Flaming a fan

While the rest of the journalistic world is at least finally acknowledging that there is more to Woody Allen than meets the public eye, Scott Marks is penning God's blessings to the "hilarious" filmmaker in an article this week ("Woody Allen's PBS mockumentary," Movies@ Home, June 4).

An argument could be made that Mr. Marks simply writes about art without concerning himself over the private lives of the artists. That's fair; however, the argument fails to hold water when you read his response to a reader who can't as easily suspend disbelief when it comes to the controversial celebrity. Rather than responding that his piece is strictly about Allen's work, and not his personal issues, in his comment, Mr. Marks defends Woody Allen. He goes as far as to declare Allen's

innocence with a conviction that would suggest he has stood within six inches of the man, unblinking, since Allen came of age in 1953. "When last I checked, Allen has never been charged with a crime. He's a lot of things, but a child molester isn't one of them."

I would like to suggest that Mr. Marks take a few moments to research child molesters and the percentage of them that actually get charged with their crimes, so he can better understand the ignorance of his statement. He might also consider researching how many Catholic priests have been criminally charged with child molestation, or how many have served time in prison. Are the vast majority of priests accused of molesting children innocent as well?

Mr. Marks is free to believe that Woody Allen isn't a child molester. He may prefer to ignore the mounting evidence against Allen, and keep hero worshipping him in his writing. However, it is an insult to the 42 million+ survivors of sexual abuse in the United States for Mr. Marks to state definitively. even in a comment, that a man he doesn't know, who has been credibly accused of raping a seven-year-old, is not a child molester. Not only is there evidence, eyewitness testimony and expert opinion to the contrary, the reality is that pedophiles don't typically invite audiences to their crimes, rendering the vast majority of cases he said, child said. (That reality favors the perpetrator 100% of the time, by the way).

Unless Mr. Marks had a front row seat in the attic with Woody and Dylan, I'm not sure where his decisiveness over Allen's innocence comes from. Surely not from the fact that Allen is a beloved celebrity; after all, if "men of God" are capable of living the double life required to violate chilcontinued on page 4


San Diego's vast park system has fallen from a top spot in a national ranking study due to a new factor used in 2021: equity. Every year since 2009, the Trust for Public Land has been geeking out about the nation's largest city park systems, even drilling down to factors like the location of park entrances and physical obstacles to access, such as roads and rivers. The goal is "to ensure there's a park within a 10-minute walk of home" for everyone in

high income neighborhoods, considering per capita park space and 10-minute-walk park access.

To obtain a high score like those of Washington, D.C. or St. Paul, Minnesota,



America. (Besides equity and access, the report looks at investment, amenities, and acreage in its ParkScore Index.) Inspired by "the national awakening" on racial and economic disparity, the new equity measures compare neighborhoods of color vs. white neighborhoods and low-income vs. disparities must be low or non-existent. San Diego, with its 538 parks, often landed within the top 20. Now it's #27. The city scored highly on acreage, which is based on a city's median park size, as well as access. For a majority of residents, a park is at most a 10-minute walk from home. But that still leaves 257,640 residents who don't have the same opportunity. In San Diego neighborhoods where most people identify as people of color, residents have access to 73 percent less park space

> than those in mostly white neighborhoods (49 percent less in Chula Vista, which was 81st in the rankings). Those in San Diego's lowincome neighborhoods have access to 86 percent less park space than those in highincome neighborhoods.

> From home to park, distance alone doesn't tell the whole story. So the rating system evaluates access by studying how easy it is to reach the park. Does a highway block the path, turning a short stroll into a roundabout car trip? Unless there's a pedestrian bridge or

other feature to allow crossing, that park isn't counted as accessible to area residents. In San Diego, for example, there's Cedar Ridge Park, separated from Gateway/Fairmount Park by I-15. Another is Admiral Baker Park & Elanus Canyon, which are cut off from Grantville by Fri-



ars Road.


City parks didn't score highly on amenities like dog parks, either, having only 1.2 per 100,000 people. Boise, Idaho, by contrast, has 6.3 per 100,000 residents. However, it's worth noting that San Diego has reserved 19 percent of its city area for parks, more than double the national ParkScore average.

On May 29, wellsready2fish, a local eBay seller, sold a concrete chunk from the recently demolished SDCCU stadium for \$15. A week earlier, the seller sold a different

concrete chunk titled "San Diego Jack Murphy Qualcomm Stadium Souvenir Authentic" for \$10. "So happy to have this little chunk representing such a big part of my life!" exclaimed the seller's customer.

When the stadium was completed and opened to the San Diego Chargers, the San Diego Padres, and their fans on August 8, 1967, it was called the San Diego Stadium. In 1980, it was renamed Jack Murphy Stadium, after the former *San Diego Union* newspaper's sports editor. Everyone has hangups, but this one may come back to haunt ex-councilwoman Bry.

Checks and unchecks

No closure yet on Bry disclosure Back on February 23, La Jolla serial entrepreneur and Union-Tribune columnist Neil Senturia slammed down the phone on a reporter when asked about his wife's role in Deckard Technologies. According to a September 2019 report by Government Technology magazine, the data mining outfit was aimed squarely at the so-called short-term rental market. "Deckard's co-founder and CEO Neil Senturia, a former real estate developer who has founded or sat on the boards of several software and technology companies, said he started the company in July 2018 to answer a specific question: what percentage of residential improvements over \$20,000 in the state of California are done without proper permits?" There was a second mission as well. Deckard's chief operating officer Nick Del Pego told the publication that another of the firm's offerings "is intended to help city governments keep up with the impact of online services like Airbnb that help citizens commoditize their properties in new ways. sometimes under the radar."

"He said revenue booked through online rental providers like Airbnb and VRBO in the United States in 2018 was close to \$20 billion. according to AllTheRooms.com, with which Deckard has a professional relationship. Given an average transient-occupancy tax over 10 percent nationwide, that should have meant about \$2 billion in local taxes."

Airbnb and other so-called short-term rental outfits were political targets of Senturia's

wife. ex-city councilwoman and defeated mayoral candidate Barbara Bry, during her single term on the council and campaign for mayor against the ultimate victor, fellow Democrat Todd Gloria. After departing office in December of last year, Bry took up the cudgels against city council Democrat Jen Campbell, currently the object of a recall campaign, accused by Bry of reneging on promises "to better control the explosion in shortterm rentals in her district." Bry wrote in a December 13 opinion piece for the Times of San Diego that "The Campbell recall is a

grass-roots effort to right those wrongs."

After her exit from the council in December, Bry filed a January 4 leaving office financial statement, as required by state law, disclosing an array of assets and income sources she held during 2020. They included an investment in Deckard Technologies valued between \$100,000 and \$1 million, described as "Spouse - Data Centric Technologies." The holding was disposed of on November 2, 2020, the filing says. Elsewhere on the same form, under "Income, Loans & Business Positions (Other than Gifts and Travel Payments)," Deckard Technology was listed as a source to Bry of between \$10,000 and \$100,000 in gross income. Under the line "Your Business Position" was typed "Consultant." The consideration was paid, per Bry's disclosure, for "consulting fees."

When asked during the February interview about the disclosure, signed by Bry under penalty of perjury showing her as a consultant to Deckard, Senturia denied his wife held had that role and terminated the call without further explanation. Now Bry has filed an amendment. dated April 2 and recently posted online by the city clerk's office, removing the checkmark from the "Other" box and placing it instead in a box designated "Spouse or registered domestic partner's income." The little-noticed change may grow in significance should ethics enforcement agencies, including the city's ethics commission and state's Fair Political Practices Commission, determine the matter needs further investigation.

Naval housing crunch Hours-long

commutes, a painful childcare backlog, and an ever-growing lack of housing are some of the problems bedeviling San Diego-based Navy families these days, says a new report to Congress by the federal Government Accountability Office. "According to officials in San Diego, the current waitlist for childcare for the installation is over several hundred children, and they reported a 6-to-18-month wait for childcare services in the area," says the April document.

"Providing sufficient housing is also an ongoing challenge in supporting additional ship homeporting, based on information provided by officials and strategic laydown plan documentation we analyzed." San Diego Chamber of Commerce types lobbied heavily for the Navy to add a third aircraft carrier to the two already based here, touting the new business and population growth it would bring. "In 2000, the Navy announced its decision

to develop homeport facilities in support of three Nimitz-class aircraft carriers at Naval Air Station North Island near San Diego, California," the document recounts. "Officials from the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations and others stated that a contributing factor to this decision was also the Navy's desire to ensure access to needed nuclear maintenance and support near the homeport," the report explains. "As the aircraft carriers age, nuclear and other system repairs increase in complexity, and maintenance has taken longer. Accordingly, it has become increasingly important they be homeported near sufficient maintenance capabilities, according to nuclear maintenance and other officials," the findings say. "It was not

until 2019, however, that the Navy moved the USS Abraham Lincoln to San Diego to join the two carriers already homeported there." That action was greeted with delight by the downtown political establishment led by Republican then-mayor Kevin Faulconer. "Those dollars are really going to help every portion of our city," Faulconer enthused to a TV interviewer during an October 2019 meeting touting a Military Economic Impact Study

for the non-profit San Diego Military Advisory Council showing the military spent \$28.1 billion that year in San Diego. Unmentioned was the fact that the Navy's growth added to an already painful housing shortage due to the government's failure to develop sufficient new units to accommodate incoming crews. "Navy officials in San Diego stated that unaccompanied housing (i.e., housing for single sailors) is particularly strained now that three aircraft carriers can be in port together, because current base housing only accommodates two aircraft carrier crews," the report says. The worsening situation has forced many Navy families to commute long distances to get to work, auditors found. "The area surrounding the homeport in San Diego is densely populated Coronado Island, where there is little room for expansion," says the document. "Because of the area's housing market many sailors live 60 to 80 miles from the base, according to officials."

Clery crime free Alliant Univer-

sity, which encountered controversy when it moved to turn part of its Scripps Ranch campus into a 300-house subdivision two years ago, has been called out by California State Auditor Elaine Howle. "State law requires institutions to enter into written agreements with these agencies to designate operational responsibility when investigating certain crimes such as robberies or hate crimes that occur at Clery reporting locations," says

> an audit regarding compliance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act - otherwise known as the Clery Act. "Alliant's campus in San Diego does not have any written agreement with its local police department," says the audit, released May 17. "According to Alliant's vice president of student affairs, the former director of security engaged in discussions for an agreement with the local police department in 2016, but a written agreement was not finalized. She also stated that Alliant will initiate the process and enter a written agreement with its local police department." Add the auditors, "Five of the six institutions we reviewed - Alliant International Univer-




an ally when it comes to security.

its report, the agency informed Alliant that it was an unfounded crime, which meant that a law enforcement agency determined that it was a false or baseless report before the report was submitted to Alliant. We confirmed that Alliant identified this crime as unfounded in its annual security report."





Marc Paskin of La Jolla built a real estate portfolio over 30 years by amassing hundreds of rental properties throughout the southwest. 

1. "Lights! Let's go!" yells Mario Alberto Ortiz Vargas. The whole crew grabs their clubs, rings, balls and unicycles, and charges out into the middle of Paseo de Los Héroes, where the rush-hour traffic has screeched to a halt. Already, the guys are up on their unicycles, flinging juggling clubs and balls at each other through the air. They do a frantic 40-second acro-ballet, while the nonplussed drivers and their spouses stare up through their windscreens and then laugh, until suddenly Mario barks something, and the guys bow and take off back to the center divide. Meanwhile, Mario zips 'round the drivers' side windows with a collection box, then makes it out of harm's way just as the lights turn green and traffic roars ahead.

Magic's over, for another two minutes.

"Ah," says Mario. They're all sitting in the center divide when one of the guys turns up with two steaming boxes of Manolo's Pizza "Manolo's Centro outlet makes the best pies," says one of the jugglers, Jose Guadalupe Figueroa Castillo. Within moments, the pies are gone. Everyone munches. Jose is Tijuanense, the only one of the four who's not from Mexico City. But all have been doing this gig a long time. 

4. The fourth side of the Tijeras monument? CECUT! *Centro Cultural*. The magnificent ball-shaped cultural center that opened in 1982 with the aim of promoting cultural tourism from the U.S. The last twenty years have been cruel to that dream. But at least they have a bona fide cultural center in their city. Do we?

On the other hand, just looking at these four sides of the Independence Monument, it is the other three that are full of impromptu life, while this whole vast plaza is magnificent, important, but asleep. At least on the outside. You've got to recognize the devastation of covid: The magnificent ball which is the Centro Cultural's Omnimax theater and the jewel in its crown, is open, but only just. "We are opening by stages," says Sofia Joffre, who is the staffer welcoming you at the entrance. Their permanent exhibitions are open, but this still sort of reminds me of San Diego's chronically-empty Horton Plaza before it began its transformation into a tech hub. All dressed up with prize-winning design, and yet, missing life. "We do normally get one million visitors a year," Sofia justifiably points out.

This is when I spot the one piece of rough architecture in the whole carefully-planned center: the 100-foot timber pole from which the Aztec *voladores* traditionally "fly." I recognize this from Barrio Logan. On certain days, men (and it customarily is men) attach ropes and imitate birds, "flying" round and round above the ground, imitating the original "dance" that sought to appease the gods during a historic drought.

"You ought to see when they do it, *senor*," says the guard. "Omnimax is good, but this is real, in front of your eyes. People are hypnotized."

The Businessman, Cat & Mouse, The Handmaid's Tale, A Gift from Earth

LAST FRIDAY I went to the beach for the first time in a year. Why didn't I think of this through the endless, mind-numbing heat wave all summer? I went to Coronado and spread my towel beneath a palm tree near the Hotel Del. A northerly breeze spilling over Point Loma and past the island naval station whipped sand into my hair and teeth and formed a plaster against the sweat on my face and chest. I reversed directions on the towel and sighed, empathizing with the troops in Iraq as I marinated myself in coconut oil and picked up one of my paperbacks. It was *The Businessman* by Thomas M. Disch.

Disch started out as a literary New Wave science-fiction writer in the '60s, and he is also an accomplished poet, having published work in prestigious small press limited editions, university presses, *The Paris Review*, and *The New Yorker*. Stephen King (who also made it several times into *The New Yorker* despite his populist and facile accessibility) once described Disch's work as packed with "morbid, jittery intensity that is quite remarkable." As I read *The Business-man*, I was distracted by thoughts of my recent attempts at small good deeds in an effort to compensate for certain character defects. The old saw that "No good deed goes unpunished" occurred to me, and coincidentally I ran into the line

halfway through the novel: "The spirit of do-gooding had laid hold of him, a spirit he despised and distrusted, since in the past that spirit had led him from one moral pratfall to another." Was this coincidence a warning to stop lending people money for beer and cigarettes?

Baking nicely, I suddenly found myself distracted by the return of a toothache. In the dentist's office, one would do well to imagine oneself on a beautiful beach beneath a palm tree. That's exactly where I was, yet I was thinking about being in a dentist's chair. There is something wrong with me.

The other paperback I had with me was an anthology of poetry about death. Here is Milton:

To live a life half dead, a living death, And buried, but O yet more miserable! Myself my sepulcher, a moving grave, Buried, yet not exempt By privilege of death and burial From worst of other evils, pains and wrongs, But made hereby obnoxious more To all the miseries of life, Life in captivity Among inhuman foes.

I intend to re-read *Paradise Lost*. I read it in high school and thought it "neat," the word I probably used back then. I didn't understand half of it, but I liked the vibe. Among the poetry was something by Thomas Lovell Beddoes, early 19th Century, and along the same ghostly lines: *Lie of my eyes begone! Art*

thou not dead? Are not the worms, that ate thy marrow, dead? What dost thou here, thou wretched goblin fool?

Think'st thou, I fear thee? Thou man-mocking air, ...

My brother Paul, dead for three years, was with me now, and my parents. Also an editor and writer I knew and loved for 17 years, Judith Moore, who recently passed away. No reason to fear Paulie or Dad nor Judith, but the wraith of my mother, Mary Jane, still scared the crap out of me. "Get off the beach, M.J. You're likely to get harpooned by the spirit of some drowned whaler." She is still fat in the afterlife and reliving her sins like Dante had it. Snap out of it. See what other people are reading.

I walked from the palm

tree line to the lifeguard tower and a little beyond. People will read on the beach when, ordinarily, they "don't have the time." I passed a woman reading *Us* magazine about Brad Pitt and Angelina something. The whole issue was about celebrity couples I never heard of. I headed north or northwest, I suppose.

Two people reading *The Da Vinci Code*: one of them in Spanish, *Codigo da Vinci*. I didn't bother to stop and discuss it with them. I haven't read it, but the thing has had so much publicity I feel like I have, and don't much care how close Jesus was to Mary Magdalene, only that he was, along with everybody else. A guy reading James Patterson's Cat & Mouse. Not much to discuss there, I figured. I read one of his, a collaboration with somebody else whose name appeared in smaller letters than Patterson's on the cover. The Jester was the title, and it took place in medieval Europe. Not bad, but forgettable.

OUTDOORS

Ocean temperatures inch up into mid-60s

Ocean Water Temperatures are rising into the mid-60s this month, perhaps to reach the low 70s in August. The usual early-summer cool weather along San Diego's coastline, disappointing to many tourists, is mostly caused by the sluggish warming of the ocean water. The payoff will come later: as the ocean gives up heat absorbed during the sunny summer months, we'll enjoy warm days and evenings well into autumn.

Spring Wildflowers may have largely dried up in most areas of San Diego County, but in the cooler coastal enclaves such as Cabrillo National Monument and Torrey Pines State Reserve, several kinds remain. Look for paintbrush, purple nightshade, coreopsis, sea fig, popcorn flower, and red monkey flower, among others.

Elderberry, two species of which range over most of San Diego County, is in full bloom this month. The flat-topped, creamy white blossoms of this large shrub or small tree can be seen in the natural coastal canyon areas such as Tecolote Canyon and Los Peñasquitos Canyon Preserve, as well as in the more moist areas of the foothills and mountains. The elderberry's tiny fruits, which ripen in late summer, have traditionally been used for various drinks and preserves.

The Chirping of Crickets tells us the warmer weather of summer is well on its way. Their plaintive pleadings for mates are heard wherever bits of seminatural scenery cut across the urban tapestry of San

Diego. Try the Spruce Street suspension footbridge, just west of Balboa Park between Front and Brant Streets. From the swaying bed of the 70-foot-high bridge you can admire a canyon filled with green and gold grasses, nasturtiums, and eucalyptus, pepper, and palm trees. Sound effects begin by midafternoon.

Bright Venus and the thin crescent Moon form a mystic pair low in the west-northwest in twilight, Friday, June 11. They'll be 3° or 4° apart for skywatchers near the US East Coast, and only 2° by the time of twilight for the West Coast. Your best view might be about 40 or 50 minutes after sunset, before they get too low.

The Big Dipper hangs high in the northwest right after dark, Saturday, June 12. The Dipper's Pointers, currently its bottom two stars, point lower right toward Polaris. Above Polaris, and looking very similar to it, is Kochab, the lip of the Little Dipper's bowl.

On June 25, Kahlee, a Mira Mesa rapper and hip-hop podcast host, and Knew-Balance, an OB rapper and school teacher, will drop their *SD State Of Mind* compilation record, featuring an array of SDbased rappers and producers, plus winners of past rap battles. "I've met a lot of talented emcees at these battles," Kahlee said in a *Reader* interview. "A lot of times, they don't even make music, or they've just started to, so it's a chance for me to see them in action." The more seasoned rappers come prepared, "writing intricate lyrics with crazy similes and metaphors, then transitioning from written to off-thetop freestyles and back, seamlessly." The judges cheer or jeer based on the rapper's wittiness, delivery, cohesiveness, "clever use of vocabulary, and presence," Kahlee continued. "I want to book artists that have stage presence, which is a major piece of battle rap. This isn't the spot to come rapping over lyrics. You gotta have your bars ready to go." Sneaker and Vintage Clothing Swap Meet POINT LOMA

The self-proclaimed "largest outdoor sneaker swap meet" in America returns on September 4-5 for Labor Day weekend. I spoke with some sneakerheads in the area before the Kobey's sneaker swap in June. "I'm looking for some Turdunken Dunks or the Camo Duck Air

Max's to match our 'Duck Sauce' song," NEMY said. (NEMY, a local artist, just released the 'Duck Sauce' single he corapped with Indian K on the *SD State Of Mind* compilation album.) "I was what people call a 'sneakerhead' before that word existed in the early 2000s," NEMY continued. And the Meet might have just what he's looking for. "I have a pair of used Nike Dunk SB High 'Turdunken' size 10s for \$230," says Sailboat Lewis. Lewis, from Mission Valley, has been slinging vintage sneakers since the first Sneaker and Vintage Clothing Swap Meet in 2019, when there were 100 vendors and 7575 shop-

pers. "Kobey's has always been my most lucrative show, and since the first time vending there, I have sold at over a dozen other events." In April, the sneaker and vintage clothing show brought in "250 vendors and 12,226 shoppers," according to Anthony Pretto, the show's founder. "We are expecting vendors and shoppers from Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico, Los Angeles, Pennsylvania, Oregon, and Washington." If you're considering selling your old kicks or pairs owned by your parents (or their parents) back in the day, Pretto sells 18-foot by 16-foot booth spots for \$40.

The San Diego Comic Book Show MISSION VALLEY

On July 17, there's a quaint comic book show in town. "Be sure to come at 8 am as an early bird to get the best selection and prices on some of the hottest books in the market," states the event's Facebook page. This is the first official local comic book gathering since I covered Comic Fest, which happened about a week before our 2020 statewide shut

down. "We comic book fans are tired of shopping online and getting books in the mail," commented Rav M., a comic book collector and online dealer. "That experience of opening up a gummy-like bag, pulling out the Silver Age comic book and backing board, whiffing the aged specimens, inspecting the spine's binding and creamy inside pages, then negotiating face to face with a dealer, was lost in 2020." The event page notes that "we will be following local health guidelines and will require all participants (dealers, guests, and attendees) to wear masks. We will be limiting the amount of attendees in the dealer room to provide a safe and comfortable environment." The organizers added that they plan on "continuing the show every 3-4 months."

Borrego Night Sky Tours


BORREGO SPRINGS Borrego Springs is, along with Julian, one of only two International Dark Sky communities in California, which means the Milky Way is visible from town and the surrounding area. From a comfortable outdoor location, you can take an extensive guided tour of the stars, including telescope viewing, with Borrego Night Sky Tours (\$59 adult/\$39 kid, reserve ahead). Astronomer Dennis Mammana will point out planets, constellations, and galaxies, then instruct you on telescope use for a closeup with heavenly bodies like Saturn and Jupiter. You can also grab a star chart and head out to the desert on your own. It'll

be great place to view the Perseid meteor shower, which peaks August on 11-12 this year.

Glamping at Hobbit House

This enchanted Hobbit House has a round door, just like Frodo's front entrance in Lord of the Rings. Rock walls, hand-carved furniture, and wood beam ceilings add to the Tolkien-esque ambience, as does the setting: nestled into boulders overlooking the hilly San Diego backcountry. Hidden behind the home of owner Roy Toft, Hobbit House has running water in an outdoor (yet private) toilet and shower. Enjoy expansive views from the rooftop garden, or light up the outdoor fire pit under the stars. If you bring perishables, bring ice for the Yeti cooler (no electricity). Amenities include glasses and utensils, a bed, a wood-burning stove and propane cooking stove,

lanterns, and a little writing desk. Maximum coziness. (\$289/night for two guests.)

Rice Canyon Demonstration Gardens and Preserve CHULA VISTA Rice Canyon is an undeveloped piece of San Diego with hiking trails and open space, tucked away in suburban Rancho Del Rey, not far from the 805. Gardens at the entrance to the canyon showcase drought-tolerant, cactus, and succulent plants, many of which were used by native peoples in various ways. Look for Desert Spoon (*sotol* in Spanish), a 3-4 foot tall rosette with blue gray spear-like leaves, used by indigenous people to make sandals, baskets, ropes, mats, and more. They even fermented the central part of the plant to make a beer-like bev-

Archery Classes

POWAY Founded in 1991, the outdoor archery range at Lake Poway hosts summer camps and classes, including a year-round first served. Bring your own gear and targets (or purchase targets at concessions). The range opens 30 minutes after sunrise - come early and you might see some deer. Camp is \$75-\$86 for four days, \$10 materials fee, equipment supplied. Beginners welcome. The range is also available for private events. Make a day of it and catch a summer concert at Lake Poway or Old Poway Park: Sundays, June 20 to August 15.

Bonita Museum and Cultural Center BONITA

A delightful hodgepodge of art, artifacts, and natural history, the Bonita Museum preserves the history of South San Diego County, from dinosaur days (when the valley was underwater) to Kumeyaay to Spanish to Mexican to the early 1900s citrus boom and beyond. See fossils found in the Sweetwater Valley, the Bonita Badger, and the locally legendary Proctor Valley Monster footprint. New exhibit "Permission To Come Aboard" opens June 25, taking visitors through local shipbuilding history, starting from the 1700s. "With cool, very detailed miniatures," promises museum director Wendy Wilson-Gibson. Learn about the Bonnie Brae lemon, patented in Bonita, and lay eyes on Bonita's first public sculpture. Donation-based (pay what you can) admission. LEORAH GAVIDOR

Mount Laguna Dav Trip

CLEVELAND NATIONAL FOREST

If you are looking for an alternative to spending an afternoon on a crowded beach, a day trip to Mount Laguna could be just the thing. No marine layer, parking is simple, and there is a noticeable temperature drop at about 5000 feet. Not only does the area offer great camping, hiking and biking opportunities, but on a clear day you can often see all the way out to the Salton Sea from certain vantage points. Plan for about an hour of drive time if you live near the coast, and bring plenty of food, water and sunscreen for the trip. If you forget something, you aren't going to find a strip mall with a Target at the top of the mountain.

San Diego River Bike Path

OCEAN BEACH/MISSION VALLEY

In the age of COVID-19, road cycling is one of the few physical activities that has experienced minimal interruptions. As a result, area bike shops did gangbuster business early on in the

pandemic while gyms and sporting goods shops remained closed. If you purchased a bike due to reduced access to other exercise options, the San Diego River Trail is a great spot to break it in. The path travels alongside the San Diego River — often in fits and spurts. That being said, the prime ride is the uninterrupted seven mile stretch that runs from Robb Field in Ocean Beach to Sefton Field at the west end of Hotel Circle Place. If you wish to continue deeper into Mission Valley, the riverside trail resumes on the southeast side of Fashion Valley Mall.


Explore Lake Wohlford ESCONDIDO

If you have ever driven north to any of the casinos in Valley Center, it's likely that your GPS routed you through the Lake Wohlford region of Escondido. You ascend a mountainous incline for about 1400 feet and end up in a tiny foothills community that feels like a miniaturized version of Ramona. While most people will just pass on through, the lake itself is a large draw for many — espe-cially anglers. From mid-December through the weekend after Labor Day in September, visitors will try their luck at hooking bass, trout, catfish and other fish. Some get so hooked that they choose to retire in Lake Wohlford Resort, a nearby mobile home park that has been operating as a fishing resort since the 1920s.

from doing? Spying on birds! Citizens nationwide figured this out in 2020; a majority remote or unemployed work force took increased notice of our winged compadres. If the flying action outside your window isn't up to snuff, take a drive over to Famosa Slough to get your bird watch on. The 37-acre wetland area (just to the east of Ocean Beach off West Point Loma Blvd) is one of the county's premier spots for bird watching. Year-round visitors include Snowy Egrets, Brown Pelicans, and Red-tailed Hawks. Rare or unusual sightings at the slough include the Hooded Merganser, Wilson's Snipe, and the Redthroated Loon.

Greg Cox Bike Park

CHULA VISTA

One year after Sweetwater Bike Park opened in Bonita, San Diego County now has its second official bike park.





Eons of pounding surf and storms along the coastline have created the La Jolla Caves, a series of seven sea caverns nestled between La Jolla Shores Beach and La Jolla Cove. Only one, Sunny Jim Sea Cave, is accessible by land, via The Cave Store, a tunnel and a 145 step descent down a wooden

staircase, but it's worth the \$5 fee. Your best bet for viewing all seven is to rent or bring your own kayak and explore them from the sea. Only two caves, The Clam's Cave and Arch Cave, are large enough to enter by kayak, and you must be with an approved kayak tour, but you can swim into them all, or just relax and enjoy the wildlife - you might see leopard sharks or garibaldi swimming by, or sea lions lazing on the rocks.

Rady Shell

MARINA DISTRICT The public must wait until August to witness performances at San Diego's newest music venue. But considering that our sunny city has always lacked an outdoor orchestra shell to compare to the likes of the Hollywood Bowl or Boston's Hatch Shell, what's another couple months? As settings go, the Rady Shell should have those others beat — the 10,000 capacity venue sits at Embarcadero Park South, commanding views of the Coronado Bridge, the harbor, and the San Diego skyline. The true test will come with the shell's acoustics, which promise to project dozens of annual performances by the San Diego Symphony, plus an inaugural concert calendar featuring Gladys Knight, Brian Wilson, and Bobby McFerrin. The Shell offi-

cially debuts on August 6; individual tickets go on sale June 22.

Water Conservation Garden

RANCHO SAN DIEGO Six of the county's most pleasant acres cover shallow slopes abutting the campus of El Cajon's Cuyamaca College. The sprawling botanical garden has grown over the course of 22 years; the place was founded with the intent to educate on planting and maintaining vegetation appropriate to our climate's recurring drought conditions. Indeed, among the garden's thousands of trees, shrubs, succulents and flowers, guests will find myriad installations detailing how to, say, plant according to soil type, produce compost, or landscape to prevent erosion. However, you needn't take notes to enjoy the garden for what it is. The path wending through its exhibits passes multicolored blooms, animal-shaped topiary, a lily pond, and a glassed-in butterfly pavilion. Take a stroll, or linger at any of the garden's gazebos, amphitheaters, or picnic tables.

Swiss Dogs

"Nunca comiste una igual," promises the menu. "You've never eaten one like it."

duardo Gonzalez guards the door to the dungeon, as he has been doing for decades. Nobody gets past without his say-so. The neon sign shines

- red. Sótano Suizo.
 - "Swiss Cellar."
 - Swiss in TI?

Well yes. We're in Plaza Fiesta. Zona Rio. Daylight's fading rapidly. The neon sign shines with a new brightness. And next to it,

in this beehive of bars, Sotano Suizo sticks out, with its wrought-iron art that says "Gourmet Bar. Anno 1989'

A lot of noise comes from inside, so you know the place has kept its mojo since 1989. When I ask about happy hour, Luis, who's guarding the outside entrance with a temperature gun, points across the Erasmo Castellano Q. alley. "They have happy hour over there," Luis says, indicating that other, more ordinary-looking place, "five to seven."

But me, I want to get inside this gothic, gnarled-wood joint with the big brass cow bells from Switzerland, heavy chains, white crosses on red backgrounds, medieval knights in murals, and chalk boards talking about "Bosiger beer" selling for 79 pesos a pint (\$4 — I see beer is only 59 pesos across the alley). I pass the temperature test and head inside. Right by me is, hey! William Tell, the Swiss patriot who was forced to put an apple on his son Walter's head and fire an arrow. Luckily, it split the apple and spared his son - and made him the only Swiss person anybody has ever remembered. William stands in the mural beside the table at which Mario and Carla are drinking. It sounds like they come often. In fact, there's something clubby about this whole place. Clubby, but not snobby. I like it.

"Bosiger, the family name. That's the name of the beer that Rene Bosiger makes here," says Luis. Oh yes. Now I remember. I've been before! Hot dogs. The greatest hot dogs! But first, a cerveza. The chalk sign says they have "Porter, Pilsner, Euro-Lager," and a "hoppy San Francisco IPA, all made right here behind the bar. Each is 79 pesos



for a *pinta*. Four bucks. Not bad. The mesero, Raul Cardona, says you can't go wrong with the Porter. And hey, anything dark, like stout, is good in my book. Porter is usually sweet

and rich. I mean, I love the bitter taste-crack of IPAs, but Porters are like an easy relationship with someone you know well. And this Bosiger hits the spot.

The place is crowded, mostly middle class, some business people, families. One or two gringos. Bar seating is

way separated for covid. So I'm standing, checking, sipping, talking with Raul. The menu is pretty

standard, but headed in German. In the kalte vorspeisen section (cold appetizers), salads start at

The Sotano the combo of Hungarian sausage, onions, and mus-\$5. Caesar's is \$6, and tard that's magic under fleisch-teller,

(cold meat plate), meats and greens go for about \$13. For \$15, you get meats plus cheeses.

But what I'm really looking for turns up in the Warme Vorspeisen (warm appetizers) section. For starters, yes! Cheese fondue, with jack cheese and grated jalapeño (\$9). Plus different sausages, climaxing in the "Mamut (Mammoth) Dog," It's half a meter of hot dog, made with the place's own mega house sausage plus Swiss cheese, golden onions, yellow peppers. Enough dog for two or three people. It costs 319 pesos (about \$16). "Nunca comiste una igual," promises the menu. "You've never eaten one like it."

So right now, it's a hard decision. Dogs, yes, but also that fondue? Or hey, half a dozen snails (Escargots a la Bourgignon) in their shells for \$9.50. Or coq au vin (braised chicken, \$11.50). I'd love'em all.

But no. Dog wins. I get the half version, the Sótano Dog, \$8.50. Believe me, it's enough, and super scrumptious. The Hungarian dog, which they make here, is spicy-flavorsome, with that paprika coming right through. Also, the mess of Dijon mustard, tomatoes, golden-grilled onions, and yellow pepper makes for dee-licious chomping. Porter's perfect with it, too. Also: the baguette

is crispy but easy to bust up.

Eduardo Gonzalez says this hot dog has been an unchanging staple since they opened in 1989. He himself has been working here 26 years. "Does the owner still come in?" I ask him. We're talking about Rene Bosiger, the gent who created this little piece of Olde World Switzerland, cowbells and all, and yet combined that with top-notch rock and roll and good vibes. It provides a kind of secret getaway feel for this tribe of guys and gals

"in the know," who kind of hide it, for fear The Hordes will come in and spoil it. The narrow alleys that lead to the place help protect it, as have the ups and

downs of the border since 9-11 and '08. All through, somehow, Sotano Suizo has rocked on, in its hybrid Swiss-Mex-Dog: It's

Cali way. So Rene Bosiger, the Founding Father? The guy must be retired in fat city, I'm thinking, after three decades of success with this place and

"That's him," says Eduardo. "Never stops." That's the owner himself? Right there, it

strikes me, is the whole secret to the success of this iewel.

Good Seed Food Co. taps into a another tasting room

Good Seed Food Company; 8685 Miralani Drive, Miramar College. If there was one thing I knew for certain heading pretty much across the board, ever since the Carlsbad brewery first opened in late 2016. The new taproom, dubbed Burgeon at the Arbor, finally offers downtown-area beer fans the opportunity to belly up to a Burgeon bar south of the 8 freeway. The keys to a successful visit are this simple: try everything, Uber home.

However, there's more than beer to Burgeon at the Arbor. The taproom sits on

Kettner Boulevard at A Street, less than a block from the south end of Little Italy. Plants hang from the rafters, while large windows open to the street outside, part of Burgeon plan to make the place "feel like an outdoor beer garden transported inside." Furthermore, a restaurant has also been transported inside.

Which isn't to say the team behind Burgeon decided that being good at making beer qualified them to create a restaurant menu.

Wisely, they looked outside their business to install meal service in their new location, and

partnered with the Good Seed Food Company.

If that name sounds familiar, chances are pretty good you have gone drinking mead and cider in Miramar. That's where Good Seed took root over the past few years, operating out of the tasting room shared by Serpentine Cider and Lost Cause Mead. Led by Chef Chuy de la Torres, Good Seed used its time in Miramar to establish a reputation within the craft beverage community, developing a menu that varied from bar snacks such as wings and deviled eggs to hot sandwiches and more adventurous fare, including mussels.

By moving in with Burgeon down in the

Little Italy area, the chef and his food should find a larger audience, even if it means having to call the place The Good Seed Food Company at Burgeon at the Arbor.

As it was in Miramar, Good Seed's kitchen is hidden behind a service window in one corner of the taproom. I'm guessing it's a bigger kitchen, though. While the old favorites remain — mussels (\$15), deviled eggs (\$6), and those dry-rubbed "stupid wings" (\$12) — there's a broader fixed menu at work, one that features regular items including a burger (\$15), jambalaya (\$20), and whatever local catch seafood is in season (\$20). And if, like me, you're a huge

into Burgeon Beer Company's new downtown tasting room, it was that the beer would be fantastic. That's been the case with Burgeon beers,

fan of both ribeye and tacos, you can hit the motherlode here, with three ribeye tacos for \$15.

Whatever your order, you'll find a suggested Burgeon Beer pairing. With the tacos, they suggest one of the house hazy IPAs. The burger is said to go well with a piney west coast IPA.

If you're really keyed up about beer pairings, you can choose to experience chef Chuy's playful creativity by checking out the Beer Pairing Board. For \$20, you get four four-ounce tasting samples of Burgeon beers, plus a small snack intended to complement each one. At my last visit, that meant pickled black grapes paired with a pilsner; chorizo-cured ahi with hazy IPA; curried kimchi with that clear west coast IPA; and blue cheese with a hoppy double IPA. Set up by the chef and Burgeon's resident cicerone (think beer sommelier), these are more brazen pairings than you'll find most places, offering strong flavors that challenge clean drinking beers with increasing pungency.

Everything's crisp at Chicken Lisa's

Chicken Lisa's and Your Mexican Favorites; 555 W Country Club Ln E, Escondido. There is no shortage of good Mexican restaurants scattered within the 40 miles between my home and Chicken Lisa's, but we press on. We think we're getting close when we start to spot Escondido freeway exits, but the mapping software says there's another 12 minutes of driving ahead. That's because Chicken Lisa's sits about as far out as Escondido gets, up in the old North Broadway neighborhood, just bevond a wooden community sign welcoming folks to Escondido Hills. Beyond that, San Diego County mostly peters out into scrubby slopes and the occasional country club; it's another 15 miles to Fallbrook.

We've kept our appetite all this way because I recently learned something about the six-year-old restaurant: if you love crispy chicken skin, it's simply the place to be. The full name of the place is

on TV while you sample the house chicken. And if anything, the restaurant side is even more casual. It's a counter shop built along one side of a long, narrow dining room with patios at both ends. The vibe caters to the suburban locale, its bright yellow walls hung with tchotchkes and eclectic artwork.

Behind the counter, spatchcocked chickens are lined up on a grill, charbroiling till the meat is tender and that skin is crisp. Crisp like the thinnest of crackers, but with that craveable blend of schmaltz and savory seasonings: garlic, cumin, chile, maybe paprika. I order the half chicken combo (\$11), and choose fries as one of the sides. These too are uncommonly crisp, battered before they hit the deep fryer. But but I'm not thinking about potatoes when I wrap a few hunks of thigh meat, crispy skin, and salsa into a

the menu.

On a second \$11 combo plate, we dig into something nearly as crispy: carnitas. A hefty portion comes slathered with fresh guacamole and served with red rice and cheesy refried beans. I take to this plate with corn tortillas, but the result is the same. The carnitas are marvelously simple: just enough brine to embellish the pork, which is slow cooked, tender, and juicy, then pulled into pieces that are seared to a crisp before serving.

"This might be the real story here," my wife tells me between bites. It's about the only conversation we can muster at Chicken Lisa's. The food has all our attention, as it should. There'll be plenty of time to talk on the ride home. by Ian Anderson

The bar being launched by Kové Hard Yerba Mate is being built entirely outdoors; its founders are transforming an industrial alley into a colorful drinking patio, aided by spraypaint, reclaimed word, and thousands of dollars' worth of green plants.

With four inaugural flavors of hard yerba mate, Kové is forging a new spinoff from the still-new hard tea market. It's all part of the fast-rising trend of glutenfree beer alternatives that started with hard kombucha and hard seltzer. Fermented from a wash of sugar dissolved in brewed verba mate, Kové is essentially

having a front row seat for the growth of another fermented tea: hard kombucha. Each previously worked for Scripps Ranch-based boochmaker JuneShine. COO Josh Makler brewed there, as well as at Chula Vista's Boochcraft. CEO Alex Montelbano worked as tasting room manager at JuneShine and **AleSmith** brewing, and also operates nascent Miramar sour ale brewery, Invoak Brewing & Blending. Chief creative officer Ryder England's experience in marketing includes film production and the sort of experiential campaigns that help alternative beverages thrive. Before the pandemic interrupted his work at JuneShine, he was preparing to travel the country in a vintage trailer he tricked out as a mobile hard kombucha bar. "I was one day away from going to Willie Nelson's house for a music festival," he laments. "That would have been cool."

Makler came up with the idea to brew hard yerba mate after being introduced to Guayaki iced yerba mate drinks, which have exploded in popularity in recent years, all across the U.S. The more interested in yerba mate he became, the more convinced he was it would make a strong alternative beverage base. "Because of all the work I was doing with the tea supplier, I started

Montelbano says the trio spent most of the

past year developing the brand and recipes - streamlined 12-ounce cans filled with sparkling beverages flavored with organic ingredients: passionfruit-blackberry, lemon-black tea, mango colada (mango, orange, coconut), and mojito (mint, lime). But the biggest challenge was finding an affordable startup location. Eventually, they hooked up with the growing cooperative of brands residing in a former boiler factory on National Avenue. Anchored by Thorn Brewing **Co.** brewery and tasting room,

the acre-sized property also includes upcycling distillerv ReBru Spirits, outdoor restaurant Sideyard BBQ, and indoor restaurant HottMess Woodfired Pizza. Kové is already available within the restaurants, and will soon operate on the same service schedule as its neighboring Thorn brewing taproom.

This is the first year for the fest, but organizer Darren Goldberg has prior experience — he ran the Gem State Jam in Idaho for three consecutive years starting in 2009. He is modeling the TPF after another event that centers on camping and music: The Joshua Tree Music Festival. "It has a similar vibe to what we are going for," he explains. "It's a smaller festival. I've always been drawn to smaller festivals, rather than 100,000-person things. Something with more of a boutique type of experience. It's Friday through Sunday, and we're only doing music on Friday and Saturday. Joshua Tree would do music on Sunday as well, but we're just doing the music on the two days, and Sunday is kind of your day to go home and

"Even if it is only this show, they will still be able to come down and walk away with a paycheck and get to do what they do, but also not stress about booking any other dates around it."

Twelve bands (including The Main Squeeze, Triptides, The Verigolds and the Shakedown String Band) will be part of the eclectic line-up. There will also be DJs and an array of live art options, ranging from collaborative live-art experiences by professional artists to installations that give festival patrons the ability to paint part of a mural or large wall.

The Sweetwater Ranch comes equipped with plenty of well water to keep concertgoers hydrated, and bathrooms with showers to keep them clean as well. Those planning to attend are encouraged to bring their own food and



collect yourself."

It may seem hard to believe, but Goldberg began booking bands for the TPF after he secured the venue back in January — when the prospects for any sort of live music this spring or summer still seemed bleak, and the possibility of an actual festival seemed downright outlandish. He pitched the bands the dates he was shooting for, leveled with them that "things are ever-changing right now," stressed that the event might need to be rescheduled, and made sure they were okay with that. He focused on San Diego and Los Angeles bands that could play the festival as a one-off, without having to schedule other tour dates around the trip. "It was that flexibility that was definitely in my mind," Goldberg says.

Never mind the cholera, we've got covid-**19** "We've got a new song and video out for 'Love in the Time of Virus,' and yes, it's about the pandemic, at

least in a 1984-ish, story-song way," says Strawberry Moons singer-guitarist-keyboardist Will A. Lerner. "Kyle Areford from Dead Feather Moon produced it, and Rory Morrison from Drug Hunt directed the video. A love song set in a dystopian version of the pandemic year, it encapsulates the feelings of isolation, frustration, love denied and time stalled that so many of us felt during the last year. Not to mention the grief and the loss."

The dream/psych/pop/art rockers came together when former Burning of Rome vocalist/keyboardist Aimee Jacobs started working with Shake Before Us defector Lerner. A year

and a half of collaborations later, they debuted Strawberry Moons with Mrs. Henry's bassist and drummer Jason Areford ("also our backcountry guide and hiking guru") and Dustin Schemensky ("influenced equally by Bonham, Buddy Rich, and The Fall's Karl Burns"), currently backed by guitarist

Hector Duenas ("our handsome shredder"). Lerner, who has worked as a talent buyer for venues such as Oceanside's Pour House, also played with Schemensky in Geese, Hip Priest, and Funhouse.

The debut self-titled foursong Strawberry Moons EP was recorded by James Page at Emerald Age Recording

in Vista. A 2019 single for "Nicole's Song" preceded a self-titled full-length released later that year, recorded and produced by Ben Moore at local Singing Serpent Studios.

Over the past few months, the band did a livestream performance from the stage at Bar Pink, which they've tried to help with fundraising efforts aimed at saving the venue. "We absolutely loved it there and will miss it terribly," says Lerner. "It was an awesome place to perform, to watch killer bands, and just hang out. Great vibe, strong drinks, and no BS." They also recently went out to the Salton Sea for a full band photo shoot, as well as filming the video for "Love in the Time of Virus."

Lerner notes that "it appears we are beginning to see the light at the end of the tunnel. But even as our future gets a bit brighter, it's hard to

The trio that makes up Sonido De La Frontera - Karlos Paez, Luke Henshaw, and DJ Unite - describe their music as "the combination of Soundsystem culture, hip-hop production aesthetic, and the sounds of Latin America's most prolific dance music, Cumbia. The result is a bass-oriented, dancedriven music with a sound unique to the border between San Diego and Tijuana, Mexico. A mixture of all the different sounds and culture found in the southernmost part of California, it is Cumbia music with a production approach similar to hip-hop and electronic music." Karlos Paez is best known as vocalist for Latin music project the B-Side Players. Luke Henshaw is the producer for First Power Crew and a member of Planet B and Satanic Planet. DJ Unite is a veteran DJ for Tribe of Kings Soundsystem and First Power Crew who cut his teeth on dancefloors nationwide. Their album *Cumbia Mundial*, originally released in March 2014, will be re-released digitally via local Three One G Records on June 25.



PHIL WICKHAM

Platinum-selling contemporary Christian singer-songwriter Phil Wickham began leading worship for his youth group at age 13, graduating from Vista's Calvary Christian School in 2002. His debut album *Give You My World* was released in 2003, after which he signed to Simple Records. It was followed by a self-titled album in 2006, and then *Cannons* in 2007, with the latter partly inspired by cannon explosions and C. S. Lewis' book *The Voyage of the Dawn Treader,* from the *Chronicles of Narnia* series. Among his subsequent full-lengths are *Heaven & Earth, The Ascension, Children of God, Living Hope,* and *Sing-A-Long* volumes 1 through 3. His

single "This is Amazing Grace" became RIAA certified platinum and topped the 2014 year-end Christian Airplay chart, with other hits including "Great Things" and "Living Hope." He also led worship at Soul Survivor, a global Christian movement based in Watford, Hertfordshire that oversees multiple Christian-themed festivals geared for providing wholesome and educational activities for young people. His eighth studio album *Hymn of Heaven* is due June 25, preceded so far by singles for "House of the Lord" and "Battle Belongs," with the latter track also shot as a music video now streaming online.



PIP LEWIS

British-American folk-pop indie singer-songwriter Pip Lewis is a top ten Song Academy Young Songwriter finalist for her tune "Missing in Action." She was 16 years-old when she started writing, recording, and mixing her own songs in 2018, with her debut EP Pathos released the following summer. Her music has been heard on 91X and she's performed at the House of Blues, Queen Bee's, and the Roxy. Earlier this year, she previewed her upcoming debut album with a single for "I Fell Asleep Thinking of Her," a narrative-based love song inspired by Greek mythology that plays with the concept of immortality. Her first full-length Human Nature, which dropped on June 3, features 14 songs including "People Like You," which aired on the BBC and is currently nominated in the "Best Folk" category at this year's San Diego Music Awards. According to Lewis, "Human Nature dives deeper than ever before, putting a mirror to the inextricable relationship between people and the world around them."



JELANI ARYEH

21 year old Filipino/African-American artist Jelani Aryeh was still a teen in 2017 when his seven-track EP Suburban Destinesia (an alternative reference to San Diego's initials SD) debuted. 2019's *Helvitica* was somewhat of an autobiographical concept album, with songs including "Patagonia" (which *Rolling Stone* cited in its "Song You Need To Know" column), "Union Station," and "Decide." His indie rock anthem "Stella Brown" has earned over a million streams on Spotify. A debut album is due this summer, I've Got Some Living To Do, preceded this week by a single for "From These Heights." The video for the track was filmed in an empty house with shots of protests breaking through Aryeh's emotional state and lyricism. "It's been a goal of mine to make a video for each single on the album," he says. "With 'From These Heights,' we wanted to put emphasis on the lyrics and capture its feeling with an intense performance-based video. To achieve that, [director Will Noyce] really just kept it as simple as possible, with the majority of shots being just me delivering the message confined to a draped room. It's designed so you have no option but to feel the weight of the words, I'm literally saying it to your face."



SLIGHTLY STOOPID

Ska-flavored pop-punkers Slightly Stoopid, who played their first paid gig in 1994 at Soma, have a video streaming online for "One More Night" collecting vintage footage of the band over the last 20-plus years, from early days with Bradley Nowell (Sublime) to appearances with Snoop Dogg, Bob Weir, Sly and Robbie, Half Pint, and locals Karl Denson and Pepper. The band recently launched their own cannabis, spirits, and health & wellness brand Stoopid Organics. Products currently include two grow-at-home seed selections, a Full Spectrum Hemp Oil tincture (CBD-A), and high-end pre-rolled "infused" marijuana cigarettes. Additional products will continue to be announced along with an online "general store" web-portal pointing consumers and fans to regional product locations, product descriptions, and special contests and merchandise. The first night of their upcoming two-night stand at Colorado's Red Rock Amphitheatre (with fellow locals Pepper) on August 14 and 15 has already sold out, and they're also booked to play Mexico's Closer to the Sun festival, running December 8-12 (with locals Iration and Hirie), and next year's California Roots Music & Arts Festival, set for May 28 in Monterey, California.



Hitting the heights

t was to be the first image I'd seen projected since the lockdown. The trailer pronouncement landed with the jaw-splintering force of a fist enfolding a roll of quarters: "From the director of Crazy Rich Asians" (Jon Chu). What followed were clusters of energetic free verse — Andrew Lloyd

Webber-style talksinging, not cadenced Rex Harrison — an

overabundance of over-theatrical theatricality, and enough strained cheer to power legions of dinner theatres. I repositioned the N-95 mask over my eyes, waiting for it to draw to a merciful end. But when it came time to tackle the feature, my subterranean expectations quickly buoyed. To my shock and delight, when it ended, the film left me feeling quite literally In the Heights.

Usnavi de la Vega (Anthony Ramos) is not your typical New Yorker. Not only does he discourage the work of graffiti artists, he will actually stop and give a tourist detailed directions. As for his forename, remember the woman who awoke in the maternity ward and named her newborn "Nosmo King" after the first sign she saw? Usnavi's (pronounced: Oooze-Nah-Vee) dad christened his son after the first ship he saw upon arriving in America from the Dominican Republic. Such a paragon of virtue is he that there appears to be no alcohol for sale in the squeaky clean corner bodega he owns and operates. He does, however, sell lottery tickets, a plot device that will eventually draw the orphaned Usnavi even closer to his "Abuela" Claudia (Olga Merediz), the neighborhood grandmother who raised him.

Feeling guilty that her dad Kevin (Jimmy Smits) is gradually selling off the family cab company to finance her Stanford education, Nina (Leslie Grace's substantial screen debut) is working up the nerve to tell him to save his money, because she's already dropped out. Nina adores Benny (Corey Hawkins), a dispatcher who longs to follow in her father's footsteps. Rounding out the love interests 🔄 is Vanessa (Melissa Barrera), a stunning prospective fashion designer who walks with a stride more powerful than that of Lee Marvin in Point Blank. Not a student, Vanessa uses swatches found in the dumpster at the New York Fashion Design College as her personal branch of Mood to create haute **9** *couture*. Our hero is paralyzed by her

beauty, so it's Usnavi's wiseguy younger cousin Sonny (Gregory Diaz IV) who acts as icebreaker.

More than the direction and screenplay, the bulk of the praise for the overall look and polish of the staging deserves to be shared by cinematographer Alice Brooks, production designer Nelson Coates, and location

man and Matthew H. Wiesner. This is how to open up a play for the screen. Chu doesn't simply position actors, he's called upon to direct entire city blocks at a time. Taking a hint from La La Land, the decision to shoot on location was a wise one. No matter how enormously appealing (and inordinately attractive) the cast might be, the true star of the movie is Washington Heights.

To the filmmaker's credit, the barrage of songs seldom bunched together, but at 143 minutes, a couple of numbers could have stood trimming. Abuela's underground dance, the one that ended at the foot of the heavenly subway steps, was enough deification to honor her passing; the candlelight vigil that followed was unnecessary. The one number that's destined to be talked about features a gravity-defying dance on the side of an apartment building by Benny and Nina. Alas, this wasn't a case of constructing a moveable set so that Fred Astaire might physically tapdance along the walls and ceiling. For a film that tries so hard to ground it's fairy tale trappings in the real world, it was a shame to see this bit of forced computer-generated terpsichore, which sucked the illusion right out of it.

It's going to be interesting to see how this plays out compared to the upcoming remake of West Side Story. (Let's see how much Vaseline will be used to fog Spielberg's lens for the Dance at the Gym number.) When it was over, I glanced at my phone and wondered where the 143 minutes went. I've seen it twice, both times on television. That's not enough. This one cries out for the big screen. There's no better time than now, nor better film than this, to mark your joyous return to the movies. $\star \star \star \star$

New Release and Video on Demand Roundup The Conjuring: The Devil Made **Me Do It** — It's beginning to feel a

lot like television. Rather than spend 30 minutes each week watching Ed and Lorraine Warren (Patrick Wilson and Vera Farmiga) solve real-life mysteries on a fictional cable show (Curse Breakers?), New Line drops semi-annual theatrical installments from the seemingly limitless Conjuring universe. It's 1981, and it appears as if Max Von Sydow's Father Merrin is making another haunted house call. Our demon-displacing lovebirds track Satan as he transports from an eightyear-old boy: after a dip in a waterbed for the film's one legitimate fright, it's time for a brief respite inside the body of Arne (Ruairi O'Connor). While in the devil's grip, Arne stabs his landlord 22 times. This was the first case in history in which Beelzebub took the stand and demonic possession was put on trial. One has to hand it to these priests and their ability to stand, with outstretched crucifixes, in the face of the demonically high-powered wind machine that replicates the bellows of hell. But as a viewer, it's getting pretty old. And fans of Flip WIlson will no doubt leave disappointed. Directed by Michel Chaves (The Curse of la Llorona). 2021. — S.M. ★

Halibut slide into shallows, bluefin bite in the deep.

Dock Totals 5/30 - 6/5: (thru 6/4):

4 421 anglers aboard 180 trips out of San Diego landings this past week caught 73 barracuda, 1 black seabass (released), 2,098 bluefin tuna (up to 215 pounds), 498 bonito, 2,312 calico bass (1,412 released), 6 halibut (2 released), 15 lingcod, 1,992 rockfish, 427 sand bass, 68 sculpin, 181 sheephead, 90 whitefish, 5 white seabass, and 1,005 yellowtail.

Saltwater: As the count reflects, the bluefin tuna fishing has been particularly good for the boats targeting them 30 to 40 miles offshore due west of Ensenada. Sizes range from 20 pounds up to over 200 pounds. The majority of bluefin caught are from 60 to 100 pounds. Half day and threequarter day boats have been mostly getting rockfish, calico bass, and sand bass in local waters. Yellowtail and bonito have been concentrating around the Coronado Islands. The count on those two species is lower this week due to boats that normally target them

extending their runs to chase bluefin. What the counts do not reflect is the good halibut fishing lately. The main reason for this is that they have been right up close to the beach and in bay mouths and are more available to the shorebased anglers.

Though California halibut can be caught in our area yearround, this is the middle of the high season for them in the shallows, which runs from April through July. Larger halibut will seek deeper and cooler aquatic climes when sea surface temperatures warm up by mid-summer. When in the shallows, halibut can be caught on medium-weight gear from beaches, jetties, and bay ripraps, and thus are a popular target for shore-based anglers. Look for them in cuts along rip currents on the beach or drop offs in the bays just outside the eel

grass. As it warms, channel edges and shady areas around bridges and eddies on the downstream side of larger pilings can be good spots to check.

Low tide will often produce better if fishing from sandy beaches, as it is easier to cast into holes and cuts not normally accessible to anglers when the tide comes up. Though anchovies and sardines are natural baits of choice, most shore-based anglers tend to use lures when targeting halibut. With lures, anglers can work more areas until they find a productive spot. Lucky Craft jerkbaits, Krokodile spoons, and Berkley Shad molded plastics are my favorite lures for halibut. Spoons and jerkbaits have a swimming action and should be presented in a steady slow to medium retrieve near the bottom. Molded plastics are 'hopped' along by reeling slowly while occasionally raising and lowering the rod tip a foot or two. Make the lure rise then flutter back to the sea floor as would a wounded baitfish. as this can often trigger a strike by the

opportunistic feeders. My preference in colors? For ierkbaits and spoons, the flashier the better; for molded plastics, metal flake, white, and hot pink colors have been most productive.

California halibut minimum legal size limit is 22" in length. An easy way to measure them is to mark or put a strip of tape on the rod 22" from the butt end so you can quickly and safely release fish too short to keep. Be careful when handling halibut, they have sharp teeth and will bite when agitated






