Dem Applegate coming for Supe Desmond, Taylor threatens Carlsbad council

When San Marcos city councilman Jim Desmond was elected to represent North County on the San Diego County Board of Supervisors three years ago, there was a five percent GOP majority in his District 5, and no Democrat had represented North County in over 50 years. But now, the northernmost

North County for another four years."

Gary Gartner is a Democratic campaign strategist who is not connected with any potential candidate for District 5. But in 2012, he helped Dave Roberts of Solana Beach become the first Democrat to get elected to the Board of Supervisors in 20 years. "If Doug Applegate was running against [Dr.] Priya Bhat-Patel, I think Doug would be the prohibitive favorite," says Gartner. "He better fits the demographic of the voters in that

district in the county has more Democratic voters than Republican voters, and at least one Democrat has noticed an opportunity. Retired USMC Colonel-turned-attorney Doug Applegate, who turned heads when he came within 1621 votes of tossing Darrell Issa out of Congress five years ago, says he will run to unseat Desmond next year. Last year, the five-person board gained a Democratic majority for the first time in recent history. If Nathan Fletcher is re-elected next year, and if a Democrat can turn District 5 blue, the board would have a 4-1 Democratic majority.

Assemblywoman Lorena Gonzales was rumored to be promoting state Assemblyman Brian Maienschein to run for the 5th District seat, and Carlsbad City Councilwoman Dr. Priya Bhat-Patel was thought to be looking into dropping her plans to for State Senate and running to unseat Desmond. A Maienschein representative and Bhat-Patel both declined to comment. But Applegate says he will run, and that he will make an official announcement after the politically dormant month of August.

Desmond did not specifically respond to questions about facing off against Applegate. He instead offered this comment in a July 14 email: "I've devoted my energy over the last year and a half to ensure that the County of San Diego did its level best to provide the full range of health services for residents in response to the COVID-19 virus. I've also tried to find a balance in allowing people to get back to work, and our kids back in the classroom. I'm proud of my accomplishments in this first term and I look forward to serving

district, especially with his military background as a retired Marine Colonel. I think he would give Desmond a run for his money." But Gartner says the upcoming redistricting, to be announced later this year, could change everything. Applegate lives in Carlsbad, which could be taken out of District 5 (Oceanside, Vista, Fallbrook, Borrego Springs) and moved into District 3 (Encinitas, Solana Beach, Escondido, Tierrasanta).

"I have no interest in speaking ill of other fellow Democrats," says Applegate of the June primary that will send the top two vote-getters to the November 2022 general election. "Let's have an honest campaign. Let's agree on the facts, and then talk about how we will address the issues facing the voters of D-5. We've got to get away from putting party over constituents." Applegate says he will concentrate on his endorsements, election staff and contributions over the next two months.

Meanwhile, Bhat-Patel was mentioned by name as a possible recall target at the July 13 Carlsbad City Council meeting. Real estate agent Katie Taylor was speaking on behalf of Save Carlsbad, the group which spearheaded the effort to recall Carlsbad Councilwoman Cori Schumacher. After Save Carlsbad declared it had collected 800 more signatures than it needed to force a recall election, Schumacher decided to resign. Schumacher had become a kind of folk hero when she helped organize Save the Strawberry Fields, a grassroots effort that successfully defeated L.A. Developer Rick Caruso's plan to build a development on the banks of the Hedionda Lagoon. And she was first elected to the city

council in 2016. But last year, she drew heat from restaurant owners and employees over her outspoken support of stricter covid lockdown measures. She also filed a restraining order against two Carlsbad locals and a Palm Springs resident who publicly chastised her. The order was denied by a judge, and Schumacher was forced to pay more than \$47,000 in court costs connected with the so-called anti-SLAPP motion.

At the July 13 Carlsbad Council meeting, Taylor was on a tear, having just secured Schumacher's resignation four days earlier. Taylor said she had watched things in Carlsbad go from bad to worse, that trash and homeless tents has tormented Los Angeles, Oakland and Venice Beach, and that Carlsbad could quickly follow suit. But she never explained how Schumacher had actually contributed to Carlsbad's decline, except to say Schumacher was trying to destroy Carlsbad from within. And she suggested that other Carlsbad City Council recall efforts could be coming, saying, "We will not tolerate another toxic city council member who does not support and respect the Carlsbad police department." Taylor also did not explain

County mayors and [county supervisor] Jim Desmond with you." Taylor then replied, "We the people will not tolerate another city council person to sit silent when their colleague uses vulgar language, heinous, unfounded accusations against mayors or Jim Desmond." (Desmond spokesperson Miles Himmel said he was aware of the tweet but that his office would have no response to either Schumacher's tweet or Taylor's tirade.) Taylor said she wanted the Carlsbad city council to issue a proclamation that would say Carlsbad was officially sorry for Schumacher's behavior, and also asked that the council "re-vote" on items that Schumacher had voted on — including approvals on a clean energy alliance, homeless vouchers, and the city's trash contract. She said those decisions were tainted by Schumacher.

Even though Taylor noted that none of the other four Carlsbad city council members corrected Democrat Schumacher, her threats for additional recalls were directed only at the two remaining Democratic councilmembers: "Your recall may be next, Council members [Teresa] Acosta and Bhat-Patel, we are speaking directly to you." She did not threaten Republicans Mayor Matt Hall or Deputy Mayor Keith Blackburn. Taylor did not return a phone call asking for explanations regarding her Schumacher attacks or her decision to threaten only Democrats.

Is Roe go an oh no for Faulconer?

Strategist slips up with **Trump-trashing tactic**

Jason Cabel Roe, the onetime political eyes, ears — and, some say, brain — of GOP San Diego mayor Kevin Faulconer, is out as executive director of Michigan's Republican Party. "I resigned my position as executive director and the rea-

sons will remain between me and Chairman Weiser," Roe told the Detroit Free Press in a July 14 statement, referring to Michigan **GOP Party Chairman Ron Weiser.**

Roe's abrupt exit is attributed to anti-Trump statements the ex-California political guru has made, including telling Politico, "the election wasn't stolen" and that "there is no one to blame but Trump" for his presidential election defeat. If so, the news of Roe's fall comes at an awkward time for Faulconer, who is running for California governor as an ostensible moderate with extensive financial backing from a bevy of super-rich pro-Trump donors. They include Mark and Susan Groff (she gave \$185,000 to Trump last year), Barbara Grimm Marshall (she gave Trump \$350,000), and Beverly Hills shopping center czar Robert Zarnegin, who came up with \$375,000 for the Trump cause. Dallas billionaire Darwin Deason, who owns a lavish La Jolla oceanside mansion, is another Trumpbacking Faulconer donor, giving \$64,800,

"I believe he was fired for not resigning," Debra Ell, a pro-Trump Michigan organizer said on Facebook of Roe, according to the Free Press. "This is just beginning of the RINO Hunt," Ell added, using an acronym standing for "Republican In Name Only."

A behind-the-scenes player during much of Faulconer's mayoral tenure. Roe was called out in February 2015 by then-Chargers special counsel Mark Fabiani for his stadiumrelated lobbying activities on behalf of food and beverage vendor Delaware North. "We write to clarify the legal and practical role that your political advisors are playing in the

operations of your new stadium Task Force," Fabiani wrote in a February 17, 2015 letter to the mayor. "When the meeting between the Chargers' representative and the Task Force began, your chief political consultant, Jason Cabel Roe, sat with the Task Force throughout the entire meeting. What legal and ethical issues are raised by Mr. Roe's dual role as an apparent de facto Task Force member and as a registered lobbyist for the Delaware North company, which is bidding to become the new concessionaire at Qualcomm Stadium and, potentially, at any new stadium in San Diego?" Added Fabiani, "Putting the legal and ethical issues aside for a moment, what sense does it make to have someone who is your chief advisor on political matters, and who advises a potential stadium vendor on business matters, play any sort of role with the 'independent' Task Force? Have you asked the City Attorney for an opinion on the propriety of Mr. Roe's intensive involvement with the Task Force's work? If you have not yet asked for such an opinion from the City Attorney, do you intend to do so?"

Delaware North eventually got the stadium deal, but Roe subsequently left the San Diego influence-peddling business and decamped to Bloomfield, Michigan, setting up an outfit he called Roe Strategic. Billed as a "Republican Strategist", Roe appeared on KUSI-TV here on July 8, saying, "I do think that Kevin is very well positioned to benefit from being I think the most credible, substantive candidate."



Political roller coaster The San

Diego Coaster Company, which runs the cityowned Giant Dipper roller coaster and related Belmont Park amusements, paid \$12,000 to Sacramento-based Axiom Advisors in the first three months of 2021. The work entailed lobbying the California legislature and gov-

ernor's office regarding "Pandemic-Related Health Issues," per an April 30, 2021, filing. In December of last year, the Los Angeles Times raised a series of questions regarding Axiom and its close ties to Gavin Newsom. The Democratic governor's appearance at the 50th birthday bash of Axiom partner Jason Kinney at Yountville's posh French Laundry on November 6 had kicked off a storm of contro-

From Newsom's inauguration in 2019 through the end of September 2020, Axiom reported a total of \$10.9 million for lobbying work."... apparel from the United States Golf Association worth a total of \$178.50, in connection with the USGA Tournament Opening.

No hablo español Non-Englishspeaking patients at UCSD Health-run hospitals and clinics may be getting second-class service at the tax-financed facilities, per a newly-released March 15 internal audit report. "Out of the 15 [Limited English Proficiency] patients selected, 13 patients had a Preferred Language noted as Spanish," says the document. "Since Spanish is the language that represents 5% of the geographical area served, California Health and Safety Code 1259 states that written documentation related to consent forms and [After Visit Summaries] are required to be provided in Spanish." But that wasn't always the case, the auditors discovered. "In some of the patient records we sampled, the native language of the person was who was signing on behalf of the patient was not clear. This raises questions whether the written document was understood by the person signing, and whether information of interpreter

> services available at no cost was provided to the person." The audit details a raft of other Spanish-speaking communication gaffes. "Some units have a practice to encourage the family member to translate. [UCSD Health] policy allows a family member (with patient's permission) to assist with providing limited, simple interpreting/translation services, such as simple patient instructions, making appoint-

ments, or registering and verifying insurance. However, if significant health information is communicated, a qualified interpreter should be used." Concludes the report: "Based on interviews, it appeared that monitoring processes within clinical areas were inconsistent. Staff may also benefit from additional or more frequent compliance training or communications, as some staff seemed to be unfamiliar with the resources available or certain aspects of the policy. We also identified areas where UCSDH Interpreter Services

> Policy could be enhanced to provide guidance on assessing preferred language when another authorized person signs forms on the patient's behalf and the need for interpreter services in those cases. Also, the policy did not contain information of the process for UCSDH faculty and staff to become qualified interpreters by completing the [Language Proficiency Assessment]."

Terminal lobbying The San Diego County Regional Airport Authority paid \$22,500 to Sacramento-based Cruz Strategies to lobby regarding two bills during the first quarter of the year, per an April 8 disclosure report. "AB 302 expands the authority of [Metropolitan Transit System] to regulate for-hire vehicle services in San Diego County and any City within the County of San Diego regardless of MTS jurisdiction," says an Assembly staff analysis of the legislation. No opposition emerged, and the bill passed both houses. On July 5 it went to Governor **Gavin Newsom** to meet its final fate. Also, according to the filing, another piece of legislation favored by the airport authority, the socalled California Tourism Recovery Act, got continued on page 13

You can probably chalk a lot of that up to it being a very different time. there is still a vocal minority of people who think that's a much more interesting way to live life. They point to the slew of socalled "unbreakable" baseball records - many of which were accomplished in the older, weirder days of the game - as evidence of a superior time. But these

people remain a vocal minority, and it's not likely that the collective hivemind of sports fans will suddenly wake up and decide the game we know and love today would be a lot better if the pitchers could spit on the ball and the players were less discouraged from sharpening their cleats in an effort to eviscerate infielders. So, what do you call a vocal minority with a yen for the obscure and antiquated? Those guys (because, let's face it, they're almost all guys) yearning for the good old days are hipster hardcore in their own way, and it all amounts to just another way to be outside the mainstream with the rest of us hipsters.

He responded: "Tac, Paul, California Mexican, born in January, 1822, at the Mission of San Luis Rey, Latin Rite. Entered [Urban College] on September 23, 1834. Studied Grammar, Humanities and Rhetoric from 1834-1840. In the month of December,

Who was Pablo Tac? A Luiseño Indian (Payómkawichum). His home was Mission San Luis Rey, founded on June 12, 1798 by Father Junípero Serra's successor, Father Fermín Francisco de Lasuén — the eighteenth of the Spanish missions established in California. Tac was born and baptized on January 15, 1822, soon after the Mexican period began. On January 17, 1832, he left San Diego with the pastor of Mission San Luis Rey, Father Antonio Peyrí, and another Luiseño boy, Agapito Amamix, for the College of San Fernando in Mexico City, where they would stay from November 12, 1832 to January 15, 1834. In February 1834, the three of them departed for Rome from the port of Veracruz, the same port Junípero Serra had used when he arrived in Mexico in 1749. Their ship stopped in New York, France, and Barcelona — where Father Peyrí disembarked. After eight months of travel, the two boys reached Rome. On September 23, 1834, Pablo and Agapito enrolled at the College of Propaganda [today known as Urban College].

Tac's writings are the earliest from a California Indian. While in Rome studying for the Catholic priesthood, Pablo wrote a description of life as a mission Indian (Conversion of the San Luiseños of Alta California, c. 1835), gave a public recitation of a poem at the Polyglot Academy (c. January 1836), created a dictionary of the language of his people (Prima Linguae Californiensis Rudimenta a P. Tak proposita, c. February 1838), and wrote an account of the native peoples in Southern California (De Californiensibus, c. after 1838). In June 2012, a building at Mission San Luis Rey was renamed Pablo Tac Hall, in honor of its native son.

I first came across Tac's writings while researching my first book about Junípero Serra, the founder of the first nine Catholic missions in California. I had been born and raised in California, and so I was shocked that I never heard of him before. Karl Kottman, who was principal at Pala Mission School from 1993-1995, notes that the Tac was still remembered there. In 2019, after I gave a presentation to members of the Tekakwitha Conference about Pablo Tac in Obio, an audience member shared with me that she knew someone who knew someone who knew Pablo Tac well and prayed to him often. I have been on a search to track this person down ever since.

According to a February 16, 2021 article in the *Coast News*, the SLR Renaming Citizens Advisory Committee began calling for name submissions in January 2021. Over 300 names were offered by members of the community. The committee initially did not include a member of the local California Indian peoples until it was recommended to do so by Ben-

jamin Prado and Karen Plascencia during public comments at the February 9, 2021 board of education meeting. trict Board of Education voted 5-0 to name the combined San Luis Rey and Garrison Elementary Schools after Pablo Tac.

Author's note: In June 2020, I finished walking the 800-mile California Missions Trail, the route that connects the twenty-one Catholic missions founded by Franciscan priests between 1769-1823. I prayed often to Saint Junípero Serra (he traversed an estimated 24,000 miles, much of it on foot and in pain). I also prayed to Pablo Tac.

Sea-Don'ts

Pounding surf, impounded watercraft

On July 4, the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department's lifeguards and the San Diego Police Department impounded more than 30 water vessels at Mission Bay. Most of them were personal watercraft, including Kawasaki's jet-skis, Bombardier Recreational Products' Sea-Doos, Yamaha's WaveRunners, and Honda's AquaTrax. These vehicles are considered inboard motor-powered watercraft; they are less than 13 feet long, and the rider sits, kneels, or stands on them. Like roaddriven vehicles, they must be registered, and the paperwork must be kept on board in the vessel's equivalent to a glovebox. While some of the colorful craft impounded that Sunday lacked paperwork, others had been rented

media pages on July 7. "Be aware that renting from an unlicensed lessee could have serious consequences if you crash and cause or suffer injuries or cause damage to a vessel. Unlicensed lessees do not carry insurance!"

Andy K. told me on July 13. "I got a notice

not mine anymore.' I sold it in used condi-

tion to a guy a while ago, and the guy never

changed the registration." Andy is the owner

of Seaforth Boat Rentals in Mission Bay; he rented out all of his personal watercraft and boats long before the holiday weekend. He said his fleet is insured for \$5 million.

"The brick [and mortar] business[es] are haters," a local responded underneath the photos of 30 or so docked water scooters on Facebook. "As long as you have a lic[ense] and insurance, who cares?" From personal experiences riding jet-skis in Mission Bay, I've seen riders flip over when they turn too hard, and newbies getting stranded because the motors are flooded. "If there's an issue, my customers can make a call," said Andy. "We have people on standby who can come out, and I can replace the unit with something else. We have all of the infrastructures to make it a safe and enjoyable experience."

Last August, a 21-year-old man reportedly died after the jet-ski he rode crashed into a boat in Mission Bay. "Then in 2019, another person died at Carlsbad Lagoon," Andy continued. "I believe both of them were from an illegal operator." According to a U.S. Coast Guard report released on June 29, "there were 767 boating fatalities nationwide in 2020, a 25.1 percent increase from 2019." Of the boating fatalities in 2020, 66 were attributed to personal watercraft.

Circular lifesavers

We need Mr. Roundabout!

Scott Ritchie has been called "The Roundabout Guy" ever since he started a company called "Roundabouts & Traffic Engineering" back in 1998. To most of us, the modest roundabout may still feel like a quaint, annoying import from Europe, especially if you're slowing down onetwothreefourfive times while navigating the roundabouts along that obstacle course known as La Jolla Boulevard.

But not Scott Ritchie. He's a transportation engineer who swears roundabouts are the answer to driving's most dangerous challenge: intersections. A quarter of all US road deaths happen there. "Studies have been done into highway safety. Comparing a modern roundabout to a 'Stop'-controlled, or even a signalized-controlled intersection, you have a 90 percent reduction in fatalities. You have an average of an 80 percent reduction in injuryproducing accidents. Those two statistics, which are consistent not just nationally but internationally, are the reason modern roundabouts have done so well in the last ten years. Yes you may get frustrated, because you have to slow down, and you're not sure if the guy is going to yield to you or not, but even if [you hit someone, in a roundabout], you're talking speeds of 20 mph! So just in terms of the safety statistics, why would planners not consider a modern roundabout at every intersection?"

He says roundabouts really didn't catch on as a viable intersection alternative until the year 2000. "We had more and more of them built, and the safety statistics that came out of the UK, France, Germany, Australia, were proving to be true in the US as well." It's not that they're new: the first circular intersection ever built for vehicles was in 1905, he says: Columbus Circle in New York City. "It is still in existence today. Back then, they weren't known as modern roundabouts, they were just circular intersections."

It wasn't until November of 1966 that the UK finally initiated what Ritchie says is the most crucial roundabout law of all, "Yield to circulating traffic." "They studied that 'Yield' condition for about nine years in the UK, and they found that 'Boy, this [roundabout] is not a series

of intersections all around the circle; it's actually one holistic device. And that holistic device functions as a result of the geometry that's imposed by the design." Of course, there are good roundabouts, and not so good roundabouts. "Some [designers] don't know what they're doing. They get a coffee can, they turn it upside down, they draw a circle, and they call it a roundabout. Especially in multi-lane scenarios,

you'll see a lot of bad design. Because what makes a modern roundabout function properly is speed control. If you slow everybody down to 25 mph, and have them drive around an object — which is not always circular — you are eliminating four times the number of potential accidents. A standard intersection has 32 points of conflict, whereas a circular intersection only has eight. So in November of 1966, they made it law that if you're entering a roundabout, you must yield to those [cars] which are [already] circulating. Crucial. Contrary to the belief that the 'yield' condition would actually reduce capacity in the intersection, it increased it, because the jam-up went away as soon as you assigned the right priority to the traffic."

Translation: "You can't enter the circular intersection until you have yielded to someone already in the circle." In the bad old days, you'd enter in, and whichever lane had the most traffic would dominate the entire circle. There was no 'Yield' control. "They were very dangerous. We didn't bring the 'Yield' sign to the United States till 1959. Our first modern roundabout was built in Las Vegas, Nevada in 1990. We were very far behind the rest of the world in terms of the modern roundabout. They quickly

lack of safe distance [visibility] due to overgrown landscaping. But in general, even a bad roundabout is going to function better than a good signal [intersection], both in capacity and safety."

Plus, roundabouts are cheaper. Way cheaper. "You don't need the technology, traffic lights, actuators, sensors to trip the signals, video detection, loop detectors, magnets in the road to sense the vehicle, blah blah blah. With a modern roundabout, you don't have anything

learned that signalizing roundabouts does not work. They'd make it four times worse. So they ended up taking out the signal, and converting them to smaller, modern roundabouts, and all of a sudden, they started working!"

Says Ritchie, "The whole concept is to get everyone to enter into the roundabout with what I call self-enforcing geometry. And that self-enforcing geometry is essentially the design of the roundabout. If you have a proper to break!" Ritchie says a typical traffic signal is going to run about \$30,000-\$40,000 per year, just to maintain. "The only thing you need to maintain a modern roundabout is the landscaping! Imagine a corridor like La Jolla Boulevard: you've got five roundabouts in a row. If those were signals, you'd be looking at about half a million a year, just to maintain the existing signals. But if you were going to create a whole new roundabout, you'd be thinking

design, by somebody who really understands roundabouts, it's going to function with that self-enforcing speed control to get everyone to enter in at roughly 25 mph, circulate around the roundabout and exit. And if it has been done right, it's very comfortable to drive."

So how does La Jolla Boulevard rate, with its five roundabouts? Not so great. "Unfortunately, too many people are drawing these coffee-can circles and calling them roundabouts when they're really just old traffic circles with very uncomfortable geometry, very abrupt, tight entries, and tight exits. La Jolla Boulevard has fairly constrained, tight, small, dingaling roundabouts. And they have flaws, such as

\$5-600,000 as a one-time cost. No comparison!

But above all this, Ritchie says he's touting his "back to the future" concept for one reason: "I'm in the business of saving lives. I'll give you one more example: For the first modern roundabout ever put on a state highway in Arizona, I did 'before' and 'after' studies. Before, you had 24 injury-producing accidents and five fatalities during the last three years of the signals. During the last five years of the modern roundabout that replaced them, there were zero fatalities, and zero injury-producing accidents. So based on those statistics, why would you not consider [replacing lights with] a modern roundabout?"








And now, only a month before the election, Hap was teaching him how to handle a six-gun. Getting elected was going to be easier than staying alive. San Diego wasn't

A Clash of Conscience

The next time I looked across the street, the anti-abortion people had shouldered their signs and were marching around in a brave little circle. They were hopelessly outnumbered, but the ten of them walked gamely around and around, clutching their signs and staring straight ahead. News in letters from SDSU students in World War II

hen the United States entered World War II, numerous San Diego State College (now University) students joined up and shipped out. Doctor Lauren Post, a professor of geography, recalled the loneliness he had felt while far from home as a sailor during World War I, and invited those Aztecs to write to him. He then excerpted their letters and compiled them into a monthly newsletter that he mailed to servicemen around the world. With help from volunteers on campus, he published and distributed the Aztec News Letter for four years, meticulously keeping track of endless address changes as his recipients were moved from one place to another. By the war's end, Doc Post had amassed a collection of more than 4500 letters, now archived in the special collections at San Diego State.

Today, local author and community college professor Lisa K. Shapiro finds that she is teaching many students who are transitioning from military to civilian life. Shapiro uses Post's letters at the outset of her business communications classes, and says that they serve as "an ice-breaker, allowing me to better connect with students who are veterans. I like to show them how powerful letters can be." Eventually, Shapiro began poring over the issues of the Aztec News Letter to create a book about Post's remarkable correspondence: No Forgotten Fronts: From Classrooms to Combat. What follows are selections from the University's collection, with occasional introductions for context.

Where the Boys are Separated from the Men

Herman Addleson was born with a cleft lip that disqualified him from military service. He wanted to serve his country alongside his peers, but he could not afford the corrective procedure. When his former schoolmate and pro baseball legend Ted Williams learned of this obstacle to his friend's service, he sponsored the surgery. Addleson became a paratrooper, along with fellow Aztec Tom Rice. They were both on the cross-country team at State, and they were both at Normandy with the Army's 101st Airborne Division. Rice came home, Addleson did not. Addleson was posthumously awarded the Purple Heart. Rice earned two Purple Hearts for his service. (Rice parachuted into Normandy on D-Day in 1944. Seventyfive years later, on June 6, 2019, he marked the anniversary by doing it again — at age 96. A native of Coronado, he still lives there.)

NOVEMBER 5, 1942 Dear Doctor Post,

As I read the captions 1st Lt. & 2nd Lt. in the News Letter I feel funny in writing and not being in the same class as they. Yet even as a "Buck Private" (with hopes of officer training) I feel that I am proud to serve my country, no matter how small or how large my rank may be. My admiration for all my college friends, who are serving in the highest ranks and may they continue to advance and end this conflict in safety.

Regardless of what the comments may be on being drafted you really have an opportunity in this army. It[sic] clean living and wholesome ideals and I'm for it 100%.

Thanks again Doc Post for your kindness and also give my regards to Andy and Clarence & tell them to drop me a line. (Boy Im[sic] sure far from home.) Sincerely, Pvt. Herman Addleson HQCo BN#2 120th Inf. Camp Blanding Florida Fort Benning, Georgia

NOVEMBER 17, 1943 Hello Doc.

Thanks for *News Letter* #20. I see the boys are really doing great. I am now a qualified Paratrooper, and am really proud to be one. Made five jumps, three from 1200 ft. and two from 800 ft.

My first jump was Monday, Oct. 18, 1943, a day I'll never forget as long as I live. We were all up at 5:45 a.m. that morning, many of us had a very restless night. Our thoughts ran in common, I guess, for

our past seemed to flash through all of our minds. It was cold & foggy that day & we marched over to the field, we were all trying to sing. Yes, sing, even if our voices did crack a little. Everyone was excited, nervous & mostly scared. As we took our parachutes out of the bins, I looked at mine & I guess I said a prayer. 'Please dear chute open for me.'

As we lined up, 24 men

in front of the plane, my knees felt like water...

The next commands came very fast... 'Stand up.' All of us managed to stand and grab the cable above our head. 'Hook up,' 'Check equipment,' &

Each jump after that is the same, only with more tensifying[sic] fear as you know what's coming. Yet it is safe as driving a car or anything else that has the word safe with it.

Don't forget, it's right here, where the boys are separated from the men...

Wish all the boys luck for me cause I'll soon be there...

JUNE 28, 1944
Dear Doc Post,

Myron G. Sessions, Herman Addleson and I have been on the continent since D-Day at H minus five hours and we weren't early either. Jumped in Normandy at 1:31 am June 6, D Day. The reception which was given us was really torrid. They threw everything at us including the kitchen sink. The sky was lit up as bright as day, ack ack bursts, streams of red, green and white tracers converged on us and showery bursts of flares outlined us in the sky as we neared our drop zone.

I was no. 1 man waiting to push the equipment bundles out on the 'go' signal. As soon as we sighted the French coast we stood up and hooked up. The flak was coming in the door and I could hear it clattering against


the fuselage beneath me. The 'go' signal came and the bundles were cumbersome to get out because we [were] trying to avoid ack ack by fishtailing and diving. After the bundles cleared the plane the men began to get out at double

time. As I left the plane my arm got hooked in the door and I was hung up with my arm inside and my body outside, finally slipped free when I straightened my arm. We were about 500 feet then and going about 135 mph, couldn't slow down cause we would be an easier target. We were getting enough flak at the time anyway. Luckily I wasn't hit at all. My wristwatch came off and is probably in the possession of the crew chief now. I came in on a field which was patterned by canals. I didn't get wet even though my 'chute reinflated and I was being pulled toward a canal. I cut the suspension line in time. I couldn't get out of my harness because I had so much equipment on, couldn't even get my weapon out. Finally had to cut my way out. We organized and raised hell behind enemy lines 'til the Seaborne troops reached us. Gliders came in after we started on Hitler's SS men and General Pratt was killed in one as it struck an anti airborne obstacle not far from where we were. The gliders were duck soup

Since our arrival on French soil I have had some close brushes with Hitler's Satellites and came out the lucky one thus far. One can't be too cautious at any moment or during any movement.

It seems that every French farm house has a wine cellar with four or five casks of about 75 gal capacity full of cider, even some hard stuff has been uncovered. The fruit in the orchards is getting ripe and the summer storms are frequent. A lot of this fighting has been from hedge row to hedge row, no picnic.

A Little **Personal Grudge**

...Everything has been going along fine since my graduation from flying school last July - and since my marriage the same day! Pat has been with me here in Spokane and we have been, and are, very happy.

The shock of Tom's sudden death has gradually worn away, and now it is hard for me to realize that he really has left us. I feel now that have a little personal grudge to satisfy in this war and I am becoming more and more anxious to get over there where I can do something about it...

I am flying B17 'flying fortresses' here, and I really do like them. Also flew some of Consolidated's B24 'Liberators,' the first month I was here — they are a 'sweet' ship also. Guess I will cut this off here 'Doc.' Sincerely, **Bob Cozens**

No Complaints

Lt. Gordon Clark Chamberlain was a glider pilot, flying one of the first gliders to land in France. He earned an Air Medal with two oak leaf clusters and a Purple Heart. He made it through D-Day but was killed in action on March 24, 1945 in Germany.

FRIDAY, AUGUST 18, 1944 England Dear Doc.

Received News Letter #29 and I certainly was glad to hear that so many of the boys came through the D-Day landings safely...

There's not much I can add to the accounts given of our particular part in the initial landings [page torn]. ...that I know of not a single glider pilot who does [page torn] put the paratroopers in a degree heretofore unknown. Those boys were at a tremendous disadvantage when they were dropped in there, and no one needs to tell of the splendid job they did while they were over there.

Those boys in the medical outfits cannot be praised too highly, either. I know of many an airborne man who would not be alive today had it not been for the tireless efforts of those medics - many of whom made excellent targets for German snipers, and many times the snipers did not fail to take advantage of it, either.

MAY 10, 1945 Dear Dr. Post,

...Sure, the Air Force and Navy have lost a lot of men. But — how nice it must be to die on a nice clean deck in nice clean clothes with a stomach full of good, warm food. How nice it must be to die in a nice clean plane doing something you like and knowing that a bed, hot chow, women and everything warm await you at your base.

I wonder if these big shots have ever seen a mangled body lying in a stinking gutter in a lousy, stinking Krout town [?] I wonder if these heroes have ever lain on a snowy hill, half frozen, always hungry and scared, and listened to the strangled wail of 'Medic' on a dark night; knowing that the medics are too busy to help most of the wounded, knowing that to attempt to evacuate the wounded is almost impossible. Have they ever heard artillery crashing down on their stranded unit for 12 hours straight, slowly dying minute after minute? Have they ever sat all night in a frozen foxhole and listened to Panzers moving just over the hill,

knowing that if they attacked there would be no stopping them?

I doubt if any of these beribboned glamour boys have ever seen or done any of these things.

Do the people at home realize who has actually fought this war? Sincerely, S/Sgt. Wm. B. Boone

OCTOBER 12, 1944 Dear Doc, et. al:

Received the September *News Letter* in my Peleliu Fox Hole a few days ago. We're back a few hundred yards now, resting for another go at the yellow so

& so's. This has been by far the hardest fought & bloodiest fight so far. The news reports we've seen don't even begin to give a picture of the Hell it's been for four long weeks.

A Lieutenant gave his life to save mine on D day [generic term for the day the invasion began]. All I got was a tiny scratch on the leg. He started to enter a pill box which was supposed to be cleaned out. It wasn't & he jumped back with three .25 slugs in his stomach. I ran over to him and laid him down behind a pill box, dressed his worst

wound and was about to start on the others when a Jap tossed a grenade at us which landed only a few feet away. I tried to pick up the Lieutenant but couldn't as he was a pretty big lad, when I failed I turned around and looked for help. There was no one around. At that instant the Lieut. got to his feet, and with a neat football block, knocked me down & covered me with his own body, taking the full blast of the grenade. I got up and finally managed to half drag & carry (with his help) him out







San Diego desert and mountain thunderheads pop up in afternoon

Cumulonimbus Clouds, or thunderheads, are most likely to form over San Diego County's deserts and mountains during the latter part of the summer season, beginning about late July. The clouds appear by midafternoon — often the result of moist, tropical air entering the county from the south or southeast. If intense, these cloud buildups are accompanied by enough rain to flood the desert washes and mountain drainages. When the weather pattern allows the movement of moist air beyond the mountain barriers, even coastal San Diego County can experience the cool spatter of raindrops and spectacular evening lightning displays.

Elderberry, a common bush or small tree found from San Diego County's coastal canyons to the mountain slopes around Julian and Palomar, is in fruit this month. The branches carry myriads of tiny bluish fruits covered with a white powder. The fruits have traditionally been used for various drinks and preserves.

Orioles, the bright yellow or yellow-orange-and-black birds seen flitting among the palm trees, are summer residents of San Diego County's coastal areas. A century ago, the orioles preferred

to nest in sycamore trees, which were then more common in our area's river bottoms. Today these birds are most likely to take up residence in the planted or volunteer palm trees, where they obtain fiber to build their nests from the easily shredded fronds.

Fourth star of the Summer Triangle. The next-brightest star near the Summer Triangle is Rasalhague, the head of Ophiuchus. First identify the Triangle. Face east soon after dark and crane your neck high to spot bright Vega. Look two fists lower left of it for Deneb. Three or four fists lower right of Vega is Altair. Next, Rasalhague. As you still face east, it's three fists to the right of Vega and three fists upper right of Altair. Admittedly, at 2nd magnitude it's not as bright as the three Triangle stars. But include it and you've got a giant, flattened quadrilateral.

The Moon, just after full, is up shining brightly in the east by late twilight. Look for Saturn about a fist at arm's length to the Moon's left. By dawn on the 24th they shift to the southwest and twist around so that Saturn is above the Moon.

San Diego Reader: What is your favorite subiect on which to preach?

Rabbi Devorah Marcus: One of the rabbis we were trained under looked at the room full of rabbinic students one day and said, "Every rabbi gives one sermon over and over again. The

great rabbis have two sermons. The exceptional rabbis have three." Then he looked at us again and said, "None of you are exceptional and none of you are great." So the sermon I give over and over again is for people to be kind and loving to one another. That is at the heart of justice and healing the world — loving and caring for one another as human beings. **SDR**: What is the mission of your synagogue?

RM: Our mission is to create a vibrant, thriving Jewish community here in our corner of San Diego, and to create space that is loving, embracing and accepting to everyone who walks through our doors. **SDR**: Where is the strangest place you found God?

RM: I had a wonderful encounter with a homeless man while I was in rabbinical school. I was driving on Shabbat early Saturday morning, trying to get down to Orange County to see my parents for Shabbat. I was hungry and pulled off to get a burrito to eat on the way down. I said sarcastically in my head, "God, I know I'm driving on Shabbat and spending money and cash on Shabbat. If there's some way I can make it up to you, let me know." Right then, I heard noise to my left — it was a homeless person digging through the trash at the restaurant. See what happens when you're a

sarcastic jackass with God? I

felt called at that moment — I

saw him and recognized him as a human being.... So I bought two breakfast burritos that morning, and gave some extra cash to this lovely man, who I called "Friend." I addressed him as Friend every time I saw him after that. I regularly went to the taco stand every week and left money so they'd give him food... I was happy that, on that random Saturday morning at that taco shop, God was right there, waiting to answer my sarcasm.

SDR: Where do you go when

RM: In the laws of physics, nothing ever ends; it just changes form and expression. We are in a constant cosmic cycle of rebirth and

re-death; the only constancy in the universe is change. So death is just an exchange. I don't know what it looks like after we die, and nor would I presume to guess because no one alive has ever been dead. I do believe there is existence beyond this existence, but I don't know if it's sentient. But then you meet people in this

world, and know your souls have known each other a million lifetimes over — and you become best friends! I'm open to all the possibilities. But I don't believe in the concept of heaven and hell, someplace of eternal damnation. I don't see any evidence of that kind of cruelty of thought in anything that's been designed in the universe we inhabit. The very notion that people would be punished for all eternity for the frailty, stupidity and worst potential of humanity - I don't accept that premise. So I can tell you what I don't believe.

Kensington Brewing Torero Blue and Bold

When students move back into University of San Diego dorms this fall, they will find that the home of the Toreros is featuring a new set of official school beers: Torero Blue and Torero Bold are now the products of a neighborhood brewery on the opposite side of Mission Valley: Kensington Brewing Company.

Brewery founders Andy Rogers and Zach Knipe are USD alums with ties to the school going back two decades. Since graduating, they've both worked there as contractors, and Knipe spent five years as the campus director of planning. design, and construction.

Absolution Brewing Company had previously brewed beers of the same name, but when the opportunity came up for a new official brewery partner to take over, Kensington reached out to the school with a pitch. A campus group of beer connoisseurs took an interest. "They got to chatting," says Knipe, "and it seemed like a good fit." He adds that the group had very clear ideas which traits they preferred in the beers. "They came in for a couple of nights and did tastings, and then gave us other parameters that they were looking for."

As befitting a school bearing the San Diego name, Torero Bold is an IPA. Torero Blue turns out to be a blonde ale. Cans of the beers, bearing the school's blue and white colors, debuted this spring during games hosted by the two professional sports teams that call the university's Torero Stadium home: Major League Rugby's San Diego Legion, and United Soccer League's San Diego Loyal. As covid restrictions ease at

the stadium, the beers will be available on draft, alongside a selection of **Stone**-affiliated beers And by time the Loval's season ends, the Bold and Blue will be poured at other campus drinking venues, year-round. They'll also be served at Torero football games, during basketball games at Jenny Craig Pavilion, and during baseball games at Fowler Park.

With Kensington brewing tanks now dedicated to brewing Torero beer full time, an uptick in demand is pushing the microbrewer's production capacity. Once the pandemic hit, the business consolidated all its brewing operations to the modest confines of its Adams Avenue tap room. Meanwhile, it adapted by finding a bigger market in canning and distribution.

With more beer moving out the door as the economy reopens, and a new outdoor

drinking patio set to open in the pub's back lot later this summer, Knipe says the partners are searching for a new brewing space. Most likely in Miramar.

I wasn't surprised that food choices included flatbreads, burgers, and wings — add fish tacos and you pretty much looking at the official bar menu of San Diego.

Now that I think about it, there *were* fish tacos. Beer battered halibut (\$12 for two), which is a heck of a lot better than the tilapia a lot of places fry up. They were pretty good for fish tacos purchased outside a Mexican restaurant.

Hidden Craft's only culinary category would be *beer-friendly*. Sharable plates include Belgian mussels (\$16), brisket poutine (\$13), and baby back ribs glazed with the Korean chili paste *gochujang* (\$16). There's the proverbial something for everyone, including special dieters seeking salads, grain bowls, or vegan Korean beef tacos.

I had high hopes for a \$15 "charcuterie and artisan cheese" board, but it leaned a little closer to something I might throw together for a third-date picnic than antipasto, with a serving of pepper jack and apple slices for every bit of brie and prosciutto. So cheese snobs may not be impressed — but revisit that board after your second round of self-pours and tell me you aren't glad you ordered it. Something on the belly will serve you well during the train ride ahead.

Oh, and try not to miss your train.

12-inch vinyl EP is still months out, due to the crazy pressing backlogs, so in the meantime, we'll be doing several digital releases," says Dewey Defeats Truman singer-bassist James Reader, who's working with Scott

went our separate ways. We weren't in touch much until [promoter] Tim Pyles reached out to me to see if we would do one of his 30-year 91X Loudspeaker anniversary shows [circa 2018]. We also did two shows in 2019: one of the Casbah 30-year anniversary shows, and La Escalera

leased. But it's longer, and would've taken more work and footage to get it done. I burned through several years' worth of timelapse material I had saved up just to have enough for 'Blue Ruin."

For the new EP, Scott Frazier tracked his drums at Thunderdome Studios near his Sacramento home. "When we first re-formed, Scott was flying down once or twice a month," says Reader. "He'd get in on a Friday night, we would rehearse all day Saturday, then all head to my house and work on stuff until all hours. On

Frazier and Mark MacBride on the band's first new music in around 20 years. A digital 7-inch is streaming online, Always Waiting in the Wrong Line, featuring two new tracks, "Bumped" and "Broken People." The songs were recorded remotely during the pandemic, with more due later this year via Silver Girl Records.

The band was formed in the late 1990s by members of Red Dye No. 5 and Luper, and earned a reputation as a fiery concert act thanks to tour slots opening for Jesus Lizard, Archers of Loaf, and Kelley Deal, as well as festival appearances at NXNW in Portland, SXSW in Austin, and NYC's CMJ Music Festival. They became inactive around 2003. According to Reader, "DDT basically stopped because our van, Air Force One, died towards the end of a regional make-up tour we did after we missed some shows on a CMJ tour. We didn't have the money to fix it, and we were all pretty exhausted mentally and physically. We decided to take three months off, and kept extending it. After a year, we quietly just loaded out of our rehearsal space and all

Fest OCHO."

"Yeah," adds singer-guitarist Mark MacBride, "after those three shows, we realized that only playing 20-year-old tunes wasn't super interesting to us long term, so we held off on booking more and shifted our focus to working on new stuff"

A new video is streaming online: "Blue Ruin," from their 2000 album B-Sides, Rarities and Out-Takes. Why make a new video for an old song instead of a current track? "We were actually already well into writing new stuff by then, and knew we would eventually resurface in some form," says Reader. "We wanted to start re-introducing ourselves, and a video for 'Blue Ruin' made sense because Keith [York, of Silver Girl Records] had pressed it into a gorgeous transparent blue 7-inch for the 2018 shows. It was one of the first things Silver Girl had done in a long while, and other than the shows, we never really promoted it." MacBride reveals that "the other option was to make a video for 'Reverse Status,' which is the B-side to 'Blue Ruin' on that 7-inch, and one that was previously unreSunday morning, we would wake up, make a big breakfast, and then do another all-day rehearsal. When covid started, that kind of threw us off, so we started sending files back and forth. But during the shutdown, we booked some time with Jeff Forrest at [San Diego studio] Doubletime."

Frazier picks up the chronology. "We started to record remotely, mainly for demos. I was using an electric Roland kit. After talking back and forth, we decided that we could record these new songs ourselves, aside from the studio sessions we had done at Doubletime. I built a drum studio at my house in Sacramento to track real acoustic drums. Mark has a full studio at his house, and James is set up to track bass at his pad. We send all the files to Mark for mixing."

So why, 20 years after disbanding, is Dewey Defeats Truman making new music? Says Reader, "We're doing it because we're all older now, and have been through loss and other struggles that help you with perspective. We do it because we all mean a lot to each other, and we just enjoy being in the same space, and

but ourselves, and that makes everything a lot more fun."

A visit from Valle Jazz guitar man Jaime Valle has been a force on the San Diego scene for many decades. That staved true even after he moved to the picturesque Mexican town of San Miguel de Allende. I was curious for a report about how his community was responding to the pandemic. "Well, there were no rebels against the rules," he says. "It's been almost four months since we've had a case. The band features Otmaro Ruiz on keyboards, Allan Phillips on percussion, John Pena on bass, Anibal Marcelo Seminario on saxophones, and jazz fusion icon Alex Acuna on drums. (Even casual jazz fans will recognize Acuna's name from

Speaking of long-term connections, Valle has known Athenaeum Jazz director Dan Atkinson "so long I can't even attach a date to it. In the old days, I used to play all over town, and I used to gig at Elario's in La Jolla every Friday night. It was probably back then. He's a guitar player too,

Now that he's been away for a few years, what does Valle miss most? "Trader Joe's," he says, before erupting into laughter. "Well, to be serious, I come to San Diego quite a bit. My kids and my grandkids all live here. It's a three-hour flight to Tijuana, and then I cross over at that new bridge they have with no problems. But I can say with confidence that I miss [bassist] Bob Magnusson. I miss [saxophonist] Tripp Sprague. I miss [drummer] Duncan Moore and [drummer] Richard Sellers. I miss [bassist] Rob Thorsen. There is so much talent in this town. Talent like that just doesn't grow on trees. I've been all over the world; even in Europe when I was touring with Mundell Lowe, it was really hard to hire a cat with the talent of a Bob Magnusson. When I lived here,

SPICE PISTOLS

"We're heading out on tour with Agent Orange for a 16-date tour through the Pacific Northwest, beginning July 31 at the Casbah and running through August 21," says Sppike Mike Muellenberg of Spice Girls-Sex Pistols mashup The Spice Pistols. "To date, five shows have reported being sold out, including the Casbah date. We're currently in talks with a record label on the release of our five song EP Spice Train, and a following series of singles on vinyl. I'm also working on a solo project is called the Sppike Mike Contraption. The first EP will be called Runaway Brain, we're looking at a release around November." In addition, a multi-artist pro-amateur charity

record called Music's Future is nearing completion. "We currently have two songs in the can and three more in production. ELEKTRIC VOODOO

Bandleader Scott Tournet first put Elektric Voodoo together in 2016, around the time he ended his 12 year run with Grace Potter & Nocturnals. The band recently released a new single called "Wake Up," followed by "Telescope," the latter also being the title track of their upcoming album, due August 20. According to Tournet, "I've been peering through a telescope, looking at the world up close, but never opening up both eyes. These lyrics from the title track summarize the plight of the main character through the first half of the record. On top of a heavy funk and afrobeat groove, this song

stacks blissed-out synths and delayed guitars that drift along with a song that could work in a stripped down singer-songwriter setting. An amalgamation of genres and elements that are disparate but blend in a natural way, created and crafted with intent, *Telescope* is a concept album that presents a conscious shift from internal to external and intended to be listened straight through. The album is 9-songs deep that tells a story of a journey through self-reflection, evaluation of mortality, confrontation of death, and eventually dawns a new perspective." The release party happens August 13 at Winstons in OB.



THE NEW REGIME

The solo project from Nine Inch Nails and Angels & Airwaves drummer Ilan Rubin (the youngest inducted member of the Rock & Roll Hall Of Fame), the New Regime, recently released two live videos, "Turning A Blind Eye" and "Feel No Pain," both directed by Matt Thompson with more videos in this series to appear later this year. "The singles showcase the more aggressive side of [new album] Heart Mind Body & Soul," says Rubin. "Both songs have an edge rooted in discontentment with



Back in 2008, she had supported the release of my LP The Richard Dastardly Identity, and I always

appreciated that. I thought she would just let me lace a few of her previously released tracks, but instead by February she handed me ten brand spanking new tracks. Over the subsequent months, I wrote and recorded my vocals. At that point, the album was sounding great, but we had bare choruses, so I wanted to bring in some scratch hook muscle. I reached out to DJs Sy-Matic and Waxsmith, and they delivered the goods big time. The final stage was mixing, mastering, and doing the cover art." The album is nominated Best Hip-Hop at the 2021 San Diego Music Awards.

IMMORTAL BEAUTY

Music as means of meditation

The ideology of woke culture is one thing. Meditating every day and thereby developing the ability to effectively respond to life's situations instead of merely reacting, is another. Meditation is the path to a consistently happy and healthy life. This fact has been verified over thousands of years by some of the greatest teachers of humanity. Call it prayer or contemplation if you must.

Happiness and health are the tests of an ideology, in my opinion. If the adherents of an ideology project perennial happiness and health, there is something of substance there. Yet the ideology of meditation is no ideology. The ability to quiet the mind and reap the benefits of that discipline requires no adherence to arbitrary tenets of belief.

The idea of meditating can be quite intimidating. The concept is simple. Quiet vour mind. The execution of that concept can feel impossible. The mind does not want to be quiet. This is where classical music can step in to help us. Meditating on a piece of music is an excellent way to begin training the mind. Sitting in complete silence for five minutes with a quiet mind is an advanced technique of meditation. That's where most people think they need to start. But that's not the case, in my experience.

Put on some headphones and listen to Palestrina's Sicut Cervus for just over three minutes. That's a place to start. Let your mind observe the music as it is happening. When you notice the mind beginning to wander, bring it back to observing the music. When you notice the mind trying to interpret the music, bring it back to observing

the music.

Tomás Luis de Victoria's O Magnum Mysterium is another option for a beginner's piece. It is almost exactly the same length as the Palestrina. Stay with this short piece of music until you can observe it, without interruption, all the way to the end. Once that is accomplished, you can look to add more time to your observational listening.

Finding a four to five-minute piece of contemplative music usually means taking a part of a larger work, such as the "Kyrie" from Palestrina's Missa Papae Marcelli or the "Sanctus" and "Benedictus" from Victoria's Missa O magnum mysterium. I prefer Palestrina and Victoria because they were writing music for a culture of contemplation during the Renaissance. There are composers such as John Cage, Henryk Górecki,

and Arvo Pärt who specifically tried to write meditative music in some of their compositions, but I don't find these to be as effective. However, Arvo Pärt's Spiegel im Spiegel is a good piece of music once you are ready to tackle 10 minutes of mediation.

In my experience, being able to observe 10 minutes

of music, without my mind wandering, means I can do about two minutes of complete silence. In order to get to the advanced stage of five minutes of silence, I need to do about 20 minutes of music. My go-to piece of music for that is Mass for Four Voices by Thomas Tallis.

Maybe high culture is the true woke culture after all.

Pig: purloined pal

hat is life but a succession of good and bad choices? There were times when Nicolas Cage's career and personal life bounded off the rails in the direction of Charlie Sheen wackyland. But then Cage turned what had the potential to be acres of muddy embarrassment into a greensward of performances replete with innovation, if not always taste. In a career that spans forty years and one hundred pictures,

Cage had me at the sound of a cockroach

crunched between his fangs. Today we feast on Pig.

It's a romance that could have begun by answering an ad in the personal section: "Man in wilderness seeks the companionship of a foraging pig." Somewhere in the woods of Washington State, Robin Feld (Cage) lives a life of mangy-haired seclusion. His sole source of companionship is his pet pig. The no-name hog licks Feld's dinner plate and sleeps in a bed next to his, like a family dog. But unlike most domesticated pets, Pig's uncanny snout can smell a truffle a mile away, making her equal parts four-legged friend

and meal ticket. How does a recluse come to know the value of a truffle, let alone where to find an underground outlet through which to peddle the valuable edibles? Feld's only contact with civilization appears to be Amir (Alex Wolff), the wet-behind-theears rich kid in the banana-colored Camaro who appears every Thursday like clockwork to exchange cash for highly-prized fungi.

> Amir's offer to pop for the installation of a shower and a phone

just in case a fall leaves our hermit unable to call for help only serves to arouse Feld's contempt. He's not a bad sort, but Feld's lack of so much as one word in response finds Amir storming off. When, later that night, home invaders kidnap Pig and leave Feld battered and bleeding, who is our man supposed to blame besides Amir? It takes some doing for Amir to convince Feld that he's not complicit, but it's just enough to lead Grizzly Adams to lean on the inexperienced dealer for help. The only clue he has to go by is the fact that Pig was purchased by a city guy in a waxy black car. Feld does own a





vehicle, one with just enough gas to get him to a point miles away from both home and final destination before giving out. Happily, Feld has contacts in Portland who should help to point him in the direction of the pig poacher. It's here that Feld commandeers control of Amir's Camaro.

I know what you're thinking. Why not simply get another pig? Fifteen years in isolation may have clouded Feld's thinking, but not to the point where the businessman in him isn't afraid of losing a season to training. Besides, we're told Pig was special, and that no other porker has the power to do what she did. Don't look for an explanation that isn't there. Just go with it.

First stop: an underground fight club, where Feld can pick up a little spending money in exchange for letting a mousy waiter beat Rip Van Winkle within an inch of his life. It's about time to issue a spoiler alert: to call the film a thriller is a touch misleading. The standard issue revenge drama is a setup for what's actually a surprisingly touching love story between friends. Without going into detail as to why he went full-recluse, suffice it to say that Feld was a legendary chef, the type who would prepare a meal you would spend a lifetime talking about. Now, he's been in isolation for so long that when he does hit up restaurant row, in the eyes of the old crowd, he doesn't exist.

Feld's quest lands him in the hoitytoity restaurant that Amir's father (Adam Arkin) sells to. (The father and his son appear to be unfriendly competitors in the same business.) After sampling the food, Feld asks to speak to the chef. The dressing down that ensues is the film's (and Cage's) #1 source of delight. Feld has an encyclopedic memory when it comes to remembering every meal that he cooked and every customer that ate it. Surely he'll never forget Chef Finway (David Knell) who, after two months in Feld's employ, was fired for overcooking the pasta. Finway stands before him as a master at deconstructing food native to the region, which is a fancy

way of saying new ways of preparing the same old dishes.

Given the at-times ridiculous nature of its subject matter, the film does occasionally stall from taking itself too seriously. But Feld's adventure following what appears to be Bigfoot with a gaping head wound as he takes a constitutional down the side streets of Portland adds welcome comic relief to what sometimes plays as an overly pious road picture. Perhaps that accounts for Cage's surprisingly subdued performance. Return his pig and all is forgiven. Mention must also be made of Alex Wolff's performance as the overconfident daddy's boy. He either has great taste in scripts, a good agent, or both, because he's appeared memorably in a string of indie pics (Hereditary, Stella's Last Weekend, Castle in the Ground). Gunpowder Milkshake — Sam (Karen Gellan) was barely a teenager when a shootout in a diner ended badly. Her mother, professional assassin Scarlet (Lena Headley), disappeared, leaving her daughter in the care of Nathan (Paul Giamatti), head of HR for a nebulous government organization known as The Firm. Fifteen years later, and Sam is batting cleanup for the same squad that once employed her mother. Sam's next job puts her in contact with a trio of munitions experts (Carla Gugino, Angela Bassett, and Michelle Yeoh) disguised as librarians. Rounding out our three generations of hitwomen is nine-year-old Emily (Chloe Coleman, in her second feature since My Spy). She doesn't know it, but Emily's dad was one of Sam's assignments. The sick look that crosses the young actress' face upon learning the truth outshines all of the seasoned pros that surround her. Much of the violence that opens the picture, most notably a standoff in a bowling alley that involves neither guns nor knives, is heard and not seen. Alas, director and co-writer Navot Papushado couldn't contain himself for too long, and the violence, although cartoony, turns graphic. The climax allows each of our first-generation stars a moment in which to shine. But it's the quieter scenes involving Emily — particularly when she's pointing out the similarities between a hired assassin and a serial killer — that make this Netflix offering

Better to pile on more animated mayhem than dwell on the soppy live-action exchanges between James and a fictional son who would rather compete in a video game competition than go to basketball camp. The drawings are cold and brittle, the voice work even less appealing. (Couldn't they afford Billy West?) Right before the climactic game, the filmmakers decide to give Team Looney Tunes a makeover. I'll accept a black guy playing Alexander Hamilton or a female James Bond. What I won't cotton to is watching my beloved troupe reduced to dribbling stuffed animals. 2021 — S.M. ●

Summertime — Last week, readers were introduced to the term "dansical," a musical without singing. With its liberating lack of dependence on traditional song and dance routines and a script fashioned out of twenty or so poems, Summertime earns a category all its own: the slam poetrysical. First impression: 18 poems in search of a narrative quickly vanished under the pulsating outbursts of measured rhythm that the characters, frequently played by the poets, brought to their individual segments. The story unfolds stream-of-consciousness style, frequently jumping from character to character before settling on one. Will it be the passenger who stepped off the bus, the street musician he passed, or the guy dropping money in the horn player's tip cup before meeting his wife for couples therapy? The action can occasionally grind to a halt for a brief recital, and too often, images meant to enhance the verse simply mirror them. (And the lover of camera movement in me was disappointed by director Carlos López Estrada's reliance on straightcuts to transport us from scene to scene.) Some of the characters run consistently throughout, others drop in, rap a little, and vamoose. It's only as good as the character that occupies the screen at any given moment, but when a connection is made, the result is something spectacular. 2020. — S.M. ★★★

Raunch is not a name befitting the confirmed bachelorette with the lamb's wool suit and hairdressing to match (and without a wedding ring in sight), lecturing a bunch of libidinous teenagers on the subject of abstention. Merritt calls Raunch out for assigning an "old fashioned" textbook. (Asking Merritt to define "making out" proves how little raunch there is left in the old professor.) Merritt supports the concept of premarital sex — watch as Raunch gets a facial Charlie Horse at the mention of Dr. Kinsey — encouraging her classmates to play a little

"back-seat bingo" on the first date if they expect there to be a second.

The boys that "are" are as follows: Tuggle's multi-hatted paramour TV Thompson (Jim Hutton); rich boy Ryder Smith; George Hamilton, tanned, rested, ready (and with a two-finger part in his hair) making time with Merritt; Basil (Frank Gorshin), skilled in dialectic jazz and capturing Angie's heart, though he's lost with-

Behind the camera, veteran studio fluff-meister Henry Koster (*Mister Scoutmaster, Honeymoon Hotel*) keeps things moving along. His concept of blocking translates into two couples occupying the same space without bumping into one another. If you're the type that demands more, you've come to the wrong place. *Where the Boys Are* is where the style isn't.

MR. HOBBS TAKES A VACATION (1963)

The original intention was a quiet summer by the shore for Roger Hobbs (Stewart), his wife Peggy (Maureen O'Hara), and their two youngsters, Katey (Lauri Peters) and Danny (Michael Burns). After a brief intro-

ductory shot of Jimmy Stewart behind the wheel, all similarities between this and Vertigo cease to exist. Hobbs is a sullen, humorless, well-to-do banker, contemptuous of almost every member of his family, a man who spends his days dictating long, vitriolic personal memos about them to his secretary — on company time.

The vacation destination is a ramshackle fixerupper that houses a lot

> more character than the sterile colosseum in St. Louis the family calls home. In order to ensure comic results, the nuclear family is joined by more kids and grandkids, a dourfaced domestic, and sons-in-law.

Everything that could possibly go wrong does. Studio hack Henry Koster tries

to show his hand at comic invention by pitting Hobbs against a Rube Goldberg septic pump, but it's a running gag that barely limps. Hobbs never pays attention to, gets involved with, or even communicates with his kids. Even a third-generation Hobbs trembles in his quake: his bipolar grandson, who takes great delight in calling Hobbs "Boom-pah," repeatedly voices his hatred for the non-nurturing patriarch. As a child, Mr. Hobbs appeared to me to be a great provider and ideal father figure. I understand his behavior more clearly now. He basically wants to get all of his kids out of the house, down pitchers of martinis with Peg. and fool around.

There's not much more to gripe about. Well, actually, there is — the 4:30 am bird-watching jaunt appears to have been shot after lunch — but that's okay. Mr. Hobbs Takes a Vacation has been inside my head so long that knocking it would be tantamount to maligning a favorite uncle, no matter how lame and unfunny he might have been.

Warm water, hot heads: parking lot fishing and distancing protocol

Dock Totals 7/11 - 7/17: 5722 anglers aboard 230 trips out of San Diego landings this past week caught 939 barracuda, 2 black seabass (released), 3583 bluefin tuna (up to 230 pounds), 1 bonito, 3278 calico bass (1,867 released), 9 halibut, 4 lingcod, 740 rockfish, 1990 sand bass, 17 sculpin, 174 sheephead, 35 whitefish, 1 white seabass, 62 yellowfin tuna, and 250 yellowtail.

Saltwater: Of the factors seasoned anglers consider when approaching a fishery, whether freshwater or salt, water temperature ranks high in importance. Being much more dense than air, bodies of water will tend to have zones of temperatures as you travel through them vertically or horizontally. That most fish are cold-blooded and sensitive to temperature changes as slight as a half-degree Fahrenheit, and that technology has afforded today's angler the ability to read exact temperatures on location, determining when and where a certain species might be actively feeding can be as simple as checking sea surface temperature (SST) charts or the temp reading on your fishfinder. But while temp breaks are beneficial, die-offs have been attributed to

extreme changes in temperature when two currents collide. I recently found several dead deeper water fish, all of them sub-species of anglerfish, in the Pacific Transition Zone on a beach near Bahia Asunción, BCS, Mexico. Though I had never seen that species stranded, I was told by a local fisherman that it is not too unusual this time of year, when warmer water collides with the very cool coastal waters that account for the great abalone and lobster fishing in the area.

Bluefin tuna are one of a few species of fish that can regulate their body temperature the way warm-blooded animals do and so they are less subject to water temperature breaks, but their prey, mainly sardines and anchovies, can stack up in areas where there is a slight change. Tunas, yellowtail, and other pelagic migratory gamefish burn a lot of energy and need to feed often, so they will follow current edges where temperature changes can constrain masses of baitfish. For that reason, sportboat captains and private boaters will often check SST charts (found online at NOAA and other oceanographic or fishing sites) before they head out to fish for pelagic species. This past week, however, has been more about just getting a few miles outside the harbor and looking for the crowd.

The surface temps between the coast and San Clemente Island range from 69-71 degrees in that span, with the warmer water being at the coast and the southeast corner of the island, and the cooler water about midway

between. There are reports of schools of bluefin tuna on or near just about every high spot from the 9-Mile Bank to the Mackerel Bank off the lee side of San Clemente. Bluefin are finicky biters, and though spotted feeding from the border to off Los Angeles, the best biters (and the main body of the fleet and private boaters) have been in a tight area about 10 to 12 miles off the La Jolla coast in 71- to 72-degree water. There are so many boats targeting one tight area off the north edge of 9-Mile Bank that, from land, their lights look like a small town lit up just a dozen miles west of the Pacific Coast Highway. There, bluefin from 18 to over 200 pounds have been straining gear, muscles, and sometimes, the patience of thousands of anglers through the week.

The area is so 'hot' that multi-day trips that usually venture hundreds of miles south are spending their entire outing between the coast and San Clemente Island. As these fish are also available to smaller private vessels, scores of boats are working so near each other that lines between anglers on different vessels tangle. There is an unwritten rule among those who fish the ocean about keeping distance from other vessels,

as fish will often break off and escape when lines tangle. Generally, the distance to maintain from another vessel while fishing is about twice as far as well cast surface iron, or a hundred and fifty yards or so. In sportfishing lexicon, a tight crowd of boats fishing a hot bite is called a "parking lot," and like its onshore namesake, common courtesy is often called for. But when the bite is hot, the usual protocol of distancing can get ignored and tempers can flare.

Warm water has brought an issue to light in the freshwater scene as well: lots of dead largemouth bass. In the summer months, when water temps rise dramatically in area lakes, largemouth bass move into the deeper cool water. Anglers often keep bass in live wells and release them at the dock after taking photos. This is usually not a problem, but as live wells draw in hot water at the surface and the bass are acclimated to the cooler water at depth, the temperature difference between where they were hooked and the live well can be over 20 degrees and the sudden change can shock their systems, which will cause the fish to roll. It is advisable to release bass as they are caught in these conditions to give them a better chance of survival.





CreepyA TikTok user in New Jersey shared the unsettling scene that unfolded on June 10 as she pulled up carpet in her new home, the New York Post reported. "Ashley" showed followers the floorboards underneath the carpet, which appeared to show a bloodstained imprint of a human being and a chalk outline of a body, along with a 2018 date and a case number. "I wasn't bothered knowing someone died in my new house," Ashley said. Responding to comments on her video, Ashley tested the bloodstain by spraying hydrogen peroxide on it, which caused bubbling - a sure sign that the substance was blood, some said. Still, Ashley isn't fazed: It "seems chill here. It's all good."

Inexplicable

- The latest trend in plastic surgery in China, according to Gulf Today, is the pointy ear. The modified ears resemble those of animated characters or fairy tale creatures, and they give the face "a slender shape," the site reported on June 17. Doctors first insert cartilage or an implant in the back of the ear, then fill it in with hyaluronic acid. Plastic surgery clinics in China are experiencing such great demand that patients have to get on waiting lists.

Yeah, Science!

 In a study published June 10 in the jour-nal Green Chemistry, scientists at the University of Edinburgh in Scotland announced a breakthrough. They had genetically engi-

neered bacteria to convert terephthalic acid - a compound left over when plastic-eating bugs (discovered in Japan in 2016) do their thing - to vanillin, the primary component of extracted vanilla beans that produces the taste and smell of vanilla. Global demand for the chemical is far outpacing the world's supply of natural vanilla beans. "Using microbes to turn waste plastics ... into an important commodity is a beautiful demonstration of green chemistry," said Ellis Crawford of the U.K.'s Royal Society of Chemistry.

Awesome!

- Julia Yonkowski of Largo, Florida, only needed a \$20 bill when she visited the ATM at Chase Bank on June 19, but she decided to check her balance while she was there. What she saw on the paper slip surprised her: a balance of \$995,985,856. "I was horrified," she told WFLA-TV. "I know most people would think they won the lottery, but I was horrified." She's tried several times to contact Chase, but she can't get through to anyone. "I get tied up with their automated system and I can't get a person," she said. "I don't know what to think.

People With Issues

- William Amos, 46, a member of the Canadian House of Commons, can't seem to get a handle on the technology he uses for virtual meetings. In April, Amos appeared completely naked on camera during a House of Commons proceeding, explaining later that he was changing in his office after going for a run and was sure that he had

disabled his camera. On May 26, Amos had to apologize again - this time for urinating "without realizing I was on camera." "I am deeply embarrassed by my actions and the distress they may have caused anybody who witnessed them," he wrote on Twitter, according to the National Post. His statement also said he would "seek assistance," although it was unclear what type of assistance that would be.

Crime Report

- As 34-year-old Paul Kiyan let himself into the home of Mat and Monica Sabz in Bel Air, California, on June 20, Monica watched on Ring video and alerted her husband, who was at home. Kiyan was naked, KTLA-TV reported, and as he wandered around the house, he helped himself to a shower and a pair of shorts. When Mat Sabz confronted him, Kiyan said the house was his. While he was there, Kiyan killed the couple's two pet birds with his hands; police arrested him on several felony charges.

Unclear on the Concept

 A 35-year-old man from Emmaus, Pennsylvania, was presumably having a good time on June 20, sitting in his Dodge Ram truck and lighting fireworks, then throwing them out the window ... until he was critically injured by one that didn't make it outside the cab. The exploding firework also did significant damage to the interior of the truck, lehighvalleylive.com reported, but didn't cause a fire, Émmaus Police Chief Troy Schantz said.

- It started as a joke on April 2, 2020, but after a month of Zoom meetings during which "Jackie," a resident of Washington, D.C., wore the same Hawaiian shirt and received nary a comment from her oblivious co-workers, the prank became a social experiment with a momentum all its own. Jackie told the Daily Mail that on June 16, 2021, she celebrated her last day of work by confessing to having worn the shirt to 264 consecutive Zoom meetings during the pandemic. The reaction? "When I told my team that I had been wearing the same shirt, they didn't know what I was talking about. They hadn't noticed," she said. "The intern literally said, 'On purpose?' So, there's that."

Lost and Found

- When a painting fell off the wall at their country home in Rome in 2016, the owners sent it to an art restorer for repairs. But during the cleaning and restoration process, it became clear that this wasn't just any painting: It was "The Adoration of the Magi" by Rembrandt, painted around 1632-1633 and long considered lost. Guido Talarico, president of the Italian Heritage Foundation, said the family that owns the painting has not expressed an interest in selling it, but that the work will eventually be made available to museums and galleries.




