



#### **How the Rich Steal** from Schools

arch 17 of 2003 was Don Bauder Day in San Diego. (I suspected that most city council members voted for it because

they were gleefully celebrating my departure from the *Union-Tribune*.) The honor was no big deal because a lot of people get it. But mine was memorable, because in accepting it, I lashed out at the council, charging that San Diego's form of government was turning into a plutocracy, or government by the wealthy.

Had I known about research that was to come out two years later, I would have also mentioned that the San Diego economy was in danger of becoming a plutonomy, in which the majority of wealth is controlled by an evershrinking, super-affluent minority. In a plutonomy, economic growth is powered and consumed by the wealthiest upper class. Public policy should be aimed at massaging the superrich. A rising tide lifts all yachts.

The word "plutonomy" usually applies to a country, but there is no reason it can't describe a metropolitan area. The concept was introduced by an economist at New York's Citigroup in 2005. He concluded that of the major industrial countries, the U.S., U.K., Canada, and Australia were plutonomies and therefore were likely to enjoy better growth than other developed countries with more

income equality. Continental Europe (with the exception of Italy) and Japan represented the "egalitarian bloc," sneered the economist, and they would do worse economically than the plutonomies.

Like most forecasts, this one was only partly right. Both the plutonomies and egalitarian bloc countries got whacked in the mayhem that began in late 2007 and is still drawing blood. Canada, a plutonomy, is doing relatively well. Europe is doing worse than the U.S., although Italy, supposedly a plutonomy, is in sick bay, and the plutonomic U.K. is a mess. (Of course, Citigroup, which got the largest bailout of any U.S. bank, is itself a disaster.)

The Citigroup economist was right in several respects: he predicted that

the rich would continue to get richer. Bingo! Between 2001 and 2007, two-thirds of income gains in the U.S. went to the richest 1 percent. The most affluent 1 percent owns well over half the nation's stocks and rakes in more income than the bottom 50 percent of Americans. In 1950, top executives earned about 30 times what the average worker earned; now it's 300 to 500 times. Last year, the top 25 hedge fund managers raked in \$25 billion. The 400 highest-paid Americans had an average income of \$345 million in 2007 and

only paid an effective tax rate of 16.6 percent.

Now, as company profits zoom, consumer sentiment has plummeted to lows that are seldom seen. That's because one reason profits are going up is that companies aren't hiring and continue to send jobs overseas

In the U.S. today, retail sales are soaring in upscale stores but not in downscale ones — just as the Citigroup economist predicted. Indeed, he said the economy can grow just fine without the poor and middle class; the upper crust's purchases will keep it going.

Crucially, a plutonomy needs friendly, cooperative governments, said the Citigroup guru. That's what San Diego has. The business overlords essentially run government, which then makes sure that taxpayer money flows to the affluent.

A classic example is the abuse of redevelopment money. It was originally meant to help the poor and middle class by creating affordable housing and eliminating blight. The San Diego downtown establishment hijacked the concept for the building of corporate welfare projects that benefit the developers, builders, and the affluent. Petco Park made John Moores an even richer

billionaire. A new Charger stadium would make a billionaire family, the Spanoses, even wealthier. Upscale hotels, condos, and retailers downtown get fat subsidies while the neighborhoods, infrastructure, maintenance, fire service, and outlying libraries are ignored.

Normally, the City gets 17 percent of property tax receipts, and the rest goes to the County, school districts, and special-purpose governments. But in a redevelopment, 80 percent of the tax increment goes to the City and redevelopment agency, and the money has to be spent in the project area where it was raised. But there has to be "blight." So despite all the redevelopment money poured into downtown, the establishment still claims it is blighted. "In San Diego, CCDC [Centre City Development Corp.] has so much power that the money goes back downtown," says Vlad Kogan, doctoral candidate at the University of California San Diego.

In Los Angeles and San Francisco, governments have made sure that redevelopment funds go into the neighborhoods. But in San Diego, Centre City utterly dominates the city council, which is the redevelopment agency. That's plutocracy.

"In San Diego, the

establishment has a feeding trough, a dedicated revenue stream for pet projects, and it is not interested in the rest of the city," says Steve Erie, professor of political science at the University of California San Diego. "In Los Angeles, the money is going to the neighborhoods," but nonetheless, there is a downtown renaissance financed by private capital. "In San Diego, the only way we do business is with public money for private purpose and private benefit."

San Diego will now pay a consulting firm half a million bucks to look, essentially, at the possibility of a Charger stadium. Big question: Is there blight? Why hire a consulting firm? You know what the answer will be: Gawd, yes! It's blighted!

Build! Subsidize!

"There was a time when downtown was blighted and needed an infusion of subsidies," says Murtaza Baxamusa of the Center on Policy Initiatives. Today, "It's like giving a blue [parking] placard to somebody who was handicapped but is no longer handicapped. The market can now take care of itself." And the money that goes to subsidizing the wealthy "is money that could go for health care, to schools."

But the political apparatus helps keep the rich stealing from the children.

Centre City wants to triple the tax increment cap for its project area. The motivation is to permit an insolvent city to subsidize a Charger stadium to the tune of \$600 million to \$900 million. Councilmember Kevin Faulconer, whose district includes downtown, asked the independent budget analyst Andrea Tevlin to see if the raising of the cap would hurt the City's finances.

The study she signed concluded that while the general fund would lose \$300 million over 32 years, there would be increases in such things as hotel and property taxes that would more than offset that loss. (Have you heard this whopper before?) Civic activist Mel Shapiro points out that Faulconer's wife runs a downtown business, and

#### **A Quiet Senior Center with a Little** Ramp

hould members of affluent communities blush when their leaders go scrounging for federal assistance? Probably

not in the view of Lynda Hunt, who was interviewed by the La Jolla Village News in May 2006. "San Diego County assumes that every-

one who lives in La Jolla is rich and doesn't need help," Hunt said. "I have a really difficult time securing donations as soon as I mention that [we're] in La Jolla." At the time, Hunt was employed by the nonprofit LiveWell San Diego as the Riford Center's executive director. The center's purpose had long been to serve elderly folk in a building that sits on La Jolla Boulevard at Bonair Street. Former La Jolla resident Florence Riford, who died in 1993 at age 100, established the center in the 1970s, including an endowment to pay for its ongoing activities. She later donated the property to the City of San Diego. Over the years, the City has leased the property to a series of center operators.

In 2007, several community leaders founded another nonprofit to run the Riford. Friends of the Riford Center immediately faced annual expenses that were exceeding what a shrunken endowment and donations

# AMERICA's SINFULLEST CITY?

CCDC Proposes Boosting Downtown Economy by Designating Failing Hotels and Empty Condos as Sites for Legalized Prostitution

"Bring back the Stingaree!"

BETWEEN THE SHEETS IN AN EXTREME WOW SUITE, W HOTEL SAN DIEGO: It wasn't that long ago that downtown San Diego was known more for XXX theaters, massage parlors, and tattoo joints than for fine dining, cool clubs, and trendy boutiques. But even those tawdry days of the '70s pale in comparison to the early 1900s, when a part of downtown known as the Stingaree played host to a host of prostitutes, drug dealers, and gamblers.

Of course, all that changed with the creation of the Centre City Development Corporation (CCDC) in 1975, which had as its mission the creation of a thriving, healthy downtown San Diego. The CCDC proved highly effective, and the passing years have seen the construction of Horton Plaza, the convention center, and Petco Park.

So it may come as a surprise to some to hear that a recent CCDC report on new

economic initiatives called for an inquiry into the use of downtown's growing number of failing hotels and vacant condo towers as sites for "legalized, regulated, and properly taxed sexual services." Noted properties mentioned in the report include the recently foreclosed W Hotel and the largely vacant Vantage Pointe condominium complex — luxury operations that have foundered during the recent economic downturn.

But the surprise fades when you pause to remember that urban redevelopment is largely a matter of economics. The anonymously authored report notes that "Economic rejuvenation relies, first and foremost, on providing people a place where they'll want to go and spend their money. That starts with desirable goods and services — obviously not an issue in this case — but it also includes atmosphere. If people

like the place they're in, they're more likely to open their wallets. Fifty years ago, 'Stingaree' was a dirty word. Today, things have changed."

As evidence, the report cites Stingaree, the swank Sixth Avenue restaurant/nightclub that has adopted the neighborhood's once-pejorative name. "And they're not alone. The Gaslamp Strip Club on Fifth may be a steak joint, but their signage is pure va-va-voom. Madame Cora's Marble Room is done up to look the way it did when it was an actual brothel. To say nothing of Hooters or the Tilted Kilt or the original F Street Adult Boutique or Hustler Hollywood. It's clear that consumers are charmed by downtown's naughty history. What they don't want is the crime and danger that can be associated with that naughti-

ness. And that's precisely what legalization and regulation will avoid. Our girls won't need pimps; they'll have the City of San Diego watching out for them."

"Our city can learn something from Las Vegas on this one," the report concluded. "Their '90s foray into familyfriendliness gave them a temporary boost, but ultimately, they learned that if people want decency, they'll stay in the suburbs and host cookouts in the backyard. Trips to town are for cutting loose — 'What happens here, stays here' is maybe the best slogan an urban center ever had. San Diego — a port city, a Navy town — has a proud history of prostitution, one that can be revisited, cleaned up, and turned into a major profit center. And the economic impact could spread beyond downtown to the larger community. Think of all the girls who could work their way through one of our fine colleges or universities!"

A public forum on the report will be held in the usually empty lobby of Vantage Pointe on Friday, August 13, at 6 a.m. Coffee and donuts and strippers will be provided by Pure Platinum Gentleman's Club.

building off Bonair Street. But the Americans with Disabilities Act has higher standards for disabled access.

Glen Rasmussen is a La Jolla attorney who in December became chairman of the Friends of the Riford board of directors. He belongs to the La Jolla Kiwanis Club, is secretary of a business organization called Promote La Jolla, serves on the La Jolla Community Planning Association, and is a former president of the La Jolla Town Council. I asked Rasmus-

sen how the Riford first got started trying to correct its disabled-access problem. Did someone file a complaint about difficulties getting into the building?

"No complaint was filed," Rasmussen wrote me by email. He went on to say that the City, as owner of the building, "was already aware that the ADA entrance did not comply with the ADA act and told us, since our organization, Friends of the Riford Center, was the lessee. So now we thought: 'What do we do about that?' since we were thinking of ways to improve the place. We were working with Scott Peters and then Sherri Lightner, when the CDBG money became available, and since we were a logical candidate, we applied and we got the grant...."

In a June 23, 2009 approval memo, Sherri Lightner referred to the block grant monies under her control. She wrote, "A total of \$207,152 is available to Council District

One for applicant funding. After consulting with City staff regarding this project's eligibility and readiness, I propose allocating \$207,152 to the Riford Center ADA front entrance project....

"On April 10, 2009 Citywide Access Compliance Officer Vern Westenberger assessed the Riford Center and recommended upgrading the front entrance to the property in order to attain ADA compliance."

The Riford Center, continued Lightner, subsequently "prepared plans for the ADA accessible entrance based on Mr. Westenberger's assessment, and Mr. Westenberger has also prepared a scope of work document" for the project.

On July 21, 2009, the San Diego City Council included Lightner's proposal in a total Community Development Block Grant allocation for the City.

However, the first official application on file for the Riford Center's block grant is dated December 7, 2009. In the application, the project is no longer described primarily as an upgrade to the Riford Center's front entrance. The application's description now refers to a "new accessible entrance on the south side of the building." That would be on Bonair Street, an entranceway to the surrounding neighborhood, and around the corner from the building's front entrance on La Jolla Boulevard. The new idea is to "provide an accessible path of travel and walkway at street grade from the public sidewalk and parking to a new building entrance. Remove two existing windows on the south side of the building and install a 3'

Marengo Morton Architects will design the renovation. At the time of application, Claude-Anthony Marengo, one of the company's principals, served on the Riford Center's board of directors. He has recently been replaced. The venture is now under the guidance of Paul Godwin, a project manager in the City's Economic Development Department. I asked Godwin why the City's process in working with the Riford looks as though

it went backward, why the approval of its disabled access came first and the application last.

By email, Godwin tells me that the project "was originally managed by the City's Disability Services Program. This project was then transferred to our office (Economic Development) so that we could work directly with the agency [Riford] to refine the scope of work and complete the improvements."

The Riford Center has vet to receive any money. It will be reimbursed for all work it completes up to the grant maximum only if that work follows the agreedupon plan and satisfies the City's conditions for an acceptable block-grant project.

A key Housing and Urban Development expectation for block-grant recipients is that they consult with the communities where the projects will be completed. On that score, Friends of the Riford has taken heat. Early this spring, neighbors began reading in La Jolla news outlets about the Riford's new entrance on Bonair Street. What would it do to neighborhood traffic? They read also of the possible new activities in the building, including weddings and parties. Wouldn't alcohol be served at such events? Would the new disabled entrance be part of a bigger expansion? A group of the neighbors, most preferring at first to remain anonymous, were not satisfied with answers Glen Rasmussen gave them. They wanted to attend a meeting of his organization's board. But Rasmussen told them his group had lots of other business and changed the meeting's location. "The problem is he tells different people different things and won't put anything in writing," one of the neighbors told me.

the executive board of the Friends of the Riford Center together with complaining neighbors. Participants came away in a better frame of mind. Glen Rasmussen had become more conciliatory, said the neighbors. By phone, he already told me that his board was now planning to return to the Riford's main entrance on La Jolla Boulevard as the site of the disabled entrance. But Rasmussen didn't know whether a costly lift would have to be built at that entrance. It looked as though a planned district ordinance might prevent a ramp being built from the building to the sidewalk. The Riford Center could appeal to the La Jolla Planned District Ordinance Committee, but if it did, Rasmussen would have to recuse himself from voting, since he sits on that committee.

As a result of the uncertainty, Rasmussen told me by email, a south-side disabled entrance on Bonair Street cannot be abandoned "as a less desirable alternative." I asked whether weddings and parties might still be in store for the Riford. "The lease has not been amended in many years, and in light of a growing demographic of people reaching age 62 (the baby boomers now becoming 'seniors') we are exploring new uses and what we can offer our adult members [that]...might generate additional income for our non-profit business [to] make it successful. Whether alcohol could be served at any events is subject to California law. So far, all alcohol served at events has been donated. We have in place guidelines to keep all events orderly, in accord with legal requirements and the valid concerns of our neighbors."

Members of the neighbors' group are now opening up, saying Rasmussen's new conciliatory

attitude was short-lived. Grace Zimmerman, who lives on Bonair Street, tells me a recent Rotary Club party staged at the Riford caused considerable traffic problems at the entrance to her neighborhood and "was very noisy. From the beginning, the Riford was intended to be a senior center, not a clubhouse," she says. Zimmerman maintains her group is being reasonable in trying to keep some control on what happens at the center. The City's lease with the Riford stipulates that its hours of operation shall be 11:00 a.m. through 4:00 p.m., Tuesdays through Saturdays. "But so the center can become more financially viable, our group has agreed to allow weekly hours of 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. and, on Saturdays, 9:00 to noon. That's a substantial concession. We've also agreed that there can be four events a month, as long as they're for the center's own fund-raising."

But the disabled-entrance location remains a bone of contention. Architect David Singer, a member of the neighbors' group, tells me that the lift Rasmussen worries will bust the project's budget should take only \$12,000 to \$15,000 out of the \$207,152 grant the Riford received. Another neighbor thinks Rasmussen wants to save as much money as possible for disabled-service improvements to the Riford's interior patio, where the parties are staged.

Meanwhile, the City of San Diego's Community Development Block Grant program has made changes. For one thing, "council-district-based geographic allocation" of grants is a thing of the past. According to a City Annual Action Plan, "Funding allocations were approved on a citywide basis for fiscal year 2011."■

#### **Lots of Harlots**

**Prostitution Fans Out Across the Border** 

Tijuana — Prostitution has burst its traditional boundaries — the zona de tolerencia along Calle Coahuila and its environs — and is expanding into new territories throughout Tijuana.

Frontera reports that at least four more districts are exhibiting an increase in such activities, although in these new areas the practice has yet to be officially recognized.

**Economic** woes are blamed for the sudden surge in prostitution stats. Lack of employment is luring many a female into being a sexoservidora. Another reason given for the expansion onto new turf is that customers don't have the time to travel to downtown TJ and the Zona Norte. The majority of the new trade is located in the eastern part of the city, where prostitutes hang out at bars and consummate their transactions in adjacent motels.

Victor Clark Alfaro, director of the Binational Center for Human Rights, points out that the new zonas are not officially recognized and thus are fraught with the potential to incubate disease and foment crime. Alfaro estimates that of 5500 sex workers, only about half are legally registered with the health department.

A mobile health unit has

been dispatched to service wayward sex workers in the 32 bars located in the Zona Este. Angel de la Torre Casillas, municipal director of health, stated that those who contract with a sexoservidora should ask to see her health card before indulging.

#### **Makes Me Want to** Cry

Same-Sex Marriage March **Draws a Crowd** 

*Hillcrest* — "Hey-hey, ho-ho, homophobia's got to go!" was the chant from hundreds of gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and straight supporters of same-sex marriage during a massive march in Hillcrest on Wednesday evening, August 4. The chant was one of many that were heard over the constant sounds of news-channel helicopters and car horns.

The procession was in celebration of the decision by chief U.S. Northern District judge Vaughn Walker to overturn Proposition 8, the ban on same-sex marriage; he deemed the proposition unconstitutional.

Graphic designer and photographer Erny Castro was among the hundreds of people marching down University Avenue. "I couldn't believe it when Prop. 8 passed, and now that I see everyone coming together, I'm just so happy... it makes me want to crv."

And while the mood around Hillcrest was festive. the disappointment for Prop. 8 supporters was evident.

Tony Krvaric, chairman of San Diego's Republican Party, issued a press release shortly after Judge Walker's ruling. "A majority of Californians continue to believe that marriage is the union of one man and one woman," read the release, which referred to the ruling as another example of an "activist judge...legislating from the bench."

When asked if he is pondering whether he should

#### **Gays' Day in Court**

**Explanation of Prop 8** Overruling

Downtown — After Northern California's chief district judge Vaughn Walker on August 4 ruled that Proposition 8 is unconstitutional, I contacted Robert R. DeKoven, law professor

at San Diego's California Western School of Law. since he writes regularly on gav issues.

DeKoven said, "The decision was not unexpected, but the stay of Prop. 8 is a surprise. And regardless if Judge Walker agrees to 'stay' his 'stay,' I suspect the Ninth Circuit will stay the judge's order requiring state officials to resume gay marriages."

"Judge Stephen Reinhardt [of the Ninth Circuit] has already opined that [the Defense of Marriage Act, which made it so states don't have to honor marital unions in other states] is unconstitutional, and I suspect his views are shared by a majority of the court."

**Professor DeKoven also** spoke of Mayor Sanders's testimony. It "was obviously emotional to the court and provided a perspective of what it's like to be a parent of a lesbian daughter whose civil rights were vanquished with a simple vote of a majority of Californians...."

Escondido — On July 30 at about 2 a.m., the clerk working at the 1290 West Valley Parkway 7-Eleven saw a man walk out of the store with a six-pack of beer he hadn't paid for. After confronting the man in the parking lot, the thief took out a knife and stabbed the clerk in the forehead. The clerk then took out a box cutter and slashed his attacker's face. The thief then fled the scene, leaving the beer behind.

The would-be thief was described as a Hispanic man in his late 20s to mid-30s, with a long gash down the left side of his face. After the attack, the clerk said he put a Band-Aid on the wound and went back to work behind the counter.

"I don't care," the Egyptian clerk said. "In my country, I do that [defends himself] a lot."

One mother testified that cheerleading meets the district and state standards for physical education. She said



cheerleading is as physical as any male contact sport, and the fact that the squad trains year-round and is involved in school events should meet any requirement for school credit.

Opposition came from concerned citizen Sally Smith, who asserted that cheerleading is exclusionary and that to allow cheerleading for course credit would open the floodgates for all school activities to be eligible for credit.

Members of the San Diego Unified school board carried out much of the same debate before agreeing to conduct a study of all extracurricular school activities. Board member John de Beck offered that a comprehensive study should include a safety-credentials system with CPR training.

The board decided that teachers, students, parents, and administrators should be on the committee to decide if cheerleading deserves school credit.

as in the Gaslamp.

There, and in other parts of downtown, those wishing to open nightclubs and bars 5000 square feet in size or larger are required to obtain a conditional-use permit as outlined in the City's municipal code; whereas, in North Park, Hillcrest, and other Uptown communities, the ordinance has been placed on the top shelf, out of reach from residents.

"The idea is not to discourage nightclubs but is just to properly regulate them, as laid out in the city code," says Leo Wilson, chair of the Uptown Planners and a proponent of better enforcement of the conditional-use permit requirement in Uptown and North Park. "We consider what they're pushing in Pacific Beach a bit too draconian," adds Wilson, referring to the effort by some in the beachside community to require conditional-use permits for all alcohol establishments, regardless of size and use.

"We are a little more business-friendly. It just gives us a discretionary handle on these establishments," says Wilson, who also favors using an expedited review process, similar to that used in downtown.



to the front fascia of the building. Landscaping must include branching trees that are large enough to break up and soften the edifice."

Meier explained that large "big box" retail stores are "stark looking" when you approach them, with pavement adjacent to the building and no landscaping. He cited the Home Depot on College Boulevard as an example.

"I think that our City needs to set standards for small-town ambience," said Meier. "We need to set codes to our standards of excellence."

Meier said that he looked at the plans for the Lowe's that will be built on the corner of Palomar Airport Road and El Camino Real and saw a rendering of the building with landscaping, and the presentation looked very good. However, he is concerned that it will be built

with little landscaping.

"Lowe's will be coming in here like a runaway freight train," said Meier. "We need to be prepared. We need to have a set of standards for them when they come in — and say you need to put some landscaping in front of the building."

No "wrong side of town" for the author

'm scouting the Other Side, which is the portion of Abadiânia that lies south of the highway that bisects the town. The Casa (John of God's healing center) and its service industry are on one side, ordinary Abadiânia is on the other.

The Other Side is bigger, comes with a supermercado that has three cash registers, although none can change an R\$20 note. Visitors are told not to venture to the Other Side, as the healing entities only work on the Casa side. Market forces ratify the entities' judgment. Renting a house costs R\$300 a month on the Other Side; on the Casa side, close to the highway, it's 600 a month (close to the Casa, it's 1200).

I see a white man riding a bicycle. He's wearing a black T-shirt, jeans, and has long, curly, eye-popping blond hair. I shout, "Hey, Aussie!" It's a guess. The man pulls up, we chat. He and his wife live in Australia, volunteer at the Casa for six months each year. I ask about sports — are there any? Aussie stops, thinks, says, "I don't think there are any competitive sports."

"There must be soccer."

"Some boys play on a field, but it's not organized."

"No school sports?"

where people work out. There's some kickboxing. I'm going over there now."

Bingo. I'm told to "Veer left, walk to the church, take the first right, go a good little ways, and it's on your left."

It's mile or more to the church, a big half-concrete, half-red-brick edifice. I take the right turn, walk another half mile, the road ends. Not a surprise. I learned long ago: never trust a local when it comes to directions.

Coming on to late afternoon now. I

make my way back to a little park that is inside a traffic circle. I note there are five roads radiating from the circle and decide to walk back by a different route.

Sun is setting. Lights start to switch on. Further on is a neighborhood bar with the usual cement floor, green painted walls, plastic tables and chairs.

Two men work on bottles of beer and shots of what looks to be tequila. Behind the glass candy-store bar top, way up, seven feet off the ground, is a long liquor shelf one bottle deep. None of the bottles has been opened, dust lays thick on their shoulders. There is a small pool table, about threequarters American size. Its plywood sides are painted white, and the rail is painted red. I order a Skol, catch the bartender's eyes, point to the pool table.

Barkeep is a young guy, maybe 30. I rack for 9-ball, barkeep shakes his head, places the 1 ball on the far cushion, racks 14 balls, and breaks. Holding his cue, he points out seven balls for him, seven for me, "Esta, esta, esta."

The game is something like 8-ball. The player who makes his seven balls first gets to shoot the 1 ball, and if that drops, he wins the game.

Barkeep wins the first game, I don't make a ball. He's good, meaning he's barpool good. He shoots true, but too hard and doesn't use english. We play another game; he wins again. I note he doesn't think about his third shot and won't take a bank. Barkeep motions that he wants to play for 20.

I haven't played in many years, but I used to be good — not money-pool good, but I could hold a table in a bar on Friday night. If you're playing someone better than you, the idea is to play safe and hide the cue ball so your opponent never gets a clear shot. You'll be left with an open shot now and then and can drop your balls one at a time. Frequently, you'll be even when it comes time to shoot for the game. It's one reason I didn't like 8-ball.

I am aware that it's dark outside and that there are now seven men in the bar, only Aussie laughs. "No, but there's a gym two are drinking. I am aware I have money on the game and money in my pocket. I am aware I've been on the Other Side most of the day, and the only foreigners I've seen are me and Aussie. I don't sense trouble, but it's time to go.





#### I have a tendency to lean toward the shadows.

King was in 1969 in San Francisco, though I used to see him around Chicago before that. I was technically too young to be in the clubs, but I always got in one way or another.

I saw Buddy guy maybe ten years ago at the Belly Up with my friend Mark. I was kind of informally tutoring him in the Chicago-blues sound; Guy was at the top of the list and he was here. We got to the will-call window and my arrangements for two

tickets had fallen through: they offered only one. I held up a finger to indicate I needed a minute to compose myself, then said, "This man next to me has been autistic for many years. He hasn't spoken a single word since he was six years old. I played a Buddy Guy record for him and he spoke the man's name."

Right then, Mark picked up on his cue: he stepped to the side, turned his back and disheveled his hair, then he tilted his glasses at an angle over his forehead and one eye. Stepping into view of the woman at the window he moaned, "Buh-ee-Guy!

"Now, you tell this man," I said to the young lady, "that he can't see his hero. I can't do it." I turned away, overcome with emotion. The woman at the window

"Okay," she said. "That was good. That was really good. Here you go," and she handed Mark the second ticket. He said, I think, "Thank you, my dear."

month are bad luck. The Expendables, starring Sylvester Stallone, the governor of California, and Bruce Willis opens in theaters, taking up space that could more edifyingly be used for a rerelease of the director's cut of Ernest Goes to Jail. and shave my head with a cheese grater.

I am unsure why I get a slight kick out of the superstitions surrounding Friday the 13th. I don't much credit that particular belief, but I have more than a reasonable share of what Edgar A. As they grow longer, however, with the onset of old age and the ineluctable pull of a gravity, well...I become, I suppose, grudgingly grateful for a true summer day; something that has been rationed in a miserly fashion to us this year in San Diego. I have discovered Stephen Goodwin and his 2003 novel Breaking Her Fall, about a father/daughter relationship, the polarization of a family, an adulterous affair, rock and roll, and a few other things. I've never had a daughter, but after reading Goodwin's work, I feel I've been allowed a difficult but gratifying experience with this area of the human heart. 

Janina Hardoy was 24 years old when last seen around the Oceanside Pier, quoting the Bible to homeless people; a couple of months later, in early 2005, she was reported missing from her rented Oceanside home.

On February 5, police went to make a welfare check at about 10:00 p.m. They found disturbing trace evidence in Janina's bedroom and that night arrested her exboyfriend and roommate, Joaquin Martinez, then 27. Joaquin has a prominent, exaggerated lower jaw, which is probably how he got his nickname "Jaws."

Both prosecution and defense attorneys referred to "tweaker logic" in an effort to explain the behavior of the witnesses.

#### **Maria Testifies**

A woman named Maria, who had befriended Janina, remained in the witness box for more than four hours. She said she met Janina while working at a 7-Eleven in Oceanside: "[Janina] came in, and she had, like, a Rasta hat on, and I kind of figured that she smoked marijuana. And I smoked marijuana as well. So she seemed pretty cool, and I decided to hang out with her."

They met several times a week at the home Janina rented on East Parker Street in Oceanside. According to Maria, "We'd usually just smoke pot and drink Mad Dog 20/20. It's, like, cheap wine, but that's what got us drunk. And we laughed and smoked weed and chilled like normal kids. Janina had a nice female roommate. It was cool."

But around Christmas of 2004 the atmosphere at the house, and the people who stayed at the house, started to change. Good-hearted Janina invited homeless people to take shelter in her rented home.

"Yeah, anybody off the street, she would help anybody. The con type, kind of gang-member type. The tough-asses, vou know. Younger guvs... It went downhill. Some of her stuff was stolen, sold off for drugs. Every time I'd come back over after my job, I noticed more stuff

disappearing. It [ended up being] really like a flophouse, pretty much."

The nice female roommate moved out. and a man named Joaquin — called Jaws moved in. Janina and Jaws became intimate. They were together for perhaps a month.

Jaws took a leadership role in the house. As far as anybody did, he was the one who gave orders regarding who was going to do what and when. Maria described him as "most calm and cool and collective [sic]. Unless provoked."

Then a woman named Alice moved in. Janina's new boyfriend Jaws swiftly switched affections to this new woman. How long did it take? "I would say seconds," said Maria. "Once Alice moved in, there was crap. In terms of living

arrangements, [Jaws] still stayed in [Janina's] room. But Janina, she was obviously against it. I mean, living under your roof, and you've got the guy that you were banging, you know, with some

other chick in another room."

Another drug addict who moved in was named Mohammed, or Moe. Maria knew Moe from Oceanside High School. He wasn't the first addict to move into the house on East Parker Street.

"Once crystal meth came into the house, everything went downhill," Maria testified. "And a few of them did heroin, so, you know." Ianina started doing the harder drugs after her home filled with street addicts. She became a smoker of crystal meth. "And when that wasn't enough, she wanted to do what everybody else was doing and decided to start slamming." Slamming means injecting, Maria told the court. "As Janina smoked crystal meth and weed and we drank, she got more curious and wanted to be... with the people that were doing that, and that's when things started to disappear. And people were selling her stuff off. I don't know if she was aware of it."

Janina did not abandon her group of rescued druggies. "She had such a big heart to help people," Maria said, "but at the same time, not the brains to stop doing the drugs."

Toward the end of 2004 and into the beginning of 2005, the addicts at the house began robbing banks. And how was Maria aware of this? "For one reason, criminals aren't the smartest. We like to brag. So there was bragging going on. There

was counting of stacks of bills inside the back bedroom and Moe's room. Bank bags. They had painted the garage white, whited out the windows, and the truck sat there." This was Alice's white truck, which had been used in at least one of the bank jobs. "And then I had overheard...they trusted every one of us in there, so...it was not a secret." The drug addicts told Janina the money would go toward her rent.

Janina became a nag in her own home. "She had to know everything



that was going on... She was kind of like the Barney of the group, the one that got left out, you know? I'd try to include her, try to take her away, but she was just so stubborn. Wanted to stay there. Wanted to be with the group. Wanted to help. She always threatened, when she wouldn't get her way, that she was going to call the police and she didn't care what happened."

The street people in the house began to talk about how annoying Janina was. "We all did,"

Maria admitted. They joked about how somebody should overdose her. And in her depressed moments, Ianina made comments about how she'd like to take a couple of grams of heroin and overdose.

At some point the people staying at the house took a room at a nearby motel. "I was told it was to avoid the conflict," Maria said. And who was with Janina? "No one but her dog." Janina had a puppy she'd adopted from an animal shelter.

On February 4, 2005, Maria got a phone call to come pick up Moe, who had just bailed out of jail. She picked him up at a grocery store across the street from the Vista jail. It was around 9:00 p.m. "I



on the door of the East Parker Street house, looking for Janina.

By this time, Maria said, she "was out buying pizza. There was helicopters everywhere. Yes, I actually drove by, and they didn't even stop me." She later heard that Jaws was arrested. "We were waiting for him down the street at the park, seeing if he'll run there, but apparently they got him."

Maria said she contacted the authorities the next day. "I was dying to tell somebody but afraid. Afraid to talk on the phone. Afraid to be seen. Afraid to be recorded. Paranoid."

Police did recover the hands and feet of Janina Hardov. They were stuffed inside her own backpack, which had been tossed into the

Dumpster at the abandoned trailer park.

#### **Rabbit Testifies**

Rabbit was 28 years old when he testified in April 2010. When Janina went missing in February 2005, he was 23.

Rabbit wore jail clothes to court: a blue short-sleeved jumpsuit, with chains around his waist; his wrists were cuffed to the waist shackles. His slicked-back hair was pulled into a long, tight braid that sprouted from the back of his head and hung down his back. The black hair contrasted with his pale skin. He had tattoos around his neck and on both arms.

Rabbit reviewed some of his criminal past. "I was in and out of prison," he said. He'd stolen cars and robbed



banks, and "I got ahold of some payroll checks."

Released on probation in 2004, Rabbit went home and had dinner with his grandmother. The next day he checked in with his probation officer, then "started looking for dope." It took him two or three hours to score some crystal meth. Rabbit sold meth to support his habit.

It was the rainy season when he moved into the house on East Parker



Street. Moe invited him to come stay the night, to get out of the rain. Eventually, Rabbit learned that the home belonged to someone named Janina.

"She was an alcoholic," he said. "She was a timid person when she wasn't drinking.

"She was kindhearted...would let all these people stay at her house." Janina, Rabbit said, didn't like to turn anyone away. Moe and Jaws were already living there, and two weeks later Alice moved in. Jaws and Alice quickly became a pair.

Yes, Rabbit had seen Janina's mood transform. "It changed...She got bitter. Some chick moved into her house." And Janina's man was now "seeing this chick. She didn't like what was going on."

When others would go into their rooms and close the door, Janina resented it. "[Janina] didn't like not feeling welcome in her own home."

On February 1, 2005, Rabbit "robbed two banks. With a note." The first bank didn't put enough money in the bag, so the crew drove to a second bank. Rabbit, Jaws, and Moe did this pair of robberies, Moe driving his Mustang to the banks. The robberies occurred at 3:45 p.m. and at 4:45 p.m., at two different branches of California Bank & Trust, one in Carlsbad, the other in Encinitas. Then the trio

drove back to East Parker

Street to divvy up the loot.

Everyone was excited about the piles of cash. Janina came out of her room. Rabbit announced that he was going to get a hotel room. His girlfriend didn't have a felony record yet, so he could book the room in her name, and it would be "safe." Janina was happy. She wanted to come along, but Rabbit told her it was something just for him and his girlfriend, that sort of thing. Janina was disappointed


and plainly did not want to be left behind. Rabbit felt sorry for Janina, and he gave her four or five dollars so she could go get herself something to drink.

That was the last time anyone admitted seeing Janina alive: at 9:00 p.m. on the night of February 1, 2005.

Rabbit spent that night with his girlfriend at an Oceanside harbor hotel room, about eight miles from the house on East Parker Street.

The next day, February 2, sometime between 3:00 and 4:00 in the afternoon, Rabbit and his girlfriend stopped by the East Parker Street house and "it was real quiet." Maria and Alice were there, but he did not see Janina; he didn't really go looking for her. The door to Janina's room was closed. Rabbit took a nap in his room. Later Moe and Jaws came by, and they were agitated, saying, we got to go, we got to get out of the house,



The next morning, February 4, Rabbit wanted to go get some of his things from the East Parker Street house, but Jaws pulled him aside and told him he couldn't return. "That's when [Jaws] said there was a dead body in the house," Rabbit recalled. "He said it was Janina." Jaws told Rabbit he was waiting for Moe to help him get the body out. Then he asked Rabbit to help him move the body.

Did Jaws give a reason for how Janina had died? "It came across

[that it was] because she was threatening to call the cops," Rabbit said. Alice piped in, calling Janina a "rat"

I guess she didn't die right away. They went back one time and heard her gurgling, so they smothered her with a pillow." When

# "[Jaws] said there was a dead body in the house," Rabbit recalled. "He said it was Janina."

Alice had her grandmother's car, a big white Buick. Jaws drove and Alice blabbed as the three went from the hotel to the house. "It was pretty blatant," Rabbit said. "Pretty much that they killed her. They poisoned her. Jaws ran from the police bust — the one where Moe got arrested — he went to the East Parker Street house. That, he told Rabbit, was when he had to smother Janina. Rabbit got the impression that Janina had been poisoned earlier.

What was Jaws's response to all this? "He just kept driving," Rabbit said. "He kinda nodded his head." Jaws did say that "it looked like an overdose."

Alice and Jaws discussed dumping the body into a lagoon or a Dumpster. Rabbit suggested leaving Janina in an alley. He assumed that the body would be dumped in an alley or public park, someplace where a druggie who overdosed might normally be found.

Jaws dropped Rabbit and Alice off at a cross street, and they walked to the house, entering through a back door. They opened the garage door from the inside, so Jaws could pull the car in.

"They said [to] be prepared, it smelled," Rabbit said. "She had been in there a few days."

The trio put bandannas over their lower faces. They put gloves on their hands. "I think Alice got them for us." They walked down the hallway to the closed door of Janina's bedroom.

When Jaws opened the door, "The dog that was in the house shot out of the bedroom. [Janina] was on the bed. She was laying sideways. With her legs hanging over the side of the bed." Janina was dressed in burgundy sweats. "She was dead. She had a purplish hue to her. She was stiff."

In the witness box five years later, Rabbit said, "I was shocked. It was pretty shocking to see that she was actually there. Dead."

The three busied themselves painting over the large window above Janina's bed, so no one could see in. They found on Janina's body the few dollars that Rabbit had given her three days earlier, the day of the bank robberies, when Rabbit was leaving to get a hotel room. Jaws and Alice took this money, Rabbit said. Then "[Jaws] described how we were going to get rid of the body. He said we were going to chop it up."

Rabbit said, "I was not cool with that. I told

him no. He told me to smash the face. I wouldn't do that either."

Rabbit thought he remembered Alice bringing in all the tools, such as the baseball bat. Jaws tried to hand the baseball bat to Rabbit, but Rabbit walked out of the room.

"He told me to man up. Stop being a pussy. And a couple other things. Bitch. Punk. He got upset. He said, 'This is how it's done.' He covered her face with a towel."

Rabbit described how Jaws used the baseball bat on the body. Then Jaws told Rabbit to chop off the hands. Rabbit refused. "He's, like, 'You're going to help.' I'm, like, 'I can't do this." Jaws badgered Rabbit, talking him down. "He took a machete, an old rusty machete, about

Jaws used the machete to remove Janina's hands; with a pair of shears, he and Alice separated the last shreds holding one hand to the body. The body did not bleed, but bits of pink flesh stuck to the walls and surroundings. Jaws put the hands into plastic grocery bags. "I'm pretty sure he knotted them at the top," Rabbit said. "And that's when he's, like, 'You're going to help now.' It just made me sick. I just dry-heaved."

And Alice? "They

were both pretty much telling me I had to step up, quit being a pussy... so they gave me a nice amount of meth to do. I injected it." He did this in the same bedroom with Janina, at the foot of her bed. "About three-quarters of a syringe full." Rabbit felt the effects "right away."

They asked again if he could help. Rabbit said that at that moment he lost his conscience. "I was in a rush on crystal meth." He described removing each foot with swings of the machete. He felt pieces of flesh strike him, as he hacked away.

Jaws put the feet in plastic bags, then all the

bags were put into a black Dickies backpack.

The three went around the house grabbing bedsheets. They wrapped the body in plastic sheeting and bed linen. Then they put the body into a big duffel bag. "We couldn't zip it," Rabbit said. "Jaws picked up the bat and swung and hit her some more," to make the body fit into the duffel bag. When the body was sufficiently stuffed into the duffel, it was placed on a large skateboard to move it.

In the garage, they put the body into the trunk of the big white Buick. They stripped out of their bandannas, gloves, and their spattered outer clothing and put those things into trash bags. Alice wiped down stores. By now it was night. Janina's body went into a Dumpster behind a liquor store in Escondido. bailed out of jail, and he showed up at the hotel late on the night of February 4.

# "[Janina was] talking some biblical nonsense," Jaws said. "Babble Bibble."

the walls of Janina's bedroom with spray-cleaner while the two men shoved Janina's things into trash bags.

The three got into Grandma's white Buick. They drove around San Diego's North County, dropping the trash bags with the feet and hands into Dumpsters behind They returned the white Buick to Alice's grandmother's home. Then they phoned Maria, who came and picked them up and drove them all back to the harborside hotel.

Jaws still had the black backpack; he brought it into the hotel's bathroom. Moe would get rid of it. He'd finally Rabbit slept at the motel with his girlfriend. According to his testimony, Moe got up the next morning, February 5, and took off with the backpack.

Later that day, Jaws gave Rabbit an "eightball" of speed to sell. "I knew this was my chance to split," Rabbit said. He got on a bus with his girlfriend and left. Some hours later, he received a phone call from Alice and Maria. They told him the house on East Parker Street was being raided. Rabbit did the eight-ball of dope himself.

# Jaws in the Witness Box

Joaquin Martinez's defense was that he did not kill Janina, he only got rid of the body. Maybe someone else killed her, by overdose, or poisoning, or smothering her. Or maybe she committed suicide.

She could have OD'd herself; maybe she was depressed. But whatever happened, Jaws did not kill Janina — he was only doing cleanup when he disposed of the body. That's what he testified to in the courtroom.

When he got out of prison in late 2004, Jaws stayed first in Riverside, then moved on to Oceanside. This was right before Christmas.

He met Janina Hardoy by the pier in Oceanside.

"Kicking it with the riffraff," said Jaws.

"And what was Janina doing down there?"

"I don't know." Jaws looked annoyed. "Talking some biblical nonsense. Babble Bibble. You would have to know the Bible to understand. It's, like, throwing biblical concepts in the air."

"Did she invite you to her home?" asked Mitts.

"She invited a whole bunch of us. About ten."

"From Christmas all the way to the time they arrested me."



things in your hand?"



# "By the way, I'm supposed to be assisting Mr. Dey, and I have no idea what he looks like."





- Does the doctor have a complete team, or is it just the doctor and a "technician"?
- Does the hairline of the doctor's clients look natural? Is the doctor's skill undetectable?

#### Be sure to meet the doctor

Most initial consultations are free. You should meet the doctor to see: 1) if you have sufficient "donor" hair in your scalp, and 2) if you're comfortable with the doctor. In his initial consults, for example, Dr. Garbutt, not only discusses treatment alternatives and procedures, he also measures hair loss rate to determine how many grafts will be needed. This level of detail should be the standard but often isn't. Make sure you're comfortable with the thoroughness of the doctor's work and hair restoration plan.



# Puerto Rico Day-Trips By A. Gracia

Old San Juan has well-preserved Spanish colonial-style architecture. Lively nightlife can be found in and around the city, and if you like a party atmosphere and live music, visit during "Las Fiestas de la Calle San Sebastián," typically held in mid to late January.

El Yunque National Rain Forest,

Río Grande. This natural reserve is the only rainforest in the U.S. National Park Service. It is made up of four different ecosystems and offers many hiking trails that lead to waterfalls.

Las Cabezas de San Juan Nature Reserve, Fajardo. Kayak through mangrove channels that lead to a bioluminescent lagoon, where the water lights up after sunset due to a reaction to movement from the dinoflagellates living in it.

Arecibo Observatory and the Río Camuy Cave System. These two attractions can be visited on the same day because of their proximity to each other. The Arecibo Observatory is home to the largest radio telescope in the world, and although it's more a research facility than a tourist attraction, around 100,000 people visit each year. The Río Camuy Cave Park allows visitors to tour part of one of the world's largest underground cave systems.

Bacardí Distillery. The Bacardí Distillery in Cataño offers free Monday–Saturday educational tours covering the history and processes of rum-making. The tour lasts about 45 minutes. After a visit to the factory you can continue on to the ferry station, which takes you

across the bay to Old San Juan for the amazing price of 50 cents (plus, you avoid the hassle of parking in San Juan).

# Halong Bay, Vietnam By Sarah Robinson

Four days, two nights spent boating through Halong Bay — with its turquoise water and giant dragon-shaped cliff islands covered by jungle — is like a dream. There are a million different tour companies taking foreigners through the bay with varying prices and packages, but they're all the same boats and go to the same destinations.

The accommodations on the boat are not cruise-like — more *Treasure Island*—style: small rooms, average beds. But the views out your window are priceless. Traditional Vietnamese dishes

are served onboard along with bountiful alcohol and Pringles for happy-hour cravings.


# ROAM-()-RAMA

A Guide to Unexpected San Diego and Beyond I by Jerry Schad

## **OAKMONT LOOP**

A short and steep, looping route on the outskirts of Glendale draws hikers and bikers.

Distance from downtown San Diego: 135 miles Hiking/biking length: 2.5 miles • Difficulty: Moderate



View across Crescenta Valley

he pint-sized (244-acre) Verdugo Mountains Open Space Preserve covers a scruffy patch of east-facing slopes in the city of Glendale. The circular hiking/biking route described here is pieced out of fire roads and residential streets bordering the property. The route is perfect for a late-afternoon outing, when you can benefit from staying in the shade, but at the same time enjoy a brightly lit valley and mountain vista to the east.


The hike is located in the Crescenta Valley area of greater Los Angeles. From La Crescenta Avenue, one mile south of Interstate 210, turn south on Oakmont View Drive. Follow this curvy residential street uphill to Oakmont View Park, where the street ends.

Starting from Oakmont View Park, follow the signed Edison Road (a fire road) and climb moderately on lazy twists and

turns over the chaparral-clad slopes. The view east is somewhat compromised by some high-voltage powerlines in the near distance. Still, you can look across the sloping Crescenta Valley toward the dramatically rising San Gabriel Mountains, which culminate (from this perspective) at the antenna-bewhiskered summit of Mount Lukens. Those San Gabriel slopes have been looking lean and hungry of late, due to 2009's catastrophic Station Fire. The suburban landscape closer at hand, which was mostly spared any damage during the fire, fills almost every reasonably flat patch of land from here to the base of the San Gabriels.

a steep descent. At 1.0 mile you reach a gorgeous oak- and sycamore-filled glade in the bottom of a ravine called Engleheard Canyon (a perfect example of how civilization and wilderness can merge at the boundary of what is known as the wildland/urban interface). Just beyond, the Edison Road ends at a narrow driveway. Follow that driveway out to the suburbs at Eilinita Avenue, take

Before long, vou're starting



a right on Emanuel Drive, and follow Emanuel to its end, 1.7 miles into the hike, where you again pick up Edison Road (a dirt road)

The remaining 0.8 mile of distance will take you some 500 feet higher to your starting point at Oakmont View Park. For mountain bikers, that final pitch requires a very low gear.

#### **OUTDOORS**

San Diego's Warmest Weather, on average, should occur in August through early September, according to statistics compiled from several decades of measurements taken near the San Diego International Airport. In an average year, coastal residents enjoy an average daily temperature of 70°, which compares favorably (depending on your viewpoint) with the January average daily temperature of 55°. The range between the high and low is typically 10° or less this time of year. August's warm, semi-tropical weather will eventually give way to September's and October's slightly cooler days interspersed with occasional heat waves brought on by Santa Ana conditions — dry, hot winds that sweep down the mountain slopes from the interior.

**Ocean Water Temperatures** are probably peaking now, the result of many weeks of summer sunshine and warm coastal air temperatures. While the water offshore seldom exceeds 70°Fahrenheit, shallow-water temperatures of 70-80 degrees are not uncommon on gently shelving beaches late in the day. Wide, sandy beaches such as Coronado, south Mission Beach, and La Jolla Shores are now at their best for comfortable bathing.

Various Sandpipers are now being seen in considerable numbers within San Diego County's coastal wetland habitats and along the ocean beaches. Some have just arrived from the north; others are juveniles that have bred locally. You'll find sanderlings and willets scurrying along the wet sand on the beaches. Several other members of the sandpiper family can be found in mudflat areas such as the Tijuana River Estuary, the south end of San Diego Bay, the

San Diego River flood channel near Sea World, and the margins of most North County lagoons.

The Waxing Moon makes its debut in the western sky at dusk on Thursday, August 12, appearing as a thin crescent close to the horizon. Right above that moon is Venus, a brilliant white beacon, plus two other much-dimmerlooking planets, Mars and Saturn. Each successive evening at dusk, the waxing moon will appear to move farther toward the upper left (south direction) in the sky, and apparently grow into a fatter crescent as the sun illuminates more and more of its surface.

with pet dolphins could easily be your reality.

We stopped on one island and spent the night in a hotel, where we had a group dinner with the rest of our boat crew. Vietnamese like to be in charge, have things done a certain way, and don't understand independence, so we didn't get away with trying to hide away in our room when dinner was served. It made me feel like I was on a cruise vacation where every minute of an itinerary is planned for you.

After spending so much time in Thailand, I realized a lot was lost in translation with the Vietnamese. The language already sounds aggressive, and their body language and facial expressions tend to be serious and

dominating. I felt like I was getting yelled at when someone was asking how dinner was, and the feeling went way beyond the obvious American guilt for Vietnam and our role in their history.

We did a hike into the jungle and saw colorful birds and monkeys as we trekked behind our sandal-clad guide. There was supposed to be a tiger on the island, but we didn't see it. We cruised alongside the cliffs by day, stopping at colorful floating markets with every fruit imaginable and observing the various communities living on houseboats.

We kayaked one morning at sunset, and it was the most peaceful, surreal time I've ever had. *Am I really here right now? Is this really happening?* I remember thinking.

San Diego Reader: How long do you spend writing your sermon?

Pastor Mark Dahle: Typically about three months out, I start looking at the topics and planning for what the content will be.

**SDR**: Can you think of a time when you gave a homily that completely flopped?

**PD**: One of the things about flops is that I know I can't tell whether it was a flop or not by how I feel about it or by the apparent reactions of people. I preached a sermon here at

La Iolla Lutheran where one of the members had his arms crossed the whole time and he was sunk down in the pew with a scowl on his face, and I was so discouraged that I just about quit several times in the message, just looking at this guy. Afterwards, he said that was the best sermon he had ever heard.

**SDR**: Are there things you've learned to stay away from in your sermons?

PD: I don't avoid any topics, except that our church is filled with people of every political party — and that's by design — so I don't preach on political parties. But I do preach about what the Bible says about every

SDR: What is your main worry as a member of the



PD: We are praying for the nations right now, and we recently focused on praying for Mexico and locally one of biggest things going on is the drug violence and Mexico's fate as a nation as the drug cartels aim at judges and politicians and people trying to help that society.

**SDR**: What is the most prevalent sin you observe or hear about from your congregation? **PD**: A lot of times people have something that they're designed to do but they don't have the courage or faith to do it, so they work on lesser things. One of the things this does to people is it causes them to feel empty because they're missing out on their true purpose and that results in a need for various addic-

tions to fill the void. Not living up to our potential is probably the biggest thing I've observed

SDR: Where do you go when vou die?

PD: Jesus taught that there is life after death and that not everyone has the same experience after death; that some people are quite happy in life after death and others are in

pain because of choices they have made during their lifetime. So much of the focus of our messages here is on helping people to make choices that they will be happy about, not just today but over the course of their lives and at the end of their days. Jesus taught that some people's experience in the afterlife will be happiness — and Jesus talks about feasting as a common illustration of a place of great joy. He was speaking to a culture which didn't have enough food and in our culture maybe that illustration makes less sense. But feasting for many people is one image of how great life after death can be.

# From the Deep Woods to Civilization Charles A. Eastman (Ohiyesa)

In accordance with my training, I asked few questions, although many arose in my mind. I simply tried silently to fit the new ideas like so many blocks

into the pattern of my philosophy, while according to my untutored logic some did not seem to have straight sides or square corners to fit in with the cardinal principles of eternal justice. My father had been converted by Protestant missionaries, and he gave me a totally new vision of the white

man as a religious man and kindly. But when he related how he had set apart every seventh day for religious duties and the worship of God, laying aside every other occupation on that day, I could not forbear explaining, "Father! And does he then forget God during the six days and do as he pleases?" — "The Way Opens," From the Deep Woods to Civilization.

Charles Alexander Eastman (Ohiyesa) (1858-1939) was a Native-American writer of the Santee Sioux nation. a physician, and reformer who helped found the Boy Scouts of America. He was

a pioneer in defending Native-American rights, serving in various capacities dealing with Native-American affairs under Theodore Roosevelt and Calvin Coolidge. From the Deep Woods to Civilization is both Eastman's autobiography and a record of the challenges of cultural assimilation.



Ramona Pioneer Historical Society and Guy B. Woodward Museum Complex of historical buildings includes the Verlaque House (the only Western adobe home of French provincial design still in existence), wagons, antique exhibits, and artifacts. # **Korea's Got Cooking Talent!**

The adventure began with an email from a work colleague: "You've got to try this place, even if you don't review it. You should just go and enjoy it."

After checking blogs that gave more details (and more raves), I emailed my friend Sang, a second-generation Korean-American, and asked him to gather a posse that might enjoy trying authentic Korean cooking, something besides the usual grilled fleshorama. Do Re Mi House does offer six choices of barbecue, but it's all cooked in the kitchen, not at the table. I was more interested in the other 25-odd dishes on the menu — traditional Korean dishes that might be served at home.

The dining room is medium-sized, simple, and squeaky-clean, with shiny tables the color of lacquered cherry-wood. On a Monday night, most were full at 7:00 p.m., and as they emptied, more diners arrived. There are two flat-screen TVs, one at the back of the room, which had the sound on, the other in the center, muted, with a non-hypnotic sideways view from the tables. That evening, both were playing something resembling *Korea's Got Talent!* — an ever-changing array of cute girl groups, boy bands, and dancers to Korean bubblegum pop.

A poised, bouncy waitress took our drink orders — green tea, Korean beer, and a brandnew find: Baekseju, Korean rice wine made with a touch of ginger and "healthful herbs," slightly chilled. It tasted dry, smooth, very clean, without that sharp cereal edge you get in some cheap sakes and Chinese rice wines. We couldn't discern the ginger or herbs, but it went down cool and easy and suited the food. It won five converts. (Drivers be cautioned: It has the same 13 percent alcohol content as most sakes.)

When we finally got our order together — four appetizers and five entrées for a fivesome — our handsome young waiter was scandalized. "Way too much food!" he warned. He was right, of course (but he didn't know we were there to review, not

just gobble-gobble). We assured him we'd be glad to take home lots of food.

Just before our ordered dishes hit the table, the servers brought an amazing array of nearly a

dozen banchen (also spelled panchan), the free side dishes that are the marks of Korean hospitality. The best known of these relishes is kimchi, spicy pickled cabbage,

but that's only one of a multitude of delicious little bites. Ordinary family meals at home typically include three of these relishes (or "chops"). At a restaurant, fewer than six chops indicates stinginess. Nine or more is lavish. A dozen is a banquet.

First, individually plated for each of us, were tangy little palate-clearers of sliced cucumbers, bean sprouts, and transparent, crunchy seaweed dotted with sesame seeds, in a light, tangy dressing. Then came a horde of communal saucers: two

bowls of warm steamed eggs and scallions, delicate and very salty. (The leftovers, gently nuked next morning, made my best breakfast in months.) The requisite kimchi. Firm fingers of agar gela-

> tin in an interesting, spicy sauce. Tiny, fiery anchovies in a dark, complex chili sauce with a touch of sweetness. A broccoli rabe-like steamed green. A crunchy, dark-

green seaweed salad. Tiny, crisp-tender broccoli florets splashed with bottled Korean hot sauce. Pale-brown french-fry shapes; these were something faintly sweet and starchy, but not yam fries. And I'm sure I've forgotten one or two. The waiter surmised that our friend Jerry was Japanese and brought him a small plate of folded nori seaweed sheets — which Jerry used (but only a piece or two) to roll up rice and sauce.

Eating family-style here, you don't get large entrée plates from which to scoop out portions of

several dishes at once, but small appetizer plates, individual covered plastic containers of white rice, and small soup bowls, when appropriate. With a large order like ours, appetizers and mains mingle freely. A little nicety: they arrived gradually, not all dumped on the table at the same time. We had a chance to eat our fill of a few dishes, then the

remains of these were packed up for another night's feasting before the next group of items arrived.

My favorite appetizer was a bowlful of steamed meat dumplings — not pan-crisped like pot stickers or Japanese gyoza, but small, soft, thin-skinned, with a delicious light pork filling; they're accompanied by a zingy sov-and-vinegar dip. I also got a kick from spicy chicken wings, Korea's answer to Buffalo wings. They're pan-fried tender and doused with bottled Korean hot sauce, but they're spicier, since there's none of Buffalo's melted butter gentling the sauce, and no mouth-cooling celery and blue cheese dressing on the side. You'll just have to search among the banchen for something soothing.

Okonomiyaki (oddly, a Japanese name for a traditional Korean dish that Sang remembers from home) is a pancake the diameter and thickness of an individual thin-crust pizza, filled with mixed veggies and a few small shrimp, served with a thick, slightly sweet dipping sauce. It's not as interesting as the other menu possibilities.

Our dinner's one total failure was the pair of *gu-jul-pan* "burritos" — they're shown in one of the photo placards in the front window. "Korean

traditional burrito," the menu calls it, but don't imagine any resemblance to the trendy Korean tacos — Korean barbecued meats wrapped in corn or flour tortillas and piled high with Mexican garnishes — currently sweeping the nation (L.A., NYC, Indiana, Georgia, Texas, but not yet San Diego). No, this burrito resembles a spring roll with dementia. The wrapping is a thick, chewy flour-based crêpe. The filling consists of tough julienne-cut raw vegetables, carrots, and something green and stalky, probably Chinese celery. Think of Clint Eastwood's cold squint in a spaghetti western they're that unyielding. Jerry tried to halve one burrito with a knife he happened to be carrying - not a very sharp knife, as it didn't make a dent. The veggies refused to surrender to the teeth as well.

simplest plate was Grilled Black Cod (aka sable), one of the world's greatest fishes, rich but delicate. Its treatment, although simple, was worthy of the best local French-trained chefs (the bold, brave few who refuse to be intimidated by conventioneers demanding dried-out seafood). The flesh was opalescent, translucent, so tender you barely

Ah, but the entrées! Our

needed teeth. The skin was lively with a soy-and-sugar rub. Alongside were sweet grilled sliced onions strewn with a few tiny clover-shaped baby greens — nothing more, and nothing more required. If you appreciate sashimi for the pure tastes of each species, you'll love this exquisite, lightly cooked version. But watch out for bones!

The winner of the Miss Popularity crown at our table's "Korea's Got Cooking Talent!" contest was Tofu Kimchi Bokum, quite another kettle of fish — or rather, pork and hot cabbage. And what pork. The thin, tender slices are irresistibly seasoned — with what, I haven't a clue, but it certainly brings out the best in the pig meat. The slices mingle in a riotous stir-fry with spicy kimchi, while around the edges of the bowl stand sentries of thick triangles of firm, unadorned tofu, to cool the fires, or to toss into the mixture as a neutral balance to the kimchi

Hot and Spicy Galbi Tang is a soup with ultra-tender braised short-rib meat (and loose bones) with cabbage shreds in a rich, meaty, deeply satisfying broth. It's moderately spicy but won't blow your head off. (Perhaps they

gentled it a bit for a table with only one Korean-American.) This is fabulous comfort food if your comforts include a little piquancy — warming on a cold night, cooling on a hot one. If you want to cool it down or fill it out a bit, you've got that bowl of rice on your table to mix in.

We all wished for bigger, better shrimp in Shrimp Japchae with Korean Leeks, rather than the small, dull-flavored specimens that couldn't hold their own in this fierce-flavored treatment. They were pan-fried with an army of thin-sliced scallions in a spicy, savory red-brown sauce, mingling with thin, tender cellophane noodles.

One of my favorite Korean dishes takes some instruction to eat properly. Bibimbap arose as a home dish to absorb a heap of leftover scraps, including rice, a sort of Korean Sunday supper. It's pretty much the equivalent of Chinese fried rice and is pronounced like a jazz drummer's final rim shot — bee BIM bop. In the more elaborate Dol Sat Bibimbap, the mixture comes in a hot-stone or regular stoneware casserole filled with rice that's crisped around the edges, along with julienned vegetables, Asian mushroom slices, and perhaps some bits of meat. At the last minute, a lightly fried or poached egg is plopped on top — and here's where the instruction comes in — which you stir in along with plenty of Korean chili sauce (which comes bottled on the table).

I have to admit my favorite Dol Sat Bibimbap was at the famed Brothers BBQ in SF (which that barbecueblessed city has nicknamed "Seoul Brothers"), considered by Koreans to be, perhaps, the best Korean restaurant in the U.S. Theirs was delivered dangerously sizzling, and the waitress stirred up the rice with a wooden paddle, to dislodge all the crackly bits, then rapidly stirred in the requisite (very ample) amount of bottled Korean hot sauce. At the end, she broke a raw egg on top and stirred it in to cook lightly in the still-sizzling rice. Wow, love at first bite!

At Do Re Mi, less of the rice is crackly, there's a smaller assortment of ingredients, and you have to stir in the precooked egg and the hot sauce yourself. (And the hot sauce is a different brand, one that's less complex than at Brothers.) The dish is still very tasty, comparable to the version at the popular Buga a few blocks away. But remember, you *must* stir in hot

sauce, as much as you think you can handle, to bring the concoction to full, vibrant life.

At the end, Do Re Mi's generosity is so complete, it even includes a subtle little dessert, a teacup filled with persimmon juice dotted with pine nuts. How sweet!

Our gluttonous review meal (which included over a week's worth of terrific takeout for one) cost all of \$32 per person, including drinks, tip, tax. A normal couple or group of eaters can figure on about \$20 per person for dinner, tout compris. (The lunch specials, which typically include rice, include dumpling, salad, and soft drink for \$10 or under — plus banchen — before tax.)

Even more important: "I think this is now my favorite Korean restaurant," said Sang, who feels that Buga's food has lost something as it's gained popularity. (The management may have changed, too.) The rest of us readily agreed on Do Re Mi's virtues. This is more relaxing than dealing with the heat, the meats, and the DIY tensions of tabletop barbecue. Yes, you can buy BBQ here but the rest of the menu, with its rich, spicy soups and stews, is where the real treasures lie. And they are treasures.■



I have cooked ever since I was little with my mom and grandmother. They are both Swedish, so we had a lot of Swedish meatballs and pancakes for dinner. There was always something going on in the kitchen at home. My mom was a stay-athome mom and a great cook, so it was always home for dinner at 5:30. I really liked our family dinners. It's, like, anything that is consistent and constant is always appealing. It really forged my relationship with my family.

For the restaurant, I tend to shop at the local farmers' markets in Little Italy. I'm a big shopper because we change our menu often. I'm about to try out some fresh jalapeño juice for a jalapeño gelee to go on a pork dish. I'll pair it with corn. I'm always planning and looking to the future. It's what's great about working with the guys who are picking these vegetables out of the ground with

their own hands. They tell me exactly when things are going to be in their prime. If it's not available from the farmers, it's not on the menu.

When I'm not working, I love to go see what other people are doing. I eat out quite a bit. When I cook at home it's the little things. Like, oatmeal in the morning. My girlfriend and I love cheese and I'll bring home something amazing from Cow Girl Creamery and we'll crack a baguette. If I have

# **INGREDIENTS**

**SERVES 4** 

2 lbs fresh black mussels about 32 (I use Carlsbad Aquafarm mussels)

4 tbsp grapeseed oil 1 small yellow onion (minced)

1 Thai red chili (seeds removed and minced)

3 shiitake mushrooms, sliced and stems removed (I use Temecula Mushroom Farm's mushrooms

½ each yellow, green, and red pepper (finely diced) 2 stalks lemongrass (smashed and halved lengthwise) 2 tsp grated lime zest (I use Schaner Farms kaffir lime zest)

3 tbsp Thai green curry paste ¼ cup Mirin (rice cooking wine)

4 cup dry white wine
4 cup coconut milk
2 tbsp Thai fish sauce
1 tsp kosher salt
1 tbsp cilantro, minced

### **HOW TO DO IT**

Scrub the mussels under running water to remove sand and dirt. Discard any mussels that are already open. Next, bring a large sauté pan to medium-high heat and add the oil. When the pan is hot, add the onion, red chili, mushrooms, and peppers. Cook on medium heat until the onion is translucent and mushrooms have colored a little bit. Add the lemongrass, lime zest, and curry paste and cook for another couple of minutes to release the flavors and to cook out the curry paste.

Deglaze the pan with the Mirin and white wine. Bring to a boil. Add the coconut milk and Thai fish sauce and lower the heat to a simmer. Add the mussels, salt, and minced cilantro and cover the sauté pan with a lid. Cook for approximately three to five minutes or until the mussels have just opened. Remove the pan from the heat and transfer to a large bowl. Garnish with some sprigs or leaves of cilantro. Serve as is or with steamed white rice. Enjoy!

Can there be such a thing as 21st-century gothic? The gothic imagination is all about superstitions that linger on after science has seemed to explain them away...but maybe the old superstitions are done lingering. I mean, vampires are everywhere these days, but not as the unsettling visions of the irrational subconscious of Dracula. Instead they're fantasy boyfriends in Twilight and True Blood. The old stories have lost their ability to scare us.

I was thinking about this recently when I listened to Dan Sartain's song "Atheist Funeral," which declares, "Don't talk about

God at my funeral!" Sartain. who hails from Alabama but spends a lot of time in San Diego, makes bluesy, swampy psychobilly music that has "Southern gothic" written all over it. Think of the Cramps or Screamin' Jay Hawkins without all the silliness, and you'll know what to expect. While you're at it, think of Screamin' Jay's "I Put a Spell on You" without the voodoo. Could the song exist without it? Would it have the same eerie quality?

I don't know the answer to that, but with "Atheist Funeral," Sartain makes a case that he doesn't need all the old mumbo-jumbo to cook up a good old-fashioned Southern gothic racket. With a bass sound this powerful and a beat this primitive, he doesn't need to talk about God or the devil in order to sound heavy. Besides, if Sartain wants to stir up something unsettling, he can find it in



the real world. Check out his song "Bohemian Grove," about the secretive and cultlike resort open exclusively to the richest and most powerful people in the country. Now that is creepy.

There was a Jack Johnson let's-makepancakes-then-save-some-whales feel that slipped around Australian singer-songwriter Xavier Rudd's bare feet like tidewater in the early days of his career. But when I read that Rudd had likened one of his later CDs to a

iourney into his own neuroses. I began to take more interest. "I needed to go into the dark rooms inside myself and clean off some dusty shelves," he told a reporter about his 2008 release Dark Shades of Blue.

Rudd has been called a didgeridoo virtuoso. Not the first choice of musical instruments among emerging pop stars, didgeridoos are primitive wooden tubes said to have been made hollow by termites living in the Australian outback. They can make

an almost satanic sound. Rudd sits behind a stand of didgeridoos onstage and is surrounded by percussion instruments and guitars, key among them a Weissenborn acoustic slide. Rudd's electric guitar has acquired more grit from the reggae influence in his show. These days he's more Sting and less Jack Johnson, with an authoritative punch added by the addition of a South African bassist-drummer rhythm section.

A few years ago Rudd and his wife were



featured in an architecture rag for the selfsustaining home they built near Melbourne. I asked him what it's like, living off the grid, and he emailed back: "It takes some work, dedication, and knowledge, and sometimes some problem solving, but it is a great feeling. And the silence is amazing."

# **Crazy Magic**

Cameron and Vashti say Golden Triangle's L.A. tour stop was "a mess," partly 'cause the venue pocketed some of the band's earnings. Setting up at the Pink isn't being easy, either. There's some protracted fiddling with equipment borrowed from Christmas Island. Suddenly, the band starts playing. That Vashti and Carly's vocals can't be pushed further up in the mix is apparently a mere bag o' shells against the band's desperate jones to throw down

Per Wikipedia, the term "golden triangle" has been applied to 33 different places or

things. Based on the chills I'm getting from a throbbing plunge into "Cinco de Mayo," the opium-producing triangle straddling Thailand and Myanmar is the GT with which



the band shares the most symbiosis — although the erotic "GT" runs a close second. It's a whirring, thumping blur; an onstage bash climaxes when Carly slithers around the floor as Vashti crouches and contorts.

Whether it's 'cause Alix's bass feels somewhat muted. almost a dimension to O.J. and Cameron's guitar din, the delicious drone raises hairs on my neck — a rare feat that in pure rock terms (excepting more progressive/experimental artists) has previously been accomplished only by the Cramps (with Bryan Gregory/without bass), Sonic Youth, and TFUI 282. Also, the vocal harmonies dip below the melody (the Beatles' choice), which purportedly makes listeners hear a third, "phantom" note. Whatever the formula, this here's some crazy magic.

# **Scrapple from** the Apple

Concert Review by Robert Bush

Jazz history was on display at the Saville Theater with the sold-out performance of the Mundell Lowe Quartet. One of the original participants in the Bebop revolution, Lowe's résumé includes work experience with three of the most influential bandleaders in jazz: Charlie Parker, Benny Goodman, and Charles Mingus.

Most artists born in 1922 have either long passed or long retired. Judging from this gig, Lowe isn't considering either

option. The passage of time hasn't diminished Mr. Lowe's dexterity — he plays finger-burning arpeggios and stunning chord-melody passages with casual

ease. His tone is full-bodied, and his rhythm is full of swing and drive.

It didn't hurt his cause to have a San Diego allstar rhythm section supporting him. Mike Wofford on piano is a giant whose touch on the instrument reflects all of the masters. Bassist Gunnar Biggs has been a rock of the local jazz scene for 30 years, and drummer Jim Plank's complete control of the dynamics shaped the affair. They tore through versions of Parker's "Steeplechase" and "Scrapple from the Apple," but the highlight was their swinging performance of the seldom played Rodgers and Hart classic, "There's a Small Hotel."





# **Tommy Guns and Classy Tunes**

# A 13-piece band makes familiar songs seem newly minted.

an Diegans hear a show's "Broadway bound" so much the tag has lost pizzazz. The Old Globe's recent musicals — The First Wives' Club, Sammy, and The Whisper

House — came decked with Great White Way hype and crept away like a buck-naked Emperor. The Globe's current offering, the "Broadway bound" Robin and

*the 7 Hoods*, isn't an embarrassment. In some ways it's an embarrassment of riches.

Sammy Cahn and Jimmy Van Heusen wrote instant hits. It helped, of course, that Frank Sinatra sang "My Kind of Town (Chicago Is)" and "High Hopes," and Dean Martin, "Ain't That a Kick in the Head." The combination made for an indomitable, "top of the heap" attitude. The songs aren't just upbeat, they're apple-pie-in-the-sky high — the opposite of the blues. When one of the Rat Pack sang a sad song, you knew it was temporary: Frank, Dean, or Sammy just couldn't stay down for long.

Robin unfolds like a Greatest Hits of Cahn (lyrics) and Van Heusen (music). Bill Elliott's fresh, savvy orchestrations — with splashy, intricate grace notes and riffs — and a 13-piece

band make familiar songs feel newly minted. Act 2, for example, goes from "(Love Is) The Tender Trap" to "All the Way" to "Come Fly with Me." Hit songs take off and soar like jets at O'Hare.

The musical's set in 1962. The director, Casey Nicholaw, also choreographs, and the show is never far from a big produc-

tion number with early '60s theatrical exuberance. The moves for "Come Blow Your Horn" have Gene Kelly athleticism. And "Walkin' Happy" pays tribute to tap dancing. Willie Scarlatti (top-notch Jeffrey Schecter) gives stolen money to the poor. He enters with clicking tap shoes. As greenbacks change hands, more and more Chicagoans arrive, tapping their hearts out. Then the orchestra shuts down, and three groups of dancers do antiphonal statementand-response steps, and if you love this stuff, it's worth the price of admission.

The musical's based, in part, on the 1964 movie (Sinatra, Martin, Sammy D., Peter Faulk as the Sheriff), which, said the hype, took the Robin Hood legend "and changed bows and arrows to machine guns!" It also took a long pil-

fering look at *Guys and Dolls*, but that's another story.

Robbo Ortona, cocky mobster, moves in on P.J. Sullivan's turf (played as an ironic, cupcake Al Capone by Rick Holmes). Like a blonde Lois Lane, ace reporter Marian Archer muck-rakes for truth, justice, and Robbo's heart. The names correspond to the legend (Maid Marian "archer": bow and arrow?), though the stories don't jibe unless you stretch the definition of

"outlaw" beyond language and can imagine Sherwood Forest as a tommy gun-infested South Side nightclub.

Rupert Holmes's book isn't bad. It's got banter and snappy one-liners (asked whose idea it was to rob from the rich and give to the poor, Willie replies, "Karl Marx?"). But it's based on showbiz personalities, not developed fictional characters. In effect, it requires the Rat Pack aura to pull it through. Mere mortals, even backed by top-notch direction and production numbers, pale in comparison.

Eric Schneider has a big voice (he played Frankie in *Jersey Boys*), but as Robbo he's more smiling nice guy — even when naughty — than head hood. Will Chase (Little John) has stellar chops, as does Amy Spanger, her Alana being a more arch Adelaide ("a poy-sun...could develop a code"). As Marian, Kelly Sullivan pushes vocally, at times coming up flat. Her and Sch-

neider's "I Like to Lead When I Dance," however, is one of the show's best numbers.

The Old Globe recently made costume designer Gregg Barnes an associate artist. Smart move: his work ranks with Old Globe mainstays Lewis Brown and Robert Morgan. For Robin, along with the thin ties and oil-slick suits from 1962, Barnes adds a real period touch: capri pants. Robert Brill's solemn box set, building façades, proves serviceable, especially when Kenneth Posner's lighting tweaks the basic gray.

Like *Boeing-Boeing*, also set in the early '60s (the Old Globe has a thing about the period), the characters' actions and attitudes are dated. Though Holmes has scrubbed the sexism from Frank's and Dino's personae, in every scene, someone is either lighting a cigarette or pouring a cocktail — the stimulants du jour of the *Mad Men* era. They smoke and swill so much in *Robin* they inspire not awe but thoughts of addictive personalities, desiccated livers, and lung cancer.

If you look past the spectacle, the show-stopping dance numbers in particular, *Robin* feels like an imitation. It relies on a bygone mystique it can't conjure. But the Cahn/Van Heusen parade of hits, and Elliott's orchestrations, almost carry the show, anyway.

Due to popular demand, Ion Theatre has extended the run of David Ives's absurdist vignettes. As Bill tells Betty in "Sure Thing" — variations on the myriad ways a chance encounter can go wrong — it's "all in the timing." Ion's polished production often had hilarious results. Brian Mackey plays Leon Trotsky with an axe in his head for 36 hours; an elastic Steven Lone's the charlatan wordsmith in "The Universal Language"; Kim Strassburger's a monkey trying to write Hamlet from scratch (but coming closer to Milton's Paradise Lost) and Trotsky's multifaceted wife; and Karson St. John shows her remarkable range in several roles. Ives's title calls attention to technique. Under Glenn Paris and Claudio Raygoza's codirection, however, the actors never make one aware of their "timing." Instead they sustain focus on Ives's

The San Diego Rep opened its 35th season with the Tony Award-winner about integrating the airways in 1962. Like American Bandstand (which was as white as Dick Clark's teeth) and Baltimore's Buddy Deane Show, The Corny Collins Show only allows blacks to dance once a month. Young Tracy Turnblad — ostracized because she isn't svelte, has a beehive hairdo, and dances "downtown" steps inspires a nonviolent democratization of the show. Director Sam Woodhouse smartly cast actors and musicians from the School of Creative and Performing Arts, who inject energy into a long-ish evening. Javier Velasco's choreography recalls the period (and his kaleidoscopic staging of a dodgeball battle is terrific!). Bethany Slomka's a kick as Tracy (who seems to dance nonstop

throughout). Peter Van Norden, Tim Irving, Victor Hernandez, and especially Steve Gunderson (unforgettable as Tracy's hyper father) offer strong support. # Harvey

In the first 18 drafts of her classic comedy, Mary Chase envisioned an actor playing Harvey: a sixfoot or six-foot-three-and-a-half invisible white rabbit. At the Boston tryout, an actor wore a \$600 costume, but looked like an actor playing a rabbit. So Chase made Harvey invisible ("more real," she said in an interview). She won a Pulitzer Prize For audiences who favor subtle, nuanced acting, the Lamb's Players production may require an adjustment. Everyone except David Cochran Heath (splendid as the convivial, egalitarian Elwood P. Dowd) pole vaults their characters over the top. In director Robert Smyth's inventive conception, even though he talks to a "pookah" (an invisible fairy spirit; a "puck" in England), Elwood's the sanest one around. Smyth makes Harvey a comedy not of manners but of neurotics, some of whom begin to grow. As Elwood's sister Veta, for example, Kerry Meads begins WAY out there: a tangle of words and gestures. As the play proceeds and she encounters Harvey's calming aegis, Veta sheds neuroses along the way. As do the others (thanks to fine ensemble work). Mike Buckley's handsome set swivels from scene to scene. Jeanne Reith's mid-'40s costumes and Nathan Peirson's lighting sustain an antic mood. (Note: due to popular demand, Lamb's has extended the show's run.)

# King Lear

THROUGH SEPTEMBER 5

In Adrian Noble's valuable book, How to Do Shakespeare, the former artistic director of the Royal Shakespeare Company teaches a master class on the subject. His direction of King Lear at the Old Globe puts his teachings into practice. I have never heard the story told better. Like Coriolanus, whose "heart's his mouth," the cast makes thought and speech one. Bruce Turk's nimble Fool, Catherine Gowl's firm Cordelia, Ionno Roberts's Edmund (as funny as he is vile), and especially Iav Whittaker's multi-voiced Edgar make each moment brand new. Robert Foxworth's Lear begins puffed up and regal and ends, 20 years older, like a dying candle extinguished by its wax. But his always-competent performance lacks size. Foxworth could tweak the narcissism and suggest that it masks a profound instability at the King's core. Deirdre Clancy's costumes begin upscale, in the 18th Century, and then fan out as they come forward in time. Ralph Funicello's spare set includes dark, castle-high walls and autumn leaves on the floor (swept away in the wintry second act). Shaun Davey's original music handles the entrances well but is absolutely unnecessary when Lear and Cordelia reunite (she, strangely, not in his arms). At this point the audience doesn't need music to tell them how to feel! (Note: King Lear runs in repertory with The Taming of the Shrew and The Madness of George III; call the theater for days and times of each.) Critic's pick.

# The Last Romance

It helps that Ioe Di Pietro wrote this lightweight charmer for Marion Ross and her husband Paul Michael. Their backstory proves that the play's theme is possible. Eighty-three-year-old Raphael Bellini (two great Italian artists in one name) has walked the same walk for years. In a play loaded with life-changing events, he takes a different path and meets Carol Reynolds. They slowly grow together (but have secrets, and will they become like an opera's plot: people meet but can't get together "because life gets in the way"?). The script's complications are predictable and a mite forced. What works is Ross and Michael's interplay. The actors are obviously having fun meeting each other, as it were, for the first time. Patricia Conolly plays Ralph's potentially spurned sister Rose with crusty conviction. Joshua Jeremiah performs during scene changes with a big, operatic voice. And in keeping with the theme, designer Alexander Dodge crowns the stage with a wreath of autumn leaves. Worth a try.

# The Madness of George III In Alan Bennett's drama, "mad

In Alan Bennett's drama, "mad King George" isn't. Unlike King Lear, whose mania sears his

synapses, George only has the symptoms, but enough of them to prompt the Regency Crisis of 1788 (since his condition could topple the government). A battery of doctors, a hypochondriac's nightmare in powdered wigs, try to heal the king but only exacerbate the condition. At the Old Globe, Miles Anderson plays George III like an inverted iceberg: deep down, at the tip, he's sane. Everything else becomes

a burden that Andrews, in an exceptional performance, overcomes, thanks to a man named Willis. Under Adrian Noble's inventive direction (the cast runs in and out of eight mirrored double doors with the speed of farce), the Globe's summer festival intersects in Willis: his authoritarian tactics recall Petruchio (in Shrew); and Robert Foxworth plays Willis and also King Lear (to whom George is often com-

pared). Andrew Dahl's a kick as the Prince of Wales, a corpulent poseur, Emily Swallow gives the Queen a loving patience, and Jay Whittaker's William Pitt exudes an almost insane ferocity. Bruce Turk, Adrian Sparks, and Joseph Marcell make the attending physicians (and their medieval cures) eerily absurdist. But like the king, they only seem mad (Note: Madness runs in repertory with King Lear and The Taming

# A Midsummer Night's Dream

In Christopher Ashley's staging, when the lovers flee Athens, the world turns upsidedown. A piano dangles midair, and a chandelier rises from the floor. The lovers don't escape to a wood, they enter a Cirque du Soleil dreamscape. The director has encouraged nearconstant movement, accompanied by a live orchestra playing Mendelssohn. But the activity often upstages the speakers. The real "juice" in *Dream* isn't Puck's love-concoction, it's the language. Few in the cast relish it (Jonathan McMurtry's tyrannical Egeus, Daniel Oreske's sometimes stiff Theseus/Oberon, and Charlayne Woodard's Hippolyta/Titania). Others treat it like utilitarian prose, especially Lucas Caleb Rooney as Bottom; he's deaf to verbal jokes ("I see a voice" should get a big laugh, for example). In the end, the rational Theseus says dreams and fantasies are just "airy nothing"; Hippolyta says they can "grow to something of great constancy. The playhouse's Dream, though visually stunning and often entertaining, aligns more with Theseus than Hippolyta. Worth a try.

# The Seven-Year Itch

Owing to a near accident, deus ex potted tomatoes, and unlike the original, fantasy becomes reality. The play, reset by New

Village Arts to 1959, is early Simon-lite, Director Amanda Sitton nicely orchestrates the farce and adds a strong period flavor (the women, in particular, dress and move pure late-Fifties) Onstage throughout, and with impressive timing, Daren Scott makes Richard a nexus of quirks and questions Jason Bieber's quick-cut lighting mirrors Richard's perplexities. Though she could be more attracted to Richard, Jacque Wilke's Girl talks the period talk beautifully (both crisp and rapid fire). Eddie Yaroch, as a funny, vein-bulging psychologist, and Melissa Fernandes, a hoot as Richard's wife (who really goes off on him), offer strong support work. Tim Wallace's set, the apartment interior, and miniature New York exterior, ranks among his best.







# After an Intermission

Both the bleakness and the humor of his vision are well earned.

odd Solondz has described his *Life during Wartime* as a "quasi-sequel" to *Happiness*. This is helpful inasmuch as it has

been a dozen years since the quasi-predecessor, and although I think of that one as his best film I am sure

I am not alone in experiencing no urge to see it again in the interval. Helpful, too, inasmuch as the moviegoer's memory receives no help whatsoever from the recasting of the principal roles with different players: Ciarán Hinds, Allison Janney, Shirley Henderson, and Ally Sheedy for Dylan Baker, Cynthia Stevenson, Jane Adams, and Lara Flynn Boyle. Naturally enough, the pubescent boy of before is now a college boy, Chris Marquette, and assuming his place on the brink of bar mitzvah is a little brother with a bowl haircut, Dylan Riley Snyder. (Charlotte Rampling, formidable as a truculent man-trap

in a hotel bar, has no previous equivalent.) The character of the middleclass suburban pedophile, even without a prompt from the filmmaker,

would assuredly have rung a faint bell, as would those of the three weird sisters weird in the colloqui-

al sense, not the Shakespearean — but if ever a sequel could be said to stand on its own without necessity of seeing the predecessor, this would be it. I think of it now as Solondz's second-best film.

We may not know quite where we are in the opening scene, apart from a plush restaurant booth, where the black half of an interracial couple (Michael Kenneth Williams, unhelpfully in for Philip Seymour Hoffman), unable to ignore the tears streaming down the face of the white half, first tries polite distraction ("They have a lot of vegetarian options here"), then tries contrite con-



frontation ("No more getting into fights with strangers, waking up in the gutter"), only to have his efforts sabotaged when the waitress without warning spits in his face. The emotional tone and temperature of a scene always trump the factual content. We know as much as we need to know. We can feel the rest. Solondz does a painstaking job of feathering

nests, comfortably affluent and antiseptically attractive surroundings, and smothering these with a golden patina, thereby locating the source of all troubles exclusively *inside* the people. External factors, even the ongoing war in the title, afford no excuses. Nowhere is this more glaringly apparent than in the swank Tinsel Town mansion of the Emmy-

winning scriptwriter and erstwhile poet — "I was feeling crushed by the enormity of my success" — though it is, with less glare, everywhere apparent. Another example: the motel where the paroled pedophile takes temporary shelter looks like a triple-diamond establishment in a AAA tour book, but the unidentified thread or hair on the bed impels the

squeamish occupant to spread towels on the mattress before reclining. Whatever icky thing lies on the bed can't be as icky as what lies within.

The themes of happiness and normality, or the illusions thereof, from the earlier film are compounded here, after everything that happened there, by themes of guilt and forgiveness, but Solondz mercilessly exposes the meaninglessness of language (can the wartime buzzword "terrorist" be extended to cover a pedophile?), and the nearest approximation his characters can come to happiness or forgiveness or whatyou-will is to pretend. Those are no small accomplishments for a filmmaker: to pinpoint the source of human discontent, to gauge the emptiness of words, to rip the mask off self-knowledge. And not simply to proclaim these, but to portray them in lucid, vivid, striking images. At times, even so, he seems to be doing things just for effect — the fantasy scenes with a suicided Paul Reubens, for a blatant instance — as if he feels he can ill afford to allow too much time in between quirks and kinks, just as the sitcom writer cannot allow too long a lag between punch lines. In this, Solondz betrays an innate inclination to conventionalize

the unconventional. Yet he, among a throng of competitors in the "indie" field, remains an above-average quirk trafficker, more discriminating than most, and both the bleakness and the humor of his vision are well earned. They do not, that is to say, come cheap.

Scott Pilgrim vs. the World is more accurately Scott Pilgrim vs. Seven Evil Exes, six guvs and one girl whom he must in some sense "defeat" in order to win the hand of the pinkhaired, then blue-haired, then greenhaired girl of his dreams. (Literally she first appeared to him, on skates, in a dream.) The serial conflicts, supernatural martial-arts contests punctuated with spelled-out sound effects in the style of the old Batman television show ("WHUMP!"), are so deep into fantasy that even a shoulderless wimp such as Michael Cera can compete, untrained, on equal footing. So deep indeed that we lose touch with the metaphor. In what sense, and why, must he best these out-of-the-picture rivals? The ironic facial expression of Mary Elizabeth Winstead, her raised-eyebrow skepticism, is very fetching even if not very revealing. Still, the singular triumph of this hard-trying movie is that Cera manages to hang onto his humanity, his Canadian modesty, his individualistic deft touch, his sidelong delivery of lines, amid all the brassy pop-culture self-consciousness, the comic-bookishness and video-gamesmanship, the distancing devices (superimposed title on a new setting: "Fun fact: This place is a toilet"), and the sophomoric cleverness of British director Edgar Wright (Shaun of the Dead, Hot Fuzz). Wright's best gambits, which have the practical purpose of speeding the action along in addition to the purely ornamental purpose of showing off, are the dreamlike scene changes in mid-dialogue.

Get Low, the feature debut of director Aaron Schneider, starts like a house afire, meaning it starts literally with a house on fire, and proceeds from there to shave off a thin slice of folksy baloney purportedly based on fact, something to do with a misanthropic old Tennessee hermit who throws himself a "funeral party" before his demise. Robert Duvall runs through his familiar repertoire at an uncommonly slow speed en route to an embarrassing Capra-esque climax of public confession. Bill Murray as the needy, greedy funeral director is still Bill Murray. And Sissy Spacek as a former flame of the protagonist brings to her every scene her special gift of being completely (as the Buddhists have it) present in the moment. One of America's shamefully neglected natural resources.

The Other Guys is a cop-partner comedy from Adam McKay, not to say cop-buddy, with Will Ferrell wobbly in tone as a contented desk jockey and Mark Wahlberg a steady straight man as a pent-up eager beaver. It evinces a deathly pale image, a fair amount of industry, and a few amusing ideas (a fight breaks out in whispers at a police funeral and carries on at a respectful volume), at least a skit's worth.

Agora — Funereal toga party commemorating the culture clash in a majestic computer-generated Alexandria, pre-Islam: pagans, Christians, Jews. It is no surprise although given the locale, and given the drift of current events in the region, it is an undoubted provocation — that the Christians, out from under the Roman sandal, get fingered as the prime movers of religious intolerance, desecrators of the all-embracing Library of Alexandria and martyrizers of the 4th-century philosopher and mathematician, Hypatia, a dim persona from distant history until Rachel Weisz stepped into the role to give her form, substance, and a starry glow. The latter's private struggle to understand the Earth's orbit proves to be more engrossing, if no more free of modern axe-grinding and historical rewriting, than the inexorable and escalating sectarian strife. One can be prepared to believe all manner of bad things about Christians without believing that their silencing of this solitary independent voice, this feminist demigoddess, set back the cause of astronomy by more than a millennium. With Max Minghella, Oscar Isaac, and Sami Samir; directed by Alejandro Amenábar. 2010.

**The Concert** — The janitor at the Bolshoi, demoted from maestro for political motives under Brezhnev, intercepts a faxed invitation from the Châtelet in Paris, and conspires to round up sixty fellow out-of-work

Low comedy en route to high culture, a climax of Tchaikovsky's Violin Concerto, mixed throughout with warmed-over Soviet politics and soap-operatic personal drama. Despicable Me — Computer cartoon available, but not imperative, in 3-D. Admittedly the Universal logo, our planet on a blanket of stars, looks good in 3-D, and the closing credits have some fun with the extra dimension, trying with the aid of an outthrusting steel tape measure to see how far off the screen the image can jump. If the whole film were as in-your-face as that, the extra expense for the glasses would have been well worth it, but the tape measure measures nothing so much as the nonaggression, the impassivity, of the rest of the film. The premise represents the very depth of inspiration: an ineffectual arch villain (a lugubrious Gorey-esque figure whose head levels off at the evebrows, a penguin torso atop ostrich legs, a twelvefoot muffler wound around his neck), his workshop of elfish helpers in the thimble shape of Pac-Man monsters, a younger and goonier rival villain in a bowl haircut and square-rimmed glasses, and three too-cute orphans who change the course of criminality. The noisy musical score strives to make the action seem more rousing than it is, and the amusing Slavic accents of Steve Carell and Julie Andrews (as the principal villain's withholding mother) make up to some extent for deficiencies in the dialogue. Kristen Wiig's churchy Southern accent adds something, too, to the stereotypical cruel directress of Miss Hattie's Home for Girls. Directed by Pierre Coffin and Chris Renaud, 2010.

mushed-up remake of a rather distasteful French farce, called here The Dinner Game, concerning a clique of fat cats who periodically convene for a soirée to which each of them for their shared amusement brings along an unwitting idiot to compete for the laurel of biggest idiot. For the American mass market, the focal fat cat (Paul Rudd) has been made leaner and hungrier, a sympathetic, reluctant participant forced to jump through this hoop for job advancement. The focal idiot (Steve Carell) has meanwhile been so grotesqued — a buck-toothed, four-eved dolt in a oversized hooded lavender nylon windbreaker, an IRS pencil pusher whose off-hours hobby is the construction of miniature tableaus with dead mice - that no idiots in the audience are at risk of identifying with him and taking offense, and yet he's not so irredeemable an idiot that he cannot learn and teach important life lessons in the last act. Any sensitive viewer will be compelled to surrender his sense of moral or intellectual superiority by wanting fervently to kill the bumbling idiot for turning the fat cat's life upside down in the twenty-four hours prior to the dinner, or else to kill the fat cat for enabling the idiot to do it. **Eclipse** — Third installment in the Twilight "saga," with a new director, David Slade, not to say new blood, only recirculated blood. The ongoing grooming of Robert Pattinson and Taylor Lautner as poster boys to be pinned up in pink bedrooms across the land reminds the viewer continually, with pop songs chiming in on the soundtrack, that this is intended primarily if not exclusively for adolescent girls. Maturer viewers might enjoy nodding sagely at the spectacle of a modern Everygirl named Bella, realistically played by Kristen Stewart, to whom you can't, at that age, tell anything, and who won't be warned off her heart's desire by reason, wisdom, foresight, superior experience. And they might take a clinical interest in the mixed signals by which Bella keeps both fellas on the string. There is, as a sideshow, a subplot about a simmering skirmish between vampire clans ("Something terrible is coming"), owing to some unelucidated grudge against Bella that you're supposed to recall from the previous installment. But the impending slaughter plays strictly second fiddle to the romantic rivalry between Edward the vampire and Jacob the werewolf, and in fact is of any interest whatsoever only for the additional flattery to Bella. The two armies after all, like the two boys, are fighting over her. In the final reckoning the film can best be enjoyed in the way you might enjoy looking at a teenage girl's Facebook pages or her Twitter entries or, if anyone still keeps one, her dear diary. Best be enjoyed, to say it another way, as documentary evidence of what large numbers of teenage girls enjoy. To be sure, large numbers of teenage girls (not to tar them all with the same brush) will enjoy it in a less detached and dispassionate way.

Exit through the Gift Shop — Halfwayengaging, halfway aggravating documentary on street art and its inevitable commer cialization. Signed by the pseudonymous Banksy, a British graffiti artist who zealously guards his true identity ("The Scarlet Pimpernel of Street Art," as one newspaper headline puts it) and who appears here on screen wearing a hoodie in silhouette or with his face digitalized, the film ostensibly began as the work of Thierry Guetta, a muttonchopped French émigré who operated a vintage clothing store in L.A., became an obsessive amateur videographer, trained his camera in particular on the activities of guerrilla artists, turned himself into one of them under the moniker of Mr. Brain Wash, and ostensibly edited his footage into an unreleasable mess, at which point Banksy ostensibly took over the project, utilizing and supplementing Guetta's footage, whipping it into the present shape. We must keep saying "ostensibly" because well, who knows? Anonymity is not a trustworthy persona for a documentarist, especially one with a prior reputation, a prior rap sheet, as a prankster. (Nor does the irony-dripping narration delivered by Rhys Ifans inspire much confidence.) Whatever the provenance or purpose, we

have here a lot of footage of street artists in action, poor in quality but sufficient in quantity to enable us to gauge the range of cleverness, and to think our worst thoughts about the impact of money and hype in the art world. "Anthropologically, sociologically," remarks street artist Shepard Fairey, who could be talking about the film itself, "it's a fascinating thing to observe." Artistically, aesthetically, it's a confounding thing.

The Girl Who Played with Fire — The second in Stieg Larsson's "Millennium" trilogy finds our pierced, tattooed, Gothhaired "girl" framed for the murders of two reporters at work on an exposé of sex trafficking. It's a solider case than the first one, The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo, but still lurid, seamy, sleazy; and the sex-trade angle gets completely pushed aside in favor of the heroine's quest for vengeance. Along the way, there are some tense sequences involving a blond giant impervious to pain, and after two-plus hours an unsatisfactory up-in-the-air ending that requires you to grit your teeth and gird for another sequel With Noomi Rapace, Michael Nyqvist, Mikael Spreitz, Yasmine Garbi, Paolo Roberto, and Per Oscarsson; directed by Daniel Alfredson. 2009.

# The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo —

Homegrown adaptation by Niels Arden Opley of the international best-seller by Stieg Larsson, from the Scandinavian wave of detective novels. The movie, like the book, is long: two and a half hours with almost half an hour of anti- or post-climax. In the early going, it juggles two separate cases and two separate investigators, a Leftist muckraking journalist (Michael Nyqvist, with his Richard Burtonish full-moon cratered face) and a security-firm computer geek (Noomi Rapace, a sort of young Claire Bloom) who sports two nose rings, numerous ear piercings, a Goth hairdo and wardrobe, and of course the titular tattoo over her entire back. Eventually the two investigators team up on the sketchier and shakier of the cases: the forty-year-old disappearance and presumed murder of


a teenage girl whose body, on a sealed-off island, was never recovered. Mystery fans alarm bells will begin ringing even before the girl's favorite uncle explains how she was in the habit of giving him an annual framed botanical and how he has continued annually to receive an anonymous framed botanical which he theorizes has been sent tauntingly by her killer. Kooky theory. Perhaps our indignity over the multiple revelations of ugly sexual violence is hoped to blind us to the shoddy plotting and the plodding development. (That, and perhaps also the cracklingly crisp photography.) But the would-be "touching" ending will be soured by the unasked question of how many women were raped, tortured, and murdered over those forty years so that we could have a touching ending. 2009.

**I Am Love** — The mad passion of a wealthy Milanese matron (Tilda Swinton, any defects in her subtitled Italian explained by her Russian origins) for the much younger chef with whom her son has entered a restaurant partnership. Thus, there's a food-film ingredient from the shelf of Babette's Feast, Big Night, Like Water for Chocolate, Mostly Martha, and the like - a sensual awakening, for example, to a glistening plate of prawns, enclosing the heroine in her own personal spotlight - as well as a Chatterley-esque

attunement to the world of flowers, berries, bugs Filmmaker Luca Guadagnino exhibits a painstaking attention to detail - the weather, the light, the living spaces, the furnishings, the silent comings and goings of the servants - and he closely monitors emotional temperatures, gelid to red-hot. His direction is littered with fussy, prinking little touches that jump out at you rather than coalesce into a coherent style. And the running-in-place music of John Adams is an intermittent irritant. With Flavio Parenti, Edoardo Gabbriellini, Alba Rohrwacher, Marisa Berenson, and Gabriele Ferzetti. 2010.

**Inception** — A major snow job from fair-haired filmmaker Christopher Nolan. nominally a science-fiction thriller focussed on some sort of psychic superspy (Leonardo DiCaprio, fully earning the furrow between his brows), an expert in the gentle art of "extraction," the stealing of conscious ideas from people when their guard is down in dreamland, now assigned the more difficult task of "inception," the planting of an idea in that same vulnerable state. Even for science fiction, the mumbo-jumbo to explain how all this works is exceptionally skimpy and unscientific; and the headlong propulsion of the plot, a vessel of commotion rather than of cogitation, allows no time for the mumbo-jumbo to sink in. The

axiom that would seem to apply, the axiom that would seem to have been mislaid, is that if an artist is going to do something so "original" — as opposed to something as well-worn and easily understood as a time machine or a teleportation device — he must take care to instruct, to lay out the rules and regulations, to show the viewer the ropes. Else it's wildest whimsy, freest fancy. It might just be possible that if the viewer were to sit through this a second or

third time, he might better come to know what's what. But a bloated running time of two and a half hours rather discourages that. On a first go-round, he's apt to find that the dream state decreases any caperfilm tension and reduces the goings-on to mere spectacle. You just sit and watch. You don't worry. You don't care. And under the influence of the key piece of strategy from Nolan's *The Dark Knight*, namely Hans Zimmer's unrelenting grinding throbbing pounding music, you might crave either an aspirin or an antidepressant. **The Kids Are All Right** — Carefully drawn family portrait in a rough, grainy, indifferent image, a "nontraditional" family let's swiftly say: two lesbian "Moms" or "Momses" with a biological son and daughter old enough to be curious as to the identity of their sperm-donor dad, who turns out to be a health-food restaurateur and organic gardener stuck in a sort of Sixties time warp: "Right on, right on.

Cool. I love lesbians." There is perhaps a whiff of self-consciousness in the initial laying-out of the family dynamic, but that's not as egregious as the audienceconsciousness of the plotty pot-stirring, the salacious lip-smacking, whereby the same-sex parents worry about the company their son keeps and wonder whether he's gay, and whereby, much worse, one of them succumbs to heterosexual temptation with, of all people, the laid-back sperm donor. All of the characters are nevertheless human and likable, even the one, believe it or not, played by Mark Ruffalo, even the teenagers, Mia Wasikowska and Josh Hutcherson. 

Liev Schreiber, Chiwetel Ejiofor, and Daniel Olbrychski all bring a compelling measure of commitment, and although Angelina Jolie in the title role of Evelyn Salt, ultra-modern Mata Hari, is so chiselled as to look out of place anywhere but in the funny pages, she reveals in the early going some becoming agitation and vulnerability. But then the

chase is on, and is thereafter never really off. Huff-puff, huff-puff. Much like the deep-cover Russkies who finally drop their disguises, but much sooner, the film stops pretending to be a legitimate espionage drama and reveals itself for the silly dilly that it is, our saline protagonist altogether transforming herself into a cookie-cutter Kick-Ass Chick. The aficionado's sense of betrayal and outrage cannot be less acute than Uncle Sam's. The mindless action fan on the other hand, or more precisely the mindless fan of mindless action, should have no complaints, except maybe that even he'll be a step ahead of the revelations, 2010.

The Secret in Their Eves — From Argentina, an old-fashioned slick manipulative commercial entertainment that took home the Oscar for foreign film, Firm-footed, smooth-surfaced, it centers on a retired public prosecutor struggling to write a novel on a nagging twenty-year-old case, the rape and murder of a newlywed schoolteacher. Generating suspense partly through its coyness as to the outcome of that case, the film shuttles between two time zones, then and now, plainly signalling the period by way of the relative blackness or grayness of the beard and hair of the leading man, Ricardo Darín, a masterly underplayer, a shrewd economizer, a dignified sublimator, once you get past his constant look of acid indigestion. In addition to Darín's tormented hero, the film is filled with well-drawn characters: his alluring but seemingly unattainable new boss (Soledad Villamil), still at work — now a judge — and still alluring twenty-odd years after the murder case; his erratic alcoholic colleague; the sarcastic tyrannical department head; the

self-aggrandizing policeman; the obsessed husband of the victim; and, when at length he turns up, the hateful perpetrator. The sturdy storyline braids together a number of complementary strands — the unravelling of a mystery, for starters, with flashes of psychological and philosophical insight worthy of Simenon; political corruption (but of course) and abuse of power; unrequited love; the regrets of advanced age — en route to a satisfying if unsurprising surprise ending. Directed by Juan José Campanella. 2009.

The Sorcerer's Apprentice — Goodand evil Medieval wizards engage in a battle of special effects in modern-day Manhattan. Only a self-professed "physics nerd." **Toy Story 3** — The second sequel adds little but minutes to the previous one, and for a computer-animated children's film it adds quite a lot of those, somewhere in the neighborhood of a hundred and five. In specific, the new 3-D adds little (but four dollars of admission) to the prevailing depth of field and openness of space. And the plot premise of the toys' boy going off to college, under orders from Mom to consign his childish things to either the attic or the trash, adds little to the torturous themes of change, aging, loss, death, that accrued from the prior premise of his going off to summer camp. Oh, the introduction of a Ken doll, a head of hair like a cowpat, at a hellish day-care center ("No one appreciates clothes here, Barbie"), adds some homo jokes suitable for the whole family, and the reprogramming of Buzz Lightyear to Spanish-language mode adds a benign Latin stereotype, but the de rigueur exhausting and exasperating finale (into the jaws of the landfill!) puts the capper on the general feeling of prolongation. With the voices of Tom Hanks, Tim Allen, Joan Cusack, Michael Keaton; directed by Lee Unkrich, 2010.

A struggling London actor (Douglas Henshall), selfdescribed as a "Marlon fucking Brando," sincerely regrets the infidelity and confession thereof — the confession perhaps a bit more than the infidelity — that came between him and his girlfriend of six years, who is now about to marry someone else. "If only I could go back," he muses aloud, a trite enough sentiment. But this expression of it conjures up, out of the fog, a pair of mystical junkmen who conduct the hero to his personal garbage dump of Things You Threw Away, and who send him back from there to a place in between the infidelity and the confession, with full memory of what happened last time. For all his resolve to straighten up and fly right, he is not at that point the most sympathetic of characters, and he becomes if anything even less so in his self-interested efforts to prevent his girlfriend from meeting and getting to know her future fiancé. The cleverness of the movie, slow to reveal itself, and nowhere hinted at in its twinkly Twilight Zone supernaturalism, now starts to assert itself. The girlfriend (Lena Headey) becomes less sympathetic herself, no longer an unaware victim but an active offender in her own right. And then another girl enters the equation. one with qualities the hero is slower to perceive than the viewer. (It's true that she wears glasses, but she is recognizable nevertheless as Penelope Cruz, and the hero perhaps loses a little more sympathy.) Each of the three principals, as well as a couple of lessers, emerges as a distinct individual, with his or her own place in the Grand Scheme, and the unseen figure of Fate heaves up as a larger presence than all the others put together, and something resembling wisdom creeps into the picture. The cleverness of the movie, to say it succinctly, is that the element of magic never denatures the element of life. Winter's Bone - Poky, low-key, some-

what parsimonious rural thriller with a simple set-up; if absent Dad, arrested for "cooking crank," the new moonshine of the Ozarks, fails to show for his court date, the family stands to lose the house he signed over for bond, and so it falls to his eldest daughter, not to the two young 'uns or the vegetative mother, to track him down, one redneck lowlife after another. The cloak of backwoods secrecy, to say nothing of the dialect, is so thick that it's difficult to determine where the threat might come from, or how, or why, and consequently difficult to share in the experience of the stoical seventeen-year-old who is at the center of every scene. We, far more than she, are in a figurative fog. But the atmosphere, even without literal fog, is also thick, no thanks to the greeny image or the arm-weary camerawork, and no need of the gratuitous skinning of a squirrel; and the authentic faces would appear to have been collected from the Depression photos of Dorothea Lange, including in a bit part a still recognizable Sheryl Lee, the murdered homecoming queen of Twin Peaks two decades earlier, and including, too, the angelic Jennifer Lawrence, who blends in well in the lead role and only occasionally looks as though she could be a spokesmodel for Pond's Cold Cream. Explaining the correct solution to Hunt and Peck is a bit tricky... Virtually everyone familiar with cryptorams will have had no difficulty in cracking the code and translating the instructions. The problem, if you had one, would have come with entering the letters on the keyboard. To tackle the puzzle, you had to know the difference between sight typing and touch typing.

In sight typing, all one has for reference is the letter on the key. To type "R." for example, you'd simply hunt for it on the board, peck at it, and come up with an "N" (which is the correct solution in the code). Many puzzlers will have placed the "N" where the "R" is normally found on the typrewriter. But, of course, it's impossible to both sight type and replicate the code in this fashion.

Of the nearly 20,000 letters received in response to this puzzle prior to its publication in book form, approximately half were wrong. Don't feel so bad.







 In the midst of World Cup fever, readers might have missed Germany's win over host Barbados in June for the Woz Challenge Cup, following an eight-team polo tournament with players not on horses but Segways. The sport is said to have been created by Apple cofounder Steve Wozniak, whose Silicon Valley Aftershocks competed again this year in Barbados (but last won the contest in 2007). Wozniak told ESPN.com that his polo skills are fading, but the San Jose Mercury News reported in May that Woz's fearlessness on the Segway seems hardly diminished. (The Mercury News report, on the Aftershocks' local, nerd-populated league, described the players as "the pudgy and the pale" and "geek chic.")

# **The Continuing Crisis**

- The Monrovia (Calif.) High School girls' track team had just been defeated for first place in the last event of the April league-championship meet — by a record-setting pole vault by South Pasadena High School's Robin Laird, edging her team over Monrovia, 66-61. But then Monrovia coach Mike Knowles noticed that Laird was wearing a flimsy string "friendship" bracelet, thus violating a national high school athletics jewelry rule. He notified offi-

cials, who were forced to disqualify Laird and declare Monrovia the champion, 65-62. "This is my 30th year coaching track," Knowles said later. "I know a lot of rules and regulations."

- Kathy Myers, 41, of Niles, Mich., who, suffering an increasingly painful shoulder injury, has been turned away from emergency rooms because the condition was not life-threatening. In June, as a last resort, she took a gun and shot herself in the shoulder, hoping for a wound serious enough for ER treatment. Alas, she missed major arteries and bones and was again sent home, except with even more pain.

- Britain's Countess of Wemyss and March, now 67, is a hands-on manager-fundraiser for the Beckley Trust - UK's leading advocacy organization for legalizing marijuana, according to an April profile by the Daily Mail. However, she has not forsaken an earlier psychotropic-promoting campaign. In her early 20s, when she was Amanda Feilding, she extolled the virtues of trepanation (to "broaden...awareness" by increasing the oxygen in the brain, directly, by drilling a hole in one's head). Feilding's first boyfriend wrote the book on the process (Bore Hole), and her husband, the flamboyant 13th Earl of Wemyss, has also been trepanned. The countess still expresses hope that the National Health Service will eventually cover trepanning.

# **Great Expectorations**

- Last year, 51 New York City bus drivers took a total of 3200 days of paid leave to "heal" over the single workplace "injury" of being spit on by passengers. (Thirty-two other spit-upon drivers did not request leave.) An official with the Transport Workers Union called spitting "physically and psychologically traumatic" and requiring "recuperat[ion]."

The prominent Howrah bridge in Calcutta, India, has become a serious safety risk, according to a May report for the Calcutta Port Trust, because the steel hoods protecting the pillars holding up the bridge have been thinned by 50 percent in recent years. Engineers believe the corrosion has been caused almost entirely by the chemicals in *gutkha*, the popular chewing tobacco/herb concoction, which produces expectorants routinely hocked onto the bridge by the 500,000 pedestrians who cross it every day.

# **Fine Points of the Law**

 Inventor Jiro Takashima, 75, maintains that his Pro-State massager is a serious medical device (retailing for about \$80), but his daughter-partner Amy Sung, 35, simultaneously markets it as a prostate sex toy called the Aneros at adult novelty stores (retailing for about \$50).

According to a June Houston Chronicle report, Takashima's booth at medical conventions is popular, but at sex expos, he and his daughter are "rock stars." However, since the Pro-State/ Aneros was intended as a medical device, competing sex-toy makers have felt free to copy Aneros' design, and Takashima's lawsuit to stop them is now before a federal court in Houston.

# The District(s) of Calamity

- Vying in recent years with Washington, D.C., as the nation's "district of calamity" is Detroit, whose previous mayor, Kwame Kilpatrick, was in May ordered to prison to serve  $1^{1/2}$ to 5 years after repeatedly violating his probation on his conviction for obstruction of justice. In June, Detroit's school board president Otis Mathis resigned under fire, then tried to unresign by offering to cure himself of the behavior that started his downfall; specifically, Mathis's touching and fondling himself during several one-on-one meetings with the school system's general superintendent, Teresa Gueyser.




