Parched position

Thank you for your interest in Loveland Reservoir, as indicated by the San Diego Reader's March 29 article "Anglers say promises broken at Loveland Reservoir." Sweetwater Authority was not contacted for comment on this article. Therefore, I would like to take this opportunity to correct several factual inaccuracies and provide additional context for points made within the article, as outlined below.

Loveland Reservoir provides storage for potable drinking water for Authority customers in National City, Bonita and portions of Chula Vista. The Author-

ity's Board is supportive of recreational activities at Loveland Reservoir, provided they do not interfere with the Authority's mission. Loveland Reservoir is not drought resistant.

The water source for Loveland Reservoir is rainfall and subsequent runoff. Water levels are directly affected by yearly rainfall, as well as the rate of evaporation. The statewide drought and hot conditions have had a significant impact on the water level at Loveland Reservoir.

The average yearly rainfall (from July 1 — June 30) at Loveland Reservoir, historically, is 15.17 inches. Last year's rainfall was 8.5 inches and this year's to date (since July 1, 2021) is 8.01 inches. Though additional emergency water storage is available regionally, including at San Vincente Reservoir, the most cost-effective source of water for our customers comes from Authority-owned reservoirs. The Authority conducts water



Echoes of Echo Park Local Tesla test flight follows L.A. launch

Shortly before 10 am on March 30, the unidentified driver of a white Tesla Model 3 reportedly stepped on the accelerator rather than the brake. As a result, the driver hopped a curb, then crashed through a fence behind the San Diego County Public Health Center parking lot by Ruffin Road and Greencraig Lane. The 480-horsepower electric vehicle then rolled down a slope, jumped a cement wall, and landed on top of a ambulance parked outside the Falck Ambulance Service headquarters. The front bumper rested on the roofline of the ambulance; the 18-inch front wheels spun freely seven feet above

optional SpaceX rocket thruster package to make it fly. Now, local wags have suggested that the Kearny Mesa Tesla was a kind of prototype, after it cleared what appeared to be a four-foot gap between the wall and the ambulance. But the fire department wasn't laughing. "There's an opportunity for the vehicle to fall down onto a wall behind the ambulance, and that would damage the bat-

ground. After arriving at the scene, the fire department grew concerned regarding the "stacked stone wall" supporting the 4000-pound vehicle's midsection and rear end, noting, "it's not a masonry wall, so the integrity is at risk."

From certain vantage points, the vehicle appeared as if it were hovering — sort of like the flying DeLorean image Tesla founder Elon Musk has been Tweeting for the last couple of years. Musk, who is known as the richest man in the world, has claimed the company will launch a roadster later this year with an

tery tray," said Battalion Chief Mike McBride in an *OnScene.TV* clip. "These lithium batteries cause a whole different problem once they're opened and released, and if any kind of water gets in there, it could be a serious fire hazard."

Ali, the owner of Guardian Towing Inc. by Miramar Road, was one of the first people on the scene with his tow truck. "Initially, we tried pulling the vehicle back, but they told us to halt," Ali told me on April 5. "Then they decided to deadlift the vehicle with a crane." (In the *OnScene.TV* video footage, Ali

is shown at the rear of the Tesla, assisting in the rescue.) The fire department strapped harnesses through the Tesla's four opened windows and pulled the vehicle up above the fence it had mowed over earlier that morning.

Ali knows about Teslas. Since the start of 2022, he has towed three of the electric vehicles that had gone out of range. "That means the battery goes dead," Ali said. "The driver didn't get to a charging station quick enough." (Depending on the version. a Model 3 Tesla can go anywhere from 270-350 miles on a charge, which costs about nine dollars and takes about 30 minutes at a Tesla Supercharger station.)

Other Teslas he has towed have suffered flat tires. "They don't have spare tires. And this year, I also towed four Teslas that wrecked. But no one died. They are safe vehicles; the batteries are on the bottom, and they are bottom-heavy vehicles, so they do not roll over." In this case, the San Diego Fire Department tweeted, "The driver and the two passengers were transported to a local hospital for unknown injuries."

The Kearny Mesa flying Tesla story gained online traction thanks to another launch just days earlier. On March 20, an unidentified person rented a 2018 Tesla Model S and drove it to the Echo Park neighborhood of Los Angeles. In the video posted on YouTube, Instagram, and TikTok that Sunday morning, the rogue driver of that Tesla motored at a reported "50 miles per hour" up a street that led to a hilltop. As the vehicle reached the crest, its wheels left the pavement, and the it flew for a second or so before landing on

its front bumper and wheels an estimated 50 feet from the launch point and careening into two parked vehicles and some trash bins. The four people inside, one allegedly holding a cat, disembarked from the car, jumped into another Tesla, and sped off. The driver is wanted by the L.A. Police. The YouTube video of the flight was viewed over two million times in a short period. and when news outlets uploaded the San Diego Tesla story onto

their YouTube pages, the story got algorithmically linked with the Los Angeles Tesla video.

Ron Villarin, a Paradise Hills Tesla customizer, saw the trending Teslas on the internet. "I didn't like that this guy in Los Angeles was doing it for clout," he said on April 4. "He's making us look bad." Villarin is part of Ruined Tesla, a group that adjusts the suspensions of Teslas and to make them lowriders. While a few Tesla owners like to post about their nine-second quarter-mile runs, Villarin assured me that most Tesla owners are humble and lie low. Personally, he says, "My idea is to open people's eyes so they can fix up Teslas just as nice as other cars, not destroy them."

No help offered after they were poked, pushed, and stabbed

During the early hours of March 27, inside the Green Witch bar within Tijuana's Zona Rio, two twenty-year-old students from Baja California's Autonomous University were stabbed

for refusing to dance with a man. One of the injured, Daniela, said that she was dancing with her friend when a man approached her, grabbing her around the waist and shoving his member against her body. "When I felt it, I turned around, and he laughed," she recalled. "We didn't know him; he just appeared there and touched my body. Jennifer (Daniela's girlfriend) and I asked him what was wrong with

Different blues, but still lots of green

Which flavor of Democrat will replace Lorena Gonzalez?

Much of San Diego media has been quiet on the costly Democrat-on-Democrat battle to fill the Assembly seat of departed Democrat Lorena Gonzalez, but the Sacramento-based CalMatters online nonprofit is speaking up about it. Last Tuesday's election leaves two ex-San Diego city council Democrats for the Assembly spot: Georgette Gomez, who lost her 2020 Congressional race to Qualcomm heiress Sara Jacobs; and David Alvarez, who lost a high-profile bid for mayor against Republican Kevin Faulconer in 2014.

As the April 4 CalMatters item notes, judging from big money pouring into the race, Alvarez is the choice of big business, with Gomez the favorite of big labor. "So far, the two Democrats have amassed six-digit totals in direct donations to their campaign coffers. Gómez has raised nearly \$470.000. much of which has come from her organized labor allies," reports CalMatters. "Alvarez has raised more than \$300,000, with sizable contributions from medical providers, real estate firms, oil companies and titans of the 'gig economy.' Marty Wilson, who directs the campaign operation of the California Chamber of Commerce, called the Assembly race in San Diego an 'attractive opportunity' for business interests who would love to see Gonzalez replaced with a friendlier kind of Democrat." (For longtime San Diego politics watchers, Wilson is best remembered for his years of rough-and-tumble political service on behalf of GOP ex-mayor, senator, and California governor Pete Wilson, to whom he is not related.)

The item continues. "Even more has been spent by independent expenditure groups that are not bound by state campaign contribution limits (for a legislative campaign, that's \$4,900 from individuals and \$9,700 from committees). More than \$670,000 has been spent to help Gómez or hurt Alvarez, while about \$535,000 has been spent to do the opposite." The spending is in keeping with California's poltical trend: "For at least two decades, as the state's Republican party has descended into near political irrelevance, labor and business have poured money into Democratic-leaning districts where the choice is not between Republican red and Democratic blue, but moderate periwinkle and progressive navy. Often these are the most expensive races in the state." Adds the story: "The fourth biggest spending committee in the race, and certainly the most mysterious one, is called San Diego Families **Opposing Georgette Gomez. Major funders** to the committee are neither families nor from San Diego. They include JobsPAC, one of the chamber-affiliated committees; Californians for Jobs and a Strong Economy, another business-funded committee and a regular funder of the campaigns of moderate Democrats; a self-described real estate developer in southeast Los Angeles County who has been fined twice by the state's campaign finance watchdog agency while managing the funds of committees in other southern California races; and the former mayor of West Covina."

UNDER THE RADAR

Anti-cop ice cream What's for dessert? San Diego politics, judging by a March 30 \$1800 contribution by ice cream kingpin **Ben** Cohen of Williston, Vermont, co-founder of Ben & Jerry's. The out-of-town cash went to the Sheriff's campaign of Deputy Sheriff Dave Myers. Widely known for liberal messaging, the ice cream purveyor called for defunding police in a June 19, 2020, tweet, saying, "This #Juneteenth, it's more important than ever that we dismantle the racist and ineffective model of American policing."

Then last September, Ben & Jerry's took to Twitter to announce their latest ice cream variety, called Change Is Brewing, "the flavor helping to transform the nation's approach to public safety to one that prioritizes community needs." Added the company website: "It's time to divest from systems that criminalize Black communities & invest in a vision of public safety that allows everyone to breathe free." In November of last year, Cohen and his

partner Jerry Greenfield co-authored an op-ed piece in USA Today calling out cops for their treatment of African-Americans. "When we were growing up, our mothers taught us the policeman was our friend. Black mothers have no choice but to teach their children to fear the police," says the piece. "If we choose to use it, we white people have the power to hold rogue cops accountable and create a society where Black mothers can also teach their children that the policeman is their friend." Ben and Jerry also co-chair the Campaign to End Qualified Immunity. According to Cornell Law, "Qualified immunity protects a government official from lawsuits alleging that the official violated a plaintiff's rights, only allowing

suits where officials violated a 'clearly established' statutory or constitutional right." Meanwhile, resigned Sheriff Bill Gore's pick to succeed him, Undersheriff Kelly Martinez, got \$1800 from Qualcomm Senior Vice President Asma Javaid of Rancho Santa Fe on April 3, according to the Martinez campaign disclosure filing. (Other public records show Omar Javaid has the Qualcomm role.)

Real estate and towing Nash

Habib, listed on a disclosure report as the owner of Alexandria Investments, has given \$1800 to the Assessor/Recorder campaign of assistant assessor Jordan Marks, who is running against ex-San Diego city council Democrat Barbara Bry. Habib, who made his contribution on March 31, per the county filing, has faced past controversy regarding his towing operation Angelo's. "Nashwan Habib, or as his friends call him, Nash, is the proud founder and owner of Angelo's Towing,

which has served the greater San Diego, California area for over 17 years," says his website. "Hard work and Habib's willingness to fight have fueled his rise," noted a November 10, 2015, Voice of San Diego expose. "So has the inattention of local governments, which have responded to his repeated misstatements, evasions, and overdue bills by awarding him lucrative contracts." Other donors to the Marks cause include developer Jeremy Dentt, with \$1500. "With over 85 years of cumulative experience in the real estate

> industry, our team symbolizes performance and hard work in every aspect of the commercial real estate market," says Dentt's company website. Kathy Bongiovanni, secretary at Seal Electric, and Frank Bongiovanni, retired, also gave \$1500. UCSD student Cybill Hellerud of Rancho Santa Fe is down for \$1800. Michelle Hellerud runs San Diego Realty Gals, a real estate brokerage. "I am very active at the Real Estate Board and I am

currently serving the San Diego Association of Realtors on their Board of Directors. I also serve on several committees including the Housing Opportunities Committee, the Government Affairs Committee, the Realtor Political Action Committee, and several others," the elder Hellerud says on her firm's website.

Good hair day The 2022 reelection fund of San Diego Democrat Lorena Gonzalez, who quit her Assembly seat at the beginning of the year, came up with \$1400 for the Cindy Chavez for Mayor committee on April 4, filings show. Santa Clara County Supervisor Chavez is running for mayor of San Jose. She's facing off against

> San Jose Councilmember Raul Peralez, another longtime labor union favorite who claimed last week that Chavez had told him to stay out of the race, per what Peralez told San Iose Spotlight as related in an April 1 online dispatch. "She told me she was being encouraged to run by labor advocates who felt as though she was a stronger ally and candidate for them than I was. She said, 'You have a couple things going for you: you're handsome, and you

have a nice head of hair." Adds the account: "Many insiders are watching this matchup closely because it could be the local labor lobby's first opportunity in 16 years to send a candidate to the mayor's office. The last labor-friendly mayor in San Jose was Ron Gonzales, who termed out in 2006."



him, and we managed to make him leave and went towards the bathroom."

But when they were about to walk out of the bar, the man came out of the bathroom with another man. That other man was initiated the physical aggression. "He came right towards me and pushed me," said Daniela, "then the other guy pushed me back from behind. My friend reacted and punched him. Then both men started to threaten us: 'We'll kill you.' The man got into a fighting position and dared us to fight back. My reaction was to hug my friend, trying to separate her from this man. That moment is when I got stabbed, but I didn't feel it right away. If I hadn't done that, she would be probably dead." Both women ended up with wounds 1.5 inches deep and 3 inches long - Daniela on her backside and waist and Jennifer in the stomach.

According to Daniela, people began to pay attention to the fight, so the man fled from the bar with his partner. She followed them to the exit to memorize their faces, and when she came back, she saw her friend was bleeding. Workers at the bar who had not intervened in the affair to calm things down now took Daniela and Jennifer out of the bar. "When we were outside, my view blurred up. I felt like fainting and I fell on my face. People who watched me screamed; they probably thought me dead since I was soaked with blood. The workers saw us on the ground and closed all entrances so no one could see us. None of the staff helped us out."

Daniela didn't lose consciousness and made her way back to the bar to get their belongings back. Daniela called the emergency services, but no one responded; it wasn't until people around them called an ambulance that they received medical attention. The next day, the bar's management called a press conference, which was then canceled, and instead a press release was issued. In it, the management stated: "We offer all our support, even economically to take care of the victims' medical expenses (...) That day, the Green Witch Bar staff acted with strict adherence to the established internal regulations, providing assistance to the injured women." But according to Daniela, they never provided real assistance. "After I came out with our belongings, a waiter came to us, but it was to keep us away from the bar so no one could see us." Both injured women stated that they haven't received even a phone call from the management.

The Baja California Prosecutor's Office has opened an investigation, and the case has gotten support of the state's governor Maria del Pilar. For now, Daniela and Jennifer are dealing with the injuries even as they raise their voices in support of women who have had to go through something similar.

Pinniped protection plan passes

No more dog days, but a long sea lion season

It's illegal to harass sea lions, but posted warning signs haven't stopped La Jolla beach-goers from petting and feeding them. And the troubles ramp up during pupping season, when the animals spend more time on the beaches and bluffs. Now, after a long fight that has pitted beach-users and business interests against sea

commission that there were fewer incidents during the emergency shutdown. That led to the city's application with the commission for an annual closure of Point La Jolla from May 25 to September 15.

The city's proposal had its critics, even among the advocates who brought the problem to their attention. Sierra Club San Diego Chapter and the Sierra Club Seal Society consider the closure dates too short and the boundaries too small. For its part, The La Jolla Community Planning Association asked the commission to

will be used to create a path from the top of the bluff to Boomer Beach to allow for ocean use such as swimming and spearfishing. Outside the boundary, wildlife and water views can still be had from the sidewalk and grassy areas. As sea lion advocates have requested, one to two city park rangers will monitor the area year-round during peak hours. And for the first time ever, dogs will be prohibited at Point La Jolla year-round.

The commission made several recommendations for revisions in order to approve the project. For one, the closure period needed to be longer at both ends, starting May 1 and lasting through October 31st "to capture the full extent of the sea lion mating and pupping season." According to

the commission's ecologist, this will give the pups needed time to bond with their mothers and learn to swim, and help shield the public from aggressive animals during mating season. Another condition required the city to submit a final signage plan that included posting signs even outside the closure period. The city must also submit a monitoring plan that measures the level of use by sea lions of the haul-out site, and assesses the effect on halting harassment. And worries about what happens when the restrictions are lifted each year led the commission to require the city to submit a long-term management plan for Point La Jolla by November 1, 2022. It must contain strategies to reduce harassment outside of pupping season, and at the same time maximize public access.

It's possible that the sea lions could naturally migrate to another site, making the ongoing closure unnecessary, the commission said. But it's also possible that allowing ocean access at Boomer Beach will undermine the whole plan. So the commission wants to limit the permit to seven years, which coincides with the end of their approvals for a similar seasonal closure to protect harbor seals at nearby Children's Pool. That will let the city and the commission "holistically review the issue of marine mammal management in La Jolla."

lion advocates, plans to close Point La Jolla each year during pupping season — which typically lasts from May through October — are nearing completion. On Friday, April 8, the California Coastal Commission held a hearing and approved an application by San Diego Parks and Recreation to close beach access to Point La Jolla — an area between Boomer Beach and La Jolla Cove — for part of each year.

While the sea lion population has been steadily growing throughout California, no area has seen as many human-animal conflicts as La Jolla. Last spring and summer, the commission received more complaints than ever about people bothering the animals. Reports included the death of one sea lion pup and several reports of injury to sea lions from visitor harassment, both accidental and malicious. In August, the volume of complaints, which had begun in 2014, prompted the city to issue a five-week emergency closure of Point La Jolla. Signs were posted, a wooden stairway to the beach was closed, and park rangers kept watch. According to San Diego Coastkeeper, despite the temporary closure of the rookery, over 300 visitors were observed by volunteer docents last summer illegally touching, petting, and picking up pups — and taking selfies. However, the docents also informed the

exclude Boomer Beach, where sea lion advocates say over 40 percent of pups were born in 2021. And La Jolla Parks and Beaches wanted a lengthy environmental review to get the city beyond decisions "based on reactions to those groups that make the most noise."

Under the city's proposal, signs will be posted as they were during the emergency closure, and a chain will block the wooden stairs at the border of Point La Jolla and La Jolla Cove. According to the application, water recreation will be provided at Boomer Beach, marked by a "Water Access Only" sign. K-rails

Kid rock

"I'm really just a rock and roll girl," says Teresa Gunn. "But this has made me a poet of the streets."

"This" is Gunn's program of arts for young mothers at the margins of San Diego's education system.

"These are girls with dreams. I'll read you something. This girl: listen to what she wrote: 'My name is Destiny Wright. My dream is to be a writer. I love to write, because life is

really hard, and I have lost people, and lost myself. When I have a pen, I can feel, I can cry, I can be happy, I can be sad, I can be safe, I can feel, I can tell you I am broken, I can tell you life is sad. But I will be OK. You will be OK. And we will be OK."

"This is what I get to be involved with," Gunn says. "These girls are among the first high school graduates in their families, and they are the first college attendees in their family. Most — all? — are children and have children, but they have a daycare at the school, and there's early childhood education, so their children are learning right along with their mommies. The school they go to, Lindsay Community School, was specifically developed for these young mothers. It's an all-girl school."

Gunn, a singer-songwriter who is famous for her monologue rock and roll drama, "Trailer Park Queen," found herself suddenly on her own as a performer when her label, Lobe Candy, went out of business. "But then I got a call from a woman. She said 'Would you donate twelve weeks of your time at this homeless school? Because we have students who are just shy of three credits to get their high school diploma. And if you would donate

a semester [to teaching singer-songwriting], we could count it as a fine arts course, and they could receive their high school diplomas."

"I said 'Look, I'm just a rock and roll queen. But what I'll do is I will guide the students to research, write, produce and perform an original spoken-word concert, because spoken word is the simplest form of songwriting.' And I said, 'It would be based on their experience, as children who have been homeless, but still gotten themselves into school, and now are graduating

from high school. And whoever among them shows up for the concert [to perform their piece onstage], they get their final grade.' And she goes, 'Done.'"

Gunn says, "I'm not a professor. I'm a recovering alcoholic. I have been 28 years sober. So I constructed a curric-

ulum on the basis of the AA 12-step program, because I was familiar with that. Instead of twelve-step recovery, I made it, 'Twelve steps to succeed in life through the arts."

The result? At the end of the course, "every single student shows up, reads her monologue, and the audience goes crazy! They rushed the stage, they were hugging and kissing the students. It's just been an amazing success. And the then-President of City College Terry Bridges heard our story and said, 'Yes, we want you here at City, and we're going to put you in the Alcohol and Other Drugs Studies Department, and we're going to call you Arts Education As Primary Prevention.' And it has become a college course!"

But is she worried about cars? "I'm not super concerned about cars. I have gotten cut off pretty good a few times and I've had to throw my skateboard to save myself, but I've never gotten hit yet. I also like to scare people while they're driving, keep them alive. I get

sons for haunting Coronado are more, well, pedestrian. "In the summer it's really hard to park in Coronado, so since I had to walk 15 minutes every day to work and back to my car, I got a skateboard to make my life a little easier. If I don't get exercise in the morning, then I'm extremely clumsy, and I drop things all day, and I don't want to cut myself with my super-sharp sushi knife. UNREAL **E**STATE

Two hundred years ago, California, along with the bulk of what would become the American Southwest, was claimed by Mexico. The newlyminted country, having just gained independence from Spain, found itself with a problem: much of its land mass was a sprawling wilderness, populated and controlled not by descendants of European blood, but by natives not much interested in the Old World ideals of conquest and empire.

In order to establish con-

trol over its territory, Mexico began granting ranchos, or parcels about 14 miles square, to its citizens and other Europeans willing to be naturalized. Unlike the lifetime land grants the Spanish had gifted to

soldiers to encourage them to remain behind after their fighting in the wars for territory, these ranchos remained the property of the grantees' families in perpetuity, even after the death of the original recipient. Between 1833 and 1846, Mexico created about 270 ranchos in California alone. The boundaries of these original land grants were largely honored when the U.S. claimed the territory, and in some instances

they helped shape development in ways that can still be recognized today. The suburbs of Rancho San Diego and Rancho Bernardo largely hew to the boundaries established over a century ago.

Rancho San Felipe was another such parcel in San Diego, one of the last to be assigned by then-governor Pio Pico in 1846. Originally composed of just under 10,000 acres in the Laguna Mountains somewhat north and east of where the mining town of Julian would eventually spring up, it was an important stop in the 1850s for emigrants arriving from the east, a place where they could rest and recover from the arduous trek across the desert before continuing on to San Diego or Los Angeles. Later, it was a major station along the Butterfield Overland Mail

stage route, where coach drivers delivering mail and packages cross-country in the days before railroads could make repairs or swap horses in order to continue their journeys. It also held a major storehouse for grain and hay to supply the remote desert outposts along the route.

Today, nearly 1150 acres of the rancho remains intact, making it one of the largest privately-held pieces of land in the county. And since this is a column about expensive real estate, you would not be wrong in assuming we're going to end our history lesson here and go look at some houses.

There are actually two listings for the property, variously described as 25550 San Felipe Road or 26068 San Felipe. Listing agents Angela Acosta

Well worth the price of admission

It is a truth universally acknowledged, that a music writer isn't going to get rich plying his trade, but at least he'll get free stuff: albums, concert tickets, swag, perhaps even the occasional backstage pass. For this year's music issue, we asked our writers what they'd be willing to pay for, their exalted status as scribblers notwithstanding.

It's not a fashion statement

When I'm going to a show and there's a band I'm not familiar with, I don't ever look them up or listen to them in advance, because there's no better introduction than a live set. And while my first encounter with Some Kind Of Nightmare didn't make me forget about headliners T.S.O.L., they had enough of an impact that I not only stopped checking the clock to see when Jack Grisham and the boys would be hitting the stage, I was also one of the first to line up at the Nightmare merch booth to buy their then-current CD Driven Red and a T-shirt. The CD did not leave my disc player for six months, and the Tshirt immediately lost its sleeves so I could wear it without arm prisons.

That was pre-pandemic. During the shutdown Some Kind Of Nightmare, became one of those bands that haunted me when it felt like live

shows might become a thing of the past — or at least not part of the foreseeable future. I started to remonstrate with myself: how many times had I had the opportunity to see them and decided. for whatever reason, to let it pass? Would I ever have the chance again? Between people dropping from covid, venues closing, and the passage of time that often results in bands just stopping, our future was uncertain.

I'm beyond happy to report that they continued doing what they were doing, albeit sometimes virtually. So when they next play San Diego in May, I'll be there, and I will be paying.

Yeah, I know, music writers get floated a lot of freebies. But I would never ask, never mind assume. I don't do it with major label bands, and I sure as hell won't do it with local bands that are living hand-tomouth on self-financed tours. And when I go to

shows, I don't mention that I'm a writer. It's not really pertinent to the experience or the conversations that happen there, and I don't want it to be. Maybe it's because I've been on the receiving end of those expectations when people have asked me to write something for free. Maybe it's because nothing shows support like cold hard cash or the digital equivalent. Maybe it's because of my punk rock disdain for entitled dickheads who start feeling powerful just because they can string a few words together or are "in" with someone. I say it throws the balance off; the relationship between band and journalist goes from symbiotic to parasitic.

I think of paying my own way as putting my money where my mouth is. The music industry has figured out ways to screw bands even harder via streaming platforms than it did with physical album sales. So I buy the digital album or CD directly from the band whenever possible. And when I buy a T-shirt at a show, that's my ultimate endorsement. It's not a fashion statement. Anyone who meets me knows I don't have the ability or the desire to make one. It means that I dig the band on my shirt, and will happily talk your ear off about them.

the ways. Because you pay only two bucks up front, and two bucks (plus the same again for each drink special) proves a cheap token to any given rodeo. Because I believe in karaoke like Bonasera in The Godfather believed in America: it's a landscape, a space where the host and guests join throats to create freedom in the form of a communal vortex. Because I once knew a "real" fake Frank Sinatra during my merry karaoke roamings in the '90s, a man with a monk's cap haircut and a cheap suit hanging one size too big off his skinny shoulders. His Frank flights lacked fancy, didn't follow that bouncing ball at all. But you gave him space. After all, he was Frank, or some sample size of Frank.

Getting back to Jose, though: this guy eschews suits in favor of some '70s finery, eyegouging ice cream hues you could've caught on Up With People were you white, or the Fifth Dimension (don't laugh, they got down with the authentic Sinatra) if you owned a TV. He waxes loud, rude, crude, crass, insistent, and persuasive, embodying the worst in that too-friendly devil in your ear, the one wellmet down the local pub, or out on a lawn for a neighborhood rager. Such fetid roots gave us Tony Clifton and Andrew Dice Clay. (Excepting, of course, that you're supposed to dig how Andy Kaufman eventually took off the Tony Clifton persona and hung him up in the closet, whereas the Diceman keeps up the stink 24/7.

Who is Jose/Richardson in his off hours? We know he used to run

midnight movies out of the old Guild Theatre; insomniac mindbending no doubt multicolored his mind. We know he saves his own shekels so that OB-oke hits hard in the hood, employing and enjoying stage fog, a full array of stage lights, and that mighty signifier, the disco ball. We know he lovingly tends his private obsession with Wayne Newton, pondering how such a freaky creature can be born, mature, and grow finally to dominance in the murky I-can't-believe-it's-notcamp culture of lounge music, which begat karaoke culture — in America, anyway. Because of the lounge, even before you could grab the mic and take matters into your own mouth, you could hide away in the dark and behold your dreams, or what were

supposed to be your

dreams, coming alive. Our man here comes out of that same dark.

And this Sinatra — like Newton, like Clay, like that guy in the cheap suit — proves a creature adapted perfectly to this environment. Bill Richardson the man has ideas about music and creative stuff and life in the light. But that's all gone the moment the fog machine fooms into life and Jose takes the stage. He puffs himself up. He takes down easy targets. He mock-bows to the regulars and he marshals the newbies, at least the ones not shitscared to death of his whole essence.

And, of course, there's the crux of the mission: throwing in dirty lyrics every chance he gets. And if he doesn't get a chance, he'll make one. And he'll make you do the same. Any given song is only a series of cartoon word balloons waiting for you to make with eraser, then pen. You have the chance to crack people up, including yourself. And maybe, just maybe, you're good enough to subvert, so that somebody pays deep attention. That's freedom. Or some sample size of freedom.

Unlikely to land a product endorsement deal

Jordan Krimston recorded his debut LP, *Bush-whacking*, on the eve of the covid-19 pandemic: February 2020. It was released on digital platforms one year later. Songs such as the relentlessly catchy "Betty" showcase pop smarts delivered with just enough experimentalism to make a lasting impression. But it might be the little flourishes of math-rock sprin-

kled all over *Bushwhacking* that give it a truly unique feel. The nine songs breeze by the first time you hear the record, but repeated listens reveal the little audio oddities that make it so special. The album is a nominee for Best Local Recording at this year's San Diego Music Awards, so it's comforting to know that others are taking notice.

If streaming or owning a digital copy of Bushwhacking just doesn't feel like enough, and the need for a physical artifact containing these nine songs tugs at the frayed edges of your soul on a daily basis, well then, the good folks at Portland, Oregon's Oranj Discs have come to your rescue. They recently released a CD version of the album in the long-revered "digipack" format, a packaging concept that eliminated the unsightly

cracked plastic jewel cases from the massive CD collections found in the coolest dorm rooms of the '90s. The Bushwhacking CD is only seven bucks on Bandcamp, so snag one quick, because only 100 were produced.

Speaking of CDs: I think I was transitioning from buying tapes to discs around the time I first heard Rocket from the Crypt. 

Castellanos' La Puerta guest Joshua White has been my favorite pianist, bar none. And in my opinion, he's been the biggest music story in our town by a long shot. This year, the groundbreaking performer and composer has secured an important milestone in the form of a grant from the Shifting Foundation (reportedly in the mid five-figures) which will allow him to produce three new albums for Orenda Records, run by Los Angeles trumpeter Dan Rosenberg.

That's joyous news, even if, for San Diego jazz fans, it comes with a bittersweet caveat: Mr. White is now officially an ex-San Diegan, having moved recently to set up shop 94 miles north in Long Beach. The first of White's three documents will feature the pianist with UC San Diego professor and trumpet virtuoso Stephanie Richards alongside L.A. associates drummer Mark Ferber, bassist Karl McComas-Reichl, and saxophonist Josh Johnson. I will remember fondly the times when it was possible to catch Mr. White three or four times a week here in San Diego. I recently heard him on a new Mark Dresser album, recorded live at the Angel City Jazz Festival, and I was blown away by the exponential progress he has made artistically since the pandemic. I can't wait to hear what he does next.

An unlikely transformation

The sixth studio album from costumed rockers Steam Powered Giraffe, 1896, should have been their Sgt. Pepper, or at least their Rubber Soul. Its title references the supposed year of their characters' robotic creation by the fictional Colonel P. A. Walter I. The first single "Hot On the Trail" came with a theatrical mimed video, while "Bad Days on the Horizon" is a sincere cowboy crooner (SPG member "The Spine" often breaks into cowpoke mode). for "Olly & the Equinox Band" features a Saturday morning cartoonstyle alter-ego version of the group.

Of particular note: their acoustic rendition of "Hot On the Trail" received a jaw-dropping video treatment of its own. Already one of the strongest gospel-tinged tunes they've ever recorded, the acoustic arrangement showcases David Michael Bennett's vocal chops right from the plaintive opening line, commanding attention and demanding an instant replay as soon as the final note fades. It's that good. I'm not even sure THEY know just how good it is. It's the kind of evergreen that could both make and define this band, possibly introducing and endearing them to the same supportive audience that favors likeminded

theatrical rockers such as Lana Del Rey (who they recently covered with a video version of "Summertime Sadness"), Queen, Gogol Bordello, and Evanescence.

There's essentially a whole separate album

of acoustic 1896 arrangements, all of them individualized so the strength of the songwriting, paired with the shimmering vocal harmonies, shines forth. It isn't so much unplugging as it is upgrading.

Steam Powered Giraffe basically started out as performance artists portraying musical steampunk robots who almost accidentally evolved into a real band, *a la* Oingo Boingo, the Monkees, and Spinal Tap. But as

unlikely as that transformation has been, they're currently at their songwriting and performing peak. They've been posting their elaborate new videos online, as well as sharing footage of themselves rehearsing with no costumes or makeup. Seeing the robots truly "unplugged" makes it even more clear that the trio really is ready for prime time. It may even be time to go Kiss Unmasked, and maybe put out an album and some videos sans the robot gear; some people will never be able to take a band seriously when its members insist on melding their act with an old episode of the Shields and Yarnell variety show.

It's not like Steam Powered Giraffe's already established fan base (which is huge enough to earn them millions of YouTube views) would drop them if they put away the robotics. Change is part and parcel of SPG fandom. Bunny/Rabbit shared her gender transition from Chris to Isabella online with fans, and with anyone else who might have been interested, through every step of the process. If their fans can roll with changes like that, they're not gonna bail over a costume change. It is simply too good a band to keep hiding behind masks that could dissuade people from taking the time to discover what lies beneath. Besides, they could always adopt another makeup maneuver from the Kiss playbook, and wait to don the costumes again when the demand is great enough for a big full-costume "reunion" (and later "farewell") tour.

Ta-ta to tuning's tribulations Composer Joe Garrison hit a milestone birthday last year, right in the midst of the pandemic, and decided, at long last, that he was sick of music. Or at least, with the

piano tuning aspect of it. Garrison has made his living tuning and servicing the anachronistic behemoth for decades, but he isn't looking back on it fondly. "I hate pianos," says Garrison. "I never want to see one again. I was trying to remember the sequence the other day, and I couldn't do it. And I was glad I couldn't do it." Garrison does remember his last instrument. however: "It was the piano in Mark Dresser's office at UCSD, on June 30th, 2021."

Garrison has had a steady gig at the University for years. "When you are young, you think you're gonna live forever, but when I turned 70, it got real all of a sudden. The pressure of tuning an instrument for a famous artist is incredible. I did a lot of concerts, man, and the piano has got to stay in tune. That's terrifying. That's what the public doesn't understand. If Ahmad Jamal hits a unison that's out of tune, that's a crisis, that's a disaster. You could lose your job over one string, and there's over 200 strings!"

That kind of stress was bound to take a toll. "It really matters. That was like my religion. But I got about 19 years into it, and all of a sudden I started to have real pain in my back and shoulder. I started going to this real heavyweight massage guy, just to keep me going. It was degrading to the point where I was in constant pain all the time."

Over the years, Garrison has tuned thousands of instruments. "I was kind of on autopilot. I would tune two to four instruments a day, five to seven days a week." He worked with some of the best musicians on the planet. "I tuned for Wynton Marsalis three times, I tuned for John Legend and Ahmad Jamal, but [UCSD professor] Aleck Karis could actually make me cry."

Garrison kept odd hours at the university. "Holy shit. I was out there at three in the morning, all the time. I had five pounds of keys on me. One time, I misplaced my keys and I couldn't find them for about a week. They were going to kill me, because it was going to cost them like \$20,000 to replace them. Luckily, the stage manager found them, but they were not happy."

Now that he's retired from the physically taxing job of piano tuning, Garrison ostensibly has plenty of time to work on his composing. He's been writing charts for many years that defy easy categorization; there are heavy jazz elements, but there are also intricate, soaring modern classical components. He feels he's at a crossroads, and he's leaving it to his muse to decide what comes next. "Maybe the muse has cut me off, or maybe it's just leading me to the next step. Maybe I'm not qualified to take it, so I have to be quiet. It's like I've turned my back on everything I've done so far. I gotta up my game, man. I might not write music in this life or the next. I do

have a ton of music that never got recorded and a ton that hasn't been performed, or even rehearsed. As of now, the plan is to put the recordings up on Bandcamp under the umbrella title 'Svaha."

In closing, Garrison offers a typically Zen-like observation. "I finally got off smoking cigars after 35-40 years. Since I have no pressing ambition to be a human being in the near future, I think it might be cool to be a tobacco weevil for the



Generations in collaboration

"I've been seriously, with all heart and soul, committed to my local community for over 30 years," says drummer Wade Youman (Unwritten Law, Demasiado, North Korea), whose new band Spray Allen is an alternative rock

group with a "new psychedelic" blend of '70s to '90s influences. Founded by Youman and bassist Eric Wilson (Sublime, Long Beach Dub Allstars), the group includes two much younger singer-guitarists formerly with Late Night Episode: Daniel Lonner and Eric Sherman.

Youman credits skateboard icon Danny Way with bringing them together. "I had just finished writing and recording songs for the new Unwritten Law album, but my relationship with the band had been deteriorating, and I was living in a small rehearsal room without a band in it to practice with. So, instead of sinking further into the swamp of sadness, I said fuck this shit and went to Danny's and met Lonner and Sherman and recorded a song with them. We connected spiritually and creatively, and became fast friends." Youman brought them all to his friend Eric Wilson's house in Bonsall to work on a song, eventually titled "Left For Dead." "The next day, we packed up our band equipment and we drove out to the Mojave Desert, where we cast a circle of fire on the ground and spent the



next three days on hallucinogenic drugs, disappearing and reappearing into the sun and attending meetings with the all-encompassing *neteru* [gods of divine energy]. At the end of those three days, our new band was born."

The group spent pandemic shutdown time recording their self-titled debut at Sonic Ranch studio in El Paso, Texas with Paul Leary of the Butthole Surfers ("He came out of retirement to do it"), keyboardist and horn player Gabrial McNair (No Doubt), and bassist Stu Brooks (Dub Trio). Due July 15, the record is described as a "psyche-punk opera" with over two dozen songs.

Spray Allen's recent Escondido video shoot for their track "Stay Clean" included reality

We went through, like, 30 songs." Unwritten Law plays April 29 at Soma, a venue once located in a downtown dungeon but now operating in the Midway District. "We'll be performing a few new songs, and we'll also be playing songs off the older records too. There are a few songs that haven't been

SURE FIRE SOUL ENSEMBLE

Formed in 2012 by bandleader Tim Felten, The Sure Fire Soul Ensemble specializes in what they call "heavy cinematic soul, spiritual jazz-funk, upbeat Afro-funk, and deeply introspective rare-groove cuts." Featuring anywhere from five to eight or more players for concert performances, the group won Best Blues Album at the 2015 San Diego Music Awards and Best Recording at the 2017 SDMAs. A video is streaming online for the title track of their fourth full-length, *Step Down*, which dropped April 1. According

to the band, "Step Down is a direct reflection of the heavy times they were written and recorded in: Covid-19, two Presidential impeachment trials, the George Floyd murder, and resulting social unrest, along with a seditious attempt to subvert the democratic process at the Capitol." The album includes post-millennial pandemic-inspired song titles such as "Time To Rebuild," "High Times," "Love Age," and "In Common."



GREYBOY ALLSTARS

Funky soul rockers Greyboy Allstars debuted in 1993 at the Green Circle Bar, where DJ Greyboy was spinning records and contemplating forming a band. The current lineup features Rolling Stones tour saxophonist Karl Denson (who also plays flute), Elgin Park (guitars), Aaron Redfield (drums), Chris Stillwell (bass), and Robert Walter (keys). Their sixth studio album, Get a Job: Music from the Original Broadcast Series Soul Dream, dropped on April 1 via the band's own Knowledge Room Recordings label. A video is streaming online for the album's second

single "Got To Get Me A Job," a reinvention of Ann Alford's 1971 soul-funk hit taken from the initial 2021 *Greyboy Allstars Soul Dream* livestream series that led to the collection. The album was recorded live in the studio during the broadcasts, spotlighting ten never-released covers that they've been honing over three decades of live performances without ever having recorded, including songs by Gil Scott-Heron, Gene Ammons, The Beatles, Gary Bartz, and Burt Bacharach.



TAMAR BERK

The new release from rising singer-songwriter Tamar Berk, "Tragic Endings," is the second single off her upcoming sophomore album *Start at the End*, due April 22. The accompanying video features Berk performing the song outdoors on a rooftop, along with footage of her riding an oceanfront rollercoaster. Her earlier single "Your Permission" comes with two different videos, one a full production with her playing the song on piano as ghostly figures of herself display various personality types, while the lyric video unfolds a similar morphing presentation, confined to a closeup of her multitude of character faces. Tamar Berk

appears at Humphreys on Tuesday, April 19, at the San Diego Music Awards (her debut *The Restless Dreams of Youth* is nominated for Best Pop Album and Album of the Year). The bill includes fellow nominees Mrs. Henry (also competing for Album of the Year, along with Best Rock Album and Best Video), Thee Sacred Souls and the Sully Band (both up for Best R&B, Funk or Soul Song), Slack Key Ohana (vying for Best New Artist and Best World Music Album), Riston Diggs (Best Hip-Hop/Rap Album, Best Hip-Hop/Rap Artist, and Album of the Year), and the Ira Liss Big Band Jazz Machine (Best Jazz or Blues Album).



WANTED NOISE

The surf-skate punks of Wanted Noise have a new video for their track "Get After It." The tune comes from their recent 13-song full-length, *Next Generation*, produced and recorded by Defiant Robot Records owner Wade Morris. According to singer-guitarist Suri Sherman, "'Get After It' is a hype song about persistence and chasing your passions. To express that sentiment, the lyrics going into the bridge exclaim 'We know, we don't know our chances, and we're still gettin' after it.' We shot the video around Sunset Cliffs

and Pacific Beach. Our homie Jacob Frazer filmed, directed, and edited the video. Frazer filmed with various older media including Super 8 and VHS, and used experimental editing techniques to create a spontaneous MTV-style vibe for our video." Similarly old-school music videos were also recently produced for the album track "More Sunrises," featuring the band skateboarding around San Diego in search of beer, and for "Clench."



San Diego Opera: that shrinking feeling

With the final performances of Charles Gounod's Romeo et Juliette in the books, the San Diego Opera mainstage season is at an end. The season consisted of Mozart's Cosi fan Tutte and the aforementioned Romeo.

Next year's season has been announced. It will he an all Puccini affair with Gianni Schicchi/Suor Angelica and Tosca. There is also a world premiere of an opera about Frida Kahlo and Diego Rivera, It's unclear if this is a part of the mainstage season or part of the **Detour Series.**

Also unclear is the future of opera in San Diego. It will be difficult to grow an opera community with only two opera productions per year. I do not count productions of the Detour Series, such as the upcoming production of The Aging Magician at The Balboa Theatre. The proof is in the name. If we're try-

ing to get to opera, these productions are a detour. I don't know about you, but when I'm going somewhere, the last thing I'm looking for is a detour.

To reiterate the main point, two operas per year simply aren't enough to develop an audience. Looking back at the history of the San Diego Opera, we can see that the last time there were only two productions was the 1970-1971 season. In the 1980s, when Tito Capobianco ran the company from a tiny office in Balboa Park, San Diego Opera produced six operas per year. In the 1990s, lan Campbell reduced the number to five productions per year, plus a recital or a special concert such as The Great Richard Wagner Concert in the 1998-1999 season.

The 2009-2010 season saw the number reduced to four productions after the finan-

cial disaster of 2008. The number stayed at four productions until Ian Campbell "wind down the company with dianity."

San Diego Opera survived, but the number of productions went down to three. The 2019-2020 season was reduced to two productions. With the 2022-2023 announcement, that makes four years of two-production seasons.

I'm not a statistician, but it would appear that the trend since 2008 has

tried to shutter the company in 2014, claiming that there was no way to continue the company at its current level. Campbell's approach was to

> been one of reduction. In 2014, Ian Campbell was correctly villainized for how he handled the proposed shuttering of the company, but perhaps he had a crystal ball that actually revealed something.

Can SD opera get things mooving without having to make a Detour?



A clatter against the window of my second-story room in Golden Hill awoke me. Then, shouts. *What the hell?*

"Eh, Miguel."

"Miguelito."

"Barba de Chivo, levántate, cabrón."

Only Rodolfo called me *Barba del Chivo*, followed by a mischievous laugh. He thought he was clever. My beard in no way resembled a goat's. The other voice, I guessed, was Mariano's. I pulled myself up from the bed, walked



Mariano directed me to the border-crossing lanes, and as usual, it was bumper to bumper. We edged forward while the vendors on foot tried to sell us junk.

to the window and peered outside. They were down there, arms cocked to hurl another onslaught of pebbles. I lifted the window.

"Stop it, guys. *Un momentito*, *por favor*," I shouted.

Throwing debris at my window was

their only way of getting my attention from the ground. Only residents of the rooming house at 23rd


and B Streets had keys to the first-floor door and stairwell that led upstairs. There was no doorbell. I couldn't afford a phone. What could they possibly want at 9:30 am on Saturday? on B, past Jaroco Market and the Golden Hill coffee shop. Most nights, Rodolfo drove us and some other colleagues home from work in his 10-yearold, mid-'70s, faded red Bonneville. It beat taking the bus from PB and walking the rest of the way up the hill on Broadway or B from Downtown.

Once I made it downstairs, Rodolfo said he needed my help. Since

Mariano spoke some English, he filled in the gaps when I didn't understand Rodolfo's Spanish. With two days off

from work, Rodolfo had driven Mariano and another dishwasher, Danilo, down to Ensenada. Mariano and Danilo were from Ensenada, and had legal documents to cross back into the U.S., but Rodolfo did not. Why would he go down to Mexico? Not smart, I thought. Then again, the Guadalajara native was only 20. He was tired of being left behind when the other guys went to bars on this side of the border, where you were supposed to be 21 to enter.

"¿Porqué te fuiste atrás La Linea sin documentos?" I asked to the best of my limited Spanish ability. "Why would you cross the border without papers? ¿Estás loco?"

"Por supuesto, a bailer con las chiquitas. Y pistear," he said, with the characteristic Mexican flourish of the hand to indicate getting pissed - middle fingers clenched with the pinkie pointing up and the thumb down, similar to the Hawaiian gesture for "everything's cool." The night before, they had started back from Ensenada. Rodolfo dropped his the trolley to downtown San Diego. Neither one of them had driver's licenses. There was no sense in hanging with Rodolfo as he attempted to sneak across the border on foot, and if he tried to drive through the border checkpoint without a green card or work permit, he would be detained and deported and have the car confiscated. So Rodolfo left the Bonnie in a Tijuana neighborhood where he thought it would be safe. He proceeded on foot to a point along the border fence separating Baja California from the San Diego enclave of San Ysidro. I surmised he followed the same route as the year before, when he had first slipped into the U.S. At the chain-link border fence, he crawled through a hole and evaded the roving border patrolmen. Then he hid out in the chaparral — "como los conejos," he said, grinning with pride. "Rabbits" was slang for border crossers who scrambled surreptitiously through the brush to reach El Otro Lado.

Once he got to the streets of San Ysidro and the trolley, he was fairly safe from being stopped by La Migra. He didn't fit the description of the typical immigrant farmworker. Like a lot of people from the state of Jalisco, he had a fair complexion and reddish brown hair, and he was casually well-dressed. Still, it was a huge risk to cross the border, and he was lucky. Now, having just gotten back home a few hours earlier, he was asking me to go down to Tijuana and retrieve his car.

"Eso es muy loco," I protested. "No puedo hacerlo. Muy difícil. Demasiados problemas a mi. Muy peligroso. I can't do it."

Rodolfo begged with exasperation, "Porfavor, mi amigo."

Mariano jumped in.

"Oye, Miguel. No difícil. Easy. I go with you. I help you take car to La Linea. You are gringo. No problema con La Migra."

He said we would take the trolley from downtown San Diego to the border. We would cross together. He would get a cab to take us to Rodolfo's car. He would accompany me back to the border in the Bonneville, then he would hop out to go back to Ensenada. He had another couple of days off and wanted to spend it with his girlfriend.

I deliberated. I was

reluctant. But it seemed straightforward enough. I had driven back and forth across the border many times when I used to have a car. There had never been a problem. Usually, the guards simply asked what you were bringing back from Mexico. If they were satisfied you weren't hiding something to get around import restrictions, they waved you through. And Rodolfo had given me many rides home. He as well as Mariano and several of the other Mexican men who worked the kitchen at night had become amigos.

"Okay," I said, with a

sigh. "Tomorrow morning. Vámonos mañana por la mañana."

Mariano shook his head. "We go now, Miguel. Ya, I no have time. Necesito regresar a Ensenada. I gotta go back. Ándale pues. Let's go."

"I have to work tonight," I said. He assured me I would be back that afternoon. I went back upstairs to grab a jacket and some cash.

Mariano and I cut over to Broadway to head Downtown, avoiding B Street's sharp decline. We walked by the outdoor phone booth at 21st and Broadway that I used when I had to make a call. Though it was late fall, it was a typically pleasant day in San Diego: sunny with some scattered clouds and cool, but not uncomfortable in a jacket. I had to walk fast to keep up with lanky Mariano's strides. He had the build of a shortstop. If Rodolfo was like a little brother, Mariano was his cool older brother. He was in his late 20s, and he had an attitude of self-assurance. Nothing ruffled him. With his charcoal-brown Afro and café con leche complexion, he could have been mistaken for Cuban, or perhaps Veracruzano. Muy suave.

Before I started at the Firehouse, I had been basically homeless, sleeping on friends' couches. I had been studying at San Diego State, but when the semester ended, my roommates graduated and moved out of our apartment on University Avenue, east of 56th Street. I couldn't afford the rent on my own. Out of desperation to generate some cash, I took the job at the Firehouse

doing cleanup and chopping vegetables if needed. Within two weeks, I had enough to afford the \$48 weekly rent in an aging two-story Victorian in Golden Hill. The owners lived downstairs and rented out the eight rooms upstairs. The half-dozen guys I worked with at night - dishwashers and food preppers - were Mexican and spoke little English. Whether documented or not, they worked hard and sent what they could afford back home. The night workers accepted me as one of their own and helped me learn the ropes. Pablo, a cheerful man in his thirties from Sinaloa, was particularly helpful. He would teach me the Spanish words for tools, utensils and food.

Working in the kitchen, I got used to everyone calling each other "cabrón." When they started calling me "cabrón," I took it as a sign of acceptance rather than an insult. And when Pablo found out I lived in Golden Hill not far from his place, he offered to drive me home along with the other guys

who roomed along his route. He, his wife and baby daughter lived in an apartment near 25th and Broadway. But one night, Pablo did not show up for work. We never saw Pablo again. He had gone to Roberto's down at the corner for a late night snack when La Migra showed up and took him away. Shortly thereafter, Rodolfo acquired the Bonneville and assumed the role of late-night chauffeur. Often, us single guys would party after work, hitting Mexican joints like the Lucky Lady on 16th Street, La Fe on Market Street a couple blocks up from 16th, and La Posada on University in City Heights. Sometimes, Rodolfo could get past the door, sometimes not. Once, I lent him an expired driver's license to serve as a fake ID, but the bouncers were wise to it. Despite my misgivings about this expedition to rescue Rodolfo's car, I agreed to do it. It felt like I owed him something like a debt of gratitude.

Mariano and I reached Park Avenue and got on the trolley. As we bumped along through Barrio Logan, National City and Chula Vista en route to San Ysidro, I learned more about Mariano. Growing up, he had worked as a fisherman with his dad in Ensenada Bay.

"Mariano el marinero," I said to see how it sounded.

"Yo no soy marinero," he responded.

"No?"

"Soy capitán, soy capitán," he said, quoting a lyric from "La Bamba."

His mother still lived in Ensenada, but his father was dead. Speaking in a low voice, head bowed, he told me his padre had been gunned down at the border while Mariano was a teenager. His dad was trying to transport gold across La Linea and was ambushed. Mariano was vague about who did it and why. I did not pursue the subject.

We hopped off the trolley at the last stop in San Ysidro and joined the throng heading across the border. We crossed through the turnstile that separates the two countries. Uniformed Mexican sentries watched through reflective sunglasses, seemingly uninterested as we

walked by the customs house. No one stopped okay, I thou

Okay, I thought. We are driving around a sprawling, poorly organized city of at least a million people looking for a car among hundreds of thousands of cars without an address or even a street name.

Mariano was swinging his head this way and that like a periscope.

"No problema, Miguel. Rodolfo me dijo que es en una avenida grande en Colonia Independencia."

So, we were looking for a big street in a neighborhood we knew nothing about.

"¿Donde?" The driver said. "Estamos en Independencia."

"Keep going," Mariano urged.

It seemed like we had been driving around for an hour, going in circles. We drove up and down several paved streets and arrived at a fourlane boulevard divided by a median. We turned left. After a few blocks, Mariano shouted, "Esto! Esto! A la derecha." There was the red Bonneville, covered in dust, parked on the north side of the road.

Mariano paid the driver in pesos and handed me the change, saying, "Si necesitas pagar una


mordida." Bribe money in case I got pulled over. He dropped the keys into my hand. I slid into the driver's seat.

In Mexico, I had often observed that drivers preferred to make adjustments more with their gas pedals than their brakes, usually accompanied by welltimed honks. Now, I was getting a tutorial.

Mariano directed me to the border-crossing lanes, and as usual, it was bumper to bumper. We edged forward while the vendors on foot tried to sell us junk. The chicos offered chiclets, señoras waved knit tablecloths and shawls, men donning vaquero hats flashed gauche Elvis Presley paintings as they draped leather belts over their forearms.

The question caught me by surprise.

"Uhh, no. It's a friend of mine's."

He reached inside the

kiosk, grabbed a yellow plastic cone with a number on it, slapped it on the hood, and directed me to pull forward into one of the parking spaces next to a long office building for Secondary Inspection. An official came out and asked me where I had been, where I was going, and what I was doing with this car. Trying to stay calm, I explained I was doing a friend a favor by picking up his car in Tijuana and driving it home for him.

"Why?" he asked.

"He got too drunk last night and couldn't drive," I improvised. "He had to work today, so he asked me to come down here and pick it up."



the front right slot along with other important cards. It was not there. I flipped through the other cards in vain.



(who took us along on a deep dive into backcountry real estate a few years ago) and Tyler Stamets clarified that the rancho is available with or without a "retreat center" — a "converted barn with large event space and 7 guest rooms and two kitchens." The price difference is \$1.5 million, but let's assume we're going for the whole enchilada here.

"A hidden backcountry gem like no other," the Zillow ad copy opens, "Rancho San Felipe consists of over 1000 acres at the San Felipe Creek headwaters, at the base of Volcan Mountain in Warner Springs."

There is a hodgepodge of buildings on the property, including a threebedroom main residence with somewhere between 3500 and 4000 square feet of living area. Adding the guest residences and other facilities, we're going to get a total of 12 bedrooms and 17 baths spread across 8200 square feet of total space. (I'm quoting from the listing for 25550 here, because even though it's the less expensive of the two, it has more and better photos. Also, Zillow doesn't seem to have the 26068 listing, but you can find it on Redfin.)

We start with an exterior shot of what I assume is the main residence and its full stone exterior — a refreshing change from the drab beige stucco that blankets houses across the suburbs of California. Around back, there are some lounge chairs on a stone patio that overlooks a small pond — is this fed by our creek? Tyler says yes. Can we swim in it? I



feel like it would be very cold and muddy, but I still want to try. From there, we wander around the property and take in a handful of smaller cabins, also built out of stone. The two closest to the main residence have two and one bedrooms respectively, I'm told.

Finally, we're inside the main house. There's a massive living room with not one but two stone fireplaces (we also see these outside the house, and it looks like there are cubbyholes that might serve as ovens and separate fireboxes, all served by a common chimney), vaulted open-beam ceilings, and what looks like a chandelier madeof deer antlers. Immediately, we feel the old-time-mountain-cabin vibe appropriate for a construction date estimated as being between 1930 and 1935, but everything seems well-maintained, and Tyler assures me the property has been "heavily updated and lovingly restored over the years." I'll buy that.

The kitchen is spacious if not ostentatious, with a large center island that houses the range, and more wood paneling,

this time painted white to offer some contrast from the polished wood of the ceiling and cabinetry. A closer look at the living room fireplaces shows that they've got iron stove inserts, though the fireplaces in the bedrooms seem to be wood-burning.

Moving on, we see some interior and exterior shots of some of the other houses on the property. These are a bit more pedestrian, though certainly functional. The most impressive feature is a smaller living room in a house that appears to have a vaulted, irregular octagonal ceiling with a skylight.

Via email, Tyler promised me a treehouse so AMAZING that he felt the need to shout it in all caps, and I'm three-quarters of the way through the photo gallery before I get to it. Okay, he's right — this thing looks incredible. The base level seems like it's carved out of a massive tree trunk, with a wraparound deck on the second level, and above that, a bunch of windowed walls jutting out at weird angles. I want to see this place from the inside.

Okay, the inside is also good: the stain used on

the floor-to-ceiling wood is a bit lighter than in the main house, and it couples with the windows to create a bright but still cozy living space. A small desk looks out of those odd windows onto the forest from canopy level; this would make for a much more conducive writing space than my dining-room-slashoffice that looks out into the side yard where I keep my trash cans. We can see that the wraparound deck has holes carved into it for the tree this house is built against to grow up through it. Tyler guesses there's about 800 square feet of living area here, but given all of the angles inside, I understand how he'd have a hard time measuring it.

We finish up with some more pictures of the grounds and aerial shots of vast, green hills with a dirt road winding through them, which I'm guessing is how we'd access the compound. There's also a well with a large storage tank and a solar array, because I'm guessing that public utilities are hard to come by when you're the only prospective customer on an 1150-acre plot.

Public records list the current owner of Rancho San Felipe as Michael Pinto, a real estate investor based out of Laguna Beach. Judging from the tax rolls, this rancho has been owned by his family for quite a long time. The property was listed for sale for the first time in late February; it carries an asking price of either \$10 million or \$11.5 million, depending on whether the aforementioned events center is included in the deal. But if you're in for a penny, why not go in for a pound and take the whole dang thing? You'll probably be glad for the company.■







The grunion are running – but don't catch 'em yet

Grunion Runs are predicted to occur during the late evening hours (generally after 10 pm and before 1 am), following the nocturnal high tide, on April 17 and 18. The small, silvery grunion tend to spawn on wide, gently sloping beaches such as Silver Strand, Mission Beach, Pacific Beach, La Jolla Shores, and Del Mar. During the months of April and May, grunion are protected and may not be taken by fishers through any means. Open season for grunion starts in June, and from then until the end of summer the fish can be collected in reasonable numbers using the hands only (fishing license needed for persons 16 years of age and older). Trail, off Mission Gorge Road (west of Santee), is a good place to begin a stroll on trails near the riverbed. But b careful — rattlesnakes may be out and about this time of year.

Desert Agaves, or century plants, are sending up their asparagus-like flower stalks on rocky hillsides throughout much of the Anza-Borrego Desert. On warm, sunny days the stalks may grow almost one foot per day (fast enough for you to notice the sharp leaf tips at the bud actually separating from one another). After the stalk reaches a height of 10-20 feet, clusters of waxy, yellow flowers appear, ready for pollination by bees and other insects. After blooming, the fleshy, dagger-like leaves at the base of the plant die (after a life of 10 or 20 years, not a century) and the stalk, bearing a crop of seeds, dries up as well.

April's Full Moon (exactly full at 11:55 am) is called a Pink Moon. In North America, April's Pink Moon takes its name from a type of pink flower known as *Phlox subulata*—also called moss pink or moss phlox—that blooms in Spring. According to *TimeandDate. com*, other names for the April full moon include Sprouting Grass Moon, Fish Moon, Hare Moon, and Egg Moon. It is also known as the Paschal Moon because it is used to calculate the date for Easter.



Into the Woods

Musical theater legend Stephen Sondheim died last November, and director Kristianne Kurner writes that "his passing has influenced every aspect of the production" of this, one of his most famous creations (with collaborator James Lapine). The musical's first act cleverly weaves together the storylines of a number of fairy tales — Cinderella, Little Red Riding Hood, Rapunzel, Jack and the Beanstalk — by sending their characters...well, you know where. All sorts of things happen in the woods; it is, after all, the undomesticated place where desire meets experience and complications arise and adventures ensue. But these are fairy tales; part of the pleasure is knowing how they end. That's the privilege of living in an ordered world with established boundaries. Except when you go into the woods, the woods go into you. Kurner writes, "To me, the first act feels like the beginning of 2020..we all had an idea of what our lives would be like. Then COVID hit..." And so Act Two sets about hauling Act One's stories

for children into the very grown-up world of unintended consequences, moral confusion, and rampant death. It's not much fun, but the music is dazzling enough to make it entertaining all the same. You start by smiling over a husband's wayward eye, then nodding over a wife's wayward kiss, then downright enjoying a cavalcade of acrid recriminations before things get really serious. The magic of theater! Kurner: "We come out the other side still searching for hope, but it's now a bruised and battered hope." Sondheim, whose 11 o'clock number "No One is Alone" serves as both comfort and caution, might approve. The show itself is a lot, but the production works hard to keep it simple. Criss-crossing green boards overhead represent the woods; a trio of arches serve as homes for everyone but Jack and Rapunzel, who get a hovel stage right and a tower stage left. The songs do a lot to convey their own drama, but Tanner Vydos' wolf and prince and Sydney Joyner's baker's wife do a particularly fine job of acting through the lyrics. The trickiest bit is Rae Henderson-Gray's all-important witch: she's a complicated character, but her performance is complicated by the presentation, and there are times when the emotions get lost in the costuming. She comes into her own when things come apart.

Aline — A pre-credit disclaimer brings us up to speed: what follows is a fictionalized biopic inspired by the life of Céline Dion that's "been modified in keeping with the filmmaker's vision." Regrettably, writer-director-star Valérie Lemercier never makes good on her promise of a triple threat. When drained, the script contains enough obeisant sap to fill an oil tanker. (I learned more about the singer's humanness from her annual exchanges with Jerry Lewis on the MDA Telethon than anything here.) Lemercier plays Aline from girlhood - the de-aging remodel suggests a shrunken apple head carving — to the present day with but a single refreshing spin put on her subject. The Las Vegas fixture never once sets foot outside the hotel and when she does rather than pouncing on the speciality of the moment, Lemercier briefly documents it before moving on to the next round of prefabricated adulation. In the end, the show must go on. But rather than close on a personal note, her selflessness takes to song and once again hammers home the virtues of truth, justice, and the American way (by way of Canada). It's not a movie,

All the Old Knives — Not a sequel to Knives Out, thank you God, but a bracing espionage adventure that flies in direct opposition to the strains of comic book calamities and celebrity impersonations

currently curdling multiplex arteries. We open in a roomful of heavyweights — Laurence Fishburne, Jonathan Pryce, Thandiwe Newton, and Chris Pine — cast as CIA agents looking to at last put an Amen on

the events that led to a 2012 hijacking that claimed the lives of all on board. The hijackers who blamed the government were initially ignored, but signs now indicate that it was an inside job, with one of our stars playing the part of a mole. Making things even stickier, Pine and Newton were once an item: she half hoped his call was that of a peacemaker looking to see if their old spark could be rekindled, not to close a decade-old case. But what can be expected of a spy who shows up in wine country looking for a vodka martini, particularly one who fills out the secret agent turtleneck like Pine? Directed by Janus Metz (Armadillo, Borg vs. McEnroe) from a screenplay by the novel's author Olen Steinhauer, you are encouraged to abandon guessing where it ends (you won't) and concentrate on the thrilling ride. 2022. — S.M. ★★★ (I ANDMARK HILL CREST)

Ambulance — The latest overinflated stretch of chase scenes stitched together to fabricate a feature from Michael Bay runs almost an hour longer than the 80 minute Danish thriller of the same name upon which it was based. Unable to get satisfaction from the VA, war hero Will Sharp (Yahya Abdul-Mateen II) lies to his wife about receiving a much needed insurance check before joining with his detestable (and criminally handsome) adoptive brother Steve (Jake Gyllenhaal) to clear a bank of \$32 million. The robbery goes wrong, forcing the boys to kidnap a hospital wagon staffed by EMT/onewoman trauma unit, Cam Thompson (Eiza González). (Her motto is: find 'em, fix 'em, and forget 'em.) Corkscrewing sport drones distract from the action, jiggling

The celebrated actress, known for her collaborations with Kenji Mizoguchi (Sansho the Bailiff, Ugetsu, The Life of Oharu), was also the second woman in Japanese cinema to direct a feature. PacArts will screen 4 of the 6 features Tanaka signed, starting with this, her debut feature. In a performance worthy of Robert Ryan, Masayuki Mori stars as Reikichi Mayumi, a deeply disturbed veteran five years out from the war who, were it not for his brother, could not scrape by on the money he makes as a translator. A navy buddy hooks him up with a job writing mash notes on behalf of prostitutes looking to win back the sailors that abandoned them. (His letters are so poignant, his customers cry when he reads them aloud.) Mayumi holds his vendees in contempt until that day when vesterday's love (Yoshiko Kuga) becomes today's clientele. Were it not for America's puritanical code, complex emotional melodramas such as this would have cracked American screens long before the studio system crumbled. Nothing you see this year will come close to matching the emotional force of this mid-century melodrama. Order your tickets yesterday! ****

On the Line (2021)

Korea's answer to The Wolf of Wall Street (The Phish of Seoul?) is this gatling-gun paced action derby that puts its current Hollywood counterparts to shame. The real villain in the piece is not ex-cop Han (Yo-Han Byun) or even his snakey superior VP Jeon (Kim Mu-yeol in a performance vou're gonna love to hate) - a scam artist who delights in Electroluxing the bank accounts of unsuspecting pigeons — but Mrs. Seo-Joon. In the time it took for Han to save a co-worker's life, his better half panicked and transferred their life savings. Ditto Han's equally flummoxed boss who flushed the company's payroll. Being both victim and enforcer gives revenge-seeking Han a tremendous advantage when it comes to working both sides of the law. Being in the right place at the right time lands him a job at the mob's call center. In less than a reel, he impresses the boss enough to earn a promotion and begin weakening the system from within. Why did it take so long for the police officers to recognize one of their own?

Brothers Gok and Sun Kim work so quickly that when questions like that arise there's no time to think about answers until you're on the drive home. **

After the Rain (2022)

It wasn't a random act of violence like the ones that hit classrooms with greater frequency, but rather a broken spring of nature. More than 6000 parents whose children perished in the 2008 Sichuan Earthquake were inspired by the government to cut their losses and have another one. (Those who couldn't conceive naturally were treated to in vitro fertilization.) Jian Fan spent over a decade following two families, their "replacement children," and the chronic distress that accompanies non-healing wounds. Sheng couldn't save his daughter Rain from the rubble, and resents her substitute for not being born a girl. Ranran began life under her grandparents' roof; a couple could be fined for having more than one child, and the death of her sister, also named Rain, freed up a bed in her parent's house. A calculated moment or two — the camera follows Sheng's hand out of frame to obscure from family view the cocktail out of view of the family — are not enough to distract from Fan's insight when objects, randomly placed in the peripherals, grow to have great significance. ★★★

Big Night (2021)

The drive-by shooting that opened the picture felt out of place, particularly in light of the campy irreverence that quickly followed. Relax. It was just director Jun Lana's successful attempt to throw the audience off guard before taking us on a wild ride through the life of Dharna (Christian Bables), a flambovant stylist who lives up to his passive resistant handle, The opening murder he witnessed was a mistake, but Dharna fears lightning will strike twice. The only aspect of his life that comes close to "straight" is his aversion to narcotics. How his name made the titular blacklist of suspected drug dealers and/or users established by the Philippine government in 2016 is a wrong he spends the better part of the running time trying to right. His quest to clear his semi-good name begins with a local politician who offers him a crash course in corpse cosmetology before moving on to a cowboy legend who may or may not be able to clear his name. Not taking its violent promise too seriously is what gives the film its fresh spin on the old war on drugs. **

CODA — Where do they get off calling it an "Apple Original" when part of CODA's (as in: Children of Deaf Adults) premise (and a good handful of its scenes) are lifted from the French/Belgian film from 2014, The Bélier Family? Normally, I'd concede the rationale behind Americananguage remakes of foreign films based on a cultural prejudice against subtitles. But this is a film about deaf people; large

passages of conversation are subtitled as it is. Nor is it a true story, which leads one to question why the casting is so xerographic in nature: bald and grizzly Troy Kotsur is a dead-ringer for Papa Bélier, while Marlee Matlin - America's most acclaimed deaf actress — dyes her hair blonde to match the fictional Mama. Of the two main subplots put forth in the original, writer/ director Sian Heder casts aside the one that concerns dad's run for political office in favor of propping up a more familiar trope: daughter Ruby (Emilia Jones), the only one in the family of four who is not deaf, flaps the wings of her inner-songbird to participate in a competition. If only the plotting were as compelling as the ensemble performances. The Contractor — Sgt. James Harper (Chris Pine, also producing) is a Special Forces agent honorably discharged without benefits because his blood work came back "filthy" with pain-killing drugs. Back home, his wife (Gillian Armstrong) and son barely recognize the man seated at the kitchen table while his actions - who repairs a roof in the middle of the night? give cause for alarm. The only time Harper comes alive is around fellow veterans, the men with whom killing was a way of life. The same mundanity that had me looking at my watch during the opening family reunion ended up being essential to the character's progression from family man, to friend grateful for Mike's (Ben Foster) offer to get him work in the private sector where a clearer picture of his mercenary past comes into focus. Foster and Kiefer Sutherland offer strong support, but Pine's portrait of a family man possessed with such little regard for the family of man is nothing short of chilling. Rib tips: another six-dollar find!

omehow, I seem to be stuck on a BBQ kick. Just can't get enough of it. Take tonight: it's dusk, and I'm looking across the street to the long, low Kansas City Barbecue, the last single-story building on Harbor

Drive, I swear. And definitely, the Drive's brightest lights. I mean, how can you resist? There are probably classier joints around these grand old ladies, the Marriott and the Hyatt. But none has the life that's pumping out of KCBBQ right now. Its patio

is lit up, it's crowded, TVs flash a hoops game. You wanna be there.

I cross over. Game's UNC Vs. Kansas. Have always liked KC BBQ, specially after its gutsy response to the fire that gutted it in

2008. Everybody said this place was like, history, done for. "It'll come back when pigs fly!" someone said. But come back it did. Tonight, 40 years after it was originally built, it looks exactly as it must have in 1983.

The location is great, because the Seaport Village trolley station sits right behind it. I can get home from straight out the door. And right now, out front, where its terrace faces Harbor Drive, you have the bonus of a sunset-luminous lawn, in Downtown! So right now, folks fill the terrace. Others line up for the chance. Me, I head straight for the inside, where, yes, Top Gun's piano scene with Maverick and Goose happened. Also the bar, the one where countless navy sailors' hats dangle

from the ceiling, surrounded by tossed-off bras that cavort around, attached to spinning overhead fans.

The reason I really wanna be here? I caught the sign at the patio entrance that said

> "Special: St. Louis-style rib tips, and Buffalo chicken thighs." The incredible thing: they each cost \$6. (Six bucks! This is the second time in two weeks. Remember BBQ House, OB?)

I pass the cutouts of Tom Cruise and Kelly McGillis

where you fill the head-holes with your mugs for a photo, and walk into the inner sanctums of the main bar. Place is rockin'! Barman Chris is pouring, mixing, slapping Lincoln tips into the jar, and you'd better not keep

him waiting when he comes for your order. "Bud Light," I say. It's \$5.

"To eat?"

Oh man. The guy's going to be gone and around the other side if I don't speak up.

I know, the \$6 deal, but I can't resist a peek at the menu in front of me. Pork baby back ribs, \$19.95 (that's with two sides like mac'n cheese and slaw), or a sandwich version with one side for \$12.95. Then a sliced beef brisket plate that goes for \$22.95, or a pulled pork sandwich plate for \$11.95. They have an absolute ton of other things, Chris, the lightning barman but I want to capture Chris while I've got

> him. And who but a fool would ignore those \$6 rib tips? I don't. In no time at all, considering the crowd, he's laid a plate full of them in front of me, plus a beer beside me. Aah. I'm looking at maybe a dozen chopped up hot rib tips drowned in a St. Louis sauce. Folks back there in the Midwest take this stuff seriously. Turns out that this

place's owners, Martin and Cindy Blair, have roots there.

I mean, I'm not expecting high-end perfection. The Marina district is total tourist-trap territory, after all. But I have to say, this St. Louis-style 'cue has a sexiness you can't get enough of. And a real cultural background. They don't just cook on hickory wood; they do extras, like providing white bread for you to soak up your sauce.

They say St. Louis and Kansas City are sisters under the skin, at least BBQ sauce-wise. In the late 1800s, they both boomed in America's heartland as important river ports. KC was also "the crossroads of two of the busiest railways, and the terminus of numerous cattle drives," says the menu (Think Lonesome Dove.) "Many 'joints' like ours made Kansas City barbecue famous. Burnt Ends are a Kansas City delicacy.' Huh? Burnt Ends? Hadn't heard of those before. They're "pieces of brisket taken from the point and cooked a little longer." I see that a plateful "when available" costs \$21.95 (that's with two sides; \$13.95 with one side).

Got to try that sometime, but not now. It's hard enough getting chews in between chats as it is. So much bar conversation going on: Shane from North Carolina to my left, Mike from Kansas to my right. Shane's at a seating conference. Yeah, seating. Mike's here at a technology and education conference. "Teachers won't disrupt themselves!" he complains.

If I let my mind drift, I can see this place as a setting for a movie. Oh, hey, it was the setting for a movie. But I'm thinking a spy movie. A John le Carré-type meeting place, where shadowy

figures pass notes at the bar, covered by the raucous convo that always seems to burst out this time of night.

"This is great!" yells Shane. "It's the nearest thing to a North Carolina bar outside Greensboro!" He's shouting over the game between Kansas and UNC. (And yes, his Mom and Dad did name him "Shane" after the movie.) "Go Jayhawks!" yells Stephanie. She's this gal dressed in a blue and gray Jayhawks suit and wearing huge red Jayhawk gloves.

I'll definitely come back, if only for the good company. But also for those Burnt Ends, and even more, for my rib tips. At \$6, here downtown in tourist central, these delicious, moist, tender, almost boneless little babies can't be beat.

It's hard to leave. But now I'm behind the rear side of Kansas City Barbecue, waiting for the Green Line trolley. Suddenly I feel surrounded: on their back wall, someone has painted a whole herd of pigs. Flying pigs.

Beard Papa's, a cream puff **boutique**

7874 Girard Ave., La Jolla. For as long as I've known the Village of La Jolla, I've associated its Girard Avenue with exactly three types of businesses: high-end

cosmetics, designer clothing, and Warwick's bookstore. So it's fair to say I was surprised to find myself at a plum location, barely a block off Prospect Street, ordering cream puffs.

Like, nothing but cream puffs. Because nestled among the boutiques is the newest location of the international cream puff chain Beard Papa's.

Named for Yuji Hirota, the bearded founder who first launched his small bakery in Osaka, Japan in 1999, Beard Papa's now boasts some 400 locations in 15 countries. I don't know about the other 399-plus shops, but the walls of this La Jolla location are covered with the brand's logo: the cartoonish face of Hirota, and his namesake flowing white beard.

While these details answered most of the obvi-

ous questions, they didn't adequately explain the most confounding: how can

international behind cream puffs? As I would soon learn, it has a lot to do with the cream.

That's not to dismiss the puff part of the equation. Apparently, the secret to the pastry has to do with a pie crust exterior and a puff pastry interior. Every cream puff on the menu — including a *crème brûlée* version — starts with this pastry shell as a base. You can see dozen of them behind the counter, some plain, some glazed with flavored frosting.

The idea is to build a custom cream puff to order. I found a menu offering pastry shells coated as ube, green tea, and honey butter. There was a shell topped with chocolate and toasted marshmallows, for a s'mores effect, and another pairing vanilla glaze with oreo cookie crumbles. It's \$3.60 to \$3.90, depending which you

Once you've selected your shell, it's time to choose a filling. These mostly echo the glazes, so there's chocolate as well as vanilla, and both These options sit in big steel vats behind the counter, with pumps at the bottom to inject each shell,

Buy five cream puffs and you get a sixth for free, so I had fun playing with the pairings. Plain with a chocolate filling, chocolate glazed with vanilla filling. Most fun was putting ube cream inside a green tea shell, and vice versa. The contrasting purple and green proved amusing enough that it almost didn't matter how well the

And it almost doesn't. Because all the flavors and colors are added to the same, absurdly creamy vanilla custard. Fill the pastry shells with anything less than this ultra-decadent cream, and Beard Papa's would have one or two-hundred locations, max. Without doubt, it's the silky custard that makes the brand an international sensation. One that can share a block with the likes of Brooks Brothers and Ralph Lauren.

Drinks All Aroun

LAZ JIMINEZ Herb & Sea 131 W D Street **Encinitas**



The cool, crisp air inside Herb & L Sea restaurant rescues me from a warm afternoon in downtown Encinitas. Behind the bar, Laz Jiminez greets me with a spirited smile before recommending the Mezcal & Spice cocktail. "It's a play on a Lion's Tail; we just subbed out the bourbon for mezcal."

He starts describing components of the cocktail as he mixes. "I use Verde Momento mezcal, so it's not going to be so smoky, and not so forward. It's a little smoother, has a lot more vegetal notes. It's not so aggressive like other mezcals, where you get this smoke bomb. You still get it, you still taste the mezcal, it's not hiding or anything... but there's supporting actors that are in there, and they make a beautiful drink." He continues, "And with Drambuie being Scotch that has a little honey, and herbs and spices in it. They dance very well together, because they're along the same lines — they both have the spiciness, the smokiness of the spirits."

Then he sets before me a pinkyorangey drink served in a chilled coupe glass, garnished with a single dehydrated blood orange round. "The blood orange is nice and refreshing, and comes out with this beautiful color. We make a syrup with it, with a little bit more sugar so it's gummier." A splash of lime juice and dash of angostura bitters makes everything nice. "It's very approachable, but it still has a punch

The citrus inspiration came from the chef's special scallop crudo with blood orange. "So I said, 'Hey can I steal some?' And we started playing around with the mezcal." When asked if his drink paired well, he confidently replies, "Yes it did!" and then gently breaks the news that I've missed my chance to test his claim. "They're constantly switching [the food menu]. Most of the time we try to [match our cocktails to it], but this one was too delicious to take off."

Jiminez believes it's that ephemeral quality that sets Herb & Sea's cocktails apart. "It's nice because everything for [the kitchen] is seasonal, and so it's fresh. You get so many different ingredients, you get to try a lot of things," he explains. "This one will probably be on the menu another couple weeks, and then it's on to the next!"

What's does next look like? Jiminez is just now finalizing his newest cocktail, which will use an infused vodka. "I want to try to feature the snap pea that's in season. It'll be a pretty green color, too. I'm excited!"

Small craft and big water, a new trend

Dock Totals 4/3 – 4/9: 1924 anglers aboard 95 half-day to 1.5-day trips out of San Diego landings this past week caught 1202 bluefin tuna (to 100 pounds), 4 bocaccio, 11 bonito, 74 calico bass, 2 halibut, 76 lingcod, 3,661 rockfish, 35 sand bass, 14 sanddab, 265 sculpin, 66 sheephead, 2 triggerfish, 844 whitefish, and 933 yellowtail.

Saltwater: The fleet has been mostly chasing the epic bluefin bite, with nearly all boats running full-day to 2-day trips getting limits early enough to target yellowtail by early morning. Still, the best bet for bluefin will

be on 1.5-day and longer runs, though yellowtail are showing well just off the Coronado Islands. Closer to home, there have been private boater reports of yellowtail off La Jolla, but that bite has yet to develop for the local half-day sportboats.

This time of year can be sketchy day to day, given the often fast-changing spring weather bringing offshore winds with heat and flat conditions one day, and blustery onshore fronts another. With good planning, folks can get out in smaller craft and find great fishing for their effort. Local angler and deckhand Fernando Vallejo picked a calm day and motored his 14' Bris inflatable out of San Diego Bay south to the Coronado Islands. With just an 8 horsepower Mercury outboard motor, he still made the Islands, fished all the way around them, and returned with a decent yellowtail in the bag – all on just 4 gallons of fuel.

Though not advisable for folks not acquainted with the ocean and changing conditions, those with experience, skill, and good planning can take advantage of the nearshore banks from smaller vessels. Kayak fishing blew up into a huge industry from a small group of dedicated anglers on Sit on Top (SOT) kayaks catching large gamefish within a few miles of the coast. When I got into the sport in the late-1990s, there were no fishing-specific kayaks on the market.

In the San Diego area, La Jolla Shores was the best launch spot for getting to big gamefish in a relatively short paddle. Considering the catches reported and careers spawned from that small stretch of sand, one could also argue that La Jolla Shores launched the modern day sport of kayak-fishing. Jim Sammons began guiding anglers aboard SOT kayaks in the 1990s, and during one outing with a group of clients he hooked and fought an estimated 200-pound striped marlin and got it to leader after being towed by the big fish miles out to sea.

Using mostly modified Ocean Kayak Scupper Pro SOT kayaks originally designed for divers, anglers began posting pictures of their large fish caught within paddling distance of shore, and with the advent of social media and fishing chat rooms, the word got out. We would customize our kayaks,

designing and adding hatches, rod holders. fish finders, and bait tanks so we could better target larger species like yellowtail and white seabass. Sharing fitting techniques and tactics, a small group of dedicated anglers grew rapidly. In just a couple years, the first tournaments grew from a handful of entrants to over a hundred. Now, just over two decades later and with hundreds of different fishing-specific kayaks and accessories on the market, kavak fishing is a huge worldwide industry.

According to the Recreational Fishing and Boating Foundation, in

just one year between 2013-2014, kayak fishing grew one percent (when comparing all types of recreational fishing from shore or vessels) from 3.3% to 4.3%. That may not seem like much, but it represents 38,872,000 kayak fishing outings in just that one year.

With the cost of a larger boat, storage concerns, fuel, and maintaining a vessel out of reach of many, the small vessel industry grew along with kayak fishing. Today, anglers have a wide range of options for vessels that can get them to fisheries once available only to larger craft. Smaller molded boats, like Solo Skiff, and versatile inflatables such as Scout and Bris, hit the market. With the ease of hauling and more available launch spots with no ramp or trailer needed, fishing kayaks and small vessels have made big game fishing accessible to just about anyone.

Though some of the new pedal-drive model kayaks can run you thousands of dollars, you can still purchase and fit a vessel suitable for fresh or saltwater fishing on a small budget. I still fish my Scupper Pro some 24 years after my first paddle out of La Jolla, and considering the original purchase and fitting cost of about \$600 and the tons, literally, of fish caught from it, I think it was a wise investment. In fact, looking back at the fish, the nautical miles of exercise, and the adventures while fishing San Diego and Baja waters, I'd have to say that \$600 dollars was by far the best recreational investment I have ever made. To add to the fish caught and minor expense of small craft fishing, there is the beauty and solitude one can rarely find in today's bustling world. As Fernando Vallejo put it in a recent post: "Hours spent in solitude, surrounded by billions of tiny droplets of water that have formed the greatest wonder of the world. Life is put into perspective and true happiness shines through the gloom. For a few minutes, time stands still and it's just you and the water"

However you get out there, get out and get 'em!





This Couch Has a Lump

- Alex Trejo, a reptile expert and owner of So-Cal Rattlesnake Removal, got more than he'd bargained for in a recent house call. While most folks never find anything more interesting than spare change in their couch cushions, one Chula Vista resident found a snake: a 7-foot-long Vietnamese blue beauty rat snake, to be precise. "This guy calls me, is pretty frantic and he's like, 'There's a snake in my couch,'" Trejo told ABC 10 News in San Diego. Trejo said he was shocked to find such a beast in a sofa, calling it a "once in a lifetime snake rescue" in a Facebook post. The species is nonvenomous, is not native to the United States, and was apparently not interested in being captured: "He didn't (bite) my skin, but he actually got the lining of my shirt," Trejo said. The snake is in the care of a specialist, receiving treatment for a respiratory infection. The animal's owner has not yet been located.

Crime Report

- It may not be Easter yet, but Mr. Bunny is already making it into the headlines. In Brandon, Manitoba, Canada, a 27-year-old man was in the process of robbing a business on March 31 when an employee tried to thwart him, the CBC reported. But the thief was armed with a Mr. Solid brand chocolate Easter bunny, which he used to hit the employee. The shoplifter escaped but was found nearby and arrested; the employee suffered only minor injuries. The stolen merch was returned to the store; no word on how Mr. Solid fared.

Danaerous Work

 The night shift workers at the Mr. Chips french fry factory in East Tamaki, New Zealand, received a bit of a shock as 28 tons of russet potatoes from a farm in nearby Matamata worked their way through the factory's conveyor belts. What appeared to be just another muddy potato was discovered to be a World War II-era hand grenade. "The guys were really calm and collected and they reacted in an extremely professional manner," Roland Spitaels, the factory's operations manager, told Stuff. co.nz. Police responded to the scene and subsequently called upon the New Zealand Defence Force's explosive ordnance disposal team, who removed the grenade from the facility; x-rays revealed it was a training version of a hand grenade, containing no explosives. Spitaels hopes the police will return the grenade to the company when their investigation is complete so it can be put on display in the factory's trophy room.

- The Glitter Twins, Sarah Franks, 29, and Kaitlin O'Donovan, 27, have had their charges dropped in Clearwater, Florida, after a January incident in which they "glitter bombed" one Jacob Colon at 3 am at his home, The Smoking Gun reported on April 5. Franks and O'Donovan, who are married, allegedly threw glitter containers at Colon as he stood on the balcony of his apartment, then entered his home and further assaulted him with glitter, police said, but prosecutors concluded that "the facts and circumstances revealed do not warrant prosecution at this time." The "twins" had been free on bond since their arrest for felony burglary. Colon had at one time been involved in a "three-way type of thing" with them, but it had ended before the incident took place.

Least Mature Criminal

- In Warren, Ohio, police responded to robbery call with a twist straight out of elementary school. As a 22-year-old man walked along a road late on March 27, a man wearing a ski mask approached him and asked if he was a drug dealer. When the victim said he was not, the robber allegedly pulled out a knife and demanded money, WKBN-TV reported. After the thief got about \$80 from him, he made the victim "pinkie promise" that he wouldn't call the cops, then rode off on a bicycle. The police have not located the pinkie promise perp.

Compelling Explanation

- Kitty Deering of Edmond, Oklahoma, was surprised to learn that students at her daughter's high school were selling "white privilege" cards for \$10 around Valentine's Day, KFOR-TV reported on March 31. The white cards read "Trumps Everything" on the front and, on the back, "This card grants its bearers happiness because it's the color of your skin and not the choices that you make that determines your ability to be successful." But Joel Patrick, the creator of the cards (who is Black), said the cards were "created as a joke. If they're saying this in seriousness, that's a personal problem with them.

You don't go around telling someone you're better than them." Deering isn't buying it. "There's been years of ongoing issues of segregation here ... between staff, between students, between the community," she said. "We have to change it. That's not how I raise my children."

- What do you get when you cross spring picture day, a green screen background and St. Patrick's Day? Completely memorable elementary school photos, of course! At Sugar Grove Elementary School in Center Grove, Indiana, picture day happened to fall on St. Patrick's Day, United Press International reported. And no kid wants to get pinched on the saint's special day, so many kids were dressed in green. One problem: Inter-State Photography used green screens, like those used on TV weather broadcasts, behind the kids, so many of them "disappeared" in the initial proofs. Amanda Snow said her son's green hoodie turned into a fence, and "he had a green mohawk, but that is completely gone. ... It ended up being just a hilarious fiasco," she said. The photo company said the issues will be fixed on the final photos, but Snow hopes not: "I might reach out to the company and see if I can get the unedited ones, because honestly, they've brought me so much joy and laughter over the last day," she said.


