ON THE TRAIL

The long and winding road... ...to getting the River Park Trail completed

The County of San Diego Department of Parks and Recreation is working to construct a seamless network of trails that will follow the route of the San Diego River from the mountains down to the coast. But while the project, named The San Diego River Park Trail, has been in progress for decades, it remains in the planning stages. Now, however, it seems to have new momentum after the county board of supervisors recently prioritized it. Lizzy Bendrick, the trails pro-

Diego connecting the mountains to the coast rings a bell, you may be thinking of the Coast to Crest Trail. It's a similar project that begins near Julian, but heads north and west into the mountains through Santa Ysabel and Pamo Valley before descending toward Lake Hodges

gram manager for the county, spoke about the River Park Trail during a recent public meeting. "The vision is to establish a trail system from the mountains to the ocean," she said. "So, potentially, the town of Julian down to the mouth of the Pacific Ocean at Ocean Beach. This connected system will serve as a unifying thread. The main trail is called the San Diego River Trail, which is a multi-purpose path for pedestrians, cyclists and equestrians in some areas."

If the idea of seamless trail system in San

and eventually reaching the ocean in Del Mar. For its part, The San Diego River trail appears to be following the Coast to Crest model of using established trails and planning to build new ones to fill in the blanks. (The Coast to Crest Trail has been in the works for decades, and still has large, unconnected swaths of land near Lake Sutherland and the San Dieguito River, along with other shorter stretches that need to be connected.)

Judging by a map shown during the meeting, the portion of the route which spans

from Ocean Beach to Lakeside is composed of completed trail and sidewalk segments, along with some planned trail segments. As the trail heads northeast from Lakeside towards Julian, the route seems less defined — proposed trail segments are shown with a large chunk of the Trans-County Trail (a 155-mile trail system that runs from the eastern boundary of San Diego County near the Salton Sea to Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve) connecting two segments. Portions of the system will include trails on both sides of the river, so the overall mileage length of the entire trail system will surpass the actual 52-mile corridor of the

river that it is designed to follow. Mark Buckley, a

representative from ECONorthwest — a company working with the county to develop funding options for the trail system — mentioned that once you get upstream of the El Capitan Reservoir, in what he referred to as the "upper headwaters section of the trail," the route was not yet planned, but that the intention was to avoid

tribal lands in that region. "So, the route is going to take a wider path away from the river, and it's not clear what that path will be right now. We're talking to the Forest Service; the longer and the lower grade the trails, the more expensive they can be. The more direct and potentially steeper, the less expensive it can be to develop those kinds of trails, depending on what you have to cut through — granite and things like that." In essence, depending on how much funding the project receives, this section of the trail system may serve as more of a challenge than much of what you would find in regions such as Mission Valley and Santee.

Speaking of funding, that is exactly what the county is trying to figure out right now — where is the money for this project going to come from? "In March 2021, the county board of supervisors chair Nathan Fletcher assembled a task force related to the San Diego River Park," Bendrick explained. "One of the issues identified by the task force was that there is no set funding source to acquire land, implement trails, and complete other projects along the river and for ongoing operations and maintenance. One of the outcomes of the task force was that a long-term funding mechanism was needed to turn this long-term vision into a reality."

Funding options mentioned during the meeting included state and federal grants, fees and charges associated with private development, infrastructure tax districts and local community, voter-approved taxes and fees. A funding report will be presented to the county board of supervisors this summer and it could be a critical step in making this patchwork trail system a reality. Judging by the Coast to Crest Trail though, don't expect all the pieces of the puzzle to fall into place in the next couple of years.

DEL MAR Beach bummer Bluff buttressing shrinks sandy shores



Sea wall? How can you not? It's huge!

A multi-phase project to armor the Del Mar bluffs has reached another crossroad. On June 8, a series of controversial repairs was reviewed for approval by the California Coastal Commission. Del Mar Bluffs 5, the next-to-last phase of work to protect the train which runs atop the landslide-prone bluffs, is expected to begin in early 2023. The work, led by the San Diego Association of Governments and North County Transit District, will add more soldier piles, improve drainage, and extend the sea wall by 2000 feet along a 1.6-mile stretch between Coast Boulevard and Torrey Pines *continued on page 6*

Junk mailed

Lady pol's suit claims that chocolate organ has no redeeming social qualities

Can a Ventura County supervisor legally use campaign money to sue a San Diego company called Dick at Your Door to force it to identify the sender of a chocolate penis during a nasty recall battle?

Yes, said the California Fair Political Practices Commission in a February 22 advice letter to Linda Parks: "This legal action is directly related to a political or governmental purpose as it arises out of your activities, duties and status as an elected officer and the recall effort of your elected position status. Therefore, the attorney fees and costs in connection with this litigation are directly related to a political and governmental purpose pursuant to Section 89514 and the expenditure is within the lawful execution of the trust imposed by Section 89512."

Continued the letter, "On June 9, 2021, while signatures were being gathered for the recall petition, you received a package at your personal residence, from an anonymous person sent through a company. The package contained a life-size chocolate penis in a box that says, 'Congratulations! YOU DESERVE IT' on the outside, and other vulgar messages on the inside of the box.

"The box also included the message, 'Honorable Linda Parks, enjoy early retire-



ment. Thank you, Casa Conejo residents' taped to the underside of the box. A separate card in the box stated, 'Confused? See if the sender left you a message' and provided the website and name of the company sending the package and messages.

"You learned that company that sent the package is a limited liability company in San Diego. The business has refused to disclose the sender to you. You believe that the anonymous sender chose a novelty item that crosses the line from free speech to threatening a female public official with implied sexual violence. You state that it is without question a dangerous time to be female and a public servant and you note recent harassment events of female public officials covered by the news media.

"The package and message referenced the campaign to recall you from your elective office and occurred during the recall attempt. You believe this was sent to you because you are a female elected official.

You are concerned that the publicity around this event may chill others from running for public office. You think it is important that the identity of the sender be known for purposes of transparency, for example if the sender is a major donor in local campaigns, as it may affect the person's influence in political campaigns.

"You are also currently receiving anonymous harassing text messages regarding a particular development project and think this action may have been intended to intimidate and dissuade you in performing your duties regarding decisions about the project."

The recall drive against Parks failed when backers fell short of gathering 11,067 signatures by mid-September of last year, according to VCStar.com. "Recall backers kicked off the drive to oust Parks in early April. largely because she had cracked down on local businesses and a church that disregarded restrictions the county had imposed to limit the spread of COVID-19," the paper reported September 14, 2021. "Petitioners attempted to collect signatures as late as Monday at a voting center in Newbury Park. Lunn said sheriff's deputies were called after the signature-

gatherers refused to stop approaching voters and again when a signature-gatherer followed a poll supervisor into the voting center. Deputies talked to the group and others at the center at Newbury Park High and determined no crime had been committed. Sheriff's Capt. Dean Cook said."

On March 15, Parks filed suit against Dick at Your Door, Rain Parade LLC, an allegedly related entity, and two San Diego men said to be principals of the business, in Ventura County Superior Court. "On or about June 5. Defendants and each of them caused to be delivered to Plaintiff's home in Ventura County a 'chocolate Dick,' an offensive 5-inch chocolate phallus with no redeeming social qualities, whatsoever," the complaint says.

According to the Ventura County Superior Court's online registry, the most recent action in the case was "Proof of Service of 30-day Summons & Complaint" mailing filed by Parks April 19.

UNDER THE RADAR

Billionaires served One of San Diego's most politically influential couples has had a notable run of late, thanks to a campaign contribution of nearly \$100,000 from billionaire Oualcomm co-founder Irwin Iacobs and his wife Joan, and a Tijuana junket paid for by a group backed by the liberal Open Society Foundation, a George Soros co-founded non-profit. On April 21, per disclosure filings, the Jacobs each kicked in \$49,000 to a campaign committee calling itself Residents for a Brighter Chula Vista, Support-

ing Ammar Campa-Najjar for Mayor. The unmarried Campa-Najjar, who lost to Republican Darrell Issa in a 2020 50th District House battle, is, per multiple sources, in a relationship with similarly unmarried 53 District Democratic Congresswoman Sara Jacobs, granddaughter of Joan and Irwin Jacobs, who live in La Jolla. As of the latest count, Campa-Najjar had a narrow lead for second place in the Chula Vista race, setting him up to run against first-place finisher, Republican

Councilman John McCann.

Meanwhile, Sara Jacobs picked up considerable national publicity on a tour of Tijuana paid for by The Council for Global Equality. In an April 5 letter to the House Ethics Committee, the group described itself as "a coalition of prominent U.S.based human rights and lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and intersex ('LGBTQI') advocacy organizations focused on advancing human rights for LGBTQI populations through U.S. foreign policy." According to the group's website, "the Council has been generously funded primarily by the following philanthropic institutions: Arcus Foundation, Sigrid Rausing Trust, Open Society

Foundations, and an anonymous source." Adds the blurb: "Funds for lobbying-related activities are segregated and tracked separately. The annual budget for the Council has averaged approximately \$865,000, with 85% of those expenses going to its program work." Sara Jacobs's crossborder jaunt, which took place May 6, cost the council a total of \$1140, including \$448 in transportation expenses, \$58.75 to cover meals, and \$663 for "Secu-

rity, interpreter, Covid test/masks," according to a May 18 Post Travel Disclosure report filed by Jacobs with the House Ethics Commission. She "attended meetings organized by the Council for Global Equality with asylum seekers in order to highlight the issues at the border for marginalized groups," per the disclosure. Paola Guzman, an aide to Jacobs, also made the trip and reported the same expenses covered by the coalition, as did Jacobs's fellow San Diego House Democrat Juan Vargas and his aide Lawrence Cohen,



though the latter pair's transportation expenses were reported to be \$172 each. "I visited Tijuana with congressional colleagues and advocates from @Global Equality to learn more about the threats LGBTQ+ asylum seekers face and what we can do to help," Jacobs subsequently tweeted. "I'll never stop working for human rights for LGBTQ+ folks and asylees, on both sides of the border."

Drug dog data dilemma The

Border Patrol has failed to keep track of its

drug-sniffing dogs, says a June 6 audit by the Government Accountability Office, leading to possible misuse. "Checkpoint officials from all 13 selected checkpoints we interviewed told us that canines were critical to the checkpoint mission, including to drug seizures." But statistics belied the statements. "For example, data showed canines assisted with a Ammar Campa-Najjar? small proportion of drug seizure events in Yuma (two per-

> cent) and Big Bend (four percent) and a large proportion of such events in Tucson (77 percent) and Rio Grande Valley (88 percent)." The variations kept on happening even after officers were ordered to keep better books. "Data integrity officials from the Yuma and Big Bend sectors offered contrasting explanations regarding the relatively low number of canine assists their agents documented," the document continues. "Yuma sector officials said that it did not seem reasonable that canines assisted with only two percent of drug seizure events at checkpoints in their sector. These officials acknowledged that they did not have a good oversight mechanism in place at the sector level to ensure

such assists. Having reliable data on canine assists in drug seizures at checkpoints would help Border Patrol better assess the effectiveness of canines for checkpoint searches and ensure that canines are properly utilized."

overhead bridge.

"We cannot overstate the impact of this project to Del Mar's beaches and bluffs," reads a letter to the commission from Surfrider, which advocates for coastal access. Shrinking beaches are already becoming a problem, as sea-level rise devours tidelands normally accessible to the public. The commission's report notes that their decision about this project "may impact the potential for coastal squeeze to occur." It will directly influence whether such public resources "can persist over time as sea levels rise." The main threats to trackbed stability are stormwater runoff and groundwater, wave action and bluff retreat, and erosion, officials said.

While there is general agreement on the need to fortify the tracks until the trains can be moved off the bluffs — which the agency says may extend beyond the target date of 2035 — some of the measures are strongly opposed. Most reviled is the plan for half a



access permanent, not just for 30 years.

According to a commission report, SANDAG is proposing to work with the city of Del Mar and North County Transit District to establish long-term maintenance agreements that cover the stabilization infrastructure, coastal access and recre-

mile of new seawall that will remain for 30 years. It will wipe out 49,566 square feet of public beach now used for coastal access and recreation. "This is one of the most transformative projects to occur in Del Mar in decades," resident Mike Meyers told the city council on Monday, when SANDAG gave an update on the work. The seawall extension is needed to prevent the toe from eroding and the slope from over steepening, said Allie Devaux, an engineer with the agency. She estimated that 300 concrete bases would remain at the bedrock level when the wall is finally removed.

As mitigation for lost beach, the agency has proposed a one-mile blufftop trail east of the tracks, a grade-level pedestrian crossing and a stairway to the beach. But city council members will be asking the commission for additional measures in the \$68 million dollar project — not only for Del Mar, but the entire San Diego community. For instance, they want access at both 11th and 7th streets; right now, only one is proposed. Currently, the agency can't pinpoint the specific locations and designs of the access and recreation improvements. An improved upper trail mentioned at 13th Street would be in someone's backyard, said council member Terry Gaasterland. "That's what worries me about these conditional mitigations." And there is uncertainty about whether fencing would accompany the trail. Another request is to make public beach ation improvements. While SANDAG said they are ready to accept the commission's conditions of approval, NCTD must speak for themselves. The city has heard nothing from NCTD, mayor Dwight Worden said. The transit district has clashed with the city and Coastal Commission over its plans to fence the tracks to prevent trespassing. Like seawalls, the fence would pose another barrier to the beach. "They're not here today," said Worden. "We don't know their position on all of this. It's important to get them on board so they're not an obstacle to getting these measures passed."

VACANT LOTS Rent (out of) control Priced out of homes and into lot living

The May 19 report released by the Regional Task Force on Homelessness states that "no less than 8427 individuals" found in the Task Force's February countywide assessment were homeless. Some 1400 volunteers had covered as much of the 4261-square-mile area of San Diego County as they could in order to assess the unsheltered resident numbers before noon. But of course, some peole got missed. "The challenges of finding every person in a families and individuals are homeless but living in their vehicles. Even if surveyors find them, some are reluctant to admit their situation for fear of being reported to social service organizations, parking enforcement, or on the Get It Done app. Others, however, openly declared their homeless status in order to expedite getting their families back into standard, stataionary housing.

There are two locations in San Diego where people can legally park their vehicles in a fenced-off, free location and sleep in them. The first is the New Life Church parking lot by the 28th Street exit off the 94, just east of downtown; the second is 5605 Imperial Avenue in the Valencia Park neighborhood, about a mile east of the Imperial Avenue exit from the 805. "If they show up with kids, there will always be a slot for them," said Teresa Smith, CEO of Dreams of Change on Imperial Avenue. "It's why we started this back in 2010. It's because we kept seeing this kind of segment of the population, where they say, 'I'd rather stay in my car."' Smith's non-profit manages both of those safe parking program locations, and works in other ways to help transition San Diegans back into stationary homes. "We started thinking about, 'How do we then help them' — because they still needed help to get connected because of the system we have — 'while at the same time, preserving some of that dignity and space?" (When I interviewed Smith, she was weed-

car, canyon, or under a bridge is impossible, but every effort is made to find and engage as many people as we can," read the May 19 report. "This number includes 4106 unsheltered San Diegans with 4321 individuals in shelters. Of those surveyed, 85 percent said they had fallen into homelessness in our region." The total count was 10 percent higher than the task force's last count in 2020.

As the report indicated, some of the unaccounted-for

Times seem to be getting tougher. Smith continued, "As we're coming out of the pandemic, we see the cost of rent increasing. That's what I hear over and over again." (A *Realtor.com* report states that San Diego County's median "rent growth" increased 25 percent to \$3,008 per month in 2021, the second highest median rent in the U.S.) I got a call this week: 'They're remodeling my place, and we all have to go — the whole complex. We're out. Where do I go? What do I do? I

The opening Zillow remarks for this week's home inform us that "the 3500 block of Seventh Avenue is one of San Diego's best-kept secrets." If you look at a map, it's hard to argue with that claim: that one block of Seventh is cut off from other sections to the north and south and runs along the northwest edge of Balboa Park before terminating in a dead end. Save for a condo tower on the corner of Upas, there are only eight residences, all tucked up against the park, all his-

toric mansions — including, perhaps most notably, the Marston House, built for early civic leader and "Father of Balboa Park" George Marston. Marston's house has been incorporated into the park itself and is now a museum, but directly across the street is another home, one also designed and built in 1906 by famed local architect Irving Gill. Let's have a look at the nearly 5000-square-foot mansion at 3526 Seventh, shall we?

Before we go inside, the listing photos take us through the "perfectly manicured grounds with avocado trees, peaceful gardens, and two koi ponds." That last clarification is welcome, because they helped me spot the fish swimming around in what I initially mistook in the opening shot for a black-bottomed pool flanked by a covered brick patio with outdoor dining area.

Once we enter the home through a pair of green French doors, we find ourselves in a small foyer, looking through a dark wood arch into a sitting room outfitted with a brick fireplace (one of four to be found throughout the house, it turns out). Off to the side is a larger entry hall, its walls and floors covered in wood, with more arch

work and a couple of ornately-carved buffets. I tend not to complain about exposed wood, but this might be a bit much, were it not for the white ceiling that lightens up the space some. While we're on the subject of color: a little, low-roofed powder room is painted dark red, perhaps too dark for such a small space. A small statue of a man stands next to the pedestal sink, and seems to be offering us some candy, as if we were in a fancy restaurant with a washroom attendant.

Back in the living room, we see that beyond it lies a sunroom, with more huge French doors and walls of windows looking out into the gardens. Down a halfflight of steps lies a family room with enough space to tuck a grand piano in a corner behind all the other

A night aboard the Clusterwink

As far as I am concerned, being inside of a submarine for any amount of time would be a form of mental torture. Underwater + enclosure = nightmare. Last Wednesday's boarding of the Acey Deucey Club's fantastical USS Clusterwink will hopefully be the closest I ever get — happily, more like a curious dream than a nightmare.

This submarine is, shall we say, "docked" off Island Avenue inside The Horton Grand Hotel, and provides a rum-heavy civilian excursion into the deep sea — and also into a whimsical, tropical past. When I visit, I make my way in amidst fellow patrons' white sailor caps, retro dresses, and aloha shirts, while the Tiki decor accents and watery "views" beyond the submarine windows help to set the scene. and switches I can fiddle with while I wait for the festivities to begin. I sit and people watch a bit: some people here are apparent retro-lifestyle enthusiastists, some just curious date-goers. Some know and like the old-timey music, some want to see their friends who are in the show, some will go home and sleep soon, and some are here as a prelude to the rest of a big night out. It's a Wednesday, so it's understandable that it's not a full house, but it detracts a little from the atmosphere; we're at 50% capacity or so, and a smaller crowd makes any event feel somewhat less vibrant.

Are we sailing at some time around World War II? The Cold War? It's not clear. But in any case, it is a past in which my captain is also a statuesque blonde lady, who is also a drunk lounge singer, and who also happens to have a wife named Lillian that she's left back home.

Skipper Finn Crawford escorts me to my seat and assures me that another engineer (waiter) will be by in "two shakes of a cocktail shaker" with my first drink, the first of four to which I am entitled with my VIP ticket. "I am in fact a married woman," Vic teases. Captain Vic is the best part of the evening — she talks about rum and pirates, makes silly jokes, and sings an eclectic array of old jazz songs accompanied by a small band. She also interacts with the Skipper, and the two

from the front stage. But, she adds, feel free to take photographs. "We encourage it. Our submarine is stunning, and so am I". The first drink, a Sea Mule, arrives, and we raise our glasses "to moxie and frivolity" at Captain Vic's direction.

There are some plantain chips in front of me and a small menu offering pork sliders, "Seaviche," and firecracker meatballs. A tableside console offers some submarine-y dials, knobs, marine problem-solving. Things get fun when she veers into some pointed engagement with a birthday boy in the audience. "Mike, how old are you today?" She strains to hear his reply. "24? No, 34? Sorry." She gets offended by Mike's looking away, pesters him with more questions, and is eventually dismayed by the interaction: "I'm done with you," she says. Then a number of songs later, she adds, "Mike — what is the point of you being here?" I like the frisson.

The event is squeezed into 90 minutes, including 10 minutes of lingering time after the presentation is done. I am given a commemorative pint glass in a box, and make my way out through the Horton Grand.

Acey Deucey's ace

Anderson Lawfer, Artistic Director at Fever Originals USA — a clearly enthusiastic and warm character, and one of the creators of this project — says that he and his team were hoping to capture a certain feeling with the Acey Deucey Club: "a nostalgia for a time that none of us actually remember," but one that is still summoned by this immersive cocktail of tropical, maritime, jazzy, and clubby ingredients. Lawfer says that "really, what we're trying to do at the end of the day is create a good environment for people to go on a date or go out with their friends and escape from the world a little bit." He hopes that it's "exciting to leave problems and the world behind and be in the submarine with people and listen to great music and have drinks".

Lawfer, who came to Fever after being an artistic director of a small company in Chicago and then starting his own immersive company, says that there is also a social component that is important to these events. It's not just escape, it's escaping into something imaginative together with other people, in person. He wants to encourage face-to-face conversation, and says it's gratifying to be able to do these

events after a long period of covid isolation. He remembers seeing people come into the Acey Deucey club for the first time: "For most of us, it's been years trapped inside," and now, "you're in there, and you get this cocktail in some crazy glass and you hear the jazz band play." He says it was "just awesome".

Though they worked long days to get the project together — hiring a local team for nearly all the elements of the Acey Deucey Club, dealing with permits and regulations, rehearsing and designing — I was told that the Fever team also had a pleasant time in San Diego. They stayed at the Horton Grand Hotel for a month, and were able to venture out into the city to explore at least a little bit. Lawfer enjoyed the Safari Park, and says that one of his favorite memories is an Ocean Beach crowd at Wonderland Ocean Pub, clapping and cheering for the sunset. A different sort of immersion, but similarly sociable. ■

Musing on marijuana in La Mesa At the High Table

n the Middle East of San Diego County, there lies a kind of marijuana Mecca, a place to which pot pilgrims may peregrinate on a high hajj in their quest to elevate themselves - not through spiritual means, but rather, smokable. Or edible. The city of La Mesa — a modest county jurisdiction once known for its small businesses, community fairs, and historical atmosphere — is of late becoming known for its wide array of weed dispensaries. A quick run down the alphabet shows that this city of 60,000 is host to at least a dozen: BackpackBoyz, Cookies, Dr. Greenthumb's, EMBR, The Grove, Hotbox, Jungle Boys, Lit, The Reserve, Urbn Leaf (two locations), and Wellgreens. The days of Spring Valley pop-up stores selling \$5

grams and knockoff Chinese concentrate to high schoolers have been replaced by a reality where refined, adult shoppers are met with upscale LED signage, licensed lanyard-wearing consultants, brand diversity, and even a bill of sale. Stunningly, many of these places even take card.

The Editor, packed bowl surely in hand, sent word that he wanted me to look into the matter. He imagined a simple research assignment into this apparently atypical accumulation: I was to talk to owners, employees, customers, even local politicians. I chuckled excitedly, rocking back and forth in delight over the realization that I'd be able to re-up on the clock — so much so that the doobie pressed between my fingers released an ember that nearly burnt a hole in my shorts. I took another toke and asked myself: why so many stores? At first puff, La Mesa seemed an odd location for such a high concentration. near-constant flux of patrons through its front entrance. This time, we both set out, and over the next 500 feet, we passed four sets of beer bellies, cargo shorts, and flip flops; six dogs; two dog walkers; three young men wearing baseball caps backwards; a pair of pigeons sharing a Five Guys* wrapper, Ladyand-the-Tramp style; and an unaccompanied, elderly black woman pushing herself backwards in a wheelchair. The aroma of marijuana is not a cologne or perfume marketed to any audience in particular, but rather a fragrance to be enjoyed by all walks of life. "I'll be out here, man," said Newman as he pulled up to the side of the building and busted out his signature cross-armed wall-lean next to an accessibility ramp.

I was welcomed by a friendly security guard, this one more Wal-Mart greeter than tough guy, before joining a sign-in line. Ahead, behind an elegantly grained marble countertop, two sensational young ladies were checking and scanning IDs, scoping out the customer base, and warming them up for sales with a bit of playful banter. A flutter of social anxiety told me to leave my notebook in my pocket; the employees at the previous store probably thought I was some kind of narc. Once inside, I noted that the corner of the store held units incubating plant life — plastic pots filled with budding seeds, future promises of elevation. I looked through the various display cases before gravitating toward a selection of pre-rolled joints. I get the appeal of such a product, the same way I get the appeal of pre-sliced bread. But to me, the construction of one's smokable is both an art to be practiced and a labor to be undertaken, such that the resulting indulgence is individual and earned.

A woman approached the display case I was eyeing and issued the familiar, "Indica, sativa, or hybrid?"

Instead of answering, I immediately began to rattle off my prepared probing of the unsuspecting budtender (a term I rather dislike). She was more forthcoming than I expected, though a hint of hesitation was present in her answers.



La Mesa is becoming known for its wide array of weed dispensaries. A quick run down the alphabet shows that this city of 60,000 is host to at least a dozen.

She spouted the usual self-promo line: stuff about having the lowest tax rates in the city. That didn't sound right: shouldn't tax be a civic constant? But she was a saleslady, not a business owner, and so she steered the conversation back to the matter at hand.

"So, can I sell you some flower, though?"

"Yeah ... Got any oil concentrate?"

She pointed me to a glass-enclosed drawer full of golden goop. Admiring the display of ambrosia was like looking at the fresh meats section in a grocery store deli. But, unlike my local Vons, the DPs didn't take my EBT, and I was quickly running out of cash. I picked the cheapest half-gram in the display and vowed to stop paying for my dialogues and just get straight to the interrogation.

I looked around the shop and noticed a certain ruggedness in the employees, something that reminded me a little of the illegal dispensaries that I frequented in high school. "What about those old dispensaries in Spring Valley and around here?" I asked. "What's the story with them? I doubt y'all ran 'em outta business."

"Man, nowadays you can only hold down those trap shops two weeks tops before the Feds raid 'em," she replied, sounding a little annoyed.

I was thrust a white paper bag and, as I turned toward the door, "Next!" rang out from over my shoulder—an almost identical handoff with a better exit.

I couldn't quite put my finger on what about these places put me off. The crisp exterior of this particular store conjured feelings I might experience at a car dealership. Brand promotion had entered the equation, along with businesslike efficiency. I used to be very friendly with my dealers, now it was someone who knew my name because of a smart device and a picture of my ID.

I had grown weary from walking the Green Brick Road. But while I was inside, Newman had made a discovery on his phone. "Yo, check it out. While vou were in the bin, a Google-mapping expedition showed that, for ten DPs along the La Mesa 91941-91942 zip code border, the average distance between any two is 1973.34 ft. The smallest distances are here, along Center Street, with minima being 960.03 ft. and 751.05 ft. All these measurements feature a \pm 4.68 ft. uncertainty because Maps is trash, but you get the point. What're they sayin' in there, man? Why the hell are there so many?" Wonder is the beginning of wisdom; we pressed on.

following behind me into the store, curiosity overcoming his unease. Inside, a friendly stoner lady, complete with beanie, nose ring, and ear gauges, welcomed us, iPad in hand. Newman was a rookie to the licensed world, but a veteran trap shop attendee. His eyes slowly swept around the shop. I watched him studying the customers, the staff, the flatscreen TV menus, the inventory; I imagine the leap was jarring. He left almost immediately.

"What can I help you with?" The Stonette spoke from behind me as my head followed Newman out the door.

"Well, I'm hoping you could give me some information," I prepped for subtle hostility.

"Sure, what's up?"

"Writing a piece for the Reader about La Mesa's dispensaries. Got a few questions."

"Shoot." Things were looking up.

"What's the deal with there being hella dispos here in La Mesa? Have you noticed how many there are around here?"

She quickly went to work explaining the economic machinations, and their consequences, of city and state tax rates for weed and non-weed items. Every eligible sale (not just pot) in the state of California gets hit with a sales tax of 6% and every sale in San Diego County gets 1.75% on top of that. In addition to this, every weed-related sale in the state gets an extra 15% tacked onto that 7.75% total. This puts us at a minimum 22.75% sales tax on weed purchases in California. From there, each city can impose its own added weed tax, which is why it varies throughout San Diego County. San Diego voted this weed tax to 8% while La Mesa voted it to 4%. So, any sale of weed in the city of San Diego faces a 30.75% total tax rate while any pot purchase in La Mesa faces one of 27.5% (for those actually following the arithmetic, La Mesa chooses to have its own citywide sales tax of 0.75% on all purchases). By shopping in La Mesa instead of SD proper, you'll save a whopping

\$3.25 on a \$100 purchase. I followed the math lesson with a bit of social studies: "Okay, and what about competition? How can y'all afford to be so close to one another"

"Hmmm, there's not really any. Like I said, tax is pretty flat across the board, so the prices are too. Shops collect in industrial areas because the rent is cheaper."

"So, how do you get customers in here, then? If there's no competition, how do you get new clientele?"

"Well, most of our base is returning, about threequarters of 'em, actually. We like to think they come here because of familiarity and the vibe. Way better than those trap shops."

"Yeah, it's a great vibe," I said with a smile.

And just like that, I had my information-didn't even need to fork over my ID. I thanked her for her time and left, buying a pair of wraps on the way out. I wished Newman well on his way, but his car was already rolling forward before I had completely shut the door. My apartment welcomed me with a stillness that let me know I was alone, providing me the perfect opportunity to relax with my expedition's secondary yield. I bit through the packaging and delivered one of the twin blunt wraps to my rolling tray, though not before taking great pleasure in the olfactory indulgence of the chemically fragrant berry infusion. The wrap got stuffed with hybrid until it was bursting at the seams. No filter. I used a toothpick to paint the outside with concentrate, and my creation was complete. Fuck a security deposit. I sparked that bitch inside.

The Editor wanted me to get into the nitty-gritty with political leaders and community organizers, but I had my story. I was glad to have met this new breed of average guy who visits this new breed of apothecary - even if I didn't fully agree with him. can't find anything that meets my budget." She added that she usually hears about these situations from people seeking a safe place to park and sleep. These displaced renters, many of whom form family units, get outbid by new tenants willing to pay higher rents. Consequently — and often, for the first time in their lives — some of these displaced families and individuals become homeless. "And where we see it impact the most is our elderly and our seniors. That's the population we've slowly seen start to grow in the last few years."

More than 70 percent of the participants who check into Smith's two safe parking program lots have incomes. Some are the displaced; others have moved to San Diego for a new job, and are staying in their vehicles for a while, showering at local gymnasiums before heading to work. Either way, there's a process and checklist one must complete to get a vehicle into the 60 or so safe parking spots in the Dreams of Change parking lots. Once the safe parking candidate is approved, they have to check in at 6 pm. Shortly after, the gates are closed for security reasons; nobody can just walk in or climb the fence. The individuals and families can utilize the electricity and running water from the shack and hang out at the picnic tables. Then, every morning at 6 am, everyone has to pack it up, clean up, and leave the lot — with their vehicles. (One exception: recently, Smith has given RVs the option of staying on-site, as gas prices in San Diego surpassed the \$6 per gallon mark.)

Nobody else was present on the Imperial Avenue lot when I spoke with Smith. However, in an NBC San Diego 7 news clip that aired in October 2021, they interviewed a woman named Susan, who stayed at the lot. "Everybody [here] gets along," Susan said. "We all eat together. Everyone's been nice. The caseworkers have been great."

Smith does get some pushback from San Diegans."It is 'nimbyism," she explained. "You know, people who don't want it in their backyards, the 'not in my neighborhood' [mentality]." Fortunately, residents around the Imperial Avenue lot seem to support the program, which has been in place since 2018. A couple of neighbors regularly bring meals to the families and individuals on different nights. They also bring donations collected from the neighborhoods. "This has been a very welcoming community, to the point that we bought this property just a couple of months ago, so we're going to be here permanently," continued Smith, whose organization paid \$260,000 for the lot and accompanying shack. "The biggest reason it was cheap was that you can't build on it," she said. "The city has easements from here back, and because there's a water main and a stormwater drain that runs down on the property right behind

In April, the city of Vista spoke of a safe parking program as part of their city agenda. "And we've been out in El Cajon talking with the city council," Smith added. "As of their last meeting, it was 'We're not going to block it, but you have to go through the permitting process."

TIJUANA **A lot of hope in** Little Haiti Strong community, but not enough school

One hundred and twenty-five Haitian families have settled in a plot of property belonging to a group of nuns called Misioneras Franciscanas de Nuestra Senora De la Paz, in the El pedregal de Santa Julia neighborhood, four miles away from Tijuana's downtown. The settlement started in December of last year; neighbors have named it Little Haiti. At least 300 Haitian nationals live there in tents. There are two classrooms used to teach catechism, and two small kitchens and portable toilets. That is all that Sister Maru Espinoza, who is in charge of the place, had on hand to

course, there are also disadvantages. "Sleeping on the ground in tents. Getting cold and wet when it rains."

Another disadvantage, one familiar to most migrant children, is the lack of school. Most of Little Haiti II's residents are children, and for now, said Sister Maru, the nuns are

But although he lacks education, he still hopes to become a doctor someday. he's

important in the community because of his role as a translator. "I like it here because I play," says Vila, "but I don't like it too much because I'm not going to school. My last time in a school was back in Brazil. I want to cross to the United States so I can study there."

Sister Maru said that neighbors are kind and helpful — sometimes. They have supported the migrants, but they have kept their distance from them. For Wolves, it's strange to play only with the kids from his own country. "I feel neighbors treat us different, and I feel sad because of it."

For adults, the situation is difficult. Most of the men lack proper documentation, and are looking for work. They mostly get jobs in construction, but only for a weke or two. Feshes D' Fouche, 44, explained that in his three years in Chile, he worked in a formal

> job as a construction worker, but here in Tijuana their jobs don't last long. "I had a job for just one month. When I got hired they made me sign my job resignation before actually starting to work. I once got robbed when going early in the morning to take the bus to my job. I miss times in Chile. Things were different there, but you can't make a living there as a foreigner."

> Right now, the families are being helped by the Haitian Bridge Alliance. Because of that help, and because they believe this is their only chance to make it into the United States, they refuse to protest against the government's migrant politics the way that other central American nationals have.

North County beaches lose the most sand

Summer Solstice, the time when the sun reaches its northernmost point in the sky, occurs this year at 2:13 am on Monday, June 21. The summer solstice not only marks the beginning of summer for the Northern Hemisphere, it also means that the daylight hours are maximized. San Diegans now enjoy approximately 14 hours of daylight, in contrast to the meager 10 hours or so we experience in December. Anytime this week or next, try checking your shadow at 12:50pm (the local daylight time in San Diego currently equivalent to astronomical noon). The sun is then only 10° south of the straight-up direction and casts near-vertical shadows. A lesser-known consequence of the summer solstice is that our twilight periods are longer than usual. Evening and morning twilight periods are now lasting more than 90 minutes.

OCEANSIDE SAND REPLENISHING PROJECT

Cobbled Shorelines are greeting some beachgoers early this summer season, as in past years. North County beaches tend to suffer most, because natural sand replenishment in the area is disrupted by dams blocking the flow of sediment down the larger streams and rivers. Some sand scooped up from dredging operations is being moved onto the beaches to mitigate this problem. South County's beaches fare better. The widest beach of all, Coronado, is protected from sand loss by the jutting Point Loma peninsula; it catches some sand drifting on currents northward from the mouth of the Tijuana River.

Colorful Foliage along San Diego's coastline lingers, despite the recent lack of rainfall and warmer, drier days. In the older, landscaped neighborhoods of Coronado, Point Loma, Pacific Beach, and La Jolla you'll find oleander and hibiscus blooming in many shades, and colorful bougainvillea creeping over garden walls. Look for the magnificent clusters of red flowers adorning the crowns of the flame eucalyptus (red-flowering gum) trees.

Jazz Fest: A New Orleans Story -We begin with a flurry of performers introducing themselves, a handy visual aid given how many faces will pass our way over the next 90 minutes. 2020 marked the 50 anniversary of The New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival aka Jazz Fest and directors Frank Marshall and Ryan Suffern were there to document an event so large it's known as the sixth biggest city in Louisiana. What kicked off in 1970 would have commenced in 1962 were it not for Jim Crow laws preventing festival co-founders George Wein and Quint Davis from mounting a multi-racial event. Don't let the name deceive you. This celebration of culture, music, and food doesn't stop at jazz. A mixture of clips past and present reveals just about every musical genre short of classical is represented. Ba-dee-ya, say, do you remember? Close your eyes and you'll think you're listening to an Earth, Wind & Fire concert recorded in 1978. Expect more than a performance film per se as the cameras venture out from the little city and into the swamps before hitting up the Mardi Gras. Even talk of Hurricane Katrina and two years in quarantine can't dampen this joyous celebration. 2022. — S.M. ★★★ (DIGITAL GYM CINEMA)

Lightyear — Give Hollywood enough time and they'll ruin everything. The Buzz Lightyear character came to be a household name thanks to four installments of *Toy Story*. The delusional doll that thought he was the character upon which he is based now has an origin story that, according to the trailer, looks more like an adventure yarn than a comedy. 2022. None. (IN WIDE RELEASE)

The Phantom of the Open — Maurice Flitcroft (Mark Rylance) was the Ed Wood of drivers, Forrest Gump a few bucks shy of the green fees, known in media circles as the worst golfer in the history of the sport. (His answer to "What's your handicap?" is "I'm not sick.") Without once having played a round, and looking to segue out of a career as a crane operator, Flitcroft stepped on the TV remote, up popped a golf match, and thus began screenwriter Simon Farnaby's epic struggle between historical accuracy and artistic license. Rylance no doubt studied all the available footage of his subject, but his performance never rises above the level of refined mimicry. Under various disguises, any one of which would make Inspector Clouseau snicker, the "people's golfer" spent years sneaking into the British Open. How is it that tourney potentate Keith Mackenzie (Rhys Ifans) failed to notice Flitcroft's flagrant press-on 70s pornstache? Add a devoted little woman (Sally Hawkins) and a "love me, daddy" subplot involving the adoption of her illegitimate son (Jake Davies) and all I could think was what Scott Alexander and Larry Karaszewski (Ed Wood, Dolemite is My Name) would have done with this celebration of mediocrity. Directed by Craig Roberts. 2022. - S.M. • (ANGELIKA FILM CEN-TER AND CAFÉ; ARCLIGHT LA JOLLA; LANDMARK HILLCREST)

The Thing — In four short years, John Carpenter followed his wholeheartedly fearsome Shatner-masked mutation with the unseen terror of homichlophobia before confronting the ultimate in evil: a heedless remake of one horror cinema's Pantheonic achievements, *The Thing From Another World*. Filmmakers Christian Nyby and Howard Hawks went out of their way to conceal the identity of their "human carrot" until the end. Carpenter's biggest fault lies in his desire to jam down our throats a

creature enlivened by special effects, one that doesn't necessitate a costumed human or, better vet, the activation of an audience's imagination. It's difficult to feel much fear when the monster in question is laughably composed of what appears to be a Venus flytrap regurgitating a killer shrew. The cast, all of whom succumb to death by billing. is first rate, as is cinematographer Dean Cundey's night work. And on a positive note, it was Ennio Morricone, not the director, who composed the score. Carpenter knows how to turn up the atmospherics and 'Scope composition don't come much cleaner, but this R-rated microcosm of paranoiacs is better suited to PG-13-year-olds. And for those drooling over the aerial footage, I submit Anthony Mann's Strategic Air Command and Josef von Sternberg's Jet Pilot for further study. Watcher — An American in Bucharest, new in town following her ambitious husband Francis' (Karl Glusman) promotion and unfamiliar with the language, Julia's (Maika Monroe) days are spent peoplewatching, both inside and outside the couple's spacious apartment. Who needs cable when there's a thin-lipped crackpot in the apartment across the way begging to make eye contact? The murder scene the couple happened across during an evening constitutional triggers Julia's paranoia, and it gradually builds to a nerve-twisting late night confrontation on public transportation between watcher and looker. First time writer-director Chloe Okuno tries for a sinister Polanski vibe, right down to an abundance of seemingly well-intentioned albeit non-communicative tenants to add to the tension. For a film of this nature to succeed, it all comes down to a happy ending, a table-turning climax that finds our heroine guilty of the titular compulsion, not a victim of it. Monroe puts a fresh spin on an all-too familiar victimized heroine and Burn Gorman as "Watcher" is creepy enough to star in a Skelton Knaggs biopic. It all went smoothly until an eleventh-hour ploy strained plausibility in the name of contrivance. Million Dollar Quartet

It's a genius premise: take a real-life Big Moment — the one time that King of Rock and Roll Elivs Presley, Man in Black Johnny Cash, Father of Rockabilly Carl Perkins and The Killer Jerry Lee Lewis met and played together at Sam Phillips' famed Sun Records recording studio in Memphis - and weave a story around it that can serve as a showcase for the music. The odds are pretty good that you know the songs, which include Perkins' "Blue Suede Shoes," Lewis' "Great Balls of Fire," Cash's "Folsom Prison Blues," and ves, Presley's "Hound Dog," It's better than going to see a cover band, because the actors aren't just imitating the real-deal pop-culture giants (the outfits, the hair, the dancing, and oh yes, the music) they're portraying them. And it's better than a biopic, because you get that live-music thrill - doubly so, because it's played in the context of when it was shaking the foundations of society. It's not remember when, it's you are there. The thing is brilliantly designed to feel good, and it does, which is all the more remarkable considering just how sad the story is. (As narrator and protagonist Phillips puts it, "I wish those boys had had a little more happiness in their lives." And he's in for a rough night of his own.) Such is the power of the musical Muse; we clap and cheer at stuff born from poverty and pain. (Phillips again: "I ain't never heard a rich man make a good record." and dead brothers abound among our stars — for starters.) Ben Van Diepen's Lewis seems designed to steal the show, and he obliges in acrobatic fashion, but Lance Arthur Smith's Phillips grounds the proceedings and keeps it from becoming a Greatest Hits album. Pink-powered pop-punk: The Havnauts

In the pink Singer Shelbi Bennett of The Midnight Pine — an act she describes as "very serious and veiled in metaphor" - and Shady Francos drummer Jenny Merullo share a love of the pop-punk that shaped their respective youths. "I was in born in '85," Merullo says, "so the late-'90s, early 2000s emo-pop-punk wave was hugely impactful on me when I was playing drums as a 15-yearold. I grew up in Boston, and I played in bands there. The first real band I was ever in was a ska band, because it was 2001 and that was what we wanted to do. When I first moved to San Diego, I was in this little punk band called French Kiss Koma. The oldest person in the band was in his fifties, and the youngest person was underage."

If you caught the duo's poppunk band The Havnauts in those early days, you probably saw bassist Zak Kmak rocking outfits that Merullo describes as having a "Jimmy Buffett vibe," and Bennett sporting "bright makeup that looked like it had been smeared on." The group was still seeking a visual aesthetic that would unify them; they found it in the color pink. "I like that it's softer, and I wouldn't ever describe our music as soft, but it does have tender subject matter," Bennett says. "That color is almost a fifth band member. The only other color I think we could have chosen besides that is red, but red is too aggressive." Merullo adds that "It's really eye-catching onstage, and it's easy to find pink stuff at a dollar store."

one group eating salads, another eating sushi, and another with a charcuterie board with nice meats & cheeses. A very subdued concert parking lot situation, and not a joint in sight. The crowd appeared to mainly be in their sixties and seventies, driving luxury cars from BMW, Mercedes, and Tesla to their rock 'n roll show and not wanting outside interference from any other concertgoers. I deemed it a yuppie rocker paradise, and resisted the temptation to ask them if they knew that the name Steely Dan was taken from William S. Burroughs' Naked Lunch, and referred to an oversized, steampowered, strap-on dildo.

The venue was easy to get into, but once inside, I found the thought of paying \$27 for a Vodka Lemonade somewhat discouraging. Other downers: no dancing allowed, and we were required to turn off our cell phones. The phone thing I understood, but no dancing to Steely Dan? It's an interesting thing when dancing at a concert is taboo. Is it possible the venue was aware of the demographics of the concertgoers and did not want to field complaints?

Steve Winwood was supposed to be the opening act but dropped out due to scheduling conflicts due to covid-19. Snarky Puppy assumed the opening slot instead. I had never heard of the all-instrumental band — a ten-piece ensemble

whose members hail from all different parts of the country — but they were all great musicians. Do yourself a favor and check out their Latin/funk/jazz sound on NPR's Tiny Desk Concerts on YouTube

Steely Dan was not to be outdone; they had their own ten-piece ensemble, plus three backup singers called the Danettes. They came out playing a big band sound reminiscent of the Glenn Miller era. Then out walked Donald Fagan. He propped himself behind his keyboards, right up front in the middle of the stage. His voice sounded the same as ever on songs such as "Hey Nineteen," "Aja," and "Kid Charlemagne." A singer from the Danettes

sang a beautiful rendition of "Dirty Work." That was followed by a sizzling version of "Bodhisattva," before the band finished off the set with "My Old School." That's when I saw the flashlights, flashing and blinking as security guards rushed through the crowd to tell people to sit down and to stop dancing. I had a hard time staying seated for the entire concert, but I managed, even when they played "Reelin' in the Years" for an encore.

Donald Fagan is the last original member of Steely Dan. All the musicians performed flawlessly, but I did notice a difference in the music without the signature guitar playing of fellow founder Walter Becker. I guess that's to be expected after a band loses a founding member, a guy who helped create many of its hit songs, and replaces him with two new guitar players. Becker died unexpectedly of esophageal cancer at age 67 on September 3, 2017. Shortly after that, Donald Fagan filed a lawsuit against the estate of Walter Becker to retain full control of the band. The litigation began four years ago and is still going strong. Happily, a fan in the crowd would not notice any signs of ill feeling, or even know there was a lawsuit in motion. As a matter of fact, there was a sense of kinship between Fagan and his fallen long-time partner. He finished the concert by saying, "I'd like to thank my partner Walter Becker for helping out." He then did a quick salute to the sky and walked off the stage.

Blue Fire: coming in hot

Tommy Gordon and his brother Charlie didn't exactly pick the easiest time to open a brewery when they started Blue Fire Brewing last September. "There were numerous challenges that we came across in building our brewery and tasting room," says Tommy. "From shipping and supply chain delays, rising construction costs, and all the other uncertainties surrounding covid... We were incredibly fortunate to partner with some talented local tradespeople that helped guide our construction - which we oversaw

ourselves — throughout the entire process." He credits collaborations with Kellogg Plumbing, Krecu Construction and Davis Electric for helping get the brewery up and running.

beers brewed at Blue Fire, as exemplified by their latest brew, Controlled Burn, which was released as part of the first SD Beer Weekend. To mark the occasion, the San Diego Brewers Guild offered members the chance to brew any style beer with Zamba, an exclusive hop blend from BSG Craft Brewing. The blend produces an aroma and flavor of pineapple, mango, and stone fruit, which worked perfectly for Controlled Burn, a 7.2% juicy-style IPA. To add to the tropical notes and hoppy profile of the IPA, Gordon added El Dorado hops to the blend, which upped the flavors and aroma without increasing bitterness — resulting in a surprisingly sippable IPA, all things considered.

Controlled Burn joins another collaboration on Blue Fire's tap list, Prickly in Pink, brewed in conjunction with San Diego Pink Boots Society. Combining a prickly pear puree with the Pink Boots Society hop blend resulted in a 6% hazy IPA with notes of papaya and grapefruit and a bright, sweet flavor courtesy of the cactus fruit. "The Pink Boots Society is an awesome orga-

nization, and we were stoked to support it with

More paua to you

Levering those sucker-strong suckers off the rocks is never easy

ew Season First Grade Bluff Oysters! Here we go, mate," says Russell. "This is the one. This place is da bomb."

We're sitting beside a small sign: "Fed Up Restaurant & Takeaway," here in Paraparaumu, a village on New Zealand's North Island. (The name means "leftovers from the underground oven.") Me, I'm

here for a second week, visiting rellies. "Kia Ora, mate."

That's Jerry, Fed Up's owner, greeting us as we come in dripping out of the storm that's raging outside. And hey, this is another thing that has changed since I was last here. The Māori language is on the march. It's not so much "gidday" any more as "Kia Ora." People

don't talk about "family" as much as "whanau." They call their country "Aotearoa (Land of the Long White Cloud)" as much as "New Zealand." Jerry himself is from Guangzhou, China. And he salts his talk with Māori words, too.

Biggest challenge? Remembering that everybody drives on the left. Dangerous when you're stepping out on a crossroad. And yes, my Kiwi buddy Russell has hauled me out along Paraparaumu's Marine Parade, right in front of angry waves crashing in from Australia (we're in mid-Winter here). Says he wants



to show me some real, Kiwi, tummywarming fish and chips. "Above all, mate, you've got to taste

our real paua. Abalone.

From the Chatham Islands." He says this is prime time for seafood. Oyster season is opening up, and nearby Antarctica is teeming with fish. Why choose the Fed Up

Cafe? It's not just for the name.

Russell says that Jerry, the guy who owns this place, has the best contacts with the fishermen out in the Chatham Islands. And everybody down here knows the Chatham Islands are what New Zealand used to be. Low on humans, high on fish. "And they have the best paua," he says.

Boom! Clap of thunder right outside. Man.

So good to be in out of that icy rain. One or two dripping people are ordering fish and chips to go. The back wall has the menu spread right along.

First thing you see is "Fresh fish, battered, \$4.80." (That's around \$3 in US currency.) Jerry says that Fed Up's fish is pulled from Chatham water, out where the South Pacific the collides with the Southern Ocean. "They're crazy fishermen out there," says Russell. "That's the difference. Jerry knows them all. Wines and dines them. Gets first dibs

on their fish." Wow. It makes you think of Deadliest Catch, that 18-season reality show from up off Alaska.

So the choices are the basic fish around here, tarakihi (with the crazy official name, the jackass morwong), which is maybe the most New Zealand of fishes. Then there's grouper (aka *hapuku*), and blue cod; those cost a bit more.

Says Russell, "Blue cod is my favorite, both ways: I mean, they're

actually cute fish. They get curious, if you dive round them. They'll come up and nip your fingers. On the other hand, they are delicious to eat. Sort of salty, sweet, and really light. And it's a fish you only find around New Zealand."

"I have some in today," says Jerry. Huh. I keep scanning the menu. It's huge, but in a way, it's very simple: "fresh fish battered, \$4.80; crumbed, \$5; fresh fillet crumbed,

\$10.70." Jerry says "fresh" means it's been caught in the last few days, never frozen.

That's it. Unless you make a meal of it and

What ten bucks (US) buys: salad, fries, and tarakihi, aka jackass morwong

include fries ("chips") and salad; then it shoots up to \$16.50 (about \$10.50 U.S.). Go for the blue cod meal and it's a buck more. Go for the native sweet potatoes, kumera, and it's \$18.50 (\$12).

"Bluff oysters?" Says Russell.

Oh yeah. Famous new season oysters from Bluff, the southernmost city on the New Zealand mainland. I pop out through the door just to check the chalkboard for the prices. Except the rains have washed the handwritten prices away.

"Four dollars each," says Jerry. Wow. That's about \$2.50 in my money. But, new season and all, we have to try one battered one each.

"And, you know, we just about forgot," says Russell. "Paua! Gotta have a paua fritter. Grow big as your hand out in the Chathams."

Okay, ulp, menu says they're \$12 (\$7.50) each. But I know from when I was a kid, levering those sucker-strong suckers off the rocks is never easy, even when you're not in half-frozen waters. So we split it, and order one of them to share. I get a Fanta Orange can (\$3.50), and Russell orders a Flat White (interesting coffee that New Zealand claims as its invention. They

reckon it originated at a place called Bar Bodega, in the capital, Wellington, from a cappuccino gone flat).

Of course, then there is this huge list of other stuff. Doner kebabs (all about NZ\$11), hot dogs (NZ\$4) and burgers (NZ\$8.50-\$14.50). Whatever, for the two of us, dinner costs NZ\$62.50

(\$40). So not too bad. And, have to say, you get a lot. My chunk of fish is huge, and nice and crunchy, even after I soak it in vinegar. And it is so good, sitting here with competing bangs of thunder overhead and rain sheeting against the window like a Hollywood movie hose, downing all these bites of wickedly hot, salty, vinegary chips and fish.

Russell gives me a forkload of his blue cod. Hmm. I see what he means. It's incredibly light flesh, a little sweet, a little salty. My battered Bluff oyster is fine, but maybe the most interesting is the abalone fritter, the *paua*. Maybe it's the celery Jerry says he puts into the patty mix, but it has a dense-yet-tangy flavor that's in no way spicy, yet qway refreshing.

"Of course, in Guangzhou, where I come from," says Jerry, "they would do fish and shellfish like this paua a thousand ways. But there is a tradition here which I honor. I am a New Zealander now."

The many charms of Duke's Old Fashioned Onion Burgers

5020 Baltimore Dr., La Mesa. Given that the state is shaped like a sauce pan, it's a little surprising that we rarely see a cooking tradition attributed to Oklahoma. But! When I google the term "onion burger," all results credit the Sooner State.

I might never have known if not for a new La Mesa joint called Duke's Old Fashioned Onion Burgers. *Don't all burgers have onions on them*?, I thought, as I approached the place. *What makes them old-fashioned, anyway*?

As I've since learned, the onion burger is a style created nearly a century ago, in response to a distinct point in American history: the Great Depression. As the story goes, high beef prices prompted a burger spot on historic Route 66 to start

making burgers with smaller patties, filled out by copious amount of grilled onion.

The burger patties are formed

smash-burger style, meaning a ball of ground beef is pressed on a hot griddle, creating a thin, irregularly shaped patty with a high char ratio. While this style has become fairly widespread in San Diego, what makes it an onion burger is this: when the burger gets flipped,

a mass of sizzling, finely sliced onion cooks down between burger and flat top.

In its original design, the texture and flavor of all that grilled onion made up for the relative lack of beef. But while Duke's remains faithful to the onion burger concept, it doesn't skimp on meat. Whereas most smashed burger patties weigh in between two and four ounces, I figure the heft of Duke's \$8.95 single onion burger has to put it in the six- to eight-ounce range. If you're a big eater, the substantial, \$11.95 double onion burger starts to look like a real value. A \$14.95 triple is so large that its menu description asks, "What were you thinking?"

Perhaps with a regular \$3.25 side order of fries, I could finish a double. But Duke's has an entire fries menu that must be factored in. It starts with dirty fries: as simple as fried with onions and jalapeños (\$4.95) or smothered in melted cheese (\$6.50), then peaks with toppings of steak, blue cheese, and balsamic glaze (\$11.95).

A strawberry milkshake with fresh strawberries blended in.

there sits my favorite guilty pleasure: chili cheese fries. You get a huge pile of fries and chili (*sans* beans) for \$7.50, and they're darn near perfect. I'd recommend Duke's based on these alone.

> I'd also point people here merely to try the milkshakes. Yes, they go for \$5.50 apiece, but what you get outperforms every fastf o o d

as a special custom blend — though I'm told it is Angus beef shipped from Tennessee. It's not even heavily seasoned. But combined with the classic assortment of burger toppings (pickled jalapeños optional), it results in a sandwich greater than the sum of its parts. Plus, just look at all that glistening, grilled onion! Thanks, Oklahoma.

Dock Totals 6/5 - 6/11: 3530 anglers aboard 159 half-day to 3-day trips out of San Diego landings this past week caught 25 barracuda, 1873 bluefin tuna (to 180 pounds), 2 bonito, 1330 calico bass. 3 halibut. 11 lingcod, 1208 rockfish, 145 sand bass, 1 sanddab, 91 sculpin, 108 sheephead, 1 treefish, 94 whitefish, 2 white seabass, and 43 vellowtail.

Saltwater: As the season develops and the water

temperatures edge upward, inconsistency seems to be the rule. Bluefin tuna have been a model of non-conformity, as they have been biting one day and tight-mouthed the next, moving up and down between northern Baja and southern California waters from ten to fifty miles offshore. The week previous, the main body of fish seemed to be across the border and moving toward San Clemente Island and the outer banks. This past week, the fleet has been more centered on the Finger Bank about 30 miles northwest of Ensenada and reporting anywhere from a handful of fish landed to occasional wideopen bites resulting in limits.

Previously biting primarily down deep on sinker-rigged bait and heavy jigs, bluefin tuna have been feeding throughout the water column, with fish coming

on the troll and surface irons and poppers early in a bite, then sinking out to favor up-and-down methods. While always metering for schools, more sightings of surface activity are witness to the quantity of fish spread out in our area within 2-day range of Point Loma. Though the bluefin counts dropped a bit, every trip out carries the anticipation of limit-style fishing with all the activity out there.

White seabass are showing well at Catalina and San Clemente islands, and even a few in our local water near La Jolla and off Point Loma. One remarkable catch was a 67.6-pound white seabass, his first ever, caught by 15-year-old Davis Morgan while fishing with his father at Catalina. That is an amazing catch for anyone who has targeted the species for a lifetime. The father-son duo also caught four yellowtail and three other white seabass to finish out their day.

Another notable catch was of a louvar caught aboard the Grande during a 1.5-day bluefin run. Louvar are an odd-looking oceanic species rarely caught by commercial or recreational anglers. They are pinkish in color and can

get to over six feet long and 300 pounds, and though they tend to remain in the upper water column from the surface to 600 feet deep, louvar are often found in deeper waters where sportfishing boats and commercial fleets do not normally target. Louvar have a bulging head with a small mouth and feed primarily on jellyfish. Though not endangered, they are very rarely caught. Louvar are highly prized as table fare, with some claiming they are the best eating fish in the sea. Once in a blue moon, louvar fillets can be found at fresh fish markets, but usually, when they are caught they are kept and not sold. If available, louvar fillets can sell for \$50 per pound.

Yellowtail began biting well a week ago but have since seemingly been fasting. Good numbers of decent-sized fish have been spotted, but few have been willing to bite. So far, the best yellowtail fishing for the better grade of fish over 20 pounds has been at San Clemente and Catalina islands, while the Coronados have vet to produce with any consistency. The fish are there, just not quite active enough to keep any full day boats from chasing bluefin a little further offshore. As long as conditions continue to improve, I expect that Coronado Island yellowtail bite to develop soon. Normally, bonito,

barracuda, and yellowtail counts would be much higher by mid-June, but any boat with the legs and time is targeting bluefin tuna while they is still near enough to do so.

Calico bass aren't being stubborn at all. When the currents set up right, that is, flowing into the kelp from the outside, calico bass are biting very well wherever there are kelp beds. Given that about three calicos are released for every one fish caught, and that few boats are fishing the kelp, over 1300 fish kept in a week is remarkable fishing for "checker bass." Though May has been gray and June thus far gloomy, the inshore fishery is heating up for private boaters and kayakers, while both bays are producing well for halibut, shortfin corvina, and spotted bay bass. For those with their feet on terra firma, barred surf perch and California corbina are biting in the surf, especially along rips and where sand crab colonies are found. The options are many and they're out there, so go get 'em!

Bright Idea

- For Alexander Leszczynski, 22, of North Redington Beach, Florida, it wasn't enough to be charged with wire fraud, bank fraud and money laundering, the Tampa Bay Times reported. The U.S. Attorney's Office in Tampa claimed Leszczynski might face up to 30 years in prison for making up charitable entifies to receive Payroll Protection Plan loans totaling almost \$200,000 and trying to deposit fake checks to the tune of \$2.7 million, among other schemes. But wait, there's more! "When he discovered that the money had been frozen, he attempted to have it released by producing a fabricated pardon purportedly signed by former President Donald Trump," the U.S. Attorney's Office said in a news release. One of Leszczynski's fake charities was trying to seize control of two properties that belonged to Jeffrey Epstein, the disgraced financier who died in prison while awaiting trial on sex-trafficking charges. Leszczynski is being held without bail at the Pinella's County Jail.

I'll Just Have Water, Thanks

- Investigators in Vancouver, Washington, looking into the sexual exploitation of children uncovered another nasty habit of Stephen Sharp, a night manager at an Arby's restaurant there. On May 10, Fox11-TV reported, Sharp admitted that he had downloaded and distributed child pornography. After conducting a search of his digital devices, police also found a video of him urinating into a container of milkshake mix from Arby's. He confessed that he had done so at least twice for sexual gratification. Sharp said it would have been added to another bag of mix and used during the next shift to make shakes for customers. Officers are seeking people who might have ordered a shake on Oct. 30 or 31, 2021, and still have a receipt; Sharp is facing multiple charges and eating institutional food at the Clark County jail.

I hope they'll come forward and turn the vandal in." "People think it's funny, but a lot of hard work and effort went into getting the grant to get this painted," Graham said.

Finland shares an 830-mile border with Russia, the longest of any European Union member.

furniture. Then we see a room so small that there's just enough space for a pair of benches flanking the walls, plus a fireplace. I like this cozy little nook, but it also seems that it would get entirely too hot once a respectable fire got going. Luckily, there are plenty of windows, at least a few of which seem to open.

A formal dining room offers seating for eight at the table, plus a padded window bench, built-in hutch, and glass-doored China cabinet — and another fireplace. A butler's pantry contains a double sink and prep area, and that's before we get to the main kitchen, which, while nice, is probably rivaled in size and opulence by those of most modern tract homes. It does adjoin a second informal dining space, where the oversized wood baseboards and molding add some classical style without overwhelming or darkening the room.
