



New life for the flower of death If you can't bring the marigolds to the people...

Local farmers south of Tijuana used to grow only vegetables: tomatoes, cucumbers, pumpkins, and peppers. But eight years ago, they started devoting one-quarter of their land to the flower of death: marigolds, also known as cempasuchil ("flower of 400 petals" in the Aztec language). These farmers then became the local suppliers to area flower shops for the Dia de los Muertos celebration. But last year, everything changed: the closure of all graveyards in the city due to the covid-19 pandemic killed flower sales, and the farmers had to invent a way to avoid disaster.

Oscar, the farmer in charge of Cempasuchil Tijuana, came up with an idea. Before 2020, Cempasuchil's fields - near Las Delicias Boulevard on the road to Rosarito - had not been open to the public. But the group decided to change that, and started a Facebook page to promote visits to their crops, charging 50 pesos per person. "It was kind of an accident caused by the pandemic," he

said. "The florist did not assure us that they would buy the flowers, and we have between 40-50,000 flowers. It was a success — we never expected and were not prepared for that."

Most of the people who visit the fields are families, and most of them appear to be surprised to find this kind of activity within the city, since Dia de los Muertos is a tradition more grounded in southern Mexico. But because of the influence of the U.S. and Halloween, initiatives like this encourage explorations of Mexican/indigenous heritage that may be neglected in border cities like Tijuana. Said Oscar, "It's so nice to see people that never actually paid attention to our tradition, especially in this part of the country, coming and enjoying our roots. So nice to recognize us as Mexicans through this tradition. In the end, we want to provide more activities like this. This year, we have folk-

loric dances regarding Dia de los Muertos, altars, and a couple of other activities within the ranch. And of course, we offer the flowers so people can put them on their own altar at home."

Tadeo Sanchez is one such visitor. He visited with his wife and eight-year-old child, and explained how hard it is to find family activities that relate to this tradition in town. He did not know about the existence of this place until his wife found it. "She likes a lot the culture of Dia de los Muertos, its colors, and the whole history behind it. I think Dia de los Muertos is a more calm tradition than Halloween; that's why we think it is important to teach that to our children. It's a great opportunity for us as parents to tell kids about our heritage, I'm 30, and until now, I haven't had the chance to see a *Cempasuchil* camp, and my kid did it at eight years old. I'm glad about that."

The fields remained until

November 1, when the flowers had to be cut for the celebration the next day. But before that, the ranch held a huge event where traditions of Halloween and Dia de los Muertos were combined. Concluded Oscar, "In the end, both celebrations are not against each other, and we can make a hybrid celebration." IVAN MOLINA

CHOLLAS CREEK **Blok knocked** Gang-neutral graffiti yard goes down to housing

When word reached me that the walls of Writerz Blok, the first legal graffiti art park in the United States, had been knocked down, I had to

see it to believe it. On October 9, I paid a visit to the venue, located at 5010 Market Street. I peered inside the eight-foot fence topped with barbed wire that surrounded the 10,000 square-foot space: a bulldozer sat dormant beside a Ruste-painted graffiti mural that, so far, remained intact. Over the years, I have documented the transformation of the walls here for the Reader; now I saw some of those

Splurgin' excursion

Jacobs' Jones jets off to junket

An aide to San Diego House Democratic Sara Jacobs took off on a free trip to Cyprus courtesy of the United Nations Foundation, as the controversial non-profit faced new questions regarding corporate sponsorship of its Food System Summit. Sophie Jones, who departed Washington on the five-day excursion beginning September 14, racked up total transportation expenses of \$4144, meal costs of \$384, lodging expenses of \$567, and two covid-19 tests valued at \$35, according to a September 24 disclosure filing. "I am Rep Sara Jacobs' Legislative Assistant and I cover the foreign policy portfolio, including U.N. peacekeeping," declared Jones on the statement. "We will be learning about progress of peacekeeping efforts on the ground."

During her journey to Larnaca, Nicosia, and North Nicosia on the long-troubled island, Jones was put up at the Hilton Nicosia at a cost per night of \$179, the document says. Lunch and dinner venues listed on the itinerary included Brasserie Au Bon Plaisir, the Olympia Restaurant, Hilton, and the Syrian Arab Friendship Club. "It's deservedly one of the most popular places to eat in Nicosia, and has plenty of choice for vegetarians," says a review of the latter by LonelyPlanet. com. "The large garden makes this a great choice for families. The meze spread (minimum two people) gives your taste buds a tour of Levantine cuisine's greatest hits, but if you know your Arabic dishes, you can go à la carte and cherry-pick your own feast."

Says the London *Telegram*'s website in an April 2021 review of Brasserie Au Bon Plaisir: "This cosy, pleasingly rustic and welcoming sort of place with its colourful walls adorned with art reminiscent of French life is run by a family who relocated from France and can be found a few minutes' walk from the famous Ledra Street in Nicosia. Meat in all forms – braised, roasted, or prepared as a delicious terrine – is celebrated with considerable flair, including the family's signature dish of matured French Charolaise steak. The family likes to keep

things healthy with the use of fresh, local produce to complement the ingredients from the regions of France, and pay particular attention to customers' food intolerances. It offers an excellent French and Cypriot wine collection."

Meanwhile, back in New York, controversy continued to fester over the alleged influence of corporate agribusiness on the U.N. Foundation's first Food Systems Summit, intended to meet the threat of global starvation. "Merely three firms own 70 percent of the global agrochemical industry that manufactures and sells chemicals and pesticides used on crops," wrote Elizabeth Mpofu, a "small-scale organic peasant farmer from Zimbabwe," and Edgardo Garcia, a "peasant leader from the Nicaragua Land Workers' Association," in a July 25 Al Jazeera opinion piece calling for a boycott of the foundation's late September event. "This corporate concentration is also evident in the livestock breeding sector, animal pharmaceutical industry, farming machinery, commodity trade and so forth. The governance of the summit remains firmly in the hands of 'experts' known to be staunch defenders of industrial agriculture, and some states, which host many of these large multinational corporations, are driving the agenda."

A list of "partners" on the foundation's website includes Chevron, Sumitomo Chemical, Terminix, Pfizer, Unilever, Nestle, Merck, Coca Cola, and Proctor & Gamble.

Sidewalk vids It may seem an audacious request for a mayor and council having difficulty finding their way through the trials and travails of running a big city, but according to a document posted online last month, "the City is issuing this Request for Sponsorship to identify a company that is interested in developing a marketing partnership in the city wayfinding category." Adds the request: "The city wayfinding partnership goals include, but are not limited to, providing information to the public regarding wayfind-

ing, storm warnings, emergency updates, information on homeless services, and bus schedules." Then the document gets to the real point, soliciting vendors who want to "generate revenue through third-party advertising" on sidewalk video screens. "No more than 49% of the kiosk screen time shall be dedicated to the display of commercial advertisements," per the rules. "Advertising for alcohol, adult

entertainment products or businesses, tobacco, or cannabis products is not permitted at any time in relation to this partnership." As for the city's cut: "Partner agrees to provide the City a marketing rights revenue share dependent on final negotiated terms of the agreement. Partner should detail the advertising revenue share model as well as any inkind value including donations to City-sponsored events or programs."...How wealthy is Republican Darrell Issa, who made his fortune in the car alarm business before moving on to the House of Representatives? His latest personal 2020 financial disclosure with the Clerk of the House, filed July 16 of this year, lists a host of assets, including three valued at "over \$50,000,000": "iShares Russell 2000," "SPDR Dow Jones Industrial Average," and "UBS Bank USA Deposit Account."

Weber's big bucks

Charter school advocate **Bill Bloomfield** came up with \$6100 for Democrat **Shirley Weber**'s 2022 California Secretary of State election campaign on October 26, state disclosure records show. The wealthy entrepreneur is noted for his rough-andtumble political style, including

launching a volley of hit pieces against Los Angeles Unified School District board incumbent **Jackie Goldberg** in the March 2020 primary campaign. "Tve never before in my life been attacked with vicious lies like this," Goldberg complained to the *Los Angeles Times* in the paper's February 18, 2020, account of the race. "The barrage of campaign mail flooding voters in a Los Angeles school board race includes images of a child holding what appears to be a gun, with the message that school board member Jackie Goldberg is responsible for putting children at risk from gun-related violence," per the story. "The multiple mailings that Goldberg calls 'pieces of lies' also suggest that she is responsible for the notorious sexual misconduct at Miramonte Elementary that came to light in 2012, and that she doesn't care about Latino children." Replied Bloomfield in a written statement to the *Times*: "We need board members who are focused on making dramatic improvements to the system by putting children first. That is not Jackie Goldberg." *Times* columnist **Steve Lopez** followed up a few days later with

"Stephen 'Steve' Silberstein is a left-of-center donor from California known for his focus on income inequality and changing the way Presidents of the United States are elected," per the website *Influence Watch.org.* Ron Conway is famous as the Godfather of Silicon Valley, according to *InsidePhilanthropy.com*.

In the big picture, I think there's some truth in the idea that popular culture has become more tolerant of people who are somehow outside of mainstream culture, in large part because, as you correctly note, being out giving any regard to the person who you actually *are*. But that's not to say that personal accountability is on a downward slide. Let me challenge both an underlying assumption and your express premise here by stating (1) don't be fooled into thinking hipsters aren't capable of being judgmental bastards even though they are generally tolerant of alternative lifestyles; and (2) if anything, the world is getting more prudish by the day.

As to point *numero uno*, the zone of hipsterness encompasses a lot of outsiders... so much so that it's hard to see anyone hip who isn't somehow an



a graffiti art program founded by The Jacobs Center for Neighborhood Innovation. Then in 2003, an unknown benefactor donated the half-acre facility on Market Street to the Jacobs Center. Included were office space and a large yard, which became Writerz Blok.

There, Venegas worked beside Sergio Gonzalez to run the "gang-neutral and creative space that encouraged artistic expression and entrepreneurial exploration, while providing an alternative to gang membership." When SDPD caught kids tagging, police officers would bring first-timers to the graffiti yard as a "get-out-of-jail-free card." For their part, Venegas and Gonzales taught kids here how to spray-paint artistic murals legally, work on graphic design programs, and screenprint their own shirts on the facility's manual press. All free of charge.

When I visited on that October day, Venegas was dismantling the shed that once housed parts of the graf-yard's screenprinting machine. "We put all the equipment in storage, and most of the walls are going to get tossed. I do have a couple of pieces that I have collected over the years from different artists that were painted at Writerz Block, and we're probably going to put those in the new shop for the heavy equipment."

"The land for Writerz Blok was always set for redevelopment and buildout," a Jacobs Center spokesperson said on October 26. "To ensure continuity and provide it a strong home, Writerz Blok was transferred to an excellent partner in UPAC (Union of Pan Asian Communities)."

Density dilemma What to do when more housing means more parking?

The small, crowded coastal town of Imperial Beach is short on both parking and affordable housing. Now, some fear that a new state laws that makes it easier to build granny flats will make the parking problem worse. Families are already doubling up, said Imperial Beach Mayor Serge Dedina. "They have multiple cars. Replicate that on every street."

Last week, the city approved a draft ordinance updating their granny flat rules, which they were required to do in order to stay in compliance with state housing law. Except the update is not quite in compliance. In order to create more parking, the city has proposed some exceptions to the rules.

When considering sizing and setbacks, planners sought to incorporate state laws into the new development standards. Accessory dwelling units and junior accessory dwelling units are now permitted by-right, without a public hearing, in all residential or mixed-

use zones. Single-family lots can have one accessory dwelling and one junior accessory dwelling. If a lot has two or more single-family homes, only one unit is allowed, internal or detached. Multifamily properties can have at least one internal accessory dwelling unit, and feet. Accessory dwellings can't be smaller than 150 square feet or bigger than 50 percent of the primary home's size. A one-bedroom must be at least 850 square feet and a two-bedroom, 1000 square feet. However, there's an incentive If a property owner provides extra parking. The

up to two that are detached. The city will prohibit short-term rentals, and if there's a junior unit, the owner must live in either it or the main house. And accessory units should match the main house in style, color and materials.

While there's wiggle room over design rules, state law sets minimum standards, saying cities can't prohibit an accessory dwelling up to 16 feet high, a floor area up to 800 square feet, or four-foot side and rear yards. For height, planners proposed 16 feet for detached and attached units, and internal units no higher than the main house. They came up with two alternatives: the first allowing the accessory unit to be as high as the main house, as long as parking is provided on the ground floor of the unit; the second, which the city council rejected, providing no parking benefit to the community.

Setback options were proposed for buildings over 16 feet. The city can pass development regulations with increased setbacks beyond the state's four-foot setback line, "as long as we provide for a 16-foot building," said Tyler Foltz, community development director. What's proposed in the alternative is that "any portion that exceeds that 16 feet would have to be set in to meet our underlying zoning, which could be anywhere from 5-10 feet." Also known as a "step back," it's seen in the city's commercial and high density zones, and meant to separate buildings.

For junior accessory dwelling units, planners proposed size limits of 150-500 square city has proposed an increased size — up to 1200 square feet — for granny flats that provide additional parking, city consultant Katie Matchett said. "That brings us to everybody's favorite topic, parking."

There are a slew of standards for ADU (accessory dwelling unit) parking that come from state law, she said. First, if parking is provided as part of construction of an ADU, it can be tandem parking, to squeeze some extra spaces onto a property. If existing parking is removed for a conversion, say, a garage to an accessory dwelling unit, "under state law and the ordinance you would not be required to replace that parking." Then there are "a whole bunch of scenarios where no off-street parking can be required for ADUS." For example, any granny flat within 1/2 mile of transit, within a historic or architecturally significant district, or within a block of a car share. "Basically the entire city falls under that stan-

dard" of being within 1/2 mile of transit. "So effectively, under state law, we cannot require off-street parking for any ADUs in the city."

But that's the plan the city will put forward when the ordinance is introduced at the December 1 meeting. "We have proposed an exception in this ordinance, because we understand there is especially high demand for parking at the coast, and we need to provide access to the public." So, for each accessory dwelling unit west of centerline of 3rd Street and within 1/4 mile of the beach, coastal park or the IB pier, two off-street parking spaces will be required.

"We're superseding state law," the mayor warned, saying he worried about the city becoming a test case. Those who live in other parts of the city, where no parking is required (or can be found), might find it unfair, favoring wealthier beach-area homeowners who can afford to build up.

"It's a little bit tricky because state law is kind of in conflict here," Matchett said. "On the one hand, you need to provide access to the coast. In the Coastal Commission's view that means providing parking at the coast. Then there's ADU law that says no parking for ADUS." Because there's this conflict at the highest levels of state law, compromises have occurred around parking in busy areas along the coast, she said. The Coastal Commission recently allowed Pismo Beach to carve out extra parking for accessory dwellings. So far, Housing and Community Development hasn't challenged it. "So we hope this strategy will pass muster with them as well."

Briar boss

The dwindling remnants of San Diego's coastal glow are fading into a mild Autumn dusk as I arrive for my meeting with master pipemaker Jeff Gracik. I find him in the spot where the majority of his working hours are spent: the main finishing desk in his compact home shop, a perch that is within arms reach of many of his tools, and only a few steps away from his other work stations. He is sitting, looking calmly focused, doing some sanding on a partially finished pipe as he waits for me. In front of him, at knee level, is his supply of Mediterranean briar blocks - hefty chunks of the hard burl that has proven to be the ideal wood for tobacco pipes. Gracik has handled each piece of briar in his possession, and knows what country it came from and who harvested it — now, each is labelled with permanent marker.

Gracik, the man behind J. Alan Pipes, may look a bit young for the appellation "master pipemaker." But the people who know his work call him that. Gracik himself will say only that sure, he may be known to 50 or 60 far-flung people. He will, however, note that despite his relative youth, he has put a great deal of time and effort into his craft. "I got my 10,000 hours about 10 years ago," he tells me. He is also quick to credit the encouragement, guidance, and supervision he's received over the years from renowned artisans in both America and Denmark, a hub of modern pipe design since the middle of the last century. "I wouldn't be here today if it weren't for the generosity of those people." he says.

Gracik got his start in the early 2000s while in graduate school in New Jersey. There, after switching from smoking the occasional cigar to puffing the occasional pipe, he developed an interest in making them, too. Soon, he was filling his academic notebooks with design sketches, and working on pipes in his spare time. He made his first one in 2003. But while he enjoyed his new hobby, he had no plans to let it take over his academic life or become his job. On the other hand, he was finding the work fulfilling in a way that was different from his academic pursuits. Eventually, the calling found him: by the next year, he found that people actually wanted to buy his pipes; then he started to build up a wait list. And the demand has kept growing: two weeks ago, Gracik stamped his 1800th pipe.

Reflecting on the path that brought him to where he is now, Gracik relates an amusing story about the first time that he took his wares to a pipe show. These would not have been as fine as what he's producing today, but they must have demonstrated some promise, because they caught the eye of Tonni Nielsen, a well-known Danish pipemaker. "I had this little Harbor Freight five-dollar box that I had my five pipes in. I got some giggles from people, but Tonni was like (Gracik here puts on a convincing Danish accent) — 'You know these are pretty good. You should come and work with me.' He joined Nielson at a shop in Louisville, Kentucky soon after that, and spent just one (very full) day there soaking up all that he could from Nielsen.

That was long ago. These days, newer makers look to Gracik for guidance, and he's provided it in numerous venues, including here in San the raw material of the briar. Gracik will only use exceptionally good pieces. He is looking for attractive grain and the absence of blemishes, and blemishes are very common. And no matter how expert his inspection, he has to be prepared to find flaws after he has begun making a pipe. Next to his baskets of unworked briar is a separate one, filled with rejects that ceased to pass muster at some point in their transformation. Gracik tells

Diego, at a twice-held "Pipe Makers Seminar by the Sea."

About 40 minutes into our conversation, Gracik asks if I want to smoke a pipe. I have been hoping he would ask this, and I grab my own pipe pouch, but he encourages me to choose from a cabinet stocked mostly with pipes marked "Own" — as opposed to the numbered ones that go out to customers. I choose a medium-sized rendition of a shape that in the pipe world is called a "blowfish." He carries it over to a buffing wheel and gives it a brief polish it before handing it to me. *A nice craftsmanlike touch*, I think to myself, as I note the svelte, gentle curve of its stem and its surprising lightness in the hand.

This touch, this craftsmanship, is the crux of the matter when it comes to the notion of "master." In the field of individually made pipes, there is no "good enough." Each one is an emblem of patience and careful attention, beginning with me of the plans he has for some of these — some are, despite their flaws, good enough to be working pipes. Just not J. Alan pipes.

I mentioned above that Gracik spends most of his time at his finishing desk. This is because the first step of the process — the cutting out of the pipe's rough shape on a band saw — is also the fastest. "The misperception by people on the outside is that the majority of time is spent on the shaping," says Gracik, "and really that takes about ten minutes — especially when you know what you're doing." So what happens the rest of the time? There is the shaping of the tobacco chamber, something for which Gracik has had special drill bits created. There is the drilling of the airway. And then there is a great deal of finer shaping: sanding, sandblasting (for the pipes that want it), polishing, staining. Finally, at the end of that, there is, Gracik says simply, "The pleasure of having something that you've actually made."

Consequences Will Never Be the Game

Lincoln High forfeits showdown against Cathedral Catholic for educational reasons

"Racism can no longer be swept under the rug or considered as normal," said Lincoln High football coach David Dunn, explaining his decision last week to cancel his team's game against Cathedral Catholic. "What are the consequences? That's the problem."

Dunn was referring to an incident that took place before last April's matchup between the two teams. A Cathedral Catholic player posted an image to social media billing the game as Catho-

lics vs. Convicts III - a reference to the moniker once applied to matchups between Notre Dame and the University of Miami. The school apologized, several players were suspended, and Cathedral's athletic community was required to take part in a seven-hour similarity training course. And Dunn

granted that the Cathedral community had reached out to the Lincoln community. But, he said, "system change includes equal protections and the implementation of a level playing field for our student athletes in game preparation, rule books, officiating, positive community relations with visiting teams, team access and resources, and so much more." He then expressed hope that by being handed an easy win going into playoffs, Cathedral would be led to reflect — and hopefully act — on his words.

The Birds Without the Bees

San Diego Zoo Wildlife alliance reports that California condors can reproduce without sex

Last week, Flora Avian, lead researcher for the San Diego Zoo Alliance's California Condor Preservation Project, announced that two of the birds in her care had been spawned via parthenogenesis, that is, asexually. "We did DNA analysis, and there was no father involved in these birds' creation," marveled Avian. "Usually we see this phenomenon in so-called 'lower' species, like insects. Seeing it something as complex as a bird — well, the implications are staggering. Might mammals be next? Might...humans?"

Explained Avian, "At first, we were thinking it was really good news for the ugly, people who might not otherwise have been able to reproduce because of difficulties in attracting a sexual partner. But the more we thought about it, the more

we realized that this was great news for all of modern humanity. Research indicates that as people become more and more isolated by the forces around them — be they so-called social media networks, individualistic capitalism, the breakdown of the family on both extended and nuclear levels, the crumbling of traditional institutions such as churches and civic groups, and so on — they are having fewer and fewer sexual encounters. And for a number of other reasons, those encounters they do have are less and less likely to result in offspring. The demographic winter is coming for the First World. But if we can figure

out their secret, these birds may just prove to be the phoenixes that help us to rise from the ashes of our own ruined civilization. As I like to say, 'Yes we can...dor!' Even though Bill in Sample Collection says jokes like that are the reason I'll die alone."

But not everyone was so delighted by the discovery. Noted evolutionary biologist Richard Dawkins lamented the prospect of widespread human parthenogenesis, saying, "For millennia, evolution has been slowly improving humanity by natural selection: the fit breeding with the fit. This is going to put us right back where we started."



on borrowed time. It relies on a tiny staff plus volunteers. A source told me they'll eventually move out, as the landlord will likely sell the building. Located at 2875 El Cajon Boulevard, its location is ripe for redevelopment; a craft beer company will soon open next door.

McBride told me, "We have had problems filling staff, as we are all retired women, and we cut our open days from Wednesday to Saturday, 11-3. We have managed, however, to make a profit for our philanthropies."

Rod Legg, executive director at Auntie Helen's in North Park said they're now "operating as a super sidewalk sale to keep shoppers, staff and volunteers safe." He explained their new service: "Our mission evolved [from just a laundry service] during the pandemic to feeding 1600 families per week with free groceries."

Amvets has a popular outlet at 3441 Sutherland Street, just off Pacific Highway. Mike Bledsoe, operations manager, told me that despite all the changes over the last two years, "our stores are hanging in there."

oceanside **Schoolhouse hawk**

Deficits drive push to sell schools The march to close and then sell off elementary

schools in Oceanside has been compared to the game of musical chairs. Parents with "Save Our Schools" signs are hoping their on-site protests will keep their neighborhood school from being the next school sold off to the highest bidder. The Oceanside Unified School District board of trustees voted November 2 to approve one of two plans. Each included putting at least one school into what the district calls "asset management," which means it would no longer serve as a traditional classroom site and may be sold off to the highest bidder, possibly a developer. The sale would impact other schools, which would be forced to absorb the displaced students.

One plan had Ditmar Elementary near Coast Highway go off the classroom grid. Its students would be moved to Del Rio Elementary on the other side of town. Built in 1946, Ditmar is one of Oceanside's three oldest elementary schools along with Mission and South Oceanside Elementary. Ditmar stopped being

> used as a traditional elementary school in 2008 and is now called Surfside Educational Academy, hosting some 600 continuation and "independent study" students. Del Rio Elementary students would then be directed to join existing students at Libby Elementary under this plan. The other plan called for Reynolds Elementary in Northeast Oceanside to be mothballed; its students would be divvied up between Del Rio and Libby Elementary.

"We are a lower-income neighborhood," says Julia Sanchez, who has children who attend Del Rio Elementary. "Both proposals suck. In the end, either way someone loses out." Sanchez says she and her children adore their teachers at Del Rio Elementary. "All the teachers here are awesome. But here we are, getting targeted, booted to another campus."

She says elementary schools in Oceanside's more affluent neighborhoods aren't faced with such disruptions or relocations. "No one is talking about doing anything to Ivey Ranch. Those schools never get touched." Palmquist and South Oceanside Elementary are thought to be two other schools blessed with upscale neighborhood adjacency.

But of late, the Oceanside Unified School District board of trustees has been on a liquidation spree. At its July meeting, the five-member board signaled it plans to proceed with the sale of the 14-acre Pacifica Elementary property for \$15.8 million to Meritage Homes of Scottsdale, Arizona, a prolific home builder which is currently marketing its new home tracts

Oceanside's population has risen by 5% since 2010, from 167,000 to 175,000. Despite this, officials at Oceanside Unified School District say their student census is shrinking, and that's why it's OK to peel off its elementary school property. But school parent Todd Maddison, who regularly attends school board meetings and closely scrutinizes the district's budget, wonders if this recent liquidation announcement isn't a kind of fire sale to help balance the books, a move necessitated by spending and deficits. Maddison says that in October, the district disclosed that due to new agreements with its labor groups, the district would add \$9.5 million to their deficit this vear and \$6-\$7 million to their deficit each

throughout the West. (New Meritage homes are listed between \$500,000 and \$800,000.) Students at Garrison Elementary were told in 2019 they had to give up their classrooms near El Camino Real and Oceanside Boulevard and start studying with students at San Luis Rey Elementary because sinkholes had made Garrison unusable. And the district just announced it will begin the sale of Garrison's 11 acres to the highest bidder in November. Also this year, the Oceanside School District sold its Ocean Shores continuation school facility near Oceanside Boulevard and El Camino Real to the city of Oceanside, which will remodel it and use it as a live-in homeless facility and as the new home for its code enforcement department. The continuation school students were moved to the Surfside Academy at Ditmar Elementary.

All that leaves 16 elementary schools still operating in the Oceanside Unified School District. At its November 7 meeting, the school board will announce which elementary school will be the next to be placed in asset management. year after, due to a 3.75 percent salary increase. He says this follows a previous salary increase from just two years ago of 3 percent. "Transparent California [a database that tracks pay for government employees and elected officials] said that the total median compensation for Oceanside teachers is \$124,688," says Maddison. "That includes benefits. That is about \$30,000 higher than comparably educated San Diego County employees."


A September 15 letter from the San Diego County Office of Education to Oceanside school Superintendent Julie Vitale said the district will be unable to meet its financial commitments after the 2021-2022 school year and that it is projected to be in the red by more than \$8 million in 2022-2023. The county says the district will be \$29 million in the hole in 2023-2024. The letter reminded Oceanside Unified that the county superintendent of schools has the authority to require the district to make cuts to remain solvent. Continues Maddison, "And what gets me, is the associate superintendent of human



25 YEARS OF OVERHEARD IN SAN DIEGO

t usually surprises people to discover that my own artwork was never published in a single issue of Rock 'N' Roll Comics from 1989 through 1994. Nor did my drawings ever appear in any Carnal Comics between '94 and '99. This despite the fact that I ran the well-known first publishing company, and owned the lucrative second. Oh, I drew rough storyboards for my comic scripts to give to the actual illustrators. (The scripts were written as I drew the thumbnail sketches, so that I would always be thinking visually.) But my own artwork never appeared in a single one of the 300 or so comic books that I've written or published.

In fact, other than my high school newspaper and yearbook, I didn't become a published cartoonist until I was 38 years old, in

1998 — two years after the *Reader* debuted *Overheard in San Diego*! And the only reason I started cartooning when I did was because the original *Overheard* artist vanished, and I realized that drawing it myself meant that I no longer had to split the paycheck.

At first, I was only the writer. Rock 'N' Roll Comics penman Scott Pentzer drew the first few *Overheards*, and then Hard Rock Comics artist Joe Paradise was aboard for around two years. When Paradise could no longer work on it, I was stuck with the unenviable task of either finding another artist or drawing the thing myself.

My crash course involved all but memorizing several highly recommended books on the art of comics, including/especially *Understanding Comics* by Scott McCloud and *Comics & Sequential*

Art by Will Eisner. After studying those two industry bibles, and a series of How To Draw books by Tarzan artist Burne Hogarth, my first solo Overheard comic debuted in 1998.

My initial published cartoons were so awful that I secretly left them out of the Overheard in San Diego Omnibus book. And I would have gotten away with it, too, if someone hadn't compared the book to the paper's online archive, week by week, and complained! Well, I never said the book would have ALL the strips.

The pressure of a weekly deadline, coupled with my weak art skills, kept me chained to the drawing board over the next few months. I recycled a lot of Paradise's backgrounds and setups, as I studied how to render art in a style similar to his. Once I finally got the hang of using a brush with a bit of flair, rather than the rapidograph technical pen that made my drawings look like woodcuts, the Overheard comics grew from barely competent to halfway decent to - I hope — not at all terrible. I somehow managed to make a good part of my living as a cartoonist for the next two decades.

Which is crazy, since that's pretty much what I spent the first half of my creative career trying to avoid. I was a writer; I didn't want to draw. I just wanted to tell real-life stories. After all, reality is stranger - and usually funnier — than fiction.

When I first landed in San Diego in the late '70s, I tried (and failed) to earn my first California cash by draw-

ing bootleg caricatures in Balboa Park. I say "bootleg," because I didn't have the required permit, which means I couldn't just set up an easel along the Prado. Instead, I had to sneak around with a huge sketchbook that I held up, so people could see the "Get Yourself Cartooned" drawing I had rigged up on the back of the pad.

Keep in mind that my only cartooning experience up until then was drawing gag illos for my high school newspaper and yearbook. But I was having trouble finding a job (mainly because I refused to cut my hair), and — at only ten bucks a pop — it was hard to make a living off donating blood plasma. I walked around the Park and literally accosted


tourists, asking if they wanted their caricature drawn. I had several carefully prepared samples in the sketchpad of celebs alongside their photos. I failed to tell anyone that each drawing probably took me at least two hours and one eraser to complete. Of course, nobody was gonna sit there for two hours while I sketched away.

I still feel so humiliated by the experience that I can't bring myself to share specifics. All I'll say is that I drew at least two dozen portraits over the course of two days. All but two of them remain in that cursed sketchbook. My wouldbe customers refused to pay for them. Hopefully, my skills have improved at least moderately. Selling the Reader on

running Overheard was surprisingly easy. I was already freelancing as a music writer, and one week, the Blurt section was short a story and had space to fill. With no article leads, I instead mocked up a comic strip with a bit of dialogue I'd recently overheard on a bus, using artwork from a Rock n' Roll Comics strip I'd done. The music editor liked the cartoon so much that he requested a weekly edition. I didn't even change the fonts used in the original mockup, and over 1300 strips later, the format remains almost identical.


At first, all of the dialogue came from things I'd overheard myself, which wasn't that difficult, since I was spending time in nightclubs



I'd write down the quotes and describe the speakers in a little notebook, or on a restaurant napkin or placemat. Then I'd give that to the artist, usually along with some photos of the locale.

Once I started drawing the thing myself, I invited others to send in overheard dialogue which I would then illustrate. The reward was that the tipster got to keep the original artboards. This "pay policy" has resulted in two things: multiple items from which to pick each week (even during the pandemic), and a dearth of archival material, since I've given most of it away. Some regular tipsters probably own more Jay Allen Sanford artwork than I do.

I've created a new Overheard comic every seven days now for 25 years, other than one week where the student cartoonists at Little Fish Studio (then in OB) won a contest to draw it (they got my paycheck too - hopefully the modest payoff didn't scare them away from wanting a comic career). That includes several hospital stretches and an out-of-state relocation, as well as a year in the early 2000s when I was homeless, sometimes sleeping in a stairwell near the Reader's Little Italy office so I could finish drawing the comic in their lobby on the morning it was due. Never missed one deadline, the whole time.

Now, there's a giant archive of strips on the Reader site, an *Overheard in San Diego* theme song recorded

tour that my mobile display embarked on without me, while I staved home and drew more comic strips! The very first Overheard art show was at Hillcrest's Ruby Room in 2010, and I just happened to be flipping the radio dial on the way there when I heard the Homegrown Hour playing the Overheard theme song on the air, which was as surreal as it was cool.

One thing people frequently ask is why Overheard has never "modernized" by going full color. After all, the rest of the paper went color years ago, and the Blurt slot occupied by the comic all these years has been running color photos since last century. Well, a trio of strips actually have run in color, but only because colors were indicated in the setup dialogue

for those three. How come? Easy: for most of my life, I was partially color blind, although I didn't realize it. For years, I wasn't even sure there was such a color as "orange," because everything from dark yellow to red looked like the same shade to me. My girl sends me to the store to buy oranges? I'd bring home round lemons if it weren't for signs. It wasn't until I had a minor eye operation in the early 2000s that I could see a nearly full range of colors.

It's hard to explain just how subjective "reality" is, until/unless your own reality entirely changes! Our perception of reality is at the mercy of how our eyeballs are shaped. And how they're wired to our brain. Ask a bee or a fly to describe what they see, and you'll hear

stuff only Tim Leary has imagined. Just one component of what each of us calls reality depends on how our brain perceives things like color. Though I wasn't diagnosed until I was an adult, I spent most of my life "suffering" from an ocular malformation that prevented me from seeing orange. Imagine what that was like as a kid at Halloween! Even my friends would tease me with "color tests." "Hey Jay, what color is THAT?" And they'd snicker when I was apparently "wrong" (which was really more a matter of how differently my eyeballs translated the same stuff they saw).

So I saw the world more or less in graduated sepia tones, something closer to monochromatic than psychedelic. That guy who did

the *Alien* paintings, H.R. Giger, I think he had the same vision defect. And yet — I've colored comic books! And been paid to do so. See, I *understood* the full range of colors, thanks to RGB color scales we used to do color separations. I could tell you the exact mix of tones that equals orange. But I couldn't see orange. I can remember, as a kid, thinking the whole world was playing a shitty prank on me with this orange crap.


(Side note: a very dimwitted young lady I dated once asked me "So when you get to a stop light, if you're not sure what's really red, how do you know to stop?" As if I can't tell when the lights switch up from green. The same poor silly girl then asked – swear to gawd – as we pulled up to a stop sign, "So how did you know to stop?" Uh, 'cause I can read?) One final thought

One final thought about color: the first time I did LSD, holy jeez: colors I didn't know existed! Turns out they were there in my brain, after all. I just couldn't get to them through my eyes. But from within, well, damn. I'd spend hours sitting in a car, just breathing fog onto the window and wiping my hand back and forth in the condensation, creating exploding rainbows with my fingertips. "Dude, trails!"

The only thing I've ever seen that comes close when I'm not on psychedelic drugs is LED-lit letters and numbers. That's one odd thing that didn't change even after they shaved my eyeballs into a near-normal shape: in the dark, the numbers on a digital alarm clock are, to me, still bright enough to land a plane by! I need to cover every LED light in my room with electrical tape, or I can't sleep. Reality: it's all in the eye of the beholder. And it all depends on what eyeballs vou be holdin'!

I *have* made some concessions to the modern world: I now do *Overheards* with the assist of digital trickery, especially when it comes to rendering realistic background settings. Thanks to working from photos (gawd bless Photoshop), people no longer frown at my art and sav "That doesn't look anything like me" and walk off toward the Zoo or the carousel without paying me. I even post tutorials online showing step-by-step exactly how I transform photos into elements for Overheard comics.

This practice once earned me an angry email from a wellknown comic artist,

resources Todd McAteer, who just negotiated the new increase, gets to be included on that new increase. This raise he negotiated, he gets to keep himself... The board approved all extra bonus raises. The vote was 5-0 on raises for certificated and classified personnel, and 4-1 on the 'me-too' raises for the administration."

Michael Mitchell has two students at Reynolds Elementary. He maintains the district was less than open about its plans to put either Ditmar or Reynolds in "asset management." "They did it at their September meeting, which they held at a special time, 4 pm, when they knew no one would be there." And unlike recent meetings, that one was not available on either Zoom or public access station KOCT.

Viviana Gonzales has two

children at Reynolds elementary. "Reynolds covers a big area," she said. "It is true the school is not in great condition, but that extra bond money should be invested in remodeling it...I hope more parents get out there and hold signs and send emails to the board. It is not right that they do everything behind closed doors."

"We didn't even know they were thinking about closing Reynolds," says parent Julie Hammer. "It was never part of the discussion. They were always talking about rebuilding or fixing it. When I tell other parents that they are thinking about closing Reynolds, they look at me like I have five faces. We were all shocked." Hammer says Reynolds also provides the neighborhood with needed parkland. "There is no park within walking distance. We used to have this horrible metal playground, and they replaced it with a high-end, top-notch

playground equipment."

Whichever plan gets implemented, Libby Elementary will be getting more crowded. If Ditmar goes and Reynolds stays, the district has said Reynolds needs to spend millions to upgrade Reynolds. "Libby and Del Rio are 90 percent brown schools," says Nataly Sanchez, president of the Libby Elementary Parent Teacher Organization. "In the past seven years, they have cut a teacher [from Libby's staff] every year." Sanchez says those cuts have led to a high student-to-teacher ratio and that Libby must employ combo classes, where two grades are taught in the same classroom. "They keep cutting back on teachers, yet they have all these associate superintendents who make \$150,000 and \$200,000 a year, and then they keep getting raises. Why does the district need three people to work full time in public relations?"

Temperatures sinking slowly in San Diego

Local Temperatures should be declining most rapidly during this time of year, according to more than a century of local meteorological records. With every successive week, daily maximum temperatures are declining by about .75° Fahrenheit, and daily minimum temperatures are plummeting by about 1° Fahrenheit. (This gradual onset of fall/winter chill is probably all but unnoticed by most newcomers from harsher climates.) By January, our mean temperature will have fallen to about 55° Fahrenheit, from an average temperature of about 70° Fahrenheit in August.

LOMBARDY POPLARS

Autumn Color in San Diego County's mountains reaches its greatest intensity in late October and early November. The forested heights of Palomar Mountain are especially colorful right now. Black oaks on Palomar's rolling uplands will be exhibiting bright yellow and brown hues for the next few weeks. Cuyamaca Reservoir remains a worthwhile leaf-peeping destination. The shimmering leaves of the Lombardy poplar, an Italian import that has taken root at the south end of the lake, delight the eye with their golden radiance.

A New Moon appears on Friday, November 5 (exactly at 5:15 pm Eastern Daylight Time).

Daylight-saving time ends at 2 am on Sunday (November 7) for most of North America. Clocks fall back an hour — and some of them do it all by themselves, this being the 21st century.

magine Christmas," says Trivikram, "but in India. That tells you what Diwali is like."

Trivikram (I have to ask what his name means. It means "Triple Victory") and his buddies (Anupam, Sahana, Sindhu, Nikhil) all work at Qualcomm. They are doing dinner here at Chennai Tiffins, in Little India, up Mira Mesa way, for a taste of home.

It's about eight at night, so no time to fool around. I'm heading for the wild blue yonder

north of here when I see something about an annual Indian festival coming up over the five days around this Thursday, November 4th. And — incredible for a festival that I have never heard of — so many different Indian cultures share it and make it part of their story. For all of them, Diwali is the celebration of good conquering evil. And it involves lots of feasting. You might call it the Mardi Gras of the Indian world.

So I jump off the bus at Black Mountain Road and Miramar on the edge of Little India and am soon walking past groceries and eating-places like Biriyani King and, hey hey, Chennai Tiffins.

This is a Tuesday, but Chennai has quite a crowd in there. I head in to a white-tiled, blond-wood room with

green booths. What with the State Bank of India, the Shri Mandir temple, and the Surati Indian grocery store around the corner, this is as Indian as it gets in San Diego. And here inside Chennai Tiffins, with its red brick and shiny white tile walls, you can just imagine this *quartier* being part of some tropical Indian or Sri Lankan city.

"Still open for dinner?" I ask the gal, Maria. With the name "Tiffin," which the Brits took to India (I think it relates to "tipple"), you expect light food, fun atmosphere, early closing.

But we're good. "Till 9:30," she says. She also says they are vegetarian here and don't serve beer. "But they do at Biriyani King. You'd have time to go there first if you want."

Hmm. Generous idea. So I do. I cross over the little road to Biriyani King and order up a large bottle of Taj Mahal beer, cold and delish! Not unlike a Coors, actually. Costs \$8.99. And to help it down, I order up a couple of roasting-hot

potato *samosas* (\$3 each), fresh cooked. They're big, but I have been running on empty, so these plump babies are good for starters. Nice crispy-

> thin pastry shells. But it's not long before I'm back across at Chennai Tiffins. Maria — she's from Guatemala but has worked here long enough to know her Indian food — says to expect southern Indian food only.

"So lots of *dosa* — fermented crepes — curries, rice, *uthapam* — thick crepes," she says. "Or you could try our lunch special. We still have

it, our South Indian *thali*, for \$14.99."

Thali turns out to be the name for this platter that carries a whole bunch of small bowls of different food. It is a common Indian way of eating, and also works well in a celebration situation like Diwali, where Hindis, Jains, Sikhs, Buddhists, and people of other faiths all eat and celebrate together. Way to go, India! I see dishes I have

never heard of, like rasas wada: deep-fried lentil donuts immersed in rasam, a spiced soup from the south with tamarind, tomatoes, other spices and herbs, mustard, cumin, fenugreek and black pepper. It is supposed to be good for your gut if you drink some every day. Definitely makes the dipped lentil donut taste more interesting. Or we can enter the

endless world of *dosas*, the huge thin crepes made of fermented batter that are at the center of southern Indian cooking. *Palli podi dosa* (\$10.99) is a crepe topped with a spicy peanut mix. The spinach *paneer dosa* (\$12.99) is topped with spinach gravy and stuffed with cottage cheese mix. The Mysore *masala dosa* is stuffed with potato *masala*.

I can see Maria and the staff of Indian women are keen to get this show on the road, what with the clock ticking towards nine, so what the heck: I go for the *thali*, and pretty soon this wide circular tray arrives with a dozen little stainless bowls filled with everything from *mor kalumbu* (a delicious yellow buttermilk-based curry with lots of sweet potatoes) to *chana masala* - a spiced garbanzo (chickpea) snack. Plus you get a row of orange, green, and creamy chutneys. Have to say, this whole *thali* display for \$14.99 is an incredible deal.

Turns out the Diwali festival ("Diwali" mysteriously means "a series of lights") is about the Hindu avatar Rama's victory over the evil spirit Ravana, and celebrates his return home, mainly through fireworks, feasts, and culintary extravagances like *kaju* ("cashew") *barfi* ("sweets") that you can get best at the Surati eatery and grocery store across the way.

Man, I could definitely get used to this. Haven't tasted half the flavors of these curries, let alone those sweets. Yes, there's a lot of deep frying going on, but tons of veggies too. So, pretty healthy overall. But what really gets me about this display of vegetarian power is how they can make such tasty combos of seemingly tasteless elements, like avail, beans, carrots and potatoes cooked in coconut milk (\$11.99), or that *paneer* butter *masala*, which is *cottage cheese* cooked in heavy cream and spicy sauce (\$13.99). Come to think of it, I should've tried it, just to see how da heck they could make something tasty out of it.

Guess I'll have to do this again.

Meanwhile, I head out into the night. Only the Shri Mandir temple is still open. Now, all I have to do is see if there's still a bus to take me back down to the world. Happy Diwali, everybody!

Following half a dozen ill-fated concepts in ten years, Sister Ray's moved in and kept it simple, offering burgers, hot dogs, fried chicken sandwiches, and my late night favorite, chili cheese fries. It felt like a good fit for what had become a cursed Sherman

Freshly married chefs Brandon Standafer and Ami Cisneros Standafer opened their shop over the summer. Both have history cooking at Grand Ole BBQ, which is precisely why I've put off covering El Barbecue til now. I know and love the Grand Ole brisket, so I didn't want to address El Barbecue until I tried its own take, currently available only on Saturdays.

I could not be more happy I did. Simply put, Standafer's Texas-style, oak-smoked brisket is flawless. It's got all you want in a smoked brisket: a crusty, black bark surrounds a pink smoke ring, which surrounds the tender texture of slow cooked meat, and a ribbon of fat so beautifully rendered it melts on contact to provide a burst of flavor with every bite. At \$14 per half pound, this thing should be selling out every single Saturday, and shame on all of us

if it doesn't.

That said, the last thing want to do is give the impression El Barbecue is a one-trick pony. There are more than enough dishes on the menu to get us through the rest of the week, and, much like the way Grand Ole draws on Argentinian barbecue traditions as well as Texan, El Barbecue brings global influences to bear. As the name suggests, one of these is Mexican food, easiest to spot in the restaurant's brisket birria quesadillas, smoked chicken tortilla soup, and Sunday smoked

pork pozole. I find myself drawn to one of the shop's collection of homemade sauces: Holy Moly BBQ sauce, which combines the tangy punch of Kansas City style BBQ sauce with the sweet depths of black mole. I recently tried the brisket birria served in beef broth with udon noodles, revealing an Asian influence that likewise shows up in a sandwich inspired by Korean fried chicken.

But arguably the best item other than brisket starts with a California BBQ tradition: Santa Maria tri-tip. On its own, El Barbecue's tri-tip is tender, smokey, peppery, and top rate. Tri-tip doesn't get better in San Diego. And when these

El Barbecue kids throw it on a bolillo roll with a combination of mayo and chimichurri to make the sandwich they call Santa Natalia (\$15), several culinary traditions sing together in beef sandwich harmony. I find myself once again re-thinking my list of San Diego's best sandwiches, and once again convinced this is going to be

to safety, one life was lost: the band's feline inspiration, Dodger. "Not like the baseball team," explains Mullenberg, "but like the Charles Dickens character. We have covotes, and I named him that in hopes he might be able to dodge the coyotes if he ever got out. I've had him for six years."

A GoFundMe page has been set up to help replace band instruments and equipment. As for other forms of support, the Pistols seem

young, not hot, and not hip, who spruce up Sex Pistols songs in bargain-basement drag. Now he's hoping that San Diego is willing to give a little something back: a house fire has cost Mullenberg his home, his musical equipment, and more. At 5 am on October 5, his roommate (and band merch man) Alan Stewart was awakened for work by his alarm clock. Recalls Muellenberg, "He came out of his room and saw the smoke, kicked open my door, waking me, and yelled 'fire.' Alan saved my life."

According to Muellenberg, "The fire was electrical in nature, and started at a plug with nothing plugged into it. The house was old and was ungrounded." Gear lost includes "twenty-four bass guitars, one third of which were vintage and collectable. Three of the basses were signed by my friend Mike Watt [Minutemen, Firehose]. My 1969 Gibson EB-3 bass,

SG, vintage and irreplaceable. My mother's 1942 Dallape accordion, which I had just had restored and was worth \$10K ... The value of what was lost is well over \$70K. That's just the value of the instruments. That doesn't include the computers, CD duplicator, [and] vintage clothing. I was way underinsured, with only \$25k in renters insurance."

Asked about his most personal possessions, he says that "there is no money number I can put on this question. My house was like a shrine to all those in my life who have impacted me and have passed. Everything from my mother, who just passed in April. Everything from my father, who passed in 1999. All my family heirlooms. Real world value of these things might be \$50K, but what they're worth to me is immeasurable. This hurts the most."

While Muellenberg and drummer Doug Walker, aka Mosh Posh Spice, made it

blessed with plenty. "I'm aware of a couple of benefit concerts being organized, but don't have any dates as of yet. I've had many, many calls from friends in the music community offering to play for the benefits. Peter DiStefano of Porno For Pyros has committed to doing a solo show, and Rikk Agnew of Adolescents is going to play at one as well. Also, Dood Craft Guitars' James Nelson is going to not only build me a replacement 'Hairy Scary Spice Heart' bass, but is building a second one for me to auction off." The band has already had an encouraging response from the local community, and have been gifted with and loaned the items needed for shows. They'll play the Congress Club in Tuscon on Halloween, and locally, they'll gig at Til-Two on November 13. They also have upcoming tours of the Pacific Northwest and Southwest planned for February and March.

"I have all the faith in

the world that we'll get through this, as art is what drives us," says Mullenberg. "This incident, though it is the worst thing I personally have ever experienced, will be just that. A part of my life that is in the past. I refuse to let this stop the art. Period. I wouldn't have the ability to persevere without the friends and family in my life, my bandmates, my roommates, and most of all our San Diego music community."

Driving to succeed

Bassist Mackenzie Leighton's presence on the San Diego jazz scene has grown exponentially over the past few years, to the point where he's been able to land some very high profile gigs with Peter Sprague, Kamau Kenyatta, and Holly Hofmann. But curiously enough, Leighton didn't start off as a bass player. "My first instrument was the trombone. That was my thing from 6th through 8th grade. In high school, I switched to the electric bass, and then to the acoustic when I was 15. It's kind of the classic bass player arc. The stage band needs a bass player, and the director thinks you'd be a good fit."

After high school, he studied with San Diego institution Bob Magnusson, but didn't really come into his own as a player until he left dry land and hit the high seas. "From 2011 to 2014, I was out on various cruise ships. I think that was super important to my development as a musician. I've never been an obsessive practice person. To just sit and woodshed for several hours every day didn't come naturally to me. But when I was working the ships, I did a gig that was five hours a night every day for months at a time. That was

a great situation for logging lots of hours, getting my chops together, learning lots of songs on the fly, and playing with new people all the time. I was 22 and I literally had no bills, so the money was pretty good as I climbed through the ranks, so to speak."

Leighton came back to town, enrolled at San Diego State, and got his master's degree. This reconnected him with Magnusson. "I was more serious about music and a bit better than I was before. He was really generous; he hooked me up with Peter Sprague and Holly Hofmann and set me up with a lot of work."

"A lot of work" is what defines the 33-year-old musician's busy life these days. In addition to a boatload of sideman gigs, he's currently got seven different teaching jobs. "Three of them involve coaching bass students at high

at Mira Costa and Palomar College. My main teaching gig, though, is at Cal State San Marcos, where I teach bass, Jazz Ensemble, and a History of Rock class. The high school and junior college gigs are centered around bass lessons, just getting the students used to playing in time and playing in tune. A lot of my students don't have a background in reading music, so I try to get them up to speed doing that. I don't do any private teaching, though. I prefer the rhythm of the school semester. We meet for 15 weeks, with the goal of a recital at the end, then take a break and do it all again."

How hard is it to keep all of this organized? "It can be tricky to manage, but I have it set up so that I never leave the house to do just one job. Today, for instance, I'm going to coach at a school in Poway, then head to teach my class in San

schools in the Poway school district. This is for orchestra, classical music. I teach them the fundamentals, getting the proper technique down. I also got hired as the jazz band coach at the Coronado School of the Arts, which is where I went to high school. In addition to that, I also teach bass


Marcos. When I'm doing the high school orchestras, it's just for an hour, and they are all at different times of the day. It's a lot of driving." — Robert Bush




BACK TO THE GARDEN

"Our band Back to the Garden is backing Richie Furay for his farewell concert in New Jersey next month," reports guitarist Marc Intravaia of the group's upcoming November 14 gig. their second time playing with the famed Buffalo Springfield and Poco musician. That first gig came about after a friend donated money for an upcoming Furay documentary, and was rewarded with a house concert for which local harmonica player (and Furay collaborator) TJ Klay recommended Back to the Garden. "We'll perform our Music of Laurel Canyon show with guests Calman Hart and Lauren Leigh Martin. It's a story concert, sort of like a live documentary, and will be narrated by Robert Hughes, former owner of KPRI."

THE HOMELESS SEXUALS

Davit Buck, frontman for punk rockers the Homeless Sexuals, claims to have difficulty doing a "normal rock show. It's hard for me because, once the music starts, I just black out and go into that weird world. Even at practice the other night, I accidentally kicked the mic into the guitarist's teeth... I even destroyed a guitar amp by climbing on top and spilling beer into it." After an extended hiatus, the Homeless Sexuals reunited its 2005 lineup for several early 2010 shows. The band splintered again later that year, with Buck going on to form a new band, Zillion Happy

Volts. Other members went on to play with Mice and Death Crisis. Within a couple of years, however, the Homeless Sexuals were again recording and turning up around town. February 2020 saw the release of Homeless Sexuals Demos 2004-2006 on Buck's Full Contact Rock 'N' Roll label, named after his local memorabilia shop. The band has two new members: Clint Graham from John Cougar Concentration Camp and the Waste Aways and Billy Mc-Cowan from Behind the Wagon. They'll appear November 19 at Brick By Brick.



JEFF BERKLEY

"We're stoked about our new video," says singer-songwriter Jeff Berkley of the promo clip for his newly recorded song "Wanderlust," which he says comes from the post-pandemic desire to get back out there and wander around. "Some songs we work on for years and years, but this one was a gift," he says. "Writing is therapy." The single is the first song recorded by his new ensemble, Jeff Berkley & the Banned. Bassist Nathan East attended Crawford High, where he played in the same school band that spawned local talents such as future Fattburger founder Hollis Gentry, as well as Skipper Ragsdale, Steve Christie, Carl Evans Jr, and bassist Gunnar Biggs, who, upon graduation, was replaced by East in the ensemble. East formed the local funk band Power in 1969, along with Gentry, Evans Jr., and Ragsdale. That band toured with Barry White, Nancy Wilson, Al Jarreau, Joe Sample, David Benoit, and Larry Carlton, among others. After earning his music degree at UC San Diego (where he studied with Cecil Lytle and Bert Turetzky), East went on to play with Eric Clapton, George Harrison, Stevie Wonder, Michael Bublé, Quincy Jones, Kenny Loggins, Rod Stewart, Herbie Hancock, Wayne Shorter, Michael Jackson, B.B. King, Bob Dylan, Aretha Franklin, Joe Satriani, and many others. He also co-wrote the 1984 Phil Collins and Phillip Bailey hit "Easy Lover." The star bassist is seen playing with Ringo Starr in the drummer's new video for "Rock Around the Clock," featuring East performing on standup bass in a remote recording studio location along with singer-guitarist Joe Walsh.



TROUBLE IN THE WIND

Founded in Carlsbad, country Americana rockers Trouble in the Wind started off in 2006 as a high school country rock trio called Cactus Bob. After a 2009 name change, they began appearing frequently at the E Street Café in Encinitas. In summer 2012, they won Best Musical Talent in the Musicpalooza talent contest at the San Diego County Fair in Del Mar, taking home a \$5000 cash prize and an electric guitar donated by Taylor Guitars. Their second full-length album Slide Rock, featuring sixteen songs mixed and recorded by the band and preceded by its first single "Taken,"

earned them a Best Americana trophy at the 2014 San Diego Music Awards. Their full-length Lefty won Best Country or Americana Album at the 2018 SDMAs, where they also took home the trophy for Artist of the Year. A 2018 album, Hammer On, was nominated Best Country or Americana Album at the 2019 SDMAs, and the band took home a 2020 San Diego Music Award as Best Country Americana for their All the Boys EP. A new EP was just released in late October, preceded by a single for "Hold On to Your Mind."



Bernard Haitink: few words, much music

Bernard Haitink had died. He was 92. He was the last of the great mid-20th Century conductors who came to worldwide prominence via the recording industry. Starting in 1961, Haitink was the first conductor of the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra in his native city of Amsterdam, Haitink held the post until 1988. During that time, he was also the principal conductor of the London Philharmonic Orchestra and music director of the Glyndebourne Opera.

From 1987 to 2004, he was the music director of London's hallowed Royal Opera Covent Garden. He enjoyed a relationship with the Berlin Philharmonic that lasted almost 50 years, and was the principal guest conductor of The Chicago Symphony.

The composer with whom Haitink is most closely associated is Gustav Mahler. When Haitink took over at The Concertgebouw, Philips --which is a Dutch company already had a contract with the orchestra for a complete set of Mahler Symphonies. Haitink didn't feel up to the task and suggested that they record one per year over the next 10 years, and that's what happened. Philips released Mahler's Symphony 8 and 9 along with Das Lied von der Erde in 1971, concluding the first of Haitink's Mahler sets.

A complete cycle did not ensue, but the recordings were highly anticipated as they were recorded digitally from start to finish. Along with Mahler, Haitink was known for his conducting of Beethoven, Brahms, and Bruckner.

Haitink was a man of few words. He did not like to give interviews, thinking that the music and the performances spoke for themselves. He was also verbally reticent in his rehearsals. His focus was always on showing as opposed to telling. That is a key distinction.

Anyone can talk about music. Heck, even I could give a competent pep talk to an orchestra during a rehearsal. However, showing it is the key. There is no talking during a concert.

The conductor can only show what is needed. Many verbose musicians fail to become great conductors because they lack the ability to show what it is they so freely talk about. Haitink was one of the greats because he could show the orchestra what he wanted. Haitink's final concert was in 2019 at the Lucerne Festival. He conducted the Vienna Philharmonic in a performance of Bruckner's Symphony No. 7.

And for the past five years, some of the best brewers in San Diego have teamed up to release Capital of Craft, a limited-edition IPA brewed specifically for Beer Week. The contributors to the 2021 Capital of Craft, which will hit taps and shelves at the start of Beer Week, include Ballast Point, Booze Bros., Craft Coast, Eppig, Latchkey, Puesto Cervecería, Roleur, and host brewery Societe Brewing.

Societe, explains the collaborative effort, "For this year's Capital of Craft IPA recipe, we incorporated new hop varieties and even used Californiagrown barley for the grain bill. Additionally, there are some newer breweries involved that are helmed by very experienced brewers who finally set out on their own. These brewers made their names at famous places like Gordon Biersch. Pizza Port Brewing, and Ballast Point, and they are now coming together to contribute their own creative spin on an IPA. It'll be more dry and less bitter than the classic IPA that made San Diego the 'Capital of Craft."

One of the new hop varieties is Azacca, which should add hints of tropical fruit, citrus, and pine to the aroma while delivering spicy notes of mango, pine, and pineapple to the palate. The hops were provided by Yakima Chief Hops and the malted barley by Country Malt Group. Other sponsors contributing to the 2021 Capital Craft include White Labs, which provided the yeast; Mother Sponge, which designed the art; and Mobile West Canning Group, which was responsible for the canning process.

Despite so many hands on-deck for the collaboration, choosing a style for the beer was not difficult. Constantiner continues, "We wanted to brew a beer that identifies with the San Diego brewing community - of course, it had to be an IPA. San Diego has been a large part of craft

It has roots in classic West Coast Double IPAs while

exploring newer flavors and aromas from more contemporary hops."

The theme of collaboration runs strong throughout San Diego breweries, as Moynier puts it, "This is a special industry where we are close with our fellow brewers and we want to do what we can to always help each other out."

What's a luzzu? A traditional Maltese fishing boat, an opalescent vessel bedecked in polychromatic hues with two eyes poking out from the bow. Alone, in a sea of nowhere, Jesmark (Jesmark Scicluna) carefully unloops a net in the water that is brighter than the lives of the characters it presents. The craft belonged to his father and grandfather before him. The baby's footprint stamped next to the wheel belongs to Jesmark. It's his hope that someday his newborn son will follow in dad's footstep. For that to happen, two things must first be healed: his boat the Tu Palma, and his baby. Keeping the boat in drydock for however long it takes to repair a cracked hull is nothing compared to the level of stress that awaits Jesmark and his wife Denise's (Michela Farrugia) visit to the family pediatrician. The boy isn't growing properly and needs a specialist that his parents can't afford.

His job as a fisherman doesn't reel in enough capital to provide for a family, and the thought of Denise relying on her mother as a source of income angers the routinely hotheaded Jesmark.

Some days, there just ain't no fish. There's work to be found, but our environmentally conscious angler refuses to answer an ad from a


seabed-desecrating corporation looking to hire a trawler. Too many laws have been put in place that are both taking a cut out of his business and treating Jesmark and his partner as if they are criminals. It's closed season, a time when swordfish is not on the menu. Just as DeSica's thief stole a bicycle to provide for his family, Jesmark finds himself perfectly suited for a career in the black market. The boss admires his ability to transform leftover fish into scallops and offers him a job. Jesmark has never left the island on which he was born. His newfound partner in crime reminds him that a fish who stays in the bowl never grows.

The film goes exactly where one doesn't expect. Characters doublingback on each other supply the action; the only weapon in the piece is a knife used to cut nets. Jesmark lives a life of "us against them" until the tides turn and he becomes one of them. His transformative voyage of discovery ends with our hero literally following doctor's orders. He's a better man for it. And you will be, too. $\star \star \star \star \star$



10/30: 1599 anglers aboard 85 trips out of San Diego landings this past week caught 88 bluefin tuna (up to 310 pounds). 30 bocaccio, 91 bonito. 288 calico bass (187 released), 19 dorado. 8 lingcod, 16 lobster (8 released), 8 rock crab, 2429 rockfish, 19 sand bass, 216 sculpin, 114 sheephead, 169 skipjack tuna, 477 whitefish. 237 yellowfin tuna, and 2823 vellowtail.

Saltwater: I was watching a

show on TV and a line from a character got me thinking about the survival rate of fish that have been caught and released. In the scene, Billy Bob Thornton as Billy McBride in episode three of Goliath, was speaking to a commercial fisherman. He said, "Y'know, I like to fish myself. I catch and release, though. You ever do that? Catch and release? Drag the little bastard around by the lip 'til he gets all gassed up with lactic acid, then you take the hook out an' look him in the eye and say 'I was just fuckin' with va buddv'?"

I have always felt that most species of fish are relatively hardy, and if handled correctly and not gut-hooked or gillhooked, most would recover after being caught and released. There are caveats to that train of thought, though. Saltwater species are generally tougher than freshwater species. Trout, for instance, are not very hardy at all. Most lakes that feature trout fishing do not permit their release. As it is, for those fishing with bait or lures, the mortality rate is about 40% for trout. That number is much lower, less than 5% for those caught on flies. One reason is the type of hooks used; baitholder hooks and treble hooks used for bait fishing and treble hooks on most trout lures can cause a lot of damage even if the fish is lip-hooked. The hooks usually used when fly fishing are generally smaller and often barbless.

This past July, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife advised that in those places where trout can be released, anglers should not prolong the fight, as a long battle will greatly reduce the survival rate. It's not a rule, just a suggestion. A suggestion that goes against the grain of anglers in general. We anglers tend to rate the fish we catch on their fighting ability. The smaller the species, the more their fighting ability seems to matter. I have heard these comparisons, or something similar, often; "If bluegill were the size of tuna, they'd kick your butt." "Pound for pound, smallmouth bass are twice as powerful as largemouth bass." And, to the freshwater angler who hooks a yellowtail for the first time, "You are now going to see how hard a real fish fights."

Though saltwater species are generally tougher than fish that swim in lakes, streams, and rivers, some are tough to catch and release with any chance of survival. Yellowtail fight very hard but can be successfully released after a long battle. I know people that catch and release them often, but the size of the fish and proximity to the water matters. A 30-pound fish is not easily raised to the deck of a sportboat several feet above the water without a gaff. From a small boat or kayak where the angler can touch water, they can be handled more easily and released. That said, yellowtail flesh is popular table fare, and in general they are rarely released.

In the vein of conservation, yellowtail is not listed as endangered or even threatened. We post pictures of our yellowtail catches and the comments that roll in are things like "Nice catch!" and "That's gonna make some good Hamachi!" But try and post a picture on social media of a striped marlin hanging at the scale, and about 50% of the comments from other anglers will be meant to shame the angler for killing it. Though striped marlin is listed as near-threatened, they are commercially fished for food in many countries. Smoked marlin, poke, and even marlin tacos are popular dishes south of the border and across the Pacific. But in most cases, the common excuse given by an angler shamed for killing a marlin is true: one problem with releasing marlin is that they fight so hard that a moderate percentage of those hooked and fought "roll" and cannot be revived.

There is one species of fish consistently reported as released by sportfishing operations in Southern California: Calico Bass. Calico bass are slow-growing endemic species and as they are heavily targeted in and near kelp beds, their population is dependent on regulations limiting size and number kept. That said, they are a very hardy species and are usually released successfully. Though they are good eating with flaky white meat, they have achieved a status among anglers not unlike marlin. Keeping a large female calico, while legal, can draw the ire of other anglers. "Don't kill the breeders" is a popular mantra in the near-shore angling community. Like largemouth bass in freshwater, many continued on page 44

How long have you been surfing? About three and half years. I started late.

Do you have a favorite surf moment?

The very first time I got on a board in Todos Santos. I unexpectedly took [a surf] lesson. The first time I stood up, I fundamentally, essentially changed. I knew that I would not be able to stop [surfing].

It's an Education

- Elementary students at Wilton Manors school in Florida were treated to a field trip on Oct. 27, walking over to Rosie's Bar and Grill accompanied by Broward County School Board member Sarah Leonardi, who posted about the outing on her official Facebook page. Fox News reported that the post ignited outrage among members of the community, who, beyond their incredulity that a bar and grill was a "field trip" destination, were upset that Rosie's is an LGBT bar, with items on the menu such as Rhoda Cowboy and Big Girl Burgers. Leonardi and the school district did not comment on the school trip.

Harsh

- An unnamed Thai woman, 34, who lives in a high-rise condominium building in Bangkok was apparently very unhappy that she wasn't informed that two painters, using ropes, would be working on the outside of the building on Oct. 12. So she cut their support rope, the Associated Press reported. One of the painters, a man named Song, said he and his co-worker had lowered themselves from the 32nd floor to repair cracks. When he reached the 30th floor, he felt something on the rope and looked down to see someone on the 21st floor lean out of the window and cut his rope. A third colleague supported them from the top floor as they tried to summon help from people in other apartments. A couple on the 26th floor finally let them in. The suspect confessed to cutting the rope and said she had no intention of killing the workers, but she faces attempted murder and property destruction charges.

Parenting Fail

- On Oct. 23, police in Gillette, Wyoming, were called to a home about a fight between a man and woman. When they arrived, the man had already left in his pickup truck, the *Gillette News Record* reported. He was pulled over and emerged from the truck with his two sons, 15 and 4. Sheriff's Lt. Paul Pownall said that the

39-year-old admitted he'd been drinking but said his 4-year-old had been sitting on his lap and doing the actual driving. The suspect, who was already on unsupervised probation, was charged with his second DUI.

Irony

- With Halloween jusst passing, Clark County (Nevada) law enforcement agencies came together to promote pedestrian safety on Oct. 26. The "crosswalk fairy," a police officer in costume, even escorted people across busy Boulder Highway, KVVU-TV reported. But as officers demonstrated proper crosswalk techniques, pedestrian Tammy Wotton tried to cross the street where the event was being held – and was almost struck by a semi-truck. Nevada law stipulates that vehicles must yield to pedestrians. Officers pulled over the truck driver, along with several other offending motorists.

Most Competent Criminal

- A clever burglar in Coronado, California, devised a simple way to enter a home there on Oct. 21, the Associated Press reported. The 43-year-old woman just called a locksmith and asked him to change the locks on "her" home, then went inside, settled in, and turned on the music and fireplace. But a neighbor noticed the activity and contacted the out-of-town homeowner, who alerted the police. When officers arrived, the spare key provided by the neighbor didn't fit the locks, and police saw metal shavings and parts of a discarded lock near the front door. Police went around back, called out to the 2021

Space Invasion

- Forget a "rude" awakening - this one verges closer to "terrifying." Ruth Hamilton of Golden, British Columbia, told CBC News that she woke up on Oct. 4 to her dog barking. "The next thing was just a huge explosion and debris all over my face," she said. After realizing something had punched a hole in her ceiling, she called 911. While answering the operator's questions, she moved a bed pillow and discovered a "melon-sized space rock" that must have landed inches from her head while she slept. Peter Brown, a physics and astronomy professor at Western University in London, Ontario, confirmed the rock was "certainly a meteorite," but will require further study to determine its exact origins.

The Way the World Works

- Well, it's happened: the first-ever doping scandal to rock the world of professional Venetian gondoliers. Renato Busetto has been stripped of his second-place award in September's Historical Regatta and has been banned from competing for more than a year, the *Daily Mail* reported. He tested positive for marijuana after the event on Sept. 4, and on Oct. 27, Venice's Technical Disciplinary Commission laid out his punishment.

calico bass tournaments are catch and release only, and in lieu of livewells used in largemouth competitions, require a photo of a fish on a sanctioned measuring device.

But even with rules in place and despite the influence from anglers, we still go out and seek that battle, whether for food or sport. Catch and release fishing, if done properly, can help ensure a strong fishery for future generations. I have fished for food, pay, and recreation throughout my life. I respect my prey, and I when I do not keep fish, I do my best to release fthem with care. I often wonder, though, if it is just human instinct; if we, like Hemingway's Santiago, need to recapture our former glory or establish our worth by dragging a frantic fish around by the lip. At 59, I no longer target marlin and I release more fish than I keep. Maybe sensitivity to life gets stronger as we approach our own mortality, but, for me, that doubt usually fades by the first bite of a fresh fish taco.
