lit up when I spotted *mozzarella en carozza* (rounds of mozzarella stuffed with anchovy and fried in a light breading), a dish I loved in San Francisco but have found rarely down here. Whoops. The bar menu is bar only. But the chef not only made the dish up for us but sent it out "compliments of the house." (It was quite firm, and I didn't love it half as much as my favorite melty-goopy version at a



you love weird, strong, sheepy cheeses, etc.) I reluctantly passed up mozzarella burrata (the softest and creamiest) garnished with roasted cherry peppers from Chino, in favor of buffalo mozzarella garnished with a waft of tomato confit and a sprinkling of bottarga ("poor man's caviar"), dried and salt-cured mullet roe — at last, a chance to try one of those exotic "Mario things"! The sprinkling was so dainty I'm still not sure what bottarga tastes like, but it added an indefinable dark note to the ethereal cheese, the touch of earthiness that turned it heavenly. The buffalo cheese is also available on the regular menu with a garnish of imported prosciutto. (I think you already know that buffalo cheese comes from water-buffalo milk and bears no relationship to Buffalo chicken, where the cheese is blue.)

We leaped on the evening's special of *porchetta*, also from the *salumeria* selection, another

adventure in Mario-land: slices of herb-cured, lightly roasted, pink pork shoulder. Oh, was that a hit — so tender, sweet, and interesting!

Along with composed appetizers and bruschetta, the cheese bar also offers tastes of single Italian cheeses or plates of several — your choice, plus condiments (fruit spreads, exotic honeys) to complement them. The cured-meat selection is generous. Next time: I need that "duel" plate pitting prosciutto di Parma against its rival, prosciutto San Daniele. They have "speck," too (separately), so if you're into food scholarship you can add that to your comparisons and finally figure out the taste

Our one regular antipasto choice was a salad of fork-tender octopus, pounded flat, serving as the bottom layer for a heap of sliced fresh fennel in a parsley-and-lemon dressing. Needed something more. I wouldn't send it back but wouldn't order it again, given the wealth of choices. The *contorni* (sides) menu offers some tremendous temptations that

could stand in for starters, like a Belgian endive salad and, somewhere or other, I spotted a dish of tempura-fried cheese-stuffed squash blossom, worth trying if only to see how it rivals Cucina Urbana's rendition. (Bice stands to become Cucina Urbana's main competition, with a similarly flexible menu — worse location, but more genuinely Italian food.)

Bice's management has no problem at all with people eating family-style, like Italians, and that means that even if our foursome had shared just one pasta and one entrée after our antipasti, there'd be no hateful little "split plate" charge. But of course I needed to try as much as possible, so we got two of each and (given the earlymorning commutes of several tablemates) opted to have pastas and entrées served at the same time, rather than pastas first, proteins second.

The evening's special of soft, fresh-made fettuccini with a medley of six mushrooms (none of them precious) was simple but fun. But what captured me entirely was a riveting house-made "calamarata" pasta

(thick, hollow, striated shells, shaped like short calamari tubes) with fresh clams in their own shells and squash blossoms sauced with garlic, olive oil, a touch of hot pepper, dry white wine, and the juices exuded by the clams. It's one of those *Ratatouille*-type revelations, a simple peasant dish rising to the fore — fierce with its in-yourface flavors.

Our first entrée choice was black cod, cooked just right to tender, coated with a light pesto and a touch of celery-root purée. It came with a mixture of string beans and diced sautéed potatoes, but the main thing was that this fine, rich fish was shown the respect it deserves in the perfectly timed cooking.

It was the relative "bargain" price that tempted me on the most expensive entrée, beef tenderloin filet (\$28, compared to most local restaurants' high-\$30s for this cut) — that and the garnish of foie gras. There was not all that much foie gras, just a bit of frou-frou on top. The beef was rare as ordered, and the Barolo wine-reduction sauce was pleasing. The prob-

lem is, beef tenderloin is tender but not very flavorful compared to, say, rib-eye or skirt steak. The mashed potatoes alongside tasted buttery but not creamy. The horizontally split roasted head of garlic proved delicious, but what do you spread it on if you've already used up the nightly carb-count on breads and pastas?

We went and consumed more carbs, after all, but they were "worth-it carbs" on exceptional desserts. Pastry chef Francesca Penoncalli rivals our local Iack Fisher (currently at 910 Restaurant) in the trembling tenderness of her panna cotta, a rendition fancied up rewardingly with balsamic reduction sauce, almonds, and fresh basil. (Panna cotta is a sort of gelatinized cream, with any flavoring desired. Done right, it's probably the airiest, most delicate dessert ever invented.) We also enjoyed her special ricotta tart — lean, clean, not too sweet. My espresso, served hot and fresh with dessert as requested, was rich, balanced — perfect.

My fear for Bice is this: Chef Mario Cassineri and sous-chef Francesca Penoncelli have been traveling together for five years, opening new Bice locations around the world. That is, they're the "opening chefs," with the expertise to get new restaurants off the ground. Then they leave them to other chefs they've presumably trained. Will Bice still be this good in three or six months or a year, after this duo has wafted off to Abu Dhabi?

"I want to come back for another meal to taste some more pastas," said Lynne. "And then come back again for a whole night exploring the cheese-and-salumi bar." "I'm with you," said Sam. "I want to try the entire menu at the regular bar," said Jerry. "I want to eat it all," I said.

Our food bill (including the most expensive entrée on the menu) came to \$35 each, for an experience that was all pleasure. Watch out, Cucina Urbana, with your noise and crowds — a new Italian stallion has just galloped into town, with saddlebags packed with the precious homeland goodies we've long heard about and are yearning to taste.

#### MOM'S BANANA WALNUT SALAD

Executive Chef, Pacifica Del Mar

One of my biggest accomplishments as a chef has been to use the local food that grows in San Diego. It was a challenge when I first moved here from the Bay Area. It was a culture shock. As far as the food scene, it was just really different. Number one was finding out what was grown here locally. In San Francisco, most of my ingredients came from a 100-mile radius. In San Diego, there were tons of farms, but all the vendors were from L.A. I couldn't understand it. There were great farms all along the I-5 and there were mushroom growers in San Marcos. I thought, why can't we

work with the local vendors?

But back then the vendors didn't even live in my area. We used seafood out of L.A. Fish was trucked from Mexico through San Diego but I had to go to L.A. to get it. It was ridiculous. So, a few chefs and I really worked to bring the indigenous products to the table. Now I go to Chino Farms and use Brandt Beef. I'm always trying to provide what's sustainable and affordable.

I usually have Sundays and Tuesdays off. Monday is my admin day, and I cook that night at home. I have three boys, aged 16, 13, and 11. They're good eaters. On Mondays I'll do a salmon dinner or fresh seafood at home. We hang out. My youngest son especially is intrigued by the kitchen. He tells me he wants to be a chef. I practice yoga and go to the beach, too. That's what my life entails.

I work on the holidays. That's what my holiday dinners turn into. One of my favorite dinners is a prime rib I do at Christmas at Pacifica. I do a salt cure on the beef for ten days. It cures it and infuses it with herbs and garlic so I have this steak that's beautifully seasoned throughout. The curing breaks the tissue down so it's got this tender bite.

At home, one of my traditional dishes is a banana walnut salad with



whipped cream, marshmallows, with a vinegarmustard base. It's incredible, but it's good for a few hours only. It's a family recipe of ours. I finally got the recipe about five years ago. Before that, my mom just handed me the mustard base in a mason jar and wouldn't tell me how to make it. We just passed the mason jar from house to house with her secret sauce in it. It's an addicting salad, and we only make it on Thanksgiving and Christmas.

#### **Dogfight**

Off-Leash Hours Contested

Encinitas — On December 13, Steve Meiche lodged a formal complaint

against Encinitas city manager Phil Cotton and director of Parks and **Recreation Chris Hazel**tine. Meiche picked up the scent last November, when city councilmembers debated whether to extend the off-leash dog hours at six of the city's parks after more than 20 residents were handed heftv \$445 fines for having their dogs roam free during on-leash hours.

CITY LIGHTS

For years, dog owners have taken the leads off their pups three days a

week, from 6 to 7:30 a.m. and then again from 4 to 6 p.m. During the November council meeting, city staff proposed extending the hours from 6 to 9 a.m. and 3 to 8 p.m. as well as opening the park on Sundays.

At that November meeting, councilmembers continued the issue until further studies were conducted and until local stakeholders signed off on the expansion of hours.

According to Meiche, a nearby resident of

Orpheus Park, that is when city administrators began misleading the city council by stating all the stakeholders in the area had given the command to extend the hours. As stated in his complaint, city officials never interviewed property owners, nor did they interview homeowners associations surrounding Orpheus, Viewpoint, and Sun Vista parks.

Meiche says that extending the hours at Orpheus Park puts the neighborhood kids, including his own, at risk of running into a rabid hound while on their way to Paul Ecke Central School. The same goes for kids traipsing through Sun Vista Park on their way to Olivenhain Pioneer School.

**Existing SDG&E Lines** Will Work

Point Loma — District 2 San Diego councilmember Kevin Faulconer and Mayor **Jerry Sanders announced** 

on December 15 a new recycling program — the first of its kind in California - for a more environmentally safe method of transporting methane gas from Point Loma's wastewater treatment plant.

Last week, on December 8, the San Diego City Council unanimously adopted a plan that called for the recycling of the methane. The big change in the plan was the method of how the gas would be transferred — from using trucks to using pipelines.

(Several Point Loma residents had voiced their concerns regarding the safety of the trucks.) The program will use existing SDG&E fuel lines to transport the methane, and the gas will be recycled and used.

Two local sites — UCSD and the South Bay Water Reclamation Plant — will receive the gas. The project is set to begin in 2011.

City of San Diego; \$15,000 for a few hours of work smells fishy to me," wrote one North Park resident to media outlets in regards to a Saturday, December 5, mass towing operation for the North Park Toyland Parade. On that day, from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. approximately 40 cars were hauled away from Oregon Street to a tow yard

owned and operated by JC Towing.

CITY LIGHTS

Most residents say that no signs were visible on Oregon Street, while others say the sole "No Parking" sign that was posted in front of an apartment building at 3930 Oregon, on a three-foot-tall A-frame makeshift sign, indicated that it was Idaho Street not Oregon Street — that was off limits to parking.

When residents returned to their empty parking place, traffic cops directed them to the JC Towing yard. Once there, some waited as long as five hours to retrieve their vehicles, while accumulating hourly impound fees. After tow fees, parking tickets, processing, and impound fees were tallied, some residents had to pay nearly \$500.

"It seems tow companies sort of make up charges as they go along. JC Towing made over \$15,000 from this little haul, which they kick back some to San Diego," wrote one resident.

 Mattel is accepting pre-orders for the April 2010 release of the newest doll in the Barbie/Ken line, the spiffily dressed Palm Beach Sugar Daddy Ken (apparently to be showcased with a much younger, trophy-type Barbie).

Even more troubling (but so far only a prototype) is Alex Green's "Placenta Teddy Bear,"

exhibited in London in September and Newcastle, England, in October at the "[re]design" showcase of "sustainable tovs" with children's themes. After the placenta is cured and dried, it is treated with an emulsifier to render it pliable and cut into strips with which to stitch Teddy together, thus "unify[ing]" mother and baby.

#### **Animal Weird News**

- CNN, reporting from the London Zoo in August, described the excitement surrounding news that the zoo would soon acquire a 12-yearold male gorilla from a preserve in France. Zoo officials were pleased, but its three older female gorillas were almost ecstatic. Shown posters of Yeboah," the male, female "Zaire" "shrieked in delight"; "Effie" wedged the poster into a tree and stared at it; and "Mjukuu" held the photo close to her chest, "then ate it."

- The births of two chicks on the same day at the Ierusalem Biblical Zoo in April was unusual enough but especially noteworthy because of the birds' lineage. Their fathers were a gay vulture couple about ten years ago, according to a report in the Israeli daily Haaretz, and zoo caretakers provided them an artificial egg to "incubate" until they could replace the egg with a justhatched vulture, as if the male-male couple had birthed it. In "an insane coincidence," said a zoo official, the two males eventually separated and paired with females, and those females hatched eggs on the same day last April. Two weeks ago, according to Haaretz, the two chicks achieved independence on the same day and were moved to the zoo's aviary.

Among the species discovered recently in Papua New Guinea were tiny bear-like creatures, frogs with fangs, fish that grunt, kangaroos that live in trees, and what is probably the world's largest rat (with no fear of humans). Scientists from Britain, the United States, and Papua New Guinea announced the findings in September, among more than 40 new species from a jungle habitat a half-mile deep inside the centuriesdormant Mount Bosavi volcano crater.

#### **Leading Economic Indicators**

- A young media-shy Chinese woman, identified only as "Mrs. Wang" and photographed in jeans, a T-shirt, and baseball cap, purchased an 18-month-old Tibetan mastiff in September for a reported 4 million yuan (about \$585,000). She ordered a motorcade of 30 luxury cars to meet her and the dog on their arrival in Xi'an, in Shaanxi province. The price is almost four times the previous reported high for the purchase of a

dog (a cloned Labrador, by a Florida family).

- Surprisingly, the recession otherwise felt in the Phoenix area this year has largely spared one "profession": psychics. An October Arizona Republic report found that while longtime clients tended to reduce their use of astrology and related fields, their business was replaced by a new class of customers desperate to know the future those facing financial ruin because of bad home mortgages. (Few, wrote the reporter, seemed to sense the irony of purchasing questionable psychic services to overcome the consequences of questionable mortgage decisions.)

#### **Hyperactive Seniors**

Elsa Seman, 71, was shot and killed in North Versailles, Pa., in September, when she was mistaken for a prowler. According to police, Seman had gone to the home of her ex-boyfriend at night and, dressed in black, commando-style, was lying in wait in his yard with a pistol, intending to kill him. A neighbor called in the report of a prowler, and a police officer arriving at the scene fatally shot Seman.



Got an unusual press release last week. It began: "On Sunday, December 13, 2009, St. Luke's Lutheran Church in La Mesa, Calif., held a legally called and conducted meeting to take its second and final vote to sever ties with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).... St. Luke's is now affiliated with the Fellowship of Evangelical Lutheran Churches."

"Emphatically, it's not the gay issue," said church council president Richard Floegel when I referred to the ELCA's recent decision to

allow openly homosexual pastors. "The belief of this congregation is that the ELCA has been moving away from the core tenets of being Lutheran" and undergoing "a fundamental shift toward following social programs as opposed to ministries and Biblical spirituality.... It's a general loss of focus on what a church is supposed to be. A church is there to prepare people to meet Christ at the time of their death, to live a spiritual life, and to serve the community - in that order."

Pastor Menacher agreed that the break was not about sexuality. "Members of the congregation who were concerned about the sex issue all left some time ago." (Menacher arrived after the exodus). "The folks here...knew that things were not right. I was able to provide them with information about what exactly is going wrong. They could read my research for themselves, and it confirmed their suspicions." Menacher argued that the ELCA was willing to "deliberately twist the Lutheran statements of

faith to make an ecumenical agreement come through." He cited as examples an attempt to adopt Episcopalian structures of Episcopal succession and a Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification that "by and large has Lutherans signing up for a Roman Catholic understanding of justification."

Menacher, who holds a doctorate in historical and systematic theology, hopes to replace this ecumenical overreaching with "a positive understanding of Luther's desire to share the Gospel" as he understood it. "Part of their calling me to be pastor was a desire to redevelop what we're calling 'genuine Lutheranism."

But all this is theology. Though it might drive a church to sever a connection for the sake of cleaving to the truth, none of it means that Menacher and his flock have no truck with their fellow travelers. Sunday's "Song of the Ages" liturgy featured the combined talents of St. Luke's and Pacific Beach Presbyterian (plus a small orchestra of

unknown affiliation), singing carols from the days when the Roman Catholic Church was the only game in town. "Twice a year," explained Menacher at the outset, "we combine our choirs to provide a sound of praise and worship that we cannot make on our

The music covered a huge swath of territory, from a modern arrangement of the first-century ode "A Great Day Has Shined Upon Us" to Gregorian Chant to Bach to Saint-Saëns to the highly contemporary "Heart of Worship." Plus traditional carols — "Joy to the World," etc.

"Our hope is the same, regardless of time and circumstances," declared the reader. "The message of Christ bringing salvation is the same." To manifest the point, the songs were intercut with both Scripture's amazing claims — "And the Word was made flesh"—and a sermon from the fourth-century bishop Augustine of Hippo. "For him, Christmas was the central mystery of the faith," she explained. "The glorious par-

adox of the Incarnation."

And Augustine hammered that paradox home: "You would have suffered eternal death had he not been born in time," cried a second lector. "Filling the universe, He lies in a manger. Ruler of the stars, He nurses at His mother's bosom. He is both

great in the nature of God and small in the form of a servant, but His greatness is not diminished by His smallness, nor His smallness overwhelmed by His greatness.... Man's maker was made man, that the truth might be accused by false witnesses...justice be sentenced by the unjust, the strength be made weak, the healer be wounded, and that life might die. Wake up, o human being! For it was for you that God was made man! Rise up and realize, it was all for you!"

What happens when we die?

"A life as we know it comes to an end," said Menacher. "What happens beyond that is where our faith comes into play. Scripture gives us a promise, particularly in Romans 8, that nothing will separate us from the love of Christ Jesus, including death itself."
