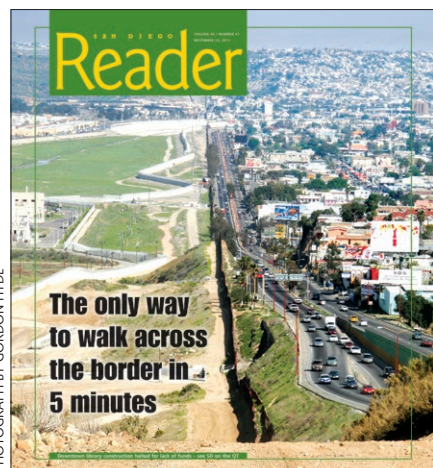

## UNDER THE RADAR

### Of palm trees and prison guards

An El Cajon firm headed by former Democratic state senator **Steve Peace** has been raking in big bucks from the California Correctional Peace Officers Association. According to state campaign finance disclosure records, J.S. Peace & Associates reported getting \$60,000 from the public employees union in January, another \$60,000 in March, and \$40,000 in May, for a total of \$160,000 during the first six months of this year. The purpose of the expense was reported as campaign consulting. Peace, onetime director of finance for ousted Democratic governor **Gray Davis**, has enjoyed long and friendly relations with the state prison guards, who have been major backers of his non-profit California Independent Voter Project, a group that played a key role in getting voters to approve the state's new nonpartisan primary system and each fall conducts a controversial shindig on Maui for lobbyists and members of the California legislature. Besides the prison union, event bankrollers reportedly have included Southern California Edison, big tobacco's Altria, Pacific Gas and Electric, the California Beer and Beverage Distributors, Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America, and Chevron.

Peace's group uses the corporate and union cash to pick up the tab for the politicians, some of whom have subsequently reimbursed the organization after newspaper exposés focused public attention on the practice. This year the confab drew more media attention than usual, with the *Sacramento Bee* editorializing, "As expected, these lawmakers are attempting to dismiss any suggestion they will be inappropriately influenced by hanging out at the beach, pool and bar by interests that have a multimillion-dollar stake in legislative decisions.... Our view is: Lawmakers already have plenty of opportunity to mingle with experts and special interests in Sacramento. They don't need to do it in Maui."

As a nonprofit rather than a political committee, Peace's project is not legally required to reveal its contributors' names and as a result keeps most financial details to itself. According to its latest federal disclosure, filed with the Internal Revenue Service on July 19 and covering 2010, the organization received a total of

\$2,166,875 in contributions and grants. It had total expenses of \$2,807,253. **David Takashima**, onetime Peace chief of staff and a former director of government affairs for utility giant Pacific Gas and Electric, is president and chief executive.

Peace is chairman of the board, which includes **Linda Mitrovich**, sister-in-law of City Club of San Diego president **George Mitrovich**.

Back in 2004, controversy arose when it was revealed that two companies owned by Linda and her husband **Dan** received \$859,000 from the Metropolitan Water District to promote its interests in San Diego, where sentiment was running high against L.A.'s strings on the local water supply, the *Los Angeles Times* reported in August 2004.

George Mitrovich got \$145,000 from the agency for a similar purpose, according to the *Times*.

The voter project board also includes **Jeff Marston**, the San Diego lobbyist and public relations man who was once a Republican assemblyman.

The most recent City disclosure for his firm, Marston + Marston, dated October 31, shows that the company has been paid \$4000 by FinWater Advisors, LLC, of Denver, Colorado, to lobby for "approval of [a] pilot program" for a "San Diego entertainment district."

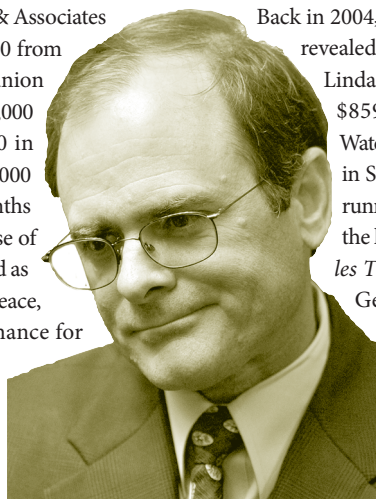
As described on FinWater's website, the project would allow installation of massive Times Square-style billboards in a part of downtown, with a generous cut of the revenue reserved for the City and property owners. According to its presentation, FinWater hopes to "create a public-private partnership to develop the legal/political environment to make the district a reality." Marston's wife, a partner in her husband's lobbying business, is listed as giving \$250 to GOP assemblyman and San Diego mayoral candidate **Nathan Fletcher**.

In separate phone interviews last week, both Marston and FinWater principal **David Ehrlich** emphasized the project's potential to generate major financial support

for revitalization and arts projects in what is currently a neglected area north of Broadway.

Another lobbyist on Peace's board is secretary and treasurer **Daniel Howle**, the Sacramento-based director of public affairs for Lilly USA, a subsidiary of the multinational pharmaceutical firm. According to the voter project's 2010 disclosure, Howle's spouse received a \$57,000 "fix fee contract" from the nonprofit to "arrange, organize and produce" Peace's

## U-T Probably Went Cheap Again

The market for metropolitan daily newspapers is stone cold. Experts are convinced that daily newspapers, even those

with a promising online presence, are becoming obsolete. That suggests that the *Union-Tribune*, which was sold to hotelier Doug Manchester on November 17, went cheap again.

Five or six years ago, the U-T was worth a billion dollars. Platinum Equity of Beverly Hills bought the paper in 2009 for between \$35 million and \$52 million, according to reliable estimates. Manchester claims he paid more than \$110 million, which would still probably be below the value of the real estate. Papa Doug's partner John Lynch publicly stated he wants editorial fluff. That could wallop circulation. It's possible the U-T will become the first major metro paper to drop the print edition and go strictly online — departing its Mission Valley headquarters in the process so Manchester can tear it down. Again, that's speculation.

Deep doubts about the future of metropolitan daily newspapers pervade the financial community, and they are reflected in stock prices of publicly owned newspaper chains. Prices

plunged in 2008 and 2009, and then they snapped back as the overall market rallied. But now they are nearing those recessionary lows.

The numbers tell the story. According to the Newspaper Association of America, industry ad revenue has dropped every quarter since the third period of 2006. Newspaper revenues have plunged about 50 percent since then. Adjusted for inflation, newspaper advertising is at about the same level as 50 years ago. Ad revenue per capita is down 63 percent from its all-time high in 1988. Revenue from classified advertising, which was once a major profit center, last year was one-fourth what it was in the year 2000, according to Pew Research Center.

"People are abandoning newspapers, and for that reason you should sell all your newspaper stocks," says a columnist for *TheStreet*.

"More readers choose to get news free online, thereby making the print-advertising model increasingly irrelevant," says *Zacks*.

Stock prices reflect such views. In 2004, you could

have paid \$40.01 a share for Lee Enterprises, which owns 49 dailies (including the *North County Times*) and 300 weeklies. By March of 2009, that price was down to 28 cents. Then it rose to \$4.24 last year; as of last Friday, it was back down to 63 cents. Gannett, the largest newspaper chain, fetched \$91.38 in 2004. It got as low as \$1.85 in early 2009, bounced back to \$19.69 last year, and Friday was down to \$10.99. McClatchy, which owns several dailies, including the *Miami Herald*, sold for as high as \$63 in March of 2005, dropped to 9 cents in early 2009, bounced back to \$5.35 last year but on Friday was down to \$1.15. The *New York Times*, which owns the *Boston Globe* and 16 other dailies, sold for \$53 in 2003, sank to \$3.44 in 2009, rebounded to \$14.87 last year, and Friday was back to \$7.19.

Advertising on newspapers' internet sites is now about 14 percent of total revenue. It had been growing robustly but was wallowed by the Great Recession. According to Pew, newspapers' online revenue was \$3.17 billion in 2007, plunged in 2008, and only made it back to \$3.04 billion in 2010. There is a general agreement that online represents the future, but internet profits are anemic. The papers would like to charge for their online service, but people can get so much online news for free. Many

## Pride and Prejudice

**P**laywright Kirsten Greenidge does not use the restroom during intermission when her plays are performed. “I get so wary about what I’m going to overhear,” she admits. “You have no voice in that situation. You can’t pick a fight in the restroom.”

This policy may have proven sound during the recent run of her controversial play *Milk Like Sugar*, at the La Jolla Playhouse from late August through Septem-

ber 25.

“During previews, before the play even opened,” Greenidge says, “[the Playhouse] started getting emails from people who were concerned about stereotypes and black characters.”

In 2008, the La Jolla Playhouse and Theater Masters in Aspen, Colorado, co-

commissioned Greenidge to write a play. Together, the two institutions sent her to the Aspen Ideas Festival, where she participated in a week of seminars to generate ideas for the play. From 2009 to 2011, Greenidge traveled back and forth between Boston (where she resides) and New York to workshop the play, discussing choices she’d made, tweaking scenes, and developing characters, all of whom are, like herself, black.

In late August of this year, *Milk Like Sugar* premiered onstage at La Jolla Playhouse.

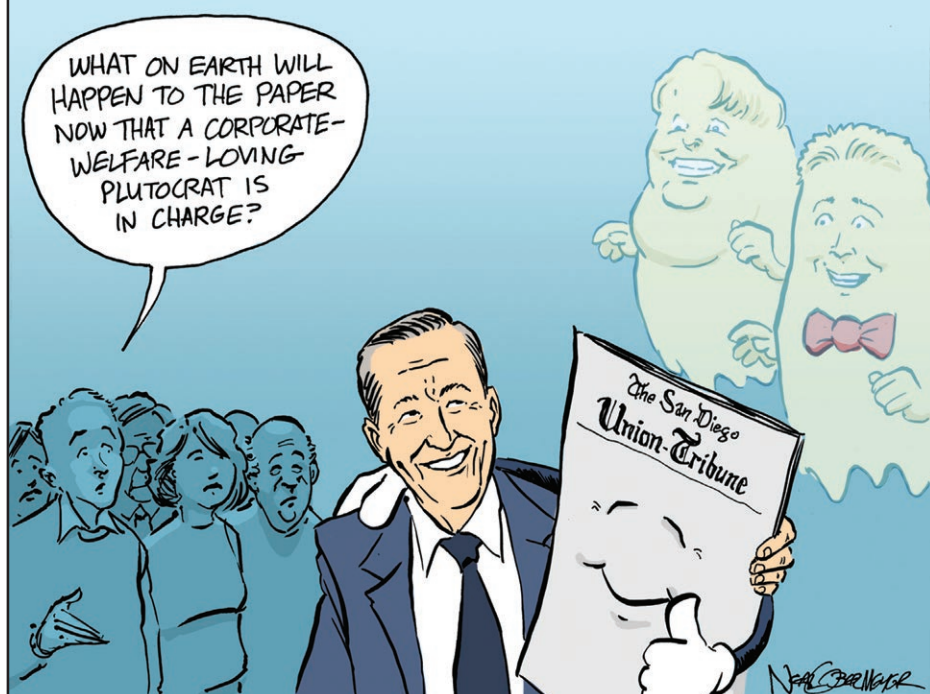

“Like all teenagers, 16-year-old Annie and her friends crave the hottest designer phones, handbags and fashion. But their prospects for the good life seem limited in the dead-end town they call home. When the girls decide to create their own future by entering into a pregnancy pact, Annie is confronted with the challenge of choosing between the safety of the life she knows and the danger of the life she desires.”

Greenidge says she and the actors discussed the idea of how these young, black urban characters would be perceived by the Playhouse’s mostly white, older, affluent audience. And although Playhouse managing director Michael Rosenberg says complaints came from an ethnically diverse range of audience members, it became clear that some of the more vocal critics were from the black community.

On September 8, the *San Diego Voice and Viewpoint* published a letter to the editor in which 73-year-old Dr. Dorothy Smith, the first African-American woman to be elected to public office in the city of San Diego (serving twice as president of San Diego Unified’s school board), wrote, “This play does not mirror life in the Black communities. It is filled with the kind of stereotypes that some White people like to perpetuate regarding Black people.”

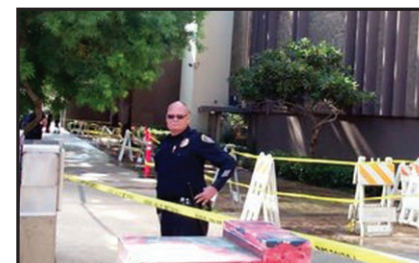
Kenney says that councilmembers David Alvarez and Tony Young have been somewhat sympathetic toward the protesters, but both have failed to provide the first of five signatures

Last night at around 2 a.m., reports began circulating that another raid of the group’s overnight camp was under way. After twice being removed from the plaza in the past month, police have prevented the group from entering the area with personal property,

Dad strained to turn his head fully toward me. Through the murk that enshrouded him, he found a way to end my prattling. “I can’t think about reading anything else right now, I’ve got to finish a book for my club this month, and I haven’t even started it.”

Shortly after we arrived at his apartment, Dad was attempting to situate himself as comfortably as possible in his recliner when I jerked him out of his fog, once again shouting, “That’s it! That’s the book I was telling you about!” It turned out the book I’d been raving about in the car — the latest tale by Tana French — was the same book Dad had on loan from the library to read for his book club. Because the club comprises Kevin’s congregation in a church that believes in things like fate, it didn’t surprise me when Nancy, upon hearing the story, concluded that I must attend the next meeting.

After a healthy and delicious dinner prepared by Kevin’s husband Tim and

a lively, provocative discussion about the book, Kevin, aka “Rev Kev,” volunteered some information about his relationship with me to his friend Kate: “You know, I’ve known Barb since she was 19. We used to work together. I was her supervisor.”

“It’s true,” I said in answer to Kate’s disbelieving expression. “Before he was a reverend, he was my boss.”

“Nineteen,” Kevin said, shaking his head. “Isn’t it weird how things come together?” I nodded. “Everyone loved Barb,” Kevin said to Kate. I feigned humility and even offered up a small protest before I agreed that, “Yeah, I was pretty likeable.”

I turned to Kate now as I explained, “See, I was a trainer, and Kevin was the training manager in the call center. Because some of my training classes went as late as 11 p.m., I would down a Mountain Dew and two Excedrin to perk me up.”

“You hated me,” he said.

“It’s true. On your first day, I took bets

in the office for how long you’d last there.” “But then you liked me.”

“Again, it’s true. I liked you even though you tortured me.” I told Kate how Kevin used to send me emails with clip-art images of cats (crude pre-LOL cat silhouettes) along with a message: “Die, Ralph. Die.” Ralph was the name of my pet rat at the time.

“Your man of God here,” I said to Kate, “your channel to the universe wanted one

of God’s creatures, my beloved companion, to die.” Kevin laughed. “I used to ask him what his boss in the sky would think of his little death wishes.” I looked at Kevin. “Did you ever think, back then, that this smart-mouthed teenager

would end up at your house years later in a book club? Isn’t it crazy?”

Kevin and I stood across from each other, shaking our heads in amused disbelief at how our lives had interwoven since we first met. First he was my boss, and then, without any involvement on my behalf, he became my father’s minister and motorcycle riding buddy. There was nothing we could say that could describe the awe that hung in the air between us. A preacher and a writer, each at a rare loss for words, marveling in silence at who we’d been, who we were now, and everything in between. ■

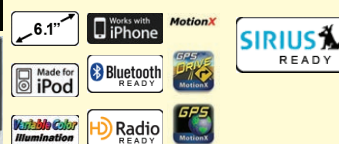

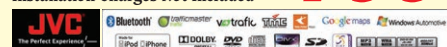

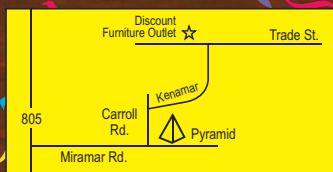

If *Lulu* is all just an inside joke, it's hilarious. But if not, it's one of the oddest collaborations in memory, recent or otherwise, and quite a misfire. Though if Leonard Cohen and Mastodon put out a release, I will be all ears.

The setting at the Copley Symphony Hall is not unlike Leonard Cohen himself. With its stained-glass windows and walls of intricately sculpted marble, the building seems as though it should house sermons rather than symphonies. But at the center of the basilican architecture lies the stage itself, lit in smokey reds and swanky purples that [seem to belong more] in a brothel than a cathedral. The juxtaposition of the sacred and the profane has long been a tenet of Cohen's distinguished career, which has been defined as much by prayer songs like "If It Be Your Will" as by the lurid recounting of trysts with Janis Joplin... Providing a sharp contrast to the often pitch-black poetry of his lyrics, Cohen grinned and joked around with the crowd. "The last time I was on this stage was fourteen or fifteen years ago," he deadpanned. "I was sixty then, just a kid with a crazy dream."

Kris Towne (vocals, guitar) [on his influences]: Modest Mouse — *The Moon and Antarctica*: I was too young (and too far away) for the live show heyday of Modest Mouse. I'd like to believe in that basement-show magic people talk about, but I never got to experience it. What I got was an introduction to MM with the album *The Moon and Antarctica*... It had already been heralded by the indie world — and, for the first time, parts of the mainstream world — as cool. And I loved it! That was followed by ob-

session over the record... followed by a general disappointment in pretty much everything the band has done since. Which is what happens when you obsess over one record from a great band. I caught them on their bridge between the indie world and the mainstream, and loved every minute of it. It was a point in their career and music where everything came together in a magical way; big ideas, big studio, HUGE label and distribution, all for the very first time in their career. Those combinations will probably never happen again for a band to create the same kind of sound.

Following the theft of his musical equipment during a 2005 tour with Via Satellite, Andrews returned to San Diego and began to write music on the only instrument he had left: an acoustic guitar. Though initially a departure for the electronically-inclined artist, those tender, finger-picked songs eventually became the gorgeous 2008 album *Only Mirrors*, and so was born Drew Andrews' solo career.

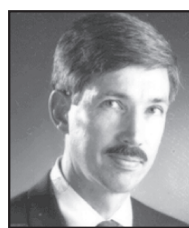

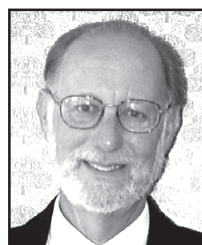

## Put It on a Postcard!

*San Diego Selects Unfinished Central Library as City's Official "Iconic Image"*

*"When you've got weather like this..."*

Much has been made over the proposal to erect a pair of 500-foot titanium rabbit ears at the end of the Midway Museum pier and the possibility that such a project could eventually become a symbol of San Diego — something akin to the Eiffel Tower in Paris or Sydney's famous opera house.

But today, the San Diego City Council voted unanimously to instead adopt the unfinished new Central Library as the official image of America's Finest-Weather City.

Council president pro tem Kevin Faulconer explained the council's decision: "By abandoning an ambitious public

project that was somehow begun before the funds were in place to finish it, we feel we are creating a fitting monument to this city's pattern of governance. By abandoning a building, we honor the fact that San Diego is about outdoor living at its finest. By abandoning a library, we are honoring our city's refreshingly unintellectual character. And by walking away now, we save the city millions of dollars, which is important in these tight economic times."

Concluded Faulconer, "Maybe we'll let some of those graffiti kids do some murals of Shamu or a koala bear. You know, give it that final touch."

## UCSD Responds to Cheating Report: "We Prefer to Think of It as 'Preparing Students for Success.'"

*UCSD Dept. of Graduate Admissions: "If by 'cheating,' you mean 'optimizing performance,' then I'm not sure why we're having this conversation."*

*"Anyone who has a problem with appropriating someone else's work as their own has obviously never been on the internet."*

SNORTING DISMISSIVELY AMONG THE EUCALYPTUS GROVES, UCSD CAMPUS — "Look," says UCSD director of graduate school admissions Roger Harkness, "China isn't getting ahead in the tech wars by doing their own R&D, okay? Everybody knows that. Investment bankers aren't buying private islands

because they work hard and keep their noses clean. Kennedy didn't become president by insisting that every voter in Chicago had to be alive. And Captain James T. Kirk didn't beat the Kobayashi Maru scenario by coloring inside the lines. You want to win? You have to be creative. There will always be haters who call that kind of behavior cheating. But frankly, that kind of above-the-fray moral snootery is a luxury that today's college student simply cannot afford."

Harkness was responding to a recent report authored by UCSD physics faculty member Michael G. Anderson and Christine Killora, an admissions counselor at the University of San Diego, which found that "the rate of cheating [at UCSD] is assumed to be much higher than what is officially reported and is thus considered



a significant problem at the University."

"Anderson is a tightass from way back," thundered Harkness. "He's welcome to do his little experiments in 'gotcha' class-management — he's got tenure, he can do what he wants. But can you honestly expect someone who's had the same cushy job for 30 years to understand today's academic job market — let alone the larger, real-world job market? I mean, I'm sure there are a lot of old-school biology teachers who got their undies in a bunch when *The Origin of Species* was published, but guess what? Times change."

Apparently so. Harkness says that he plans to turn Anderson's findings to his own advantage. "We're working on a campaign right now: 'UCSD: We Know What It Takes.'"

## Stopping the Brown Tide

*Critics Say Plan to Rebuild U.S.-Mexico Pacific Ocean Border Fence Will Do Little to Stop Influx of Invasive Brown Kelp*

*"A six-inch gap is more than enough room for these buggers to slip through and take up spots once held by American kelp beds."*

The United States Border Patrol today announced plans to rebuild the "surf fence" that marks the beach border between the United States and Mexico and extends some 300 feet into the Pacific Ocean. The fence will be made from steel poles set six inches apart, and is designed to last for some 30 years. But according to Carl "Crusty" McCracken, president of Northern Oceanographic Mexican Abatement Society (NO-MAS), the fence will do little to ease the threat posed by "invasive Mexicans of the underwater variety."

Says McCracken, "According to a recent article in *Botanica Marina*, a scientific-political journal

dedicated to tracking the encroachment of invasive species into American waters, '*Undaria pinnatifida*, a laminarian kelp (Phaeophyta)...has been introduced recently to the coast of Southern

California (USA). We present the first record of this invasive species on the Mexican Pacific coast and show the current southern limit along the Pacific coast of North America. The colonization of the Pacific coast of North America by this invasive species is still occurring, and its distributional range is expanding.' Now, *Undaria pinnatifida* is 50 cm long, tops, and it can easily slip between those fence poles. I've said it before, and I'll say it again: until we have a safe and secure border net, America and her native flora will remain under attack."

"In closing, please know that everyone here at *Vanity Fair* hates your little crap town and looks forward to the day when California south of Los Angeles slides into the sea."

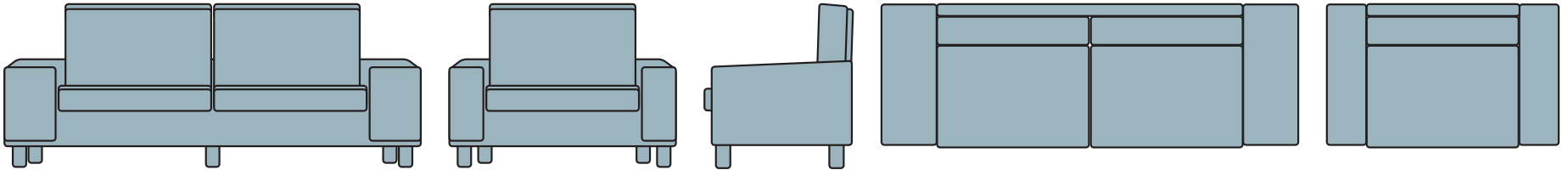

### Rotten to the Bone



*Penn State is a plantation, and JoePa was the owner.*

There is a continental stench coming out of Penn State. Step back, consider yourself a neutral observer with no stake in the scandal. Let's say you knew there was an eyewitness to the (alleged) rape of a child in the Penn State football building. Let's say the (alleged) rape was performed by a former defensive coordinator, someone who had been a coach at Penn State for 31 years who "retired" in 1999 as coach emeritus. Let's say he was given an office on campus and access to the university's football facilities. Finally, let's say, 34 years ago he founded a statewide charity for troubled young boys, boys he escorted around campus, to Penn State football games, and university social events.

What are you going to do, blame the university? Penn State dealt with Jerry Sandusky harshly after administrators learned of his (alleged) 2002 rape of a ten-year-old boy in the Lasch Football Building. Sandusky was ordered not to bring children from the Second Mile (his charity) into the football building. Not a problem, lots of other buildings around, and his company, Sandusky Associates, continued to use a Penn State satellite campus until at least 2008.

Time passes. Not letting up for a second, Penn State banned Sandusky from campus on November 6, 2011, the day after he was arrested on 40 counts of sex crimes against young boys.

Penn State is a plantation, and JoePa was the owner. If you're a football coach you keep your bags packed. The day you're hired is one day closer to the day you're going to be fired. Except at Penn State. The new interim head coach is Tom Bradley. He played for Penn State in 1977 and 1978, was a graduate assistant for the football team in 1979, hired as a coach in 1980. He worked under Sandusky coaching defensive backs, linebackers, defensive ends, and special

teams. He's been part of the Penn State football staff for 32 years.

Dick Anderson was a tight end and defensive end at Penn State from 1960 to 1962 and a graduate assistant in 1963. He was the Penn State offensive line coach from 1973 to 1983, then coached Rutgers, then returned to Penn State in 1990 as offensive line coach and quarterbacks coach. Thirty-four years.

Galen Hall is the offensive coordinator for Penn State. He played quarterback for Penn State in 1960 and '61. He had a short pro career, coached for Oklahoma and Florida, returned to Penn State in 2004 as offensive coordinator and running backs coach. Seven years.

Larry Johnson is a defensive line/special teams coach and has been on staff since 1996. His son was a wide receiver at Penn State. Fifteen years.

Bill Kenney coaches offensive tackles and tight ends. He was a Penn State graduate assistant in 1988 and on staff since 1989. Twenty-three years.

Jay Paterno, Joe's son, was a reserve quarterback from Penn State in 1990 and on the Penn State coaching staff since 1995 (tight ends, recruiting coordinator, quarterbacks). Sixteen years.

John Thomas is the strength and conditioning coach for Penn State. Nineteen years.

Ron Vanderlinden, linebackers coach, has been on staff since 2000. Eleven years.

Kermit Buggs is the safeties coach, has been on staff as a graduate student or coach since 2003. Eight years.

You have now seen the entire Penn State football coaching staff as listed on their web page. Mike McQueary (nine years), the child-rapist eyewitness and wide receivers/recruiting coordinator is still on the payroll but not mentioned on Penn State's web page.

Nobody who is smart enough to read this sentence can possibly believe these people didn't know what was going on. How many times did one or all of them see or hear of Sandusky showering with prepubescent boys? How many times did one or all of them see or hear about a naked Sandusky lathering up boys and "horsing around" in the shower? How many times did one or all of them see or hear about Sandusky putting his hand on a boy's thigh and on and on?

Here's the real question: why in the hell is Penn State still playing football? It's not that this is a difficult moral choice. Penn State should forfeit games for the rest of the season. Then they should fire/let go/resign everybody in and connected to the football department. Then, to be more than fair, let those who wish to reapply for their jobs do so with the understanding that they would be vetted to the tits. Same with the trustees and administrators.

Instead, the cover-up continues and the same people are coaching. It is sickening, and here's the part that is personally offensive: these "coaches" are turning the rest of us into their accomplices.

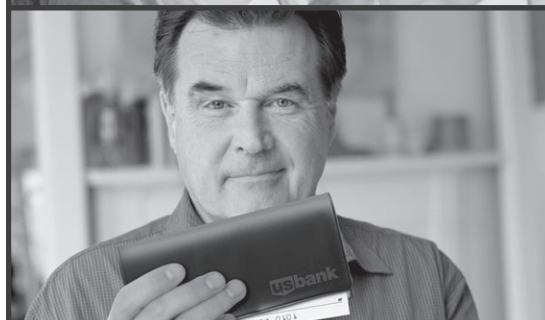

## The sarge on the drum kit announced loudly, "Gross-out contest!" which was met with unanimous cheers around the club.

So, Thanksgiving. I'm guessing I'll have my son bunking here, and I don't know how to roast a turkey. Going out to dinner sounds like unnecessary stress. I'll see if he will go for a roasted chicken — that's in my repertoire — with some good side dishes, dessert, and a DVD or two. Japanese anime is what he likes. Not me. It won't matter, though. I'll be asleep on the Barcalounger after stuffing my gob.

Still, as this holiday approaches, I feel compelled to recall Thanksgivings past. Family gatherings come to mind. At the home of my Italian relatives, the order of the day would invariably involve too much food and too much yelling, as if my aunt, uncle, grandmother, etc. were cheating each other at a streetside fish market. Going to a Blackhawks game — viewing broken bones and blood drawn — would have been more restful.

As a kid in our home, Thanksgiving would be equally chaotic, an occasion to take turns upbraiding each other: first from Mommy dearest, then my dad trying to keep the peace as my seven siblings took their cue to insult each other. This would have been true at any dinner during the year. But somehow, when called upon to list that which we were grateful for, this would trigger my sister's sense of license to accuse my three brothers and me of cruel and unusual punishment — largely accurate. This would segue into trivia such as, "John was picking his nose in church," or, "Paul was masturbating when I went into his room to help him with his homework."

"Bullshit!" Paul would respond, "You never helped me with my homework in your life."

One of my most memorable Thanksgivings was at Fort Ord. I was with a country/Top 40 band with a name that should have given us all diabetes: Misty Mountain and Peggy, featuring (I'm not kidding) "Little Peggy Parsley" from Casper, Wyoming. Our first gig was actually in Casper in an after-hours club, mostly for truckers. We played behind a chicken-wire fence à la the Blues Brothers. During our rendition of "Fortunate Son," by Creedence Clearwater, an ashtray was thrown at the stage accompanied by the shout, "Take that shit back to Jew York!"

But I digress. Thanksgiving at Fort Ord was a gig at the officers' club, and it was "Bring-Your-Sergeant Thanksgiving." The 50-cent whiskey and 35-cent beer flowed across the bar in a rapid stream.

By the beginning of our third set, many of the officers and their wives had left after an "out-standing" meal. ("Outstanding" seemed to be a favorite word around every officers' club we played, most of them in all those rectangular states.) The room was left with maybe two dozen drunken sergeants. Three of them charged the stage and seized our instruments. There wasn't a damned thing

we could do about it. The sarge on the drum kit announced loudly, "Gross-out contest!" which was met with unanimous cheers around the club.

The noncom band was creating a hellish noise comprising much Telecaster feedback, the drums and cymbals imitating the clangor of 50-gallon drums filled with household appliances and broken glass tumbling down a flight of



stairs.

The guy bashing away at my Fender bass — sounding like a barrage of wet rags hitting a hollow wall, only at high volume — dropped his pants. The Telecaster continued to screech at volume ten like an army of fighting cats. The guy holding that guitar unzipped himself and took a leak on a potted palm at the corner of the stage. This was nothing. The sergeants at the bar, on the dance floor, and at tables were now performing unnatural acts with leftover dinner items, their body parts, and those of their mates. I refuse to describe this in any more detail, and besides, I was keeping a close eye on my bass. What infuriated our drummer was the guy who had hijacked his kit, freed his unit from his pants, and began pounding his member on the snare, screaming, "I'm the fuggin' grossest!" Repeating this several times.

Someone pulled the plug on the electricity onstage and the room erupted with MPs and nightsticks. There were several fistfights. Handcuffs and nightsticks were produced as we smuggled our equipment out the side door. I'll never know what happened to those NCOs, and we never got to eat.

**‘Y**ou’ll have to do without the bourbon-cherry-apple pie,” I told Patrick. “This year, I’m bringing a ready-made pumpkin pie.”

A few days later, after making the store rounds, Patrick and I sat down with friend Bernice for some pie nibbling.

The Vons pumpkin pie (\$2.99 for 18 ounces) looked sickly. “Flavorless, white, gummy crust,” said Bernice.

“Light on the pumpkin flavor,” added Pat.

Vons’ other pie offering won the marketing award: ESP (“Extra Special Pie”) pumpkin pie (\$4.99 for 22 ounces). “We know you want this pie,” stated the pie box. The marketing text caught Bernice’s eye.

“59 million pies are eaten each Thanksgiving” she read, “and the average American eats six slices of pumpkin pie each year.

“In early times,” she continued, “the pumpkin was used as crust for pies, not for filling.” “Pumpkins are fruits, not vegetables.” “Pumpkins are 90% water.”

“Can we move past the pumpkin trivia and back to the eating?” asked Patrick.

I passed around a slice of ESP pie. “A little more spice, more dense filling...it’s passable, but I’m not sure it’s ‘extra special,’” laughed Pat.

The Sprouts pumpkin pie did not fare as well (\$2.99 for 24 ounces). “So processed, the texture is slippery in the mouth, like baby food,” said Bernice. “And the crust is a little bitter.”

“Kudos for the crust on this one — it looks like a sunflower,” said Bernice about the Trader Joe’s pumpkin pie (\$4.99 for 24 ounces). “I can pick out individual spices in the filling: cinnamon, ginger.”

“It’s too sweet and too spiced for my taste,” said Patrick.

Albertsons wasn’t selling a pumpkin pie when I popped in, but they did have a Harvest sweet-potato pie (\$4.99 for 24 ounces). “The thickest of all the pie fillings and a flaky crust,” observed Bernice. “This would be an okay substitute. Your guests would know it’s not a pumpkin pie, but it would fill the spicy, squashy dessert needs.”

“The filling tastes candied to me,” said Patrick. “You would have to serve this with an unsweetened cream.”

The Ralphs 8-inch pumpkin pie (\$4.99 for 22 ounces) ranked at the bottom of our ten-pie testing. “The crust feels like rubber and tastes like cardboard,” said Bernice.

“And the filling has so much cinnamon I can feel it up in my sinuses.”

“The texture is like gelatinous chicken fat,” laughed Patrick, shaking a clump of pie filling.

Ralphs’ other pie: the Jessie Lord pumpkin pie (\$5.99 for 24 ounces) was a no-sugar-added Splenda dessert. “It’s got that melt-away sugar-free sweetness, no sugary granule texture. It makes me think squash baby food,” said Bernice.

“Gloppy texture, and the flavors are not integrated,” added Patrick. “First you’re hit with sweetness, followed by overpowering pumpkin.”

Another non-keeper: the Fabe’s Bakery gluten-free pumpkin pie from Whole Foods (\$7.69 for 10 ounces). “The crust tastes like old french fries,” grimaced Bernice. “And the filling is too runny.”

“Tastes like ginger snaps, not pumpkin pie,” agreed Patrick.

Whole Foods’ other pumpkin offering was the winner of the evening (\$9.99, 20-ounce 9-inch). “A substantial lip on this crust...and I can actually taste the butter in it,” said Bernice.

“Something about cloves immediately makes you think of the holidays,” smiled Patrick. “The clove in this puts it into its own class.”

The whopping 58-ounce pumpkin pie from Costco was the other winner (\$5.99). “The crust looks homemade,” said Patrick. “A dark, scalloped crust with a rich caramel hint in the filling. I could eat this without slathering it in cream. And after enough wine and tryptophan, I’d have no idea it wasn’t homemade.”

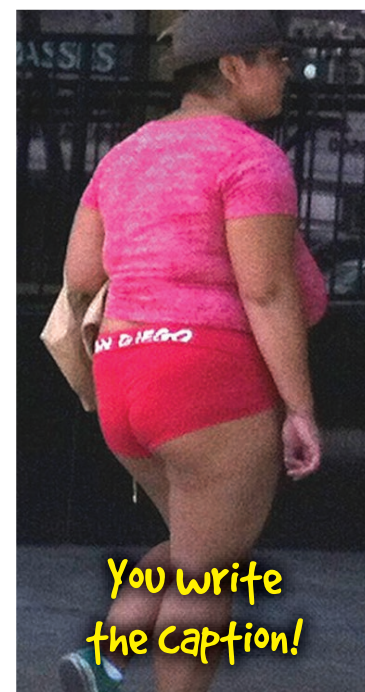

# The only way to walk across the border in 5 minutes

**It is with some reluctance that I write about my recent acquisition of the SENTRI border-crossing card because, well, I got a good thing going.**

After years of standing for hours in that long, sinuous pedestrian line that huffs and puffs, lurches and shuffles north from the U.S. border station at San Ysidro, I finally applied for a SENTRI card. The acronym stands for Secure Electronic Network for Travelers Rapid Inspection.

I applied because the crossing had become increasingly intolerable. Some 18,000 pedestrians go into Tijuana each day, and the line, bad as it whenever you cross, is especially inchoate and disorganized during maximum-traffic hours. Annually, 6.5 million people cross the border on foot, and with a population that size, there are bound to be problems. Fights break out. Social civility disintegrates. As a U.S. citizen who lives in TJ, I was developing a phobia, part depression, part anxiety — a choked-back nausea coupled with the weariness that Sisyphean futility inevitably brings — about getting back into California, something I needed to do regularly to keep on working.

Often, the length of the line

did not correspond to the wait, and that way lies madness. There was no foolproof formula for ascertaining an ideal time to cross. A friend of mine postulated that the secret lay in the inspectors' hands; they could speed or slow the movement of the line on a whim. But who knows?

Not long ago, while waiting, I overheard a middle-aged American tourist inquire of a Mexican police officer, who was trying to keep order in the crowd, as to the location of the end of the line for Americans wishing to return to the U.S. The officer pointed several blocks away. The American found it astonishing that there was not a special line to accommodate him; he was, by God, an American citizen. I tried to reassure him, telling him that the wait shouldn't take more than an hour and a half. He looked off into the distance, his face the color of pease porridge.

Another time, a fellow in his late 60s cut in front of me just as I neared the gate, simultaneously slipping a five-dollar





bill into my hand and speaking familiarly in a Boston accent, as if I had known him forever. Whitey Bulger? A clever ruse. What could I do? I'm sorry, sir, but I cannot accept this bribe. You'll have to go to the end of the line and wait like everyone else.

The fellow kept up a steady patter about horseracing, baseball, and football, until we crossed. I sheepishly looked around, trying to appear as if I'd been expecting him to show up: I was just holding his place while he ran off to buy a burrito or something.

It is considered socially acceptable to hold a friend's place, or to get in line early and have your later arriving friends cell phone you in order to determine where in the line you are. You just passed the taco stand near the railroad tracks, where the line bends back? I'll be right there. You're by the duty-free store, under the canopy? Even

better! See you soon, and thanks for holding my place... As the flash mob meets up with their contact, a person can wind up eight or more places behind. A few repetitions of this, and your reptilian brain grows peevish, ready to strike.

Ah, but the SENTRI card.

I have, since 1995, owned a U.S. passport — or rather I was in possession of one, since it states clearly on my passport that it is the property of the U.S. government, and subject to re-appropriation at any time and for any reason. I imagine the same to be true of the SENTRI card, but I haven't read all the fine print.

You would assume that a U.S. passport is the sine qua non of international ID, commanding built-in respect (this is what the statement in English, French, and Spanish revealed inside the passport booklet

posted signs delineating the requirements of the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative — or WHTI Act — there are five or six other documents that equal its authority.

The U.S. passport also carries little clout with the local police, a lesson I learned when I was detained by Tijuana cops. I showed them my passport and asked them to read the section where it beseeches foreign authorities to permit U.S. citizens to pass without undue delay. The officer told me that the passport carried no significance in Mexico, that it was for “the other side.” Hmm...seemed to carry some clout in Europe...

Prior to 9/11, the day that “changed everything,” crossing the border in San Ysidro from Tijuana to U.S. soil was a simple matter of verbal declaration. Lines of thousands, waiting for hours, were nonexistent. It might take five minutes, and it

usually went something like this:

Bored border agent: “Citizenship?”

Equally phlegmatic returnee: “U.S.”

Then one slipped through the turnstile and went on. Nary an ID was flashed, and, of course, no passport necessary. Though even during that pre 9/11 era, suspected illegals were nabbed at the turnstiles at precisely the moment they thought they had it made. I saw it happen several times; a seemingly laconic agent behind the counter would let someone through, then snag them as they exited passage. Some sixth sense, apparently.

Following 9/11, the questions began.

“Where are you going?”

A snappy repost like “the United States” could result in a prolonged quiz.

“From Minnesota, huh?”

“Yes.” That’s what is listed as my birthplace

on my passport, that document which grants me citizenship status.

“Where’s Detroit Lakes?”

“Hey, I was brought to California when I was three.”

to learn more about the geography of my natal state.

Another line of questioning:

“Where are you going?”

I sometimes wanted

“Isn’t it near Deer Lake? Lake Mille Lacs? Lake of the Woods? Itasca, source of the Mississippi? I know it’s north of the Twin Cities. North of Bemidji, even?”

In the land of 10,000 lakes, locating a single one with specificity is a brainbuster. I had once passed through Detroit Lakes on a trip to Canada, but I was ten years old at the time.

They finally let me through, and I vowed

to say something flip, like “the United States” or “Point Barrow, Alaska” or “Hey, I’m a citizen, my passport says so...” But I learned to be measured in my response.

“First, Walmart off Palomar in Chula Vista, then Borders Books in downtown San Diego, then Little Italy, for some ravioli and an espresso...”

I think they really just wanted to hear my English, to see if it was accented, and

if I could speak colloquial Americanese. Well, I can throw in “Mickey Mouse” and “Joe DiMaggio,” too, if required.

For several years during the dotcom boom of the late ’90s through the early 2000s, I flew from San Jose to San Diego every three weeks or so, mainly because I was making good dough, and because my European sojourns during that period had given me a wanderlust that was insatiable. I dubbed Tijuana “the poor man’s Paris.”

I’d fly down from the San Francisco Bay Area on Southwest, take the red trolley to San Ysidro, then catch a Mexico coach across the border and into downtown TJ. It was no-sweat automatic. Business as usual. I had so many frequent-flyer freebies, they’d expire before I could use them, and my complimentary free-drink booklets offered more than one beer guzzler could ever consume. Crossing north, it was the same: just walk over the border. “Citizenship?” they’d ask. Answer “U.S.A.!” and you were on your way, with plenty of time to make it back to Lindbergh Field for the return flight within an hour or so.

In the immedi-

ate aftermath of 9/11, there was little action taken to alter the way things were, the way things had been, but trips in the weeks to come brought dramatic change.

Arriving at the line a couple of hours ahead of my flight was no longer good enough. There were thousands of people. Crossing, someone said, took four hours. I could leave my front door in San Jose and be on Avenida Revolución in 2 1/2 hours, but to get back over the border, I needed four hours to cover a mile? I’d never make my flight, or so I thought, until a Mexican guy told me I could ride a bike across in five minutes.

An entire enterprise had arisen: the renting of children’s bicycles.

The bikes were itty-bitty, so diminutive that your feet touched the ground. You had only to scuttle along, pushing with your feet into the regular motor-vehicle lanes, where amidst the thrumming of hundreds of engines combusting internal, you could move *ahead* of the cars — as motorcyclists do, weaving in and out — and thus rapidly cross into the U.S.A. Some loophole in the law — or perhaps a clear policy had not yet been established — allowed this bizarre workaround to

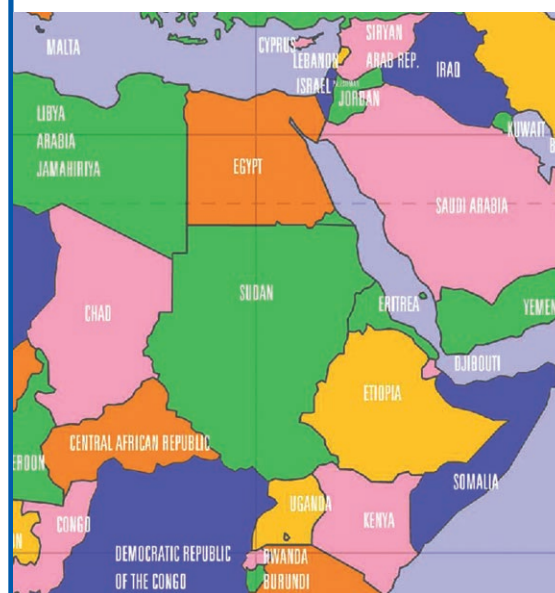

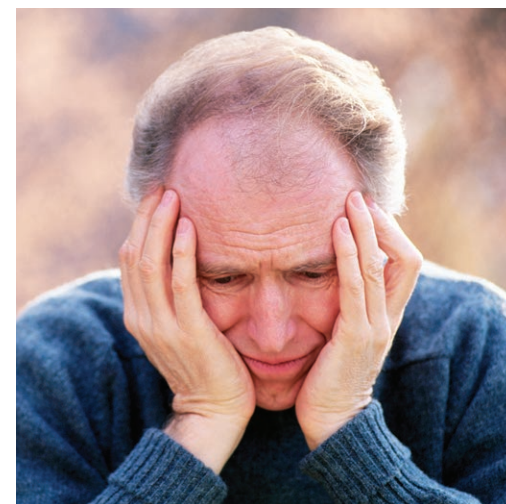

flourish, and for a while, hundreds of kid-sized bikes rented out for \$5 a pop. On the U.S. side, guys collected the bikes and walked them back into Mexico, four at a time.

Where all those little bicycles came from so suddenly, stockpiled behind a chainlink fence, is a mystery, but I imagined that somewhere in TJ, lots of elementary school kids were missing their wheels.

With the realization that bicycle riders were allowed rapid access, more day laborers, construction workers, and NASSCO shipbuilders began riding to the trolley terminus in San Ysidro from Tijuana. For a time, hundreds of bicycles could be seen locked to whatever immovable object was available around the trolley station.

An American friend, also living in Tijuana, took to riding a bicycle from his residence in town a mile or so to the border crossing, but he gave it up after he was waylaid by

a gang of thieves on the pedestrian bridge early one morning. They bulldogged him off the bike as he rode by, robbed him of his backpack and wallet, and left him in a scraped heap on the bridge. He started to take a taxi to the border — at a cost

TJ, and to get to my job in the U.S. had become increasingly annoying. I'd lived in the San Francisco Bay Area, where traffic congestion had been growing for two decades — particularly during the influx of population brought about by the dot-com

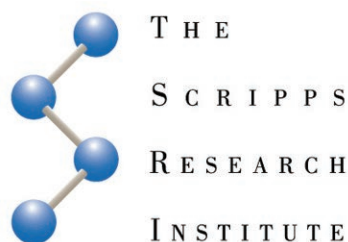

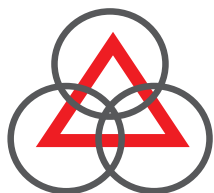

of crossing remained unpredictable. A 5:30 magic hour inexplicably became a 3:30 a.m. magic hour. It was the proverbial last straw.

I'd recently secured a three-month contract position that required prompt arrival at the even earlier hour of 7:30 a.m., and using the trolley line and bus system, I crossed five days a week at 3:30 in the morning. All this early-to-bed-early-to-rise stuff took its toll. My circadian rhythms were shot to hell, and I began to shudder and tremble as the workweek wore on. By the weekend, I wanted to sleep for 48 hours straight, just to get right, but my body had grown used to the

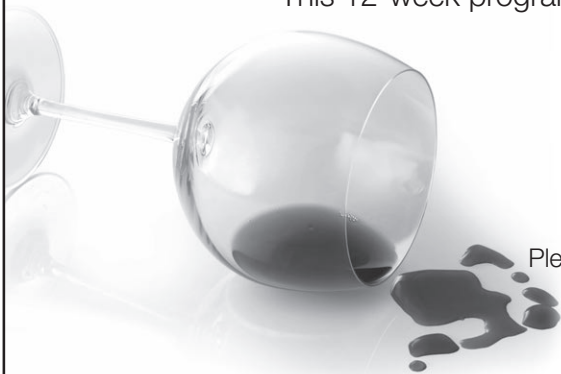

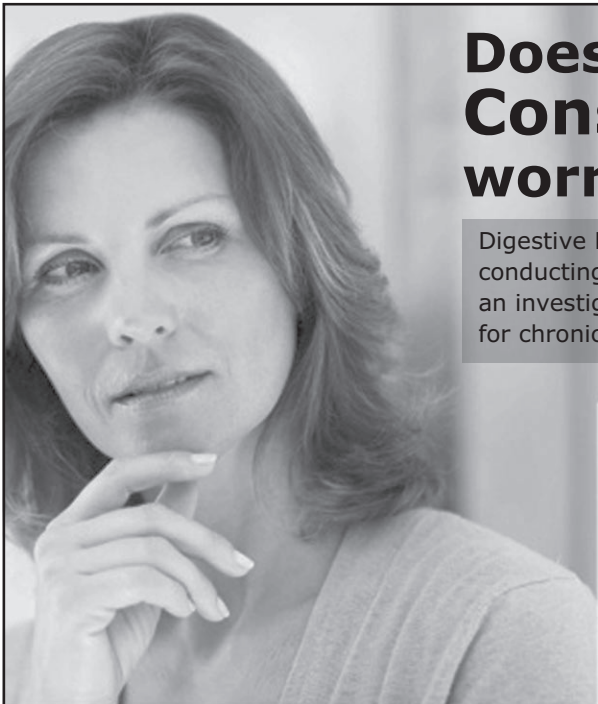

shuttle launch, ponderously at first, then accelerating, gaining the necessary velocity to knock me into SENTRI card orbit.

A uniformed agent asked me a few questions. I probably spent ten minutes with him. I showed him my evidences of address (rent receipts), employment (pay stubs), and citizenship (U.S. passport). He wanted to know if I had ever been arrested. Nope. Married? Nope. He especially focused on whether I had ever had any run-ins with the law involving drugs. Nope. Transporting human traffic (i.e. smuggling in illegal aliens)? Nope.

Then he sent me over to a nice woman who took my fingerprints digitally and took a digital ID photo with a cheesy Logitech camera (one of those gray balls with a lens in it connected to a USB port on a computer). I was then directed outside, where another nice woman in a uniform walked me and two other inductees through a series of locked gates and doors into the original old Customs Building, a WPA-constructed relic from the Great Depression that, despite its obvious inadequacy for today's border crossings, still emanates a nostalgic stateliness, with its red-tiled roof and Spanish-federalist facade. We were shown to a window, where we paid what remained to be paid on our fees — in my case, \$97 and some-odd cents. Then we went back to the San Ysidro SENTRI office, where they returned the paperwork I'd left with my interviewing officer. I was told I would get my SENTRI card in the mail, in five

to ten days.

I got it in seven. The ID photo was in black-and-white, and the wide-angle lens of the digital camera had exaggerated my facial proportions, as if my visage were reflected back at me while gazing from inches away into a silver Christmas tree ornament. I wondered if I would even be recog-

*esperado* — one who waits.

As if by divine deliverance, I'd risen above the maundering masses, the hoi polloi, and I felt, well, guilty about it. As if I'd greased the palm of some cosmic maître d' in order to get preferential treatment. I had grown so accustomed to "the line" — it was

Also, you are admonished to immediately report the loss of the card if you should lose control of it; so maybe that photo of me in which I resemble a homunculus pickled in a jar of formaldehyde is not of much importance.

The first time I used the card, some 30 minutes after activating it on the SENTRI website, I was swept alongside the waiting masses toward the special SENTRI entrance. I walked over toward the official U.S.-Mexico border line, painted in yellow and black stripes, and I could not contain my sense of self-consciousness as I passed the people in that *other* line, for I was once one of them. *Un*

all just part of living here — that I'd bonded with it, regardless of the misery it wrought. It was a kind of Stockholm syndrome, a brain-invading mezcaworm, and it wouldn't release me, though it no longer had power over me. All the patience I'd developed, all the stifled resistance to unmitigated tedium, all the tolerance to human rudeness and inanity — I leapt over them like the cow over the moon. No need for that particular social armor anymore.

When I faced the official at the SENTRI counter, I told him that this was my maiden voyage with the card, and as I glanced askance at the sweating and swaying masses lined up inside, I confessed that I felt...guilty. Undeserving of such privilege. Survivor's guilt. He looked at me quizzically, then raised an eyebrow...*guilty*? Then he chuckled and swiped my card through the device, and I was on my way. ■

less dress, her long hair still flaming red, breasts still full, waist tight, legs long — sexy enough to turn the head of the most worldly 20-year-old male. *Nicely done, Abby.* I present the damp flowers and escort Ms. Pizer into the Compass Rose Room for tea.

Ten minutes earlier, I'd given the maître d' \$100 and instructed him to "Be fluffy." He leads us to the table I'd already picked out, flutters about, then waves for a waiter, who arrives instantly. Both men flutter. I am pleased as punch.

Tea is ordered. I say, "How have you been?" She says, "How have you been?" Chit and chat and bingo, we arrive at Arden days. "Arden," Abby says, "that was the worst time in my life. "Is there a university or college around here?" "I want to make love to you." "Is there coffee in the kitchen?" "Just passing through."

I hitchhiked across this country 20, 30...well, it was all just one long-ass trip, no beginning, no end. Picture a journey from, say, San Francisco to Florida. In Florida, spend a few days in Gainesville, "ball"

(a '60s term) a co-ed, sleep in the dorm, hitch south to Miami, stay in a dirt-bag youth hostel, tour local juice joints, smoke Jamaican weed, fuck what's available, thumb down to Key West, meet somebody, stay with her for a week, help her brother refinish his 40-foot houseboat, then hitch back to Gainesville, one more night with the college co-ed, then on to Atlanta to stay with a guy

See, it's when you stay in one place, that's when you spend money, on rent and groceries, which means you need skillets, pots, pans, silverware, and dishes, which means acquiring tables and chairs. But keep moving, and you'll meet people who are happy to put you up for the night. Dinner is on the house. One day turns into the next.

But. I could never have

I'd met in Seattle who plays bass in a tone-deaf rock-'n-roll band, meet Alicia during band practice, move to her place, help the band pack up, travel to Macon for a band gig, come back, get drunk, take a side trip to Savannah, spend two glorious days in the library reading magazines and a book, do not relate to anyone, meet law student in downtown coffee house on day three, she has to listen to the Eagles when she makes love, attend the symphony with her, the bassoonist is an old boyfriend, get drunk with him after the show, then on to South Carolina, sleep in the bushes beside the freeway, a couple of nights in Charlotte with bikers met at Johnny's Tavern, then DC and ten days with Mary, who I met in Eugene, Oregon, and three weeks with Todd in Philadelphia, where I cop a ten-day temp job out of Manpower, then NYC, stay with an Alaskan buddy, Boston, more Alaskan friends, Martha's Vineyard, Buffalo, Erie, back to Philly, Cincinnati, Kansas City, Denver, continue west and carry on. Hitchhiking wasn't a trip, it was another day at the office.

hitchhiked for five years had I not been drafted into the armed forces of the United States, a shotgun wedding, which, after a long and painful gestation, gave birth to a GI Bill made out in my name. The government dole motivated me to attend Foothill Junior College, thence to meet Abby, move to Arden, and commence hitchhiking — which eventually propelled me into the Fairbanks laborers' union hall, which led to my employ as a writer, and proceeding from there, on a straightish line, to my current position of author and affable host.

The GI Bill, you see, augmented by the odd Pell Grant and NDSL loan, afforded a small stipend, thereby permitting me to hitchhike for years. I avoided a job between the ages of 23 to 30, a formative time of life when contemporaries were dispatched to the employment camps. As a bonus, the Army also introduced me to Alaska, the best part of Alaska, Alaska of 1965.

dent Dan Quayle, former Attorney General John Ashcroft, former Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich, former Speaker of the House Dennis Hastert, former House Majority Leader Dick Armey, former House Majority Leader Tom DeLay, former Senate Majority/Minority Leader Trent Lott, Paul Wolfowitz, Richard Perle, Karl Rove, Phil Gramm, Jack Kemp, Mitch McConnell, Elliott Abrams, Ken Adelman, Don Evans, Harvey Pitt, Tommy Thompson, Bill Bennett, Bill O'Reilly, Pat Buchanan, Kenneth Starr, George Will, Steve Forbes, Alan Keyes; unlike the foregoing public servants and opinion-makers, I did not have the stroke to oink my way past odious little people to the front of a National Guard induction line or obtain a deferment by way of doc, college, vocation, or family.

At one point, however, I did possess a certificate, drawn up and hand-delivered to me at government expense, proclaiming that I had been classified 1-Y. For readers interested in obscure cultural artifacts, a 1-Y draft classification meant I was draft ineligible for reasons of physical disability, except in times of war or declared national emergency. Vietnam was not then, and never would be, a declared war or national emergency.

Nowadays, the government hires poor people and people of color to do the killing and dying, this exploitation so natural, so trouble-free, it's easy to think that's the way it's always been. But back in 1965, white middle-class males, and, occasionally, inattentive white upper-class males, were taken, whether they wanted to go or not, into the Army.

The 1-Y came to me in this way. The thugs who ran my local draft

board dispatched a communiqué to my personal sanctuary, ordering me to appear at the Armed Forces Induction Center on Clay Street in Oakland, California, for the purposes of taking a physical exami-

nation. This examination would determine if I was healthy enough to allow my country to place me in situations and locations where I might be killed or maimed. Starting pay was, and this is not a joke, \$78

a month.

This first physical was regarded in my circle as a "free at bat." If I could work a deal here, I would be excused from more difficult decisions down the road.

You showed up or were bused into the Oakland Induction Center sometime after the bars closed and before the donut shops opened — it's always 4:30 a.m. when you're dealing with the military. I

stripped to my underwear and got in a long line. All the guys wore white Jockey briefs. We looked like a flock of little boys making a first foray into the men's locker room.

The line slogged

around a gymnasium-sized room crowded with wooden booths. The slap-up stalls gave the space a depressing look, like a circus midway at daybreak. Inside every booth was an Army doc who presided over that booth's anatomical turf.

I lodged a complaint at every stop. Booth number one might be the chest booth. "I've had this pain for the last year or so. Increases when I walk up a flight of stairs." Then, the eye booth. "Every once in awhile, and this is weird if it happens while I'm driving, I see everything as a blur." Ear booth. "It's only the high-pitch sounds; whistles, shouts, fire alarms." Appendage booth. "Can't lift my right arm past shoulder height. Football injury." Foot booth. "Can't walk down hills. Fishing accident." Hand booth.

"Wrists hurt like hell in the mornings." Mouth booth. "I choke on food and cough blood. My mother is a drug addict."

Weeks later, I received another communiqué, this one informing me that I'd been awarded a 1-Y draft

that came down the chute.

At the time, I was living in a seedy retirement hotel on Fourth Avenue in San Diego, smoking a lot of dope/ganja/weed/shit/bammy/buddha/chillums/hookah/hemp/pacalolo/cannabis/kiff/weed/mota/

classification at the hand-station booth. And that, I thought, was that.

This was fall of 1964, when the U.S. had no combat troops in South Vietnam, the 17,000 American military personnel there officially termed "American advisors." There was still some wiggle in the meat line, before the monthly order got so big it required every carcass

reefer/sinsemilla/ stick/tea/ happy cigarettes. I lived in Tijuana during a large portion of that interval. There were too many drugs to keep a coherent timeline, but I recall coming up for air one summer morning in Lemon Grove, a methamphetamine suburb of San Diego. I was crashing at a friend's house. There was a knock on the door, and another friend from an

apartment I'd abandoned months ago delivered a brown bag filled with mail addressed to me, including my draft notice. Those scurvy-mouth draft-board pig-fuckers had reclassified me 1-A, then drafted my ass while I was out of the country.

We are now into July of 1965. The American propaganda machine, so good that to this day Americans don't believe it exists, was cranked up to battle speed. *Time*, *Newsweek*, *New York Times*, *Washington Post*, *Los Angeles Times*, and the rest were honking about the commie threat to freedom-loving South Vietnam and how, if freedom-loving South Vietnam went commie, then Cambodia, the strategic hub of Asia, would go commie, followed by Laos, Thailand, Indonesia, Australia, New Zealand, the Pitcairn Islands,

Bolivia, Newfoundland, and, ultimately, the state of Delaware. National survival was on the line.

Never underestimate the persuasiveness of a government willing to put its citizens in jail unless they agree to be involved in an evil, senseless war waged on the other side of the globe against a people who have caused said citizens no harm, for a cause no greater than not knowing what else to do.

"I don't believe they're [the North Vietnamese] ever going to quit. And I don't see any plan for a victory — militarily or diplomatically." This is what President Lyndon Johnson said to Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara on June 21, 1965, the day I received my induction notice.

I completed boot camp at Fort Ord, located on the romantic Monterey, Cali-

fornia, peninsula, under sedate, even pleasant conditions. There had been a meningitis outbreak in the class preceding mine. Someone died, which caused one or two stories to appear in nearby newspapers. My company was not allowed to run or indulge in blatant physical activity. We were bused around Fort Ord to our kill classes and ordered to sleep eight hours every night. Mostly, I recall being loaded on pharmaceutical speed, courtesy of a girlfriend who was a doctor's daughter.

The most important moment in boot camp was the typing test. (I owe my skills to Ms. Louise Pendleton's tits, having in 8th grade followed them into a beginning typing class and never looking back.) During my first week at Fort Ord, I signed up for, and aced, the Army's career-

enhancing typing test.

On graduation day, I was dubbed an Army finance clerk and ordered to Fort Wainwright, located on the outskirts of Fairbanks, Alaska. I viewed this posting as an undesirable beginning to my military service. I felt I could better serve my country at the Presidio in San Francisco.

But the Army didn't care about my needs. My entire military career was spent at Fort Wainwright. The tour passed without incident except for one savage paper cut inflicted upon my right index finger while filing a form at the end of a hectic week. (Old timers look back and remember it as the week when military pay rates changed and

many unfamiliar numbers had to be entered into many rows.) I lived off-base, hung out with locals, and, most importantly, went native.

My transformation was aided by the previously mentioned Freddie Galloway and Kermit Beman, met at the University of Alaska student union on a perfect September day in 1966. I was taking an art appreciation class and had dropped by the student union to gawk at women. Kermit and Freddie were drinking coffee at a corner table, the only other long-haired males on campus. I knew, like a dog knows dinner time, that I'd found the next stop on my train ride.

Kermit had arrived in Fairbanks a couple of

months earlier straight out of the University of Idaho with a master's degree. That was enough to get you a job at a small state university, and Kermit was a lecturer in the psychology department. He wore cowboy boots, jeans, checkered wool shirts, and a hand-stitched leather jacket to class. He was stocky, barrel-chested, 5'10", with long dark-blond hair and a perfect Santa Claus beard, save for the blond. He talked about existential phenomenology, using the word existential as a universal descriptor, as in "Ex-is-ten-tial!" or "That's pretty existential," followed by a heartless chuckle, and he lived with an artist chick in a wood-heated cabin with psychedelic posters on the

walls and LSD in the sewing-table drawer. He reeked of cool. Thirty-eight years later, he'd be working as a laborer in the oil fields of Prudhoe Bay.

But being a laborer does not necessarily mean being stupid. Kermit went into his golden years with 40 acres of land, seven rental cabins, an enormous, three-story, built-by-his-own-hand house, a yard full of trucks, an alcoholic wife, estranged son, and the respect of his community.

When I met Freddie Galloway, he was 19 years old, a slender 6'2", with black eyes and hair. He had the longest beard I'd ever seen, a ZZ Top beard, which, even then, had streaks of gray. Smart, funny, athletic, stubborn, and a loyal friend, he is someone who takes time for coffee in the morning, time for his banjo at night, time to read in the afternoon. No time for steady work.

Freddie was born in Fairbanks; his parents were homesteaders. This Fairbanks pedigree gave him an identity rock. He was sure about who he was, about what was right and what was wrong. He was sure Fairbanks was the only

place in the world that mattered. He would live in the woods, take up carpentry, then fine woodworking, raise three children, marry, never hold a steady job, all that being only gloss and glow because he was Fairbanks born and bred, something, dear reader, you and I will never be.

Kermit and Freddie, two years from our first meeting, will (as you may recall from earlier installments) buy five acres on the east slope of Ester Dome, where I'll help build Freddie's cabin, then tree house, the same tree house I fled to after the tragic sexual bust in Santa Fe, which inevitably led to Pipeline Days, and from there on to a career as journalist and literary lion.

It has come to this: I am sitting at my desk in Berkeley, California, examining a photograph. The portrait shows a beaming, middle-aged man. Middle-aged hair flares hindward from the shoreline of his egg-shaped dome. Snappy Victorian sideburns and a Santa Claus beard and mustache add mix and meat to his angelic ether. The man's cheekbones are set high. His raven eyes squint. The image was taken at sunset,

thus drenching his countenance in luscious rainbow hues.

This is not a true representation of a human being. This is an advertisement, another box of breakfast cereal, and another solicitation to spend money. This, to be specific, is a book jacket. Regard, pilgrim, the colorized facsimile of Dr. Andrew Weil, who, at present, is staring up at me from the cover of his seminal work, *8 Weeks to Optimum Health*.

Let me not fail to mention that alongside Dr. Weil is Bill Moyers's *Healing and the Mind*, Dr. Neal Barnard's *Food for Life*, Martha Rose Shulman's *Light Basics Cookbook*, and George Foreman's *Knock-Out-the-Fat Barbecue and Grilling Cookbook*. This wellness archive was acquired at the Ashby Street flea market, Northern California's finest discount book outlet and literary browse-ateria.

As you've probably guessed by now, your best-o'rama pal is embarking upon a thorough retooling of his physical, mental, and spiritual states. But I want you to understand that I did not go down easy. ■

papers fear an online charge will backfire. The *New York Times* and *Wall Street Journal* are among those that have clamped on fees.

On November 14, the *New York Times* ran a story about John Paton, the chief executive of Denver's MediaNews Group, the second-largest newspaper chain by circulation. He's known as "the digital apostle." Newspapers must go online quickly and "stop listening to newspaper people," preaches Paton. He is convinced that "if newspapers are to survive, they will all but have to set themselves on fire, eventually forsaking print and becoming digital news operations," the *Times* said.

Newspapers in their most recent quarters have

suffered. Total ad revenue at the *New York Times* dropped 7 percent, with print down 10 percent. McClatchy's revenue was down 10 percent. Print ad revenue at the *Washington Post* was down 20 percent, as the company lowered prices. By contrast, ad revenue at Google soared 33 percent. No wonder Wall Street analysts think the metro daily print-advertising model is outmoded.

Newspapers are improving profits by slicing employment, pay, and contributions to employees' 401(k) plans, while closing printing facilities. Joselyn MacKay of Morningstar Research fears that the *New York Times* "will run out of fat to trim and have to cut into muscle, hurting the quality of its product." And she doubts that online revenue will ever become a meaningful part of overall

sales. MacKay expects Gannett's revenue to continue sliding as print declines offset by online gains.

Joseph Agnese of Standard & Poor's says McClatchy's sales will drop 6 percent next year following this year's declines, as circulation also slips.

The *Union-Tribune* has some advantages. In combined print and online, the paper has a 52 percent penetration of the local market, according to Pew. That puts it in the top 20 of American papers. But it's well below the 72 percent of the *Rochester Democrat & Chronicle*, the leader. It's frigid and snowy in Rochester. People have more time to read newspapers.

That's more evidence that it will be a cold day in hell when the *Union-Tribune* sells for a fat price, and it certainly didn't on November 17. ■

annual Maui event. The group's total consulting fees were listed as \$157,000. The nonprofit also gave \$15,000 to the San Diego Asian Film Festival, a favorite of Takashima's.

**Hotel manna** Rancho Santa Fe-based political fundraiser **Karolyn Dorsee** spent the first half of this year collecting cash for the GOP's New Majority California PAC, which is out to "broaden the appeal of the Republican Party." Dorsee received a total of \$15,745.77 for her services. Meantime, the Lodge at Torrey Pines, owned by the staunchly Republican Evans family, has done very

well by the California Democratic state central committee, which spent \$232,976 there on fund-raising events from January through June. La Jolla appears to be a popular venue for state Democrats, who also paid \$16,110 to Torrey Pines Hilton for fund-raising events in March and anted up another \$27,264 in fees to the City of San Diego's Park and Recreation Department for fund-raising events in La Jolla.

Dea Hurston, one of two black commissioners on the City of San Diego's Commission for Arts and Culture, read Dr. Smith's letter before she saw the play. Hurston, who is also a longtime volunteer at the Playhouse, spoke outside her role of commissioner when she said, "I was pleasantly surprised that I did understand the play. I guess I viewed it in a different way [than Dr. Smith]."

Hurston's friend Sherry Tyson saw the play during a visit to San Diego from Youngstown, Ohio, where she resides and works for

the Youngstown City School District.

"[Greenidge's] play was about young black girls with foul mouths, and the only things they could think about were their cell phones and getting Gucci bags at a baby shower," Tyson says. "I think this is what white people believe happens in homes where there's maybe a single parent, but I know for a fact that's not always what happens."

Philip Liburd, a vice president at the local branch of the NAACP, found the play to be "well-written and relevant." He says, "I didn't think that the play was in any way meant to represent all African Americans or all young black kids."

Greenidge says this is not the first time she's been criticized for these characters. When she first began writing the play, another black female playwright told her she didn't like these young characters and didn't care to know what they wanted. Greenidge decided then that she would "write the hell out of these girls" and give them a place on the stage.

"The message I'm getting is that girls like this — and I know they exist — don't deserve to be onstage and be seen. And that there are other stories to put onstage, other more hopeful or better

characters," Greenidge says. "Not every play is going to be about Rosa Parks or Martin Luther King or Sojourner Truth. And I also think we owe it to ourselves as a people to look at other stories besides those."

Another complaint that came up: right play, wrong theater.

"I think it's fair to say that there were people in the community who think something like this should be done in the black community," says Liburd.

Referring to Dr. Smith's letter to the editor, Hurston explains, "I think something that Dorothy worried about with that was that white people will think that's how we really are. Or, rather, that that's how they will think we *only* are."

And though Hurston understands why this fear would resonate through the community, she also says, "It isn't art if there isn't criticism. And for me, this piece has just caused so much discussion. I love it. I applaud the Playhouse for being brave enough to commission this piece. Here we have a black female playwright who has had her play commissioned and produced at one of the finest regional theaters in the country. How bad can this be?"

Greenidge spent the

month of October tweaking the play before its Off Broadway run in New York. When asked if any changes are the result of criticisms she heard in San Diego, Greenidge says, "No. This play has been through so much development and so many readings where as a writer you just sit there and take notes for two hours, over and over and over again. So, even though it upsets people, I'm confident in what the play is saying." ■

**struck the camp without warning and ousted up to four dozen sleeping protesters. Five arrests were reported.**

**"They're spending thousands and thousands of dollars of our money arresting us," Gormlie said later to a group of about 75 Occupiers after a march to re-occupy the plaza. Gormlie was critical of the costs police have elected to incur in enforcement on what, by most accounts, has been a demonstration relatively devoid of violence. "How much money is the city spending — no, how much money is the city wasting, money that the city doesn't have?"**

Big Bucks for Human Smugglers

*San Diego County* — The human smuggling trade appears to be quite lucrative, according to a report by *Courthouse News Service*.

Eight men were recently indicted by the U.S. Attorney's Office for smuggling. The men, mostly in their 20s and early 30s, were tasked with picking up illegal immigrants after their arrival in eastern San Diego County and transporting them to Orange County. For this, the immigrants were charged \$4000 to \$5000 per head.

If these numbers are correct, the cost of illegal transport is skyrocketing. In the early 1980s, coyotes charged as little as \$50 to lead others across the border.

Enforcement of the law has also stiffened. The men, charged with conspiracy to transport illegal aliens, could face five years' prison time and fines of up to \$250,000.

### Developing Story

Manchester Purchase of *Union-Tribune* Raises Questions of Timing

*San Diego* — Word this morning that Doug Manchester is buying the *Union-Tribune* may help explain some recent editorializing by the paper.

Don Bauder first reported here on September 29 about rumors circulating that Platinum Equity, the Beverly Hills private equity outfit run by billionaire Tom Gores, was about to seal a deal allowing controversial La Jolla Manchester to take control of the *Union-Tribune*, San Diego's once all-powerful newspaper of record and political influence.

On November 5, the *Union-Tribune*, without mentioning any prospec-

tive deal to sell the paper, editorialized in favor of going ahead with Manchester's redevelopment project with the Navy.

Only after his project with the Navy was finally shot down by the coastal commission did Manchester go public with his desire to buy the *U-T*, telling the online news website Voice of San Diego of his interest on November 7.

And today, at the top of its front page, the *U-T* features a large color graphic with five yellow stars, touting the Grand Del Mar resort as the "the first in the county to receive *Forbes Travel Guide's* top rating."

A glowing story inside says the designation "puts the Grand Del Mar in the same league as the esteemed Beverly Hills Hotel and the Four Seasons Hotel in San Francisco."

But one seemingly important detail is missing: the resort was developed and is run by Manchester Financial Group, Doug Manchester's holding company.

### Drug Dugout

Tunnel Discovered in Border Warehouse

*Otay Mesa* — On Tuesday, U.S. and Mexican authorities confiscated 14 tons of marijuana and discovered a 400-yard tunnel that linked Tijuana and San Diego. Agents from Immigration and Customs Enforcement say the tunnel had recently been completed and was outfitted with electricity, ventilation, and structural supports.

Agents discovered the tunnel after staking out a warehouse near the Otay Mesa port of entry. Earlier that day, agents pulled over a small cargo truck leaving the facility. Inside they found three tons of marijuana. The bust led to a search of the warehouse,

where six and a half tons of pot were found, along with the tunnel.

After receiving word of the bust, authorities in Mexico located the other entry to the tunnel, confiscating an additional five to six tons of pot there.

millions of dollars.

"San Diego probably doesn't really have a sense of what this is going to cost them until they get into it," said an unnamed manager at a private firm that provides court services. He went on to estimate that the eventual cost would more likely be close to \$7 million annually, rather than the official estimate of just over \$1 million per year, which includes \$215,000 to hire five new clerks to run the imaging system.

## America's Shiniest City

Billboard Promoter  
Hires Well-Connected  
Lobbyists

Downtown — A former aide to the owner of the

Denver Nuggets has been quietly pitching the idea of turning part of downtown San Diego into a giant "entertainment district," complete with massive, Times Square-style animated advertising signs, video screens, and billboards.

According to a presentation on his company's website, David Ehrlich, principal of FinWater Advisors in Denver, wants to "create a public-private partnership to develop the legal/political environment to make the district a reality."

Touting the plan as "a revitalized neighborhood powered by outdoor media...[not] a sign district," Ehrlich's company estimates annual gross revenue of \$5 million by the third year of the project, with a share of the money to go to city hall

and downtown property owners.

The city's decades-old billboard ordinance currently prohibits construction of any new "off premise" signs and would have to be significantly amended to allow the kinds of outdoor advertising foreseen in the FinWater plan.

City records show FinWater has hired local lobbying outfit Marston + Marston, run by the husband-and-wife team of Jeff and Myrna Marston, to influence the city on the project's behalf.

### Living Local in Paris, France

My husband, six-year-old, and I spent a month in Paris. The best part was learning to live what the French call a “quotidien” life (just the day-to-day goodies) in the City of Lights.

Since there was no washing machine in our Parisian apartment, we did laundry down the street. It was my husband’s job. One day, I went to check on him, only to find him standing sheepishly in an inch of water.

Somehow the machine he stuffed a week’s worth of clothes into wouldn’t

open and had exploded water everywhere. Imagine that.

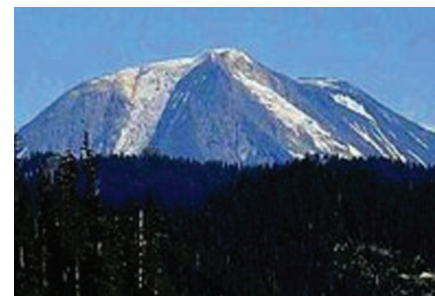

### Mount St. Helens, Washington

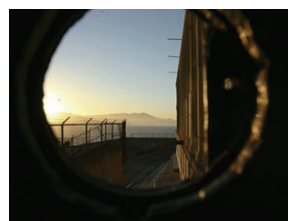

Mount St. Helens is an active stratovolcano located near Washington State’s southern border — 96 miles south of Seattle and 50 miles northeast of Portland.

On May 18, 1980, the eruption changed more than 200 square miles of rich forest into a gray, lifeless landscape resembling a moonscape. Instead of erupting upward, Mount St. Helens blew sideways. A 650-mile-per-hour blast of gas, rock, and ash swept over a 230-square-mile area, killing nearly everything in its path. The 600° F eruption

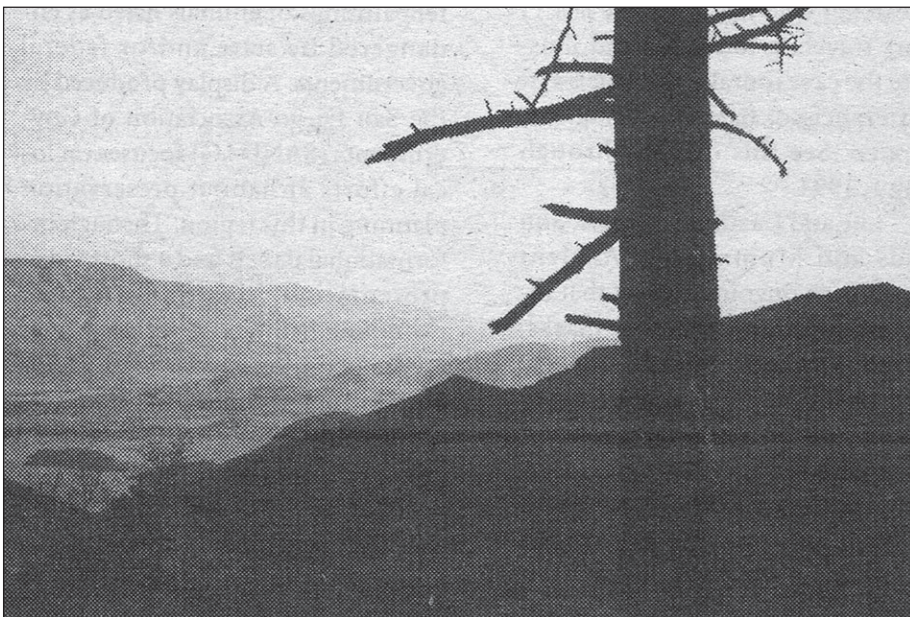

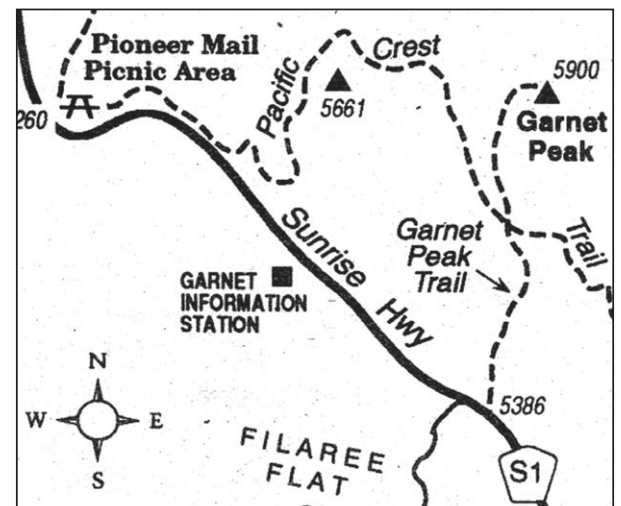

est mornings, you can witness the almost-mythical "green flash"; an optical phenomenon familiarity associated with the sun's disappearance over the Pacific Ocean in the west but seldom noticed when the sun reappears in the east.

The Garnet Peak Trail, 1.2 miles long, starts near mile 27.8 (as reckoned by the green milepost signs) on Sunrise Highway. This is about five miles north of the small resort community of Mount Laguna. Park your car nearby, off the pavement, and take the signed Garnet Peak Trail north. After one-half mile in Jeffrey pine forest, you emerge in the open and cross the Pacific Crest Trail. Continue north on a rocky path slanting upward. Bleached yucca stalks, left from the flowering season half a year ago, poke through the trailside ceanothus and manzanita like exclamation points. This is an ankle-busting trail, especially at dawn when the seemingly substantial, angular stones caught in your flashlight beam still manage to roll unexpectedly underfoot.

Garnet Peak's summit con-



sists of layered chunks of schist, a type of metamorphic rock seen along much of the Laguna escarpment. The peak falls away abruptly, revealing a vertiginous panorama of Storm Canyon and its distant alluvial fan toward the east. The Salton Sea and Baja's Laguna Salada (just south of the border) shimmer in the

east and southeast, respectively. To the south and west, the Laguna crest, dusky with oak and pine forests and patches of chaparral, seems to roll like a frozen wave to the edge of the escarpment.

**A**lthough Garnet Peak isn't the highest peaklet along the eastern escarpment of the Laguna Mountains, its exposed position makes it a fine place to view both

the pine-clad high country and the raw desert below. Now through January, whenever east or north winds chase away air pollution and haze, Garnet Peak is simply the best spot

in the morning sun. Around 6:45 to 7 a.m., the sun's flattened disk pops up over the desert wastes of northwestern Sonora, Mexico, some 150 miles away. On the clear-

tion vaporized the forest near the volcano and left other trees standing but scorched to death.

See the remains of the trees that were destroyed where they stood as the blast arrived. Some vegetation has returned to the slopes around the volcano, but it will be years before the forest returns.

The first (and least impressive) exhibit you’ll approach is the Mount St. Helens Visitor Center at Seaquest/Silver Lake at mile marker 5 on State Route 504, off Interstate 5. It’s somewhat outdated; save it for a stop on the way back down if you have time.

The Mount St. Helens Forest Learning Center at mile marker 33 is

free. This is the best of the three exhibits on the mountain. There’s a playground for children and a helicopter to climb into and pretend you’re flying around the mountain. The eruption chamber is an experience you can’t miss.

At mile marker 52, Johnston Ridge Observatory has an awesome view with great exhibits.

The Northwest Forest Pass is required to visit the sites around Mt. St. Helens. This is a vehicle pass for \$5 a day/\$30 per year and good in both Oregon and Washington National Forests.

Check the Mount St. Helens websites before planning a visit between October and February, as many times all roads are closed once snow begins in the winter months.

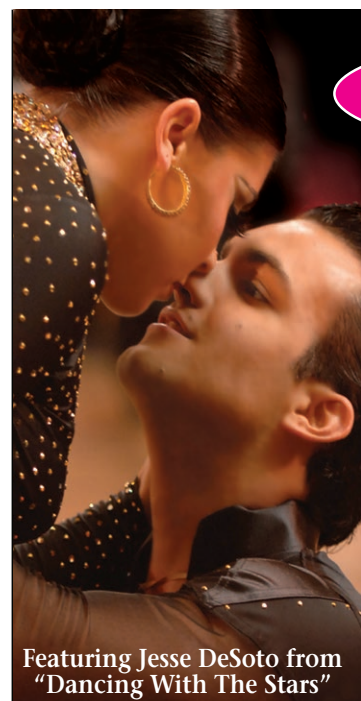

## Rhyme & Verse

### One Day I Wrote Her Name

*A poem by Edmund Spenser*

One day I wrote her name upon the strand,  
But came the waves and washed it away:  
Again I wrote it with a second hand,  
But came the tide, and made my pains his prey.  
"Vain man," said she, "that dost in vain assay  
A mortal thing so to immortalize;  
For I myself shall like to this decay,  
And eke my name be wiped out likewise."  
"Not so," (quod I) "let baser things devise  
To die in dust, but you shall live by fame:  
My verse your virtues rare shall eternize,  
And in the heavens write your glorious name:  
Where whenas death shall all the world subdue,  
Our love shall live, and later life renew."



Little is known for certain about the parentage or youth of the English poet Edmund Spenser, who was born in 1552, probably in London. He was educated at Cambridge and published his first volume of poetry three years after graduating, in 1579. That book, the Shepherd's Calendar, filled with archaic language and composed in a pastoral mode that was largely unfamiliar to his readers, was nonetheless clearly the work of a highly accomplished and enormously talented poet. In 1580, Spenser was appointed secretary to the lord-deputy of Ireland and that year fought in a bloody suppression of an Irish rebellion against British rule. The first three books of his epic allegory The Faery Queen were published in 1590, and despite its great length and somewhat difficult language, Spenser was at once widely acknowledged as one of the masterful poets of the Elizabethan Age. In January of 1599, a few months after his home in Ireland was sacked and burned to the ground during Tyler's Rebellion, Spenser died in poverty. "One Day I Wrote Her Name" is widely considered one of his most memorable sonnets. The notion of immortalizing one's beloved by writing of her in a poem (an immortal poem, needless to say) was a common motif among Elizabethan poets.

### What are you reading?

"*Inheritance*, by Christopher Paolini. This is the last book in his *Eragon* series, and it just came out today. I started reading the series because my brother read the first one, *Eragon*, and told me about it."

### Tell me about it.

"It's a fantasy series about a 15-year-old boy who starts out as a farmer in a small village. One day, this blue stone appears in front of him while he's hunting, and he takes it home. A couple of weeks later, it hatches into a dragon, and he becomes a dragon rider. There used to be an entire force of them; they were peacekeepers. But one of them, Galbatorix, went bad. His dragon was killed, and he stole another dragon and recruited some others, and they destroyed the riders. Then he took over and made himself king. Eragon sets out on a journey to learn to fight and use magic so that he can join the resistance and defeat the king. Part of the mystery of the book is that, even by this point in the series — I'm on

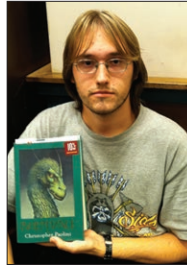
page 123 — you've never seen Galbatorix or his dragon. You've only heard about them."

### What do you like about it?

"I like his details — he describes scenes very well. And I like the way the author switches between the different characters — he doesn't tell the story from just one point of view."

### Who is your favorite character?

"Eragon's cousin; he's called Roran Stronghammer. He's one of the few characters in the book who's a great warrior but is completely normal. He's very intelligent and strong, but he doesn't use magic or ride a dragon. He just fights with what he has. There was a scene in the last book, *Brisingr*, where Roran is a soldier and his commanding officer orders the soldiers into battle. But the order would have led to all the soldiers being killed. Roran, knowing that he would be punished for insubordination, went against his commanding officer's orders



and told the men to do something else. They ended up winning and also saved all the soldiers' lives. I liked that he did, even though he knew he would be punished."

### What book was most life-changing for you or opened your eyes in some way?

"Maybe *Ender's Game*, by Orson Scott Card. Most of the characters in it are really young kids, between the ages of 5 and 12. All of them have super-genius levels of intelligence. As a result, they have power that normal kids don't have. Two of them are always going on the internet, visiting political websites, gaining influence. One of them, by the time he's 15, he's almost become the leader of the world."

### Do you see that as a metaphor about young people, how they have power inside them that hasn't been unlocked?

"Yeah."

### Who is your favorite author?

"James Patterson. Some authors take too long to get into a scene. They draw them out, and you start to get bored. I don't even finish books by certain authors. But Patterson gets into the scene while still giving you detail. He's not rushing through it. He did the *Maximum Ride* series, which is sort of adventure with a little sci-fi."

### Do you read any magazines or newspapers?

"No."

### Do you talk to anyone about what you're reading?

"Yes, my brother. We read a lot of the same books. We'll talk about characters and events in the books, speculate on what we think is going to happen."

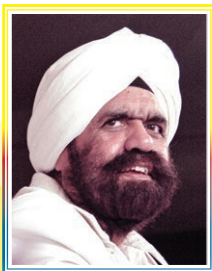

“Official Proclamation of the First Thanksgiving”

To all ye Pilgrims: Inasmuch as the great Father has given us this year an abundant harvest of Indian corn, wheat, peas, squashes, and garden vegetable, and has made the forest to abound with game and the sea with fish and clams, and inasmuch

as he has protected us from the ravages of the savages, has spared us from pestilence and disease, has granted us freedom to worship God according to the dictates of our own conscience; now I, your magistrate, do proclaim that all ye Pilgrims, with your wives and ye little ones, do gath-

er at ye meeting house, on ye hill, between the hours of 9 and 12 in the day time, on Thursday, November 29, of the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred and twenty-three, and the third year since ye Pilgrims landed on ye Plymouth Rock, there to listen to ye pastor and render thanksgiving

to ye Almighty God for all His blessings. — William Bradford, Nov. 29, 1623.

**William Bradford (1590–1657)** was the founder and leader of the Plymouth Colony in Massachusetts and served as the second Massachusetts governor, succeeding John Carver (1576–1621). His journal,

“Of Plymouth Plantation,” is an important early source in the history of the founding of the American colonies. Perhaps his greatest legacy is this public pronouncement as governor which has ever since been enshrined as the uniquely American holiday of Thanksgiving.

# Tots on the Side

The sun glinted off oak trees. Golf carts waddled down the fairway. A dry, light breeze signaled an impending Santa Ana. I gazed upon this glorious scene, sipping Stella Artois, happy to be alive and honored to have such a setting within walking distance of my house.

You might think I was dining at A.R. Valentien and looking out across Torrey Pines Golf Course at the sparkling ocean beyond. But you would be wrong. I was, in fact, at Tobey's 19th Hole Cafe, perched above Balboa Golf Course and savoring a panoramic view of downtown's skyscrapers. I was also drinking the most gourmet thing on the menu. Which was just fine.

My family and I had hiked up to Tobey's on this lazy Saturday afternoon because we'd heard from our Golden Hill neighbors that the café serves solid diner food and that you couldn't beat the location.

Both reports were true. From the chorizo-and-egg breakfast burrito (\$5.75) that my husband inhaled to the basic cheeseburger on a fluffy, freshly baked bun (\$5.50), which my son

ordered, the food is designed to fill you up after you've trudged around the golf course for 18 holes. Or, we realized, as groups of haggard-looking 20-somethings wandered in, this is the place to go for a little hair of the dog after a hard night drinking beer and hanging out in South Park.

The clientele is an amusing mix of retirees sporting loud Bermuda shorts and perky visors inside, and youngsters in garish, overly large sunglasses outside on the patio. It makes for fun people-watching, if you can tear your eyes away from the view. Tobey's 19th Hole Cafe sits on the edge of a mesa, 100 or so feet above the golf course. A fairway winds down the hill beneath picture windows that line the rear of the café, housed in Balboa Golf Course's clubhouse.

As for the food, it's basic but well prepared. Don't look for elaborate dish descriptions or sourcing of ingredients. My husband's giant breakfast burrito came mostly unencumbered, with a lone piece of iceberg lettuce and a slice of tomato. When he bit into the burrito, the filling nearly oozed out over his dish. The chorizo was smoky and piquant, made more so by generous slatherings of the tasty house green salsa that's provided in a large squirt bottle on every table. Our son's burger came topped with American cheese and a dollop of ketchup, mustard, onions, and pickles (which he promptly scraped off in favor of his usual mayo). His fries were crispy and salty, exactly as they should be.

I ordered a BLT on wheat toast (\$5.50) and was surprised at how thick and perfectly crisped the bacon was. So often BLTs seem to be vessels for leftover breakfast bacon — cold, limp, and overwhelmed by the L and the T. In my sandwich, the bacon took center stage; good, because the L was iceberg and the T was bland. But while I appreciate a competent BLT, what really won me over were the tater tots. I realize that tots



are everywhere these days, often dressed up in elaborate outfits that end up obscuring their delicious tot-iness. Not at Tobey's. Here, they're deep-fried balls of potato joy. I made a mixture of mayonnaise and the herby green salsa, took a slug of my beer, and dipped my tots. Life was grand.

Tobey's 19th Hole Cafe opened in 1934, 19 years after the Balboa Golf Course, which was built in 1915 to coincide with the first Panama Exposition. Thus, Tobey's came into being on the eve of the second Exposition, which ran from 1935-'36 and celebrated "modernist" San Diego. The Tobey family still owns the diner, and there's definitely an old-world feel to it. The waitresses (the servers are all women) smile upon you kindly and make sure your food is okay, but they don't hover. This allows you to recover from whatever ails you — whether it be strenuous golfing or a wicked hangover.

On that note, one more breakfast item should be mentioned. The chicken-fried steak topped with gravy and eggs and served with hash browns

and toast is a great deal at \$8.25, since you won't have to eat for the rest of the day (and quite possibly into the next one). All the ingredients are fresh, the crust on the steak shatters upon impact, and the gravy, while thick, isn't gelatinous. Break your egg yolk over the top and make sure to mingle it with the hash browns. Then order a mimosa to balance out the richness of your breakfast and to take the edge off your headache. Sit back in your patio seat and relax while you digest. Sometimes, it's really cool to live in San Diego. ■

# When in El Salvador...

*“Apart from tasting pretty, well, herby, it’s supposed to be an aphrodisiac.”*

It was a dark and rainstormy night. Marvel as our hero tramps undaunted through the dripping streets of Grant Hill. Crosses 26th, 27th, 28th, ever searching for his Shangri-La.

Aha! Suddenly, lights! Camera! ¡Acción! A sign on a rain-spattered wall! “Restaurante El Salvadoreño.”

Yes, it’s painted on a wall behind a chain-link fence protecting an empty lot, but the front’s a fresh-painted olive green, with white-framed windows behind black grilles.

Was down El Salvador way once, long ago. Chowd down at *pupuserias* and drank Kolashampan, that sweet golden soda that tastes like real bubbly, even though there’s no alcohol.

There’s something about gentle fare from a land that’s gone through so much — like that horrific civil war back in the ’80s — that draws you to it. Talk about comfort food...

*Pupusas?* Beautiful word they say comes from the Pibil people, who live down there, and always have.

So in I go, hungry as a horse in a hay barn. The large room is divided into two sections, and even now, at 8:00 p.m., it’s abuzz. Not packed, but no way empty.

It’s all varnished timber and goldy-brown paint. Green columns with painted ropes. A Bible on the welcome desk sits open, the text highlighted in yellow. A wooden plaque hung over the kitchen has been chiseled to say: “Welcome, Bienvenidos!”

Palm-leaf fans whirl slowly overhead. There are blond solid-wood chairs decorated with dark green struts — almost feels Western — and big black-and-white photos of (says the waiter Francisco) the San Salvadoran presidential palace.

Francisco seats me near a group of mainly gringos all chowing down from big sampler plates. Plantains, tamales, enchiladas, fried

yucca sticks, everything arranged around bowls of frijoles and sour cream. Dang, it looks good. Luis, who says he’s the lone *salvadoreño* in the group, claims this is the best *pupusa* place in town.

I ask for Kolashampan, and Francisco leaves a menu. Man, there’s a lot. From all-day breakfast to dozens of dishes.

You can pay about as little or as much as you want. Like, there’s a breakfast of fried yucca with ground pork for \$9.50. Or you can go for the *pupusas* at \$2 each. Two would probably be enough. They have all sorts, but the most popular, Francisco says, is the one stuffed with *chicharrón* and cheese. Seems *chicharrón* for Salvadorans means ground pork mashed almost to a paste.

The one I want is the *pupusa loroco*. That’s the traditional thick tortilla stuffed with the *loroco* flower or *quilite* (“edible herb”). Grows only in Central America. And, hey, apart from tasting pretty, well, herby, it’s supposed to be an aphrodisiac.

They also have tamales with pork or maize (Indian corn) stuffed inside. Or chicken enchiladas (three for \$7.50), or a whole batch of yucca (cassava root) chips, like large french fries, but much tastier, for \$4.50.

And here’s Francisco with...oh, this drink’s called Goya Cola Champagne. Really does taste champagne-y.

Decision time. Have to say that the sampler plate looks delicious. But \$17.99? Then I think: the beautiful Carla will be waiting, starving, hoping, back at the ranch, and that would make it only \$9 each, right? And for sure we’re talking extras for another day. So, what the heck. I order it.

Deliciously good decision, even though I’ll be out a Jackson.

The plate arrives loaded and hot, with a wooden side bowl of *curtido*. Lot of folk have come to places like this thinking *curtido* was cole slaw, then complained that it was

limp and old and vinegary. Me, too. But turns out, that’s what it’s *supposed* to be. Pickled (fermented) cabbage, with onion and carrot topping, designed to add tang to your tongue. Like sauerkraut, or kimchi.

Where to start? When in El Salvador...*pupusa* has got to be the opener. Just sprinkle some salt and it’s a cushiony little flying saucer, toasty on the outside, moist and porky *sabroso* inside. *Pupusa* is the litmus test for any Salvadoran meal, along with the universal aftertaste of corn.

The pork tamal feels like it’s got both the *chicharrón* mixed with maize and extra pork meat. It’s almost liquidy around the meat chunks. The chicken enchilada has more of a fried crispiness. Love it, though I’m gonna have to run for a few buses to sweat all this off. The cornbread-tasting tamal has to have been just-steamed.

“Maria Constanta brought every recipe from El Salvador,” says Francisco. “She’s the lady who started this restaurant in 1995. She and her family still run it.”

He says the farther south you go, the less *picante* the food is. “But I like it,” he says.

“And I’m Mexican.”

Although, now that I take another forkful, this *curtido* is plenty *picante*.

The desserts are custardy, or else rice-pudding types. But I’m full. Plus, the glistening plantains that came with the sampler were beautifully sweet.

I pay. Then, on a thought, count what I’ve got left. Yes! Just enough.

“Could you make me a *pupusa loroco* to go?”

You never know, maybe it does deliver on its aphrodisiacal promise.

Francisco says, head down, staring into his order book, “Good choice, *señor*.” ■

### Starlite Waging the Battle of the Beauj

She's better known for having put together the wine and cocktail program at Starlite, but Kate MacWilliamson has much broader adult-beverage goals.

Her current mission is to

enlighten drinkers to "the magic of Beaujolais." She experienced the magic firsthand several years ago when she visited the region and hopes to wield a bit of it with several hand-selected bottles and a little help from Starlite chef Kathleen Wise during a Beaujolais dinner on Thursday, November 17.

Three Beaujolais (two of which were just released) will be poured, and the accompanying three-course bill of fare will consist of re-creations of some of MacWilliamson's favorite food memories from her time in France.

"The food in Beaujolais is very simple and earthy. One might even call it peasant food," says MacWilliamson. "The simplicity of it is very satisfying and marries wonderfully with the wine."

Dupueble Beaujolais Nouveau made from organically farmed Gamay grapes will be served with a caramelized onion tart topped with local greens, while a 2010 Chateau Thivin

Cote de Bouilly will accompany house-made sausage crafted in the Lyonnaise style from pork, garlic, white wines, and traditional herbs.

The final course will feature a fruity Jean Foillard Beaujolais Nouveau with a lightly tart and only mildly sweet buttermilk custard pie.

## San Diego Beer Week: Day Ten

With roughly 500 events, from pint nights to festivals to all-out, multi-venue fermentable free-for-alls, San Diego Beer Week can be confusing...and that's before you start drinking.

Fortunately, I know a thing or two about craft beer and our local scene and have been doling out daily info on some of the most special and significant goings-on during this ten-day span.

Here are five key opportunities to extract the most out of the final day before SDBW detoxing begins.

**10 a.m. – Pour It Black Festival**  
With the prevalence of sunny weather and hops, our region is mostly about crisp, dry, refreshing beers ranging from straw-hued to golden, but for one day Stone Brewing World Bistro & Gardens will celebrate everything brown and beyond with a fest featuring over 100 porters, stouts, and black IPAs.

**10 a.m. – Beer for Breakfast with Coronado Brewing Company**  
Take advantage of one of the last opportunities to have an eye-opening morning pint or four at Small Bar in University Heights. Hop bombs like Idiot IPA, Frog's Breath IPA, and Hoppy Daze should do wonders cutting through fried pork chops and biscuits smothered with hop sausage gravy.

**Noon – Beer Garden**  
The closing capstone event for the San Diego Brewers Guild,

this outdoor food-and-beer-pairing event features 20 local breweries and 10 local chefs from eateries including Kitchen 1540, the Shores, Harney Sushi, and Karl Strauss. Held at the Lodge at Torrey Pines, beer's never been so classy.

**Noon – All the Rest and the Best of SDBW**

San Diego has tons of big name breweries, but on the final day of Beer Week, PB's San Diego Tap Room will pay homage to the smaller companies such as Vista's Iron Fist and Mother Earth, while finishing off kegs of the special, rare, and unusual beers they had throughout the SDBW.

**Noon – Cable Car Release**  
In a town of great beer, few are as coveted and hard to come by as the Lost Abbey's Cable Car. North Park's Toronado is providing one of the only chances

to score some of this exquisite oak-aged American-style wild ale whose name was inspired by San Francisco, home of the original Toronado.

## Hemingway Sat Here?

“Ernest Hemingway sat right in that corner,” says one of the managers of the Chiki Jai Basque restaurant (corner of 7th and Revolución, Tijuana).

“Right there. When these were booths, he would sit in the first on the right or the third on the left.”

The Chiki Jai (“little party”) is one of the venerable restaurant survivors in Tijuana from its Golden Age. Hemingway admired the jai alai player Pedro Garate, and some say he helped him take over this place back in the 1940s.

Others say Ernest never came here but sent cards to his friend here.

The place has definitely seen plenty of other celebs, though: Ava Gardner, Ronald Reagan, and Errol Flynn all caroused on *vino tinto* in here. Matadors would come in after their bull-fights, and professional Spanish jai alai players would come in at one in the morning after finishing their games next door at the

Fronton Palace. The place would stay open till dawn.

Ava probably flirted with all of them. Even Richard Nixon came down but stayed at the Coronet motel opposite.

Chiki Jai was started for and by the Basque country jai alai players — and Basque, not Spanish or Mexican, is what most of its food is still.

“The paella? Good,” says Rafael Ramirez.

He should know. He won this year's L.A. Cetto contest to cook the best paella at a festival of paella and wine last May. He shows me a picture of his winning paella.

The paella here costs \$9. It's worth it: you'll hardly squeeze through the exit door by the time you finish.

But the dish I love most from this beautiful little eatery is *camarones al ajillo*. Garlic shrimp. Think it's about \$7. Worth every penny.


So did he or didn't the great man come here? I really wanna know.

you might say, across the social divide.

Clue: bunch of fixies leaning on each other outside.

Big open barn space inside, original brick exposed on all walls, ancient redwood rafters. Looks like, rolled up overhead, a huge garage-door-type window, which puts the entire bar area on the street.

This is the spinoff from Basic, down in East Village: Urbn (3085 University Avenue, North Park, 619-255-7300).

Inside, a fan. But what a fan. It's, like, 12 feet across. Looks like the rotor right off a Super Stallion chopper.

"Comes from Big Ass Fans," says Dustin Haarstad, the pork-pie-hat guy behind the bar.

It's a big ol' space. Few booths, one settee arrangement, some high-stool counters, but lots of standing room.

And you know the next three nights — Thursday, Friday, Saturday — it's gonna be packed. You don't see a *Trivial Pursuit* quiz happening here.

Craft beers, on the other hand, are big time, front and center. San Diego Beer Week, all that. Tonight (Thursday) it'll be Hess Brewing, the nano brewery, tiniest of all the 35-plus San Diego breweries, up around Miramar Road.

But this is last night when I haul up to a stool-for-two — cool! — at the bar and order a Mad River Jamaica Red from Dustin (\$5). Beer of the night is from Victory, in Pennsylvania, so I don't feel too bad.

Zach, guy next to me, is gnawing away at "coal-fired wings" from a little black iron skillet. They look so downhome, grandma's-own, farmhouse fry-up, I long to have at them.

Menu promises the chickens had a happy, free-range life. Zach says they taste superb, when I ask him.

On the other hand, guess I'm kinda winged out from U-31. Also, things ain't the cheapest here. We're talking mainly pizzas, which start out at \$9 but mainly end up being around \$15.

On the other hand, there is isn't anything under \$9, now that I look at it. So I go for the meat-ball appetizer from the "Begin" section for \$9, when Chelsea the barkeep promises meatballs also come in that little skillet.

And they're big, with a luscious tomato-based sauce, sour cream, a bay leaf, and tons of flavor, and oh-so filling. I can feel my gut swelling.

I start talking to Dustin. He's their passionate cocktail guy.

"We're into craft beer big-time here," he says. "But I'm especially into craft cocktails. There's a revolution happening. Everything is done by hand. People want their drinks to be interesting, and new ideas are thought up right here. You're on your toes all the time with this crowd."

He's doing two "say what?" things here. One is making "beer cocktails" such as the "Georgia on My Mind," a mix of bourbon, peach liqueur, and Allagash White Ale plus muddled

peaches, oranges, and lemons that've been "coal fired" in their same pizza oven. It costs \$10.

Beer and bourbon? Next time I have a spare Hamilton, I'll have to try it.

The other thing? "Not quite up and running yet," he says. "But soon we're going to have cocktails on tap, just like beer. Gonna start off with a new take on an Old Fashioned. The crowds we get here, it'll save so much standing-around time."

Me, I can't help imagining, after a couple of those, trying to count how many blades that Big Ass fan has while it spins around. I almost fall off my stool just thinking about it.

Kidding, but I swear, what a hike. I get off the Blue Line trolley at 24th Street National City. Dark already, around six. I head south to Mile of Cars Way (aka 24th street), turn right, head west, dive under the trolley and then the 5 freeway, and come out

into kinda satellite civilization.

There are a couple of new buildings on the left, including a Best Western motel, and there's an ancient railroad depot. Then, nothing.

Now I'm pointing south down Marina Way, heading into complete silence with bushes climbing over the fence reaching out to you. It's California before it became California.

And then: Tijuana! You come to the end of the road and the beginning of the water and the blaze of lights, like spilled diamonds: Tijuana on the near horizon.

This is Pier 32 Marina, National City's own. You pass a sculptured skeleton of a boat and then decks with tables and chairs. Upstairs on the deck of the marina building I spot this lady Kimberly, grilling chicken thighs and potatoes on a grill. Turns out she's on a boat that's moored in this marina. She's just sailed around the world and is cooking her meal here on a grill provided by the marina. Cool.

Then, whew. Into the warmth of the Waterfront Grill (3201 Marina Way, at Pier 32 Marina, National City, 619-718-6240).

This is what I've been looking for. Feels small in this chill night air, with the windows closed. But I can see everything opens up and out onto the deck when the sun's up.

I flop back in a chair and

check the menu. Hey hey! Happy hour, 4-7 p.m.: \$2 beers, \$2 fish tacos. I order one of each.

A three-generation family of five at the next table says this is their first time. "We were riding the bayside bike track and came across it," says David, the dad.

His own dad, David ("Bud") has had "British fish and chips." Cost \$9.95.

"Good," he says. "Really good."

His son David Jr. had the "new bigger half-pound beef burger," as the menu calls it (\$10.50).

"I'd've liked it rarer," says David Jr., "but it was good."

I have my delish fish taco, plug the MGB, and order their beef burger to take home to Carla. It's not part of happy hour. And it's \$10.50. Most regular dishes are this price and up. But it sounds good: Half-pound patty with roasted garlic aioli, red-leaf lettuce, tomato, onion fritters, and blue cheese (or you could have smoked gouda, mozzarella, or pepperjack). And it comes with a side of garlic fries, or salad, bean salad, potato salad, or coleslaw. I go for the bean salad.

I hate to leave, actually. Desperate to come back at sunset, drink some Green Flash (which they have) and watch for the green flashes.

This National City waterfront is kinda like Bali Hai. It's been

here for years, but nobody's done anything about it till now. I feel like an explorer who's discovered sophisticated life on Mars.

P.S. The burger is a hit with Carla, and for me it is a beautiful success — not just because of the huge patty and tons of blue cheese but because of the delectable bean salad, which includes black beans, garbanzos, red and green chili-pepper chunks, tomato, and pineapple. I stuff it into the burger and presto: the National City Burger is born!

Next time: either sunset or one of their weekend breakfasts, out on the balcony.

### It's No Lie...Fuego One Is Hittin' the Road

Bar impresario Scot Blair has a lot on his plate. So much so that the owner of Hamilton's Tavern, Small Bar, Eleven, and Monkey Paw is lightening his load.

Blair's bidding adieu to Fuego One, a food truck that, when not making rounds at local beer events, holds a regular spot outside Normal Heights' aforementioned craft brew and live-music spot, Eleven.

Before riding off into the sunset, Blair and Small Bar manager Louis Mello will pull off at Linda Vista's Home Brew Mart on Thursday, November

17 for a last hurrah that includes a one-night-only reincarnation of a local beer-biz forerunner, Mission Beach's The Liars' Club.


Back in the day, before craft beer was big (or even a term), The Liars' Club, which was owned by Mello, was one of a handful of spots offering anything beyond Bud and Coors. The first kegs and casks of brews such as Ballast Point's Sculpin IPA and Sour Wench Blackberry Ale were sold at TLC.

Both of those beers will be on tomorrow night (along with 16 others, including such rarities as dried habanero Piper Down Scottish Ale, Black Marlin Porter on nitro, and Wahoo Wheat brewed with ginger, lime, Szechuan peppercorns, and long peppers) at Ballast Point's tasting room inside Home Brew Mart.

On the food front, Fuego One will be pumping out popular TLC dishes, including their Fuego steak-melt sandwich, ahi tuna sandwich, and sweet-potato fries, and HBM's neighbor, Fiji Yogurt, will be offering up a mango, lime, and Tabasco-pepper sorbet made with Longfin Lager wort (the unfermented, non-alcoholic liquid base for that beer).

The event will take place from 4 to 7 p.m. Home Brew Mart is located in Suite 406 at 5401 Linda Vista Road.

## Stanbul Express!

How come kebob shops are suddenly everywhere? I'm looking at the answer here.

Fact is, you get a lot of bang for your buck. And it's flavorful, and it's Turkey and the Middle East's and Europe's fast food du jour.

This is late night, downtown, at the Café Istanbul (921 Sixth Avenue, between E Street and Broadway, 619-544-1700). It's not far from Hustler, Larry Flynt's store.

Not the primo spot downtown but just as old and quaint as the Gaslamp, next door on Fifth. And if you're on a kebob kick as I am, this is probably the closest to the bus routes that run up and down Broadway.

Inside, one wall's all mirror, so it doesn't feel narrow.

Masood, the one-man band here, says it has been open eight months. He's Chaldean, but the owner's from Istanbul. And yes, they cater to the late-night crowd hauling out of Gaslamp bars.

I see Masood has two shawarmas, gyros, döner kebabs ("turning kebab") going.

"One's beef, the other is lamb," he says.

I can feed my lamb fetish,

though I'm almost tempted by the swords loaded with beef or chicken for the \$8.49 shish kebab plates that come with "hummus, salad, rice, and home-made bread."

The guy at the next table has the beef plate. But no, stay loyal to my lamb. Could order the lamb sandwich or wrap for \$5.99, but I go for the lamb döner shawarma plate for \$8.49, because it has the hummus and the salad.

Of course, this is shaved lamb piled onto a spit and slow roasted, with the fat dripping off. So one, being shaved, it's guaranteed tender; two, slow cooked means it keeps its flavor; and three, its healthy, fat-wise. It has all dripped off.

Man, there's a lot. Yes, I love mixing it in with the hummus and salad, so a lot of oil involved, but good olive oils.

Next time, the sword kebab. Out on the little patio.

## French-ish

Café Bleu has moved to Mission Hills, to a location just a bit away from its old spot on University Avenue.

Now on Washington Street over by the Red Door (it's becoming quite the colorful neighborhood), Bleu Bistro and Wine Lounge (it's full name) is

more of a neighborhood joint, with weekly prix fixe menu deals. I stopped in on a Sunday night and ordered off the prix fixe menu. Here's a taste of what I sampled:

The *amuse bouche*, drowning in some kind of aioli, wasn't to my taste, but then again, I don't like whipped-egg products (mayonnaise especially). I was so distracted by the sauce that I can't even remember what was under it.

The French Onion soup was a highlight. All the flavors were spot-on, the onions were expertly caramelized, the broth wasn't over-salted and just the right amount of savory — it's a pity it was only lukewarm.

I ordered the vegetarian entrée. Though visually it's a mucky pile of something I would avoid looking at if I were to pass it on the street, it was actually quite tasty. Beets, creamy mushroom polenta, grilled asparagus — the only thing I allowed David to eat was the celery. Again, this dish was only lukewarm. Quite the bummer, because a bit hotter and it would have been straight-up awesome.

David really liked his steak frites, and that's all I really have to say about that one, because I was too engrossed in my own — oh wait, I forgot I did try those frites, and they were excellent when dipped in my pile o' sauce and other stuff.

Ah, dessert. David got something ice-creamy — I think it was a bread pudding of sorts. He seemed to like it, even though it arrived with most of the ice cream already melted. After I got over the strange bread-to-cheese ratio with my slice of Manchego cheese plate, I did enjoy the dried fruits that accompanied the bite of cheese, and the toast-ettes had a nice salty crunch to them, which complimented the honey and fruit.

First impression? The service was friendly and informed, the ambiance is okay, the food was good but could have been better (and hotter), and the wine pairings were great.

It wasn't a French restaurant as much as French-ish. But for a neighborhood joint, it was comfortable and easy to get to, and I may check it out again to see if I was just there on an off night in terms of food prep. Try it out for yourself and let me know what you think.

## Joan Crawford's Bar — at Brian's

"The dents in the wood," says Brian. "There. There! Dime sized. Here's another one. That's her stilettos when she danced, right here, on the bar. Her bar."

Talking Joan Crawford, Mommy Dearest. Actress in all

those black-and-white movies, '30s, '40s.

She owned this bar. She danced on this bar. Though not in this bar. This is Brian's 24 (828 Sixth Avenue, between E and F street, downtown, 619-702-8410), the all-night, all-day bar-restaurant that's part of the St. James Hotel (now owned by Ramada), which was put up in 1913, ten stories high, downtown's first skyscraper hotel.

And Joan owned the counter and backboard. It was part of a house she had in Italy. Seems they shipped it over to the States, and since she died it has been in a bunch of bars. Ended up here. Boy, that big beautiful backboard must've seen a few things in its day.

So, yeah, the bar is one thing this place is famous for. The other is their peanut butter burger. "Don't be afraid," says the menu. "Our 1/2-pound patty is topped with peanut butter, bacon, and cheddar cheese, \$11.99. If it wasn't great, we wouldn't serve it."

And man, I've had it. It's oozy, sloppy, bacon-salty, sweet, almost like a Thai burger with that peanuty thing going on.

But tonight, it's late. Gonna slip into something light. Order the "light eaters' fish and chips," a single cod fillet, fries, tub of tartar sauce, \$6.99.

It's fine, and by the time we're done talking about Joan's wild

parties (she had a few), it's gone.

This place is definitely old-school. Has a '40s vibe you can't imitate. And what I like is they do breakfast all day and all night, including an "absolutely everything" omelet with six eggs, bacon, sausage, ham, mushrooms, peppers, spinach, tomatoes, onions, all topped with cheddar cheese, \$14.99.

My fave, last time I downed a breakfast, was the Italian frittata (\$12.99), loaded (of course) with Italian sausage.

Before you leave, go through the door into the hotel. Check out its two elevators. They're the same li'l ol' elevators as in 1913. Back then, the hotel claimed they were the "fastest in the world."

Today, same elevators, same speed. It's the world that's gotten faster.

The fact that these midget cabbages have gotten so hot in a day where bacon and short ribs



are everywhere is remarkable. It's a great sign that the American palate is expanding. Ditto the creativity of chefs, who are doing more than serving up plain-as-day sprouts worthy of the upturned nose we afforded them when we were kids.

I've come across some nice roasted, fried, balsamic-dressed, pancetta-studded, crème fraîche adorned versions, but I enjoyed one most-interesting take on this veggie earlier this week at Little Italy's Davanti Enoteca. They shave their sprouts raw, then simply mix in some Pecorino Romano, Parm, and a light vinaigrette. The result is a salad that's like a low-dressed slaw with built-in salty bite and a refreshing quality I'd have never thought was possible from this often bitter vegetable. It's made for a delightful start to a meal that featured two other ingredients that, like

brussels sprouts, I at one time in my life abhorred.

One of those is faro, an ancient grain that's to 2011 what quinoa was to 2009. The problem with it is that it usually tastes and feels like an ancient grain: earthy to the point of tasting dirty and as gummy as undercooked macaroni. It's been the bland foil of more duck dishes than I care to remember, but here it's served in a seasonal dish incorporating roasted butternut squash, arugula, and balsamic vinegar. It's a true component rather than an obligatory starch, which allows it to meld with its counterparts to make for a tasty dish that's sweet, earthy, and autumnal.

Rounding out my cavalcade of lesser-ordered edibles was *polpo*

*con rafano*, seared octopus tentacles drizzled with a horseradish aioli served over warm fingerling potato salad. Typical treatments of this cephalopod leave them tough, yet the appendages at Davanti were not only tender but boldly seasoned. That zestiness stood up to the spice of the aioli and the salt provided by flecks of *finocchiona* (Tuscan fennel salami) in the potato salad. It's one of the better and more complete octopus dishes I've had in a long time and yet another dish at this restaurant that makes a solid case for ordering outside the box.

assumed. I have it in writing that when they took over, they assumed all the debts, which includes that SBA loan.” Puma disagrees: “We were held harmless for that loan. We did not assume that loan.” Nilforshan, with the blessing of his attorney Sean Simpson, says he will provide the sale agreement for a third party to inspect. Puma says he will provide the communication from the bank telling him to stop paying Nilforshan after he checks with his attorney.

Puma says he was making payments to Nilforshan “for close to a year before we were told by the bank they were going to repossess.” Repossess? “They can take equipment, but they can’t take the business,” says Puma. “And we control the liquor license.” The Department of Alcohol Beverage Control website shows that 4th&B’s liquor license is owned by Speth Brothers Inc., named after 4th&B founder Bob Speth. That website lists three corporate officers — the Pumas and chief financial officer George Salameh.

Puma says Nilforshan “doesn’t own any part of Speth Brothers [Inc.]” “I was brought in as a managing partner,” says Salameh who now manages a restaurant. “They used me to help them qualify to get a loan to buy 4th&B. They had no management experience.

Once they got the loan they decided they didn’t need me anymore. I was blackballed.” Salameh, who was with 4th&B for seven months, says

he has filed a lawsuit against the Pumas. “He always had an ulterior motive,” says Salameh. “He has not been clean with any of us. He bullied me out of that place. It almost got physical one time.”

Vince Puma: “George was supposed to come in with one-third of the money, and he did not put in one penny. My wife ran the fleet department at McCune Chrysler Jeep for 20 years. She has plenty of managerial experience.”

Judy Puma says that she “worked at McCune for about 13 to 14 years. I did not ‘run’ the fleet department, but I did sell and manage all of my deals that went through the fleet department, which was a large share of the business that did give me the managerial skills I needed. Plus, I have my

his boat in a Florida marina last week. “I have heard about all this, but that’s their battle to fight. I’m out of the business. When I retired, I took my payout in cash.”

Speth says he doesn’t want to get involved now. “I don’t have anything in the game.... But, it’s all about who controls the liquor license and whose name the lease is in.”

Speth says the current rent on the building “is three or four times what I was paying.” An insider says rent for 4th&B is \$29,000 a month.

**Profit of the Heart.** Music and DVD sales continue their downward spiral, but San Diego-based video archive company Reelin’ in the Years has had a banner 2011. Over

the past two months, RITY has released nine DVDs, including titles from the Hollies, Miles Davis, Ray Charles, and six volumes of their *Jazz Icons* series.

Founded in 1992, RITY represents more than 35 television stations and independent archives in Europe, Australia, New Zealand, and the U.S. Last month, the company signed one of its biggest deals yet, adding to their library of over 20,000 hours of music footage all the interviews and performances of the musical guests that appeared on the *Tonight Show* starring Johnny Carson from 1962–1992. Plans include licensing the material for use in television programs and documentaries.

While there is footage included of artists such as David Bowie, Paul McCartney, and ZZ Top, RITY president David Peck notes the typical *Tonight Show* musical guests were softer-edged acts. “There’s more soul, R&B, and country than rock,” Peck said. “Rock was not a specialty.” Although the 30-year span covers thousands of *Tonight Show* episodes, Peck notes quite a bit is missing from the Carson archive. “The first ten years is mostly gone,” he explained. In 1972 Carson looked for past clips to include in a tenth-anniversary special, only to find much had been wiped. “Tape was expensive. They were erased two or three times,” Peck reports. “From

# I Play Kitchen Tools

*“I don’t belong to anyone/ My heart is heavy as an oil drum.”*

**M**y music sounds like Joanna Newsom meets Wilco meets Gershwin meets Rilo Kiley,” says Kelsea Little, who first earned widespread attention in 2006 with local teen-trio the Wrong Trousers. Their acoustic performance of the Buggles’ “Video Killed the Radio Star” at Balboa Park went viral, gathering over 600,000 YouTube views.

Little is a multi-instrumentalist, mainly known as a harpist and singer. “The album title [*Personal Myth*] is basically a term I’ve coined for the way I experience the world, a projection of a persona, befitting for different times and places. But, after awhile, I lose sight of where my real self begins and the fabricated one ends, so in a sense I become mythic to myself. Personal myth.”

Recorded at local Cabana Recording Studio with Anthony “Twon” Ridenhour and David Miano, two singles will be released with non-album B-sides “Us Stew” and “Debauché.” Wrong Trousers bassist Mack Leighton plays on four of the tracks.

“On the album,” says Little, “I play concert harp, piano, electric guitar, acoustic guitar, ukulele, main vocals, backup vocals, various kitchen tools, and maybe a few other things. On electric bass we had James Albers and on string bass Mack Leighton. Wyatt Stone played electric and acoustic guitar, pedal steel, mandolin, and backup vocals. José Guerrero played kick-ass drums, Sean Burdeaux [Paper Forest] played electric guitar and backup vocals, and Tasha Locke played four different-sized saxophones.”

Newsom’s debut solo full-length drops Saturday, December 3, with a release party at Lestat’s.

### WHAT CDS ARE IN YOUR CAR PLAYER?

1. Broni, *To Get Her Together*. “I met Broni, an Australian musician, at a birthday show a few weeks ago. I’d always heard everyone in the music scene talk about him, and we finally met and he gave me his CD. I love it!”
2. Kerouac: *Kicks Joy Darkness*. “I’ve been infatuated with beat literature for years, and my fellow beat-lover Chris Bopp got me this album for my birthday. It’s a bunch of different people and musicians reading or singing Jack Kerouac’s work, and it’s brilliant.”
3. *Bon Iver*, self-titled. “This is on repeat because it’s one of the best albums I’ve ever heard.”

### CD YOU WERE EMBARRASSED TO MENTION?

“I don’t know if Phil Collins counts as embarrassing, but I love that man.”

### WHERE DO YOU HANG OUT?

“Balboa Park, especially on free-museum Tuesdays.”

### FAVORITE SOLO MUSICIAN?

“I used to go to Largo in L.A. all the time when it was still on Fairfax, and Jon Brion was a big mainstay there. He uses multiple-loop pedals and plays every instrument, so he’ll start out on piano and move to drums, then bass, then guitar, and then, 20 minutes after this amazing buildup, he starts singing — and your socks are just knocked clean off.”

### YOUR BEST CONCERT?

“When the Wrong Trousers played at the FM 94/9

Independence Jam, it was so thrilling to be a part of a festival. I pretended it was Coachella, which it is my ultimate goal to play, and the crowd was extremely supportive. They even had us sign things and take pictures after, and our stuff was at the merch booth. A real live merch booth!”

### MOST DIFFICULT SONG TO COVER ON THE HARP?

“Anything with a lot of key changes. With the pedal harp, you make your sharps and flats by moving one through seven of the foot pedals up or down. So, say I was covering ‘Bohemian Rhapsody,’ which I’ve been working on, my feet are working more than my hands.”

### ANY FEARS OR PHOBIAS?

“I get a little nervous from time to time about natural disasters, especially after I took an entire educational course on the geography of California, which is in the ‘We’re all going to perish in a giant earthquake pretty soon’ class.”

### WHO SHOULD PLAY YOU IN A MOVIE?

“Zooey Deschanel, of course. I love her!”

### EVER BEEN A CRIME VICTIM?

“I had my cell phone, Ray-Bans, and an iPod stolen out of my purse at UCSD. I took it as a sign from the universe that I don’t need expensive things. I like to look on the bright side.”

### WHERE DO YOU TAKE OUT-OF-TOWN GUESTS?

“I usually take them to one of my favorite vegetarian

“‘In California,’ by Joanna Newsom, especially these lyrics: ‘I don’t belong to anyone/ My heart is heavy as an oil drum/ And I don’t want to be alone/ My heart is yellow as an ear of corn/ Some nights, I just never go to sleep at all.’”

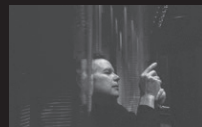

**Melt-Banana often sounds like an early '80s hardcore 45 played at 78 rpm. At other times they sound like a hyperactive five-year-old playing a video game while a badger attacks a drum kit and an infant screams in your ear. I swear it sometimes sounds like someone took all the digital traffic on the internet and played it through incredibly loud speakers installed next to my bed while I'm trying to sleep. The racket is shocking, irritating, and exhilarating.**

Melt-Banana was formed in Japan in 1992 by lead-shrieker Yasuko Onuki (a.k.a. Yako) and guitarist Ichirou Agata (a.k.a. Agata) and

quickly became one of the leading ambassadors of the Japanese noise scene. It's incredible to think that anyone could play music this intense for very long, and Yako and Agata have burned through numerous bandmates. Over the years, they have worked with Steve Albini, Mr. Bungle's Mike Patton, avant-garde composer John Zorn, and most of the leading purveyors of noise in the United States. In fact, they have a much bigger audience in America and the United Kingdom than they do at home, but this is speaking relatively: the noise scene is a rarified world.

Although it may strike outsiders as strange to say, within that world Melt-Banana represents the relatively accessible end of the spectrum. It's more extreme than, say, Mars Volta, but not as far out as Merzbow. It's wilder than the most far-out moments of Sonic Youth but



not as arty as the Boredoms. Melt-Banana's official website describes it as "a rock band with a spice of punk taste."

Retox and XBXR also perform.



**Who is Chris Isaak? The crooner of heartbreak ballads, a fashion icon, a comic television host, or all of the above? He's always been a hard target; I've never known how to assimilate his act. It's great, pop-oriented stuff, but I don't know when to take him seriously. His best songs are mildly eerie, a fact not lost on filmmaker David Lynch. Lynch is known for his unsettling and sometimes violent motion pictures. And Lynch was Isaak's ride to the top when he put two of the singer/songwriter's compositions into the soundtrack of *Blue Velvet*. Lynch would again feature Isaak music in *Wild at Heart*, a celluloid freak show featuring**

Nicolas Cage. Stanley Kubrick incorporated a song by Isaak into the soundtrack of his *Eyes Wide Shut*, another disturbing film.

That Isaak's music fits with such darkness is confusing, due to the wholesome Ricky Nelson image Isaak has fashioned over the years. Ricky Nelson...or possibly Buddy Holly or even Elvis. There is in Isaak a resemblance to all three.

Isaak, by the way, can do a spot-on impersonation of a young Elvis. Most of the Elvis impersonators work the King's later years, the bloated flashy jump-suited Vegas era, because that is easier to mimic. But Isaak's ability to sing with the acrobatic grace of young Elvis singing "That's All Right" served him well when he went to Sun Studios in Memphis earlier this year and stood in the same place as Elvis and recorded something of a tribute CD, an album of cov-

ers by the old masters: Cash, Lewis, Orbison, Presley, and Perkins. It's the comfort food of music, sure-footed and authentic. Finally, a Chris Isaak I can believe.

## Donkey Jacket Henry’s Funeral Shoe

Only a few of the  
“crank-it” tunes on  
this album fit the  
implications of its  
name, which refers  
to Welsh mining  
apparel. “Mission  
& Maintenance” is  
one of those. “Be  
Your Own Invention”  
leans on a riff that,  
to these ears, fuses  
“Spirit in the Sky”  
with ZZ Top. And am  
I the only one who  
feels Jim Diamond’s  
mixes are starting to  
sound awfully Jon-  
Spencer-assembly-  
line? Or who prefers  
blues-rock’s origina-

tors, along with those  
who’ve thrown some logs  
on the fire?

Anyway, there’s hope:  
style and tempo varia-  
tion suggests a healthy  
dose of humility and  
objectivity. “Love Is a  
Fever” welds the dis-  
torted “Southern” blues stomp that’s becoming  
a cliché with the British slant (Rory Gallagher,  
Duster Bennett), at least as likely to inhabit  
the psyches of the Welsh brothers compris-  
ing HFS. The band engages with the shuffling  
narrative of “Bottom to Top” and a song John  
Lennon didn’t live to write, “Across the Sky,”  
as much as when it blisters (“Anvil & Chains,”  
“Dog Scratched Ear”) — maybe more. While  
there’s nothing noteworthy in the scaled-down  
prettiness of “Heart on Fire,” quiet flares go up  
with “Across the Sky.” If the Clifford Brothers  
start future efforts from such an unassuming  
place and more organically incorporate heavier  
influences, they could set off consistently gasp-  
inducing fireworks.

### Grouplove Cruise

The expansive Grou-  
plove sound spilled  
over the brightly lit San  
Diego Bay as the audi-  
ence aboard the *Horn-  
blower* kicked Hallow-  
een weekend into high  
gear. The band was an  
excellent selection for  
the drunken revelry  
of 91X’s annual “Boos  
Cruise.” Warm, dance-  
friendly fodder from  
their debut record  
*Never Trust a Happy  
Song* vied for the  
deck’s attention with  
scantly clad twenty-  
somethings desperately  
clinging to buckets of  
lukewarm ale.

There is a special

kind of energy in the air  
for a Halloween show  
on a moving vessel that  
Grouplove attacked from  
just the right angle. With  
the iconic downtown skyline  
and Coronado bridge as  
a backdrop, the five-piece  
orchestra had the audience  
in sing-along mode for the manic pop of “Tongue  
Tied” and “Lovely Cup.” The crisp vocal interplay  
between frontman Christian Zucconi and his sidekick  
Hannah Hooper, both sporting Day of the Dead face-  
paint, provided the melodic framework for a robust  
soundscape. Grouplove kept their hour-long set  
upbeat and poignant, finishing things off with the  
cascading brilliance of “Colours,” their breakout hit  
receiving play everywhere from local radio to video  
game soundtracks.

# the HERE'S DEAL

## Downtown Johnny Brown's

"We were the first bar to have Arrogant Bastard," says Downtown Johnny Brown's owner Todd Alexander. "Stone had their release party here. John Brown really embraced the local beer movement. When I bought the bar six years ago, I added casks. We still don't carry any macros. The first thing I did was reach out to make relationships with Pizza Port, Stone, Alpine, people like that."

Johnny Brown's claims to be the first craft-beer bar in San Diego, starting about 14 years ago. Now, the craft-beer boom presents new obstacles to bars like Johnny Brown's.

"For the past two years, one of the biggest challenges has been that some of the best breweries in town have been selling so much onsite that they don't bother to distribute," Alexander says. "You can't get kegs."

Regardless, Johnny Brown's offers 17 rotating taps of pilsners, wheats, IPAs, and other micro-brewed varieties, which go for an intoxicating \$3 a

pint as Beer of the Day.

Established in 1987, this hidden gem next to the Civic Theatre is the charming lovechild of a sports bar and an Irish dive. The walls are spackled with old license plates, football photos, and flatscreens streaming the game at every possible vector to a comfortable pastiche of professionals, sports fans, and tap hounds.

An expansive dining room holds 135 patrons, a pool table, and shuffleboard, while Johnny Brown's patio seats about 200. Accruing most of its business from Beer Week and theater crowds, the bar has also seen a reported 60 percent boost in business from the Occupy San Diego crowd, which began occupying the plaza in early October.

In addition to tasty brews and free popcorn, Johnny Brown's menu (which recent-

ly expanded to include grilled mahi mahi mango tacos and a house smoked brisket) offers classic finger foods, soups, salads, burgers (\$8.25–9.75), desserts, and daily specials. Cheese sticks and hot wings go for 35 cents a pop on Mondays, while fish tacos and sliders are a buck on

weekdays from 3 to 6 p.m.

The budget beverages at Johnny Brown's (\$5 Long Islands on Thursdays) are enough to make one empathize with a woodcarving on one wall, which proclaims, "Often in error, never in doubt."

"We were planning on adding a couple more components," he says, "but when we tasted it with cranberry and pineapple juice, I ended up having one of those Alfred Hitchcock flashbacks to my childhood. I was eating fruit cocktail. I had a strong memory of sitting there with my brothers and fighting over the cherry. I thought it tasted just like Dole fruit cocktail syrup."

A much lighter version of this viscous varietal from a can — at only 150 calories — Kitchen says, the Pier View, like its namesake, is also a visual delight,

"When you

shake it properly, really hard," he says, "because of the pineapple juice, you get a really fine froth over the top of the drink that looks neat."

And the Pier View has an added feature — "We garnish it with a cherry because, as we tell people, that way you don't have to fight over it."

**Kitchen Proof:** *With a mix of fruit flavors, the Pier View also shows a gentle suggestion of the vodka underneath, which reminds your taste buds that they've grown up since last they've had fruit cocktail.*

# Brief Idyll

Colin knows he is being used, but what man fights being used by Marilyn?

Marilyn Monroe in England, Werner Herzog in Texas, George Clooney in Hawaii, Serge Gainsbourg in Paris (and next week, Scorsese's *Hugo* in Paris). Off we go:

## My Week with Marilyn

Hardly anyone recalls that Marilyn Monroe

won major French and Italian awards for playing Elsie in *The Prince and the Showgirl* (1957). But then, how many people watch Monroe films for her acting? That is understandable but unfortunate, because in her self-doubting, highly specialized way she could be terrific. Laurence Olivier, though often wishing to kill her when he directed and starred with Marilyn, knew it.

That is the key fact of *My Week with*

*Marilyn*, in which a great-acting Sir faces a great American star and sees that the camera will never love him as it so easily does her. I wish the movie elaborated on that by showing how, despite their radi-

cally contrasting knowledge and style, Monroe and Olivier were both intuitive searchers whose best work gambled on

courage—no matter how much she bunched into Hollywood vamping and he into theatrical bravura. You don't get to moments like her slow, wistful dance toward a tree in *The Misfits* or his heart-felt, envious remembrance of an old blues singer in *The Entertainer* without offering up some soul.

As the creaky prince in the 1957 film, a packaging of what used to be called "Ruritanian romance" (the pinnacle was

1953's *Roman Holiday*), Olivier retreated into royal mannerisms and a two-ton accent. He was fairly witty but hardly inspired. Kenneth Branagh plays Olivier with some humanity peeping through the stiff mannerisms. He goes half crazy

as Marilyn blows lines, keeps everyone waiting, and obeys her adhesive Method coach, Paula Strasberg (Zoë Wanamaker, cuddly as a blowtorch). As Monroe, the bold and fluent Michelle Williams rules Branagh's Olivier almost as easily as she did the dog in *Wendy and Lucy*.

This bounce off the 1957 film, by director Simon Curtis and writer Adrian Hodges, is based on a memoir by Colin Clark, who was a "gofer" assistant on the movie (and also son of the esteemed art historian Kenneth Clark). The story quickly falls into the arms of Colin's nervous crush on Monroe.

His brief idyll (how true, how fanciful?) is handled with touching smartness by gifted Eddie Redmayne. Colin knows he is being used, but what man fights being used by Marilyn? (Her husband Arthur Miller couldn't—nor, later, writing about MM, could Norman Mailer.) This spoils Colin's interest in a wardrobe girl, played with charismatic sparkle by *Harry Potter* beauty Emma Watson, who seems ready to carry a full lead.

By flaunting Colin, Marilyn one-ups the important, controlling males and even goes skinny-dipping with him. Her wiles are indulgent if not cynical, and Colin is so graciously available, so thoughtfully English. Williams, whose face can look closer to young Leslie Caron or Brit star Brenda De Banzie than to Marilyn, goes beyond the wow hair and lipstick, and she doesn't rely heavily on the famous baby-sexpot voice.

Rich in nuance, Williams radiates the vulnerability of a natural who lacks self-esteem and doesn't trust her talent. But when she turns on the sizzle and loves the kick of it, you can feel silly for worrying about her. She empowers this odd, gossipy, fetching movie.

## The Descendants

In the Hawaii of *The Descendants*, Matt King (George Clooney) is a rich, hand-

some lawyer facing heavy pressure. His risk-driven, somewhat alienated wife is in a coma after a boating accident. His two upset daughters are full of snark. His many comfy cousins want him to sell 20,000 pristine acres of Kauai for which Matt is the highly ambivalent trustee. At times the story feels like *The Little Foxes* folded into a Hawaiian travelogue, as Matt heads off with the girls to track down a stranger who is also nibbling at the land deal.

The trip stays on Hawaiian time, with so little dramatic momentum that it's almost another coma. This plodding disappointment from Alexander Payne, creator of the brilliant *Sideways*, is like a stressed holiday, a lachrymose luau. There is plenty of good scenery, Hawaiian singing, maybe the first-ever scene of crying underwater, a wee role for surfing-god Laird Hamilton, and some fine performances: Robert Forster as a grumpy gramps, Nick Krause as an amusing dork-dude, Matthew Lillard as a guilty guy, Judy Greer as his guiltless wife, and (the best) Shailene Woodley as Matt's older daughter.

As for Clooney, nice try, but his beautifully haired handsomeness is only slightly dented by emotion.

## Into the Abyss

I went to Conroe when it was just a hick town, one of the rustic Texas nowheres in the flat pine country north of Houston. No need to return, thank you, but Werner Herzog's *Into the Abyss* hauled me back with compelling power. Overbuilt McMansions now thrive among the pines, but there are still plenty of backwoods in which to dump three bodies. Which teens Michael Perry and Jason Burkett did in 2001, before joy riding in a sports car stolen from one victim (the car was their motive). This begins to feel like a Southern branch of Michael Lesy's great, disturbing book *Wisconsin Death Trip*.

They were quickly caught, claiming innocence but found guilty on strong evidence. The fearless German director, who will go *anywhere*, reached them in prison. Boyish, goofily smiling Perry would be strapped to the lethal-injection table a week after telling the diplomatic, almost priestly Herzog that he planned to soon be in heaven. Burkett lucked out. His dad, an old con as remorseful as drunken Marmeladov in *Crime and Punishment*, testified about Jason's rotten childhood and got him a life sentence. The father's sagging, shamed confession to Herzog is the heart of the movie, which is against capital punishment because, well, aren't we all suffering humans?

Herzog is a squishy advocate (remember how he seemed to make a case for the bear-loving nut in *Grizzly Man*?) but an effective searcher. Everyone, including the convicts and devastated family members, has words that resonate. Herzog's fabled luck still holds. Only he could have found the prison chaplain who, standing near potter's field graves, turns weepy about having almost run over squirrels with a golf cart. And there is a sweet, daffy girl, so drawn to lifer Jason that she sees a rainbow over the prison as divine sanction. *Into the Abyss*, stripped to a very basic style, is less a true-life crime drama than a grimly candid slurry of abuse, waste, guilt, ignorance, and grief, though laced with love and furtive hints of redemption.

**Gainsbourg: A Heroic Life**

Singer and composer Serge Gainsbourg (1928–1991) was a culture totem in France, but Joann Sfar's partly fantasized tribute film loses something in trans-Atlantic translation. Based on Sfar's graphic novel, this quirky homage is vivid in early scenes of Jewish child Lucien Ginsburg, boyishly teasing anti-Semites in Nazi-

occupied Paris. The antic and artistic imp (Kacey Mottet Klein) is reminiscent of zany Zazie in Louis Malle's *Zazie dans le Métro*, and he has a comical alter-ego—a bloated fascist caricature of a Jew, visualized as a giant puppet, Lucien's personal riposte to his fears.

Whimsy withers when Lucien grows into adult Serge (Eric Elmosnino), a hard-smoking, wine-and-wench guy who seems both cocky and scared. He is pushed from painting into music by a new, imaginary muse whose hook nose could have embarrassed even Fagin in *Oliver Twist*. The movie flaunts famous women: Juliette Gréco (Anna Mouglalis), Brigitte Bardot (Laetitia Casta), wife Jane Birkin (the late Lucy Gordon). All are ripe and ready to give scrawny Serge some well-fleshed comfort. Gainsbourg, a mutt and a runt, remains more pampered and provocative than heroic.

## news of the WeiRD

### LEAD STORY

— An option for suicide “with elegance and euphoria” is how Lithuanian-born Ph.D. candidate Julijonas Urbonas (London’s Royal College of Art) described his “Euthanasia (Roller) Coaster,” currently on the drawing board. Urbonas’s model of “gravitational aesthetics” would be a third-mile-long, 1600-foot-high thrill ride engineered to supply 10 Gs of centrifugal force (a spin at about 220 mph) to induce cerebral hypoxia, forcing blood away from the head and denying oxygen to the brain. Euphoria (and disorientation and anxiety, but not pain) are likely states to precede the brain’s shutdown. Urbonas insisted that users would have the option through the first two minutes of the three-minute ride to rethink their decision and bail out (or else to push the final “FALL” button). Suicide is legal in four European countries and Oregon and Washington.

### Government in Action!

— In August, the Securities and Exchange Commission’s inspector general revealed that a \$1200 cash award was paid by the agency in 2010 to one of the employees who had been singled out for allowing Bernard Madoff to talk his way out of SEC inquiries in 2005 and 2006, before his Ponzi scheme was exposed in 2008.

— Among the aftershocks of the 9/11 attacks on America was the colossal budget-busting on “homeland security” — a spending binge that, additionally, was thought to require something approaching uniform disbursement of funds

throughout the 50 states. (Endless “what if” possibilities left no legislator willing to forsake maximum security.) Among the questionable projects described in a *Los Angeles Times* August review were the purchase of an inflatable Zodiac boat with wide-scan sonar — in case terrorists were eyeing Lake McConaughy in Keith County, Neb.; cattle nose leads, halters, and electric prods (to protect against biological attacks on cows, awarded to Cherry County, Neb.); a terrorist-proof iron fence around a Veterans Affairs hospital near Asheville, N.C.; and \$557,400 in communications and rescue gear in case North Pole, Alaska, got hit.

— The Office of Personnel Management’s inspector general denounced the agency in September for continuing to pay pension benefits to deceased federal retirees — citing a 70 percent rise in bogus payments during the past five years. However, another federal inspector general (the Social Security Administration’s) chastised its agency for the opposite reason: about 14,000 people each year are cut off from benefits after erroneously being declared dead.

### News That Sounds Like a Joke

— Convenience-store clerk Ms. Falguni Patel was giving testimony in the September trial of Morgan Armstrong (charged with robbing her in Hudson, Fla., in 2009) when she began shaking and then passed out while seated in the witness box. A relative of Patel’s approached, removed her sneaker and held it to Patel’s face, without success. The relative explained that Patel was subject to such

blackouts and that sniffing the sneaker often revives her. After paramedics attended to her, Patel took the rest of the day off and went back to court the next morning.

### Great Art!

— Although Moroccan artist Mehdi-Georges Lahlou, 27, concedes that photographs can be misinterpreted, he maintains on his website that he never wants to hurt people’s feelings. Nevertheless, he said he is proud of his photo exhibit in which he stands completely nude, allowing various verses of the Quran to be projected on his skin. His latest scheduled appearance was at an art fair in Marrakesh in October.

— Two women were charged in September with art theft in Johnson City, Tenn. Connie Sumlin, 45, and Gail Johnson, 58, were identified from surveillance video as the ones who snatched two pieces of art off the wall in the entrance of a local Arby’s restaurant (a picture of some pears and a metal art object with an alleged combined value, according to the police report, of \$1200).

— Earlier this year, Marion Laval-Jeantet won a notable Prix Ars Electronica award for her “hybrid” work that, she said, intends to blur the boundaries between species. Laval-Jeantet stepped onstage in Ljubljana, Slovenia, as a horse-human, having earlier injected herself with horse blood (after prepping her body for several months with different horse immunoglobulins). She also walked with stilts that had “hooves” affixed to the bottom. She capped the show by extracting some

of her own presumably-hybrid blood, to be frozen and stored for future research.

### Fetishes on Parade

— In Florida’s Sarasota County in September, Shane Wheatley, 31, was arrested after a Comcast cable customer complained that Wheatley had begun fondling himself while installing the woman’s TV service. Three days earlier, in Niceville, a 14-year-old boy (whose name was not released) was charged with indecent exposure after a worshipper reported him masturbating openly during services at the First United Methodist Church. The boy admitted he had done the same thing during services the week before because he was “bored.”

### Least Competent Criminals

— In September, a jury found Terry Newman, 25, and an associate guilty of aggravated assault for a home invasion in San Antonio in 2009, thus adding insult to Newman’s injuries. Newman was shot by a resident during the initial invasion and then again by another resident when he returned 15 minutes later to retrieve his car. After police encountered Newman following a short chase, he resisted officers and was shot again, for the third time. (None of the injuries was life-threatening.)

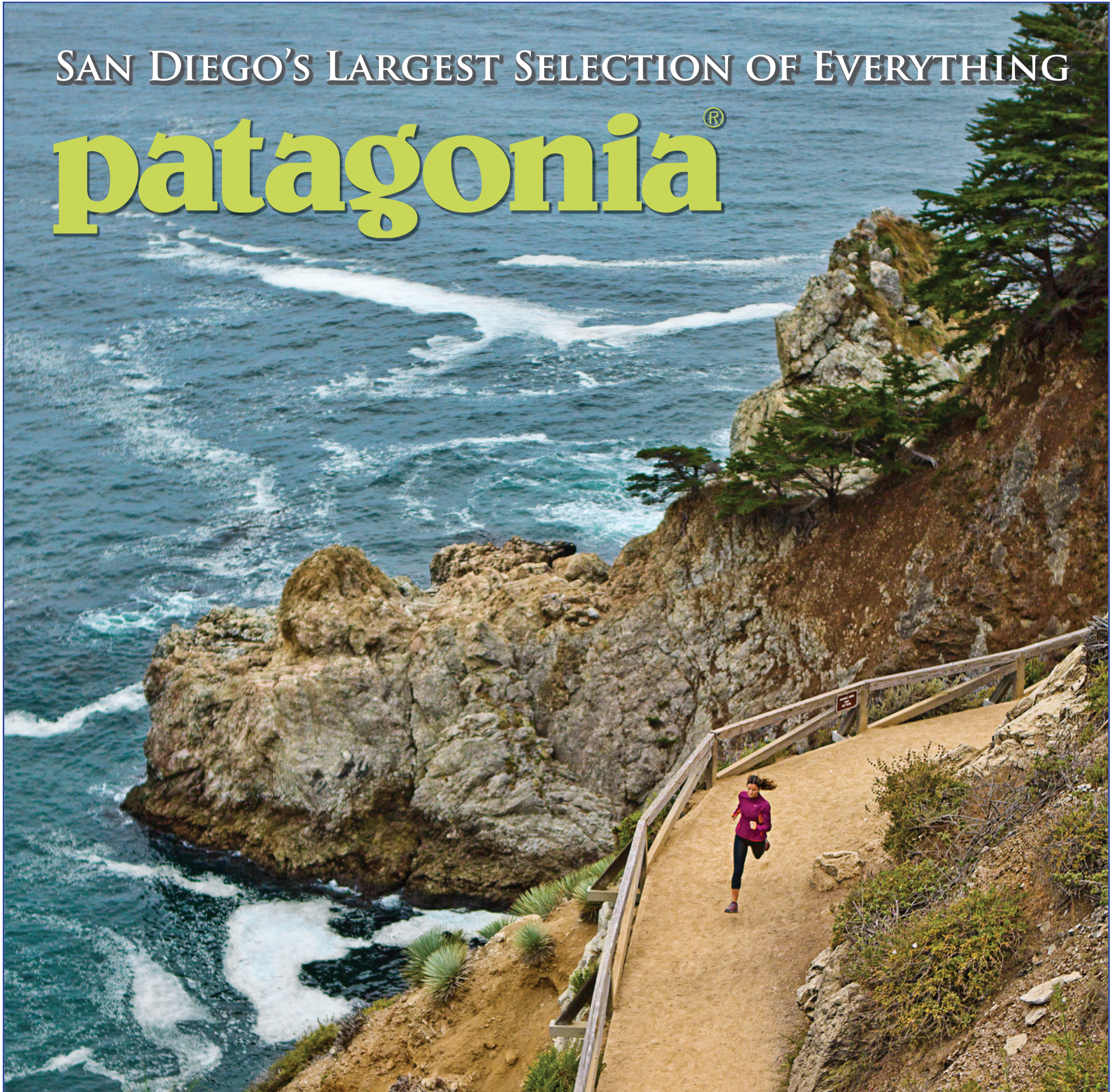
