Baptism and blood Gang brings death to celebration

At a recent pre-trial hearing, prosecutor Shawn Tafreshi claimed that parolee Luis Ezekial Espinoza, then 26, was wearing a GPS ankle monitor when he drove his silver Nissan Altima full of homies to shoot up an Oceanside baptism celebration on April 28, 2018. The shooting left one man dead, and two more were wounded. Suspects have since been identified and arrested.

Tafreshi claimed that Espinoza, whose gang name is allegedly "Serio," was the eldest gangmember and had the most status of the six alleged Varrio San Marcos (VSM) gang members in his car. Those alleged members were named as: Emmanuel Nelson, whose gang name is "Puma;" Omar David Ornelas, known as "Damage;" Anthony Avila, known as "Devious;" Miguel, known as "Blanco;" and a man named Elmer Ayala. Espinoza was wearing the VeriTracks ankle bracelet

as part of a GPS monitoring system used for parolees in California. When he was later contacted by police, Espinoza claimed he had been in that neighborhood at that time to pick up a girlfriend.

The celebration of the child's baptism had started about 2 pm that Saturday on Jacqueline Lane, near Tri City Hospital. By about 8 pm, the party was winding down, but there were still 30 or 40 people there, some standing outside the home, with many children running around, according to witnesses. Two tall men reportedly walked toward the house party; one of them held a silver pistol. One reportedly yelled, "This is Ghost Town! I'm looking for Vista Home Boys!" and the other yelled, "Varrio San Marcos!" At 7:59 p.m. multiple calls to 911 reported gunshots.


The godfather of the baptized child was seen grabbing up two small children; he turned and ran for the house. Another witness said he heard "at least two gunshots pop off." One victim, 26, was standing in the front yard smoking a cigarette. He reported, "I heard a gunshot and I got hit." The bullet went through his arm and into his rib cage. "That's what the surgeon told me." His lung was damaged, and he was in hospital for one month. Another man, 45, was also hit; he too survived. Police later found four 9mm expended casings in the street in front of the party house, and they collected one blue box cutter from underneath a car parked at the curb.

Another man — Jose Alfredo Jimenez, 29 — came running out of the party house during the confrontation. The two strangers reportedly turned and ran back toward their car, which was parked a half block away on Thunder Drive. Jimenez reportedly chased the two strangers all the way back to their car and smashed a brick into the head of one of the intruders. Jimenez then suffered gun shots to his right arm, right torso, lower back, buttocks, and groin. It was reported that his kidneys, liver, lung, and heart were dam-

> aged. He did not survive. Police later collected nine expended shell casings in the street on Thunder Drive, and more 9 mm Winchester casings in a driveway. Bullet holes in the facade of one house and the damaged tire of one parked vehicle were photographed.

> Prosecutor Tafreshi alleged that "Puma" Nelson and "Damage" Ornelas, both 21 at the time, were the two alleged Varrio San Marcos gang members who shot the party-goers. He alleged that Ornelas first wounded the two persons who were outside the party, and then Nelson shot Jiminez after he struck him with the brick. Investigators later recorded multiple suspects speaking to each other in jail cells, and Ornelas reportedly said that if DNA could be found on the cartridges or bullets, he "would be fucked."

Nelson, now 25, has a puma symbol tattooed on his neck, the letters "SM" on the back of his neck, "GHOST TOWN" in large letters on his back, and "1904" on his right forearm and "1913" on his hands, according to a San Diego County Sheriff gang expert who testified at the hearing. The numbers 19 and 13 correspond with the letters S and M in the alphabet — for San Marcos, and 19 and 04 for the letters S and D — for San Diego.) Police allegedly found a YouTube

videos labeled "Rap from G Boy SM," in which Nelson's voice declares his allegiance to Varrio San Marcos and that he "kills for the thrill" and has "murderous tendencies, pulling triggers on enemies." Ornelas, now 24, allegedly has a Georgia Tech logo tattooed on one arm. The gang expert said the GT symbol is used by Ghost Town members. Police claim they DFI MAR

found rap lyrics on Ornelas' phone, in which he spoke about his gang moniker, saying that he goes by "Damage" because he inflicts damage on his enemies.

The Sheriff's gang expert said that Varrio San Marcos has about 62 documented gang

members, and that they claim the entire city of San Marcos. They call themselves VSM for Varrio San Marcos, and GT for Ghost Town, and SMGT and 1913. The founders of VSM in the 1970s called it Ghost Town or 720, because there was not much there at the time. Then in 2004, a shot caller created a subset gang called the Wolfpack, or SMWP, or 2316. Driver Espinoza is alleged

to be part of Wolfpack.

Both Nelson and Orenelas have prior felony convictions, with gang allegations. Their next court date is January 25, 2022, to set a date for trial.

Crane in vain? Don't ask Amtrak

Amtrak in absentia

Train brains would do well to keep track

As the failing bluffs at Del Mar play havoc with passenger and freight rail service, officials of taxpayer-subsidized Amtrak, otherwise known as the National Railroad Passenger Corporation, have been chronic no-shows at discussions to fix the problem. "Since 2018, at least six bluff failures have occurred in the Del Mar Bluffs area just north of San Diego, California, resulting in temporary closures on the railroad tracks that traverse the area and speed restrictions on Amtrak's high-volume Pacific Surfliner route 1." That's per a December 6 memo from Assistant Inspector General Jim Morrison to Amtrak executive vice president and chief operations officer Scot Naparstek calling out Amtrak's lack of engagement during the crisis. "The most recent failure occurred in February 2021, when a 60-foot seawall collapsed at the base of 1.7-mile-long section of the tracks that run along the bluffs. Also, in late September 2021, coastal erosion and high tides caused the railroad tracks near San Clemente, California to shift 14 inches, leading to a 3-week partial shut-down of the Pacific Surfliner."

Yet despite the burgeoning crisis and threats to future service, Amtrak officials have remained above the fray, and have not "engaged in broader forums to discuss...the conditions and work along the bluffs. For example, after a major bluff slide in late

2019, the California State **Transportation Agency orga**nized a year-long effort to examine short- and long-term bluff stabilization issues that included more than 70 participants." Amtrak, "the largest passenger operator on the bluffs," the report says, "did not participate. A follow-on study began in the summer of 2020 to analyze alternative route alignments, compare the benefits and costs in

terms of safety, ridership, and speed, and assess impacts on service plans. Amtrak, according to the audit, "is not participating in these discussions either, although any decisions to realign the route could affect the company's service plans and its revenue/ridership."

Notes the document. "Because the company has not been actively participating in ongoing working groups or discussions with stakeholders about these and other issues along the Pacific Surfliner route, it may not be receiving the most current information on the conditions, mitigation plans, and short- and long-term actions under consideration. Without current information on these efforts, the company may not be well-positioned to determine when circumstances warrant additional company actions."

In a December 2, 2021, response to the audit's preliminary findings, Amtrak chief Scot Naparstek pledged a change of course. "Effective immediately, the Executive Vice President/Chief Operations Officer has mandated that an Amtrak representative from the Operations Department will participate in ongoing discussions with stakeholders about evolving coastal conditions, short and long-term remediation efforts, and potential realignment of the Pacific Surfliner route. Amtrak is confident that the measures outlined here," the memo continued, "address the [Inspector General's] considerations and support Amtrak's proactive risk management strategy."



"She was a hero to women across our nation as the brilliant lawyer who successfully argued the landmark reproductive rights case Roe v. Wade before the U.S. Supreme Court in 1971 & 1972," says a January 9 obituary dedicated to Texas lawyer Sarah Wed-

dington, who died December 26. While most *U-T* death notices typically detail the number of great-grandchildren left behind by the deceased or their favorite sports teams, Schaeffer's Weddington tribute reads, "I escorted Sarah to a Planned Parenthood celebration in her honor in San Diego and took her to visit the AIDS quilt exhibit in Balboa Park. We explored Tijuana together, our neighboring city to the south,



advertised for an ethics investigator to root out its burgeoning raft of in-house scandals in November. U.C. San Diego Health, per a January 11 news release by the U.S. Justice Department, "has paid \$2.98 million to resolve allegations that it violated the False Claims Act by ordering medically unnecessary genetic testing reimbursed by Medicare." Says the announcement, "from December 2015 to October 2019, U.C. San Diego Health ordered and submitted

referrals for medically unnecessary genetic testing performed by CQuentia Arkansas Labs, CQuentia NGS, and Total Diagnostic II." Intoned U.S. Attorney Randy Grossman: "Ordering unnecessary genetic tests creates a drain on vital governmentfunded health care programs like Medicare."



Deep-pocketed *Union-Tribune* owner **Patrick Soon-Shiong**'s Nant Capital has "loaned" \$300 million of his sizable fortune to his Los Angeles-based ImmunityBio venture, side-stepping a

potentially embarrassing public stock offering. "With the \$300 million financing from Nant Capital combined with the equity raised over the last nine months, we have made the decision to pause the At-the-Market offering, and we are well-positioned to further accelerate development of our oncology and covid-19 trials," ImmunityBio's chief executive Richard Adcock said in a January 10 LA Business Journal dispatch. Having a 78.8% stake in the company, the publication notes, Soon-Shiong "is the most impacted by any significant


> movement in ImmunityBio's share price." The stock's price bumped up the first week of January with the announcement that ImmunityBio had finished setting up a deal with Emeryville-based biotech Amyris Inc. to get into the potentially lucrative business of making a covid-19 vaccine. But all has not gone according to plan for another high-profile covid-related Soon-Shiong venture. Back in 2020, the super-rich biotech magnate

bought the 7.5-acre St. Vincent Medical Center in L.A.'s Westlake district out of bankruptcy for \$135 million. According to an April 16, 2020, news release from seller Verity Health System, Soon-Shiong was to "assume the lease between Verity Health and the State of California, which allows the State to utilize the main campus to provide services related to the SARS-CoV-2 virus and related infectious disease ('COVID-19') pandemic. Dr. Patrick Soon-Shiong will also use the other buildings on the St. Vincent campus to conduct critical COVID-19 research." Soon-Shiong personally entered the transaction after state Attorney General **Xavier Becerra** objected to a previously set sale to a Soon-Shiong-run non-profit. (Becerra com-

> plained the arrangement would be tainted by conflict of interest because a Soon-Shiong profitmaking company was a creditor in bankruptcy, the Los Angeles *Times* reported.) But per the LABusiness Journal's account, under Soon-Shiong's stewardship, the property's status has since been in limbo. "In November 2020, Soon-Shiong quietly turned over the campus to Chicago-based real estate giant Jones Lang LaSalle

proposed the resolution along with Councilmember Terry Gaasterland. Over 244 cities have already supported the initiative, including the city of Los Angeles, Martinez said. The petition has received \$200,000 from the AIDS Healthcare Foundation, along with funding from the group Our Neighborhood Voices.

At the center of the fight over local zoning are two new state laws, SB 9 and 10, which tackle the housing shortage by allowing more units per lot. Far too many, as their opponents see it; up to six, counting the existing home. Those opponents regard the new laws as the death of single-family zoning, measures that will draw investors and developers who (they say) will turn entire residential neighborhoods into apartment zones. SB 9, for instance, would allow up to four new units as well as a granny flat on most single-family properties. Additional parking would not be required, since the measures would encourage that units be built near transit lines and job centers by imposing fewer zoning limitations.

The new laws don't mandate any affordable housing, but cities are already supposed to be building their fair share to meet regional housing needs. Del Mar added just one affordable unit in its previous housing cycle (2013-2020). Its current 6th Cycle Housing Element has not yet been certified by the state. Right now, plans for where to put such housing target the state-owned fairgrounds. But that land would hold only about half of the 113 units the San Diego Association of Governments determined is Del Mar's fair share; the rest would go in downtown Del Mar.

Mayor Worden said the city has been through a long, grueling process trying to bring the housing element into compliance with state law, "putting ADUs in various places." Now, in addition, the city must reckon with SB 9 and 10, which would allow four units where there used to be 2, he said. "I'd rather live with the mistakes we make than mistakes made by the state," he concluded.

Housing isn't the only issue when it comes to questions of community control, however. The city is also struggling to assert its local coastal plan, which centers on adaptation measures that don't involve the Coastal Commission's managed retreat - read: moving houses away from the rising sea. It, too, remains uncertified by the state. Trains, on the other hand, they do want to see moved inland, miles from the eroding bluffs; it's another topic involving complicated jurisdiction. Neither will be helped by the citizens' initiative, which doesn't cover every local issue. State law would prevail in three areas of statewide importance: coastal zones, power plant sites, and infrastructure projects.

Flood buds

River rescue team rides when the waters rise

In December, San Diego accumulated 2.58 inches of rain at the San Diego International Airport, almost an inch more than our city's 1.6-inch December average. "Widespread heavy rainfall and mountain snow is forecast this week, with the heaviest precipitation occurring Wednesday [December 29] afternoon through Thursday [December 30] morning," warned the US National Weather Service San Diego.

In preparation, locals retrieved complimentary sandbags from the County of San Diego or CAL FIRE, then lined the flood-prone areas of their properties and surrounding streets and sidewalks. Those San Diegans who were headed towards Mount Palomar and Mount Laguna, which received more than two inches of rain and snow, were wise to follow CAL FIRE's advice: "Be winter driving ready... Even the safest driver can still end up in an accident." Local auto racers took precautions by removing cold air intakes, which sit low to the asphalt and are notorious for sucking floodwater into the engine's cylinders,

in La Jolla, at 3:21 pm, a report read: "Storm drain clogged preventing access to school parking lot prevent parents and staff from entering or leaving."

But most flooding reports that Tuesday came in from Mission Valley and Fashion Valley — as commuters by the carload (boatload?) trekked in for holiday shopping. At about 8 am, The River Rescue Team collected a motorist on Avenida Del Rio "with a high directional off their bumper for a one-point boat rescue." (The River Rescue Team is a subsidiary of San Diego Fire-Rescue,

established in 1978 to "respond to emergencies created by flooding due to heavy rain. It is the task of the team to rescue people or property threatened, surrounded or entrapped by stationary or moving water.") traffic, the driver of a black Toyota Camry driver proceeded anyway. Then the car conked out. Eventually, lifeguards pulled up in a yellow boat and rescued the Camry driver.

That same day, a San Diego State University student captured video footage of a driver driving a black Camry through a flooded street "in Mission Valley" and posted it to the *DaygoTV* Instagram account. "Oh shit, it got stuck," says the person filming. Felipe M. from El Cajon explained that it was "because of how fast he/she was driving the Camry. The water got all up in the engine. The water probably got in the air filter and throttle body, and then killed the engine — hydrolock. Also, if your coil gets wet, it'll start misfiring, and that'll shut the engine off, too. And lastly, if the connector to the crank sensor gets wet, that's not good." Felipe races a VW Bug in the annual Baja 1000 races, where he sometimes has to drive through deep water and mud. "Thing is, when we race, we just drive slow in the deep waters."

San Diego County is a big place. With a population of nearly 3.3 million people, the head count here is higher than in 21 entire states. But again: it's a big place, covering 4526 square miles. That's more land than Delaware and Rhode Island combined.

Sure, we've got our city centers surrounded by densely-packed suburbs. And wealthy inland enclaves like Rancho Santa Fe might even give you a homesite with several acres of land upon

which to spread out. But there's still plenty of barren wilderness back country where you won't see a neighbor for days unless you're look-

ing for them. Let's head out east, and explore a massive compound where you and perhaps a few dozen friends can hunker down and await the apocalypse undisturbed.

"Historic Rancho Jamul," the Zillow listing for the 120-acre estate at 17426 Campo Road opens, was "established in the mid-19th century, the headquarters for a once sprawling cattle and equine operation spreading far east and north." We're promised "beautifully expansive, usable land encompassing a functionally versatile ranching retreat." Sounds nice, doesn't it?

The first photo on our tour shows a nicelytrimmed lawn and a whole bunch of palm trees in front of a house with quite a few garage bays. Let's assume this is the "impressive 6000+/sf rambling, main adobe ranch-house with outdoor pool and entertaining space." It certainly doesn't look like it was built in 1860 as reported in the listing (public records offer no help confirming or denying this build date), but it's appealing, nonetheless.

We're also told there are two more "secondary residences" in addition to a "caretakers home, several barns and outbuildings, two water wells and acreage ideal for a variety of uses and activities."

An aerial shot shows us a tropically-landscaped compound of buildings, and another shows us just how alone we'd be when living here - there's nothing else in sight aside from the tree-lined drive to our gated entryway. A foliage canopy completely covers the path leading from a wrought-iron gate to what I assume is the main entrance. At least, it's the entrance I would bring friends through on their first visit, just to impress them.

We've got a proper entry foyer, then a big living room with the sort continued on page 9

of rock-lined fireplace you'd expect to find in a mid-century home about 60 or so years old, which is when I'm guessing the current residence was built. The white carpet does not seem like it would lend itself to ranch living, however. Moving on, there's a dining room that at first I thought was part of the kitchen, outfitted with a brick wall and a fireplace. Add the big wooden table with lazy Susan and you've definitely got a "ranch house" vibe going on. The real kitchen is through a passageway off to the side. While it's had a recent remodel, it's not as opulent as some of the kitchens we're used to seeing in this column but is that a pizza oven built into one wall below the microwave and wall oven? Yes, please. We then get another dining room that's even bigger than the kitchen-adjacent one, another living area with brick walls, exposed-beam ceilings, and (by my count) the third fireplace we've seen so far, plus a bar/ pub with a more modern feel than much of the house.

The bedrooms are fine, really. The main suite has an extensive hallway wardrobe leading to a large bath with a soaking tub and a couple of nooks that we're going to assume are hiding a shower and toilet. The rest of the interior photos are of rooms that look like they could be in my house, except much larger.

Now we're getting back outside to the pool area, and I am returning to being impressed. A little non-functional bridge over a pile of rocks that appear to have been placed there solely for the purpose of building a bridge over them leads us to the massive black-bottomed pool and a covered patio that houses another fireplace, a bar, a TV, and an outdoor kitchen. I can't tell if the other building here is a pool house or one of the secondary residences, but whatever it is, this would make an excellent gathering space and, with no discernible neighbors aside from the ones cooccupying your compound, there's no risk of a noise disturbance.

We're next presented with a handful of photos of some of the other houses, which look simultaneously more modern and less opulent than the main residence. One of them features another pleasant loggia with what's now the fifth fireplace we've seen, but it's unclear how many bedrooms and baths each contains. Will you need ten friends to help you occupy this property? Thirty? All we know is that it's a large number.

The last pictures are of a pair of barns; these are the only structures I believe could actually be more than 100 years old. Maybe you could house some horses there — or maybe vou're scared they could fall down at any moment. I'm not sure which is the correct call here. There are also some more aerial shots of empty fields just waiting to be plowed and planted, or torn up to build a monster truck course, or to have done to them whatever a very wealthy person with a large plot of land wishes to do. We're told the ranch is "surrounded by an Ecological Preserve & Wildlife Aera totaling thousands of acres assuring continued privacy and endless recreational opportunities," so let's assume the possibilities are pretty wide open.

Public records list a Lawrence Daley as owner of the ranch. Daley died in 2002, but not before he and his wife Barbara dedicated another 597 acres of their land to create the Lawrence and Barbara Daley Preserve near the property. Rancho Jamul was listed for sale in early December, the first time it's recorded to have been offered to the public. The list price, which seeks offers between \$5,999,000 and \$6,299,000, remains unchanged to date. ■

Sailor Shangaied by Russian

But not the way you think

Continuing my research into the history of my home's original owners: the 1950 census won't be released until 2025, so it was impossible to follow the census trail forward any further. I figured the only more current record I would find on our couple was their death dates, which I figured would also get me their birth dates. Harry, who had been born in Missouri, lived from 1879 to 1954; Keria lived from 1889 to 1965. Both are buried at Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery in Point Loma, which makes sense, given that Harry was a Navy veteran.

Death information can be easily attained online through the free resource Findagrave.com. The site even contained photos of the couple's gravesites, and from those, I discovered that "Keria" was short for "Glikeria". Just like that, her name had gone from something unusual for its time period to what the heck country did she come from? It seemed that Harry L. Rogers, who had about as American a name as one could have 100-150 years ago, likely married an immigrant.

Armed with their birth and death years, I set out to see what else I could dig up on Harry and Glikeria. Even though there was no family tree on Ancestry.com that claimed them (no major surprise there), the document floodgates soon opened up. I found their 1915 marriage certificate, applied for in Shanghai, China, where Harry was obviously stationed. Besides the surprising residence, I learned that Glikeria's full maiden name was Glikeria Dmitrieva Hastchina. A 27-year-old bride to be, she had been born in Kharkof (Tomsk Province), Russia, and, according to a Wikipedia entry, seemed to fit the description of an early "Shanghai Russian". Wikipedia defines this group

as a Russian diaspora that flourished in Shanghai, China, between WWI and WWII. Clearly, Harry Llewellyn (as I now had his middle name) Rogers had done some roundthe-world traveling as a sailor, and must have met his fiancée in China. But how did Glikeria and Harry communicate? In English? In Russian? In some

form of Mandarin? That was something I knew I'd never discern about their early years together.

When it came to digging through documents on Ancestry.com, though, the best news was that the couple did some serious overseas traveling after getting married, and that meant passports. And passports meant photos! Their subtly smiling faces adorned both their passport applications from 1917, when they were heading from Manila to the United States. Glikeria wore an undoubtedly homemade, European, checkerboard-design blouse in her photo, while Harry donned his bright white lab coat in his. It was fortuitous that photos were included, because they had not become a regular fixture in passports until 1914. I was beyond excited to see what the pair looked like, because I had already been drawing a detailed mental image of them going through their daily routines in the rooms of our old house some 80+ years ago. I imagined Glikeria calling out in her Russian accent: "Harry, would you please shut the front door? There's a draft in here!" Next week - Part 4: Bought houses on Brookes, Upas, 8th

But too late now. Bunch of guys standing at the bar with some of their girlfriends belt out with Toby Keith on the juke box, "I love this bar!" Then a couple of them look up and lift their glasses. Above them, the photo gallery of their buddies who didn't make it back from wars in places like Afghanistan look down. You suddenly feel like stopping everything out of respect.

And then you feel like: no, this is what they would want. These guys bonding are doing it for them. I look up again. In some weird way, they look as though they approve.

Love in Little Haiti

San Diego's active Haitian Pastor Johny (sic) Oxeda has a new weapon: his food truck. He uses it to reach out to his flock, to give them a taste of home. Also, to spread Haitian culture to others — and yes, to make money. Just now, it's seven at night. We're in a shadowy cul de sac in City Heights, and his food truck is blasting French-peppered Creole music. "French is our official language," Pastor Johny says while he waits for customers. The Haitian Caribbean Kitchen truck is covered in pictures of grilled sandwiches that look like empanadas, or dishes of "Fritay chicken," or Caribbean spaghetti.

The reverend and his wife and family have just started this food truck business, slinging everything Haitian, from "griot and pikliz" (pork cubes with pickled shredded vegetables) to "fritay chicken (fritters) and tasso ham." But it's not just food. Pastor Oxeda wants us all to know about Haiti, too. "I come from the first free Black Country," he says. "The slaves revolted and won. You had your revolution in 1776. We had our revolution in 1791." What started as the largest slave uprising since Spartacus turned the French slave colony into the republic of Haiti, which, despite its prob-

me get through, and I will bless Him for that."

And Haiti? It has had to learn to endure, he says. "When it's not being run by a dictator, it's filled with insecurity, poverty, politics, and so many disasters, like the earthquakes of 2010 and 2021 and the assassination of President Jovenel Moise last July. It's sometimes all a little too much for us humans. Only God knows how to change things. I grew up without

lems, remains a beacon of black-ruled independence to this day.

Still, Pastor Oxeda says times in the country of his birth are really, really tough. He had to leave because of death threats. "Life was never easy like it is here. We didn't grow up with electricity. We didn't grow up with food. We didn't grow up with nice clothes, clean water, good education. Being born in Haiti makes me value what I have now, and I teach people how many blessings they have, to be born and raised in a

country like this. I have never been into drugs, alcohol, I've never been in any trouble, because where I come from, when you make a mistake, you get killed. If you steal stuff, they kill you. If you're in drugs, you're killed. People die for whatever reason, for whatever small mistake they make. So I thank my country. At least, with those choices, it forced me to be a better person." At an early age, his mom passed. "I had to survive alone, to be independent. But by the grace of the Lord, He has always helped

father, mother, but one of the best strengths I have now is that I live here, in a safe country, a lovely country, where people respect you for who you are, and which gives us a lot of great opportunity. That's something I'm really happy about."

We talk into the night, until Pastor Oxeda's first customer walks into the pool of light.

"Hello, sir. How are you?"

"Do you have tacos?"

"No, sir. This is Haitian food." ■





he Marina District is one of San Diego's more prestigious addresses. Once consisting mostly of warehouses and vacant lots, the 343-acre area on the west side of Downtown is now a cluster of apartments, high-rise condos and townhomes. The District is credited with igniting the revitalization of the Gaslamp Quarter by bringing the crucial residential element to the city's center, beginning in 1982 with the Marina Park and Park Row condominiums. According to the San Diego Condo Mania website, the average price of a Marina District condo (as of December 2021) was \$2,173,130, with an average price per square foot of \$1,813.

But despite the prestige and price, according to a September 2021

story on the *News Break* website, which bills itself as "The Nation's #1 Intelligent Local News App," the Marina District is one of San Diego's five most dangerous places to live. "It's one of San Diego's most expensive areas," the article states. "Don't be fooled though; it's also among the most dangerous neighborhoods in San Diego, with a crime rate of 556% greater than the San Diego average. Any resident in Marina has a 1 in 9 chance of becoming a crime victim, so it's advised to avoid exploring the area alone or moving in the area if you're a family with kids." Little Italy, the reborn Italian-American community now known for its high-end restaurants and elegant pedestrian mall, fared no better in the *News Break* story: "Police patrols are rare, while property crime and thefts occur frequently, especially

around public transit areas. And although the crime rate has been on the decline over the past few years, it's still deemed an unsafe area for families, women, and solo travelers." The top danger zone in San Diego, the article maintains, is East Village: "Heroin addicts and drug-addicted people fill up this neighborhood, often living on the streets. Petty crimes and muggings often take place as well." Also on the list are Horton Plaza ("Exploring the neighborhood alone, especially at night times, is deemed greatly unsafe") and Kearny Mesa ("a vast majority of Kearny Mesa's crime is in petty thefts and muggings, which mainly occur in public means of transport").

The USA ESTA Online website, run by a privately owned service provider specializing in Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA) applications, also published a story on dangerous San Diego neighborhoods in July 2020. The writing appeared to be generated by a computer, or by someone using bad translation software. At the top of this list: Kearny Mesa. "This neighborhood of 3,664 people has a vast majority of its crime in petty thefts," the website said. "Bus transits and other public means of transport are thus not safe." East Village, according the website, is filled with "heroin addicts and drug-addled homeless.... Strangely enough, there are tons of police patrolling this neighborhood regularly. This neighborhood is not a safe one for walks or bike journeys, especially at night times.... Females and visitors are encouraged to travel lighter, in terms of cash handling.

This is to avoid being mugged. Residents are doubtful about the safety of public commutes or hotels." And Oak Park, the website said, "has a slight gang situation and car stealing fetish.... Going around Oak Park gets sketchy, so walking or strolling should quit at daylight hours. Preferably, female solo travelers would need to be escorted at nights through these seedy areas."

Ah, San Diego! For years, our humble burg received precious little media coverage, and most of what was written consisted of fawning travel stories that pegged San Diego as a hidden gem just waiting to be discovered. In a 1925 cover story for the Los Angeles Times Sunday Magazine, John Steven McGroarty wrote, "It is a strange thing, indeed, that the world has been so slow to find its way to San Diego. It has always been a wonder to us - this strange thing. A spot so surpassingly alluring in its beauty, so glamorous with romance, and that was ever so potential in its commercial position of strategic mastery. But, the world has a way of learning at last. And now it is making a pathway to San Diego's door - to its puerta del sol, the doorway of the sun.... The vision of San Diego taking her place among the great cities of the earth is so clear and vivid now that even the dullest mind cannot fail to see it."

Nearly 20 years later, World War II brought San Diego into the national spotlight for its military presence. Famed war correspondent Ernie Pyle wrote in 1942, "You can't help but feel war when you are in San Diego.... The streets are

some ways it is like a college town.... Since I was here last spring, more housing projects have gone up [and] vast new trailer camps for the workers have been established.... This is a city living on war. It will be a chaotic day here when the war ends and all this terrific war structure begins to crumble. Unfortunately, it probably never can crumble clear back to the good old sleepy San Diego of ten years ago." A year later, in his syndicated column, H.R. Baukhage mentioned "that fabulous city of San Diego, once a pleasant, sleepy town which seemed to move lazily with the pelicans that flew over the bay or the whispering palms. The pelicans have been replaced by planes and it's a 24-hour town, with a 336 percent increase in the use of its busses and trolley cars." But when the war ended, so did the media attention, and the mentions that San Diego did get consisted mostly of snide comments about a sleepy Navy town living in the shadow of Los Angeles.

In 1967, Los Angeles Times sports columnist John Hall marveled over San Diego's new football stadium in Mission Valley, which he called "the newest and perhaps plushest joint of them all." "San Diego, that sleepy place where they have the zoo and where all they used to do was sail around and lie around in the sun, may have at last outdone us city slickers." A Chicago Tribune travel story from 1971 talked up San Diego as a "pleasant place in which to live," but also noted that historically, the city "became a place where old sailors

faded away and good admirals went to retire." Then-Mayor Pete Wilson tried to lift the city's national profile in 1972 when, shortly after the city lost out on hosting the Republican National Convention, he coined the nickname, "America's Finest City." But few outside San Diego even noticed. In a 1972 article on President Nixon's groundbreaking visit to China, the New York Times referred to San Diego as a "palisade of palm trees and political conservatism." Three years later, the Honolulu Star-Telegram wrote an article about a new World Team Tennis franchise in "San Diego, the Navy town."

A rare exception was a story on San Diego and its many recreational opportunities that was published in the December 1978 issue of Sports Illustrated, in which the author branded San Diego "Sports Town, USA." But some of his passages are a little hyperbolic, if not downright laughable. He wrote of "the streams of people who pour out of City Hall and downtown offices at noontime and hoof it to nearby Balboa Park for

group jogging sessions; judges and lawyers over there, secretaries to the left, dentists to the right." At Mission Bay, the writer observed, "along with countless swimmers, sail surfers, water skiers and jet skiers, the waters were brimming with an armada of pleasure craft: kayaks, sloops, sculls, cabin cruisers, pontoon barges, paddle boats, catboats, catamarans, hydroplanes, hydrofoils — you name it,

it was afloat and moving. Ashore, scattered across 27 miles of bayfront that meanders around a maze of coves, peninsulas and islands, park-goers were bicycling, skateboarding, fishing, practicing karate, sailing Frisbees, batting whiffleballs and playing badminton, volleyball, kickball and touch football. And everywhere there were joggers, including one fast-stepping woman towing a tot on

roller skates." The author also noted that "on a back road leading to the University of California, San Diego, one can see regaily attired equestrians on one side, while on the other, motorcycles, dune buggies and comical all-terrain vehicles skitter across the hills like jackrabbits." (We have no idea to which "back road" he is referring.)

Only with the rise of the Internet — and the

proliferation of "ranking" features, designed more than anything else to generate clicks — has San Diego been getting the media attention the city has craved for so long. But those of us who truly see San Diego as paradise and wouldn't contemplate living anyplace else might be surprised to find that not everyone shares our rosyeyed view of California's second-biggest city. On

travel blogs and discussion boards, San Diego routinely gets knocked for our high cost of living and expensive housing. We get dinged for our lack of culture, our too-laid-back ways, our traffic and our restaurants — even our weather, which some say is too gray in May and June and too boring the rest of the year. Even on the various "best places" lists, San Diego typically doesn't place nearly as high as we locals believe it should. San Diego's media went gaga in October when U.S. News & World Report, in its annual ranking of 150 metro areas, pegged San Diego as No. 1 on the "30 Most Fun Places to Live" list. But what the media didn't mention was that on the overall "Best Places to Live" ranking, San Diego didn't even make the Top 25. That elite group consisted of such dynamic metropolises as Ann Arbor, Michigan; Huntsville, Alabama; Favetteville, Arkansas; and Omaha, Nebraska — the latter, home of the Reuben sandwich and Duncan Hines cake mix.

You could blame San Diego's failure to crack the top 25 on the usual

suspects — cost of living and affordable housing — but then, how does one explain the fact that San Francisco, where everything is even more expensive than down here, finished at No. 15? And just where, exactly, did San Diego place? Number 97. Yep, Number 97. Ninety-seven! That's six spots below Birmingham, Alabama, which for years has had one of the highest murder rates in the country, nearly three times that of Chicago.

Also in October, Liveability.com published its annual ranking of the "Top 100 Best Places to Live in America." Madison, Wisconsin was No. 1, followed by Ann Arbor, Michigan at No. 2; Overland Park, Kansas, at No. 3; Frederick, Maryland, at No. 4; and Charlottesville, Virginia, at No. 5. Only a handful of California cities made the list, including Oxnard at No. 68 and Riverside

at No. 82. (When my middle son, Conner, went to orientation day at Cal State Channel Islands a few years ago, a police officer warned the incoming freshmen: "Stay away from Oxnard!" And Riverside — well, what really needs to be said?) As for San Diego, well, America's Finest City didn't even make the list, with the final spot, Number 100, reserved for - get ready - Anchorage, Alaska.

San Diego also was shut out of Money magazine's 35th annual 50 Best Places to Live, which was topped by the Minneapolis suburb of Chanhassen, Minnesota, praised by the publication for its "gorgeous outdoors, musical history (the city was home to Prince), and an appealing growth trajectory." Rounding out the top five: Carmel, Indiana; Franklin, Tennessee; Flower Mound, Texas; and Ashburn, Virginia.

And the hits keep coming. In July 2018, British journalist Robert Hull came to San Diego for Comic-Con and wound up writing a travel story for The Guardian, one of the top British newspapers. He described San Diego as "a city often in the shadow of its Californian neighbour, Los Angeles (a two-hour drive north along the Pacific Coast Highway)," but raved about Torrey Pines State Park, Cabrillo National Monument and even Chicano Park. The Gaslamp Quarter, on the other hand, didn't impress Hull: "The Gaslamp Quarter is 'the historic heart of Downtown' with its Victorian-era buildings," he wrote. "In reality, it's a nightlife hub that feels too engineered."

On the Housely.com website, contributor Camille Moore wrote an undated article titled "5 Of The Worst Things About Living In San Diego, California." At the top of her list: "San Diego is what some would describe as overcrowded. Not only do lots of people come to visit San Diego, but many people also relocate there, which has led to an increased number of residents. With that being said, it's nearly impossible to avoid crowds in San Diego, especially at places like the beach." Other "worst things" include traffic, the high cost of living, the weather ("The city has lots of 'gray' days and the weather can have long periods of being cloudy and muggy") and "constant construction," which Moore maintains "can get pretty annoying."

A January 2021 You-Tube video is titled "The Top 10 reasons You Should NOT move to San Diego." Among the reasons: too many tourists ("a bunch of entitled

visitors who tend to be jerks"), "awful drivers," boring always-the-same weather, and fire danger. In a November 2021 story on the Embrace Someplace travel blog, an article explores the pros and cons of living in San Diego. Among the latter: The high cost of housing, taxes, the lack of public transportation, and homelessness — a rather surprising dig, considering that the website is based in Portland, Oregon. "Time and the time again, San Diego makes the list as having one of the highest homeless populations in the country," the article maintains. "And it's true, vou can't walk around the city streets without seeing the detrimental effects of homelessness around you... The discrepancy between the haves and the have-nots is painstakingly clear on

the streets and practically impossible to avoid."

Back in 2002, on the Fodors travel forum, the question was posed, "What are the worst things about San Diego?" Dozens of respondents ticked off traffic, the high cost of living, low wages and the lack of public transportation. One, whose online name was New York Exile, complained that "in addition to the previously mentioned negatives (traffic, high home prices, no public transportation, low wages), as a New Yorker, you will notice that the few theater productions here are secondrate touring groups, the restaurants don't compare to New York's (and bring your own corned beef and bagels — the delis and bakeries are really sad), classic culture (ballet, symphony) is almost non-existent, and

the schools leave much to be desired. While the weather is better than New York's, be sure to find out about May Gray and June Gloom if you're thinking about living near the coast. And if you're thinking about living inland, plan on super-high electricity bills in the summer because of the air-conditioning (assuming there are no black-outs). And did I mention the forest fires if you live further out to get a cheaper house? So welcome to San Diego!" Another, "John," wrote a checklist: "Most residents are transplants, so no 'traditional sense;' people are quite superficial; weather is very same and predictable; lack of cultured feel; everything is super casual all the time, which is great most times, but not at all times; tax base being eroded continually; huge illegal immigrant

population; schools don't compare well nationally. There's no perfect place. I've lived all over the country. You just have to find what works for you. For me, SD wasn't it."

On the Quora questionand-answer website, two questions were asked about what people don't like about living in San Diego. Of the more than forty responses, at least half complained about the high cost of housing and the low-wage job market. A woman named Leslie Slavens. who described herself as a fourth-generation San Diego native now living in New York, penned a

lengthy diatribe in September 2018 about what she doesn't like about her former hometown. "I did not like that the changing seasons were hardly noticeable and Christmas just didn't have the right atmosphere," she wrote. "I found it culturally limited as more tax funds and public interest seemed to go toward arenas and stadiums over libraries and museums. I disliked the obsession with the physical, which drove plastic surgery and tanning salons to take over magazine ads, mini malls and main streets while the intellectual was starved and ignored by

the mainstream culture. These and many other little things like increased traffic, crowds, homeless, too many conservatives all inspired me to move to New York.... Every vear while home for the holidays in SD, I witness that it has increased in population, that more land has been developed into endless condos, the traffic is worse, the crime is worse, and 90% of the people are not Californians. They bring their preconceived ideas of California with them and slowly change the state to something very different from my memories of 1970s San Diego....

San Diego is heaven to those who have only known life in the middle of wheat fields or Midwest tract homes, [but] I'm sure it's not so great to those visiting from The Riviera, rather filthy and dangerous for someone from say Sag Harbor, and a bit boring to most NY city dwellers...."

Isaiah Howard, a former San Diegan who now lives in Houston, blasted San Diegans in April of 2020 for their thin skins: "Criticize anything about it, and I mean anything — even the increasingly bad homeless situation or increasingly bad traffic — and your name is s**t in a social circle, neighborhood, or workplace pretty quickly. Imperfections are ignored in SD in a manner so blatantly closed-minded that I haven't seen anywhere else in the world, except maybe the rural American South...." A third respondent complained that "90% of all restaurants are Mexican food," while a fourth opined, "It isn't all that visually appealing. The skyline sucks and the city itself is, for the most part, a sprawl of chain stores and ugly stucco buildings."

Another Quora question asked, "What's it like to live in San Diego?" Ca Ri, in March 2021, wrote, "I hate San Diego! I really wanted to come here and was optimistic about everything. I have been here almost 8 years and am counting the days until I can move that is 13 months from today exactly.... What don't I like? It's mostly the people. I have lived in 4 states and this is the only place I have ever had a hard time talking with people, making or keeping friends. Every conversation with anyone here is like a first date. It's all

small talk and no matter how many times you talk to them, the conversation is still shallow small talk. This place has the most aloof people anywhere in the U.S. I have ever seen. Most the time, I think I may be a ghost because no one ever acknowledges me in anyway. I consider this a lonely paradise.... Homeless people have no boundaries like in other cities, they will camp out in your carport and yes they have tried in mine or they will sit in your car or break your car windows to take a quarter. They also love to get in the dumpsters and throw it all over the alley. They even argue that they should get to stay in your carport because it's cold outside, you know like 60 degrees."

San Diego has even gotten some nasty reviews on Yelp. In 2016, Encinitas resident K.C. wrote a lengthy piece titled "I'm not 'clicking' with San Diego. Like, at all." K.C. wrote, "I like every place

else I've lived ... until San Diego." Her biggest complaint: "Its surprisingly rude, cold, aloof, and unfriendly population... In only six months in SD (I live in North County and work in the city), I've experienced:

*Indifference in customer service. Even the Berliners seem to be better at this customer service thing!

*Road rage directed at me numerous times, which I have not instigated, engaged or fueled (I honestly didn't experience this in L.A. or the Bay Area!) And, disclaimer: I've driven on the 405 in L.A., Highway 880 in Oakland, I-75 in Cincinnati/Dayton, and ain't none of those drivers got the road rage y'all got!

*Going out in PB, OB, and La Jolla, which has introduced me to the wide range of douchebags that San Diegans seem to love to rag on L.A. for supposedly having. If you leave Beverly Hills and Santa Monica,

L.A. folks are actually pretty normal."

In October of 2016, au-

thor Sara Morris wrote on the website Thrillist that after four years in San Diego, she moved to Nashville. Good riddance, she writes. A key reason: "I missed the four seasons. Living in a never-ending summer sounds like paradise, but if I had to wake up to another perfect, sunny, cloudless day I was going to freak out. I know, I know — spoken like a true transplant. Sure, the entire month of June is sort of gray, but I enjoy the occasional gloomy day at other times of the year, or having an afternoon thunderstorm that doesn't cause complete chaos in the streets just because it's a little wet outside. Feeling the crispness of the air in fall and seeing the leaves change color is one of my favorite things in life. In SoCal, the changing of seasons is much more abrupt. 

GREEN VALLEY FALLS

Ceanothus, or wild lilac, a late-winter or early-spring blooming native plant, could blossom profusely this month or next. Heavy rains and protracted periods of abundant sunshine produce the most extravagant displays. Blue- and white-flowering varities of ceanothus are common wherever native sage-scrub and chaparral vegetation grows, from the bluffs of Torrey Pines to the edge of the Anza-Borrego Desert.

Now That The Waning Moon doesn't rise until about 9 pm, is your early-evening sky dark enough for you to see the winter Milky Way? After dinnertime, it runs vertically from Canis Major low in the southeast, up between Orion and Gemini, through Auriga and Perseus overhead, and down through Cassiopeia, Cepheus, and Cygnus to the northwest horizon.

Weird Science

Russian biologist Vera Emelianenko stumbled across a strange phenomenon in the snow along the White Sea coast, in the Russian Arctic, in December. Bright blue glowing spots were embedded in the snow, Oddity Central reported, and her feet would leave streaks of blue as she walked. Emelianenko collected a sample and examined it under a microscope, where she found tiny aquatic crustaceans called copepods. When she poked them with a needle, they lighted up blue. The creatures normally live up to 100 meters deep in the ocean, but an

expert at the Academy of Science in Moscow thinks they might have been caught in a powerful current that swept them ashore and into the snow.

- When Olivia Crump tried to leave her apartment in Milledgeville, Georgia, on Dec. 28, she was surprised to find a crucial structure missing: the stairs to the ground floor. According to the Daily Mail, Crump said the management company did not notify her about the stairs being removed for construction. American Underdog — A purebred underdog with a dream rises from supermarket stock boy to the heights of fame and fortune in this inspirational sports biopic. Two mothers, two accidents, and numerous unexpected twists come to a boil in this, the filmmaker's definitive statement on motherhood, melodrama,

and the unhealthy allegiance that's formed when the two are shuffled and dealt from the crazed mind of Almodóvar. At least he does so with the greatest of stylistic ease. A response to something as seemingly innocuous as a knock on the door whisks us into the past. And don't expect any of that "One Year Earlier" nonsense when a change of costume and hair will do for an indicator. You know you're in good hands when along the way, every question that arises - and there are many to be found within the labyrinthian narrative — is answered the moment after it comes to mind. Penelope Cruz reciprocates by gifting her frequent directorial collaborator with a performance that's equal parts warmth, depth, and the nervous breakdown required for these parts. A white Shinola bob adds elfin charm to Milena Smi, who co-stars as Cruz's maternity ward bunkmate-turned-lover - and mother of Cruz's dead daughter. I warned you about the unwholesomeness. Redeeming Love — A tale of "love conquers all" set during the California Gold Rush of 1850. D.J. Director Leon Lee chronicles the fight for freedom in this earnest, truth-be-told eve-opener that brings shame to those of us who are first learning of this dark period in contemporary history by watching a movie. When painted in a corner, Lee and his co-screenwriters will occasionally resort to narrative trickery for the sake of dramatization. The day-saving American reporter (Sam Trammell) is ever in the right place at the right time, the sinister Secretary Yang (Tzu-Chiang Wang) could have stood more shading (a constant scowl and the patience to repair timepieces is not enough), and a seemingly incidental character who returns with a bang to point a finger of guilt at our hero (Ting Wu) makes for a clumsy, day-foiling coincidence. Poetic license be damned! This pointed history lesson will not only keep and hold your interest, you'll leave feeling thankful to be an American. 2021. —S.M. ★★★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

West Side Story — Why? Steven Spielberg can make any movie he wants. Why trace a legend if all that's to come of it is a blemished face-lift? Some of the more problematic moments from Robert Wise's 1962 original — Anglo-stars darkened by Max Factor, Marni Nixon's ghost-singing, Vaselined lenses - have been smoothed out, although not entirely. The original, shot in 70mm and intended to be viewed on a big screen, was composed almost entirely in medium and longshots. Janusz Kaminski's camera knows no restraint: including the light source in every other shot must be the director and cinematographer's way of paying tribute to Kubrick. (Imagine watching a movie with a car's high beams parked behind the screen.) Is there nothing nice to say? It was bound to be woke woke, so imagine one's chagrin to find Baby John in the arms of a woman. Tony Kushner's script grants Tony (Ansel Elgort) and Maria (Rachel Zegler) more time to fall in love and the repositioning of America from rooftop to sidewalk was a musical highpoint. And a man with Spielberg's clout couldn't have secured the rights from the estate of Ned "Doc" Glass" to Photoshop on a wedding picture next to his widow, Valentina (Rita Moreno, topping her turn as Anita). This musical, the glampunk cabaret Story of My Life as told by a genderqueer hard-luck case in a platinum

blond wig that looks like it's ready to take flight, first played in 1998, which means it's old enough now to have a generational legacy. That's made clear by the program, in which Patio Playhouse artistic manager Matt FitzGerald calls Hedwig "a vital part of queer history" and says that it "teaches us that we are enough, that we are whole, and that we are worthy. That message is as important today as it was in 1998 or any other year." Director Juztine Tuazon-Martin writes that it "speaks to anyone who's ever been excluded from a binary when saying, 'You know, you're doing all right." The first-time viewer will recognize that quote from the big number "Midnight Radio," the title of which alludes to Hedwig's impoverished youth in Communist East Germany, listening to American radio with his "girly-boy" head in the oven. That same viewer may wonder at the veracity of the claim: here is a kid who was sexually abused and abandoned by his G.I. Father, neglected by his mother, subjected to a botched sex-reassignment by his first lover, and utterly betrayed by his Aristophenean Other. (There is a lot going on here in the religion department, mostly but not entirely as it relates to power.) Doing all right? Hedwig writhes in obscurity, drinks

throughout the show, and is generally abusive to onstage/life partner Yitzhak (Kailey Agpaoa). And the show's grand moment of triumph seems to hinge on an out-of-character whim from Ye Olde Antagonist. It feels like a story, not of winning, but of losing with style, of suffering magnificently, of telling terrible off-color jokes to keep from crying ("When it comes to a huge opening, a lot of people think of me," "When Luther proposed, I was on my knees," etc.) But while it's a sad story, it's anything but a sad show, thanks to that style and magnificence, and thanks also to the way Amanda Blair responds to the character's invitation

to go no-balls to the wall. The accent is tough, the songs hit every emotional key, and the spotlight never lets up, but Blair is game, and that carries her through as she stomps, struts, and slumps about. The production shares that same spirit, and makes virtues of its limitations - overhead projectors, childlike illustrations, fan-blown confetti — rather like its subject. Baker the builder Victor Baker knows guitars. For one thing, he's been playing them professionally for years. For another, back in the late '90s, he decided to start building

time, and doing two of them at a time is pretty intense. I forget what day of the week it is sometimes. I'm doing a whole video series on the project, to document each step

them as well. "I was teaching a ton of guitar students and playing a lot of gigs, and I just needed a hobby," Baker explains. "I've always done my own modifications and setups, so I decided to take it one step further and build one myself. So I bought a bunch of books and did some research and made my first guitar. Things just grew from there, and I realized I had an aptitude. Before long, I was making guitars more than I

Baker creates one-of-a kind custom instruments, and he doesn't seem to have any problem attracting customers. He's currently building his 600th in his Poway home, having moved to San Diego from New York City four years ago. "It's a special edition: it's going to have a lot of inlays and artwork, plus super fancy aged woods. I'm making number 600 and 601 at the same time, so this month is going to require a lot of heavy lifting, because this is the pinnacle of what I do. This is my most difficult project in terms of

was teaching students."

of the way."

For these particular guitars, Baker has drawn inspiration from the Czech Art Nouveau painter Alphonse Mucha for many of the details. "This one has piles and piles of embellishment, with all kinds of artwork and inlays on the fingerboard. I'm using really aged cello wood from Italy, and the soundboard is coming from some very rare spruce from Alaska. This wood has been submerged for decades, and the grain patterns are amazing."

Baker makes his guitars with a blend of old-world skills and modern Computer Numerical Control (CNC for short) woodworking machines. "I'm fully modern. I wouldn't be able to do this kind of work without them. I would never be able to make a living without the CNC. Plus, I have a playing career, so I have to be careful with my hands. I can't grip tools for too long; I have problems with the impact of repetitive motion on my hands. So, I depend on making use of modern technology.

Because of covid, Baker has been working by himself for the last few years, but that is about to change. "I do have a part-time guy. He's worked at Taylor Guitars for the last 15 years. He's going to switch over to full-time early next year. That's a huge deal. His skill set is pretty solid, and I'm excited to have the help finally after covid."

Berk wrote and produced the song, as well as playing piano, guitar, Wurlitzer, and strings. "The other local musician on the track is lead guitar virtuoso Chris Davies" of Chloe Lou and The Liddells, and The Penetrators. "My drummer, Matt Walker (Morrissey, Smashing Pumpkins,

Garbage) recorded his parts in his studio in Chicago, and Matt Thomson (Maita) played bass on the track while in his studio in Portland. I'm lucky enough to have Sean O'Keefe (Plain White T's, Fall Out Boy) who mixed and mastered the single, and who, incidentally, mixed the track in his Chicago studio." The album's other local guests include Ron Silva (Crawdaddys, Nashville Ramblers), who she first met when the touring Pynnacles played San Diego, and Danny Cress (Coyote Problem, True Stories).

Since the album's release, Berk has been awash in recognition. Her world-class single "Shadow Clues" earned positive reviews in Northern Transmissions and Stereo Embers Magazine. The track

ANDRA DAY

Academy Award-nominated Andra Day began singing at Chula Vista's First United Methodist Church, then studied music at the School of Creative and Performing Arts. Her 2012 cover of Jessie J's "Mamma Knows Best" peaked at number two on the YouTube Music Charts, resulting in her signing to Warner Bros. Records. Her debut album *Cheers to the Fall* earned a Best R&B Album nomination at the 2016 Grammy Awards, where she was also up for Best R&B Performance for the song "Rise Up." As a follow-up to her covid-19 benefit single "Make Your Troubles Go Away," Day released a cover of Billie Holidav's "All of Me." in advance of her Oscar-nom-

inated starring role in *The United States vs. Billie Holiday,* a 2021 Hulu biopic about the late singer. This month, Day appears in *Eggs Over Easy,* a new Discovery+ streaming special that "investigates the often taboo subject of infertility in the black community and brings black women together for an enlightening and empowering dialogue about the sometimes unpredictable path to motherhood." Keshia Knight Pulliam narrates the program, which also features black women, doctors, and fertility advocates who share their personal experiences including miscarriage, IVF, ovarian cysts, uterine fibroids, and other reproductive issues.



PRICE OF DOPE

"We're putting the band back together with all original members," says acid-jazz group Price of Dope. The band came up in the 1990s, playing beach venues like Winstons and the Catamaran. Songs from their debut CD were used for Rob Machado's MTV surf videos and frequently featured on local TV and radio. Saxophonist Gastelum, who grew up in Spring Valley, has delved into the jazz world. The 1990 graduate of Monte Vista High School relocated to New York City, where he records and performs. The last Price of Dope reunions were in January 2011 at Bar Pink and September 2011 at Gallagher's in Ocean Beach. The upcoming performance takes place March 26 at Wintons.



SULLY BAND

Fronted by Sully Sullivan, the Sully Band has a funky new single covering Albert Collins' 1980 track "If You Love Me Like You Say," from the band's upcoming Let's Straighten It Out! album. According to Sullivan, "I've been a fan of the blues forever, artists like Muddy Waters, Buddy Guy, and John Lee Hooker, but Albert wasn't really on my radar. Then, during the making of this album, we were looking for certain songs about love and found this Albert Collins gem and it was love at first listen. Since then, I've become a huge fan of The Iceman, and even though we put a bit of a New

Orleans spice on our version, I still wanted to bring in a player really steeped in blues to handle the guitar lead, out of respect for Albert. Fortunately, I knew a young San Diegobased blues guitar phenom, Anthony Cullins, and he came into the studio and cut the track live with us, and absolutely killed it." Due March 11, the album features ten '60s and '70s soul, blues, and R&B tunes, curated by Grammywinning producer Chris Goldsmith (Blind Boys of Alabama, Ben Harper) and tracked at Henson Recording Studio in Hollywood (formerly A&M Studios).



ADAM GNADE

Asked to describe his music, native San Diegan Adam Gnade says "The louder songs are like a midnight head-on collision on the 70 West — the sounds of cars hitting cars, metal crunching, glass shattering and spraying across the highway - then silence, followed by God and the devil trying to figure out which one gets you. The quieter ones are like [Led Zeppelin's] 'Going to California' played by big-rig drivers or sad waitresses. Music writers sometimes call it 'spoken word,' but I hate spoken word. I'm just into nontraditional vocals." Gnade collects his books and audio recordings into a series titled We Live Nowhere and Know No One, which unfolds over novels, novellas, and writing

released on vinyl and cassette. His new book, After Tonight, Everything Will Be Different, takes place in San Diego and features "taco shops and rundown beach apartments, on the amusement park boardwalk at 3 am, and in cars bound for Tijuana and drunken glory...this is a book of deli sub sandwiches, endless burritos, eggplant parmesan, the magnificence of good sourdough bread, of box brownies and Nacho Cheese Doritos, rolled tacos and the perfect tortilla. After Tonight, Everything Will Be Different is a raging, ecstatic, troubled book that shows a world of food and a world of life, each inextricable from the other."



AUGUSTANA

After only playing a handful of shows, Augustana were signed by major label Epic Records, who released their debut All the Stars and Boulevards in 2005. Produced by Brendan O'Brien (STP, Pearl Jam), the album's title single was for a while the sixth most requested track on L.A.'s KROQ 106.7 FM. Their hit song "Boston" reached platinum sales status. The band's 2008 full-length Can't Love Can't Hurt debuted on the Billboard Top 200 chart at number 21. Their self-titled third album, released by Epic Records in early 2011, was recorded in L.A. with Grammy Award-winning producer/engineer Jacquire King (Kings of Leon,

Norah Jones, etc.) It only sold around 29,000 copies in the U.S. By comparison, *All the Stars and Boulevards* sold over 345,000 U.S. copies, while *Can't Love Can't Hurt* sold 121,000 U.S. copies. Their fourth studio album *Life Imitating Life* dropped in 2014, recorded in Rhinebeck, NY and Nashville, TN with producer John O'Mahony (Coldplay, Metric, Kashmir). After several band members departed Augustana, frontman Dan Layus released his debut solo album, *Dangerous Things*, in 2016. He returns to San Diego as Augustana to play the Casbah on Tuesday, January 25.

Against a different sort of cancel culture

"Due to the recent surge of COVID-19 cases in San Diego County and after consulting with local health experts, the San Diego Symphony has made the difficult decision to cancel this concert." Thus read the San Diego Symphony website and app regarding two concerts scheduled for January 15 and 16 at the San Diego Civic Theatre. These would have been the first proper concerts since covid closed everything down in early 2020.

Let's take a look at that statement from The Symphony. First of all, covid has officially ruined the word "surge." If I never hear the word again, it will be too soon. Secondly, I can't imagine any public health official recommending any concerts anytime this year.

But it's worth noting that at this point, The Symphony has not canceled the concerts scheduled for January 28 and 29. Is covid going away in the next two weeks? No, it is not. If local health experts are consulted again, I can't imagine them recommending that those concerts go on. So if the 15th and 16th are canceled, then the 28th and 29th should be canceled as well.

It has almost been two vears. It is time for The San Diego Symphony to stand up to covid and perform despite whatever "surge" might currently be occurring. The only reason to cancel a concert would be an outbreak among the orchestra members. I went to indoor performances in both Los Angeles and New York during the fall while The San Diego Symphony was still playing outdoors at The Shell. The Shell was already in the plan, so I can understand why The Symphony remained outdoors while others were performing in the appropriate —

read: indoor — space for classical music.

According to the latest numbers on the state covid website, Los Angeles County had a seven-day average of 286 cases per 100,000 people. San Diego's number was 265 per 100,000. San Diego has a lower number, and yet The San Diego Symphony is canceling while the L.A. Philharmonic is not. Both organizations have the same attendance policies, requiring audience members to be fully vaccinated and wear

masks during the concert.

Given all this information, The San Diego Symphony has opened itself to conjecture. Are these concerts being canceled because of covid, or are they being canceled because of covid and the lack of an appropriate audience? The Civic Theatre has 700 more seats than Symphony Hall. Was The Civic Theatre going to be less than half full? It is more than possible. We cannot know.

The fact remains: The San Diego Symphony is canceling concerts while the rest of the leading classical music organizations in the state are not.

A lesson in spices

"It's about heat, but also taste."

ight has clanged down on City Heights like an emergency curtain at a movie theater. It's easy to get lost in this gloom once you're out of the #7 bus, but, just past Happy Bubbles Car Wash, I spot the place my

friend Kim says "hasn't 'a-Lao'd' itself to become watered down and westernized. Only thing," he warns, "watch out when you choose your spice strength there. A 10 means a 10."

"Sit anywhere," says Paula,
this self-assured gal wearing a
black "Nu-Nouveau Supply-Paris" teeshirt. The
furniture is dark and smart. I'm getting a feeling
of prosperity here. Chandeliers. Expensive framed

mirrors. Shiny polished ebony tabletops. Paula leaves a menu. It's a relief to find that the prices aren't as fancy as the furniture.

Place advertises "Lao-Thai food." Is there a difference? I hold that thought as I spot crab rangoon — crispy pastries squished around crab meat. Costs \$7.95 for half a dozen. Nice starter. But I'm also hankering for some tom yum kung (spicy shrimp soup) to spark the cockles of my heart with heat. The question Paula puts to me is, how much spiciness to go for? "We have a scale of 0-50 here," she says. "We can go all the way, but not many do and live." She laughs. So do I, nervously. While I'm umming and aaahing about it, she hauls over this four-pot spice collection. And for the first time, I get a lesson in spices.

"You have to know what spices to use. It's

about heat, but also taste. This first pot is fish sauce; it's a substitute for salt. It gives flavor to plain rice. Then this is vinegar with serrano pepper slices, good for flavoring noodles or fried rice. This third pot is crushed dry chili. We use it on every-

thing except papaya." She fills up an entire deep scoop and scatters it over the *tom yum* soup. "Start off with one scoop and move up. After the fourth scoop, you are on your own." Then she reaches to the last bowl of hot stuff. "And this is the chili oil. Spicy with a smoky

flavor. Good with pork belly or soup, but not with fresh salad or larb or papaya salad. Too strong. It will erase their light flavors."

> Ten minutes later, I have made up my mind, with Paula's input, natch. "How about larb?" she suggested. "I am Lao. It is our national dish."

> I mention tom yum. On this cold night, I have the hots for that hot, spicy soup with shrimp bobbing about in it. "Not a problem," says Paula. "Even though tom yum is, well, not Lao." Turns out it's Thai. Not the same. Result is, I get one of each: the steaming tom yum soup, and this fresh cool dish of larb, a kind of salad mixed with ground pork and wicked red peppers. It costs \$12.95. The tom yum ("boiled mix") soup is \$13.95. "So you want it a little spicy?" Paula says. I sure do. With tom yum you've got to, to get the thrill. Most times, Thai restaurants undersupply the spiciness because they worry customers aren't used to hot peppers. I'm not saying I've got the toughest taste buds in the world, but I do like a

> Time to chow. I start off with the larb pork salad, because, hey, it is Laos's National Dish, and, Paula says, this gives you a good vibe.

"Larb salad is special to us. I am Lao. We are very sentimental about it. If you go back in history, the reason it is called 'larb' is this: it is more like

a beautiful wedding ceremony or a birthday when you eat it. It means 'luck,' or 'fortune' in the ancient Lanna language. We eat it to say "Thank you,' and when we want to give our blessing. So when you eat that together, it's like 'OK. Nothing's going to stop us now."

And it is delicious. It's ground marinated pork (or you could have chicken or beef, or duck, or faux meat), with a little bit of citrus, *nam pla* (fish sauce), herbs, mint, lemon grass. It is supposed to be light-flavored and refreshing. Paula: "Our food is not westernized here at Ban Lao ('Laotian House'). Larb is more of a country people's dish." One famous larb version uses the eggs of red ants to zip up the colors and the flavor. But mostly, Paula says, Laotian cuisine is simple. "Our basics are papaya salad, fish sauce, larb, and sticky rice.

Kids want a lot of deep-fried everything, but the rest of us like most things fresh."

And tom yum soup? "It's a Thai dish. Same with curries. They are Thai. From the south. They got them from India. The main difference between Lao and Thai food? Our countries are neighbors, but Laos is landlocked. Laos is about vegetables and pork and chicken and maybe freshwater shrimp and fish, and sticky rice. The Thais have the coasts. They get all the seafood."

It works well. Light and spicy larb pork salad, then the shining hotpot with its cargo of shrimp and veggies — mainly mushrooms — and sticky rice. It gets richer the further down you go. A scoop of crushed dry chilis onto both, and I've got me a kick-ass hot soup and salad. It sure warms up the night.

PS. Okay. Discover I've spent, like, a lot. But I check the menu again. Next time, I can fill up on a bowl of *tom kha* soup (\$6.95) and a woven basket of sticky rice for \$2. That should stop the wallet leak. ■

Evolution Fast Food does just fine with old-fashioned fake

Evolution Fast Food; 2965 Fifth Avenue, Bankers Hill. A certain fried poultry chain garnered buckets of free press last week by announcing that it will be serving vegan chicken options at its restaurants. Really, KFC is just the latest fast-


food brand to make hay out of partnering with Beyond Meat, one of the buzzy new bevy of tech companies that employ scicreate plant-based meat substitutes.

You see, the announcement roughly coincides with the launch of a new Beyond Chicken line. The company has been steadily looking beyond its burger success, and has now fashioned an approximation of white meat from pea and fava bean proteins (plus a variety of starches and glutens).

I can't lie: I will be eager to try it. But will vegetarians?

Two years ago, the founder of Beyond Meat made the claim that 93 percent of the people who bought its products in grocery stores also shopped for animal proteins. In effect, that means Beyond's market isn't strict vegetarians, or vegans,

dietary diversity.

I could pretend to be shocked by this, but it's almost like Beyond is reading my diary. I've been the one who wants it both ways: to eat less beef while eating the same number of burgers. Meanwhile, for all the tens of millions companies like Beyond have invested in developing veggie patties "that bleed," it just might be that people committed to plant-based diets were pretty happy with the meat substitutes they'd already been eating for decades.

So, instead of rushing out to a Kentucky-fried drive-thru to try the new, sci-fi-styled chicken tenders, I steered toward Bankers Hill, to pay a visit to San Diego's own, original vegan drive thru: Evolution Fast Food.

Since 2006, Evolution has been making plant-based beef and chicken alternatives cooked up in a kitchen, not in Silicon Valley. Along the way, it's debunked the misconception that vegans are only interested in health food — one of its most popular menu items is a Buffalo chicken sandwich!

I've found it to be one of the city's most consistently busy drive-thrus that isn't named Starbucks. Though its burgers-and-fries-led menu is modeled after fast food (down to the non-dairy milkshakes). a wait upwards of fifteen minutes is common, even when cars aren't backed up into the street. I've had occasion to joke that my biggest challenge to giving up meat is the drive-thru line at Evolution.

For those determined to go, it's quicker and easier these days to place an order online for pickup. But my point is, people are determined to eat here, despite all the well-documented advances in food tech. Many remain attracted by a choice of tempeh, black bean, or "beefy" soy-based burgers

(\$8-10) — fare that never generates headlines.

Or, like me, they go for the faux-chicken sandwich (\$10). Even without the Buffalo sauce, ranch dressing, or other house-made adornments, it's tasty and filling. Even without the tempeh bacon add-on — which looks more like a limp sock than actual pork, but

lends a fatty sensation that allows you to feel like your breaking all kinds of New Year's resolutions. The alt-meat's chew hardly resembles chicken, but honestly, I've had bigger qualms with the texture of a few fast-food chicken sandwiches in the past.

As for the future: when I do get around to trying the new-tech-marvel phony chicken, Evolution is what I'll be comparing it to.

Drinks All Around

t's a Saturday night in University Heights, and groups of friends are pouring into Park & Rec. Busy bartender Alex Rodriguez is slinging cocktails left and right, keeping pace with the crowd as they order rounds of craft cocktails. After studying a menu full of enticing options, I decide to get down with Get Ur Freak On.

Rodriguez gives me the rundown. "We infuse the Mezcal with Anaheim chili peppers and mango for three to five days. Then from there, we have our house-made curação made with amber agave, Cointreau and a little bit of sugar. And then we have a sweet white vermouth in there from Lo-Fi Aperitifs. It's really lovely, and it brings out a little bitterness and also a sweetness at the end — but not too much," she specifies, calling it "a drier sweet. Then, we have rhubarb and

"All fun stuff!" she says with a giggle. "It all sounds funky, but it all comes together so beautifully with the flavors. It's not spicy, either. I really wanted to go with a cocktail that had the flavor of a chili but doesn't throw you off with the spice. Because I can't handle spice!" She says the Anaheim chilis offer a mild compromise "refreshing, with the bold flavors and just a hint of spice in the cocktail."

The cocktail uses El Silencio mezcal cut with Real del Valle tequila. "It's a pretty standard mezcal, it's got a bold flavor. It's pretty smoky, so we do blend it with tequila. Because I've noticed that unless people are coming up and saying 'Where's your mezcal cocktail?' they're not ready for mezcal," observes the seasoned bartender. "So we try to soften the blow... but you can still taste all of that in there."

Giffard rhubarb syrup adds a tart, fruity flavor. "It's thinner in viscosity, so that's where our agave comes into play. I'd never thought to put rhubarb in a cocktail, but it works well with tequila and mezcal." Sweet white vermouth, she feels, is the most notable component because it's an ingredient not often seen. "It has kind of a wormwood finish, which can be overpowering but because of the small amount that we use in it, and because of the small amount that's in the actual vermouth, it's really nice."

Besides borrowing names from famous songs for their winter menu, "we did all these cocktails that were all about love and cuddling up. There are a few dirty ones in there, and this is one of them," she says with a smirk. "It also gets people in a good mood. Nobody can order a Get Ur Freak On without smiling or laughing."

White pelicans not plunge diving at Dixon

Dock Totals 1/9 – 1/15: 578 anglers aboard 31 half-day to 1.5-day trips out of San Diego landings this past week caught 8 blacksmith perch, 36 bluefin tuna (up to 100 pounds), 2 blue perch, 71 calico bass (50 released), 43 halfmoon, 1 halibut, 52 lingcod, 125 lobster (86 released), 975 rockfish, 275 sand bass, 596 sculpin, 4 triggerfish, and 119 yellowtail.

Saltwater: While a bit of bluefin tuna action outside of Cedros Island is keeping the attention of a few boats still operating 1.5- to 3-day runs south, the coastal Baia vellowtail action has been warming back up. After a bit of a lull, the bruiser jacks returned in force to nearshore waters outside of San Quintin, and continue their seasonal bite from Santa Rosalillita, around Punta Eugenia. and on down to the southern end of the Vizcaino Peninsula. There have been a lot of good-sized fish caught by friends off Quintin and down south, some fish coming in near the 50-pound mark. While the

Pacifica had a rough day on bluefin with only 4 landed for their 22 anglers aboard a 1.5-day trip, the Polaris Supreme reported 36 fish landed up to 100 pounds during their 3-day run with 24 anglers. Meanwhile, 13 anglers aboard the Pacific Voyager 2.5-day trip concentrated on the rockfish and yellowtail bite nearer the Baja coast and scored well, with 119 yellowtail, 60 rockfish, and 52 lingcod coming over the rail.

Further down the line, yellowfin tuna to over 200 pounds are showing for the long-range fleet fishing the Ridge and out at Alijos Rocks, with all signs being good for that excellent fishing to continue. In our nearshore waters, it's all about the bass — as in sand bass. Though the calico bite has been hit and miss depending on current, the sand bass bite, especially off the Point Loma flats down to the Imperial Beach 'pipe', has been consistently good, with most of the fish caught measuring over 14 inches. Rockfish are biting well for the boats venturing south of the border to the lower 9-Mile Bank and other high spots within half to full-day reach in Mexican waters.

In the surf, halibut are biting on occasion, and along with surf, perch are providing another winter off-season outlet for anglers targeting them. Forget sand crabs for bait; they've moved deep as is their wintertime normal. Try crank baits like Lucky Crafts or Gulp sandworms, grubs, and even their imitation sand crab baits for action. The best times are when tides are moderate and surf is low to medium. Use the bottom of the tide to hit holes hard to reach and fish to the top as the tide rises.

Freshwater: It's all about the trout this past week, even though winter bass fishing has been decent. Taste is subjective, but some would say those stocked trout are preferred table-fare over green bass. I have been a few times in recent weeks, and I am zoning in on the most productive methods for trout. Although it does make a difference how many days before fishing, the lakes were stocked, there are the common go-to baits when targeting trout. Topping that list is chartreuse Power

Bait, especially with glitter. I like to present it on a long 24-inch to 30-inch leader with a weight just heavy enough to get a decent cast. As the stocked fish tend to circle the lakes and coves near to the shore, one doesn't have to cast much more than a couple dozen vards, and usually less.

I have dangled worms, specifically nightcrawlers, directly in front of trout by sight, and so far, no takers. Meal worms might get them to go, but I haven't yet tried those, though I do know trout favor them. Other popular trout baits, like corn, may be restricted at area lakes, so be sure to check bait limitations before heading out to fill your creel.

For lures, my go-to Kastmasters, small spoons like Thomas Buoyant, tiny Krokodiles, and spinners like Roostser Tails and Mepps have all done little to encourage tank-raised trou to bite. I have noticed that guys working a 1/32nd ounce mini jig, mostly white or yellow, where trout are congregating have done very well.

In the time I caught one three-pound trout soaking Power Bait, one angler fishing the same cove caught six fish using mini jigs. Alas, I had none in the box, so I just enjoyed watching him catch. This also brings me to line size. I was fishing 6-pound test, which is on the heavy side of what is working. The guy with the mini jigs was using 2-pound line. Though he was the 'catchinist' angler in the cove, he released 4 of them unintentionally as they broke the line when the fish fought hard at the bank. My advice is center around 4-pound test, fish power bait or mini jigs (in white, seconded by yellow), and, to secure the frantic hooked fish, take a long-handled net. Some of these stocked trout are up to and over 8 pounds and require a bit of finesse to not only hook, but to land.

Trout fight very hard once at the shoreline. They sense their end, however deep their senses run. I do know that migrating white pelicans are hunting them along shore and have seen a few get scooped up. Two ospreys were also working Whisker Cove at Dixon while I was there. Birds beat the fish up in the shallows, where the trout tend to cruise for days after being planted, which is apparently what they do in tanks where they are raised. Every fish caught would draw two or three pelicans that would fly over and watch the action. White pelicans, however, do not 'plunge dive' from high up the way our native brown pelicans do. White pelicans swim in groups of three or more and try to herd fish to a point where they can plunge their heads and scoop up fish in quick thrusts. Were they the diving type we see at our local bays and beaches, the trout would not stand a chance. So far, it seems our diving brown pelicans haven't figured out the freshwater action in San Diego County lakes during the wintertime. Raptors, on the other hand, find the trout stocks quite appetizing and golden eagles, bald eagles, and ospreys all take part in feeding on them. Go get some!

When did surfing click for you? It took me a couple of years. I

started [going to a] surf meetup. That helped. It was free lessons, free boards, free wetsuits, and all that. It was a beginner's group—all ages, all backgrounds, anyone who wanted to come out. When I got a little confident, I bought this board and my wetsuit.

Favorite surf moment?

Surfing in Hawaii. It was awesome. The waves are so long. It's warm weather and warm water. There is something different about the water there. It's very airy. I got a little intimidated surfing there just because of the reputation, but I started out at a beginner's beach. I had an instructor with me, so I always felt protected.

Has it taken you a while to work up to surfing certain beaches? Yes. I learned at La Jolla Shores. As I became more confident. I ventured out to [Tourmaline]. I did a surf clinic at Black's Beach a few weeks ago. That was a little bit more challenging. I need more practice at Black's Beach.


