"Can you eat fish caught in San Diego Bay?" Feature Stories May 19

This article, at least the first section, was so dramatically edited that is it misleading in parts. The homeless are not the cause of water pollution. There are many sources of pollution in San Diego's watersheds and coastal waters and we as a society are ALL contributors... And sometimes our pollution comes back to bite us all-that's the point of the first part of this article. You can stop here or read on for an explanation.

We directly contribute through littering and illegal dumping of mattresses, furniture, appliances – big things that may require a drive and cost a few bucks to dispose of properly (or waiting for one of the city's free pick-up events). We indirectly contribute through our reliance on services and products that often unintentionally add to pollution (industrial waste, vehicle emissions, use of convenient single-use items, etc). We also have social challenges that contribute to pollution such as the homeless crisis, and that our busy lives cause us to choose convenience over the environment (not recycling as much as we can, not stopping to pick up litter, not reducing our use of single use packaging, etc).

I'm not pointing fingers, I am a part of this, too. San Diego Bay is an absolute treasure – from sand bass, seahorses, salt marshes and living shorelines to fishing harbors, public piers, navy bases, shipping terminals, parks and maritime museums. The diversity of life – both wild and human – in and around this bay is astonishing and we rely on it all. The bay can absorb some of our nutrient and contaminant inputs but not all, and our pollution can come back to bite us through trashed shorelines and fish with some pollutants and fibers (not clumps of blankets and mattresses!)

The good news is that since we each contribute to the pollution problem, we also have the power to solve it. The Port of San Diego, with their partners and colleagues, are always working towards a healthy bay and, along with an engaged city, can continue to make great progress in improving the bay and therefore our quality of life.

Dr. Talley, I'd be grateful if you'd clarify (assuming it's true), that by "first section" of the article bearing my byline, my name – my reputation as an honest journalist reporting in good faith information from my interviews, that you're referring to the sub-headline, which unfortunately reads, "How the homeless contribute to water pollution."


As we discussed when I called you after I saw for the 1st time my article with that sub-head, I did NOT write those 7 words. Most readers will miss a key point in your comment: you mean the EDITOR-written sub-headline is problematic because it does exactly opposite of what you & I took care to convey in the actual story. You were clear that people experiencing homelessness are not to blame for the bay's imperfect water quality.

Those who read the article itself will see that society's homelessness crisis, not people experiencing homelessness, is one among many contributors of water pollution. I've now asked multiple times that the subhead be changed. I'm a freelancer who occasionally writes for continued on page 4

SANTEE

Pave it first, then we'll incorporate it

Once a highway, now a trail

Just before Mesa Road spills into Mission Trails Regional Park in Santee, that last quarter mile is still a dirt path built before the auto, riddled with potholes.

In 1884 it was declared a public highway. Today, those who live in Santee say it's a city street while the city calls it a private road, and the county sees it as a park trail.

Last week, the 14 or so homeowners who live along the deeply rutted stretch learned that they won't be getting any help with paving from the city or county. They've been asking for 20 years.

The final answer from Santee is that the road leading to the trailhead is for the neighbors to maintain, even though most of its traffic is park-bound. Should a developer

While the entire length of Mesa Road is within city limits, the city only maintains the section that comes before the rustic road.

According to local Allen Zwan, the city did provide temporary pavement one time, followed by some repairs a few years later.

But at the next meeting, the road's history since 1884 was explained in a twisted tale of ownership that passed its maintenance back to the homeowners.

Neighbors say the 1884 county document proves it's a dedicated county road, and should therefore have automatically become a city road at the time of Santee's incorporation in 1000

Yet, according to Santee officials, it was never accepted into the county road system, so the city isn't obligated to maintain it. At the time, the county was maintaining Mesa Road only from Mission Gorge Road to about the southern limits of the Mesa Heights subdivision.

"The county still claims fee ownership to that portion of Mesa Road south of the Mesa Heights subdivision," a staff report says. (The smooth portion was acquired by the developer from the county in 1990).

The record search found no evidence the road was ever dropped by the county, which has to follow a process when accepting or abandoning a road.

Santee officials suggest that Mesa Road wasn't accepted into the county road system because the "highway" has morphed into a trail.

The board's lack of action "is likely due to the creation of the Mission Trails Regional Park and the use of the road as a park trail."

Toby Brown, a resident who has sought help from the Mission Trails Regional Park Committee, estimates that eighty percent of the road's users are park visitors.

But "whoever owns the park, doesn't have the money or jurisdiction to do any road improvements adjacent" to it over here, he told the city. "They may help pay for it if the San Diego City Council got together with them."

come along and improve it – then "it could be accepted into the city's roadway system."

Where the same road turns smooth, it's part of the Mesa Heights subdivision where developer Lifetime Homes was required to build the road in 1990 to meet the city's Public Works Standards next to their site.

The roadway south of the subdivision had no such requirement.

"It has since fallen into a terrible state and it is only a matter of time before some resident or visitor to Mission Trails park is injured due to" its condition.

Neighbors have made their own repairs but in between patches, the dust still flies. In March, they raised the issue again at a city council meeting where the mayor advised they would get "a full report."

Cunningham manse owner kicks in \$3000 for latest GOP House accused

Monday's guilty plea by ex-Seminole County Tax **Collector Joel Greenberg to** sex trafficking and a bevy of other felony counts has reportedly ratcheted up the heat on his partner in partying, Republican congressman Matt Gaetz.

Greenberg's deal with federal prosecutors makes no

mention of Gaetz but is widely expected to mark the beginning of a new chapter in the government's investigation of the pair's alleged cocaine-snorting and Venmo payments for sex with young women, including a 17-year-old.

One aspect of the probe includes whether Gaetz used any funds from his campaign account to pay for any extracurricular hotel room activities, a charge aired by CNN last month.

Gaetz has denied any wrongdoing. "Matt Gaetz has never paid for sex," said an April statement cited by the New York Times. "Matt Gaetz refutes all the disgusting allegations completely."

Whatever the outcome of the charges against him, the Gaetz case may cast a new spotlight on Rancho Santa Fe, at the top of the list of California communities giving to Gaetz's congressional campaign fund.

According to disclosure filings with the Federal Election Commission, three Rancho Santa Fe denizens have come up with a total of \$10.100 so far this year for Friends of Matt Gaetz.

The biggest giver was John Peck, Jr., with \$6600 contributed between January 14 through March 5. Less than a month later, on March 30, the New York Times broke word that Gaetz was under investigation regarding sex trafficking of a 17-year-old. Peck, a computer industry veteran turned real estate investor, is a frequent giver to GOP causes, including Donald Trump.

Also, among the Gaetz donors, the records show, was Rancho Santa Fe philanthropist Patricia Amtower, with \$500 on January 28.

Giving a total of \$3,000 from January 28 to March 28 of this year was Hugh Bancroft, an heir to the Dow Jones fortune, who has previously crossed paths with another troubled GOP congressman, the notorious Randy 'Duke' Cunningham.

In 2005 Bancroft purchased the mansion in Rancho Santa Fe that Cunningham had acquired for \$2.5 million in cash. The then-House member bought the property with money from proceeds of Cunning-

ham's November 2003 sale of a house in Del Mar to defense contractor Mitchell Wade, as first reported by the Union-Tribune, ultimately garnering a Pulitzer for the then-robust daily.

Cunningham subsequently pled guilty to receiving \$2.4 million in bribes and evading more than a million dollars in taxes, agreeing to forfeit the Rancho Santa Fe house and other property to the feds. "I broke the law, concealed my conduct, and disgraced my high office," Cunningham told reporters. "I know I will forfeit my freedom, my reputation, [and] my high office."

In his last hours as president, Donald Trump granted Cunningham, who had done eight years in prison for his misdeeds, a partial pardon, allowing him to own a gun, but keeping him on the hook for \$3.6 million in restitution, the U-T reported Janu-

"It makes life worth living when people look at you and accept you, and this pardon is another step forward," the disgraced congressman was quoted as saving.

"The Bancrofts' home and garden provide a peaceful counterpoint to the couple's active lives filled with family (they have three grown children), travel. and adventure," wrote Ranch and Coast Magazine in a September 2019 profile of Bancroft and his wife lov.

"Joy played polo for years with the San Diego Polo Club (along with son Colton), and now rides jumpers. Even the couple's vacations are action-packed. In Tanzania. they rode horses at the base of Kilimanjaro, 'flying along' amid herds of wildebeest, zebra, and giraffe."

"In reality, says Joy, the [Cunningham] house was a fixer-upper — a bad take on the fictional Tara, a plantation in Gone with the Wind. The house had tacky entrance columns and a warren of small, dark rooms crammed with old furniture."

The city of San Diego's online campaign disclosure system, at one time a stellar model of electronic reporting, now

Refund check's in the mail

County auditors have not let the Covid-19 pandemic deter them from rooting out a bevy of "unallowable expenses" by non-profit groups awarded taxpayer cash by county supervisors through the so-called Neighborhood Reinvestment and Community Support programs.

"During the review of the grant expenditures," says a recently released report dated February 1, staffers for the county's office of Auditor and Controller combed through the files of the Julian Chamber of Commerce, which got \$120,000 during the county's 2019 fiscal year. Auditors found that "the organization submitted multiple expenses not allowed under the Grant Agreement," including "expenses outside the grant period," and workers who got cash "without invoices, receipts, reimbursement

forms, or signatures of appropriate authorities." The chamber "did not include a copy of detailed invoices or receipts for 23 of 40 expenditures reviewed," according to the report, and "submitted payments to performers without a contract, invoice or affidavit documenting the money received." Similarly, the Tierrasanta Foundation, which got \$12,000 during the same period, "submitted multiple expenses not allowed under the grant agreement." The report recommended that county officials "perform a detailed review of the Julian Chamber of Commerce and Tierrasanta Foundation files for unallowable expenses to determine the

total expenses not allowed under the grant agreement and pursue the recovery of the funds." Iulian's Chamber became famous in March of last year by telling outsiders to keep away. "With our being in close proximity to San Diego and other major urban population centers, we know that Julian seems like an attractive place to practice social distancing

in the outdoors," said a statement cited by the Union-Tribune. "We also fully understand the inclination to seek escape in the outdoors during difficult times, the reality is that doing so right now risks the lives of our residents and puts undue strain on our limited services." In the matter of the Tierrasanta Foundation, says a January 29 memo from Brian Hagerty, director of the county's Office of Financial Planning to Chief of Audits Juan Perez, "The organization was contacted regarding these unallowable expenses and

indicated a plan to write a check back to the County for the difference on January 27, 2021." Per its website, the foundation's mission "is to promote the general welfare and interests of Tierrasanta through various community events that benefit the well being and quality of life for all Tierrasantans." As for the Julian

> Chamber, "most of the organization's expenditure documents were deemed eligible, and the organization indicated its intent to work with the County to resolve the [remaining] issues," wrote Hagerty.

U-T's DTLA printing plant goes **Hollywood** Presses

aren't the only things spinning at the Los Angeles Times, judging by the paper's recent account of its printing complex, which also produces the San Diego Union-Tribune for daily

trucking south to the border city. "The Times' landlord, Atlas Capital Group, said it would file a proposal with the city Wednesday to build soundstages on parking lots around the plant on Olympic Boulevard as The Times continues to print papers there," the business section of the Times reported May 19. "If the city approves the \$650-million project, a second phase of development would eventually convert the cavernous 1980s-era building where printing presses now roll daily into soundstages after The Times departs." The story added, "The Times said its lease on the printing facility may be extended for years, how-

ever." Well, maybe. What Times spokeswoman Hillary Manning actually said, as quoted in the piece, was, "We have the opportunity to remain in that location without any disruption to our operations well into the future." The current lease on the property lasts until "the end of 2023," but "the Times has the option to renew its lease at prevailing market rates for at least a decade, according to a real estate expert familiar with the terms," said the story, not explaining the need to employ an unnamed continued on page 4

the SD Reader. I'm grateful for the work. But I've never been inside the Reader's newsroom. Former editor, Ernie Grimm, who just left the publication after 26 years is a supremely ethical writer's writer. We didn't always agree on everything, but my respect & gratitude for Ernie is immense. The new editor will no doubt reply soon to my requests to change the subhead. I'll follow up again Monday & reach out to the publisher if I get no reply. I doubt that'll be necessary.

My own experience says a new job managing a bunch of freelancers is a lot in the beginning. Again, I did not write, nor did I see the subhead prior to publication. Otherwise, I stand by my reporting in the body of the article. Another problem I have with the subhead: I try never to refer to human beings who have nowhere to live as "the homeless." Referring to "the homeless" leads to singularization of the plural, turning "the homeless" to "a homeless." That makes a person who is experiencing homelessness sound like a different species, making it easier for some to ignore and/or harm them, whether by violence or negligence,.

As an adult who experienced homelessness when I was a child, I'm keenly aware of the importance of respecting & honoring our fellow humans with no shelter. One need not have experienced homelessness to get that there's no such thing as "a

homeless." There are people who have no home, and we must fix that. To readers & to Dr. Talley, I fear the bay story may be overshadowed by this comment thread. I urge readers to note the understanding I share with Dr. Talley & return to the article to take in its substance. Lastly, Dr. Theresa Talley is a passionate, gifted scientist & a San Diegan seeking to reveal facts about, & suggest solutions to improve, the quality of San Diego Bay and this region's natural environment.

Calls to the city clerk's office, the city's ethics commission, and Netfile, the Mariposa-based

to be a home-grown filing and disclosure system remains a tightly held city hall secret.

In a subsequent telephone interview, Netfile vice president Diebert said his company bowed out of the competition for a new contract because city officials wanted would-be vendors to bun-

online filing vendor that has run the city's disclosure portal for almost a decade, were not immediately returned.

A longtime professional campaign treasurer, who agreed to discuss the matter on background, said she had learned that the city's termination of its relationship with the vendor had been sudden and had come as a surprise.

"They didn't really give a lot of detail," according to this person. "[The city] told me they are not going to support Netfile anymore. When I contacted Netfile, they said the city didn't want to renew the contract."

An early effort to use electronic filing via Netfile stalled out in 2005 after the city manager questioned its then-estimated its then estimated annual cost of \$40,000, but the city ultimately became one of the vendor's first clients.

"The city of San Diego made history with our campaign system, having the first-ever paperless campaign statement filed on January 2013," wrote Netfile vice president Tom Diebert in an April 6, 2020, letter to Garden Grove city clerk Terri Pomeroy.

What led city officials to dispense with Netfile in favor of what appears dle a new lobbyist reporting system, with campaign and financial interest reporting modules.

source. In the meantime, landlord Atlas Capital plans to keep busy in the parking lot. "The buildings would include six soundstages, a mill shop for scenery and prop design, and the garage — all built first to minimize disruption of printing operations," said the Times story. "Longer term," the plant itself, "which has high ceilings and is largely free of support columns... would be redeveloped into 11 soundstages, production support, executive offices, a full-service restaurant with an outdoor patio, a commissary, a café, and a fitness center." Whether the Times and San Diego's U-T would still exist in the realm of print is left unsaid. The U-T's San Diego printing plant in Mission Valley, which shut down in June 2015 after the paper's sale by Doug Manchester to Tribune Publishing sans headquarters and presses, is now part of a redeveloped office complex.

He's looking at himself in the window mirror. His arms flail around like the Navy guy who guides planes into landings on a carrier. But what he's actually doing is wiping the final water away from his attack on a once-grimy display window.

"Is that sparkling, or what!" says Timothy.

an awful lot of vertical massaging of windows in the job he has chosen, a lot of climbing ladders, a ton of leaning and kneeling. "Specially in private houses where they have benches in front of windows, kneeling for each of them can be tough. By the time I've finished some of them, I can hardly walk. 

"European Elegance meets casual California beach lifestyle!" shouts the Zillow intro to 708 A Avenue, purported to be "one of Coronado's most iconic and significant properties."

Billed as the "Grand Dame" of the island, the 6872-square-foot residence was built in 1916 under the guidance of Reginald Johnson, ten years before the famed Los Angeles architect went on to design La Jolla's La Valencia Hotel, among a

handful of Southern California landmarks to his credit. It's believed to be Johnson's only existing work in Coronado.

The approach to the

house from the palmlined street is through a cobblestone half-circle driveway leading to a French glass entry door. For some reason two small windows flanking the entryway are covered in security bars, which seem out of place in this neighborhood and odder still when considering none of the larger firstfloor windows are similarly equipped.

Once we're past the historic façade with its pleasant Tuscan columns and balconies overlooking the front yard, the style quickly changes. "This masterpiece has recently been modernized, updated, and renovated with no expense spared," the listing promises. Whether that's a good or bad thing is a matter of one's taste.

The floors are covered in a wood-look tile that doesn't seem out of touch with the vintage coffered ceilings and exposed wood beams. The columns on the exterior walls carry through to the interior.

A formal dining room offers seating for eight and a two-sided fireplace that's outfitted from floor to ceiling with mirrors on every side. The "gourmet kitchen with all the trimmings" has a diner-style breakfast booth along with an oversized island with prep sink, walk-in pantry, and a new appliance suite. Solid stone counters and a farmhouse-style sink top cabinets that, while new, again seem to fit with the home's age.

Upstairs we find a bedroom with a wall covered in chalkboard paint and teenager doodles, while a gold orb chandelier dips between exposed rafter beams which are thankfully left unpainted. The deck overlooking the entry is outfitted with a huge hammock in which to lie back and enjoy the view of the neighborhood's other stately mansions including a huge Tudor castle across

in the neighborhood's street markets. "They've reported them to the police, but they're very busy and never come immediately. They have to respond first to shootings, robberies, and things like that."

The elementary school is located in El Laurel neighborhood on the east side, an area that has grown rapidly in the last few years. According to Gastelum, they have had support from the police department for parents to watch the school.

"We have a parents' committee to organize surveillance and keep the school safe, but we have nobody to stay at night." Because of the pandemic, burglars took advantage of the school being closed. "We have seen them stealing during the day, but we can't take the risk to stop them;

doors, fences, pipes, and lamps were stolen. Irma Martinez, who is in charge of the educational system in Tijuana, says that which made him look to move out of the neighborhood. City Heights intruder eased out but not arrested

Turns out signage is everything

On April 25, at about 11:30 p.m., a man wearing long dark shorts, a white-black-and-gray striped tank top, and a black-colored baseball cap entered Cam Pascale's City Heights home — uninvited.

"This is where he came in," Pascale said to me, "and I'm positive the gate outside was shut."

She opened and closed the metal door that bears a sign that read "we don't call 911" and a depiction of a gun.

"I don't own a gun," Pascale continued.
"[Now] I'm going to get a gun, definitely. This
was the deciding factor. I will shoot in a second
now. I am not going to hesitate, so don't come
into my house."

On May 14, Pascale and I spoke inside her home, within walking distance from the Tower Bar on University Avenue, about four miles south of the I-8 and a mile east of the I-15.

She walked me through her home and showed me the two cameras that captured the "home invasion" that Sunday night.

"I'm coming out of my room, and he's like this," she explained as she dropped down to the floor in front of her daughter's room. (For this article, I changed her 14-year-old daughter's name to Stephanie.)

"Stephanie is sitting right there on her computer, and she's oblivious to what's happening while he's crouched down right here."

Stephanie's door is about 15 feet away from the front door. The kitchen separates Stephanie's and Pascale's rooms that are about 12 feet apart.

Pascale is depicted on video coming out of her bedroom; she stopped in her tracks a second or two after.

"What the fuck, who are you?" Pascale yelled at the intruder in the video. ".... why are you here?"

The trespasser approached Pascale and blurted something inaudible, grabbed his stomach, and bent over.

"Can you head out, please, head out of the house now," Pascale said to the intruder on the video, which she showed me on her cellphone.

"And I had a hammer right there [by Stephanie's door]," she explained to me, "and I'm thinking my taser's outside. All this stuff's going on in my head."

"When he was bent down, I saw he had something wrapped around his knee and thigh area."

"Like an electric gadget?" I asked her.

"Maybe," she replied, "it was up by his thigh under his shorts. It could've been a weapon, that's what Stephanie thought. My eyes aren't that great, hers are much better. I just wanted him outside of the house."

The living room camera then captured the intruder, who appeared to be about 5 foot 7 inches and weighed around 145 pounds. He was





Climb Laguna, Cuyamaca, **Palomar for best** wildflowers

Wildflowers of San Diego County's highest mountains are in full bloom this week. Take a walk along any trail above 4500 feet in the Laguna, Cuyamaca, or Palomar Mountains and enjoy a palette of colors ranging from crimson red to indigo blue. Among the most common varieties are lupine (blue, occasionally yellow), wallflower (yellow), paintbrush (red), scarlet bugler (red), beard tongue (bluepurple), checker (lavender), woolly blue curls (violet), forgetme-not (white), wild hyacinth (purple), and yarrow (yellow and white).

Mule Deer by the dozens continue to roam through the 25,000- acre Cuyamaca Rancho State Park. Take an early-morning drive down Highway 79 through the park, and you'll likely spot deer on or near the road.

Agaves, or century plants (Agave americana), have been sending up their asparagus-like flower stalks all over the San Diego area lately. In warm weather, the tips can rise as much as a foot a day. During summer big clusters of yellow and green flowers should appear on the tops of the stalks, some up to 30 feet tall. After the blooming cycle ends, the spine-tipped, fleshy daggers at the base of the stalk die (after a life of 10 or 20 years, not a century) and the stalk dries up, but suckers usually

remain to continue a new cycle of growth, flowering, seed production, and death. The smaller desert agaves (Agave deserti), which are native to the western edge of the Anza-Borrego Desert, are now finishing their blooming cycle.

Oleander bushes, now beginning to bloom in gardens and along roadsides in the interior valleys and desert, will continue putting on a good show through the summer. Good displays of white, pink, and red varieties can be seen along the medians of Interstate 8 in east El Cajon and along Interstates 5 and 15 in parts of North County. Oleander's toxic characteristics are well-known: all parts of it are poisonous if ingested.

She began to ask me why I thought that, and why there is a God. I though, "Wait a minute, aren't you supposed to be helping me?" It was very clear to me that in my suffering, God was present and gave me a clear example of how someone

else - the social worker had gone through a very painful time, and I was able to help her. "Well, this stinks," I thought. "This is not what I really expected, but I'm so grateful." Your Own Ending" stories. We choose. C.S. Lewis wrote about it in The Great Divorce. Who we are now we will more fully become. If we choose to turn our backs on God, we will more fully be turned away from God. If we choose to turn toward God, we will see more fully. In I Corinthi-

ans it says we see now in a mirror, and then face to face. For those who reject God, I can't see what they see, but I wish they could see what I see. It goes back to Pascal's Wager: If there is no God and you don't believe - no loss. If there is no God and you believe - no loss. If there is a God and you believe - no loss, only gain. But if there is a God and you don't believe - all is lost. I can decide for me how I'm going to take that wager, but I don't get to decide for anyone else what their bet is.

Anonymous women reveal misogyny in San Diego beer

"These stories are not mine and I do not vouch for their accuracy."

That was the all-caps message in the Instagram bio of East Coast craft brewer Brienne Allan, as she used the platform to share firsthand accounts about women enduring harassment while working in the beer industry. Though Allan (using her @ratmagnet handle on Instagram) protected the anonymity of her sources, many of the women themselves named names.

The posts went viral, and hundreds more inflammatory testimonies poured in from across the U.S.0000 and elsewhere. It received national news coverage and inspired local coverage. Perhaps nowhere more than San Diego.

"Worked at a brewery in San Diego where the regulars constantly grabbed and harassed all the female beertending staff," wrote one account.

"Myself and other female coworkers have brought up inappropriate behavior," writes one, "and all you get told is, 'This is just how the industry is."

"Everything was great until I became pregnant," writes a former employee of one of San Diego's largest breweries. "I was treated horribly by someone... when I reported this to my COO and boss, my job was instantly cut in half... shortly after I was pushed out entirely because my complaint marked me as a liability."

One man was described simply as "problematic." Others were said to make racist or sexist comments; grope female coworkers, employees, or customers; physically abuse domestic partners; or commit violent sexual assault. "Worked at another brewery in San Diego where the sales rep sent pictures of his dick to all the female staff."

Another woman claimed a co-worker "grabbed my crotch, and told me he wished he wasn't married and could fuck me." They got more violent from there. "I was also assaulted in my own apartment," said one of a popular bartender. "I woke up to his hands in my pants."

While on the job with a fellow bar-

tender — now a bar owner — a woman recounts: "He grabbed both of my wrists tight and held them up above my head saying, 'I will fucking end you if you try to tell me what to do ever again." In a separate post, the same bar owner was rather graphically accused of attempted rape.

In another post, a local brewer is accused of having raped two teenage girls on the same night.

I'm choosing not to report the names or businesses of the accused, here. Many of them are

men well known to members and fans of local beer. I have personally interviewed several for this column. But I'm not doing any favors, nor keeping any secrets by omitting them: Their names are out there, attached to serious accusations. Jobs have already been lost. Some businesses will likely see steep losses. Careers may be ruined, as well as friendships and potentially marriages. I couldn't provide anyone cover if I wanted to.

Whether you choose to believe every woman, or cast skeptical eye, there's this: a human being

cannot spend hours reading the @ratmagnet stories and not come away resolved to be better than the men it describes.

Public golf course with sliders

his is our sport," says Annie, "and don't you Sassenachs forget it." Did I mention? My friend Annie is

Scottish. "Sassenachs" ("Saxons") basically means anyone who's not Scottish.

We're standing at the entrance to the Coronado Golf Club, the one with the terrific glass mural of a woman golfer whacking a ball to the sun.

This is a public course, so anyone can come in, hire gear, play. More important from my point of view, you can eat at their eatery, the "Feast and Fareway" (their spelling!), and as of just recently,

they have brought their Happy Hour back, postcovid. And things are cheap, compared to the rest of this Admirals' playground, anyway.

Sun's heading for Hawaii as we come to the $\,$

inside-outside restaurant space. I'm surprised at how crowded it is. This is a weekday. Happy Hour has only started half an hour ago. But in

> the groups, there's the energy of people who have just been in some major activity. They're talking loudly in groups, laughing a lot.

This is when I spot these two gents at a table, just outside. "The Bo Tour," a poster says. "A professional golf mini tour." It costs \$680

to enter, but you can win up to \$5,000. Huh. Not on the cards for me. I wouldn't know a rough from a green.

But Annie's waiting. I catch her up on the ginormous patio. It looks out across greens and eucalyptus and palms to the blue of the bay with its spiky lines of gray navy ships on the other side. On this side, in the greens, you see players zipping around in their olive green club carts and - whu?? - golf bags on wheels driving themselves in front of their owners as they stroll to the next tee. Annie sees my face. "Shows how long since you've been on a golf course," she says.

"Guess so," I say.

We sit down at an outside table.

Annie's already looking at the online menu. Honestly, it's not bad, for a classy golf club. Breakfast dishes are mostly in the teens. Like, shrimp and cheesy grits with three eggs runs \$15. Steak and eggs with potatoes, \$16. Omelets are \$13. Regular meals such as fish and chips are \$12, cheeseburger's \$12, and maybe the most interesting, the truffle burger, with angus beef, tomato jam, portobello mushroom, candied bacon, white truffle cheese, and a sunny side up egg. It runs \$16.

But Annie's in full bargain-hunting mode. "They'd better have this happy hour," she says. Actually, both of us are a bit strapped.

But no worries. Breanna turns up with an HH menu. Chicken wings are \$8, salmon salad (with capers and quail egg) is the most expensive at \$12, garlic or truffle fries are cheapest at \$4, followed by fried calamari at \$6. Then, we're looking at BBQ bacon cheddar sliders (\$9), two fish tacos for \$7, a couple of salads - arugula/crispy goat (with sweet

goat cheese croquettes) for \$10, and the farm salad with spinach, tangerine, and beets, for \$8.

Hmm. Annie goes for the fish tacos - and I go for the nachos, because they've got chicken in them. Plus, we decide to share the arugula and crispy goat salad, just to get something healthy down. I also order a \$6 Coronado Brewing Orange Wit, even though I could have had a Coors or Bud Light for \$4. Annie gets a sauvignon blanc for \$8.

"Bucolic!" says Annie.

"Maybe you, not me," I say.

"Bucolic, not alcoholic," she says. "You are such a peasant."

Have to say it is great, eating out here, with the bay and all this greenery surrounding us. The gastro-champs of the day are the nachos and the fish tacos. Annie gives me half a taco and the fish is crisp, tender, in tasty mustard-battered cod, helped by the cilantro cream sauce, and at \$3.50 each, not a bad deal.

And, surprisingly for me, the nachos turn out to be great too. For starters, with so many big chunks of chicken, these crispy babies are filling. But also great on the taste buds. Black beans, cheese, and red and green sauce add to the flavors, as well as sour cream and guac. And a good chile kick in there too.

So the reason there are all these pumped people at this time of day is they're part of the Bo Tour, a kind of mini PGA contest.

"My favorite?" says Steve "Bo" Boveri, who, turns out, runs the BoTour pro golf tour, and has eaten here many times. I have just asked what food he likes best here. He's a burly fellow with a shining gold tooth, a "Cabo" hat, a Hawaiian shirt,

Have to ask how this golf tournament has been going in this last covid year. "Well, I have just had my best year ever," Bo says. "And it's thanks to covid! People are getting out and playing golf more than ever. Why? Fresh air! Space. They have discovered the golf course! Just like they did 100 years ago. They can breathe safely out here. And golf is not a team sport."

Huh. Good point.

"Wanna try?" I say to Annie.

"As I said, you Sassenachs took this sport we invented," she says. "But sure. We'll meet here, rent the gear. Expect no mercy!"

Weapon Ramen + Chirashi (and okonomiyaki)

Weapon Ramen, Liberty Public Market; 2820 Historic Decatur Road, Liberty Station. Masks on, because I'm pretty sure this is what the CDC

was talking about when it said vaccinated people could uncover in public spaces, *except in crowded settings*. It's Saturday afternoon, and Liberty Station is looking fairly close to normal: parking lots close to full, traffic building to get in or out, and people everywhere.

Especially in and around the Liberty Public Market. Packing a collection of food vendors under one roof didn't create the most conducive environment for a pandemic, and I witnessed some pretty thin attendance here over the course of last year. But now, on a sunny Saturday, its halls are teeming, hungry eyes peering out over every masked face, in search of tables opening up

Quite a few of these guests are lining up for Nashville hot chicken at Fluster Cluck, but I'm here to visit the booth next door, which used to be a RakiRaki Ramen counter. It's not anymore, but there's still ramen to be found: Weapon Ramen.

on either of the Market's two dining patios.

Despite the name, the new food stall will do no damage to this city's fondness for ramen. Its OG Tonkotsu ramen (\$14) delivers an impeccable rendition of the crowd-pleasing Hakata-style, with thin noodles in pork bone broth, topped with menma (bamboo shoots), kikurage (wood-ear mushrooms), negi (scallions), and chashu (pork belly). There are also chicken bone and vegetarian options, and for \$2.50 you may add a "butter bomb" to blast any broth with additional miso, sesame, spice, or fermented black garlic flavor.

But wait! you say. Ramen is fine, but San Diego is crazy about hot chicken now. Do you see the line?

Yes, yes, ramen has been popular for a while, and Nashville hot chicken is the shiny new toy of San Diego feeders. But my top reason for checking out Weapon is the chef behind the broth: Phillip Esteban.

Chef Esteban's very active 2020 saw him A) win an episode of the TV cooking competition *Chopped*, and B) help feed food insecure San Diegans to the tune of a quarter million meals. He did the latter on the success of his Filipino delivery concept, White Rice, which is slated to open within Liberty Public Market this year.

Given RakiRaki only closed recently, it's kind of amazing that Esteban managed to open Weapon Ramen so quickly. But having spoken with the former Consortium Holdings R chef (disclosure: I know the guy), I know he's got no shortage of influences and ideas, and has a pocketful of restaurant ideas.

Apparently, he had already developed a Japanese restaurant menu in that pocket, one that's faithful both to the spirit and palate of Japanese cuisine. And there's more to it than ramen. Indeed, there's a lot worth exploring here when you look past the noodles at the top of Weapon's menu.

An example for all you fried-chicken heads out

there: Japanese fried chicken, karaage is finding a moment. You'll find that here, along with sandwich featuring the fried chicken filet, katsu.

Better yet, take a look at the chirashi menu. These rice bowls topped by fish go for \$14-15 apiece, and often highlight San Diego fresh catch seafood. The signature bowl may include crab, rock fish, and more; and a second bowl combines linecaught albacore with spicy tuna and smoked trout roe. But I can't resist a good miso marinated black cod, and find it here over a bowl of sushi rice, and dressed with pickled radish, cucumber, roe, and shredded seaweed.

As captivated as we are

with this chirashi, perhaps my favorite Weapon Ramen find is a dish less common to San Diego: okonomiyaki. This is a savory Japanese pancake made with eggs and cabbage, typically topped with scallions, bonita flakes, and a mix of sweet and savory sauces. Here, it's all that, plus hunks of that chashu pork belly.

I'm thrilled to find it on a menu, and even happier when I sink my teeth into the perfectly executed pancake, which lands somewhere between fluffy omelet and thick crepe. The layering of flavors is so good, I momentarily forget about ramen, hot chicken, and much else other than ordering another.

If a savory pancakes could possibly start a trend, this would be the one do it. Though, I suppose Weapon Okonomiyaki doesn't have quite the same ring to it.

Deli Belly wasn't supposed to be interesting

Deli Belly; 8396 Parkway Dr., La Mesa. There aren't too many exciting things that can be said about sandwich shops these days. Most of them carry one of two or three deli meat suppliers — usually Boar's Head or Dietz & Watson — and come up with a menu of sandwiches built off more or less the same assortment of cheese, condiment, and vegetable toppings. At times, the choice of bread makes a difference, but ultimately such shops have what we might call high floor, and a low ceiling. Meaning, it's tough to make bad sandwiches with good deli meats, but they can only be good to a point.

So, when I found myself ordering from a shop in La Mesa, called Deli Belly, which uses Boar's head meats, I didn't think too much about it. Until I

ate the sandwich. Though hungry, I was in kind of a hurry, and didn't expect to notice the simple nourishment I was shoveling into my gullet. But the steamed pastrami and corned beef on a toasted onion roll (\$10) forced me to stop, take notice, and enjoy myself. More

than I thought I would. When I looked closer, I learned Deli belly is a growing chain of East County sandwich shops that started nearly eight years ago with a modest location on Jamacha Road, in the Rancho San Diego neighborhood of El Cajon. This La Mesa location was the latest to open - sometime around the New Year — but there's a shop in Lakeside and another coming soon to Santee.

Given my enjoyment of that FA sandwich, as it was called, I can understand why the "New York style deli" brand has been growing. But I was still struggling to figure out what made my sandwich so good. I've had Boar's Head pastrami before, but didn't remember liking it this much. And that was the brisket cut pastrami; Deli Belly uses the — arguably less sexy top round pastrami. Same with the corned beef.

Near as I could figure, two things put this sandwich over the top, the first being a thick serving of meat. Though very thin, the pastrami and corned beef slices were piled high. Higher than most California delis, which don't seem to understand that these kinds of smoked and cured beef demand thick portions, so the spicy beef can continue to dominate despite the assertive flavors they're usually pitted against: from the likes of pickles, mustard, sauerkraut, onion rolls or rye bread.

The Double New Yorkers: a pile of steam pastrami with havarti, provolone, pickles, mus-

The second key to my sandwich was steamed meat. The great Jewish delis of New York and Los Angeles steam their pastramis to make them hot and tender on a sandwich, and while Deli Belly may not smoke its own pastrami, steaming that Boar's Head gives it a bigger, more sultry profile than I thought you could get, off the rack.

I decided to check out the original, Rancho location, just to be sure I hadn't imagined everything. This time I ordered from the \$12, premium sandwich menu, selecting the Double New Yorker: steamed pastrami with both Havarti and provolone cheese, pickles, mustard, and thousand island dressing on toasted rye. Much closer to the celebrated New York sandwiches that inspired it, for this one, the pastrami was stacked even thicker, with no tomatoes or onions to get in its way. Another success!

And once again, steaming the pastrami made a big difference. Though I think, if I really try to put my finger on

why Deli Belly has progressed to the point of growing East County brand, it's even simpler than steamed meat. It's just trying to get the best out of each sandwich.

"Groundswell Corduroy is a low-temperature variant of surf-rock," he says, "the teen effervescence long gone, but it is ocean music nevertheless. A new single and video from the Color Forty Nine dropped for "String Ladder." According to Phil Beaumont, "The video is a collaboration with Chris Wassell and Lianne Mueller [Ship in the Woods]. I went down a number months ago to Chris' house in Tijuana and asked him to make a painting for the various lines of the song. We discussed the lyrics in general and then, with a glass of mezcal by our sides, he would paint a panel while I sang the song acoustically to him. In the four minutes or so of the song, he would be done with the painting and it was on to the next. By 3 am, we had 15 paintings. We then passed these along to Lianne who set about plucking

elements from each drawing and animating them, creating an abstract narrative that threads the viewer through each painting." Their upcoming seven-song EP, due July 23, includes "What Would I Know? Yo que sé?," featuring famed Cafe Tacvba singer Rubén Albarrán. The video was animated by Hugo Crosthwaite, who won the Smithsonian National Portrait Gallery prize in 2019 for Portrait of Berenice Sarmiento Ortiz. "Without knowing him personally, I reached out and presented the song in hopes of collaboration. By the end of one weekend, we had spoken and he came up with a plan for the video. He spent the next three months drawing and animating."



WANTED NOISE

Pop-punk island rockers Wanted Noise just dropped two new singles, "Go Get," and "More Sunrises," previewing their upcoming album Next Generation. The video for "More Sunrises," directed and edited by Jeff Dirdack, features the band skateboarding around San Diego in search of beer. According to singer-guitarist Caleb Adkins, "The concept for this video came from a day in the life of the Wanted Noise crew. In the making of this video, we camped out for the weekend at our drummer's pad in Leucadia, with the whole band plus director-producer Jeff and director of photography Pat. It was a blast, bombing hills with Taylor riding sitting

on a cooler on a longboard, skating through North County neighborhoods, and rocking out on the beach. Everywhere we went, people were stoked and asking us about Wanted Noise. We chose to make our drummer Taylor [Wagner] the starring character, since drummers need love too. Inspiration for the song 'More Sunrises' came after Jin [Salamack, bassist] and I made a guick trip south from Santa Barbara back to San Diego, just before sunup. After playing an epic show, we were stoked on life and looking to personify the idea of recognizing the great times in life, in a ripping posi-


Born in San Francisco and raised in San Rafael, Slightly Stoopid drummer Rymo (Ryan Moran) was bitten by the music bug shortly after his 10th birthday, citing John Bonham and Neil Peart as particularly influential. After earning a scholarship to the Berklee College of Music in 1993 for their five-week summer program, he attended SDSU beginning in late 1994 until 2000, when he earned his BA in Music. He's been a full-time member of Slightly Stoopid since 2003 and his YouTube channel Rymostoopid has over 60 drum lessons posted and more than a million views. He just released a solo album called *Kinetic*, preceded by

singles for the title track and "Skooby Snax." Guest players include celebrity bassist Tony Levin (Peter Gabriel, ABWH, Pink Floyd, King Crimson) and YouTube guitar sensation Marty Schwartz. Local Chapman Stick player Tom Griesgraber helped record, produce, perform, and engineer the album. Also contributing are members of Slightly Stoopid, and film composer Farzam Salami added Middle Eastern percussion and stringed instruments on several tracks. Signed to major label Warner Records, Bassett was only 16 years old in 2020 when he released his first original songs. "Common Sense" and "Anvone Else." which within a year had together earned over 20 million streams. How long will the Rady Shell last?

The opening of the Rady Shell at the Jacobs Park featuring performances on the Una Davis Family Stage is imminent. As one might surmise from all the titles surrounding the Shell project, the San Diego Symphony has been hard at work on their comprehensive funding campaign entitled "The Future is Hear."

The symphony has raised \$98.7 million toward a goal of \$125 million. Those funds were raised privately and now The Future is Hear campaign is entering its public phase.

Those giving \$10,000 or more will receive recognition on the donor appreciation wall at the Shell venue. The amounts raised prior to this public appeal were \$15 million from Ernest and Evelyn Rady, \$15 million from the Conrad Prebys Foundation, \$11 million from Joan and Irwin Jacobs, and \$10 million from Una Davis.

The extent of the funding reminded me of a pick-up truck I saw the other day. The truck was for a business with the name Haffner. The f's were written as if they were forte markings in a musical score.

I pointed it out to my kids and gave them the dad trivia for the day. I explained that the musical reference was to Mozart's Haffner Symphony and Haffner Serenade.


Who were the Haffners? They were a Salzburg family of some means who happened to know Mozart. Now, 250 years later, they

live on in posterity because they happened to associate themselves with one of the immortals.

Will the Rady Shell last for 250 years? Probably not, but it could make it to 50 years or mavbe even a 100.

Avery Fisher donated \$10 million in 1973 dollars to the New York Philharmonic and the concert hall was named in his honor for about 40 years. In 2014 the Philharmonic received permission from the Fisher family to sell the naming rights to the highest bidder. The concert hall became David Geffen Hall after he gave \$100 million.

Dorothy Chandler Pavilion has been so named since 1964. Chandler

headed a campaign that raised \$19 million for the construction of the arts center. Now Disney Hall is a part of the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion. Anytime anyone trumps Mickey Mouse, it's a significant accomplishment.

Severance Hall in Cleveland has been named after

Elizabeth and John Severance since their \$1 million gift in 1931. Of course, there's also Carnegie Hall which was built in 1891 by Andrew Carnegie with funds from the fortune he amassed in the steel industry.

The point is that fortunes come and go but the arts, so far as I can tell, go on forever.

A North Hollywood outside of time

MOVIES

orth Hollywood arrives with the tagline: The first ever movie about becoming a pro skater. Sonja Henie and *I, Tonya* to the contrary, for the sake of argument the profession referred to in the catchphrase is that of a sk8er. Whether or not the slogan is accurate is beside the point. First time director Mikey Alfred's dis-

tinctively captivating coming-of-age drama (with strong comedic

leanings) is such that the thought of fact checking will be the furthest thing from your mind.

Michael (Ryder McLaughlin, a blonde Buscemi) will never be the son his dad Oliver (Vince Vaughn, never better) wants him to be, but left alone, the boy might just turn out to be a pretty cool, fully functioning contributor to society. We all have a family member like Oliver, a know-it-all whose mantra is, "You're doing it wrong!" His knowledge extends to everything from tucking the shower curtain inside the bathtub to the horror of propping a skateboard up against the wall. (The wheels leave little black marks.) All Michael wants to prove is the possibility of becoming a fierce skater while attending college. That, and winning the heart of his high school crush, Rachel (Miranda Cosgrove). While serving as an altar boy, Michael finds it impossible to place the holy wafer in Rachel's mouth. Michael is grossed out at Rachel taking a swig from his single-use plastic water bottle. His method of "waterfall" - tilting his head back while cascading the liquid into his mouth — is a quick fix. An inexperienced Michael will soon learn that nothing cures this strain of germophobia quicker than an open-mouthed kiss.

Like most recently graduated teenagers, Michael has a posse of his own to hang with. Jay (Nico Hiraga) is a charismatic nutjob who also sees the potential of mixing skating with studies. Practical Adolf (Aramis Hudson) finds no shame in leaving high school and his board behind to work construction. (After Hitler, didn't the spelling of "Adolf" forever lose the 'f' in favor of a "ph?) At the outset, Jay's lighthearted antics, most notably a stop at the Galleria to pinch a board, are given more screen time. It's only after Michael begins questioning his friend's devotion to street skating that his relationship with Adolf takes center stage. The feelings of abandonment Adolf experiences when Michael trades in their friendship for a chance to hang with local legends Noah (Bob Worrest) and Isiah (Tyshawn Jones) should act as a memory-rattling reminder of youth's vulnerability and resilience.

No matter how dense (stoned?) they may be, Alfred instills in his secondary characters enough personality to make them standout. Take Walker, a NoHo burnout tight with Nolan and Isiah. Michael courts buddyhood looking to score an introduction even though he talks smack behind Walker's back. The guy whom Michael describes as "a bum

from the neighborhood" is the only one willing to bring the novice up to

speed on the politics of skating. He sagaciously hints that many a man who tried to turn pro generally wound up working in a skate park pro-shop. Michael fears that his friends might embarrass him in front of his newfound mentors when in fact it's Walker who accuses Michael of making him look bad.

The time is clearly present day, something Alfred's seamless flair for blurring decades steadfastly refuses to acknowledge. The fashions scream, "Where were you in '62?" And are there still homes in North Hollywood in which the main form of communication with the outside world is via landline? Even the location work is a blast from the past. Rather than showing off NoHo's spruced up art district, Alfed instead pays visits to such venerable neighborhood staples as Circus Liquors and Burbank's Bob's Big Boy. Perhaps the greatest example of his desire to imbue a touch of timelessness is through his unique choice of preexisting songs that embody his soundtrack. If the goal was to construct an American Graffiti (with a dash of Heaven Help Us) for his generation, Alfred did one hell of a job curating the incidental music.

The film glides along at its own pace.
The boldness comes from Alfred's skill at cherry-picking life's telling moments, stripping away the boring parts, and creating characters and situations humbly drawn from life. Available on Amazon Prime, Vudu, Google Play, etc. ***

Riders of Justice — Mads. It's not only our star Mr. Mikkelsen's first name, but a perfect description of what his character Markus is left with a mean case of after a trio of math geeks — statistical engineer Otto (Nikolaj Lie Kaas), expert computer hacker Lennart (Lars Brygmann), and Emmenthaler (Nicolas Bro), the 400 lb guy sitting on his bed that Trump prophesied — show up at his door with shocking news. It wasn't the fault of fate that caused the accident.

The passenger train crash his wife and daughter were involved in that claimed the latter's life was staged to take out a member of the titular motorcycle gang en route to turn state's evidence. Why seek the services of a crisis psychologist as teenage daughter Mathilde (Andrea Heick Gadeberg) pleads when Markus, a soldier with a passion for violence, can manage his volatile temper by taking it out on everyone he comes across? If none of the above sounds even vaguely amusing give it a reel and you'll be convulsed with laughter. That's precisely the joy of this movie: at any given moment you never know in what direction the plot's bound to twist. Even more gratifying is how much we begin to feel for these characters even as the bodies mount. The one major coincidence arrives well into the picture. By that time, we are so invested in the characters and writer-director Anders Thomas Jensen's ability to keep us guessing that it doesn't matter. At a cost of \$5 million, this Danish indie puts its American counterparts to shame. 2020. ★★★★ S.M. (Now playing at the Angelika Film Center and Landmark Hillcrest.)

SAS: Red Notice — Psychopaths are incapable of love, so says William Lewis (Tom Wilkison), madman and father to a pair of likewise pernicious offspring: Grace (Ruby Rose, achieving cool clarity as daddy's little two-legged slaughterhouse) and her unpolished, but nonetheless inhuman brother Oliver (Owain Yeoman). Together they're the Black Swans, a family owned and operated military company recognized for a string of crimes against humanity committed in the Republic of Georgia. Wilkinson lends name recognition in exchange for a short work schedule and juicy death scene at the hands of military contract killer, George Clements (Andy Serkis). On the side of good stands Sam Heughan (Tom Buckingham), a Special

Forces operative who loves to kill more than he does Dr. Sophie Hart (Hannah John-Kamen), the woman he's about to propose to once the train deposits the couple in Paris. That is until the Black Swans board the EuroStar. Next stop: an action-packed hijacking that's surprisingly steeped in drollery. ("Be famous, not dead" is the advice given to hostages; those willing to play along will have a grand story to shop around.) One could have done without the cliche-toned score and wouldn't it be nice if just once, the bad guys were astute enough to go about

their nefarious business without the aid of a slick-fashioned inside man, make that inside men, to bring an element of foreseen surprise. Halfway through, visions of two diverse, yet thoroughly valid endings began to bubble: either the psychopaths find love together or Tom finds the psychopath in Sophie. Without giving anything away, I was close. But nothing that came before it prepared me for the remarkable closing credit shot. Bravo to director Magnus Martens! 2021. This week's offerings include a trio of documentaries that range in subject from the history of everyone's favorite curse word, Miami's cocaine cartel, and this, a cautionary fable for the marginally talented among us who think they have what it takes to make it in Hollywood. As if the poster's graphics — artist's renderings of indie monarchs George Romero, Dick Miller, Sid Haig, Larry Cohen, Tom Savini, and more — weren't inducement enough, the accompanying paragraph spoke of a "currently over-crowded marketplace" and how this documentary would "serve as a survival guide for the

modern independent filmmaker." Nowhere does it mention, "Vanity production by Justin McConnell who appears to have spent fifteen years in a sub semi-pro capacity trying to emulate schlock that came before him." We spend 5 years in McConnell's life, following him from festival to festival and one dashed deal after another, as he tries desperately to crack the mainstream. There is much to be learned from many of the illustrious and less distinguished talking heads participants. McConnell should have heeded the sagacious advice of Buddy Giovinazzo (Life is Hot in Cracktown, A Night of Nightmares): "If a director says to himself, 'I've seen this scene a hundred times... do something different."" What McConnell has to show for him can at best be described as derivative. What the film has to say about the current state distribution is the stuff gerd is made of. Available on Arrow Video.





Gaming the System

 In Taiwan, where companies are required to give newlyweds eight days of paid leave, an unnamed bank employee in Taipei used a loophole in the law to claim 32 days of leave over 37 days last year, reported Agence France-Presse on April 21. The man and his wife got married four times and divorced three times, claiming eight days of leave for each wedding. The bank complained to the city labor department, which sided with the employee and fined the bank about \$670 for violating the regulation, sparking public criticism. The labor department later revoked the fine "to recognize a mistake and improve," it said.

Jungle Justice

- A man suspected of poaching rhinos in South Africa's Kruger National Park was trampled to death by a herd of elephants on April 17, according to park authorities. Managing Executive Gareth Coleman praised the park's "successful weekend in the fight to keep our rhinos alive" as rangers arrested five suspects, carrying hunting rifles and an ax, in a continuing crackdown on poaching, reported The Washington Post. (BONUS: A skull and a pair of pants were all that remained of a suspected poacher killed by an elephant and eaten by lions in the park in 2019.)

Awesome!

- Police in the Hradec Kralove region of the Czech Republic were stunned when a man turned in a Soviet T-34 tank and an

SD-100 artillery gun as part of a nationwide weapons amnesty program designed to legalize guns that had not been registered. Prague Morning reported on April 10 that the man was a collector of historic weaponry and has owned the 1950s-era tank, which had been painted pink, since the 1990s. Authorities checked the tank and gun to confirm they have been properly deactivated, and the man was allowed to keep them in his collection. The amnesty campaign continues until July.

Opportunity Knocked

- Kelyn Spadoni, 33, of Harvey, Louisiana, was fired from her job as a dispatcher for the Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office after she was arrested on April 7 and accused of refusing to return more than \$1.2 million mistakenly deposited in her brokerage account by Charles Schwab & Co., said sheriff's office spokesman Capt. Jason Rivarde. According to a lawsuit filed in U.S. District Court in New Orleans, Schwab meant to transfer \$82.56 into Spadoni's account in February, but instead transferred \$1,205,619; when Schwab tried to correct the error the next day, it was told the funds were not available. NOLA.com reported Spadoni is suspected of moving the money and using some of it to buy a new house and an SUV, but authorities have been able to recover about 75% of the money, according to Rivarde.

Canine Chronicles

- Newsweek reported a dog lover in Hobbs, New Mexico, who identifies himself

as girthbrooks1994 on TikTok, couldn't figure out why the English bulldog he'd been given didn't respond to any of the commands he gave it until he tried something different - Spanish. Now named Senor Snax, the dog is shown on posted videos readily obeying commands such as "dame la mano" and "sientate" ("give me your hand" and "sit down"). "He's a bien boy and very spoiled," says the proud owner.

Bright Idea

- Nathan Finkel called 911 on April 17 to report that Courtney Wilson and another person showed up at the gate of his expansive mansion in suburban Fort Lauderdale, Florida, claiming that they were having a wedding there that day. "I have people trespassing on my property," Finkel said. "They say they're having a wedding here and it's God's message. I don't know what's going on." According to the South Florida Sun Sentinel, Wilson, the groom, had inquired about buying the estate, listed for \$5.7 million, several weeks ago, then asked Finkel if he could use the backyard for his wedding. Finkel said no, but Wilson and his betrothed, Shenita Iones, sent out online invitations anyway, with festivities beginning at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday and continuing through brunch on Sunday at what they called "the Wilson estate." "The guy figured it was a vacant house and didn't realize (Finkel) lived on the property in a different home," explained Town Attorney Keith Poliakoff. Wilson was told to vacate the property and was not charged with a crime.

- A Blount County (Tennessee) Sheriff's deputy was dispatched to a Dollar General store in Maryville on April 5 after a clerk was presented with a \$1 million bill, The Smoking Gun reported. The video then ends. Pascale said she closed and locked the door and called 911. Another video, which contained part of her phone communication with the dispatcher, was posted on the NextDoor app.

"The lady next door came over the next day, and she's like 'I saw him sitting out on your chair outside,' and it had to be before the cops came here."

"How long did it take for the police to arrive?" I asked.

"Not too long, that's a good thing. I only saw one cop with a flashlight. We heard him talking outside so I walk out there, and the guy's upstairs, they found him at the duplex behind me. The cop is like, 'so you were just on her porch, right?' and I'm like 'no he wasn't, he was in my house,' and he was like, 'you go back inside.' Then ten minutes later, he [the policeman] never came back, and Stephanie said 'the cop car's gone."

"What happened to the perp?" I asked.

ment to act as the agent for the owner of private property for purposes of enforcing laws against any person(s) found on the property without the owner's consent or without lawful purpose In conjunction with this form, a sign must be posted on the property indicating: a Letter of Agency has been filed with the San Diego Police Department; the address of the property; the words "No Trespassing"; and who the property is managed by and/or who to call to report problems or concerns. The sign should be no less than 18"x24", ideally have a font legible from the nearest public street, and not be readily accessible to vandals. Signs should be evenly

spaced throughout the surrounding property boundaries covered by the Letter of Agency." MIKE MADRIAGA

Despots at the Depot? Police chase workers from spot near store

Outside Home Depot on Via Rapida in Tijuana, construction workers offer their services to Home Depot customers. Most of

them are older and not eligible for most jobs offered by the city. Eduardo Morales, 48, came to Tijuana more than 20 years ago. Recently, he got a one-day job that made him the same money — 1800 pesos (\$90USD) — that he would have made working for a week in a factory, the most common job found in Tijuana. But there are difficulties. The spot where he waits for customers is next to Tijuana's river pipelines, where drug addicts have settled and steal equipment. "I know those of us

and then they come to bother us." Jose Luis, 61, tells a similar story. Luis used to cross the border and offer his work at the Home Depot on Palm Avenue in Imperial Beach. But since the travel restrictions have been in place, he has struggled to cross — even though he keeps a 619 cell phone number. He used to earn \$150 USD a day. "I used to cross every 15 days, and that was enough for me to live in Tijuana." He regrets not saving his






