

Biden's barrio Pay to pee while you wait for asylum appointment

Since February 19, when 25 cases of asylum seekers were accepted for review, around 500 migrants have established an improvised camp on the Mexican side of the San Ysidro Port of Entry. The Migrant Protection Protocols program announced by Biden's administration has given hope to those stuck

in Tijuana due to the Trump's Remain in Mexico program. According to one of the Tijuana's migrant officials, Jose Luis Perez, 25 asylum seekers crossed the border that day, and groups of that same number will be crossing every day. Most migrants in the camp (called El Chaparral) have no appointment. They heard about the new migrant program and decided to camp here, hoping for legal help.

Isabelo Soto, 62, says his journey from Honduras was dreadful. "We suffered a hurricane that destroyed everything we had. That's why I came here, I just have two months, and it has been pretty difficult."

For now, these asylum seekers are camping on the asphalt in the hope of getting into the U.S., but they must wait

Maria Benavidez from the Mexican state of Michoacan lived on the exact boundary in dispute between Los Viagras and Jalisco's New Generation Cartel, the most powerful gangs in Mexico. "The day before we decided to leave, a grenade exploded in front of our house; we were in the crossfire. We were just able to hide under our beds. at least four months to have an appointment and initiate their process. According to the Municipal Department of Migrant Attention, 25,000 asylum seekers will be re-accepted in Matamoros, Ciudad Juarez, and Tijuana after this Biden program.



Sorrento Therapeutics' Ji- will his "catch and kill" lawsuit force Soon-Shiong to release the U-T?

How soon, Soon-Shiong?

Analyst speculates U-T owner could bail out by mid-summer

Will a lawsuit spawned in San Diego by the wheelings and dealings of Patrick Soon-Shiong ultimately force the Los Angeles billionaire to divest himself of the San Diego Union-Tribune, as well as the L.A. Times as early as this summer? Yes, according to a theory Poynter Institute Media Analyst Rick Edmunds in an March 4 put forth in an online dispatch regarding the trials and tribulations of Soon-Shiong and his Southern California papers. Alden Global Capital appears to be "the most likely to win any bidding contest for the Los Angeles Times, along with the San Diego Union-Tribune and some real estate," says Edmunds in light of mounting speculation that Soon-Shiong may need the cash. "A tipster pointed me to a \$1 billion suit Sorrento Therapeutics brought against Soon-Shiong's NantPharma in April 2019," he writes. Biotech Sorrento was founded here in 2006 by Henry Ji, who got his undergrad training at China's Fudan University and a Ph.D. at the University of Minnesota.

A 2015 drug deal by Soon-Shiong's NantPharma is at the root of the ongoing courtroom clash, which began in 2019. "The suit alleges that Nant did a 'catch-and-kill' when it took a majority stake in a promising drug of Sorrento's. then stopped its development," notes Edmunds. "Soon-Shiong's true purpose, the suit charges, was to clear the way for developing a similar drug NanPharma had in the works." Mandatory arbitration begins July 22, the columnist says. "Even a settlement at a fraction of the damages Sorrento seeks could run to hundreds of millions of dollars. That would leave Soon-Shiong hungry for cash at a time when he is also funding expensive initiatives at his biotech company." Then there is the not insubstantial matter of finding newspaper talent to run the Times. "Particularly telling is that Soon-Shiong has never hired a publisher with industry experience. He essentially fulfills that role himself while still tending to entrepreneurial biotech work and trying to invent cancer treatments and now Covid-19 drugs. Given the circumstances, and the time and money

a next stage would require, it seems more likely Soon-Shiong will exit, likely swallowing a loss on his \$600 million in investments in the Times." Meanwhile, down in San Diego, Soon-Shiong's strategy has appeared to be converting the U-T into the wokest paper in America while reducing advertising and daily page counts.

Enter Alden Global Capital, the industry bad-boy that has been snapping up newspapers across the country, vowing to remake the businesses but often selling off premises and gutting staff. "Alden **CEO Heath Freeman and founder Randall** Smith have become known as grim reapers as they pull profits from titles like the Denver Post," writes Edmunds. "Alden are cost-cutters supreme, but Freeman and Smith clearly also know how to wage a relentless takeover campaign and drive a hard bargain. Most promising financially for Alden would be control of the Los Angeles Times, a ring of suburban dailies near Los Angeles, the Orange County Register (which it already owns), and the San Diego Union-Tribune (which comes with the Times). That would amount to control of the huge Southern California market, with half the megastate's 40 million residents."

Anti-trust resistance from the Biden Administration might interrupt Alden's best-laid plans to control Southern California. Alden owns the dailies in San Bernardino and Riverside counties, where the U-T has recently ventured with a two-page experimental news and events section. Local resistance from San Diego labor unions and would-be advertisers to the putative buyout might ultimately deter Alden from bidding, but the U-T, whose workers long-ago bid farewell to their newspaper union, has so far attracted few outspoken champions.

And the U-T's fate appears inextricably linked to that of the Times, which prints the San Diego paper in L.A. at a plant whose lease by Soon-Shiong is due to expire in just two years.

Madaffer swabs the Deckard

Clears Bry-adjacent client from list

One of the shortest lobbying gigs in San Diego city hall's history has ended less than two weeks after it formally began, amidst intrigue about ex-councilwoman Barbara Bry's role in one of her wealthy husband's start-ups. A March 1 disclosure by Madaffer Enterprises shows the firm deleted Deckard Technologies as a client that day. Madaffer's original February 16 disclosure said the company had begun continued on page 42

SDPD Chief Nisleit's \$8.3 mil-

lion meal As the coronavirus pandemic raged on last fall, shutting down a multitude of conventions across the globe, an annual gathering of the nation's top cops was a notable exception. "Upon concluding it was imperative to convene an in-person meeting to discuss the various challenges of 2020, the Major Cities Chiefs Association held its annual fall meeting in New Orleans," per the group's October 30 news release. "While discussing lessons learned and best practices, the

membership expressed concern regarding efforts by local elected officials to restrict the use of less than lethal tools. Allegations that law enforcement agencies overuse less than lethal tools are simply unfounded." The statement added, "Given that many [Major Cities Chiefs Association] members expect activity in their jurisdictions surrounding the November 3rd election, it's imperative that law enforcement maintain access to tools

and resources necessary to quell violence and protect life and property." The event also served as a chance for sell-

ers of "less than lethal" devices to demonstrate their wares. As they pitched their wares, the vendors picked up food and beverage tabs for law enforcement higher-ups. On October 15, Niche Technology of Springfield, Missouri, treated San Diego police chief David Nisleit to a \$100 meal. The next night, Utility Inc. of Decatur, George paid a \$100 dinner tab for the chief. On October 17, Axon Enterprise of Scottsdale, Arizona, spent \$75 for Nisleit's evening meal, all according to the chief's annual financial interest statement for 2020, filed March 9. Axon makes Tas-

ers, the controversial stun-guns that have steadily grown in use by law enforcement. The company also produces the so-called body-worn cameras used by San Diego cops. A contract between Axon and the city of San Diego, dated June 23 of last year, says the firm is getting paid \$8,367,892 for goods and services related to the devices. "The purpose of this contract is to outfit current employees as well as recruits graduating from the Academy (expected 200 recruits per

year)," says the document. Utility, Inc makes body-mounted video gear, and Niche Technology specializes in police video records tracking.

Cash for kidneys California Secretary of State Shirley Weber continues to pile up significant campaign money for her attempt to hold her seat against next year's election challenge by Assembly Democrat Lorena Gonzalez. On March 3, Lakeside's Barona Band of Mission Indians gave \$5000, as did DaVita Total Renal Care of Tacoma, Washington. That firm has also supported charitable causes favored by Weber. "Dialysis company DaVita gave nearly \$250,000 combined to the Black, Latino and Women's Caucus foundations between 2017 and 2019, as it fought a union-backed ballot measure, and then a bill, that would curb profits at dialysis clinics," reported CalMatters a year ago in February. OCEANSIDE **Riprap vs riffraff** Private beaches swell, public gets groined

Apparently nothing will stop beachfront property owners in Oceanside from dropping in huge riprap boulders in front of their houses. Not even a stop-work order from the state coastal commission. At about 2 pm on Friday, March 5, the city of Oceanside was served with an order from the commission instructing the city to rescind its approval of the installation of new riprap in front of the seven houses from 1201 to 1213 South Pacific, located at the western terminus of Oceanside Boulevard. But after the stop-work order was served Friday afternoon, the heavy equipment operator continued dropping new boulders and moving existing ones towards the sea with a bulldozer and giant crane. He's been returning every day since. On Saturday afternoon, March 6, a man from Cantarini Tractor of Fallbrook admitted the stop work order had in fact been served to the city of Oceanside the day before. "They were served at 2:30 in the afternoon and then they talked to their attorneys, and they got it rescinded." He claimed the work was legal. "They got permits for everything."

Not true, says Jim Jaffee of the Surfrider Foundation. "Throughout the years, private property owners in Oceanside have undertaken illegal construction activities to dump riprap further out onto the public beach, expanding their private beach at the cost of the public beach. While permits may seem like a bureaucratic issue, a crime is a crime by any name." Jaffee suggests Oceanside officials have established a wink-wink, nudge-nudge relationship with beachfront homeowners, while failing its obligation to the coastal commission in preserving the public beach. "The tractors are rolling again today," Jaffee said on Monday, March 8. "They are in violation


of what the coastal commission has asked them not to do. They continue to move their private beach out. This is illegal. They are doing it without a permit. That's why there is no public beach there anymore." Jaffee says

Oceanside in March of last year, claiming that a permit is required for construction equipment to be operated within 20 feet of coastal waters, and that the city-allowed riprap installation done in 2019 was not legal.

private, beachfront property is expanding in Oceanside thanks to the coziness of city officials. "The city has willingly turned a blind eye by allowing the homeowner to maintain and expand their private beach without coastal development permits."

The coastal commission sent a letter to



was not productive.

Realtor Chris Abad is familiar with beachfront property in Oceanside. He says 1201 South Pacific, for instance, is divided into two units, and that the larger, 1850-square feet unit would probably sell for \$2 million. Abad says the new riprap would "definitely" increase the value of all the homes with new riprap, even though the increase in square footage would not officially appear on documents. "The extra area may not show up on title, but all anyone would have to do is look at it to see there is more land there."

Meanwhile, some residents are wondering why the city of Oceanside is not being completely open with its residents regarding its plans to bring more sand to its denuded beaches. City officials unveiled a power point presentation last September called "Feasibility Study for Beach Sand Replenishment/Retention Devices." It showed a number of possibilities that the city may execute in order to get more sand on the two-thirds of Oceanside's beach area north of Tyson Street, which has largely gone beachless. The plan's options include a \$12.5 million submerged artificial reef, a 350-foot extension of the South Jetty near the harbor, or the installation of 400- to 600-foot rock groins (or short jetties), similar to those installed in Newport Beach in the 1960s. What the city did not tell the public, but did in fact tell the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) at its March 4 meeting, was that the city has in mind 12 jetties

between the pier and the southern boundary of the city at the Buena Vista Lagoon. At its March 11 meeting, the Oceanside city council considered applying for a shoreline erosion grant from the state department of boating and waterways. Plans call for that grant to be used for the groins and/or other sand retention projects. Jaffee says if the city does decide to apply for that grant, he will personally appear before that state of California department to try to block it. "The legislation under which these grants are given specifically excludes using the grants to be used for sand retention."

Oceanside principal planner Russ Cunningham has been the point man for riprap installations as well as sand replenishment issues for the city of Oceanside. Attempts to get a response from him on these issues were not successful.



Musician to the stars

You have to wonder: this past year, how did we all not go stir crazy with the covid restrictions? Claudio Martin did it by going as far away as he could. "I travel billions of miles into space, and it has saved my sanity," he says.

What he means is, six months ago, he set up a mini-observatory in the garden of his

Alpine home, and started photographing, well, the universe.

"One day, I'm going, 'God, I hate covid,' but in a strange way it dawned on me that covid was giving me an opportunity to strike out and do some things that I couldn't have done before. Like, as a kid, instead of being a musician, I wanted to be an astronomer. That was my first thing. The only problem was I wasn't very good at math. Astronomy, turns out, is 95 percent math! So I pursued music."

He created a successful career, teaching, and performing as the lead guitar with Ron's Garage, one of the most in-demand cover bands in the county, as well as giving solo performances. But that all evaporated with the first lock-down a year ago.

It hit him hard — financially, emotionally. "I'm a musician. Everything is about live sounds, instant interaction, and here I was, no band, no gigs, no up-close audience, no music."

Which is partly why now, with all this time, he's giving astronomy a second whirl. Odd though, since astrophotography too is all about far away, lonely, timeless, silent. But Martin, who lives in Alpine, has become obsessed with visually capturing distant phenomena, through his telescope and onto his laptop.

"It's like treasure-hunting for me. Capturing the universe on my little computer, and even making art of it. I've always had a telescope, but astrophotography is a different challenge.

"I needed something to give me a little bit of hope and humbleness. I'm not super-religious or anything, but looking at the sky, looking at the stars, was about as close as I can get to God. Whether you believe it or not, it's like, 'Wow! This universe is tremendously huge and vast.' It humbled me. I would go, 'These stars are looking at us, and they couldn't care

less whether there was covid or not, and whether we live here or not. And they have been here for billions and billions of years.' So I look up there, and I'm humbled. They don't care whether you live or die, but this is our moment. the moment that we have. So it kept me sane, grounded, I guess. And my wife has been very patient with me as well, through this endeavor.

But how to set up for his new side-hustle? Here's where another musician-astronomer alliance came to help: Wayne Parker, the Canadian bass player of Glass Tiger fame, is also, turns out, a star-watcher who invented a kind of miniobservatory. He designed and started selling his Sky Shed Pod, big enough for two, and

small enough to install in your garden or on your deck.

"These pods are not cheap," says Martin. "Around \$4500 new. But I got a used — or rather, unused — one for \$500. My wife Mona liked the idea because it kept me close by, because being a musician, I'm always out on the road, performing."

Does he long for that again?

He stops to think. "This space gig is great, but yeah, I miss the music, miss the crowds."

I ask if tracking space inspires him to write music. "Hey, how about this for a song?" he asks. "Ground Control to Major Tom."

Mr. Kim's Korean archery

A badge on his tunic reads "World Kuk Gung Federation" above a sewn picture of a horseman shooting arrows from a galloping horse.

We are looking out over a steep field bisected by a stream. This is Mr. Kim's traditional Korean Archery field.

"Kuk Gung' is 'Horn Bow," he says.

On the creek's opposite upslope, four square targets face us, each one white, black, and red. "That is a long way, Mr. Kim," I say.

"Not a problem for Korean Kuk Gung," Mr. Kim says. He says a Korean bow can propel an arrow 475 feet, 145 meters. "At Olympics they only allow distance of 30-90 meters," he says. "We always win archery at Olympics."

Mr. Kim draws his bow out of a blue and white cloth sleeve. Wow. I am surprised how small it is.

"Why is it called a 'horn bow'?" I ask. "Because it is made of bamboo, mulberry wood, maple tree skin, and water buffalo horn. It is a composite of all these, glued by fishes'

He is a modest, quietly powerful man who clearly believes in the precepts he painted on the posts designating the shooting area:

"Be seen as a model of love and virtue." "Have a straight mind and a straight body." "Protect integrity through discreet behavior." "Be courteous."

He hands me a bow. "First lesson," he says. "We do each ten times."

"Chinese used the spear. Japanese used the sword. We Koreans used the Bow. Have for 5000 years."

swimming bladder."

Mr. Kim knows these things because he has practiced Korean archery for most of the 43 years he has been traveling back and forth from South Korea, where he grows and sells succulents and cacti for the American, European, and other markets. "We ship 4 to 5 million plants every year," he says. "I control 70 percent of the market."

But love of Korean archery is clearly what drives him now. He purchased this land up in the rolling hills of Valley Center to turn it into a Korean traditional archery center, the only one in the U.S. He's developing the part of the field by the creek into horse trails where students can learn to gallop on horseback while shooting arrows.

Now he bends the bow between his legs so he can stretch its string. It's curled like Cupid bows you see on Valentine's Day cards.

But looks are deceptive. "This is the most powerful bow," Mr. Kim says. "You see those?" He's pointing to the four distant targets. No way other bows, he says - English, Japanese, Chinese — can reach those targets. (To be fair, many military historians say the English longbow had an effective range of over 300 yards.)

He takes the sleeve and wraps it around his waist. "Now, sleeve becomes quiver," he says He slips five wooden arrows between it and his tunic.

My exercise is to draw the bow to shooting position, hold, and then undraw. He shows me how to hold it above my head, level it, push the bow hand forward, while hauling the string hand back, harmoniously. "Good for breathing," he says.

Also exhausting for a first-timer. He watches every movement. Only then does he go to shoot his ten arrows — and you can hear the distant "bap!" as most hit the targets. He hangs up his bow and heads off down the hill. "Where are we going?" I ask. "To pick up the arrows," Mr. Kim says. "Part of discipline."



Once, Sylvia Burner was head librarian at UCSD's Geisel Library - the campus's signature building, named for La Jolla's most famous citizen, beloved children's author Ted Geisel, aka Dr. Seuss. Once, she paused every morning on her way into work by the statue of Geisel outside the library entrance and rested her hand on its shoulder in silent communion with an acknowledged genius. But that was before: before the great groundswell of antiracist activism that has done so much to shine a light on America's enduring vice. including the hateful images in Seuss' early cartoons, political and otherwise. And not just those bits of adult-oriented early work, but also the children's books that would make

him famous all over the world. In some cases, such as the six books recently unpublished by the Seuss Foundation and delisted by eBay, he employed grossly offensive caricatures of the amusement of his audience. In others, he encoded racist subtexts; even seemingly noble works like The Sneetches and Horton Hears a Who were discovered to be racist at heart. And once Burner saw the truth of Geisel's monstrosity, she was filled with righteous fury for the way she and so many others had been misled, manipulated, and delighted for so many years. Last night, that fury gave rise to spectacular action, as she and a cohort of brave university students set fire to the Geisel Library in a grand gesture that echoed the Gleichschaltung



"In a lot of ways, books themselves are just a White Supremacist tool," said Burner. "So many cultures survived and thrived for centuries through an oral culture. But white colonization, and its practice of writing everything down and binding it between two covers shackling and perhaps even enslaving the world captured in the words — destroyed that culture, again and again. Even if the dread Geisel's insidious evil had not been discovered, there was good reason for this conflagration. In form and, all to often, content, libraries are just temples dedicated to the worship of Western thought - a dying religion if ever there was one. Let the consuming flame purify our minds! Let the heat of this funeral pyre make our own hearts burn with zeal for justice! Let the light it casts show us the path through this dark night of racism and hate to a new dawn of equity and goodness! Burn! Burn! Burn!"

(or "Awakened") movement of Germany in the early '30s. Back then, idealistic German college students burned 25,000 un-German books, many of them taken from university libraries, in Berlin's Opera Square, taking "fire oaths" in allegiance to the movement as they did so. "We did them one better," says Burner. "We burned the library, too. Now, as long as they are at UCSD, our children will be safe from the scourge of racism. Or at least the racism of one Theodore Geisel."

he San Diego River Crossing Trail intersects the Visitor Center Loop Trail just to the northwest of Mission Trails Regional Park's Visitor Center. It's your typical fire road with a moderately steep grade.

On February 4, I arrived at Mission Trails and entered the park at Jackson Drive. I proceeded to head down the trail toward the river. There were two runners ahead of me, and they reached the crossing area before I did. When I caught up with them, they were looking at one another, somewhat bewildered.

"I bet you weren't expecting this," I said to them.

"It's our first time here," one of them replied. "There wasn't anything about this on the map we saw online."

"This" was a swollen San Diego

River that made the trail impassable. We were looking at a water crossing that was, judging by a visible marker near the center of the water, about three feet deep and 40 feet wide. And no bridge. The runners turned around and pursued a different route.

They did have an option for getting across, though. It's an unauthorized route approximately 20 feet to the west of the official crossing area. My guess was that this was a small, aging dam that had been built long before the days of the Fashion Valley Mall — but I was wrong.

According to the Mission Trails Master Plan, it's a "concrete encased sewer main." It looks like a concrete truck poured all its contents next to the river and a group of workers molded it into sort of elongated pile across the *continued on page 16*

continued from page 14 river. Somehow a visible, decaying automobile tire was built into this mess. It's a massive, unsightly mound of coarse and uneven concrete with some large rocks shoved into it. Even in the realm of sewer structures, it ain't the belle of the ball.

But this is where people tend to cross. Two seemingly fit guys in their early-20s crossed by way of the encased pipe while I was observing its many quirks. When the water is high enough to flow over the concrete, it comes across as a typical rock crossing. The large, exposed rocks on top are pretty much all you have to work with - everything else is submerged. You must choose your steps and hops wisely. The duo took their time to map out their steps,

and they made it across without slipping or falling into the water.

Crossing over the

concrete-encased sewer main back on Friday, January 29 was likely much more difficult. A storm system had arrived the previous evening, and by 1 pm had already deposited 1.38 inches of rain at Lake Cuyamaca, 1.29 inches in Point Loma, and 1.12 inches in nearby Santee. Forecasters described the storm as being an "atmospheric river" — a trail of condensed water vapor that travels within the atmosphere in tandem with the weather.

So, when Max Lenail arrived at the river crossing area, heading south, near the end of a long run at close to 2 pm, he was left with a tough decision. He had started his run near the Visitor Center, and now found himself on the other side of a violent river. He had to somehow cross to the other side to get back to his car.

At 1:44 pm, he downloaded a map of the park. This would be his last activity on his cell phone. He was likely looking for an alternate route over the river that was nearby, safe, and fast. No such route exists. At

some point while he was deciding what course of action to take, he encountered another park visitor who had just successfully navigated the river crossing in the opposite direction. "He actually ran into someone who was going the other way who said, 'Be very careful," Max's father Ben Lenail said later. "But he made a calculation that he could cross the river - and he drowned."

Max's body was recovered from the San Diego River the following day.

Max's final run is a testament to his athletic prowess. His loop on January 29 started under sunny skies in the Visitor Center parking area from which he ran northeast up to Kwaay Paay peak (1194 feet.) He may have even done some moderate rock climbing on this segment, as no official trail from the south leads up to this peak. He then descended that peak and headed northwest toward the Old Mission Dam, where he commenced yet another large climb. This route would eventually turn to the south and lead him up and over South Fortuna peak (1094 feet). The final descent would complete the loop and lead him back toward the Visitor Center and his car. But first, the river.

While describing his many athletic talents, Max's father shared with me that Max had climbed with Alex Honnold in Lake Tahoe. Honnold is a professional rock climber who is famous for scaling the 3000-foot El Capitan rock formation in Yosemite National Park — without climbing equipment. The 2018 documentary *Free Solo* was about this achievement.

Even though Max was in great shape, he was at the tail end of what was still a tough 5.5-mile run when he reached the crossing. Turning around and running a route that was nearly equal in length (even though he could have eliminated some of the climbs) may have seemed too grueling. And then there was a random weather oddity that arrived, one which may have played a significant role in Max's decisionmaking — hail.

"He was basically 15 minutes from the parking lot when he got caught in the hailstorm and felt, 'I need to find shelter' and 'I wanna get back to my car, and I have no choice but to try to cross the river," his father said.

The timing for the hailstorm checks out. I shot video of it hailing in La Mesa on the same day. That video is timestamped at 2:09 pm.

When I went back the next day, I saw hundreds of people going across with their dogs and their babies and their small children, and so many of them were slipping and falling. I was absolutely astounded that [Mission Trails Regional Park] hadn't either put two park rangers on either side of the river to make sure everyone was crossing safely or had turned people away at the entrance saying, 'Sorry, it's too dangerous to take this loop.' I'm just so astounded."

She added, "Who would think you would have an uncrossable river on your visitor loop?"

Amid their grief,

Max's parents are now concentrating their efforts on making sure that an official bridge is built in the crossing area.

It's a feature that the park has had its eye on building as well. The construction of two different bridges was proposed in the 2019 Mission Trails Regional Park Master Plan Update. The first and main bridge would be "an all-weather suspension or truss pedestrian and bicycle bridge across the San Diego River near the San Diego River Crossing Trail." The second bridge would be more of a temporary alternative to the concrete-enclosed sewer main until the permanent bridge was built. According to the MPU, "an improved low-flow crossing or seasonal removable bridge structure at the San Diego River Crossing to remove the unauthorized existing use of the concrete encased sewer main, while a bridge option is developed."

It's two years later, and not even the temporary alternative to the sewer main crossing has been built. Susie Murphy, executive director of the San Diego Mountain Biking Association, said that the bridge was one of four projects that was prioritized by the Citizen's Advisory Committee in early 2020, before covid hit. She added that they "were going to attempt to implement all four of those things simultaneously."

Murphy has followed the park's dealings for many years now, and the fact that there still isn't an official bridge in this

crossing area obviously gets under her skin.

"I'm appalled. I'm appalled at this whole situation," she said. "It's just makes me so angry whenever I think about it. As far as SDMBA is concerned, we're in full support of a bridge. It's extremely dangerous. We support it as a priority project of the implementation of the Master Plan Update. We're just concerned for all the families and the people that cross those slimy rocks every day."

When you take a long look at the crossing area, it becomes a bit more obvious as to why there isn't a bridge there yet. It's going to be a large and likely quite expensive project. The bridge will have to stretch over the width of the river, and be raised high enough to avoid the peak floodwater, and be durable enough to withstand the extreme force of floodwater at its base. But beyond that, "The lay of the land is a difficult place to build a bridge. I get it," Murphy said. "That's why it hasn't been done. But it definitely can be done."

She added, "Mission Trails already has its epic bridges. The one that is over off the Clairemont Mesa trailhead... they've done this before. This is not impossible."

The most recent major project completed in the park was the construction of a 5000-square-foot ranger *continued on page 41*

Osip Mandelstam (1891-1938) was a Russian poet who with fellow poet Nikolai Gumilyov (1886-1921) helped found the Acemist movement in Russian literature - which strove for compactness of form and clarity of expression in all its literary productions. Part of the first generation of poets to write under Soviet rule, he was arrested twice

by Joseph Stalin. After authorities discovered his "Stalin Epigram," he was arrested in 1933 and sent into internal exile, prohibited from entering any major city in Soviet Russia. After his second arrest in 1938, he was sentenced to a "re-education" work camp and died in a transition camp that same year from cold and starvation. Sometime before his death he had noted, "Only in Russia is poetry respected, it gets people killed. Is there anywhere else where poetry is so common a motive for murder?" His wife Nadezhda Mandelstam (1899-1980), whose memoirs brought to light much of the oppression and savagery of the Soviet government, memorized his poems, despite great risk to her own life. Her efforts at keeping Osip's writings alive in her mind she did not trust putting the works to paper - enabled her, later in life, to see her husband's work published in Russia.

with a bit of egg, carrots, cucumber, and pickled daikon radish (\$10). It's the best way I can think of to enjoyed cold meat, and would be reason enough to give Myung Ka a try. With beef, or versions made with spicy grilled pork (\$9), or with a combination of Spam, Japanese sausage, and fish cakes (\$7).

However, there's more to Myung Ka than just kimbap rolls. Especially around lunchtime, thanks to a spate of lunchbox specials. These beg another comparison to Japanese cuisine, being analogous to bento boxes. Around a choice of bulgogi, pork, fried shrimp, or grilled chicken, each box gets rounded out with rice, salad, a small bowl of soup,

and assorted banchan.

My grilled chicken box featured sesame noodles, savory pancake, omelet, a fried dumpling, and a single fried shrimp. I found it a convenient and relatively affordable way to get a well-rounded lunch. It gets extra points for not resorting to potatoes, beans, or macaroni as a side dish.

Other highlights include a variety of steamed dumplings, *jjajangmyung* black bean noodles (\$10), bone-in short rib soup (\$16), and my wife's favorite: spicy seafood soup (\$12). Swimming around in there were blue crab, mussels, clams, shrimp, and squid. This spicy food lover found the restaurant's *medium* spice rating to be the



fiery hot sauces made by El Cajon's Ring of Fire brand. I found Julian pies, locally roasted coffee beans, San Diego county wines, and it almost goes without saying, beer. In fact, one of my favorite finds in the meat case was a supply of thick, house-made bratwursts flavored with Second Chance Beer Co's roasty gold medal winner, Tabula Rasa porter. That made for another satisfying dinner at home.

For a place with an uninspiring name, it's got an inspiring atmosphere.

aggie's regretting ever opening her the music at full volume. And yes, it's a struggle

mouth. She stands back from where this guy is throwing his into the mic. "You and I are just two leaves in the wind," he croons. The crowd at his table harmonizes behind him. It's a Ramon Ayala song, "Las Hojas Sin Rumbo (Swirling Leaves)." Or you might say, "Blowing in the Wind."

It's Karaoke night here under the open tents of Sr. Taquito's on East Valley Parkway in Escondido. Sunday evening, six o'clock.

My step-daughter Mag and I were just talking about food when this scene flashed past. "That's the place I was talking about!" she says.

Oh wow. For a place with an uninspiring name, it's got an inspiring atmosphere.

People cluster in groups under the canopies between palms, on red high-top chairs, at tables on shocking green Astroturf. It's a scene.

Mag ain't that keen. This is a bit too rural for her. She wants Escondido's real Old Town section with all the cool restaurants. But for me, this is the real Escondido - it means "Hidden City" - below all those developer rows of houses that ribbon the hills.

Whatever, it's a bird in hand. We sit down at one of the tables near where the karaoke guy has



hearing Marie the waitress shout from behind her mask, specially with gals on their Karaoke mics calling out the chorus just a table over ("Dos hojas sin rumbo, *Qué el viento arrastro!*") but she understands my "tipping bottle" sign and Mag's glass of water sign,

and soon gets back with both. Mine's a Negra Modelo (\$5.50), Mag's, an Agua Fresca (\$1.89). Marie also drops off a couple of multi-page, lavishly-illustrated plastic menus.

There's a lot to choose from. I look down their mini-tacos column, because they start off at \$1.89. That's for an adobada taco. Deal. Ooh. And they have buches. I swear I've eaten them at a TJ place called Kentucky Fried Buches, on Avenida Constitución. "Buches" there means "chicken necks."

Now we're checking down the menu. Hmm. Once you get specialized, prices go up. Shrimp and octopus cocktail is \$16.49, cooked (tostada) shrimp with octopus (enchipotlado, prepared with chipotle chile) with breaded onion, is \$15.99. Or a large Del Toro taco with cheese, marlin, shrimp, and octopus goes for \$6.49.

Mag and I decide on a \$5.95 shrimp taco each, and then, oh man. They have a molcajete mixto

dish. You get chicken breast, four "Costa Azul" shrimp, whatever that is, plus meat a la parilla (grilled), with rice, refried beans, and tortillas. No surprise: it costs twenty bucks. "Oh let's do it," says Mag. "I can help with cash."

Turns out she knows quite a bit about molcajetes. "They're carved out of black volcanic rock. Aztec, Maya design." Now she's googling

for more info.

"Huh.'Molli,' is 'seasoning' or 'sauce,' and 'caxitl' is 'bowl.' And they have been making these things for the past 6000 years."

First, though, we're tackling the shrimp tacos. Huge, garlic-luscious, packed with two different cheeses, green and red peppers, and a ton of shrimp flesh. We chomp away as older ladies grab the mics and start belting out tragic love songs, almost in tune, but not on the high notes.

Then, the piece de resistance. Marie carries out this heavy, traditional, pock-

marked black lava rock bowl, steaming, sprouting with shrimp, chicken, beef, the whole enchilada. Added bonus: On this chilly night it's perfect to warm your hands on.

Just as well. The rock keeps our food hot while we take five, to settle the first-round tacos.

But then, what a feast! First off, we find out what they mean by "Costa Azul" shrimp. They are large, deepfried, and wrapped in

bacon. Wicked! Specially dipped in the savory liquid in the bottom. It flavors the chicken, chunks of carne a la parilla beef, the wrapped shrimp, and what turn out to be planks of queso fresco, the curdlike Mexican cheese that doesn't melt and gives a gentle tang to anything (and fries up to a beautiful golden snack in its own right).

"But what's in the soup?" I ask Marie.

"A lot," she says. "We have garlic, chile, cilantro, onions, and tomatillos to give it the sour."

Whatever, the more we mix and poke, the richer that soup gets. I'm taking spoonfuls of it out, and dunking the corn tortillas in, just for its flavor. They also bring flour tortillas. And still the black rock keeps it warm.

Of course, I don't stop Marie when she offers to bring another Negra Modelo. Two girls are singing a duet now. I'm really getting into it. The singing somehow gives a togetherness feeling out here in the cold night. Plus, it's good to spend this time

with Mag. We don't get together enough.

What I like about this place is it has kept its Mexicanness, and doesn't get lost in the whole fusion food thing. You can see that's how this crowd wants it to stay that way. Next time, I'm just going to go for the mini-tacos. (They're really not that mini.) I want to try the slightly more fringey ones like cabeza, lengua, tripa, and buche.

Mag is in no hurry to leave. It's not the karaoke, which is getting more dodgy as more people find the Dutch courage to grab the mic and yell out the words. It's that she can't stop reaching into the bowels of the *molcajete* to find a few drops more of those ancient flavors.

"Next time, breakfast," she says finally. "Huevos rancheros would be nice in the morning sun."

"Uh, do you think they would still be doing karaoke in the morning?" I ask. ■

BOOZE NEWS

Return to normal in sight for San Diego beer?

It's been roughly 52 weeks since I first used the word *pandemic* in a beer story, and though I've had to do so dozens of times since, this time there's finally reason for optimism. Between the falling number of covid cases and rising number of vaccinations in San Diego County, there are signs that an end to the restrictive public health policies that have hampered local beer and booze businesses may finally be on the horizon.

After a prolonged winter in the restrictive purple tier of California's "Blueprint for a Safer Economy," which bans indoor dining, San Diego is poised to enter red tier as soon as next week. That will officially allow brewpubs and tasting rooms with meal service

Vaccinations became available to service workers in late February, which means most brewery workers should be vaccinated by the time indoor capacity rises to 50 percent. That will happen when San Diego enters the orange tier, which will also allow outdoor drink service to resume for bars and breweries that do not offer meal service. Fortunately, the criteria for entering the orange tier becomes much easier to reach as vaccination numbers rise. With three different vaccines (Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson) now being administered, there's no official timeline yet, but it's reasonable to expect graduating to the orange tier by April, and to the less restrictive yellow tier by the summer.

On-premise service is significant to breweries in two major ways. First, it allows them to bring more hospitality employees back to work. President Biden's newly signed Covid-19 relief bill extends supplemental unemployment benefits through Labor Day, which will provide vital benefits to thousands of front of house workers who lost hours or employment due to covid restrictions. Through a staged re-opening, these supplemental benefits will allow breweries to phase back workers as San Diego heads toward the newly announced green tier, which will mean back to business as usual.

The second important aspect of moving up and out of the purple tier is that even a return to



have to account for operating losses and increased debt. The only way out of the hole for some will be the mass return of beer fans to taprooms.

This will also play a critical role in reviving

what was arguably the beer community's greatest coronavirus loss: tasting room culture. San Diego's beer business would never have become a billion dollar industry without the social life that sprang up around it. For things to truly return to normal, a county full of self-isolating beer enthusiasts will have to unlearn the drinking-at-home habits we forged during this covid year. To salvage what we can of the industry that has given San Diegan so much pride, we're all going to have to make a point of going out this spring and summer, and doing

the hard work of drinking beer with our friends. [Editor's note: as of Saturday, March 13, Cali-

fornia has removed the meal service requirement for breweries, distilleries, and bars. Until 8 pm each day, customers may order adult beverages without also ordering food for on-premise, outdoor consumption.]

Bell of my trumpet

Of all the collateral damage suffered in the last 12 months, the music industry has been hit particularly hard. Everyone has lost gigs, and many venues have shuttered permanently. But for trumpeter John Reynolds, a weekly session at Madison on Park (4622 Park Boulevard) has been a welcome respite.

"We've pretty much been playing the entire time," Reynolds related over the phone. "We started in 2019, and other than two blips in the road (April of 2020, and the second California shut-down) we've been at this every Tuesday from 7 to 9."

How do you manage the

about as a fundraising effort for the students of the San Diego School of Creative and Performing Arts where Reynolds was employed at the time. "At that point, I pitched the concept of a summer series to the owners," says Reynolds. "We decided to try it for eight weeks. I settled on Tuesdays so it wouldn't interfere with the sessions that Louie Valenzuela was doing at Rosie O' Grady's on Monday's or the scene Gilbert Castellanos has at Panama 66 on Wednesday. Within a few weeks, the place was packed. Usually, Tuesday is a slow night, (Madison is closed on Mondays) but by the time 7 pm rolls around, every table was filled and it stays

saxophone. There's plenty of room for the musicians to spread out, and the rhythm section keeps their masks on. Obviously, it's different for horn players.

"All of the studies they've done regarding aerosol distribution from brass instruments is like 30 centimeters (basically one foot). So as long as you are farther than a foot away from the bell of my trumpet, you're fine. And honestly, no one wants to be that close"

How has covid affected your personal outlook on life?

"I'm very fortunate that I am able to teach, both at school (Reynolds is the associate director of instrumental music at the Orange County School of the Arts) and privately. A lot of my friends have just been decimated over the last year. It's been a tragedy for the folks who are full-time performers, who depend on that for their main source of income."

SILENT

Goth-inclined Silent was founded in Mexicali, Baja California by singer-percussionist Jung Sing (Maniqui Lazer, All Leather) and guitarist Alejandro Lara. The band has toured the USA and Mexico, alongside San Diego labelmates like Dead Cross, Retox, the Locust, and Author & Punisher. Their last album, 2016's *A Century of Abuse*, was recorded in Mexicali and released digitally by the Locust's label Three One G, with a separate limited edition of 500 records on white vinyl. Their upcoming sophomore LP *Modern Hate*, due digitally and on vinyl April 23 via Three One G, will be their first full-length in five years. The album was recorded, produced, mixed, and mastered in Mexicali at Pulsar Studios and La Casa Estudios by Cesar Cossio, with vinyl mastering by Ruben Tamayo. According to the label, "The record was meant to be released in 2018, but was put on hold while they went on short hiatus to address some of their differences." The album delays were furthered by the pandemic, in addition to having to break in new drummer Rocio Chavez and rethink the work they'd already done in the studio. "This felt like a new start that called for relearning, reshaping, and retouching some of the tracks."



HARPCO

Folk/rock/blues/Americana band Harpco features Sue Ferguson, aka Sue Delguidice, who co-founded the local late-1970s all-girl punk band the Dinettes. She fronts the group alongside her husband Mark "Harpo" Delguidice. Originally from Chicago, Harpo's family lived behind the Kingston Mines blues club, where he got his nickname from Big Walter Horton. The veteran bluesman took exception to a neighborhood kid who played the harp inexplicably nicknaming himself "Lil' Johnny Winter," and instead started calling him Lil' Harpo. This was eventually shortened, once he was no longer lil'. Harpo moved in 1999 from San Francisco to San Diego with his wife, who also played with Slackjaw, Private Sector, and Shelf Life, and is proud of the fact that she turns 60 this year. As she once told the *Reader*, "I'm easing into my wiser years, it seems. It is harder to stay out until 2 am. I enjoy telling stories to the youngsters: 'Yep, saw Zeppelin in '76, hanging with Spinal Tap, seeing Black Flag's first tour.' I worked backstage a long time." The band has a new bassist, Chad Allbritton, previously of JuJu Satori, a group that has also featured Sue Delguidice.



DEATH EYES

Fronted by Alberto Jurado, Death Eyes was founded by former members of local pop-punk bands Rats Eyes and Death Crisis: Jurado (vocals), Jimmy Armbrust (bass), Jason Blackmore (guitar), and John Cota (drums). A self-titled debut full-length was released in early 2015, followed by touring and opening slots for the Weirdos, Agent Orange, M.D.C., and Nails. Alberto Jurado passed away in early 2020, while the band was working on their next EP and preparing to tour with Big Business. By last summer, bassist Jimmy Armbrust had been replaced by Cole Mears (Ghetto Blaster, Hostile Comb-Over). Last year, local label Three One G dropped the EP that the band was recording before Jurado's death, *State of Fear*, including a video for "Management Is Not Your Friend" that features found footage, as well as live performances featuring the late singer. A new locally-recorded album called *Death Eyes Live at Bar Pink* will be available this summer on 180-gram translucent pink vinyl, limited to 300 copies produced by Pink Pachyderm Records. It will be the label's debut release.



WSPRGRL

The electronic gloom-pop band Wsprgrl began as a 1980sinspired three-piece. The project was created in 2015 by singer-songwriter Cara Potiker (L1ght Ra1L), produced by Patrick Heaney (Shark Attack, Tiny Telephones), and performed by Heaney, Potiker, and Mike Delgado (Shark Attack, Scary Pierre). "I have been producing dark wave, new wave, pop, and indie electro music for a number of years, and I specialize in creating dark lyrics with palatable vocal and instrumental hooks," says Potiker. The band's first live gig is streaming on their Facebook page, and their website samples include quick performances of club-friendly tracks like "Gasoline" and "Higher." Songs uploaded to YouTube include a cover version of Andrew Gold's "Never Let Her Slip Away." Now a duo featuring Heaney and Potiker, they recently released a three-track cassette with the title track "Remember," sporting artwork by Marina Grize. The group calls the title song "A reminder to stay present with the ones you love."



THE DRAGONS

Their name inspired by Thomas Harris's first Hannibal Lecter book Red Dragon, the Dragons were originally together for a run of around around thirteen years, releasing six albums. The band essentially formed from the ashes of M-80, whose second and final lineup was Ken Mochikoshi-Horne and Mario Escovedo (MFX), alongside Kevin Chanel (the Front, Ghetto Scheist), and Baba Chanel (Ghetto Scheist). Though they landed opening slots for touring acts like Johnny Thunders at the Bacchanal, M-80 didn't last long, so Mochikoshi-Horne and Escovedo formed the Dragons, soon joined by drummer Jarrod Lucas. After they split in late 2004, Escovedo formed the Mario Escovedo Experience, or MEX, with former Dragon Lucas on drums. Encinitas-based guitarist-turned-Jarana-player Ken Horne joined the Bronx (aka Mariachi El Bronx) in 2006, and local violinist Ray Suen (Louis XIV, the Killers) joined Mariachi El Bronx in early 2010. The Dragons played a reunion gig at the Casbah in January, 2010, and still occasionally perform. A 2015 Casbah tribute gig for the band's late bassist Steve Rodriguez included the Dragons being joined onstage for a surprise appearance by Kiss guitarist Ace Frehley. The band's *Live at the Casbah* album, previously only available on CD, will soon be released on colored vinyl.

Art and music do not change the world

I cast a jaundiced eve at music composed based on current events. We've had several compositions performed in San Diego about issues such as climate change, receding glaciers, immigration, police shootings, and transgender dynamics.

For the record, the practice is even worse in popular culture. According to Wikipedia, there are more than 160 songs about September 11th. Can you name any of them? Why were they written? What purpose did they serve? I think there are several problems with this practice.

For starters, there is the troubling idea that compositions based on current events are trying to capitalize on tragedy. Now there is nothing wrong with that if an appropriate amount of time has passed. For instance. I believe a new composition based on the story of Emmett Till could be a powerful and moving statement. Till was murdered in 1955

If time hasn't passed, the piece of music, in my opinion, comes off as at least partially opportunistic. It is the artistic equivalent of the lawyer with a reputation for chasing ambulances.

conflicting opinions exist concerning current events. If a composer wrote something in honor of or in condemnation of the recent assault on the Capitol building, half the audience would immediately be pissed off. But as time passes, opinions tend to become more uniform and rational, and less clouded

Another issue is that

In the case of Emmett Till, the men who beat and mutilated him to death were found to be innocent and I'm sure there was a significant percentage of the population that agreed with that — at the time. Now, 60 years later, opinion has solidified into a uniform condemnation of the men who killed a 14-year-old in cold blood.

The third issue that I can see is that the composer is dictating the audience's experience of the music. The composer is tyrannically directing the audience to a specific opinion and the emotions that go with that opinion.

Maybe a piece of music that was inspired by receding glaciers would land on audience members in a more profound way if the audience didn't know it was about glaciers. Maybe an

audience member who is experiencing the loss of a family member could find comfort in such a composition, but that audience member has been told what to feel by the composer.

The feeling for receding glaciers appears to be a low-level sense of guilt. I don't know. I've never met a receding glacier, so it's tough for me to connect with the idea.

Of course, if the audience doesn't know the composition is about receding glaciers or immigration, then they won't be aware. Ah, here we go, Awareness appears to be the new transcendent experience for audiences.

I don't know about you, but I don't go to the opera or the symphony to be made aware of issues that are clearly in every social media and news feed I see every day on my phone. Trust me, I'm aware. There is an idea that art and music change the world and to do this, audiences must be made aware.

Art and music do not change the world. They might reflect a changing world or even, in very rare cases, guide a changing world. It should be noted

that those pieces of music that happened to guide a changing world were not written with the intention of guiding a changing world

The fact is no piece of music ever written resulted in improved human rights and better access to justice.

To be fair, music history is littered with political pieces of music. Shostakovich's Symphony No. 11 is about the 1905 massacre at the Winter Palace in St. Petersburg. Shostakovich wrote the symphony in 1957. At the time, the USSR was involved in military action in Hungary. The tone of the symphony was considered to be a condemnation of the USSR's involvement. You will notice that it was not specifically about the 1957 war.

Beethoven's Symphony Nos. 3 and 5 are generally considered to be inspired by The French Revolution. However, there is nothing specific in Beethoven's music except

for some subtle references to French revolutionary tunes in the 5th Symphony.

Puccini's opera Tosca is about art and freedom of expression struggling against repressive government. Tosca is set during the Napoleonic Wars, which took place about 90 years before the opera was written. Once again, it is not specifically about current events in Puccini's day.

Perhaps the greatest political statement is Wagner's Ring Cycle. It is a condemnation of 19th-Century capitalism and the European aristocracy. In the end, the entire thing burns to the ground and nature is restored. Wagner wanted to burn down the existing social structures and create a utopia based on nature and simple craftsmanship. As intent as Wagner was, the entire message is wrapped in myth instead of specifics. That's what makes it great art. Specific art borders on propaganda.

here are still a few days left to partake in this year's San Diego Latino Film Festival. For a complete list of titles, visit http sdlatinofilm.com. In the meantime, here are two worth watching.

La Bronca (2019)

Here's a welcome anomaly: a film about migration that isn't structured around a border wall. Roberto (Jorge Guerra) comes from a broken home, but word has spread that the rea-

son he's fled his mother's house in Peru owes

more to the country's history of violence than the unmanageable teenager's proximity to becoming a statistic of it. But the move from a climate of tropical terrorism to dad's home in snowbound and freezing Montreal leaves Roberto feeling martyred and alone. It's made clear from the outset — a freshly uprooted stop sign slung over his shoulder, Roberto leads a one man Via Crucis through the snow — the hell isn't going to freeze out of him, it's only going to get hotter.

Bob Montoya (Rodrigo Palacios) is an even bigger adolescent than his son. It's 1991, and in Montoyo's mind, such assimilation efforts as no longer answering to the

name Bobby López and having a mistress on the side — the type he's not ashamed to bring around his boy — are good calls. Poised at the ground floor of computer technology, Montoya envisions millions to be made off anti-glare and privacy filters for PC monitors - enough riches to inch the Canadian transplant that much closer to the American dream. Still, one can't help but notice that like the son, the father isn't going anywhere.

Rounding out this trio of itinerant Peruvians

(Rodrigo Sánchez Patiño), the easiest of the bunch to find, generally loafing or sound asleep on the couch in Montova's basement. What happens in Lima rubs off on Montreal as family aces out friendship and machismo triumphs over all. When it comes time for a show of loyalty, that is, for father to pledge undying allegiance to son, Montoya does so in the worst way imaginable. By then, the writing and directing team of Daniel Vega and Diego Vega have devoted so much time to building a tale of hate compounded that the few extra minutes spent veiling the end result of a violent overreaction is all the more powerful when the they finally go in for the

Nudo Mixteco (2021)

The funeral of Maria's (Sonia Couoh) estranged mother is what brings her to San Mateo. She is the first of three seemingly disparate characters whose lives are destined to intersect over the course of the town's long holiday weekend celebration. After her father stops short of physically ejecting her from the funeral - he blames his wife's death on Maria's love for another woman — Piedad (Eileen Yañez) arrives and, not wishing for Maria to freeze to death, insists that she spend the night. The nature of their relationship is soon made clear. "Where's the father?" is Maria's first question. The long patch of silence that ensues is broken with, "You kept it?" This is followed by a scene of

intense lovemaking, a long post-coital silence, and a hushed breakfast with the baby. Just when it couldn't get any quieter, María announces she's leaving tomorrow and asks Piedad to join her.

You probably won't catch on the first time through, but somewhere around the 16-minute mark, our three principles are brought together in the same time and space for the first time, with Toña (Myriam Bravo) and her mother taking over Maria's spot as funeral procession caboose and Esteban on clarinet, entertaining both revelers and mourners alike. As if to compensate for the stretches of silence that open the picture, music (performed live) underscores much of the film. It's an important part of Esteban's life. The first person he goes to meet upon arriving back in town after a three-year absence is not his wife Chabela (Aida López) or his children, but fellow musician Nato (Noé Hernández). Profitable employment is scarce in San Mateo, hence the time spent making a living in another town to support his family.

Esteban reasons that instruments, like women, can only be played by the owner. But in his absence, his neglected wife Chabela has come under new ownership. His own mother chimes in, "You stayed away too long, son," to which he responds by assigning blame on her for not looking after Chabela in his absence. A town council has final jurisdiction over the couple's fate. A call is put out for the citizenry to

meet in the town square, where the matter of Esteban's "troubles at home" will be publicly arbitrated and ruled on.

The film's third wheel is easily its most problematic. A young Toña was sexually abused by her uncle while Mom looked the other way. Knowing that, it's impossible to comprehend why a mother would years later place her daughter in the same care of her abusers. Ángeles Cruz, an actress making her writing and directing debut on a feature, knows how to layer the setup, but the payoff was quite the head-scratcher. —Scott Marks

Video on Demand New Release Roundup

I Care a Lot — Marla Grayson (Rosamund Pike) has what it takes to become the court-appointed guardian to a galaxy of unwitting seniors. From her hairstyle — a cascading pageboy with bamboo cutting board earflaps - to the determined heels against marble click-clack in her approach, every move is calculated to intimidate, to beat her mostly male competition at their own game. She comes by her arrogance honestly. No matter how questionable her motives, she knows how to play the system and gets what she wants without breaking any laws. There's no knocking success — that is, until Marla runs up against a sharp granny whose baby boy is a made man in the Russian mafia. Jennifer Peterson (Dianne Wiest) is what's known in the business as a "cherry" - a homeowner, never married, with no children or relatives. In no time, Jennifer is installed in a lavish care facility, with Marla stripping her house in a manner befitting a seasoned burglar. Eiza González co-stars as Fran, Marla's partner both in and out of the courtroom. Writer-director J Blakeson draws no unwarranted attention to their relationship. It's a given that both are strong, smart, viable women capable of balancing their personal lives and professional careers. But greed has a way of changing things, and it was only a matter of time before the smoothie hit the plate glass window. Checking the records, it turns out Jennifer does indeed have a son, Roman Lunyov (a slow-burning Peter Dinklage, savoring each sinful aside), the aforementioned mobster who loves his mother almost as much as the millions in diamonds, once stashed in her safe deposit box, that are now in Marla's possession. Just before the fun-filled roller coaster ride deposited me back at the gate, I scribbled, "Could have stood one more twist" across the bottom of the notepad. That was written three minutes before the film ended, enough time for the filmmakers to make me regret my final wish. 2021 — S.M. $\star \star \star$

HOLD THAT LION (1947) By this time, doctor's orders had called for Curly to relinquish the coveted third Stooge spot to brother Shemp. (He appears as "Man Sleeping on Train.") It was a challenging period all around. what with the onslaught of television causing the Columbia shorts unit to economise. Originality was supplanted by the cost cutting need to repurpose past efforts. Long before America went green, filmmaker Jules White was one of the earliest practitioners of recycling — the studio would not let go of Hold That Lion. Between March and May of 1953, eight years before Ingmar Bergman kicked off his "Death of God" trilogy with Through a Glass Darkly. Columbia Pictures released three "new" Stooge shorts to first run theatres that would collectively come to be known as the "Death of Shemp" trilogy. Hold That Lion adds water to the triad soup, all directed by Mr. White. Combine the bits and pieces, and these shorts contain the entire 1947 two-reeler

Hold That Lion features bit player Kenneth MacDonald in the career-defining role of Ichabod Slipp, a character he would revive two years later for another pair of shorts. After he swindles the boys, our trio of process-serving knuckleheads trail him to Union Station and hop a train, aiming to slap Slipp with a "subpeeny." But Slipp isn't the only threat on board: an escaped lion wreaks havoc among the day-players. (The sparkling video restoration reveals a new-found flaw heretofore indiscernible in softer TV prints. Look carefully when the

boys are trapped in the cage with Leo. One can now spot the camera reflection in the pane of glass that separates Stooges from their maned menace.) Also take note of the terrorizing FAO Schwarz stuffed lion at the foot of their bunk. (Three can sleep cheaper than one.)

Doubles, dubs, and a cringe-worthy Dudley Dickerson round out the festivities. Gasp as the mangyhaired Larry stunt double flees the lion's cage. Listen to the passengers' blase, dubbed in moans of, "Oh, a lion," and, "Look, a lion." And what can be said of Stooge-regular **Dickerson?** Columbia Pictures head Harry Cohn vowed that the only time a person of color would appear in one of his films was if they were cast in a subservient role. As the hapless train porter, Dickerson is Cohn's theory put to the test.

Booty and the Beast joins Godfather II and Gremlins 2 as one of those rare sequels that outshines its predecessor. The short opens on new footage of old Kenneth MacDonald playing a burglar breaking and entering into a cheap soundstage flat. After he bamboozles the boys into believing he's the owner of the house, they willingly aid and abet the desperate intruder's attempt to gain entry, and an inevitable safe cracking subplot ensues. The mighty Stooges pull up in front of a rolled painted backdrop of a poverty row Twelve Oaks.

Aside from our trio of halfwits, MacDonald's revival of infamous Ichabod Slipp is, in one form or another, the film's unifying link. The Nixonian MacDonald plays a man with no name, thus enabling Columbia's crack sound editors to seamlessly (and seemingly) transform I. Slipp into a new and fascinating screen presence. MacDonald looks like a deer caught in the grip truck's headlights as he fumbles with a crowbar to jimmy his way through the balsa wood plantation. The surrogate Slipp absconds with the loot, leaving ample running time for a sagging Vernon Dent to show up for SAG scale. Dressed in

a costume more befitting a filling station attendant than a security guard, the whitehaired, belt-busting bit player looks every day of his 58 years — plus 30. Kudos to the corpulent comic trooper for performing his own stunt. The production probably couldn't afford to pop for a dummy that big.

At precisely 7:38, an optical wipe transports us six years into the past when such luxuries as extras, props and set dressing were built into the budget. What makes this reimagining unique can be found in the extensive effort needed to maintain continuity by redubbing every utterance of Slipp's name. Whole sentences are replaced, but it's a quick one word substitution that functions as the short's raison d'être. A dazed Moe looks up, takes one look at stock footage Slipp and cries, "Hey, it's him." We conclude with the five seconds of fresh footage necessary to tie up the new plot line.

Working in achronological order, Columbia's crack creative team chose to use the tail of the Lion to round out Booty and the Lion's head to begin *Loose Loot*. The same custom-lettered "Cess, Poole & Drayne" door signage that opens Hold that Lion ignites Loose Loot. For the first time. MacDonald officially reprises the role of I. Slipp. Slipp2 slips into character at precisely 1.52. In a fleet 30 seconds, the filmmakers establish that once the next patch of stock footage wraps, the remainder of the short will play out at the Circle

Follies Theatre. (In a nod to the Stooges' Hebraic ancestry, the offices of Honest Ichabod's Theatrical Enterprises and Real Estate offices are located in the Knish Building.) With the exception of an insert shot of a placard displaying a youthful, dapper MacDonald that brings the Stooges up to speed, the first 6 minutes and 35 seconds of the short is lifted directly from *Hold That Lion*.

Eager to recycle every frame of Hold That Lion, the studio tacked the remaining file cabinet sequence onto the last film in the cycle, Tricky Dicks. Sadly, it's the one short in the bunch that doesn't feature MacDonald. (Not unlike Robert Duvall in The Godfather: Part *II*, the studio refused to meet MacDonald's salary demands.) The trio star as policemen under the annoyingly watchful supervision of Chief Detective B.A. Copper (Ferris Taylor). Murray Alper plays a self-described "thrill killer" whose six shooter holds more bullets than Albert Finney's tommy gun in Miller's Crossing. Aiming at everything and nothing, the character's explosive outburst overwhelms the viewer with its wanton display of post-Korean war existential angst. Positioning Alper motionless in midframe, the red hot White unleashes a personal/political statement: Alper's brutality is a direct externalization of Whites' deep-seated hostility toward studio heads who trimmed his already modest budgets.

"They were up to no good, I knew in my mind they were up to no good, nobody does that."

Ted's girlfriend asked him, "What are they doing?" He told her they were crawling around, "Cause I can see the tops of the bushes going like this." (When he testified in court two months after the incident, Ted motioned with his hands, waving them back and forth.) "And the bushes are 15 feet tall. And I can see right in there, so I know they're crawling. And she said, 'Well, what do you think?' I said, 'Well, I'm just going to call the cops, I'll call you back." The police quickly came to Ted's house. "I took

James, now 28, is described as 5 feet 1 inch tall and 150 pounds. When they arrested her, police noticed that Malissa James had electrical tape wrapped around her right thumb. When they looked, they saw a deep cut there. Both defendants are charged with multiple burglaries and the murder of a 63-year-old woman. The woman was apparently surprised in her bedroom late on Sunday, March 10, approximately A doctor who performed the autopsy testified that the woman slowly bled to death from 142 cuts and stabs, most less than four inches deep. The doctor said that no single wound would have been fatal, but altogether the total blood loss was not survivable. A small folding knife, believed to be the deadly weapon, was recovered in the woman's home in the 1800 block of Outrigger Lane.

Prosecutor Nicole Rooney said that Ian Bushee and Malissa James are transients, and that they have previously acted together to commit crimes in San Bernardino County and Arizona. Their prior arrests were for burglaries and shoplifting, and when they were arrested in San Diego County they were both on multiple probations. Prosecutor Rooney claimed the pair had committed a prior burglary one year earlier, in which Malissa James reportedly confronted the homeowner after he unexpectedly returned to his house in Rancho Cucamonga. That man said Malissa James walked towards him holding a kind of arrow in her hands while he was standing in his front yard, and she fled only after he cocked the pistol he held. That homeowner also said that Ian Bushee had already bolted out of his home and fled before the female burglar exited his home and approached him.

nine hours before two suspects were spotted by Ted returning to their encampment at the lagoon. They were arrested just a short walk from the Outrigger Lane crime scene.

A prosecutor said the victim was first attacked on her bed, then on the floor next to her bed. Apparently, she was able to make it out onto her back deck where the attack resumed, and finally, the gravely wounded woman crawled back to the foot of her bed where she dialed 911 for help. This scenario was deduced from a blood trail. The prosecutor said this included blood smears from the victim and blood droplets from her attacker. The defense attorney for Ian Bushee insisted that Bushee was not the one who stabbed the woman to death on Outrigger Lane in Carlsbad. Although police found many blood droplets which DNA-matched to Malissa James, there was no DNA nor any other evidence showing that Bushee was ever in that home, according to his defense attorney John Patterson. Honorable judge Brad Weinreb ordered both defendants to answer multiple charges at trial, and to be held without bail. Their date for trial, which is eligible as a death penalty case, is set for March 25, 2021. EVA KNOTT





continued from page 18 station located in the East Fortuna Staging Area. It was finished last February at a final cost of \$6.6 million. The cost of the river crossing bridge is anybody's guess, but Max's parents are eager to start raising the money to get it done.

Max's father had hoped to work with the Mission Trails Regional Park Foundation in creating a restricted fund earmarked exclusively for construction of the bridge. They are a nonprofit organization whose sole purpose is improving the park infrastructure and experience. Unfortunately, this collaboration did not get approved. He is now looking to "leverage another San Diego foundation" to accomplish the same goal.

In the meantime, the family has hired KPFF Consulting Engineers,

who are preparing a design and cost estimate for the bridge project.

"If they let us, we would love to have a say on the design, the style," Max's father said. "If we end up raising most or all the money, we would love to maybe have a designation or a plaque or a name to honor Max's memory. Max was very artistic. He was basically a professional-grade glassblower, and a photographer as well. He would have loved to have had a bridge that had a functional utility but also had an aesthetic merit."

Communications between the Lenail family and Councilmember Raul Campillo's office revealed a bit of history on the bridge project. An email from the latter revealed that the last time the bridge was discussed was at a Mission Trails **Regional Park Citizens** Advisory Committee meeting in 2011. "At that time, it was communicated to the Committee that any bridge would have to been constructed with the 100-year flood plain in mind. Thus, the bridge span could be between 320 - 400 feet." The email further stated, "A project like this will take a great amount of work, preparation and funding. It very well could be an eight figure project. It will require an environmental review process, environmental mitigation, design, engineering, permitting, construction, as well as other things that we may be unaware of at the point in time."

If an eight-figure project seems a bit expensive, another email sent to Max's father by Andy Field (director of Parks and Recreation City of San Diego) may provide another clue. In it, Field states it's still to be determined "whether the bridge must be usable by both pedestrians as well as vehicles...."

Max Lenail was 21 years old when he drowned in the San Diego River. He was new to the area but had already enjoyed runs around the North Park neighborhood, Mission Trails, and had done some rock climbing at Mount Woodson. He was set to graduate from Brown University in May.

"He loved San Diego, and he was really looking forward to spending the whole semester there," his father said. "We were going to come visit him with his dog, and it is absolutely inconceivably tragic that he died that way after only a couple of weeks in San Diego."

As first reported here February 23, the original filing said Maddaffer would be lobbying city officials on Deckard's behalf about "procurement of real estate data analytics for regulatory compliance, public safety, and community equity." The desired goal was said to be "approval of vendor services by City of San Diego." Reached by phone after deleting Deckard as a client, Jim Madaffer, a former city councilman and CEO of Madaffer Enterprises, said his firm's work for Deckard was of a short-term nature. including "introducing" company executives to city officials and getting on contracting lists. Madaffer said his lobbying contingent held just one meeting with the city's interim chief operating officer Jay Goldstone and unidentified



access, client Deckard never got past the lobby.

staff members regarding Deckard and its system to track illegal short-term rentals. Neither mayor Todd Gloria nor his representatives participated, the lobbyist added.

According to Bry's 2018 economic interest disclosure, filed March 19, 2019, her husband, entrepreneur Neil Senturia, acquired an interest in Deckard in June 2018, reportedly worth between \$10.000 and \$100.000. Bry's statement on leaving office, dated January 4 of this year, said Senturia divested himself of the Deckard holding, then valued between \$100,000 to \$1 million, on Monday, November 2, 2020, the day before she lost her election bid for mayor against fellow Democrat Gloria. A September 25, 2019 post by GovTech. com identifying Senturia as a co-founder and CEO of Deckard, paraphrased **COO** Nick Del Pego's description of the firm and its services. "The company compiles information from sources such as Zillow, long-term rentals, property sales, MLS (multiple listing service)

information, Airbnb and VRBO, then compares it with government records to see if there are gaps or anomalies. He said usually there are, and Deckard's data-as-a-service model gives governments the information without requiring staff to download or familiarize themselves with new software. Bry's statement on leaving office said Senturia divested himself of the Deckard holding on Monday, November 2, 2020. "Del Pego added that Rentalscape, particularly, is intended to help city governments keep up with the impact of online services like Airbnb that help citizens commoditize their properties in new ways, sometimes under the radar. He said revenue booked through online rental providers like Airbnb and VRBO in the United States in 2018 was close to \$20 billion. according to AllTheRooms. com. with which Deckard has a professional relationship. Given an average transient-occupancy tax over 10 percent nationwide, that should have meant about \$2 billion in local taxes."

During her single term on the council, Bry was a consistent voice against so-called short-term vacation rentals, though her husband's interest in Deckard was not widely publicized at the time. She has subsequently lent her support to the current recall effort against former council colleague Jen Campbell, whom Bry has accused of being too easy on short-term rentals. Before terminating a February 23 phone call in which he spoke for the couple, Senturia declined to provide details about Bry's role in Deckard and her related city council activities. other than acknowledging she may have held an interest in the company at some point. ing in the Regional Bikeway Program are at greater risk of not being completed on schedule or as planned." Explaining why was difficult, say auditors. "When we reviewed the six completed projects as of July 7, 2020 in more depth, we did not find a common factor causing delays - although most experienced some type of delay. For example, the Sweetwater Bonita segment had an 8-month delayed start in the advertisement phase which led to compounded delays in all following stages. Another project, the Coastal Rail Trail in Oceanside, had delays in the construction phase. Yet, there was no clear indication of patterns behind the various project delays."

Diplomats and their families from the Russian embassy in Pyongyang, North Korea, worked around extreme COVID-induced travel restrictions by pushing themselves across the border in a rail trolley to reach their home country on Feb. 25, the BBC reported. The group of eight, including children, traveled 32 hours by train and two hours by bus to reach the Russian border, but trains and wagons cannot enter or leave North Korea, so the embassy's third secretary, Vladislav Sorokin, completed the last half-mile of the journey by pushing the trolley filled with the group and their baggage on train tracks over the Tumen River, where they were met by Russian officials at the border station.

Animal Antics

EuroWeekly reported that on Feb. 24, a routine Sudanese Tarco airline flight from Khartoum to Doha, Qatar, was forced to turn around about a half-hour after takeoff when a stowaway cat caused a midair emergency. The cat gained entry to the cockpit and became aggressive, attacking the crew, who were unable to restrain it, prompting the pilot to return to the airport. Officials believe the cat got onto the airplane while it was parked overnight in a hangar in Khartoum.

Just Desserts

 In late February, Thangulla Satish, 45, was killed in Telangana state in southern India when the rooster he was preparing for an illegal cockfight panicked and slashed him with the 3-inch blade strapped to its leg. Police inspector B. Jeevan said Satish was "hit by the rooster's knife in his groin and started bleeding heavily," the Associated Press reported. He died on the way to the hospital. The rooster was removed to a poultry farm nearby.

Oops!

- Mates Jackson Perry and Noah Palmer of Mandurah, Western Australia, planned a leisurely float offshore, drinking beer on a blowup air mattress on Feb. 27, but they wound up stranded in the Indian Ocean for nearly three hours after the wind blew them out to sea. "We couldn't paddle against the wind, and we just kept going further and further out," Perry told 7News, but they did manage to call a friend, who reached them on his jet ski just before their cellphones died. "We were kind of getting worried at that point," Perry said, but the beers helped with the anxiety.

Wait, What?

- On Feb. 23, Siriporn Niamrin, 49, discovered a large, waxy, oval-shaped lump that smelled of fish and weighed about 15 pounds along the beach near her home in Nakhon Si Thammarat province, Thailand, and was excited to learn it may be a rare substance called ambergris, or vomit produced by sperm whales. *The Mirror* reported ambergris is highly prized in making perfume, and it might be worth as much as \$260,000. "If I really have the genuine ambergris, I can help my community once I find a buyer for it," Niamrin said. "I'm keeping it safe in my house" as she waits for expert confirmation of its authenticity.

Smooth Reaction

- Vidam Perevertilov, 52, chief engineer on a supply ship sailing in the South Pacific from New Zealand to Pitcairn Island, fell overboard after finishing his shift at 4 a.m. on Feb. 16. Alone in the dark and without a life jacket, Perevertilov nevertheless started swimming toward a spot that appeared on the horizon at dawn, The Guardian reported. The spot turned out to be an abandoned fishing buoy and Perevertilov spent the next 14 hours clinging to it before being rescued by his crew, who noticed his absence six hours after he fell and were able to determine where he left the ship. Perevertilov's son, Marat, said his father was unhurt, but exhausted, and he left the buoy in the ocean "so it could save another person's life."

Multitasking

– Northern California plastic surgeon Scott Green surprised officials in Sacramento Superior Court on Feb. 25 when he appeared for a traffic trial via videoconference from what appeared to be an operating room, the Sacramento Bee reported. As clicks and whirs of medical equipment and suctions could be heard in the background, a courtroom clerk questioned his whereabouts, and Green, dressed in hospital scrubs, admitted, "Yes, I'm in an operating room right now. I'm available for trial. Go right ahead." Despite Green's repeated assurances, Court Commissioner Gary Link was skeptical: "I do not feel comfortable for the welfare of a patient if you're in the process of operating ... I don't think that's appropriate." The trial was rescheduled for later in March. California's Medical Board said in a statement it was investigating the incident.

- Sharon Carr of Tulsa, Oklahoma, was arrested by officers responding to a residential burglary call on Feb. 26 when she stepped from the shadows in front of the victim's house. Investigators found a window screen removed and a window open, where they allege Carr entered the home but quickly left, leaving behind an empty Cheetos bag and a water bottle. Cheetos residue on Carr's teeth linked her to the crime, reported KTUL-TV, along with testimony from the victim. Carr was charged with first-degree burglary.
