

said there's a light at the ped crossing there, so they did nothing. The light is basically worthless - cars don't even see it. Both east and west sides are really dangerous. I heard a bike rider was killed on the west side awhile back."

Others contacted me with the same concerns. "I'm interested in creating a safe path for pedestrians to access the San Diego River bike path from Sports Arena," one woman wrote. "I live in the Loma Riviera community and many of us are hoping we can reach out, as the con-

struction is ongoing." Point Loman Daniel shared his experiences with the crossing: "It was worse when traffic coming from the beach in the right lane never had to stop. It was impossible to get an opening to cross. At least now, they have to stop at a red light, periodically providing a window (albeit short) to dash across. I have complained many, many times about this, to no avail. Like Angel, I am always scared for

someone who nicely stops, knowing someone is ready to slam into them. They need a quick button-activated light (like the road entering the Seaworld entrance). That would turn the light yellow, then red for a quick 10 seconds or so to allow crossing. But that will never happen. Hopefully, this entire bridge project will include a completely new design for safer access to the river path. The bike path is one of the best places to ride, safely away from traffic, from the beach all the way to Mission Valley. But if you have to risk your life to get there, it kind of defeats the purpose."

Eva has nearly been hit three times. "I live off West Point Loma Blvd," she shared via email. "I almost got hit there many times before; the worst is when one car in one lane stops and then the other cars just keep going, even going around the stopped car as if they don't see people crossing. It's completely unsafe." Jessica: "I got badly rear-ended because I stopped for a pedestrian at that crosswalk, and now unfortunately, I never stop, because I'm scared of getting into an accident. The city needs to do something about that horribly unsafe crosswalk." "I've had this conversation way too many times," Mike commented. "If you have a mobility disability around here, drivers gonna run you down.

This is a major problem."

Green Angels in the red? Cutbacks rumored for highway helpers

San Diego's Michelle Cardenas is worried: she heard that Angeles Verdes (Green Angels), a free of charge and national road service, might be discontinued in certain parts of Mexico. "The Green Angels towed our car to Rosarito when we broke down on the toll road," she said. "They came up at the right

time, and possibly saved our lives by helping us move our car." (Cardenas and her family traveled from San Diego to Ensenada on a regular basis until two months ago, when the port city restricted non-essential visitors to curb the spread of COVID-19.) "I saw the ElSudCaliforniano.com news report about the Mexican government cutting funding for the Green Angels," Cardenas said of the June 21 story. "We planned on driving down to Cabo San Lucas when they lift the restrictions, but we'll need to make an emergency plan if the Green Angels are 86'd."







Oceanside Laker Trump

backer The COVID-19 pandemic may have cut the number of donations from San Diegans backing the reelection of president **Donald Trump**, but money continues to stream in. Among prominent contributors, per new filings at the Federal Election Commission, are Vista City Attorney **Darold Pieper**, with \$1000 on May 30. He was at the center of a marijuana flap at the city in November 2018, during which the city attorney accused a pro-cannabis group

of failing to disclose the identity of their mailer's sponsors. Also giving to this year's Trump cause was Oceanside's James Buss, son of late Los Angeles Lakers owner Jerry Buss and part-owner of the team. According to the federal filings, James Buss, who kicked in \$250 on May 28, is currently a Lakers department head. In 1984, he was sued for fraud and passing bad checks, according to a UPI account in October of that year. Three years ago,

he was stripped of all power over the team by sibling Jeannie Buss in a family putsch that gave her control of the Lakers, as related by USA Today in February 2017. "She'd recount all the mistakes that her brother, part-owner and former front office executive Jim Buss, and longtime general manager Mitch Kupchak had made and wondered why her patience in them hadn't paid off, she was more and more ready to do this deed," the report said.

"The message is clear here: Do not underestimate Jeanie Buss," Adam Streisand, her attorney, told the L.A. Times in March 2017. "There is not going to be [another] palace coup. Not now. Not ever."

After Trump questioned the intelligence of Lakers star LeBron James in an August 2018 tweet, Jeannie came to the player's defense, writing, "We could not be more proud to have LeBron James as part of our Lakers family." Federal records show she gave \$270 to Act Blue, a Democratic online fundraising site, in February of last year.

Jerry Buss, who died in February 2013 at 80 of cancer complications, was a longtime resident of Rancho Santa Fe. An infamous womanizer, he was busted in May 2007 at 74 for driving drunk while cruising around Carlsbad in his gold Mercedes-Benz E320 after midnight with 23-year-old Jeannana M. Flores of New York City, according to an L.A. Times account of the day.

The Lakers are now partly owned by L.A billionaire Patrick Soon-Shiong, also the proprietor of the Times and San Diego Union-Tribune, which rarely report on the inside doings of Lakers ownership.

Nathan's Gaslamp safety **pitch** It's been a torrent of mixed messages from local politicos racing to keep up with the always morphing COVID-19 pandemic, especially for Democratic county supervisor Nathan Fletcher and San Diego mayor Kevin Faulconer. The Gaslamp Quarter's "diligent cleaning crews pledge to pressure-wash all

> sidewalks and patios every week, and restaurants pledge to provide responsible dining service, and hotels pledge to keep guests safe and comfortable, and retailers pledge to keep customers safe while they shop," said Fletcher in a June 26 video for the Gaslamp Quarter Association. He strolled down a Gaslamp sidewalk while extolling the area's purported safety, with scenes of custodians hosing down sidewalks and waitresses taking safety vows. A

separate video, using the same script, featured San Diego Republican mayor Kevin Faulconer. Four days later, the hammer dropped. Bars that don't serve food were ordered by the county to shut down, and eateries of all kinds slapped with a 10 pm curfew.

Sushi's not a shoo-in.

You reveal as much with what you don't say as with what you do. I notice you omitted major trends from recent memory, like that comes in food-dye-flavored rainbow colors. Similarly von do not 1

ticular location. Instead. vou're stuck between two cuisines, each of which boasts its own peculiar traditions, and neither of which yields its secrets to the casual observer. To

me, this says your long, self-imposed exile has distilled your hipster yearnings down to their very essence. Both choices offer you so much more than a delicious meal.

Normally, health-conscious hipsters will ditch their quinoa salads and green smoothies for a rack of ribs with nary a vegetable in sight, a

full pound of chopped pork soaked in tangy sauce, or a flourish of sliced brisket from which decadent rivulets of rendered fat ooze their way into your heart (and the rest of your arteries). Somehow, the downhome charm of barbecued meats affords hipsters an excuse to eat staggeringly unhealthy meals under the ruse of a porkily authentic sense of Americana. few tiered assets when this went down. Some of the worst shit I've ever seen in almost 20 years. Pilots wouldn't fly in to provide CCA because the area was too hot, sustained fire for hours, no way out or in. Basically a fishbowl with a two way gun range. The dudes that defended this place not only repelled the initial insider attack but continued to fight for hours after ward. I'll never forget the faces of the men we picked up when they finally let additional assets in to the area. Most of the guys we checked for IDs and dog tags had been shot in the back, the worst situation I've seen, and I'll never forget it. The COP was retrograded afterwards, all ordnance expended, etc; A10s flying low over the valley dropping ordnance as a deterrance to counter attack and to eliminate resistance. The best way to honor these men is to remember them, remember their families when you think of your loved ones, they had wives and children that will never see their husbands/fathers again. That's the reality of war, it's not something to cherish, you experience incredible highs and lows, tremendous joy and pain, there's nothing like it, and you will never ever forget it. I would never take back the time I had, and I know most guys say the same, but it won't change the pain I feel when I think of those dudes and so many others you get to know along the way. Watch the movie, and if you have your own story, pass it on to others if you can, the real story is always passed down by the warriors that saw it, just like the old skaldic traditions. The unsinkable **Linda Brovles**

Linda Broyles often goes to the beach, just to look. "I see the cruise ships anchored there just a mile out to sea," she says. "It looks romantic, but I know what's going on. On each ship there are crew, stuck."

Broyles is a San Diego ER nurse, but since 2016 she has been working at sea as a nurse on Holland America cruise ships, largely cruising Asia.

Until the end of 2019.

That's when she was on the Westerdam, an 82,500-ton, 2000-passenger mega cruise liner built in 2003, and beloved by older, richer cruise passengers.

"I didn't know that on the last trip, Coronavirus would hit, and keep me stuck at sea for five months," she says.

"January 31st was when things started to

day, our passengers wanted to get off the ship again, and they were denied, because they had discovered infected people aboard World Dream. And it was assumed that we did the same. And it was all downhill from there. They told us we actually had to leave. So we left, and then got turned away from port to port to port all through Asia.

"The passengers at that point were getting

happen. We had been to Vietnam for Christmas, and then, for New Years, Thailand. We had also done an overnight in Shanghai. That was in December. And then we had gone to Ha Long Bay. On January 31st, we were meant to do an overnight in Hong Kong. But right then things were brewing. We were set to disembark 600 passengers and take 600 more on board. And we were scared. We screened passengers, but some got through the cracks. On February 3rd, we went to Manila, and we were turned away, because we had been to Hong Kong. So we went to Kaohsiung in Taiwan, and we didn't have any trouble. Passengers went ashore, explored the town. But a cruise ship called the World Dream was berthed alongside us. And supposedly, in their health declarations, [some of their passengers] were not completely forthcoming. And the next

very anxious. Rightfully so. Things were starting to erupt. People called home. One crew member on another ship hung a banner that said, 'I'm from the US. I'm being held hostage'. An Australian couple on board were doing regular video reports back to their home TV network. People were becoming desperate. But our Dutch captain, Vincent Smit, was great, and kept us all informed. The US embassies in the different countries were in touch, and the company guaranteed full refunds."

Finally, on the 13th of February, Cambodia let the ship dock and let the passengers disembark, until one tested positive. "Everything stopped," says Broyles. "Then it proved to be a false positive. So we finally got the last of the passengers off on February 19th. And the crew was tested, and nobody had the virus."

Perhaps surprisingly, Broyles says there

had been no panic among the passengers. "Most were retired Americans. Everyone was very civil."

The captain told Broyles and the rest of the crew he had decided to head back across the Pacific to the US. They refueled and provisioned in Honolulu, and authorities even let the crew ashore for one night.

"So we sailed on, heading for San Diego. And I thought that was it. I could come ashore, see my family, contract over. But in San Diego they said 'Nope.' As a nurse, I was 'essential personnel.' We still had crew to look after. And

the CDC was being strict.

"We're now talking mid-April. This was a long time together. Of course, relationships developed. There were certainly a few pregnancies by then. We hoped we'd get to port before they started having births on board. But we were one big family. And this was with 70 nationalities among the crew. Romanians, Chinese, Jamaicans, South Americans, Filipinos, Brazilians, Indonesians, Malaysians, Mauritians, Sri Lankans,

Dutch, on and on.

"I mean, when they said I couldn't go home, I could see Coronado! From the ship! My husband Rob and my two boys Andrew and Lucas could practically see me. On the phone, Rob said, 'Just barge down the gangplank, push past the security and run like hell. Port police will catch you, but I'll pay your bail.' But I knew I was no match for security. And then they made the ship leave San Diego again. So, back to Mexico. Mexico wouldn't let us off the ship either. Except, when we got to Puerto Vallarta, they let one guy from our casino leave, because he was Mexican."

Could it get any worse? Well, yes. The company decided to send the Westerdam back to Asia, complete with Broyles as nurse, to ferry the different Asian crews home.

Incredibly, Broyles told her boss she was okay with that, even though there was no guarantee if or when the Westerdam would be coming back.

But finally, the company found a replacement for Broyles. In a bizarre gathering of the clan, half a dozen cruise ships anchored in the waters off Ensenada and effected an exchangeby-lifeboat of crews. It took two days. Asian crew were shuttled to Westerdam and one other ship for the long voyage home. Broyles was taken aboard the Koningsdam.

Just over a week later, May 8th, the Koningsdam pulled into San Pedro. After more than five months at sea, Linda Broyles walked down the gangplank onto dry land.

"I felt elation. I couldn't believe it. To have solid ground beneath my feet. And no-one running up and telling me, 'You've got to go back!""

But she has regrets too. "I felt I was leaving 'my' ship, the Westerdam, before she had completed her mission. I told my boss I felt I was leaving the job undone. They still had to return the Asian crews to Asia. And there are still so many stuck on other ships out there. And these are people who are usually not sailors. They are onboard shop concessionaires, spa masseuses, nannies, casino blackjack operators. Many aren't being paid. It has been months! I know three different crew members have committed suicide recently. And suicides continue. Like this Ukrainian girl who jumped overboard. She was booked on a charter flight to go home, and apparently it got canceled. I think that was aboard the Regal Princess."


After all this, would she go to sea again? "Well, I've been told I'm too old. So I guess I'll have to hang up my sea boots. But absolutely. I'd go in a heartbeat." ■



"My advice is to actively listen. To me, that's a lost art." To me, that's a lost art."

"You painted a black person"

Last year, while exiting an MTS bus at the El Cajon Transit Station, I heard a man yell, "Imagine a world without black people!" A black girl walked away from the bus with her head held down. I normally ignore

the ravings of crazy street people. But I replied, "The world would be a gloomy place!"

When I was 11, a white supremacist moved in across the street from my childhood home on the south side of Chicago. He plastered swastika-covered papers on light poles all over the neighborhood with

the message, "Keep this neighborhood white."

Up to that point, all I'd done was tell my white and Hispanic neighborhood friends to stop using the n-word. But now, I got to stand up against an actual neo-Nazi. I grabbed a step stool and a paint scraper and walked from light pole

to light pole, up and down the surrounding streets, tearing all the papers down. Every time he put them back up, my brothers and I took them down.

My experience with race doesn't fit the standard white privilege/ white ignorance/white guilt narrative — not that anybody's does.

As a white kid attending Chicago public schools, I was the minority. In sixth grade, I and a small group of white kids were bused to a school on the other side of the railroad tracks. Black kids routinely lined up to throw rocks as the bus passed by.

But I was accepted by my classmates. One day, the alpha male of the class, William, announced who his list of "cool kids" were. I made the cut. The only other white boy didn't. A couple years later at another south side school, my friend Jovan, a towering figure, announced in class, "If I ever see Eric getting beat up outside, I will help him."

I've experienced the bond of friendship with many African-Americans and was often treated with fondness — even by my middle school social studies teacher, who frequently taught us how evil "the white man" is. I quietly wondered if she realized I was a white male.

I think of a painting I did in 8th grade of an African-American baseball player. When my black classmate Lisa saw it, she was jubilant. "You painted a black person!" I didn't understand. I hadn't even thought about the subject's skin color. But it meant the world to her.

When I heard about

African-Americans being disproportionately affected by COVID-19 and related comorbidities, I thought of Shalon Buchanan, who was the first friend I lost to a tragic death. We became friends freshman year as we sat next to each other every day in one of my classes. She really enjoyed playing with the hair on the back of my head. She was the first person I looked for sophomore year, but I couldn't find her. I was shocked to find out she died of a heart attack during the heatwave of the summer of 1994.

And as the world shakes with the declaration that black lives matter, I think of Christopher Pinkins, a gentle autistic African-American kid I mentored when I started volunteering at church. He was murdered at age 27. He was walking in a neighborhood in which his skin color made him a minority, and wandered into an alley, where he found a car wheel to roll around. Two men accused him of trying to steal it. They chased him down, beat him, and crushed his windpipe with a crowbar. This happened in broad daylight, at a busy intersection, as a crowd of pedestrians stood by, watching, doing nothing to stop it.


His killers weren't police officers or white supremacists. They were a Mexican immigrant and a Hispanic gangbanger. (When I shared what happened with a Mexican friend, she pleaded with me not to think all Mexicans are bad people, a thought that had never crossed my mind.) The men were convicted of murder, but got out of prison after five years.

There were no rally cries for justice. Neither Jesse Jackson nor Al Sharpton held a press conference to speak against the racism that killed Christopher or to say his life mattered. As I investigated the incident and made inquiries, the only response I got from the social justice-oriented church in that neighborhood was that I should think about how the killers and their families will be affected if they go to prison.

"Racism is being taught"

El Cajon resident Lori St. Pierre, a black woman, lost her nephew Jordan Davis to a racist killing in Jacksonville, Florida in 2012. It made national headlines and drew in famous voices.

She explains, "Jordan and his friends went Black Friday shopping. While stopped at a gas station, [Michael David Dunn, a white man] pulled up next to them and yelled at them, tell-

ing them to turn their 'thug music' down. Jordan said they didn't have to. So [Dunn] pulled out a gun and started shooting. Our Jordan was murdered by a white supremacist for no reason. The killer's fiancée testified he told her he would 'shoot those n*ggers again' if he could."

Dunn was convicted of murdering Davis and attempting to murder Davis' three friends and sentenced to life in prison without parole plus 90 years.

It wasn't the first runin with racism St. Pierre had. Her father, Dr. Lucien Holman, worked with Dr. Martin Luther King during the 1960s civil rights movement. He was the state president of the Illinois NAACP and served on the executive board of the national NAACP. He also owned a black-oriented newspaper and sat next to President Johnson as he signed civil rights legislation. She says, "We always had people in and out of the house, civil rights activists, people writing news stories. It was a way of life."

Then one day as a little girl, she had to flee her home in Ioliet, Illinois (outside of Chicago) when white supremacists firebombed her father's rental properties and the Jewish-owned grocery store across the street. She says, "They didn't want blacks to own property. They didn't want us to have equal rights. And they didn't like that Mr. Kave had his store in the black neighborhood."

Though she has been afflicted by racism all her life, St. Pierre says, "We weren't raised to think white people are the enemy. People say whites are out to get us. That's racist. And that racism is being taught.

"I don't know anyone on this earth who was part of slavery. Why hold that against generation after generation? Slavery cursed us all, but we can be released from that with repentance and forgiveness. We have a

choice to love or hate, to choose the peace of God or the division and havoc that is coming from the

enemy of our souls.

"Dr. King said, 'I have a dream that one day on the red hills of Georgia the sons of former slaves and the sons of former slave owners will sit down together at the table of brotherhood.' I don't care if you're black or white. We all can have misconceptions about other people.

"Look at Santee. You hear [it called] Klantee. I've experienced racism almost everywhere, but

when I lived in Santee, I didn't feel any. I still do most of my shopping there, and my family has never felt uncomfortable or unwelcome.

"Dr. King also dreamed that in America, people would 'not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character.' Today they're judging police by the color of their uniform. You can't blame an entire group for the actions of a few, whether it's whites, blacks, or people who wear a blue uniform.

"If there's 100,000 police, I refuse to believe any of 99,000 would want to harm black people or anyone. Abortion is a bigger threat to black lives. Planned Parenthood's founder Margaret Sanger's agenda was to eradicate the black race. I mean, if we're aborting babies, how can we value anybody's life?"

Then she brings up the identity issue. "Most African-Americans can't trace our roots. We don't know which country our ancestors came from. Personally, I've found even deeper roots in my identity as a child of God. That is where I find my peace, strength, truth, forgiveness, and love for others."

St. Pierre adds, "It's something we grow up with. You explain to your kids, primarily your boys, be extra careful, think twice before you speak, know your surroundings."

Black elder from La Mesa

Pastor Rolland Slade of El Cajon's Meridian Baptist Church says, "As a black person, I have more awareness of my skin color than a white person does. As a young man my father taught me, 'If you engage a white man you don't know or he calls you out, don't look him in the eye.' That advice came from his southern experience. He was not allowed to engage my grandmother's employers as an equal." He says those words affect him to this day. "I would never tell my sons to look away. I tell them, 'You have nothing to be ashamed of and no reason to be looked down on."

He says he has relayed the rest of his dad's advice to his sons. "Unfortunately, it's a rite of passage between African-American fathers and their sons. My father sat me down at 17 and

taught me how I should engage with police officers if I got pulled over. You make sure your window is down. Don't obstruct their vision. Don't move quickly. Tell them everything you're going

to do. Put your hands on the steering wheel so they can see them. If he says he needs your license and registration, you communicate, 'I'm going to reach into my glove compartment to get my registration.' I shared that with my boys as well. I wasn't trying to scare them; I was telling them, 'Yhese are things you need to know."

He clarifies that he

has never feared police officers. "I never allowed myself to get in a position where I was breaking the law. I had more fear of my dad killing me than a policeman. He loved me deeply, but he was a disciplinarian. He had a good reputation, and that's not something to take lightly. He got respect, because he did his job and did it well. He started in a segregated Navy in 1942 during World War II. He served in Korea and Vietnam. The Navy he went into was vastly different from the Navy he left as a Senior Chief. In all, he had over 50 years of government service."

Slade was born in southeast San Diego but moved to La Mesa as a child. "Going from an all-black neighborhood to being one of only three black families in the neighborhood was traumatic."

Though nobody targeted him with racism as a child, he says, "We had

a white supremacist retail store along my route to school. The Daily Californian published the letter I wrote about it in elementary school." He says when he came back to La Mesa in 1998, he found flyers for a Klan rally lying on the ground. "I wrote another letter to the same paper.... Now I'm a married man with children, and I'm back." He says he couldn't imagine that happening in La Mesa today.

In response to the recent riot, he says, "Seeing La Mesa burn really gripped my heart, because I consider that my hometown. It hurts to see your home burning. In civil society, we're supposed to be able to talk. Violence is not supposed to be part of American politics. We need to get back to that. The civil rights movement had its roots in the church. My understanding of BLM is it does not. That creates a big chasm.

rative is that you're being hunted, you'll be on the defensive."

Slade says he got involved during the protests in El Cajon after Alfred Olango was killed by a police officer in 2016. "I was part of a group of leaders that stood between protesters and police. I was in a meeting when we heard police siren after police siren going by. I thought, 'Something's going on.' Instead of just sitting there, we got involved. I met some young guys and had respectful conversations. I got them to safety before they could do something that might harm themselves. We found mutual respect. They invited me to things after that, and I showed up."

"It's important that the clergy in El Cajon knew each other.... You have to know people before a crisis comes, so you're ready to cut straight to dealing with the issue."

"My advice is to actively listen. To me, that's a lost art. Everybody wants to talk and give their opinion. We're not taking the time to listen. Right now, people are hurting. The young people who are protesting want to be heard. I'm older, but I still don't know it all."

Slade made history June 16 when he was unanimously elected the first African American chairman of the Executive Committee of the Southern Baptist Convention, the world's largest Protestant Christian denomination.

Statistics

According to a San Diego District Attorney 25-year officer-involved shooting review, subjects of police shootings in San Diego County "are mostly male, Hispanic or white, and age 18-35... Ninety-two percent of subjects were armed with weapons."

No details were given about skin color in incidents involving unarmed subjects. An officer was killed or injured in 12 percent of incidents. "San Diego County had over 1,000 officers assaulted in 2017, up from an average of 700 over the previous nine years."

According to the Washington Post, the number of unarmed subjects shot and killed by police in America dropped from 94 in 2015 to 55 in 2019, "with white people accounting for 25 of them, while 14 of them were black."

Though police shootings of unarmed subjects have been decreasing, assaults on police officers and rates of violent crime have been increasing. The odds of a black citizen being killed by police or white supremacists are far lower than being killed by another black citizen. And though more police shooting victims are white, more murder victims are black.

According to statista.com, in 2018 there were 7407 black victims of murder and 6088 white victims. A 2018 Bureau of Justice Statistics survey reports, "After declining by more than 60 percent from 1994 to 2015... the number of violent-crime victims rose from 2015 to 2016, and again from 2016 to 2018. In 2018, the offender was of the same race or ethnicity as the victim in 70 percent of violent incidents involving black victims, in 62 percent of those involving white victims, 45 percent of those involving Hispanic victims, and 24 percent of those involving Asian victims."

"We had to get canning quickly."

Rollercoaster 2020 continues to hammer home the message we have little idea what's coming next. At this writing, San Diego somehow escaped being one of the 19 California counties the Governor ordered or recommended bars, breweries, and wineries be re-shut down.

However, remaining open invited a perfect pandemic storm as we entered a no-boom 4th of July weekend: COVID-19 cases have been mounting in Los Angeles and Arizona, both of which have ordered their bars to close. Thousands of people from both places appear likely to cruise into San Diego for the long weekend, and they will be out drinking. So, to mitigate the almost certain local spread of

coronavirus over the holiday, San Diego County proactively made the move to once again ban on-premise drinking in bars, breweries, and wineries that don't serve food.

So locally, fans of social drinking may have to settle for spreading the virus at backyard barbecues for another few weeks.

It's tough to see the re-opening move backwards, but this time around, at least we know the drill, which includes picking up take-out cocktails, and to-go cans and crowlers from our local breweries.

That now includes a few breweries you might not expect. When they closed to drinkers the first time, in March, San Diego's micro- and nanobreweries found themselves relying on packaged beer more than ever. Those already canning, started canning more. And several began releasing beer in cans for the first time.

Double Peak Brewing Co., for example. The small San Marcos brewery, which opened early last year, had planned to put beer in cans eventually, but "COVID-19 rushed us into it a lot faster then originally planned." Since March, Double Peak has released no fewer than eight of its beers in 4-packs, including its best sellers Whodunit IPA, Intergalactic Haze, and Day Hike Pilsner.

Chula Vista Brewery had 'always been a community-oriented space that sold all its beer in person, so when that was disallowed in March.

"We had to get canning quickly," says cofounder Tim Parker, "We weren't even doing crowlers." Now, crowlers and limited 4-packs are available, including Guerita blonde ale, Beautiful View pale

ale, and medal-winning brown ale Browner Than Ivan. Canning should increase soon, including limited retail distribution, as the brewery has picked up its own canning line.

Thr3e Punk Ales Brewing Co., another popular neighborhood hangout in Chula Vista, has long offered crowlers, but the July 4-pack release of Emo Brown coffee brown ale is its first official can release. Cofounder Steve Garcia says Thr3e

Punks had always planned on putting beer in cans at some point, but calls it "much more of a priority now." Next up are 4-packs of Kill the Pour IPA, La Flama Blanca Mexican lager,

and a watermelon hard seltzer dubbed SandíaGo.

White Labs Brewing Co., the small beermaking extension of the San Diego's global yeast purveyor, didn't seem like a likely candidate for canned releases. Much of the value of drinking in its taproom is educational: a chance to drink multiple versions of a single beer recipe, brewed with differing yeast strains, to compare and contrast each yeast's distinctive results. However, the brewery has found a clever way to recreate this at home. Its first ever can

release is called Tabberer IPA, and features two versions of the beer: a piny west coast IPA made with the company's signature California ale yeast, and a tropical hazy, brewed with East Coast ale yeast. White Labs will even post a guided video tasting of the two beers to its YouTube Channel.



Not many pedestrians. No mariachis. And definitely no striped zebra-donkeys.

ijuana! It feels like a lifetime. I'm down here checking on when

Caesar Hotel's opening. (They say they're looking at mid-July.)

And, hey hey! There's my fave cafe, Praga, right across Revolución.

It's not hard to get over. Traffic on this Sunday afternoon is, well, scanty. Mostly taxis, listlessly tapping their horns to get pedestrians' attention. Except, not many pedestrians either. No mariachis. And definitely no striped zebra-donkeys.

Praga (Prague, in Spanish), on the other hand,

is open. Of course, they've reduced their outside tables from 12 to 6. They also now have a gal named Aracely who unhitches the chain across the entrance, takes your temperature while you stand on a water-filled rubber mat, squirts antibacterial gel on your hands, and checks your mascara (that's mask, not make-up). She's wearing hers, plus a curved face shield.

She guides me to one of the six white tables on the sidewalk

patio. Glad not to have to go inside, even though you can see at a glance it really has that Bohemian feel — like you imagine from Bohemia itself. Black marble counter, white tables, sepia photos. On the other hand, hey, Bob Marley's "Jamming" on the

Carlos brings the menu. "It is simplified," he says. Only three other tables with customers, but the patio feels cozy, with black planter boxes and their red-flowered shrubs protecting you from the foot traffic of the street into which we're jutting out. Hmm. Menu has desayunos, sandwiches, pizzas, and a pasta dish. This is around six o'clock in the evening, but they're still doing breakfasts.

I'm sort of tempted by the breakfast dishes,


specially the 85-peso combo deal: Two eggs your

way, frijoles (refried beans), toast, Cafe Americano. Eighty-five pesos is about \$4.

The two main breakfast dishes are chilaquiles. Chilaquiles are a basic "leftover" breakfast idea. You fry corn tortillas chopped up into quarters, and add whatever's

left over from yesterday. But in restaurants, those "leftovers" are usually red or green salsa, chunks of chicken, cheese, frijoles, scrambled eggs. I've always been interested in them because for starters, they are delicious, as only refried leftovers can be, and then there's the fact that they come

in a direct line from the ancient cultures of Mexico. Of course. what you get depends on where in Mexico you eat them. Central Mexicans like them crisp, with the salsa added at the last moment. whereas Tapatios — people from Guadalajara — seem to love them thick and soggy, like polenta. Chilaquiles means "chiles and greens" in Nahuatl, the language of the Aztecs. So here, you can have it with green or red salsa,



Then I spot their one pasta dish. The "fettuccine con pollo" in a "creamy Alfredo sauce," with chunks of chicken breast a la plancha — grilled — comes in at 145 pesos, less than \$6.50. Love that Alfredo. Gotta go for it, even though we're talking Italian.

"To drink?" says Carlos.

Craft & Commerce gets fast foodie

Craft and Commerce; 675 W. Beech Street, Little Italy. There's something familiar about the

Consortium shut down its properties with the pandemic, and has been selectively re-open-

> ing them in recent weeks, with occasional quirks and sharing of resources. For example, Morning Glory didn't open till early

July, but I hear you can get its famous Japanese soufflé pancake at the Modern Times shop in the meantime.

Where I guess you'll no longer find that satirically creepy Ronald McDonald statue. At the moment, he's been reassigned to the re-opening of another Consortium property, Craft & Commerce. The cocktail hub and eatery returned the last weekend of June. with the faux-Ronald serving as quirky

reminder that social distancing rules are still in place, and masked bartenders and waitstaff a reminder that facial coverings are a must.

The presence of the fast food clown reflects another pandemic change as Craft & Commerce returns. In keeping with the half-dine-in, halftake-out theme we're seeing in many restaurants, Craft has selectively revamped its menu, embracing a fast food theme.

The idea is to reinterpret fast food favorites, but make them with quality ingredients, and maybe a bit of cheffy flourish. It's not entirely fast food derivative (there is still a bone marrow appetizer, bacony brussels sprouts, and chopped salad), but classic drive-thru orders definitely dominate. Probably my favorite reimagining is the McDonalds hash brown: the real thing gives you a mildly greasy, crispy patty for a little over a buck. Here, the Mc C Hash Browns are served blini style, a thick potato cake dressed with crème fraîche, pickled shallots, and smoked trout roe, for \$9.

There's a Chik-Fil-A style chicken slider (\$5), a bacon wrapped Hot Dog on a Stick (\$10), and in reference to der Wienerschnitzel, a chili dog (\$7.29). Of course, no San Diego fast food riff would be complete without a nod to Jack in the Box, and its crispy shell, value menu tacos. Likewise served by the pair, the Jack in the Crack



tacos have been made vegetarian, with soyrizo to go with the shredded iceberg lettuce and slice of American cheese (\$5). The upgrade here is really all about the fresh corn tortillas and guajillo salsa.

Despite the availability of dine-in reservations, I opted for a take-out order. Consortium is so committed to the bit, it made up its own cardboard fast food packaging, printed with a creepy clown graphic and logo repurposing golden arches to spell the initials CC.

So, I was a little disappointed when my four piece bucket of C Fried Chicken (\$15) didn't actually come in a bucket. It was good chicken — I went for the OG seasoning rather than the buffalo or chili-garlic styles, and it came with a trio of sauces anyway. But I think going after KFC may be the Achilles heel of Consortium's cheeky fast food endeavor. At twice the price, I can't definitively say it tastes better than the Colonel's secret recipe, which has never asked for sauce.

For the most part, though, I found this a fun way to return to the San Diego dining landscape while subtly encouraging take-out as an option. And you definitely won't find a McDonald's burger that comes close to the one served here with waffle fries and topped with white cheddar, onion confit, and kosher dill pickle. Craft & Commerce always belongs on the short list of best burgers in the city.



out is available when you can't get one.

It's a shame North Parkers can't make better use of Louisiana Purchase's gorgeous bar during the pandemic — though it doesn't stop a litany of craft cocktails being served. Fortunately, the restaurant has done a nice job making the most of its indoor/outdoor and patio seating, installing glass partitions between booths and alternating guest seating to one side or the other of some booths to keep more tables open.

I can't complain that a New Orleans restaurant menu is dominated by shrimp dishes I can't enjoy due to allergy, but I can let fellow sufferers know the service and kitchen staff were helpful in letting me know which dishes would put me at risk. In the end, I opted not to try the chicken wings encrusted with a crawfish meat batter, but

I might have to return with an epi-pen to take my chances with this dish.

What I can do is watch "Chef Q's daily specials," which on Thursdays include fried crab legs. For \$30 you get a pound of deep-fried, cornmeal dusted snow crab legs (and knuckles), served with a dish of melted butter. It feels exquisitely messy, in such a fine-looking establishment, to crack these legs apart in search of sweet crab meat. But it's hard work that must be done, in North Park, with cocktails.

Lookimabat isn't a part of the "Gooba" rapper's 23.6 million IG followers. "It's because he's a snitch," she commented on my timeline. "For me and what I'm into, I'd have to give him a 3 out of 10. He seems willing to do anything on stage which might satisfy his supporters, and you can't discount the fans' hype reaction, though that's also due to his overall shock and celebrity. But for whatever that's worth, he loses mad points for rapping over his vocals, and he still has a hype man singing half his words. We're definitely not down with that. I don't wanna see that from any rapper, emcee, or singer. For me it's lazy, and ruins the experience."

"And, what do you admire about him?" I asked.

"Far from admiration, but if I had to compliment him on something, it would be his understanding of social media and ability to go viral.... Mix that with a ghostwriter and the willingness to abandon all principles and ethics," continues Kahlee310, "and you have a successful rap star in 2020. If I throw out all the emotion and dislike for him as a person, the music is cool. Shout out to his ghostwriter."

The tune can be heard on Howard's website, and a vocal-only track was posted on his Facebook page that features video footage of Jade singing solo from a remote locale, in front of a blank backdrop. In addition to that creation, "I'll be releasing two songs a week for a year," Howard tells the Reader. "My mother will be doing two original pieces of art over the course of the year as well. The website

[alfredhowardwrites.com] is a subscription site and it will feature a lot of San Diego musicians." Howard certainly knows plenty of players, having recorded or performed with the K23 Orchestra, the Heavy Guilt, Karl Denson's Tiny Universe, Umphrey's McGee, Digital Underground, Garaj Mahal, the Slip, Jacob Fred Jazz Odyssey, ALO, the Breakfast, and many others. As if he wasn't already busy enough, Howard cofounded a new record label with his Heavy Guilt bandmate Josh Rice and Matt Molarius of Transfer, the Redwoods Music, whose debut release was a 7-inch single of The Midnight Pine's "Caution."

In order to keep new music flowing, Aether X have posted some demos in progress on their Facebook page, and members also took part in the recent 14-guitarist "San Diego Quarantine Guitar Collaboration 2020." The track features players from RDG, Up the Irons, Woke Up Dead, Night Shadow, Strange Crew, Axe of Creation, Township Rebellion, Chosen Arrows, and 2lil2late, all performing their contributions from isolation. In addition, Aether X singer-guitarist James Brady, also from New Day Mile

and Dolan Brotherhood, tells the Reader "Got some solo stuff coming out soon, Brady Guitar, should be on iTunes and Spotify. I'm exploring other personalities and the art of home recording in lieu of COVID-19. Aether X is still a thing, but this was a good excuse to explore a bit." A new solo track, "Our Time Has Come," is available on YouTube. "It's an experiment with influences by Tom Petty and Puscifer, the lyrics speak for themselves. Recorded in my living room with GarageBand."



ME, MYSELF AND EYE

Me, Myself and Eye was a 1960s act now considered pioneers of electronic space rock, almost creating a technosound with records like "I Come From the Andromeda Galaxy" and its flipside "You Look For Trouble," recorded in 1969 at Fanfare Studios. The band was the mostlysolo brainchild of Carl Gerde, who lived on Chase Avenue in El Cajon and played in a short-lived group called The Yellow Jackets, which performed only a handful of gigs before splitting. Gerde was an ingenious electronics whiz who loved both the Beatles and, later, Scientology. He made elaborate recordings in his garage, often tackling

topics such as his own abusive father (the inspiration behind "You Look For Trouble"). An avid UFO researcher who befriended principals from Area 51/Roswell reports, he reportedly struggled with mental illness, telling people he was experimenting with electromagnetic wave fields and the power of human thought, as well as building a machine that could bridge dimensions. A 1981 suicide attempt resulted in a coma that lasted just over ten years, until he passed away in 1992, at the age of 71. A copy of "I Come From the Andromeda Galaxy" recently sold for just over \$300 on eBay.



ORCHID MANTIS

Performing original compositions inspired by jazz, classical, and drum 'n' bass, initial members of Orchid Mantis included Nina Deering (vocals, vocoder, synth), Harley Magsino (e-bass), Caitlin Fahey Crow (cello, vocals), Rebecca Matayoshi (viola, vocals), John Smith (violin), Cliff Thrasher (cello), and Isaac Crow (drums, synth). Multi-instrumentalist Harley Magsino is originally from the Philippines and has his Masters from SDSU. Drummer Isaac Crow is a San Diego native known from

bands like Latin Jazz Quartet, bLUMPY, and Humankind. Cellist Caitlin Crow has performed with Thousand Butterflies, and cellist Cliff Thrasher has been a member of the Mid-Century Cello Quartet and the Bonita Trio. After releasing a self-titled album, the lineup distilled down to a core foursome of Isaac Crow, Nina Deering (who played with Crow in Humankind), Harley Magsino, and Caitlin Fahey Crow. Deering was killed in a car accident on June 11.



PUTTIN' ON THE FRITZ

"I'm an up-tempo original artist who likes to do fun songs," says Puttin' on the Fritz frontman Fritz Jensen. His former band Collage Menage proudly proclaimed themselves The Jesters of Rock for over two decades, staging prop-heavy video-accompanied extravaganzas that aspired for all the pageantry and spectacle of a Pink Floyd concert, with the budget of a high school prom. Fritz, one of the twins who fronted every incarnation of that group, has been performing solo around town at various open mics, trying out new material as

well as reworked tunes from the Collage catalog. "I like to perform my own original songs. I love to do performance rock, having props or anything else to stimulate the audience to enjoy the song." Trees prefer Palestrina

I'm spending some time in the Santa Cruz mountains and the Redwood forest. A Redwood forest is often compared to a cathedral and for good reason. I must admit, there is something of a sacred quietude that combines with the soaring trees, creating a cathedralesque atmosphere.

The music of the late Renaissance and early Baroque fits the forest perfectly. If they could sing, the trees would probably prefer Palestrina.

I did begin to wonder if there was any music inspired by the Redwoods. I should qualify that. I began to wonder if there was any good music inspired by the Redwoods. I'm sure there is some "innovative" composition which tries hard to represent the Redwoods as victims of the patriarchy. I'm not going to waste a moment looking for it.

I was thinking there might be something of substance, such as Frederick Delius's Florida Suite or Ferde Grofé's Grand Canvon. The British have done a good job of immortalizing their countryside with pieces such as On the Banks of Green Willow by George Butterworth and In the Fen Country by Vaughan Williams. Of course, Beethoven and Mahler immortalized the German and Austrian countryside with their symphonic efforts.

The only thing of substance I came up with for the Redwoods is Puccini's Girl of the Golden West. which is set in a Redwood Forest during the Gold Rush. Obviously the opera is not specifically about Redwoods, but it is an underappreciated masterpiece.

The opera is based on a play by David Belasco. Belasco was also the author of the play that inspired Puccini to write Madama Butterfly.

marry the upstanding sheriff, but she's not into him. Instead, she falls for Ramirez, the bandit masquerading as Dick Johnson. Minnie even cheats at cards to help Ramirez escape.

Ultimately, Ramirez is captured. The miners decide to hang him, but Minnie interrupts the execution and faces the mob down, holding them at gunpoint. She convinces the miners that they owe her

for all the care she's given them and they allow her and Ramirez to leave and start a new life together.

Minnie combines qualities of care and compassion along with the willingness to wield a gun in defense of the man she loves. She is unique in opera. She is neither a victim nor temptress but a fully integrated character who owns her dark side and uses it when necessary.

The Tobacconist: Stogie story

ther than an innate ability to turn heads with each passing performance, what do Montgomery Clift, Alan Arkin, Alec Guinness, Bud Cort, and Viggo Mortensen share in common? At a given moment in each man's career, he was handed a cigar and hired to put Sigmund Freud

on the couch. Adding another credit to the good doctor's celluloid

resume is Bruno Ganz, who, in one of his last performances, works hard to make this visit to *The Tobacconist* a healthy choice.

What would a film about Freud be without dream sequences and symbolism? Set in Vienna during the days leading up to World War II, both sorts of imagery occupy prime real estate in Nikolaus Leytner's (Lemming's First Case) strikingly appointed coming-of-age drama. At the bottom of Austria's Lake Atter, enwombed by a sea of green, sits Franz (Simon Morzé). A clap of thunder draws the 17-year-old out of the water and into a torrential downpour that leaves him slipping and sliding his way back home and under the covers. The same electrical storm that Franz fled claims the life of his mother's (Regina Fritsch) current lover. With money tight and the prospects of securing a new mealticket uncertain, mom has no choice but to ship her only son from Attersee to Vienna, where he'll live with, and apprentice under, a former lover.

Otto (Johannes Krisch) is more than just a cancer salesman; he's a one-man (and -legged, thanks to WWI) authority on smoking culture. "A tobacconist's capital is his memory," tops the first day's lesson plan. It is essential that Franz take stock of his clients' tastes and habits the moment they walk through the door. His job is to sell pleasure and desire, cigars "hand-rolled tenderly by beautiful women on their thighs." As if that cigar-box promise of lust were not enough, there's a stack of girlie magazines, sold on the side and kept hidden from view. (The only merchandise Otto refuses to stock are national socialist publications.) For his part, Franz finds his way into a relationship with Anezka (Emma Drogunova), a mercurial Bohemian fan dancer at the Black Cat cabaret. Their lovemaking spills out of the embryonic smoke shop and

into an exquisitely designed and lit studio mockup of the snow-covered storefront. Their nude, albeit condensation-free romp is an exhilarating moment of freedom; take sides against the Nazis, and it could be your last.

Franz's first impression of Freud comes from the town postman.

When asked what the

doc specializes in, he replies, "He treats nutcases." It's his relationship with Anezka that causes Franz to wonder if maybe he's one of them, and to seek the advice of the shop's most famous stogie sucker. (Oddly enough, it's Freud who first expresses an interest in the young man's sexcapades.) As played by Ganz, Freud's downfall is a good cigar. If Franz's offer to exchange imported Havanas for the doctor's advice feels like a stretch — how can he afford them on an apprentice's salary? — it's nothing compared to Freud cutting short a plump and pampered patient, whining on the costly clock, to answer the call of Franz, motioning outside

The mechanics of hate are steadily set into motion: the prominent doctor arrives at his favorite coffee shop, only to find himself relocated to a newly-established "Jewish Only" section. Antisemitic diatribes supplant topical stand-up comedy. The degree of down-to-earth rapport reached by Morzé and Ganz would normally be recommendation enough, but the story is at its most compelling when the stars are asked to share billing with the rise of Naziism. Without the balance of equal attention, it would be a simple tale of hero-worship, a variation on My Favorite Year with psychoanalysis and Nazis substituting for Errol Flynn and NBC. ★★★

The Beach House — In the spirit of 1950s sci-fi comes Jeffrey A. Brown's gripping debut feature. Recent college dropout Randall (Noah Le Gros) is content at the thought of spending an eternity bumming around his father's spacious waterfront property. Emily (masterfully played by Liana Liberato), his semi-estranged girlfriend, is a bril-

liant college student eager to attend grad school. (Liberato is one of the few young actresses around capable of convincingly pulling off the role of organic chemistry major.) What is meant to be a weekend devoted to romantic reconciliation gets disrupted, first when an oddball pair of dad's old friends, already granted use of the space, show up, followed by strange atmospheric phenomena materializing on land and sea. Because I don't want to keep audiences away, I am loath to peg this as a cautionary fable about climate change. The point is there, but never hammered. And the film offers no explanations; the horror lies just out of sight, somewhere below the horizon line. 2019 _S.M. ****

Four Kids and It — Dad (Matthew Goode) might have used his surprise holiday as an excuse to reconcile with Mom. Instead, his son Ross (Teddie Malleson-Allen) is greeted at the lake house by her replacement parent (Paula Patton) and his surrogate siblings Maudie (Ellie-Mae Siame) and the smashingly appointed Smash (Ashley Aufderheide). Forced to coexist, the kids initially bond, not out of friendship, but rather out of fear of what's furrowing underground. The tunnelling effect that introduced the magical sand creature called Psammead looked promising - and any character voiced by Michael Caine, even this threadbare imitation of a Lorax, is worth a listen — as did his strict miracle-per-day limit to granting wishes. But clueless parenting and a badly miscast bad guy (Russell Brand) contribute to the film's ultimate downfall. Still, Caine and the kids have their fun — as when the Psammead is first introduced to the concept of carpeting. Andy De Emmony directs this adaptation of E. Nesbit's 1902 children's novel, farts and all. 2019. —S.M. ★★

Shanghai Traid — We open on a tight shot of Tang Shuisheng's (Xiaoxiao Wang) face, the world swarming around him. And for the next 7 days, we view life exclusively through the 14-year-old boy's eyes. It's the provincial lad's first visit to the big city. (Recreating Shanghai in the 1930s was a task for which production designer Juiping Cao was clearly ready.) Call it guilt by association: Shuisheng is drafted by his crime boss uncle Tang (Li Baotian) to tend to his mistress Xiao

Jinbao's (Gong Li) every wish. The decision was based not on the boy's desire to be a gangster, but on the luck of the draw: the untrustworthy Tang will hire only from within the family. Zhang Yimou directs as if assigned a pre-code Warner Bros. contract picture, and befitting its period, there is no nudity, and only the aftermath of violence is seen. The sparkling new digital restoration is currently available for download via Film Movement's Virtual Cinema. 1995. —S.M. ★★★★



ALBERT BROOKS FAMOUS SCHOOL FOR COMEDIANS (1972)

Omnibus television at its finest, The Great American Dream Machine was a weekly PBS presentation that John Lennon called "as good as, if not better than...Monty Python's Flying Circus." The series will live on for eternity, if for no other reason (and there are many) than this 10-minute short, based on a 1971 Esquire article, that introduced the world to Albert Brooks, Watch as Albert's embryonic mockinfomercial blows the lid off the "comedy fraternity of show business" by revealing, with near Masonic-like abandon, its deepest secrets. From an office that could just as easily belong to an Allstate agent, Albert makes a mockery out of intercutting — a simple turn of the head — before leading us on a personal tour of the campus. Core curriculum includes classes on punctilious pie-placement, how to properly execute a spit-take Danny Thomas-style, or, in the event the student cracks the big

Complaint Department

 Car buyer Da Tong Yang of Richmond, British Columbia, became so frustrated with his local Mercedes-Benz dealership that in January he flew to the company's headquarters in Stuttgart, Germany, to seek help. Yang bought his wife, Guifang Huo, a brand-new \$550 in 2017, partially because he believed the \$155,000 car to be one of the safest vehicles available, but a year later, the couple claimed, the steering wheel locked, causing the car to nearly crash into a concrete wall. Mercedes-Benz said an "internal electrical issue" was at fault and assured the couple it was fixed. Yang wasn't convinced, demanded his money back or a replacement car, then sued the company when it declined. The case has languished in court, prompting Yang's trip to Stuttgart in early June "to find justice, not only for him but also for other drivers," he told the *Richmond News*. Despite his personal appearance, litigation is still underway.

Desperate Times

- In Logrono, Spain, an unidentified man pushed the envelope on Spain's stringent lockdown rules, which make an exception for pet owners, who are allowed to go outside briefly with their pets, according to Gray News. The National Police tweeted a photo on April 24 of the man being arrested for sitting on a city bench holding his pet fish a fish bowl.

Bright Idea

- Bradley Bell, head writer for The Bold and the Beautiful, told the New York Post the show is experimenting with using lifesized dolls in love scenes as the daytime soap, in hiatus since March, resumed taping on June 17. Challenged to adhere to COVID-19 protocols, Bell said, "We put our heads together trying to figure out a way to make these scenes work without breaking the 8-foot (distancing) rule ... and we brought out a doll we used years ago as a corpse." The result, he said, "was very convincing ... We'll be using her with hair and makeup as a stand-in to match some of our leading ladies." The show has also recruited some of the actors' spouses as body doubles. "We've had stunt doubles before," Bell said, "but this is the first time we've had kissing doubles."

Least Competent, **Most Ambitious Criminals**

- Donnovan Russell Jester, 28, of Largo, Florida, was arrested on June 18 for grand theft of a vessel -- a \$900,000, 46-foot-long yacht. The Tampa Bay Times reported the theft took place March 20 at Thunder Marine, where Pinellas County deputies said the 2019 Jeanneau Leader was stolen and driven into four channel-marker pilings, doing about \$60,000 worth of damage, before being abandoned to drift in an oyster bed. Investigators found Jester's thumbprint on a cabin door; he was held at the Pinellas County iail on \$50,000.

 At 1:28 a.m. on June 20, airport air traffic control in New Smyrna Beach, Florida, contacted police about a distress call coming from an aircraft. Officers already at the airport trying to locate a car they believed had been stolen from Daytona Beach found Robert Stienstra, 22, of DeBary, Florida, sitting in the airplane on the airport apron, according to an arrest report. Stienstra asked an officer whether he knew how to fly a plane, the report stated, then explained that he had recently purchased the aircraft (valued at \$1 million) for \$20,000 and needed to fly to California to take marijuana and meet his girlfriend. The Daytona Beach News-Journal reported that along with a bag of weed, Stienstra had in his possession a glass pipe with remnants of methamphetamine and other drug paraphernalia. New Smyrna Beach police charged Stienstra with grand theft over \$100,000; he was also wanted by Daytona Beach police on charges of grand theft of a motor ve-

Creme de la Weird

 Koji Ishii, 39, of Tokyo, admits his passion is sometimes more like a "curse": He is compelled to document every lost glove he sees on the streets of his city. He photographs and records details about each one, whether they're stuck in drains or washed up on a beach, but never touches or removes them. Over 15 years, he's curated more than 5,000 stray gloves, including children's mittens, heavy workingman's gloves and lacy ladies' accessories. "I live with the constant fear that there might be a glove right around the corner," Ishii told AFP. He even gets off buses before his stop if he sees a glove on the ground. For him, the attraction is thinking about how the glove got there and who once wore it. "Lone gloves are a constantly changing, dynamic phenomena," Ishii said.

Government in Action

- In 2013, Chad Dearth of Overland Park, Kansas, purchased his dream car, a 1964 Chevy Impala, and got an "antique" license plate for it. Since then, he has sold the car and moved to a new neighborhood, but earlier this year he received word that seven to 10 collection letters a day were arriving at his old address from state turnpike authorities up and down the East Coast. That's when Dearth learned that Kansas is one of a few states that assign identical numbers to different categories of specialty license plates, and his old antique plate number matched the number on a commercial semi truck - the one photographed by one of the authorities demanding payment for toll violations. Lee Ann Phelps, vehicle services manager for the Kansas Department of Revenue, told Fox4 she doesn't know why the state uses identical numbers, but there are about 625,000 plates in the state that share a number. Kansas has issued a new license for the truck, but in the meantime, the bills continue. Dearth most recently got a letter from the Delaware Turnpike Áuthority seeking \$479.

include an LGBTQ+ community representative and a community representative to "act as a liaison to the African American community."

Fletcher, husband of **Assembly Democrat Lorena** Gonzalez, currently has a staff of nine, according to his website, including director of communications James Canning, formerly with Gallatin Public Affairs of Seattle. Before Canning arrived at Gallatin in 2017, the firm came under fire by environmentalists for work on behalf of a controversial coal export depot on the Columbia River, according to published reports. Gallatin partner Bruce Gryniewski defended the company's involvement in the project in a June 6, 2015, Seattle Times account: "The reality is, energy is a complex issue," he told the paper. "We need to explore all of these methods when looking at climate change, and drawing lines in the

sand is not how the real world operates."

Fletcher's chief of staff Paul Worlie also hails from the world of public relations, having served as a public affairs and government relations specialist for Nuffer Smith after a long career as a political operative. "He is the former deputy executive director of the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee," according to an online write up by the local public relations society. "His past clients have included U.S. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid and former U.S. Senate Minority Leader Tom Daschle." In February 2017, Worlie became enmeshed in a Fletcherrelated controversy when the Union-Tribune reported that a Fletcher nonprofit known as the Three Wise **Men Veterans Foundation** was paying Nuffer Smith \$5000 a month for PR services. Worlie is a onetime board member of the charity. Three Wise Men, the paper noted, was the beneficiary of \$35,000 from special interest contributors, including oil giant Chevron, San Diego Gas & Electric, and casino-owning tribes Barona and Viejas, thanks to fundraising behests by Assemblywoman Gonzalez.
