





THE WAVES

Surfers say Tsunami swell small

But then, it did travel over 5000 miles On the morning of January 15, Carol Niotta and her Yorkie Pebbles walked out on their La Jolla home's balcony to see if the tsunami emergency alert issued at 7:03 am had affected the surf scene below. "No lifeguards were on duty," she told me on January 30. "One woman was down at the end of the rock where The Shack is, and she was holding a toddler. I was shocked, because I had just watched a video of how sneaky tsunamis can be, and how one just clobbered people out of the blue at a resort." (In this case, the tsunami waves were caused by the Hunga Tonga-Hunga Ha'apai volcano eruption in the South Pacific water near the island of Tonga, situated about 5300 miles southwest of San Diego; there, they would be responsible for three deaths, many injuries, and large-scale coastal damage.)

Niotta sent me photos and a video from the elevated vantage point of Windansea that Saturday morning. Curious people parked below her home, and as the spots filled up, others parked a block east by La Jolla Boulevard and strolled in. The crowd watched the reported six-inch rise in coastal water level and the accompanying one- to three-foot waves crash into the shoreline rocks. They also watched some surfers and bodyboarders who had apparently ignored the National Tsunami Warning Center's alert, which read in part: "Coastal areas in San Diego may experience strong currents that may be hazardous...please move off the beach and out of the harbors and marinas.

Avoid the coastline." Continued Niotta, "The waves were really long, and it was good surf all across. And there were surfers out there in the middle. People usually only surf in front of the Surf Shack."

goers "leave the beach area until about 9 am." Grant told me that "waves are unpredictable coming from that far. They always try to err on the side of safety when making these types of predictions. 'Better safe than sorry'

In Encinitas, about 18 miles north, surfer Greg busted out his baby blue Hobie surfboard to catch the tsunami waves coming into San Elijo State Beach. "There's already a swell right now: chest to overhead, so not sure how concerning that is as far as [wave]

Greg's wife Jess on their Drifter Journey YouTube channel. "But we're reading more, and it sounds like the bigger issue could be [during] the sucking out of the water. There could be currents that could pull people away from the shore." On the vanlife couple's eight-minute video, there appear to be seven other surfers with Greg in the lineup. Greg caught his first wave shortly after 7:50

am; Jenn narrated while filming him. "We didn't see a distinct wall of water. It seemed like it was just more of bigger sets closer together for about five minutes." Afterward, Greg walked into the camera shot, surfboard in hand, and said, "We crushed the tsunami. It was kind of gnarly — we all survived."

Throughout San Diego County — from the northernmost Trestles break by San Onofre State Beach to the southernmost Imperial Beach swells — surfers, bodyboarders and skimboarders came out to ride the tsunami waves. Jim Grant, a known surf photographer, posted a video he filmed by the Ocean Beach pier that morning — where a lifeguard on a PA recommended the beachis the mindset."

Other surfers heeded lifeguards' warnings, packed up their boards and passports, and trekked south of the border. Some competed in and watched the 2022 Baja Surf Club Invitational at Playa San Miguel in Ensenada. "I participated in the masters (40-and-up class) and made it to the semifinals," said Alfredo Ramirez from Mission Valley. "Many competitors were from San Diego, including Tiare Thompson from La

Jolla; she won the open women's shortboard class. There were solid 4-to-6 footers, and winds shifted all morning: glassy at first, then it was sideshore, and a bit offshore." As for the tsunami's effect, "some of the spectators on the rocks were washed by the incoming waves. Nothing major, but all of them got wet."

After that, Ramirez texted his surfing buddy, I.B. Mayor Serge Dedina. "Talking to Serge was also calming. Also, Mexico has the Centro de Investigación Científica y de Educación Superior de Ensenada, the largest scientific research center in Mexico, and we would've been notified right away if there was a tsunami threat. But we didn't hear anything."

THE URBAN LANDSCAPE Backcountry building battle brewing

Without a car, you can't get there from here

Under the watchful eye of environmental groups, county planners last week presented several options to guide development in San Diego's backcountry. Since more than 99 percent of the unincorporated area depends on cars, development is leaning towards the urban core, where housing is more expensive. "As staff has shown, the harsh reality is there will be very little development in the unincorporated county in the foreseeable future," said David Grubb, transportation chair of Sierra Club San Diego. That's because under a 2013 state law aimed at curbing greenhouse gas emissions, the county must analyze the transportation impacts, or "vehicle miles traveled," for new projects during environmental review.

How they first went about that prompted a lawsuit and the end of their transportation study guide, leading up to last week's meeting of the county board of supervisors. In 2020, the county adopted a method that sprawl opponents considered an end-run around the law, creating a study guide for applicants preparing transportation analyses for backcountry projects. But the analyses were based on miles traveled only within unincorporated areas. (According to a county report, the Governor's Office of Planning and Research had not made specific recommendations about the boundary that should be used to establish driving impacts.) Critics said the approach ignored the far-flung driving patterns that result from sprawl. Cleveland National Forest Foundation, Coastal Environmental Rights continued on page 6

Different tunes at the **Union-Tribune**

Editorial and news divisions yield split score for Gore

Release of a state audit substantiating years of Union-Tribune reporting on county jail deaths during the rule of Republican Sheriff Bill Gore has insiders talking up the possibility of a last Pulitzer Prize for the fast-fading print daily. But it could be a different story for the paper's editorialists, who spent years helping to keep Gore in office by endorsing him for reelection despite a growing torrent of damning news, then playing down their support for the ultimately out-of-favor sheriff.

Gore owed his sheriff's job to another of the paper's favored sheriffs, Bill Kolender, who abruptly announced his retirement in April 2009. To critics, Kolender's sudden departure was part of a behind-the-scenes succession scenario, set up in cahoots with the U-T, whereby Gore was appointed sheriff by the county's Republican board of supervisors, allowing him to run for the job as an incumbent the following year. In an April 5, 2009 editorial, the U-T urged supervisors to install a permanent successor instead of making an interim appointment to replace Kolender and to "let the political cards play out as they may. Not surprisingly, Kolender's decision to step down early, due to his wife's ill health, has spurred early wrangling by several candidates who hope to succeed him by winning election next year," said the editorial. "Most of these contenders want the board of supervisors to refrain from naming a new sheriff in the meantime, because they fear the appointed incumbent would have a strong political advantage going into the June 2010 primary. Their self-serving stance is certainly no reason for the supervisors to leave the sheriff's job vacant for a year and a half."

Gore thus became sheriff without a public vote, subsequently employing the power of incumbency, campaign money, and U-T endorsements to get elected to the position three times, beginning in **2010.** In the first race, the private prison company GEO Group, seeking to renew a lease for space at downtown's county jail. gave \$2000 to the then-interim sheriff's election campaign. Cash also flowed into the sheriff's campaigns from the likes of Democratic ex-school board chief Alan Bersin, Republican hotel magnate C. Terry Brown, and GOP mayoral insider and port commissioner Stephen Cushman. And a month before the U-T's purchase by Los Angeles billionaire Patrick Soon-Shiong from Tronc on June 18, 2018, the paper endorsed Gore's reelection in a May 18 editorial, despite the paper's coverage of burgeoning jail deaths under Gore's administration. "Contrary to his Democratic

opponent's view that Gore, a Republican, is resistant to change, the sheriff made a plausible case in an interview with us that he is open to criticism and ready to embrace new approaches," said the editorial. "His department appears to have an appropriate appreciation of suspects' mental health issues, reflected in its hiring of mental health clinicians and arguably in the decline of jail suicides."

The result was to help cement Gore into office for yet another four-year term. At the same time, the U-T continued its cascade of coverage of mounting jail deaths, officially validated by a California state audit released February 2. "From 2006 through 2020, 185 people died in San Diego County's jails - one of the highest totals among counties in the state," wrote acting state auditor Michael Tilden. "The department's reviews of in-custody deaths have been insufficient and have not consistently led to significant corrective action. In addition, the Citizens' Law Enforcement Review Board (CLERB)-a citizen-governed board approved by San Diego County voters to restore public confidence in county law enforcement-has failed to provide effective, independent oversight of in-custody deaths."

Months before, in July of 2021, Gore announced he wouldn't run for reelection. A Union-Tribune editorial that month maintained the paper had endorsed his reelection only "tepidly" in 2018, "but has criticized him repeatedly in recent years for the deaths. We welcome his decision to move on." Over the editorial ran a disclaimer proclaiming, "The editorial board operates independently from the U-T newsroom but holds itself to similar ethical standards." When Gore abruptly announced January 19 that he would retire on February 3, well ahead of the end of his final term. but conveniently a day before the critical audit's announced release date, the paper intoned, "The San Diego Union-Tribune Editorial Board thanks Gore for five decades of public service in law enforcement — but hopes his successor is an improvement."

Todd's costly homeless binge

Citizens wanting to know how San Diego mayor Todd Gloria will handle the homeless may find some of the answers in the pages of a potentially costly request for proposals put out by the city's housing commission. "Program will engage persons experiencing homelessness through two distinct yet complimentary [sic] functions: street outreach and street-based case management," says the January 27 solicitation for a contractor to run the mayor's Coor-

dinated Street Outreach Program. "Street outreach," per the document, will have "an emphasis on rapid resolution interventions, diversion from the homelessness response system, and referrals to emergency housing resources." The solicitation goes on to say, "Successful proposals must demonstrate an ability to rapidly respond to service requests for outreach throughout the City of San Diego and street-based case

management activities using a neighborhoodbased strategy." A host of would-be providers from out of town are already angling for a crack at the contract. But labor shortages could inflate costs to six figures or more and delay the effort before it ever gets off the ground. The list of proposers includes San Bernardino-based Lutheran Social Services of Southern California and Los Angeles-based People Assisting the Homeless, otherwise known as PATH. According to a January 27 account by CalMatters, PATH's business is growing so fast that it can hardly handle the burgeoning influx of work. The non-profit, "which serves about a fifth of the state's homeless population, has hired

seven recruiters to help fill 340 vacancies, out of 1,100 jobs," said CEO Jennifer Hark Dietz. "It's now taking an average of four months to fill any given spot." In addition to lengthy delays, insiders note that California's social service worker shortage is virtually sure to drive up San Diego's cost. "We have all this money," Farrah McDaid Ting of the California State Association of Counties told CalMatters. "Can we really

do this if we don't have the people? I think there could be a real limitation." Even more cash may be the answer, but San Diego's request for proposal notes that any payment costing more than \$250,000 "must be approved by the Board of Commissioners of the San Diego Housing Commission," and public resistance may be strong.

In 2020, she received a total of \$328,582 in pay and benefits as chief operating officer, per TransparentCalifornia.com. Axiom Strategies of Kansas City, where Stephen Puetz



Meanwhile, Faulconer's committee for the 2021 gubernatorial recall campaign, in which he managed to place just third in the race to replace incumbent Gov. Gavin Newhas found a home in San Diego. som (who beat the recall), had only \$6342 in the bank, with \$27,076 in debt, after raising \$2,666,233 during 2021. Expenses included \$1219 worth of "travel meals" at Woolgrowers in Los Banos and \$4925 for "event,

meal and music" paid to CityMark Development in San Diego. Still owed was \$4450 to Hemphill Brothers of Whites Creek, Tennessee, for a "final bus tour" and \$12,139 to the U.S. Treasury for payroll taxes. In addition, \$25,736 was owed to Axiom-owned Remington Research Group of Kansas City for "texting Yet another pro-Faulconer group, an independent expenditure committee called Fund for a Better California, primarily formed to support Kevin Faulconer for Governor 2022, was also

Foundation, and the Sierra Club sued, saying it violated state law.

Last summer, the state released a new guidance, stating that the unincorporated areas should use the entire county as a basis for analyzing how much driving new projects would generate. That shrank the 45,444 acres the county considered vehicle efficient down to 2,467 acres. And yet, the county still has to build its share of regional housing. And as part of the 6th Cycle Housing Element (2021-2029), it was found that there aren't enough sites with the requisite densities within the "vehicle-friendly" areas of the county to meet its housing production goals. In light of that new guidance, the board of supervisors voted unanimously to rescind their transportation study guide, and the petitioners dismissed the lawsuit. County staff was directed to come back with more information about auto impacts on projects in the unincorporated areas, infill development, creation of transit accessible areas, affordable housing, and mitigation programs.

The options presented included a phased approach that would allow projects to move forward in areas deemed appropriate for infill, excluding very high fire hazard severity zones. But what exactly counts as infill out in the country? According to a county report, to define "infill development" in unincorporated areas, they considered the density of population, housing, employment, and intersections, along with access to jobs within a 15-mile radius, and shopping and restaurants within a one-mile radius. The locations they deemed appropriate "are close to incorporated cities and within the sphere of development for urbanized San Diego. Specifically, core areas of Fallbrook, San Dieguito, Bonsall, Ramona (along Main Street), Lakeside, Valle De Oro, Spring Valley, Alpine, and Sweetwater all meet the definition." Within those infill areas, there is a housing capacity of up to 2900 units.

Duncan McFetridge, co-founder of Cleveland National Forest Foundation, says the proposal defines infill so broadly that it would exempt much rural development from state requirements to reduce traffic impacts. In places like Alpine, driving distances are already higher than the regional average, he says. "This isn't true infill development, and it will increase rather than reduce" driving. Other groups criticized the use of transportation demand management. "I see it over and over again in the developer-proposed sprawl projects," said Dan Silver, executive director of the Endangered Habitats League. "I think it has mostly been a fig leaf on sprawl development."

Staff proposed expanding the infill areas to include two buffer options that incorporate adjacent areas having "similar urban characteristics." Supervisor Terra Lawson-Remer said she supported an option that looked at exempting 100 percent affordable housing no matter where it's built, and another that champions affordable housing as well as climate protection. But she added that some of the options "are likely to land us in court" - especially versions of the autoinefficient infill and buffer options. She suggested adding another option that includes exemptions for infill areas that may improve their auto profile within 10-15 years as rapid transit comes along. "I envision exemptions in the southwest edge of our urban core; East Otay, Sweetwater, Spring Valley, Valle de Oro, perhaps southwest Lakeside." She also called for a new transportation study guide as soon as possible, so that developers have the certainty they need to build infill. A few developers asked to have their current projects exempted as infill. Chair Nathan Fletcher said the board would return in two weeks "to try to land the plane on some of the recommendations."

Representatives of the building industry and realtor groups were opposed to the regional approach. Many warned of a depleted housing supply. Chris Anderson, president of the Greater San Diego Association of Realtors, said that unlike other regions that have an established urban core, "our communities are comprised of villages dotting the entire region. The county has historically offered new opportunities for ownership, so if you can't afford the coast, you just keep going inland," she said. "We usually call that, in my profession, You Drive Till You Qualify."

OCEANSIDE **Roundup ruination** Never mind the canary in a coalmine, we've got bees leaving beehives

Jeremiah Depesa lives at the west end of the San Luis Rey Valley. The backyard of his hillside home has hosted beehives for the last four years. Then, last October, he headed out for a morning surf session around 8 am and saw an unhappy sight. "This guy in a city of Oceanside truck with pump tanks pulls up and he starts spraying. I said, 'Hey, what are you spraying?' He told me it was Roundup. And he didn't even have a mask on. I told him 'I have bees right here. My daughter lives here. Can't you just go somewhere else?' He said, 'I have to do my

job.' I told him that Roundup causes lymphoma, which kills you. He looked at me straight in the eyes and said, 'That depends on who you talk to.' I told him it's a no-brainer. 'You can take a whiff of the stuff and know it's bad for you.'' Depesa recorded the event on video.

Depesa lives across about 100 yards from the Arctic Glacier ice plant. Its water runoff fills the concrete culvert/storm drain that runs along Benet Road. The ever-present moisture brings weeds, which in turn brings the city of Oceanside weed abatement crew about every six months or so, he says. "He just started spraying up and down the ditch, filling it up with poison. We live about 80 to 100 feet away, and the wind sometimes blows it up there. Plus, the culvert runs right into the San Luis Rey River and I surf the south jetty, right where it comes out into the ocean. I had one friend who surfed who got MS.

Another got cancer. I got a full body rash. It's poison like this that we are immersed in when we're in the ocean."

Plus, every time the city sprays Roundup, Depesa says, it wreaks havoc on his bees. "If they detect poison, they will just up and leave. Five or six hives have completely died."

Starting in 2018, Monsanto, creator of Roundup, has been hit with multi-million dollar judgments compensating grounds-

sprayer, it issued a notice of violation to the city of Oceanside. On January 31, Erica Ryan, water resources control engineer, says her department was assured by Oceanside that it would comply with its own jurisdictional runoff management plan and not use Roundup in its waterways.

Oceanside's Roundup dustup is a big deal, according to George Courser, the conservation committee chair for the Sierra Club,

keepers and homeowners who claimed they got lymphoma from glyphosate, Roundup's active ingredient. Published reports have questioned if a \$10 billion fund set up by Mosanto would be enough to cover the tens of thousands of pending claims. *Pesticides.org* has linked glyphosate to cancer, endocrine disruption, neuro-toxicity, and kidney and liver damage. Monsanto has said it will stop selling Roundup in the U.S. for home and garden use in 2023.

Last month, city staffers in Oceanside's public works department outlined their plans at their annual pest abatement program presentation in front of the Parks and Recreation Commission. The commissioners were asked specifically if they cared that Roundup was being used by the city. None of the commissioners had anything to say. But the San Diego Water Board did. In fact, based on Depesa's video of the maskless city San Diego chapter. "They have not extended proper oversight over their employees. Roundup is the most notorious herbicide on the planet. We do know that it has had severe impacts on our environment. It kills everything it comes in contact with. There is no stopping it. It's just like Agent Orange in Vietnam. But we are not Vietnam." Courser says manual labor is the best way to deal for invasive plant removal, but that the Sierra Club even endorses the use of chlorine over Roundup. "You have to think of people first."

The October Roundup episode helped Quentin Alexander decide it was time to leave. He owns and operates Hive Savers (*hivesavers.com*) which helps preserve beehives locally. Depesa learned how to create thriving hives from Alexander, who maintained hives just west of Depesa on the grounds of the Rosicrucian Fellowship. But in December, Alexander pulled his 10-hive Hive Savers bee sanctuary out of *continued on page 8*

Oceanside. "I'm abandoning that project," says Alexander, who now spends a lot of his bee-saving time in the Elfin Forest area of Encinitas and Rancho Santa Fe. He says his neighbors there are less toxic — literally. "My new neighbors don't use chemicals. We just found a male bumblebee, which means a hive is close by, where the queen is laying eggs." Alexander knows it's still an uphill battle. "Our native pollinators, which are the bumblebees, are almost completely extinct. Leucadia lost its bumblebees last year. There are still a few holdouts out there who won't ditch the chemicals."

Alexander says he feels double crossed by Oceanside. "This last summer, we asked them to please not spray chemicals within two miles. We got the impression they would not. And what's the harm of having weeds anyway? Some of them provide pollinating support for the bees. Why would Oceanside care so much about the weeds in that area (around the intersection of Benet Road and Jones Road) and do nothing about the homeless who are camped down there? Look how ridiculous that is. There were always at least 50 to 100 people squatting on the street. They would [defecate] in the gutter, leave trash in the gutter...I've had my truck broken into, equipment stolen. They raided my shed."

Suzanne Hume, founder of Cleanearth4kids.org, says Oceanside passed then immediately broke its own laws. "I was shocked and heartbroken. We helped get them to pass the Integrated Pest Management Plan in 2020, which does not allow Roundup to be used unless there is a documented threat to health or property." (Oceanside public works division manager Nathan Mertz confirmed that Roundup was no longer being used in city parks as of 2020, but did not answer other questions about Oceanside's ongoing use of Roundup, or if employees still apply it without a mask.) "When that plan passed, we were so happy for a huge victory," says Hume. "We assumed they would not randomly spray poison into this culvert. The city is opening us up to lawsuits." Hume says she herself was poisoned when she was exposed to pesticides dropped from a helicopter when she lived adjacent to West Coast Tomato Growers near Guajome Lake. "I did not sue. Instead I put all my energy into cleanearth4kids.org." But, she says, West Coast Tomato Growers still use pesticides, and she wonders if they would have stopped if she had sued.

HILLCREST **Mudrooms and memorials** Did San Diego's first house-flippers start with home improvement?

Concluding my investiation into our home's first owners, Harry and Glikeria Rogers. In addition to several of the specifics in Glikeria's will, the Winnipeg newspaper article I found contained quotes from a Chula Vista woman who was identified as Glikeria's friend. "She always had a hammer or a saw or paintbrush in her hands. She was the hardest working woman I ever saw." As for Harry's role, the friend said, "He did most of the paperwork; she did much of the manual labor."

From earlier documents, I found that Harry retired from the Navy in 1941, when he was 62. I didn't find any evidence of their house flipping habits until 1944, and my guess is that since they were listed as owning the Upas Street house in the '44 directory, they probably sold our house in either 1943 or 1944 to buy that one, and so that house would become their first flip.

The Winnipeg newspaper article got me thinking about an addition made to our house. long before we arrived. A previous owner had slapped what we would call a mudroom onto the back of it, and we knew the room wasn't original because it didn't really match the rest of the house. Also, where a window from a back closet once looked out into our backyard, it now provided a close-up view of lathe. But I also know the mudroom was added before 1957, because I acquired an aerial photo of our Hillcrest neighborhood from the San Diego History Center archives, and I could clearly see our roofline in the photo as it extended to that extra room. Was it possible that Harry and Glikeria built our mudroom (or had it built), and if so, was that their first "home improvement"? I guess I'd like to think so, but I'd also like to think their later improvements to other properties were more professional-looking than this one.

Lynne and I still find it unusual that Harry and Glikeria Rogers were buying what they considered to be fixers in our neighborhood. Did many 25-year-old houses really need fixing up? Were the Rogers going mostly for added curb appeal and really quick turnarounds, or did they engage in big add-on projects and bring in contractors to do some construction that crews are currently setting up scaffolding for in an amount not to exceed \$450,000. The \$8.4 million from the state will go toward the future project that will address the Ocean Beach Pier's long-term future."

Scaffolding has been erected at the west end of the pier, bridging the upper deck. A section of scaffolding erected under the pier will serve as an access point for divers. "The repair work has not yet started," said Ruben Minjarez, lead diver & supervisor for American Marine Corporation. But he and his team are standing by, eager to dive in and start repairs on two damaged pilings. "We have a four-man dive team. One diver in the water at a time. But that won't be happening today or tomorrow or anytime soon," he said while side-eying the heavy surf. "Scheduling is currently in the works, and it's all weather dependent. Tides, surf, swell, king tides... We're just on the set-up part - material, procurement, access point. Access is not doing too good right now."

On January 25, less than a week after it went up, the scaffolding under the pier was removed due to weather. "The temporary removal of the scaffolding platforms is a planned precautionary operating procedure when high or king tides are forecasted," the city representative explained. "This planned response will be implemented whenever tide levels reach the scaffolding, and any removed sections will be reinstalled as soon as tidal conditions subside and forecasted weather conditions allow for it."

OCEAN BEACH **Pier review** Initial preliminary repairs almost almost underway

It's been a year since the OB Pier was partially closed after sustaining heavy damage due to high surf. Last week, the city finally began setting the stage for initial emergency repairs — but a spokesperson for the city clarified that this is not the proposed \$8.4M fix. Scott Robinson, supervising public information officer for the city of San Diego explained, "The contract is for the emergency

For now, all the public can do is peer through the fence.

Minjarez, who has already inspected the damage underwater, added that even if scaffolding stage is removed, he's not worried about access. The city has options. "I know there are load restrictions on the pier. The city could use a bridge inspection machine to lower personnel, but that's not my area of expertise. I work on the water and in the water."

Once work resumes, it could take up to two weeks for scaffolding to be erected and eight weeks for repairs. Once completed, the entire pier will reopen to the public.

Selfie with self-portrait

Immersive art exhibits have grown in popularity recently, with installments like the recently closed Sistine Chapel Exhibition in Mission Valley now featured all over the world. Here in town, we still have *Beyond Van Gogh*, which is showing inside of a 30,000 square foot space in the Wyland Center at the Del Mar Fairgrounds, and is presented by Keurig. I bought a ticket for last Tuesday night and joined a wide variety

of fellow guests — young and old, dates and families — to see what it was all about.

The show begins with an educational stroll through some biographical and background information about the artist: his era, his internal torment, and the travails of his creative life. His earnest epistolary relationship with his brother Theo provides some of the content for the displays here. Here in the first section, there is also a thought-provoking row of suspended frames that invite the visitor to take a look at pieces of the world through them, to see things in a more painterly way.

After the introduction, guests walk past a display showing two Keurig K Supreme Plus

SMART machines and a reminder that a "rich, full-flavored coffee masterpiece" is within reach. Scan the QR code for a coupon if you like, and, as the sign bids you, "Gogh this way" into the main room where the heart of *Beyond Van Gogh* is situated.

This room makes a striking first impression. Within the cavernous space, a classical soundtrack, which movingly evokes the melancholic feeling of Van Gogh's life and

work, plays, while a selection of Van Gogh's paintings are projected on the walls and the floor. Some other sounds are here, too; for instance, a pencil scratching during a sketch. There is some understated animationa blinking eye, a twinkling star, the re-creation of some brush strokes. Occasionally, there are words from the artist about his work or his process. Some episodes, especially when a single painting is featured rather than panels of multiple pieces, feel more immersive than others.

The dark, blue night paintings work best, providing a dreamlike ambience that is not present during, say, the sequences of personal portraits, or the boat scenes.

You can sit or walk around slowly and observe different sections of the room. Of course, this being 2022, this whole show is also an opportunity to just take copious pictures of yourself and your companions against awesome backgrounds. The show welcomes this (and welcomes "Influencers" in particular on its website). I am struck, during one section of the show that fills the room with Van Gogh's own oil paint selfies, by the intriguing double layer of self-regarding moments taking place here. Van Gogh: here I am in this big furry hat, now a straw one, smoking a pipe, with a shaved head, with my bandaged ear. San Diegans: here I am making my peace sign, embracing my date, pulling down my mask so I can smile for the camera.

Toasting the Captain

When I worked in North County some years ago, I would regularly drive by Cap'n Keno's on the 101 and admire it, in the same way I would admire Leucadia's Log Cabin Apartments or the old yellow railway station that houses the Pannikin. Like all of these, Keno's is a survivor of a cozier, more innocent, more wonderful time in the midst of mostly boring kitchen. All the food, which they will bring to my seat at the bar, has the strange, timetravel-like low prices alluded to earlier. There is a claw machine near some arcade games. An old snack machine has been cleared out and repurposed as a display case for the kind of cute miniature buildings that people bring out around the holidays. From my seat at the bar, I can appreciate the plush red booths and the log wall along the back of the building. I listen to a guy tell his friend that he looks old ("Im tired, man"), and to another guy telling the bartender that he just had a promising interview for work. A lady pays for her White Russian and adds an extra tip for the big bartender — a little bag of jellybeans.

new development. I would wonder what the place was like — with its friendly maritime sign with a pipe-smoking captain and parrot below a homey shake roof, with its \$2.99 meal specials advertised outside — but I never went inside until last week, when I had some extra time before going to the Fairgrounds to see the *Beyond Van Gogh* exhibit.

Around 6:45, I open the door with its "Cash Only" sign and step inside from the chilly coastal night onto the well-trodden burgundy carpet, breathing in the reassuring alcoholinfused aroma of the place. I've never been here before, but the smell of a place like this lowers my pulse. It feels instantly familiar. The Christmas lights and ornaments are still up. The FM radio plays mellow hits from the '80s and '90s. College basketball plays on a TV over

the bar next to signs — two of them — requesting no profanity. Silverware clinks on plates filled with ribs, steaks, burgers, baked potatos, and fried fish. When I ask for a menu myself, the giant of a bartender kindly says, "We're old school here; you can order right over there at the counter," and points me through a dining room in the direction of a cafeteria-style register in front of a window to the


Keno's has been written about before — in this paper and in numerous others — and is acknowledged fondly by many locals and regulars. The story of its origins many decades ago, its previous incarnations as two other restaurants, and its 1970 purchase by current owner Gerry Sova has also been told. But I want to raise one more glass to this place, especially because it may not be here for many more years to come after its recent purchase, along with the property of its neighbor, the defunct Portofino Inn, by RAF Pacifica Group. The Group says it will incorporate this space as part of a mixed-use project. This project is said to include a bar that will pay tribute to Captain Keno's, but it is of course not clear what this will look like. Could it ever be this warm and good?

OUR BOYS NEVER HAIR OUT. The black panther has black feet. Black feet on the crumbling black panther. Pan-thuh. Mee-dah. Pam Stacy, 16 years old, a cute girl here in La Jolla, California, with a pair of orange bellbottom hip-huggers on, sits on a step about four steps down the stairway to the beach and she can see a pair of revolting black feet without lifting her head. So she says it out loud, "The black panther."

Somebody farther down the stairs, one of the boys with the major hair and khaki shorts, says, "The black feet of the black panther."

"Mee-dah," says another kid. This happens to be the cry of a, well, underground society known as the Mac Meda Destruction Company. "The pan-thuh."

"The poon-thuh."

All these kids, seventeen of them, members of the Pump House crowd, are lollygagging around the stairs down to Windansea Beach, La Jolla, California, about 11 a.m., and they all look at the black feet, which are a woman's pair of black street shoes, out of which stick a pair of old veiny white ankles, which lead up like a senile cone to a fudge of tallowy, edematous flesh, her thighs, squeezing out of her bathing suit, with old faded yellow bruises on them, which she probably got from running eight feet to catch a bus or something. She is standing with her old work-a-hubby, who has on sandals: you know, a pair of navy-blue anklet socks and these sandals with big, wide, new-smelling tan straps going this way and that, for keeps. Man, they look like orthopedic sandals, if one can imagine that. Obviously, these people come from Tucson or Albuquerque or one of those hincty adobe towns. All these hincty, crumbling black feet come to La Jollaby-the-sea from the adobe towns for the weekend. They even drive in cars all full of thermos bottles and mayonnaisey sandwiches and some kind of latticework wooden-back support for the old crock who drives and Venetian blinds on the back window.

"Pan-thuh."

- "Poon-thuh."
- "Mee-dah."

Nobody says it to the two old crocks directly. God, they must be practically 50 years old...

[T]he Pump House itself [is] a concrete block, 15 feet high, full of machinery for the La Jolla water system...The surfers around the Pump House use that word, mysterioso, quite a lot. It refers to the mystery of the Oh Mighty Hulking Pacific Ocean and everything. Sometimes a guy will stare at the surf and say, "Mysterioso." They keep telling the story of Bob Simmons' wipeout, and somebody will say "mysterioso"...






San Diego's costly mistakes

A rguably, it was incidental that a San Diego courtroom proved to be the venue where federal judicial power asserted that enough was enough in terms of Donald Trump's child-separation policy — a decision that helped pave the way for massive settlement negotiations between the Jusice Department and the immigrant families that had been affected. But for some, it no doubt seemed significant, because local governments in and around San Diego have, of late, been making some historically large legal-liability settlements.

One notable example: in September of last year, a \$10 million award was issued to the family of two young men who died when their car exploded after an off-duty San Diego police officer's city-issued Ford Explorer "Interceptor" slammed into their Toyota Corolla. In 2018, Jesus David Dominguez, his sister Giovanna, and Isaac Felix were driving at night on the 15 when they were hit by previously convicted drunk driver Jeffrey Brian Levi. According to Levi's defense attorney, the collision left them stranded and without working lights, but uninjured. What killed Jesus and Isaac (and severely injured Giovanna) was the high-speed impact from SDPD gangunit officer Detective Seargent Raymond Rowe's SUV just minutes later. Because E STOCK

of Levi's previous DUI conviction, the prosecutor in his case argued that he was "on notice" with regard to the dangers of drunken driving, and he was convicted of murder and sentenced to 34 years to life in prison. Detective Rowe, meanwhile, blamed his bad vision, his failure

to wear driving glasses, and the Corolla's lack of lights, and noted, "I didn't actually see the collision, I felt it. I was looking in the rear-view mirror."

Ten million dollars is a lot of money. But attorney Warren Ellis, who represented the Dominguez and Felix families,

warns against a kneejerk reaction: "I always say the worst thing that can happen to a person or to a family is to receive a large liability settlement, because it means something very, very bad has happened to them. It's a fact that municipal governments and insurance companies are not in the business of giving out big settlements willynilly." Context, he says, is everything. "There's this misperception among the public that, 'Hey, these people are going to suddenly be made very wealthy because of a mere car accident.' They don't realize where the damages are really going." He starts by pointing to medical expenses for the survivor: "Giovanna had third-degree burns over 25 percent of her body surface," and longterm medical recovery will be a fact of life for the young woman for many years. Then he notes that the men who died were voung — 33 and 19 — two lifetimes cut short. Further, there were children left behind, children who lost a provider. Finally, he says that payouts are generally split among multiiple parties, and that they

generally come via structured disbursements from insurance companies and multi-jurisdictional sources across decades. That, he explains, is why taxpayers don't usually take big, concentrated hits, even from settlements such as the one he recently secured.

Suicides and Supervisors

The Rowe crash was an awful, isolated incident. Other recent payouts indicate troubling patterns, such as those related to a rash of suicides among people inside lock-ups operated by the San Diego County Sheriff's Department. On May 11, 2020, deeply depressed Joseph "Joey" Morton was being held in the sheriff's Vista Detention Facility for erratic behavior that included an amateurish attempt at robbery using a toy gun. Morton was broke, and after getting laid off from his job at the beginning of the pandemic, he saw no way to make a living. Just the day before, he had been released from a socalled "5150" hold after a neighbor had called 911 and authorities had found him attempting suicide by inhaling carbon monoxide fumes. (Morton was already unconscious when authorities found him, according to court documents.) As the Reader reported in December, "While detained at Vista Detention Facility, on three different occasions, Joey admitted to medical staff that he was feeling suicidal and was suffering from untreated mental health disorders and withdrawals." And every time, says Morton famly attorney Danielle Pena, an outsourced medical provider "ignored his admissions because they thought he was lying." The Mortons are now suing the County.

Citing research in a 2020 article published in the professional-trade periodical Prison Legal News, the complaint against San Diego County and other defendants in the Morton case states, "The county has the dubious distinction of leading the state in prisoner suicides, with a 10-year average of 74.8 suicides per 100,000, compared to Los Angeles' 44.3 per 100,000." The complaint notes that a "2018 report by the nonprofit Disability Rights Organization blamed an overreliance on incarceration for the mentally ill as well as a failure to provide adequate mental-health care to those in custody. 'Effective suicide prevention practices and oversight are especially lacking, [the Disability Rights Organization] found." The complaint further asserts that San Diego County supervisors are on the

record as having said to a Joint Legislative Audit Committee that "there is an extensive public record documenting the tragic loss of lives, systemic failures, and inadequacy of oversight... This grim history shows no sign of waning." Furthermore, the complaint claims that "as a direct result of the county's abysmal suicide rate, and likely the root cause of the suicide rate, members of the Board of Supervisors have publicly criticized Sheriff Bill Gore for maintaining knowingly inadequate policies and procedures, and primarily for outsourcing medical and mental-health care." The Morton attorneys are seeking a jury trial, and asking for unspecified damages on four major counts, ranging from "objective indifference" and medical malpractice, to inadequate carein-custody policies, gross negligence, and wrongful death.

The San Diego County Board of Supervisors is already worried about alleged negligence leading to suicide among jailed individuals. One reason: the cost of paying for not taking such risks seriously. In September, the same

Downtown San Diego firm where Pena practices secured an historic settlement from the County for a strikingly similar case: that of Heron Moriarty, who also died by suicide at the Vista lockup. Moriarty's family received a record payout of of nearly \$3 million after the deceased man's wife (now his widow) begged medical staff and jailers to watch out for the likelihood that her husband would try to take his own life in jail. Her fears were well founded, but ignored. Morris Law Firm founder (and former deputy city attorney) Christopher Morris says, "To me, being a public official requires one to not only assess the fiscal impact of the decision being made, but in my opinion, our leaders have a responsibility to resolve cases of clear liability early on in the process for the sake of the aggrieved party. They really have a dual duty — a fiscal responsibility to the public and a moral obligation to the aggrieved. In my opinion, [significant liability settlements and judgements are] the most effective deterrent to bad public policies and negligent conduct by government employees. The old saying that 'money talks' is especially true in this context."

The Board of Supervisors may agree. In addition to yielding a \$2.95 million payout to the 43-year-old electrical contractor's widow — the most ever paid to a civil litigant by the County in a jail-suicide case — Heron Moriarity's death and the ensuing lawsuit also prompted a state audit of how the county handles people with mental health problems while they are in custody. It seems there

is plenty of blame to go around. Notes the audit. "The [Citizens Law Enforcement Review Board] has not independently interviewed witnesses or visited the initial scenes of the deaths. Further, it has not consistently performed thorough investigations, and it relies largely on the interviews the Sheriff's Department conducts. Moreover, [the Board] failed to review dozens of deaths in the Sheriff's Department's jails." It seems there is still a long way to go.

Smash silos, stop stumbles?

Speaking of audits: a 2020 City of San Diego audit informed elected leaders that a "siloed" warren of municipal departments doesn't bode well when it comes to coordinating and communicating regarding mitigation of liability-lawsuit risks. Damaged sidewalks are a perfect example. According to a citygenerated report on the audit, "The City incurs liability for a wide variety of issues, such as when a resident trips on a damaged City sidewalk and falls." The report adds that resources useful for eliminating some of the mil-

lions of dollars in liability payouts caused by cracked concrete may be buried inside City Hall's own databases. "The City's approach to trip and fall risk mitigation does not utilize data analytics to identify trends in the locations of trip and fall claims, and does not sufficiently prioritize sidewalk defect repairs in areas where future claims are most likely to occur. One likely result is that both the annual number of trip and fall closed claims and costs trended upward during [fiscal years 2010 to 2018]." The sidewalks portion of the audit analysis concluded that "overall, the City closed 875 trip-and-fall claims and incurred approximately \$14.6 million in trip and fall claim costs during [fiscal year] 2010 to [fiscal year] 2018."

Bad cop, good insurance

San Diego Police Detective Daniel Riis's decision in 2018 to pepper spray Gregory McNally and slam his head to the ground at a Fashion Valley trolley platform cost the city the hefty sum of \$2.5 million in damages and legal costs. (It took just a week-long trial for a jury to conclude McNally had

been wronged by the city's police department.) But according to a researcher at the UCLA School of Law, there's doubt about whether large liability judgements and payouts do all that much to deter city employees from making high-cost mistakes. "Some law enforcement agencies pay millions from their budgets each year toward settlements and judgments, but the particularities of their jurisdictions' budgeting arrangements lessen or eliminate altogether the financial impact of these payments on these agencies," writes UCLA law Professor Joanna C. Schwartz.

It seems she has a point: the McNally case was only one in a bucket of 20,000 claims with liability payouts that, for the city of San Diego alone, totaled \$220 million during a recent eight-year period. But it turns out large municipalities like the city and the county of San Diego are actually pretty good at managing their litigation liabilities. Even though its own auditors say there's major room for improving liabilityrisk mitigation through better data-sharing and communication, the city reports receiving far more in insurance-claims proceeds — that means income — than it pays out in both premiums and its share of claims. Citing analyses by the city's Risk Management Department, auditors reported to the mayor and city council that San Diegans "paid approximately \$45 million for public liability insurance and received over \$120 million in insurance proceeds" from 2014 to 2018. San Diego pulls off this near-magical trick by maintaining a complex, but apparently effective, set of long-established practices that include pool-buying of insurance policies, "selfinsurance," re-insurance and joint-powers costsharing with other regional governments.

Keeping premiums lower than proceeds despite a constant flow of civil rights, negligence, and other liability lawsuits would be impossible for an individual or small business. But large corporations, states, and municipal governments have a lot more options when it comes to fiscal strategies and mitigating the costs of their legal liabilities. Prowess in shielding taxpayers — i.e., voters — from the pain of large liability payouts means that most elected officials rarely feel repercussions at the ballot box as a result of being sued over reckless employees or harmful policies.

Slaughter of The Innocent

KILLER SAYS THE DEVIL TOLD HER TO

ceanside police officer Kari Winship was the first to arrive after a 911 call reporting a fight in the front yard of the home on Garfield Street in Oceanside. Witnesses had reported seeing a Hispanic male with long black hair run away in the pouring rain, just before 8 am on April 10, 2020. Chad Danielson, a well-liked PE instructor at Jefferson Middle School, was found unconscious on the ground near the front door of his home. His wife and two children had decorated the house for his 45th birthday and were inside waiting to celebrate. Danielson had taken the dog for a walk, which was his normal morning routine. He was then transported to Palomar Hospital, where he died at 9:24 am. An autopsy revealed multiple stab wounds, including four to his front and three to his back. Some of the wounds were five

inches deep; his lung and his heart had been penetrated.

A team of police officers immediately began canvassing the neighborhood, speaking with potential witnesses and collecting surveillance video from cameras in the area. Detective Erik Ellgard, who has been with Oceanside police 21 years, testified at a pre-trial hearing more than a year later. He remembered that on that morning, "It was raining massively; streets were flooded." There were few pedestrians outside, and therefore, few eyewitnesses. However, neighbors did report hearing yelling and screams, and saw a longhaired man running away. (The detective reviewed video from cameras in the neighborhood and used it to make a map of the suspect's movements. A video clip of the suspect, wearing dark clothing and walking on the sidewalk of Garfield Street, was displayed as evidence in court.)

Meanwhile, a young man who was working at home that day heard the squeaky iron gate opening in front of his house on Missouri Avenue. He looked out and saw the gate was open, so he went outside in the rain and closed it. He returned to his work in the house; then he heard police sirens and saw cop cars. The man then slid open the glass door to his side patio and saw a heavyset Hispanic man crouched in the corner; the stranger was backed up against a gate. They made eye contact, and the young man retreated back into his house. He told his mother what he had seen, and she grabbed her phone and went outside in the rain to flag down a passing police officer.

Field evidence technician Elizabeth Gluck was the first forensic expert to arrive at the scene. She had to work fast, because the rain was washing away evidence. First she took photographs at 523 Garfield Street, and she helped put up a canopy to preserve things. Then she visited the home on Missouri Avenue, where she photographed bloody hand prints on a white gate and collected blood swabs. She also collected a red plastic sign that said

ATTACK CAT, because she could see "good ridge detail" print on it. She sent it to the San Diego County Sheriff's crime lab for fingerprint and DNA analysis. Six days after the murder, the Sheriff's crime lab phoned detective Ellgard and reported a fingerprint match from the ATTACK CAT sign: Jennifer Ramos. "I thought that was an error, because it was a female name, and all the witness descriptions said a male," Detective Ellgard testified later. But then he remembered that he had been in contact with a Jennifer Ramos in the past, back when he was assigned to the gang detail, and that she "could easily be perceived as a male."

The same day they were informed of the fingerprint match — April 16, 2020 — Oceanside cops served a search warrant at the home of the 22-yearold Ramos. She lived with her sister and her mother and a big dog in a duplex on the corner of Division and Garfield streets, just a block from the crime scene. A large, red ceramic knife was collected from the dresser in Ramos' bedroom. And a dark jacket with blood spots was found in her laundry basket.

Ramos was taken to an interview room at Oceanside Police headquarters. At first, she denied knowing anything, saying, "I haven't even gone outside for a couple weeks" (because of the Covid lockdown). She guessed that police had picked her up "for a probation check." But she also said she got her black eye from a fight six days previous, claiming that "somebody jumped me" in a parking lot.

Detective Ellgard showed Danielson's driver's license photo to Ramos. She said, "So. he is an outsider to me, I don't really know him." (This even though she said she had lived in that neighborhood for her "whole life.") When police showed her the photo showing her walking down the street, she spontaneously exclaimed, "Oh, I did not know there was a camera there!" But then she recovered, and said that was not her in the photo. Police showed her more photos, from other cameras.

"Damn! There is cameras around!" she exclaimed. "I never even know that!" At first she denied it was her, but soon she changed her story. Then she was shown photos of the victim's wounds, taken at his autopsy. She responded, "God damn! For real?" Then she leaned forward on the leather couch in the interview room. Her elbows were on her knees and her head hung down. She said, "Yeah, I did it." Ramos confessed that the Devil or Satan told her to kill the next person she saw, and that she did not know Danielson. "Yeah, he was walking his dog. And they told me, the first person you see, kill." She had taken a kitchen knife from her home before she left, and chose to find someone away from the familiar street where she had grown up. She asked the two detectives in the room if they knew Satan. "He told me you guys were going to come," she said.

Her confession lasted about an hour. Near the end of the interview, detective Ellgard offered to act as the victim, so Ramos

could demonstrate how she attacked the man she called "The Innocent." She said she hurried up from behind when the man was approaching his house, and reached around him to deliver the first, lethal stab to his chest. "Something like a bear hug," she told the cops. She guessed she stabbed him maybe eight times in his chest and back and side. She said the man fought her and tried to control her knife hand. At one point, he struck her, and that was how she got her black eye — "Because I deserved it. He punched me in the face. I can't blame him."

She confirmed her blood might be at the scene, "because I got a little cut right here," she said, pointing to her right arm. After the attack, she said, she ran to someone's patio, "because I was wheezing." She was lightheaded and couldn't run anymore. The

knife was tucked in her jacket while she crouched, hidden, on the patio. She heard the police arriving, and was surprised they had come so fast. "Then I just went home. I took a shower." A recording of Ramos' interview with police was played as evidence during the court

stance of lying in wait. He

hearing on October 20, 2021. Ramos, now 24, was handcuffed to chains around her waist while she listened to a full day's worth of evidence against her. Twelve family members and supporters of the deceased man were in court for the hearing, and there was frequent weeping. The defendant looked impassive, possibly because her face was covered by a Covid mask.

Prosecutor Matt Hardy charged Ramos with first degree murder, use of a deadly weapon, and the special circumsaid that Ramos had exited her apartment with murderous intent, crossed the street when she saw her target, followed him, and then took him by surprise. According to the prosecutor, that satisfied the "lying in wait" element. The public defender, however, argued against the charge of lying in wait, which can result in the death penalty or life in prison with no parole. He pointed out that Ramos did not conceal herself, and that she did not conceal her purpose. He said that she did

not watch and wait, that she did not know he lived at that house, and that as soon as she saw him, she started to approach him. At the end of the hearing, Honorable Judge David Brown ordered Jennifer Ramos to answer all charges, including the special circumstances. Ramos pleaded not guilty, and remains in a no-bail hold status in the Las Colinas women's jail. She is next due in San Diego's North County Superior Courthouse in June 2022, to confirm a trial date in August. — Eva Knott

Look for lupines in desert gullies first

Lupines, whose spiky, purple (sometimes yellow) flower clusters adorn grassy areas and disturbed patches of soil, are beginning to pop up all over San Diego County. If desert rainfall cooperates, you'll spot lupines along the sandy washes or in roadside gullies where water temporarily collects. Coastal lupines should be in full flower by late March. Higher-elevation lupines will be blooming in the mountain areas in May and early June. The generic name *Lupinus*, meaning "wolf," was given these plants in the belief that they robbed the soil of nutrients. Actually the reverse is true: Their ability to fix nitrogen through root nodules helps them survive on poor soils and may, in fact, enrich the soil around them.

The Frost-Nipped Legacies of the past winter's cold spells might not be hard to spot in February, especially in the inland areas where overnight lows dipped to below freezing. Look for brown lawns, half-dead-looking avocado trees, and wilted ornamental plants like poinsettias. One common frost-sensitive native plant, the laurel sumac, is responsive to the reach of cold air. Laurel sumac is often the largest and most conspicuous plant growing within the coastal sagescrub type of vegetation native to San Diego's undisturbed canyon hillsides. Wherever freezing-cold air has sunk into low lying canyons and basins, laurel sumac bushes tell the story by appearing brown and withered a few weeks later.

Sirius the Dog Star blazes in the southeast after dinnertime, the brightest star of *Canis Major*. In a dark sky with lots of stars in view, the constellation's points can be connected to form a convincing dog profile. He's currently standing on his hind legs. Sirius is on his chest, to the right or lower right of his faint, triangular head.

While we're on the subject of kitty privvies, Wilson deserves a better agent, while Halle Berry doesn't deserve the career she's had since trading in her Oscar® for a litter box. The torrential cloudburst of moon debris that caps the piece might have worked better in 3D, but as it is, it's as flat as everything else in this artificial universe. 2022. — S.M. ● (IN WIDE RELEASE)

Nightmare Alley — What makes the 1946 adaptation of William Lindsay Gresham bleak tale of life far, far under the big top so unique was the curious combination of director Edmund Goulding (acclaimed for such "woman's pictures" as Grand Hotel and Dark Victory), the backing of a Hollywood major (20th Century Fox), and Tyrone Power, the handsome leading man contracted to star as the mentalist. fallen on hard times, reduced to entertaining the crowd by biting the heads off live poultry. Parallel Mothers — Leave it to Pedro Almodóvar to slap a fresh coat of Technicolor enamel on that most reviled made-for-TV variant: the switched-at-birth melodrama. Two mothers, two accidents, and numerous unexpected twists come to a boil in this, the filmmaker's definitive statement on motherhood, melodrama, and the unhealthy allegiance that's formed when shuffled and dealt from the crazed mind of Almodóvar. And he does so with the greatest of stylistic ease. Responding to something as seemingly innocuous as a knock on the door whisks us into the past. And don't expect any of that "One Year Earlier" nonsense when a change of costume and hair will do for an indicator. You know you're in good hands when along the way, every question that arose — and there are many to be found within the labyrinthian narrative was answered the moment after it came to mind. Penelope Cruz reciprocates by gifting her frequent directorial collaborator with a performance that's equal parts warmth, depth, and nervous breakdown required in these parts. Storaro tells all by miraculously composing a dinner conversation between the three as if Rifkin wasn't at the table. Former film professor Rifkin does his best work on his back sound asleep, dreaming in black-and-white and in the context of the European Masters (and Claude Lelouch), about whom he has based his class. Both director and cinematographer feast on affec-San tionate recreations of the genius of Godard, Diego Buñuel, Renoir, Truffaut (and Claude Lelouch). When it comes to Bergman, I'm not sure whether Woody is spoofing *Persona* or his own *Interiors*. It's been a lot of movies to produce this many laughs. (When choos-February ing between testaments, he argues, "In the New Testament, at least the Messiah shows up.") resurrected over the course of the year were selected by fan vote. Jeremy Moynier, Stone's Senior Manager of Innovation, explains, "When we announce new beers on our social channels. fans always write in the comments, 'Bring back SSR (Sublimely Self-Righteous),' or, 'Bring back Stone Green Tea IPA!' With so much innovation happening around here, we think it's really meaningful to give in to nostalgia from time to time, too." Sublimely Self-Righteous, an 8.7% Black IPA which was originally brewed for Stone's 11th Anniversary, is now on tap and available in cans. Featuring Chinook, Simcoe, and Amarillo hops, the beer is medium-bodied with a dark hue and a dry finish providing notes of chocolate, coffee, orange, and pine.

Later this month, Stone will release the second brew of its Throwback series: Japanese Green Tea IPA, which was first released in 2011 as a collaboration with **Baird Brewing Company** in Japan and Ishii Brewing Company in Guam. The brew comes in at 9.2% and is double dryhopped - first with Crystal, Pacifica, and Aramis, then with Japanese Sorachi Ace hops and Sencha green tea. The tea offers an aroma and flavor that distinguish the IPA from traditional West Coast IPAs without completely overpowering the citrus notes of the hops.

Moynier makes it clear that while bringing back old favorites is fun for the fans and brewers, it isn't always as easy as it may seem. "We

hadn't done the Baird/Ishii/Stone Japanese Green Tea IPA in a while, so we had to dust off that recipe (which is always a challenge), and then the key ingredient, Japanese Sencha Green Tea, takes some planning to procure, especially in the amount we want. Then there's the fact that we are in difficult supply chain times in the world, leading to longer lead times, shipping, etc." Following the Green Tea IPA, Stone plans

on releasing RuinTen Triple IPA in late April, Peak Conditions Double Hazy in June, Stone

25th+1 Anniversary Triple IPA in August, and Stone Imperial Russian Stout in October

Beer aficionados who for some reason aren't feeling the nostalgia and so remain search of something new can seek out Stone's One Batch Dispatch, a series of limited edition beers destined to be brewed only once, with a new ale released every four weeks. The latest iteration, released on February 2 at local Stone locations, is Pineapple Dunn Upside Down Wee Heavy, a 9.5% Scotch Ale brewed with pineapple and fea-

turing a bold caramelized, malty character. The ale was brewed by Stone's latest Homebrew Competition winner, Jason Dunn, who also serves as the president of Inland Empire Brewers homebrew club.

Bluegrass beginnings

Mandolinist Randy Hanson first met guitarist Mark Miller in 2012 at Cliff Keller's San Diego Songwriters MeetUp. At the weekly gathering, the two were paired up and given a song title, "Every Second," for which they had to create music and lyrics. Miller, a West Virginia native, had a history of playing in rock cover bands, but was primarily working on ballads in the songwriters' group at the time. "I hijacked him and said, 'Let's do this in a bluegrass instrumentation format," Hanson explains. "That's how that kind of evolved. It was kind of new for him. He's learned a lot of bluegrass cover tunes since then."

The duo performed in South Park at an event held by the songwriter group, and took note of two musicians who were filling in as part of the house band: banjo player Jason Weiss and bassist Orion Boucher. Hanson and Miller 2022 were impressed enough to 10, invite the two musicians to join their new bluegrass proj-ect. Boucher's background was more jazz and funk, and "he's a pretty good rapper as well," according to Hanson. Diego Weiss, surprisingly enough, started out on jazz guitar before discovering the banjo. 80

Since Hanson's background was playing in bar bands, MohaviSoul would be the first bluegrass outfit for all four members.

After the lineup was set, the group quickly released two EPs in 2013. The first included Hanson and Miller's initial songwriting experiment, "Every Second," which became the name of the disc as well. A full-length, Hometown Blues, arrived in 2017. By this point, the band had grown tired of doing smaller bar gigs around town, and the men were looking to show off their skills in a different context. "We really wanted to try and grow and transition into being more of a festival band and do house concerts and weddings. We were really trying to step away."

Locally, MohaviSoul has played bluegrass festivals in Ramona, Santee, and Temecula. But how does the band go over at a non-bluegrassspecific event such as the OB Street Fair? "Pretty damn well," according to Hanson. "We get a great crowd and people stick around. They want to hear it. We do a fun mix of some unusual covers and our own stuff."

In 2019, the band was on a roll, playing national and local festivals. That's when

Finn Jubilee in Ontario, California in 2019. "We had no idea that was going to happen. We played the festival, and then I got this message that this guy had recorded us. It was a Grateful Dead/ Phish kind of a thing where he set up some high-end microphones right next to the soundboard and recorded us, which we knew nothing of." The mics worked well enough that the band chose to release the full concert set themselves. However, they decided to re-record the songs for the upcoming album because, according to Hanson, "the quality was good, but it wasn't great."

Alongside some guests and their fiddle player Dan Sankey (with the band since 2014, though he missed the previous album recording sessions due to a hand operation), the group knocked out the thirteen songs that appear on their new full-length, Stories and Memories, tracked during the pandemic at Studio West in Rancho Bernardo. Orion Boucher even squeezed one of his own songs onto the album, "Self-Imposed Highs and Lows," before he moved away from San Diego. Ben Bostwick has stepped in to cover the low end, while Boucher re-acclimates himself

Patriotic pianist persists through pandemic In the days before

covid, piano virtuoso Irving Flores was one of the busiest cats in town. "Yes, I was playing every day," recalls Flores. "But, just like that, it all collapsed from all that craziness." The pianist says he was lucky enough to avoid homelessness, thanks to some help from his friends, notably trombonist Dave Scott. "He gave me a place to stay during the pandemic, and was always looking to help me out."

Little by little, Flores began putting gigs together, and now he's nearly back to his previous schedule. "It's great, but a little scary at the same time" — he's deeply aware of just how quickly and drastically things can change in the current climate. "Right now, I'm playing six or seven days a week. The previous three months have been very busy, sometimes with two or three gigs a day." And while busy is much better than the alternative, it does carry its own causes for concern. Live music

means live fans, many of whom keep their social distance, but some of whom do not. Flores doesn't want to offend anyone, so he keeps it friendly, shakes hands, and then heads for the sink in the restroom for a wash. "I might do that 20 or 30 times a night. My Friday gig in Chula Vista has the acoustic piano in the center of the room, so I wear my mask when I'm talking to the people." In general, he tries to balance caution with good sense and optimism.

Flores came to the U.S. (and San Diego) in 2004. One of the main goals he was able to accomplish during the pandemic, in March 2021, was becoming a U.S. citizen. It's easy to hear the emotion in his voice when he talks about the process. "It's a very good feeling. I am so proud to become an American citizen. I love this country. I'm very conscious to be a law-abiding citizen, so I can be a part of this beautiful society. I have a lot of respect for this country and this

emony, but this was right in the middle of the pandemic, so that was impossible. It's not the same ceremony as it was before covid; you couldn't invite people. It was very controlled with a small group of applicants, like maybe 20 people who were socially distanced. It wasn't in the same building as before. All in all, it was a very short ceremony. I went in at 7:30 in the morning and was finished by 8:00. But even though there were a lot of changes, it was still a very big deal to me. It was a serious occasion, something you dress up for. In the end, you get the certificate and the paperwork, and now you are a citizen."

The general public can shake hands with Flores at several recurring gigs throughout the city. Since last May, he's been working Friday evenings at the Brew Bar in Chula Vista. Thursday nights, he does a solo gig at the Alcove Wine & Beer

LOS SAINTS

Founded in Chula Vista, rock trio Los Saints features first-generation Mexican-Americans, including frontman Angel Mariscal, guitarist Gianluca Exposito, and drummer Emiliano Garcia. Their debut singles "I'm In Need" and "As Bad As the First" were followed by a 2021 EP, recorded over three days in an L.A. studio with Dear Boy drummer Keith Harrison. Music videos for "Let It Out" and "It's Easier When You Jump" were shot in Chula Vista. A single was also released for "A17." The trio recently signed to Enci Records (the label known for The Joy Formidable and Fences), which will release their new single on February 18 for "Fouund You Somewhere," recorded in Los Angeles by another Dear Boy member, Keith Cooper. According to Los Saints frontman Angel Mariscal, "'Fouund You Somewhere' was written at the end of my first serious relationship. It's about yearning for something that you lost and holding on to what could have been, if things were done differently." Mariscal also directed a video for the song, which he says features him leading the rest of the band on "a wild-eyed odyssey to the heart of the city in search of someone, or something." The single is from their upcoming five-Song EP Welcome To Confusion. They'll play Oceanside's Pour House on February 26.

NASHVILLE RAMBLERS

Cult band Nashville Ramblers - led by Carl Rusk (guitar) with Tom Ward (bass) and Ron Silva (drums) – released their famous single "The Trains" in 1986. The tune is now considered a power-pop classic, thanks in part to being included on the multi-volume *Children of Nuggets* box set from Rhino Records. The individual trio members also spent time playing with other noted local garage bands such as the Crawdaddys, the Gravedigger Five, and Mystery Machine. "In 1986, 'Trains' and one other Ramblers song appeared on an obscure UK-only compilation, but few people noticed," says Mike Stax, whose local Ugly Things Records released the tune on vinyl a quarter century later. The Nashville Ramblers played a 2002 reunion show with The Gants at Maxwell's in Hoboken, New Jersey, where they also appeared in 2010. There was also an April 2014 reunion set at the Casbah, and they reunited again at Til Two in May 2015. A January 2017 private party gig in Hollywood found once and future Monkee Micky Dolenz performing with the group. They'll reconvene again at the Casbah on February 18, as part of the two-day Che Underground Midwinter Masque, for a Friday night bill that includes The Nephews and a coalition of local talent called The Wrecktangle, featuring Ray Brandes, Cindy Lee Berryhill, Dave Doyle, Joel Kmak, and Kevin Ring.



SIX STRING SOCIETY

Kenneth Rexrode's project Six String Society is an all-star guitar group with a rotating roster of guest guitarists that has included Gregory Page, Peter Sprague, Leonard Patton, Buzz Campbell, Dennis Caplinger, Billy Watson, Ben Powell, David Maldonado, Nathan James, Jim Soldi, Jimmy Patton, Enrique Platas, Greg Douglass, Casey Hensley, Laura Chavez, Evan Caleb Yearsley, Tim Foley, Patric Petrie, Jonny Viau, Anthony Cullins, and others. In 2016, the band helped launch the recurring Funk Soul Social at the Holding Company in Ocean Beach. In 2017, Bryan Barbarin began performing with local steampunk cult icons Steam Powered Giraffe, joining the costumed robot band as a new character named Zero. The Routine appears at the Music Box in Little Italy on Friday, February 11, for a bill that includes Fresh Veggies Micro Brass.


Tender is the bite

uesday, 4 pm. Sixth Avenue is not exactly busy. The Hustler Hollywood store has a couple of old geezers staring at open

bras on plastic models. I came here thinking more about my stomach. Hmm. Brian's 24 Grill in the Ramada across the street is a possible. I mean, hey: sex and stomach! After all, the imprint of once-famous Joan Crawford's heels still dents the mahogany bar where she danced in her stilettos...

On t'other hand, there's this bright red sign above a restaurant on this side. 'Course, it looks way too expensive;

classy, too. A "cowgirl" 16-ounce ribeye will set you back \$92. A dry-aged Delmonico 14-ounce goes for \$104. A Wagyu A5 filet goes by weight: \$44 per ounce. So a 7-ounce would

be, man, \$308. Don't even think about a 14-ounce. Besides steaks, a maple-rubbed salmon, say, is \$48; rack of lamb, \$62; a dozen oysters, \$54. Six-ounce filet and a lobster tail, \$79. Sweat's busting out on my brow. I try to stay cool.

Shoulda had that \$7.99 take-out burger. Luis the waiter fetches me a HH menu. It's small, but not mean. It's divided into \$3, \$6, and

\$9 plates. Now we're talking! For \$3, you get an oyster on the half-shell, or tater tots, or hummus and veggies. Six dollars gets you,

like, "Lil' Brg and truffle fries." Translation: small burger. Or a "giant Wagyu meatball," or ooh, short rib croquettes and mustard cream, or a "Green Goddess salmon slider." And for the princely price of \$9, how about a plate of beef tartare or a tuna tartare taco, or popcorn chicken, or crispy calamari, or jalapeño pickled shrimp cocktail, or, hey, a filet "lollipop" mini-steak and truffle fries? Think I'll go for that one, because at least you

it's STK. I have heard of this. One of a raft of top-dollar steak places like

Two giant Wagyu meatballs cooked in iron skillet beers at \$9.1 guess in

Morton's, Animae, Del Frisco's that have come to town. Has DJs and a kind of lounge feel, from what I hear. So I shouldn't, but I take a look in. I mean, it's new, it's really sleek, its staff looks *muy soigné*. Besides, I'd heard that they had a 7-ounce Wagyu burger with chips, \$7.99. OK, for takeout only. But still, pretty good price for a classy place. This gives me hope. On the *other* hand, a bunch of people cluster around outside, talking about "happy hour." Hmm. More fun to eat inside than carry a cooling *boiger* all the way home on the trolley.

And the timing's perfect. It's everybody's happy hour, the time when bargains are starting to fly all around the Gaslamp. I follow this group in. Business IT types. Inside's kinda effortlessly classy. Purple and black. Lounge settees upstairs. Black walls, purple-lit flowers, gals wearing loosely tied purple silk ties. But the prices are effortlessly know you've got a bit of meat. And, for sure, tender. They have HH beers at \$9. I guess in this atmosphere. we

should be grateful, because, look down the list: Wine by the glass goes for \$14 on up. By the bottle? They top out around \$600. So I get a glass of Justin Cabernet. Costs \$9. I think about a bottle of beer, but wine's easier to stretch than beer.

Food-wise, in some ways, the best is the cheapest and most filling HH dish on offer: my \$3 hummus and veggies! For starters, the hummus is nice and tangy. We're talking olive oil and chickpeas, basically. Then croutons, and little black, yellow, and red tomatoes huddling beneath a forest of celery and carrots. It's an honest and way-tasty dipping app.

When Luis brings the black iron pan, smokin' with my small "lollipop" steak and three large truffle fries, my choices start to look like, yes, modest, but a real meal. For \$12, together with the hummus plate, we've got ourselves a healthy, interesting main course. The meat is lush, marinated,

But it's certainly healthy protein and filling, and a generous size for a slider.

STK also has a good social vibe. My energyexploring buddy and I talk on for hours, and no staff come and try to move us out. Later, when the DJ and music thing clicks in, it'll probably be different. But that's tonight. Right now, happy hour, it's perfect. Next time if I'm passing by, a \$9 glass of wine and that excellent \$3 hummus will do me just fine. ■

Barrio Donas finds beauty in fried dough

Barrio Donas; 4714 Clairemont Mesa Blvd., Clairemont. "Chubby, round, and very pretty." That's how Google

translates gordita redondita y bien bonita, the Span- 🧲 ish words written in pink neon on the wall of Barrio Donas.

The shop's name itself translates to "neighborhood donuts," which suggests this Clairemont business might be simply another among the dozens of donut shops spread out among San Diego's various neighborhoods. But as I peruse the contents of this glass counter, it quickly becomes clear that that the donas in question actually live up to their neon description. These are some of the prettiest donuts I've ever seen.

One thing that helps this donut shop stand out is a Mexican culinary influence. That's evident in several of the donuts, and more so in a menu that features tortas ranging from chorizo and egg to carne asada (\$6-11.50), and banana leaf tamales with pork or chicken (\$4).

I try a few of the savory items, and particularly enjoy a carne asada sandwich, which

features beans, lettuce, tomato, red onions, mozzarella, and a thick chipotle salsa, on a toasted telera roll. But it's the donuts that keep attracting my gaze.

Now, I've ordered donas from Mexican bakeries (panaderias) in the past, and they've been great, though relatively boring. That is, they've been

It's fantastic, and it's not



standard donuts, glazed with chocolate, sugar, or vanilla, not any different from mainstays of conventional donut shops. In recent years, I've also noticed several shops begin serving ube-glazed donuts, following the lead of Filipino-inspired donut shops (the purple donuts were popularized by Nomad Donuts, locally).

But even Nomad falls short of the imagination at play in Barrio Donas. A few of the Mexican-inspired offerings are rather obvious: the fast-selling churro donut, for example, adopts the ridged crust of the cinnamon and sugar treat. The abuelita takes its cues from cinnamon-infused Mexican hot chocolate, and the tart jamaica donut owes its pinkish-purple glaze to the hibiscus flower that flavors the staple taco shop aqua fresca of the same name.

However, it's not merely an appreciation for Mexican flavors that makes this donut shop special. There's a creativity that goes beyond merely adapting cultural associations to the donut medium. Probably my favorite dona here is the chocolate glazed *mazapan*. Similar to the almond-based confection marzipan, the Mexican version replaces almond with peanut. Barrio Donas takes this concept and turns it into a donut with peanut butter glaze, topped by mazapan crumbles (offered with or without the chocolate drizzle).

even the most innovative donut in the case. That would be a *dona* dubbed Mi Rey, a chocolate and hazelnut donut that actually draws inspiration from the Italian confection Ferrero Rocher. The \$3.75 treat even includes a piece of the gold-foilwrapped candy, nestled in its donut hole. For starters, the donut itself is topped with a chocolate

glaze, with a hazelnut (Nutella) drizzle over the top of that. Then, one half of the donut is topped with crushed hazelnut, the other with shavings of a rich, dark chocolate. Finally, the entire thing is sprinkled with edible gold dust.

I could go on about the shop's top quality vegan donuts, about donas incorporating dolce de leche, cajeta, mango, guava, toasted coconuts, and macadamia nuts. About the bear claw stuffed with berry jam, the arroz con leche stuffed with rice pudding, or the gansito chocolate cake donut bar stuffed with both strawberry jam and vanilla cream.

But at this point, it should be clear that just about all of the \$2-4 donas here are worth trying, and then some. Also that this neighborhood donut shop is worth a drive out of your way. And as two new locations are coming soon, Old Town and National City have chubby, round, and very pretty futures ahead.

Fishing license on Mission Bay jetty?

Dock Totals 1/30 - 2/5: 599 anglers aboard 34 half-day to 1.5-day trips out of San Diego landings this past week caught 3 bluefin tuna, 11 bocaccio, 3 bonito, 199 calico bass (143 released), 1 halibut, 118 lingcod, 46 lobster (37 released), 18 perch, 1 spider crab, 1358 rockfish, 224 sand bass. 761 sculpin, 3 sheephead, 331 whitefish, and 62 yellowtail.

Saltwater: Fishing along the coast of Baja has been very good for the anglers making the trek. Whether by sportfishing boat out of one of our local landings, by local panga, or even from the beach, the bite has been on. Boats working the high spots from outside of Ensenada

and south to San Ouintin have been reporting good vellowtail action in the morning hours following first light. When that bite slows by 10 am or so, the focus shifts to the bottom, where plenty of rockfish, sheephead, and lingcod are filling the sacks for limit-style fishing.

Recent reports indicate there are still schools of bluefin tuna in an area that stretches from Camalu and Colonet to outside Cedros Island about mid-peninsula. The Tribute recently returned from a 1.5-day run fishing "the beach" along the coast near Colonet with a solid catch for their 33 anglers aboard with 130 red snapper, 76 whitefish, 60 rockfish. 53 lingcod. 3 bluefin tuna, and 2 sheephead caught. Extended half-day trips running into Mexican waters around the upper 9-Mile Bank and Coronado Islands have been catching sack limits of rockfish with a few nice lingcod, sheephead, whitefish and sculpin in the mix.

Local half-day trips are concentrating on calico and sand bass off the kelp beds off Point Loma and sand flats near Imperial Beach. Outside of the normal winter bass fishing, the Dolphin has been targeting halibut every Wednesday this month, and the Alicia and Jig Strike continue to have success on lobster during their evening hoop-netting trips.

For those fishing from shore, the CDFW has added a new page to their website that lists the locations where no state fishing license is required. The "piers and ietties rule" was relatively ambiguous, especially concerning jetties, and gave rise to a long-running debate among anglers on social media. The rule reads, "Public piers must be connected to the shoreline, allow for free, unrestricted public access, and have been built or currently function for the primary purpose of fishing. Publicly owned jetties and breakwaters may also be 'public piers,' but, in addition, must form the most seaward protective boundary of an ocean harbor. Jetties and

Wait, What?

 Clive Jones, 66, a retired teacher in Derby, England, calls himself the "world's most prolific sperm donor," having fathered 129 children, with nine currently on the way. Jones has been donating his semen for nine years through Facebook, he told DerbyshireLive, because of the "happiness it brings" to donee families. But his wife of more than 40 years isn't so pleased; they now live apart. Jones explained that he drives to a park near the donee's home and collects the sample in the back of his van (complete with window curtains), then texts them to say he'll "be round in three min-utes." England's Human Fertilisation and Embryology Authority has issued a medical warning about Jones, saying, "If arrange-ments are made outside of the clinic environment, there can be medical and legal risks."

Inappropriate

- Tourists and locals in Venice, Italy, got all judgy on Jan. 21 when a 30-year-old Czech woman stripped off her top and went for a swim near the Monument to the Partisan Woman, a bronze sculpture of a reclining woman that rests partly in and partly out of the water. After her dip, the unnamed woman climbed onto the monument and posed for pictures, CNN reported. "It's like going to Rome, leaping in the Trevi Fountain and then saying, 'What do you mean, you can't do this?" said Mario Nason, who was walking by with his son at the time. "Why do people do these things in Venice that they wouldn't do elsewhere? They probably didn't know that the statue of the woman lying there was a dead partisan. But it's treating Venice like a beach." Police banned the woman from Venice for 48 hours and fined her \$513.

Bright Ideas

- Zachary Taylor Blood, 33, of Galveston, Texas, pleaded guilty on Jan. 25 to trying to smuggle two men into the United States in a flag-draped coffin, The New York Times reported. Blood showed up at a border patrol checkpoint near Encino, Texas, on Oct. 26, where he told the agent he was hauling a "Dead guy, Navy guy" when asked about his cargo. But the agent, who was a military veteran, noticed the "rusty and dented coffin" and saw that the flag had been "crudely taped" to it. Agents explored further and found two live men, cousins, in-side the coffin. One man told agents that it had been hot and hard to breathe in the box, and he had agreed to pay \$6,000 to be smuggled to San Antonio. Blood will be sentenced on May 11 and could receive up to five years in federal prison.

- Georgetown University's William Treanor, dean of the law school, met with a Black student group on Feb. 1 to hear their complaints about an incoming lecturer, Ilya Shapiro, after he made comments about President Joe Biden's plans to replace Supreme Court Justice Stephen Breyer. National Review reported that the students wanted to discuss a "reparations" package with Treanor, which included a designated place on campus to cry. "Is there an office they can go to?" one student asked. "I don't know what it would look like, but if they want to cry, if they need to break down, where can they go?
