Pandemics without plants?

"Push into Future" noted COVID-19-related evolution beyond office space ("Is the corona virus pushing us into the future?" Golden Dreams, March 28). As a personal trainer sitting is known to promote physical dysfunction and disease. Stress, inactivity, and indoor air quality also degenerate health. Resulting complications (diabetes, heart disease, etc.) compound with issues like coronavirus increasing mortality. The coronavirus discussion should include diet. On YouTube, Dr. Michael Greger's 2008 "Pandemic Prevention" lecture prophesized our situation recognizing factory farms pro-pandemic nature. Wet markets, multi-species infectious disease extravaganzas, feature animals unnaturally close in hellish conditions

reliant on antibiotics to survive until slaughter. Human coronaviruses were discovered in chickens and common cold human patients. The WHO notes livestock uses 80% antibiotics, promoting superbugs. Pandemics loom without a plant-based future. Hunger, malnutrition, water pollution, oceanic dead zones, deforestation, and disease will persist. The World Watch Institute revealed 51% of greenhouse gases originate from livestock. Watch the documentaries Cowspiracy (livestock's environmental threat) and What the Health (eating animal products). Both are on Netflix. Dr. Greger's book How Not to Die (on Audible) illustrates how whole food, plant-based diet thwarts preventable common causes of death. Nature is teaching us a lesson. Will we learn or struggle to survive perpetually? Preserving livestock industries may preserve our fate.








CARLSBAD Lhooq out Bookshop finds next chapter in Astoria

In September of last year, Lhooq Books was told it had two months to pack up and get out of Carlsbad's downtown Village area. And while the store's story does have a happy ending, it's not due to the help that founder Sean Christopher says he was promised by the city of Carlsbad following the outpouring of praise from longtime locals who patronized the funky outpost. Instead, it came from 1000 miles away: a non-profit in Astoria, Oregon has welcomed the Carlsbad native's venture with an expansive venue and a promise of support.

and that's why I gravitated to Oceanside. It seemed like Carlsbad was just headed for gentrification. But Lhooq Books is why I was starting to have hope in Carlsbad."

Christopher says that when Lhooq Books was told its days were over at Carlsbad Village Drive, the public reaction and words of

> positive support from local officials gave him hope that Lhooq Books could stay in Carlsbad. He points out that a public/private incentive is what drove the city of Oceanside and local arts supporters to launch the Oceanside Museum of Arts, and he thought that could happen in Carlsbad. "Councilmember Cori Schumacher told me she would do everything in her power to try and help us," he says. "She set up meetings with the economic development department." And he says his discussion with that

department's management analyst Christie Marcella was promising — that she told him the city would help him keep Lhooq alive.

But, he says, things changed when Marcella left the city and was replaced by a new management analyst, Joe Stewart, who oversaw a city hall meeting on February 4. Christopher had been in communication with the owners of 395 Carlsbad Village Drive, Bernard and Marina Goldstein, about a house that has been vacant for 10 years. "Every time I brought up what we could do to the building, even if it was cosmetic, they said it would take a year or two to get permits approved. They said all the permits would cost in the high six-figures...The whole meeting seemed antagonistic."

That house and its adjacent property (immediately east of Señor Grubby's res-

taurant) is listed for sale at \$4.7 million. Christopher says it was recently listed.

"Cory was disheartened when she found out there was no real help in the pipeline for me," says Christopher. "I think she has always been about breaking up the good old boys network in Carlsbad. But in this case, the machine prevailed, and we didn't fit into their agenda."

Economic development analyst Lewis responds: "Staff listened to Mr. Christopher's

business plans and ideas and provided him with as much information as possible regarding the properties in question. Staff was cordial, polite, and respectful of Mr. Christopher and his concerns. The city staff provided as much information as we could, given the facts that were provided."

Christopher challenged his two-month eviction notice and was then given until the end of May. He spent the time searching for a new location. "I was looking for a town that had the same smalltime vibe I knew growing up in Carlsbad, Astoria is a town known for being a historical town with an open mind about promoting culture. There are just some towns, like Austin, Athens [Georgia], and Lawrence [Kansas], that have a reputation for proudly mixing the cultural with the mainstream."

He says the city of Astoria bought an abandoned 44,000-square foot armory built in the 1940s that was in turn purchased by a non-profit called Friends of Astoria Armory for \$250,000. "For being such a big space, it was not run-down. It's right in the center of town, so the city was able to protect it when it was closed. The wiring was still intact and there wasn't a lot of graffiti. There is one large room, offices, a kitchen, and a separate basement space that would be a good performance space. And there is the space that used to house the old propeller museum that was used the film *The Goonies*."

Christopher says he is talking with the Astoria non-profit about which space will be used for what purpose, and that the new Lhooq Books will now be allowed to thrive alongside a "higher-end gallery," a video studio, and a mixed-use performance area which will help cover expenses. "It's not a co-op," he notes. "That triggers the image of old school hippie stuff. It will be a forwardthinking operation where arts and culture will be in the forefront while still helping young artists or any artists get a start."

BAJA **Diseases Without Borders** Coronavirus crossings concern both sides

On March 25, the Nogales Police Department in Arizona, which is about 350 miles east of El Centro, tweeted: "Southbound traffic into Mexico is closed at the DeConcini Port of Entry." Mexican news outlets reported that the *Usuarios Unidos por Sonora* organization was protesting and blocking

access on the Mexican side of the border at Nogales for about four hours. The 30 or so protestors, led by José Luis Hernández, reportedly barricaded the entrance lanes with three vehicles, demanding that a screening system be implemented within their customs stations during the COVID-19 health emergency. The reason: many Americans continue to travel south into Mexico, despite the March 20 binational travel ban that applies to people who cross for recreation, tourism, or other activities considered non-essential.

After the report, San Diegans grew concerned that protestors might congregate on the other side of our San Ysidro and Otay Mesa ports of entries, and so disrupt their essential travel plans. "This is stupid," Shancontinued on page 6

"This is just another small, funky shop that is being priced out of Carlsbad and is being forced to pull up stakes and move out of town. It seems like everything in Carlsbad is now being tailored to the tourists." And Garrison Zoutendyk says he will miss Lhooq Books. "They have been an amazing platform for all kinds of artists to do anything they want in any medium." Zoutendyk and his local record label

Zoutendyk and his local record label BoneJaw Records has used Lhooq Books to put on live rock shows. "My experience growing up was that Oceanside was always more supportive of the arts than Carlsbad,

High-flying salaries at San Diego Airport

Go ahead and stay at home; they'll still get paid

As the worldwide coronavirus crisis rages on, San Diego's tourist economy has cratered. bringing down with it a small army of maids, bartenders, drivers, and service workers cast out of their jobs for an indefinite duration. And like most other public agencies, the San **Diego County Regional Airport Authority board** shuttered its office to the public beginning March 18, according to the agency's online coronavirus page. A March 27 board workshop has been canceled, as has the airport authority's April 2 monthly board meeting. Future plans haven't been announced regarding any possible budget adjustments in light of plunging revenues. The most recent news release posted online, dated March 10, touts a leadership award from an outfit called the **Climate Leadership Conference.**

"We couldn't help but notice that at 6:30 am, when many of the day's flights are taking place, the curbs in front of the terminals had only a few vehicles at any one time," noted KUSI's Ed Lenderman in a March 12 TV report. "No two-deep cars with other drivers waiting for someone to pull out."

Despite a dramatic traffic falloff, the airport is officially open, which means continu-

ing super-size government salaries and benefits for higher-ups, despite economic misery elsewhere. "San Diego International Airport is essential to the nation, helping to bring home family and friends. transporting critical medicines and supporting commerce and tourism for our region," proclaims the authority's website. "The airport remains open, in full operation as an essential critical infrastructure

in the transportation systems sector."

Executive employment at the airport, which makes millions of dollars annually from landing fees and other charges, has long been a local bureaucratic plum. President and CEO Kimberly Becker pulled down pay and benefits totaling \$400,756 in 2018, the latest year for which figures posted by the website *Transpar entCalifornia.com* are available. She was to

have been honored March 20 at the national Women in Tourism and Hospital convention at the Double Tree by Hilton in Mission Valley, but the event was called off without refunds. "As we continue to work out the details of rescheduling our program with the hotel, the majority of the funds that are required to

execute this kind of a conference have already been spent," says the sponsor's website. "The hotel will allow expended monies to be credited but not refunded. Therefore, we are not able to extend refunds, but will apply all registration fees to be extended as credit for the re-scheduled conference."

Not far behind Becker in airport pay was general counsel Amy Gonzalez, a former deputy city attorney in Los Angeles, with \$348,134. Then came vice president and chief operating officer Angela Shafer-Payne, getting \$347,954. Once treasurer of fraudtainted Peregrine Systems - where ex-Padres owner John Moores was chairman of the board — Scott Brickner, now the airport's vice president, treasurer, and chief financial operator, received \$334,952. "In 2000, Mr. Brickner joined Peregrine Systems in San Diego, becoming Treasurer in 2002 and playing an integral role in the company's successful emergence from bankruptcy and ultimate sale to Hewlett Packard in 2006," says his Bond Buyer profile Further down the airport pay line, director of communications Diana Lucero, picked up \$229,280. Stephanie Alexander, senior manager of talent and awards, got \$160,468, according to Transparent California.

UNDER THE RADAR

Viral lobbyists Mega-developer H.G. Fenton Company became the first registered San Diego influence seeker to jump into the fray over the financial impact of coronavirus legislation. Fenton wants "new policies regarding eviction moratoriums during COVID-19," seeking to "provide guidance on how to keep households and businesses stabilized," according to a March 19 disclosure filing. The residential and commercial landlord also

seeks "new policies on how the City of San Diego can support small business during COVID-19," and "provide guidance on effective policies to assist small businesses."

Since the beginning of last year, Fenton and employees have come up a total of \$38,995 for San Diego city political causes, including \$30,335 for the San Diego Regional Chamber of Commerce Political Action Committee; **Scott Sherman** for

mayor (\$2300); the Build San Diego Political Action Committee (\$1570); and city attorney **Mara Elliott** (\$1350). On March 17, the council unanimously passed an emergency eviction moratorium and a multimillion-dollar small business fund backed by GOP Mayor **Kevin Faulconer**. "The temporary eviction moratorium is accompanied by millions of dollars to help small businesses stay afloat and keep San Diegans employed," said a mayoral statement. "I applaud the city council, city attorney and city staff for taking quick action to help our community."

The debate over what happens next is

expected to be long and bitter, and potentially costly to Fenton and other landlords seeking to guard their income stream. "This is a necessary step but not a long-term solution," council Democrat and Assembly candidate **Chris Ward** said. "Delaying payment can set up a crisis for the same families and businesses we are trying to help. Adding missed rent or mortgage payments onto already cost-

burdened households will lead to continued hardship well after the moratorium ends."

Remote-control government

The bad news arrived at a virtual Imperial Beach city council meeting last week. After Mayor **Serge Dedina** brought the teleconference to order by banging his smartphone on a desk in place of the traditional gavel, City Manager **Andy Hall** presented a grim list of potential municipal economies. They included, as noted by the Union-Tribune, "implementing a hiring freeze, suspending all travel and training for staff and council, and limiting spending by having management sign off on all expenditures made by employees and department heads." The account added that "some of the worst-case-scenario options, for a long-term economic downturn, include laying off staff and cutting city services." Said Hall, "In a community that has

imited financial resources, we knew we needed to put together, as quickly as possible, a financial road map that would allow us to move through this situation." If the most draconian options of salary cuts do materialize, Hall is likely to feel some significant pain. In 2018, he made a total of \$340,558 in pay and benefits, according to the latest available figures

San Diego's city council has so far avoided discussing bad fiscal tidings by canceling all of its proceedings until the middle of April, says a memo from Council president and Democratic congressional candidate **Georgette Gomez** posted online March 31. "The next regularly scheduled City Council meeting is on Monday, April 13, 2020, at 2:00 p.m," according to the document. "However, please

> note that a Special Meeting may be called for critical or time-sensitive matters before the next regularly scheduled City Council meeting." Like Imperial Beach's outing, San Diego is also going virtual. "During the current State of Emergency and in the interest of public health and safety, most — and possibly all of the City Councilmembers will be participating in City Council meetings by

teleconference," says the latest online order. "There will be no members of the public in attendance at the Council Meetings."

Perhaps the biggest attractant of older TV shows is the prevalence of episodic formats. For the most part, successful, modern television productions use a heavily serialized format.

They spread a single story out over multiple seasons, and seem seldom to resolve any mini-arc over fewer than four episodes. In contrast, many of the most popular shows on television traded on an episodic format right up to the 1990s. At some point, people apparently decided heavily serialized TV was better, and that the episodic format is only appropriate in the context of comedies. But serialized shows don't give out the kind of emotional catharsis you get from watching a single plotline unfold and resolve. Those who grew up in a world where the monotony of, say, The Walking Dead is the norm are starting to discover the value of such com-

> pressed storytelling, which lets you live out the entire emotional rollercoaster of a completed story in 22 or 44 minutes.

We hipsters are not immune to this charm. Moreover, we can enjoy old-school episodic TV on

an even more meta level. If super-serious, complicated, conspiracy-theory-inducing television is the new normal, then tightly scripted episodic shows are borderline countercultural by comparison. Hipsters enjoy retro TV with a connoisseur's appreciation for what has erroneously been labeled as an inferior art form. Like a smug hipster poopooing standoffish, labor-intensive craft beer in favor of the "simple purity" of a Miller High Life, hipsters can derive snobbish glee from appreciating the retro simplicity of episodic TV in a way mainstream people can't.

Nicole L. opined, "I don't think there's a reason for protesting, it's only temporary. Here in Tijuana, I haven't seen anyone protesting, yet. [Some] do feel the U.S. is blowing the coronavirus bigger than it is. They know there are more infections up there than in Mexico."

In February, digital marketing specialist Forest Baker and his family rented out their house in Truckee (by Reno), and moved into a converted van to travel through Mexico and the U.S. on a six-month sabbatical. "We went through a checkpoint on March 26, just south of El Rosarito (about 300 miles south of Ensenada)," Baker told me. "They stopped us and searched our van, but they weren't practicing social distancing and kind of laughed at me when I grew concerned that they were going into our van with our young kids. The guy who searched touched a bunch of stuff in the car before ours; he put his

But San Diegan Andrew W. replied, "The only reason the numbers are low[er in Mexico] is due to the fact they are not doing mass testing. The virus is already here in Tijuana."

So far, there hasn't been any trouble; since the March 20 travel ban, San Diegans are saying they have crossed into Mexico fingers in his mouth several times and then wanted to go through our car without cleaning his hands at all. He at least agreed to use some of our hand sanitizer, but continued to tell us that the virus is only in the U.S., and not in Mexico. I'm worried that these young guys at the checkpoints are going to be a major vector."

Baker and his family stayed in a beach resort north



Leon is an American who works in San Diego and lives in Rosarito; we direct messaged one another about her recent trek. "The U.S. CBP agents were wearing gloves," she said, "I crossed about 10 am and there was nothing out of the norm; I was asked if I am a U.S. citizen, so they would have to let me back in. I did have a friend that tried to cross in the regular lane; she has a tourist visa and they were turned around. When returning home, [I saw that] the Mexican officials did have gloves and masks on for the most part. I came across to Mexico around 1 pm, and no one was

station attendants were wearing masks, but two of the military checkpoints we passed through in the last week were not taking any precautions. Though I should point out that the checkpoint just north of Loreto did a good job of keeping distance and keeping their masks on."

Vincent Maiorano is an Uber driver who moved from San Diego down to Playas de Tijuana about five months ago. Since the March 20 border shut-down, Maiorano's been staying at his buddy's house in San Diego. But on March 26, he returned to his Tijuana home by the beach and bullring, to pick up some clothes and to water his plants. He had no trouble crossing, and noticed that "the customs agents going into TJ were wearing masks and gloves." Once home, he

looked around. "Normally, by my house, there's people walking down the street and the restaurants and bars are all open — but it was like 1:30 pm and every single place was closed. There was nobody walking on the boardwalk, nobody was motorcycling it was dead. The only ones that I saw had gloves, masks, and hand sanitizer. They've even got people at the border selling surgical

masks that people made, boxes of hand sanitizer, and toilet paper — everything we don't have in the U.S."

Maiorano said that two bottles of hand sanitizer sell for about \$5 USD, masks for \$1.50-\$2. He added, "I think the reasons why they (Mexican protestors) don't want us there is because, besides spreading the virus down there, they are worried we might buy up all the tissue paper and start hoarding the supplies."

As Maiorano returned to San Diego, he noticed two lanes open for regular traffic, one lane for medical purposes, and four-tofive accessible Ready and SENTRI lanes, "so there's a little bit of a longer wait returning. So it's a good thing that OB residents Brent and his wife Teresa have started a jigsaw puzzle exchange. "We've been doing puzzles, on and off, for years," Brent explains. "When this whole coronavirus hit, the puzzle thing just became a little bit bigger of an activity. I thought it was ridiculous to keep buying puzzles all the time, and I imagined other people were in the same position we were in. They have no care if it's been done before. It doesn't have to be new. And they don't want to keep it. I thought, why not trade them on NextDoor? There's been a

I like to say that whenever you're presented with a problem, you always have to figure it out; a puzzle is just another problem."

No shelter for shelter magazines

Pity the poor editors. As March turned into April, Wendy Manwarren Generes, editor of San Diego Home/Garden Lifestyles Magazine (for which I have written) was trying to get the upcoming May issue to bed.

"Last Monday (March 30th), we had a call with the publisher (Mark McKinnon)," she tells me by phone. "We just chatted about things: San Diego Magazine was already closing its

were taking our readers to Laguna Beach, Paso Robles, San Francisco, design destinations. We also had to pull that story.

"And we changed our lifestyle feature at the back to be 'Things for your own wellbeing.' Things that you could do at home: easy gardening projects, easy organizing projects, easy interior design projects, even mindful cleaning. Whatever, as the target moved, so did we."

But, after all that, it just took one email.

doors. And we wanted to make sure that Mark was not thinking of doing the same. And it appeared at that point that we were not closing.

"But my creative director Emily Jones and I are definitely planners. She and I had already put into motion plans for a digital-only edition. And we had already modified our contents. For instance, 'Around Town,' in which we interview one person, and see a certain part of San Diego through their design-savvy eyes: as things started closing up, we decided that 'Around Town' probably wasn't the best option. Some things unfortunately won't re-open."

"So we modified that story into one called 'Our editors' picks for our favorite places to escape. Secret places around the city'. Unfortunately, the trails and beaches also shut down. "Then travel: this coming May issue, we

"On Tuesday afternoon (March 24) we received an email informing us that [our owners] would not be continuing SDHG/L. We were all being laid off. So on Wednesday, we went in and cleaned out our offices. And that was it."

Wendy thinks a moment. "Quite honestly, this would have been a good opportunity for any publisher to rethink what it means to publish in 2020. The home-and-garden concept is always relevant. Unfortunately, I'm not the owner."

But more than the magazine, it's the days with her group, her editorial cricca, that Wendy Generes mourns.

There's silence for a moment. Then I hear her choke up. "Sorry. I get emo-

tional about it. But I already miss the group of women I adored working with. We supported one another, we were collaborative. It was a dream team. So tight. Even though we had people in their twenties, in their sixties, people with young kids ... we all brought something to the table. And when we collaborated — which we did for the entire magazine - nothing was just a one-person show. Everything was a collaborative effort, and because of that, I think we got our best work. We were really good at challenging one another, but also giving a small idea huge legs that took things to other places. Like our October issue: Maximalist! Everything over the top! That was just a thought one of us brought to a meeting. It grew into one of our best issues."

No money in prevention

"It was surprising and very exciting," says Professor Kimberly Brouwer, who teaches epidemiology at the UCSD School of Medicine. She's talking about the brand-new graduate class she started last Tuesday, online. "I had 27 students sign in. Some from outside epidemiology. Some from outside the country.

In the US, she says, we don't have the data inputs to adequately inform infectious disease models.

"We're using what we have, but right now the stay at home order is a kind of sledgehammer tool of control, because we're missing a lot of the pieces of the puzzle with regards to where exactly the disease is. Is it everywhere?

"If you could get blanket testing, then you could determine if we've built some type of herd immunity,"

Interest is up."

So how come epidemiology is suddenly hot, after being somewhat the "bean-counting branch" of medicine?

"I would say our experience with previous epidemics and pandemics has given us the [background] to accurately model things.

All of those estimates of, for instance, how long we have to stay at home are based on the history of epidemiology, and of epidemics throughout the world. Advice such as 'wash your hands' has been informed by an evidence base of multiple [epidemics]. And it is important in the absence of cures and-or vaccines for this virus."

"A lot of public health is quite basic," says Brouwer. "In fact, I'd say that public health in recent years has moved from discovering new ways to prevent epidemics to finding ways to implement known solutions that we already have. Because we know how to prevent disease, but we are just not implementing. So implementation science is now hand-in-hand with epidemiology to make sure the basics we already know are put to work."

But Professor Brouwer says epidemiology is also sprouting new wings. "We have genetic

epidemiology, where we're able to learn whether or not the virus is related between two people, or spreads by direct transmission. We're also able to better predict where the virus will go, with what we call spatial epidemiology. We map it."

Would it work here? "A place like South Korea, where they do widespread testing, mapping has been quite efficient. They've been linking mapping with cellphone alerts, authorities saying 'You're in an area, a shopping mall, whatever, where there was recently a diagnosed case.' They'll call you. 'If you were there at a particular time, you may have been exposed ... 'South Korea is the gold standard of spatial epidemiology."

Or are there certain places that could have functioning economies, where people could still interact, and not have to be under a blanket stav-at-home order?"

The biggest thing we need, she says again and again, is testing. Two types: one that measures the virus itself, that can diagnose people

who currently have the virus. But also testing that looks at antibodies, to determine who was previously infected, and maybe didn't even know they'd already had it.

"If you could get blanket testing, then you could determine if we've built some type of herd immunity. Has it already passed through huge sections of our population? Or do we need to still have this stay at home policy?"

And after all this has hopefully passed by, are we going to have learned our lesson? Maybe, maybe not, says Professor Brouwer. "We'll likely just go back to our old habits." Why?

"Because there's no money in prevention."



A municipal battle of life and death

Treat any sickness

"as a bad cold"

and "take

Dover's Powders."

It was a municipal battle of life and death, witnessed by the frightened citizenry of century-ago San Diego, crowded into the musty confines of city hall, an ornate Victorian building at the corner of Fifth and G Street in what is today called the Gaslamp Quarter.

The date was December 5, 1918. Three months before, San Diegans had barely shrugged at the disease that was about to engulf their city, taking hundreds of lives.

"San Diego is full of colds, just now," said a September advertisement in the *San Diego Sun* headlined "All the Facts About

Spanish Influenza." Avoid "secretions of the nose and throat passages, conveyed on handkerchiefs, towels, cups, and mess-gear." Treat any sickness "as a bad cold" and "take Dover's Powders."

But while the population remained com-

placent, the virus responsible for what came to be known as the worldwide influenza pandemic of 1918 was silently spreading, aided by the personal mobility brought on by World War I and poor military hygiene.

An October 1, 1918 memo from a Navy senior medical officer, entitled "Appearance of Influenza among draft of 95 apprentice seaman en route from Memphis, Tennessee, to San Diego Naval Training Station, San Diego, California," described a host of unsanitary conditions ideal for sowing the virus across the country.

"[A] Party of 95 apprentice seaman ... en

trained Thursday, September 26 at Memphis in two old type Pullman tourist sleepers. The cars were both in very bad shape," said the document.

"The water tank in one car was leaking so that the entire floor of the car was wet. The toilet was out of order; no ice and only a limited amount of water was obtainable to wash with on the entire trip.

'The Chief Machinist Mate reported that at Kansas City he protested to the railroad officials concerning the condition of the two cars, requesting that the men be

> transferred to other sleepers. This request was denied.

"He reports that the first two cases of influenza appeared Saturday morning September 28. He immediately took steps to isolate the two men in the rear of the car, however, the disease

spread rapidly so that on arrival there were 54 men afflicted with symptoms of influenza of varying degree. "

By October, the Army was acting at Camp Kearny north of town. "A general quarantine was placed over the entire camp October 9, 1918, and on this date a detention camp was established, where everyone entering camp was held for five days and examined daily," according to a report in the archives of the Army Department of Medical History.

"All indoor amusement halls and exchanges were closed 14 days after the

first case was reported.

"Gauze masks were worn by everyone in camp from November 2 to November 12, inclusive.

"A convalescent camp was established for patients returning from the hospital where they were excused from all duties for two days, and then gradually returned to full duty.

"When this camp had to be abolished on account of its location and the inclement weather, all patients returning to their organizations were placed at the end of their company streets and excused from duty as they had been while in the convalescent camp. All men were supplied with sufficient clothing."

But by that point, there was no limiting the illness to come for many of San Diego's unwary citizens.

"By the end of the third week in October, the number of [San Diego] cases had risen to over 200 and deaths were being reported daily," noted the *Union-Tribune*'s Richard Crawford in a 2008 history of the epidemic. "Dr. Ernest Chartres-Martin, the City Health Officer, announced: 'We do not wish to unduly alarm people, but we have a situation which must be recognized. The influenza has not been stopped, or even been curbed.'

"South of San Diego, the flu felled workers building the Lower Otay Dam on the Sweetwater River. East of the city in the high desert of the Carrizo Gorge, construction on the San Diego Arizona Railway nearly halted when the flu struck. One hundred cases were reported in the work camps in October, twelve of them fatal."

In late October, the San Diego board of health, urged on by Chartres-Martin, mandated that masks like those used by the Army be worn to counter the fast-moving disease.

"The police department has been asked to cooperate in the enforcement of this order, which is designed to stop the spread of Spanish influenza," said a *Los Angeles Times* report of October 25. "The Red Cross will supply the masks to be

worn here."

"Members of the board of health at first advocated the arrest of any person appearing without a mask," the *Union* reported the same day.

"This afterwards changed to a request that the police 'send home' anyone violating this rule. Members of the board say they were advised that this action may legally be taken without special ordinance enacted by the common [city] council."

"Dr. Chartres-Martin, city health officer, says that the new order will be strictly enforced. 'We realize that it will be difficult for the population to equip itself with masks by midnight tomorrow,' he said, 'but it must be done. The Red Cross will supply all who apply with patterns for making the masks.""

"The public is urged by Health Officer E.P. Chartres-Martin to refrain from indulging in social gatherings of all kinds and to devote as much time as possible to outdoor exercise and recreation. All homes should be kept well ventilated," said an October 11 *Evening Tribune* report.

"The order hits the vaudeville houses hardest, as all those engaged for the coming week at both the Savoy and the Hippodrome had to be notified by telephone or telegraph that they could not be used."

But Chartres-Martin and his colleagues turned out to be mistaken. The city offered little or no enforcement assistance, leaving the health board with nothing but moral suasion to carry out its mandate, and the virus continued its spread. Only after weeks of growing fatalities did the matter of mandatory quarantine, business curbs, and maskwearing finally begin to coalesce.

In mid-October Chartres-Martin's fellow physician Peter C. Remondino, a health board member, issued an ultimatum to the city council: pass a mandatory mask ordinance accompanied by stringent business closures or the board might call for a state quarantine of the city.

There was pushback from the San Diego Union, among other downtown business interests, loath to disrupt the city's growing tourist trade and other enterprises with inconvenient health threats.

"Only highwaymen, burglars, and holdup men wear them professionally," said an October 18 *Union* editorial against the masks. "We sincerely regret that some of the young women in public employment are compelled to wear these masks. We miss their pretty faces."

Taking its lead from

the paper, the city council rejected the health board's proposed regulations, causing county coroner Schuyler Kelley and Dr. W.W. Crawford to quit.

"This is not the time to stand from under," Chartres-Martin told Crawford. "This is the time to see the city through. I'll see the council damned before I resign."

"On Saturday, November 30, Chartres-Martin and Remondino, both of whom were recovering from the flu, met with fellow [health board] members John Buerkle and newly appointed Senator Leroy A. Wright at Remondino's home," notes Jeff Smith in a 2009 *Reader* account of the 1918 pandemic.

"They wrote a twopronged emergency continued on page 39



Mario's thing

Let's keep snacking. One takeout at a time!

can't believe it. But here's the sign: "Hancock Street Cafe. Grand Reopening! Under New Management."

I swear. People are opening up all over (see last week's column) in these worst of times. We've got

to support these folks. They've been there for us in the good times in America's Pickiest City. Meaning, we've been able to pick our snacking whims from the farthest reaches of Earth. Just saying: let's keep snacking. One takeout at a time!

This is partly why I've asked my buddy Erik to swing off Rosecrans and up Hancock Street into this serious industrial zone. At Sherman Street, we get out of Erik's pickup and find ourselves among places such as San Diego Westy ("Specializing in repair and restoration of Vanagon and Westphalia campers") and Sharpeye Surfboards.

But then I see what I came for: the Statue of Liberty holding her torch high, and holding her famous tablet ("Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses, yearning to breathe free..."), and looking green and magnificent, despite layers of white pigeon poop on her shoulders.

She's in the patio of a place I love, the Hancock Street Cafe.

"Whew. Still here!" I say to Erik. Because I first found this place about 15 years ago. That's when I met Mario, the Polish immigrant owner who had become famous when he walked across America as a tribute to his wife Joanna after she died of cervical cancer. Then Mario had become even more famous as the wild and crazy guy who turned this unlikely coffee joint in an industrial backwater into a music mavericks' haven. Many of the jazz-blues greats would turn up here after their gig at, say, the nearby San Diego Sports Arena. Mario had a piano always tuned and ready to go, plus a full band setup as often as not, and also sold drinks and pizzas and classy hot dogs at musician-affordable prices. His walls were - and here they are still - plastered with dollar bills from fans who wanted to leave their mark here. The walls also are plastered with kitchen specials.

"Hot toasted cheese melt w/side of marinara,

> > "Under new management." "What does that mean?" I ask the guy who comes out from

the kitchen.

"It means Mario passed away, two years ago," he says, "and his daughter, Alexandra, has taken over. I am his nephew."

Wow. Mario, gone. I start to ask him all about it when he says, "Look, I don't want to be rude, but can you just decide what you want and then wait outside?

His name is Erick. With a "ck." I mean, he's right: I completely forgot about all the rules. Social Distancing, whatever.

Oh. And this happens just at the moment I spot a row of bottles of exotic and ancient beer. Zvwiec (since 1856), Warka (since, wow, 1478), and Tatra.

"Polish," says Erick. Dang. Have to try them. Except where, if

not here? So my buddy Erik (no "c") and I look at our choices off of a small menu framed and tacked to the wall.

Hmm.

Seven sandwiches and six pizzas.

"It's reduced choice, because of the virus," Erick says, "take-out only."

Naturally, in the sandwich section, they have Polish Kielbasa, with sauerkraut, grilled onion, and mustard on an Italian roll. Costs \$9.99. Or a bratwurst, same price.

I'm tempted by the chicken parmesan sandwich, or the meatball (also \$9.99).

The 12-inch, thin-crust pizzas are all \$16.99 (except for the \$13.99 cheese pizza). The bratwurst, meatball, and Polish kielbasa sound okay, but the most crunchy-interesting are the veggie (with bell peppers, olives, marinara), or the breakfast pizza,

which comes with 2 eggs, cheese, hash browns, plus "a topping of your choice.'

But, sorry pizzas, 'tis a bratwurst chili dog that captures my heart. It's a huge bratwurst under chili with beans, topped with shredded cheese on a toasted Italian roll, all tied up in strings of sautéed onion and that melted shredded cheese.

Buddy Erik orders two slices of pepperoni pizza.

"Sorry to hear about Mario," I say to Erick. "Do you guys still have music happening here? Is the studio still there behind the curtain? Concerts out back?"

I'm thinking of how the Beat Farmers came here, and how a member of T-Rex gave an impromptu performance at an after-concert get together. All of that gave this a magic atmosphere for the rest of us.

"No more," says Erick. "That was Mario's thing." Then he goes out back to make and bake.

We end up eating lunch in Erik's silver pick-up, like police detectives, watching all the activity at the Westy VW Vanagon place across the road. "Nice flaky dough," Erik says as he tears at his pizza slice. "How was yours?"

To feed vulnerable residents during a pandemic. Oceanside turns to restaurants

In the weeks since American public life was offi-

cially put on pause in response to the Covid-19 pandemic, too much the news out of the res-

taurant industry has been dire. Dining rooms closed, millions out of work, and even as some restaurants scramble to make a go serving takeout and delivery, some analysts predict more than a hundred thousand American restau-

rants will close permanently as these weeks turn into months.

There's better news out of the city of Oceanside, which has found a novel way to support local restaurants while providing government assistance to citizens facing food insecurity.

By unanimous vote, the Oceanside city council allocated \$50,000 for a program to purchase

nutritious daily meals prepared FEAST!

by local eateries, to feed residents of nonprofit group homes adapting to changes in food supply and social isolation rules.

The program started delivering meals Monday, March 30, only four days after council approval. It's being overseen by the city's

> neighborhood services department, which reached out to the North County Food Bank to identify local organizations in need of meals.

From Monday through Friday, 66 meals per day went to Loving the Elderly, which distributed them to four senior living locations; 28 meals per day to CRF Casa Pacifica, a transitional home for adults treated for chronic mental illness and 25 meals per day to the Women's Resource Center, which provides shelter to victims of domes-

tic abuse.

Five restaurants and counting that have been enlisted thus far cover a range of cuisines, ranging from the Guamanian food of Guahan Grill to the offbeat sushi of Wrench & Rodent. Newly opened vegan restaurant the Plot is preparing 100 percent plant-based meals, usually incorporating produce sourced from local farms, adding a second layer of economic support to the program.

The meals themselves are determined by the restaurants, within a loose set of parameters. "What we ask is for restaurants to make a nutritional meal," says Javier Bermudez, a management analyst for the department overseeing the program, "and charge about 7 or 8 dollars per meal."

Meals provided by the Plot have included meatless shepherd's pie and meatloaf sandwiches. Downtown Oceanside's Mission Avenue

Bar & Grill has prepared lunches of fried chicken and mashed potatoes and turkey sandwiches.

Whether those receiving the meals know it or not, they're being made by a few of Oceanside's more popular chefs. Mission Avenue executive chef William Eik is cooking meals on behalf of his restaurant, and his newer Japanese pop-up, Matsu, which prior to the pandemic was serving exclusive, eight-course tasting menus at \$120 per person.

But for now, the Matsu chef is keeping busy making breakfast meals for people who really need them, including the likes of coconut milk pancakes and bacon congee (rice porridge). Of course, he downplays the effort.

"It's nothing really that special," Eik says, "Mostly, we are just keeping things simple and feeding people in need, and that's why I was interested in helping."

The latest coronavirus restaurant trend: family meals

I was sitting on my couch watching TV when I had my first experience with nocontact delivery. First came the text message, letting me know my food was arriving. I watched through the peephole as the driver walked up, and placed the bags on my doorstep, without knocking. He walked a few steps away, then paused for a moment, before returning to his car. A moment later, my phone buzzed again: he'd taken and sent a photograph of the bags on my doorstep, confirming delivery of my order: two quarts of soup. Given two full weeks now to adjust to San Diego's take-out only reality, delivery services have adapted well to the pandemic. And so have restaurants. Among those still open for business, online ordering has become more prevalent, whether or not a delivery service is involved. Curbside pick ups have gotten so streamlined you may see orders placed directly in your trunk — no need even to roll down the window. But one of the more interesting trends has been the emergence of family meals.

These are meal combos that bundle entrees and sides to serve a family of four at a price more affordable than four entrees. For example, locations of Italian restaurant family Buona Forchetta offer \$39 dinners that include choice of soup or salad, choice of pasta, and two pizzas. Ranch 45 in Solana Beach offers meals ranging from \$25 to \$75, built around turkey pot pie, lasagna, or rib roast. At its three coastal locations between La Jolla and Carlsbad, sustainable ingredients specialist Urban Plates offers fresh-baked bread and two sides to go with grilled grass-fed steak, free range chicken, or line-caught ahi tuna for family meals ranging from \$39 to \$45. East Village's Social Tap offers \$50 meals of BBQ chicken and tri-tip that include sides, cookies, a fourpack of canned cocktails, and a roll of toilet paper. And for every one sold, the restaurant provides a meal to a Scripps health care worker.

While the majority of family meals cropping up assemble popular dishes and sides from restaurants' regular menus, they occasionally inspire a

restaurant special, and that's how I've come to order so much soup on this Sunday afternoon. My local East Village taco shop, Lola 55, has been gradually expanding its family meal offerings. For 40 bucks, customers may choose a pound of carnitas, mesquite grilled chicken, or pasilla saltfried chicken; served with two portions each of Lola's creamy peruano beans and chipotle rice, avocado mousse, salsa, and a dozen warm, handmade corn tortillas.

Made-in-front-of-me tacos may be the food item I miss most while in isolation, so I'd originally planned on ordering one of these family meals and gobbling down self-assembled tacos all day. But then came the Sunday special: two quarts of red *pozole* with pork belly and some of those Peruvian beans. Lola's regular menu includes a fantastic green pozole, but this one, with red chilis and hunks of succulent pork, had to be tried. It's served with the usual pozole fixins, and then some: avocado and diced onion, cilantro, lime, Mexican oregano, and *pasilla* (chili pepper) salt. Oh, and a dozen fresh corn tortillas.

The aroma of warm *masa* nearly overwhelmed me as I unpacked my order — it's been missed. *Pozole* for four might be just what the doctor ordered, if doctors weren't currently preoccupied by the

Clueless The Mother Hips formed in Chico, California in the early 90s. They were operating against the grain from the start — most of the bands in their college town

"At the time, we didn't even know that that was unusual," Bluhm explained. "We didn't even know enough to know that that was like the golden ticket. We were just like 'Yeah, that's just what happens when you start a rock and roll band. You learn how play to guitar. You start a band and you get E signed and you get famous. That's just what happens.""

The band signed a deal with Rick Rubin's American Recordings and commenced a heavy touring regiment. As the 90s progressed, the band began 22

In the late 90s, they enlisted Convoy's Jason Hill to record some songs for them. His makeshift studio was in the garage of a modest house on a large property in Jamul.

"It was probably four or five days," Bluhm recalled. "I remember sleeping in the back of the van and waking up because it was too hot. Jason had sort of built this wooden floor in the garage so that the drums would sound good. The tape machine was set-up in what would have been where the work bench was in the garage. At the time, it was pretty cool. It was pretty inspired. It probably formed some of my desires in the future to get into recording and have my own space to record bands."

Convoy didn't last too long, but The Mother Hips are still gigging to this day. In fact, they would be playing The Belly Up this month if COVID-19 hadn't shut down the live music scene. Bluhm and his bandmates are full-time musicians, so the lack of shows has a harsh sting.



Nobody was surprised in 2014 when Christian heavy metal band As I Lay Dying changed their name to Wovenwar. After all, their lead singer Tim Lambesis had just pleaded guilty to attempting to solicit the murder of his wife, earning himself a six-year prison sentence. But many were surprised four years later when an already-paroled Lambesis reunited with his former bandmates for a new song, "My Own Grave," a comeback gig at Soma, and their first North American tour as AILD in five years. A new video debuted online last year for their song "Redefined," followed by a single for "Shaped By Fire," the title track of their reunion album on the Nuclear Blast label. Proceeds from their new charity single "Destruction Or Strength," originally a B-side from the Shaped By Fire album sessions, will benefit members of their road crew until the concert circuit can restart, as well as local charity activists Feeding San Diego.



WSPRGRL

"I have been producing dark wave, new wave, pop. and indie electro music for a number of years, and I specialize in creating dark lyrics with palatable vocal and instrumental hooks," says singer-songwriter Cara Potiker (L1ght Ra1L), the creator behind the '80sinspired Wsprgrl. The group includes producer Patrick Heaney (Shark Attack, Tiny Telephones) and Mike Delgado (Shark Attack, Scary Pierre). Potiker's first gig as Wsprgrl is streaming on the band's Facebook page, providing a fair sample of the icy whooshes and ethereal vibe that melds cinematic contemporaries like Lana Del Rey with first-wave operatic electropop stars like Kate Bush and Laurie Anderson. Their website samples also include quick performances of clubfriendly tracks like "Gasoline" and "Higher." Songs uploaded to YouTube include an unconventional cover version of Andrew Gold's "Never Let Her Slip Away" that takes the easy-listening pop original and feeds it so thoroughly through the blender that the resultant smoothie seems spiked with LSD, Xanax, and Ecstasy.



SULCUS

Based in La Mesa and North County, Sulcus is an experimental electronic art rock project which began as a quartet with a drummer before distilling down to a trio. "Our music is inspired by cinema, the nearby open spaces, as well as the not so distant ones in deep space," says the band, "It is mostly instrumental, texture-based, including field recordings, collages of found sounds, spoken words, and tape and keyboard loops." Their debut self-titled fulllength, recorded at Studio Phaser Control 350 in San Diego and mastered in Vista, features tracks that indicate the esoteric nature of their songwriting with titles such as "Zonula Occludens" and "Beyond the Lyapunov Spectrum." Lengthy epics like "Hydrogen Rebounds" play like the slowly building early masterworks of Pink Flovd ("Set the Control For the Heart of the Sun," "Atom Heart Mother," etc). You can also stream their full hour-long Transistor Matadors album, an experience not unlike listening to Hawkwind while clinging to the wing of an airborne jet.



CHALK TALK

Fronted by singer Nina Tartibi, Chalk Talk is an all-female Encinitas-based group with an indie bedroom pop vibe. Their album Just a Girl Band is highlighted by a single for "Worse Than Steve" that introduces their fluffy pop chops as perfectly suited for anyone who ever wondered what Liz Phair would sound like if Katy Perry wrote and produced all her music. Tracks that have proven popular on Spotify (where they average around 1,600 monthly listeners) include "Seals," "Grammar Police," and an ideal addition to any home guarantine playlist, "Bored Games." The group has been promoting the album with increasingly well-attended gigs at local venues such as Soma and the Che Cafe, earning notice for their willingness to spice up setlists with unabashed tributes to inspirations such as Britney Spears and Angel Olsen. They'd just made their House of Blues debut when the local concert scene started getting shut down by the coronavirus pandemic.



SATANIC PLANET

Satanic Planet features Justin Pearson (the Locust, Dead Cross, Swing Kids, Retox, owner of Three One G Records), hip-hop producer Luke Henshaw (Sonido de la Frontera, First Power Crew), and social activist and Satanic Temple co-founder Lucien Greaves. Their debut album is preceded by a video (just uploaded) for "999" that indicates Pearson has lost none of his Locust-style fondness for making apocalyptic noise that frequently approximates the sound of

bees living in your head, nor his penchant for Skinny Diego Puppy-ish over-layering. The flame-filled video is so full of subsonic grunting and demonic groaning that it $\frac{\pi}{2}$ ends up sounding and looking like the Devil is taking a painful, flaming dump, as seen and heard from the POV of his infernal taint. The video appears as a free feature at the Satanic Temple TV website, which also offers equally apocalyptic music documentaries, livestream events, and original programming.



THE FRONT LINES **PPE paucity produces pandemic peril** The risk of tending to the at-risk

The local toll of COVID-19 keeps rising. Over 900 confirmed cases as of Friday, April 2. An unknown number of infected people out and about. Ten million dollars per month and climbing in costs to the county. And, as one nurse warned about his workplace on March 30, two boxes of face shields left.

It's not just hospital workers who need more protective gear. Frontline workers in the field, in prisons out working with parolees, including clients who are homeless and have weakened immune systems - all face the unknown every day. "Everything is on back order, and we need supplies now," Augustin Rucobo, a public

health nurse in tuberculosis control and refugee health, told county supervisors in a Zoom conference call two weeks ago. His department "already works with a deadly infectious disease," and the patients include seniors and those without housing or established health care. "If we're going to expand field services for the county, we need supplies." Alicia Shirley, a supervisor in the probation department, said their clients have challenges "that amplify the risks during the coronavirus pandemic," such as addiction, illness, hygiene and weakened immune systems. "The work probation staff do cannot easily be done from and may have somebody that has a fear that they are going to get COVID 19."

For now, personal protective gear is being given out where the county deems it most important. All first responders and hospital personnel who are in contact with symptomatic members of the public are given priority, she said. "That is critical." The second group given priority to receive face shields, masks, gloves,

six feet away in all cases. All workers who conduct house visits and interact in close quarters with parolees, clients, probationers, and patients need professionally fitted N95 masks."

The county declared a public health state of emergency on February 14. "But even then, we had no idea the severity of what we would be facing," said county chief administrative officer Helen Robbins-Myer. "There are many frontline folks who are doing heroic work every single day," and the county wants to get supplies to them. "But there are shortages, so we just cannot hand out personal protective equipment to folks that may come into a family and garb are those dealing with people who may not have positive COVID symptoms but who have been in direct contact with someone who does.

All requests for supplies go through the web emergency operations center, said Dr. Wilma Wooten, San Diego county public health officer. "We have many reports of doctors and nurses that don't have the supplies they need," she acknowledged. "We were low and are low on face shields, gowns, and goggles," she said, though she hoped to receive supplies from the strategic national stockpile.

"I did it as a joke, but it seems to have worked," she told CNN. The symbols imply that if someone nips TP from the store, a hungry monster will hunt them down and gobble them up. "People can be quite superstitious in Japan," Itachibe said.

Ah, Snap

- PSA: The Deerfield, Michigan, American Legion has been forced by COVID-19 restrictions to cancel its annual testicle-eating festival, which was to take place on March 21. The big event, which draws 2,000 locals and visitors to Deerfield every year, offers deep-fried cattle genitals (also known as mountain oysters) and chicken gizzards, Metro reported. "So many people look forward to coming to Deerfield during this time of year," said organizer Nick Pulver, "[but] I think we made the best decision to delay it." Organizers hope to postpone it to May 9. The 300 pounds of delectables that were ordered for the festival have been frozen.

Not Funny

- Joe Fasula, co-owner of Gerrity's Supermarket in Hanover Township, Pennsylvania, had "a very challenging day" on March 25. A woman who claimed she had the coronavirus, later identified by police as Margaret Chirko, "came into the store and proceeded to purposely cough on our fresh produce, and a small section of our bakery, meat case and grocery," he wrote on Facebook. While the staff "did the best they could to get the woman out of the store as fast as possible," he said, the health department had to help disinfect the store, and the "twisted prank" resulted in the loss of \$35,000 worth of food. The Philadelphia Inquirer reports the Luzerne County District Attorney's Office has charged Chirko with threatening to use weapons of mass destruction and making terroristic threats. It is not known whether the woman has COVID-19.

Lesson Learned

Taiwan has strictly cracked down on its citizens during the COVID-19 pandemic, using GPS on phones to monitor the movement of those in quarantine. One man got a particularly costly lesson when he violated the quarantine to go clubbing, AFP reported. The unnamed man, who was required to self-quarantine for 14 days after returning from Southeast Asia, was charged \$1 million Taiwanese (about \$33,000 US) after he was found at a Taipei nightclub on March 22. Authorities deemed his night out "malicious," and the New Taipei mayor, Hou Yu-ih, warned, "I will not be soft-handed."

Least Competent Criminal

 Kenneth Braden, 65, filled his shopping cart at a Nashville-area Kroger store with essentials – five cases of beer and two packages of toilet paper – on March 11, then bypassed the checkout lanes, according to court documents. As he attempted to leave the store, he tripped the alarm sensors at the door and the wheels on his cart locked up. After several unsuccessful attempts to move the cart, he fled the store. WZTV reported Metro Police later picked him up and charged him with theft of merchandise and driving on a suspended license.

Crafting During the Coronavirus

- Steve Walton of Shotley Bridge, England, took a bad spill in 2018 and, after a series of surgeries, had to have the lower part of his leg amputated in January. He was scheduled to be fitted with a prosthetic leg in mid-March, but his appointment was delayed because of the coronavirus crisis. That was when his wife, Atchari, went to work, making a leg for him using a bucket, fiberglass resin and wood. The first attempt kept falling off ("It was more akin to something Long John Silver would wear," Walton said), but Ms. Walton refined her project using a moon boot, and it worked. "My wife is very practical. She can turn her hand to anything," Walton told the BBC. "I am not going to use this regularly, but it will be good for getting around the house for the next three to six months. There are people far worse off than me at the minute."

"Visits to selected facilities were completed from March 19 through March 24, 2020," according to a March 26 report regarding the system's COVID-19 readiness. "Inspectors drove to [Veterans Health Administration] medical facilities that were close to their homes and observed or underwent the screening process or both.

"Upon arrival to a facility, [Office of Inspector General] staff did not immediately make their identity known to VHA staff. After observing VHA personnel screen individuals who were seeking entrance or being screened themselves or both, OIG staff sought entrance to community living centers ...to determine if they would be denied entrance as a visitor. The unannounced visits to facilities were planned to minimize exposure and potential transmission of the novel coronavirus for both V.A.

and OIG personnel as well as patients and visitors," the document adds.

"A total of 237 facilities (58 medical centers. 125 community-based outpatient clinics, and 54 community living centers) were visited," according to the report. The bulk of the V.A. facilities received adequate grades, with the San Diego region one of a few outliers. "Four facilities were observed as having no screening procedures in place. At three locations, [Office of Inspector General] staff presented themselves as visitors and were politely greeted but not asked any COVID-19 screening questions. At the fourth facility, the V.A. San Diego HCS—Imperial Valley VA Clinic, patients and visitors were permitted to freely enter the waiting room. The [Office of Inspector General] team entered, stood in the waiting room for 10 minutes, and were not greeted or screened by VHA staff." The Chula Vista VA mental health clinic was also among the four that failed the screening. (Veterans clinics in Lakeside and Auburn Gresham, Virginia were faulted for similar failures.)

Compounding San Diego's bad marks, officials here reported no plans to share either beds or personal protective equipment supplies with community providers, according to the document. "Facility leaders were asked about plans to share intensive care unit beds or personal protective equipment with community hospitals, whether there was a written agreement for transfer of COVID-19 patients to non-VA community hospitals when a higher level of care was needed, sharing of V.A. staff with non-VA facilities, and referral patterns." Fewer than half of the V.A. facilities reviewed nationally had reported such plans, the report notes. "As of March 19, 2020, 23 of the 54 (43 percent) facility leaders reported plans to share ICU beds, personal protective equipment supplies, or both, with community providers." Auditors cited the San Diego region for having inadequate supplies of hand sanitizers, N95 respirators, disposable level 4 gowns, surgical masks, and disinfecting/sanitizing wipes, per the report.

"The OIG recognizes that conditions at VHA facilities and veterans' needs related to the COVID-19 pandemic may change rapidly." concluded John Daught, M.D., the agency's assistant inspector general for Health Care Inspections. "It is hoped that the findings in this report will assist VHA leaders in gaining a better assessment of screening. access, and emergency preparedness at its facilities. This may also be a useful reference for facilities that were not visited to gauge their status."

A March 26 memo from the Veterans Health Administration fired back, contending that the inspector general's audit itself may have jeopardized patient and staff safety. "We are... deeply concerned that these investigators (many of them clinicians) did not abide by CDC guidelines regarding social distancing, and their movement from one V.A. hospital and Community Clinic to the next could very possibly make them COVID-19 vectors and put our patients and staff at risk."

Responded auditors: "The 'investigators' were nearly all clinicians who volunteered to drive to facilities to conduct the inspection. To leverage that opportunity, OIG leaders determined that asking some questions about readiness and medication, supply, and equipment needs would be of immediate use to both V.A. and other stakeholders. All OIG staff screened for conditions before traveling to facilities and did observe CDC guidelines on site. Any inference to the contrary is inaccurate."

continued from page 13 resolution: quarantine schools, churches, and public amusements; give the Board of Health the power to enforce the edict. On Monday, they brought their proposal to the city council."

On the fateful day of the hearing, opponents lined up to speak against the measures and question the integrity of their sponsors.

Roland Dowell, representing the small city's motion picture exhibitors, lashed out at the establishment physicians who were calling for a virtual lockdown of the city. "And perhaps some of the doctors are rather glad to have an epidemic, as I've heard they're charging 'flu' patients \$5 a visit, and other patients only \$3."

"That's a low down, diabolical lie!" screamed Chartres-Martin. "If this man will meet me on the street and repeat his statement, he'll be in the hospital, or I will!"

"If the council will do nothing not approved by the theater managers! If such is the case, there's no use in the health board trying to do anything."

C h a r t r e s - M a r tin — who was born in Cardiff, Wales on October 7, 1886, and came to San Diego in 1912 — had reason to be upset. He had suffered a personal loss in the pandemic when his stepfather, Dr. William P. Williamson, died of the flu in October 1918.

"In the last seven days, we have had over 600 new cases and 42 deaths. We're doing our best to cope. It's time the council did its share!" said the doctor.

As a result of the physician's plea, along with backdoor lobbying and pressure from state health officials who threatened to override the city, the

council finally acted.

"San Diego Shut Tight," said a headline over a December 5 dispatch in the *Los Angeles Times*.

"The most rigid quarantine measures that have been imposed on any city during the influenza epidemic will go into effect at Midnight in San Diego," the story said.

"The quarantine terms provide for the closing of all schools, churches, lodges and societies, barber shops, soda fountains, candy and cigar stands, all wholesale or retail businesses excepting those handling food, drugs, doctors supplies, stock supplies, fuel and all manufacturing establishments, excepting those pronounced essential."

Noting that "newspapers are included in the essential list of manufacturers," the story went on to say that "all persons dealing with the public must wear masks."

"There were 166 new cases of the disease today and six deaths resulting from it."

On December 6, the day after the council's approval of the Draconian move, "San Diego looked helps you separate your work life, versus your home life."

like the deserted village," said a *Los Angeles Times* dispatch, "as citizens and police authorities united in a desperate effort to stamp out the flu by the drastic quarantine put into effect last midnight."

"Shops and places of business were closed, but necessities ordered by telephone were delivered from the stores. The few places permitted to be open could only be entered by persons wearing masks," according to the story, headlined "Only Maskers Enter."

"Many unusual sights were seen. In front of one of the large butcher shops was stationed a big police officer who warned each customer before entering to don a flu mask. On one of the bank buildings was a placard placed there by the president. 'You cannot enter without a mask.'

"An extra squad of police assisted the regular force explaining the rigid quarantine and warning persons as to its fulfillment. Tomorrow there will be no warnings, but arrests will be made for violation of the ordinance."

Tourists received no special dispensation. "The



lobbies of the hotels have been robbed of all chairs and seats and guests were chased to their rooms by authorities and proprietors. Shoeshine parlors, like soda fountains, were closed tight. Citizens must shine their shoes and go without drinks, either soft or otherwise until the ban is raised."

Chartres-Martin had ultimately prevailed, but there was no rejoicing. It wasn't the first time the council had been warned, and many lives had been lost.

For Remondino, too, it was a bittersweet moment. During the 1870s, the Italian-born physician — trained at Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia — had been the first president of San Diego's board of health and had been county physician for several terms.

A civil war veteran,

with a collection of 250 guns, swords, sabers, lances, and armor, some described him as picturesque, intellectually audacious, egocentric, genius and eccentric," notes George W. Kaplan in a biography for the *San Diego Journal of History*, Summer and Fall, 2015.

"He was known to have trained crickets. He would often venture out for an evening walk in a blue French military cloak with one side thrown over a shoulder to show the inner red lining while wearing a Derby hat and carrying a cane."

Remondino grew famous for authoring *The History of Circumcision from the Earliest Times to the Present*, for which his enemies labeled him "a dilettante or a quack," according to Kaplan.

"The book was very popular; its first printing in 1891 sold over 50,000 copies resulting in a second printing in 1900," writes Kaplan. "Reportedly over a half million copies were sold. It was reprinted in 1974, 2001, and 2008.

"At 346 pages, this tome was considered to have almost singlehandedly popularized circumcision in the United States at a time when the intact foreskin was the norm and circumcision was an aberration," the biographer adds.

"Remondino performed the surgery on adult men many times. He wrote, 'In adults with a very narrow, thin, not overlong prepuce, a very good result often follows...I have repeatedly performed it on lawyers, book-keepers, clerks, and even laboring men, who have gone from the office to the courts, counting rooms, or stores without the least resulting inconvenience or loss of time.' He was such an enthusiast for circumcision that some called the operation 'Remondino's Procedure.''

"Given his previous military experience, Remondino's practice was weighted toward surgery," according to Kaplan. Gunshot wounds were an occasional occurrence in his practice and at least two of his cases were reported in the local newspaper.

"In 1875, he treated William Gregg after a shootout on Fifth Avenue and D Street that resulted from a difference of opinion about a lawsuit. In 1877, Dr. Remondino was called to treat G.F.W. Richardson, whose thigh was shattered by a gunshot wound in an altercation with the superintendent of the water works; the wound was severe enough to necessitate amputation. "Remondino's reputation extended beyond the confines of San Diego; he was once called to Ensenada to operate on a patient with a cyst of the pancreas caused by *Echinococcus*, a parasitic tapeworm that sometimes affects sheepherders."

Remondino emerged from retirement at age 72 to meet the flu pandemic threat, according to Kaplan. "He took charge of an improvised hospital located in the Mission Brewery near Five Points [at the foot of Washington Street] where most of the patients, Italians, were being treated with garlic and red wine.

"In 1922 Remondino was injured in an automobile accident at Tenth Avenue and B Street in which he sustained cuts about the head and face. At age 78, he sustained a stroke and developed cardiac failure but remained alert. He continued his literary work from his bed until a second stroke resulted in his death two months before his 81st birthday."

Chartres-Martin, an avid yachtsman who cofounded the Southwestern Yacht Club on Point Loma in 1925, lived on until 1961. He is buried in Greenwood Memorial Park.

By the time the pandemic ended, 366 San Diegans were reported dead, out of a population of 75,000. Over 500,000 died in the United States, with more than 20 million deaths reported worldwide.

For San Diego, the epidemic peaked in December, with 2039 cases and 188 deaths, according to Crawford. The order to wear masks ended on Christmas Eve, 1918.


