Rodriguez recedes, Robinson rises

Former fire chief heats up race for ex-Marine's seat

Four years ago, Christopher Rodriguez arrived on the scene, looking like one of North County's most promising Republican up-and-comers. An Iraq war veteran who was once awarded a Purple Heart, he still sports a high-and-tight Marine haircut. During Oceanside City Council meetings, he's told stories about how he had to look after his younger siblings when his gang-banging, drug-peddling dad would get violent back home in Chicago. Rodriguez's campaign ads have used the tagline "No excuses" to highlight his initiative and self-reliance. He uses photos of himself standing next to farmland to show that he is a farmer (though he also sells real

Oceanside. (A lion's share of his campaign donations over the years were given by developers.) Rodriguez did say that he is in the prime of his working career. "We billed \$150 million in sales last year," he says of his real estate company. And he says that past political campaigns have cost him income. "Unlike most of the others on the city council, I am not a retiree." Oceanside city councilmembers get about \$40,000 a year including benefits.

The deadline to file for all city offices for the November election is August 12 at 4 pm. Districts 1 and 2 are up for election. Rodri"seven property loan defaults since 2018." This fall, Rodriguez is facing two lawsuits that claim he failed to repay debts he took out to buy property. (Of those lawsuits, Rodriguez says, "In California, you can sue a ham sandwich.")

In his first year in office, Rodriguez caused a stir after his full-time city council aide and fellow ex-Marine Michael Murray announced he was running for California's 76th Assembly district, hoping to unseat Democrat Tasha Boerner Horvath. A video then surfaced of Murray performing a ribald comedy routine. Murray explained that had had once been a semi-professional comedian, and that the video hailed from those days, when he used the same brand of humor used by Richard Pryor or George Carlin. Murray eventually dropped out of the Assembly race and resigned

spoken at city council meetings in support of the high-density North River Farms project, which was rejected by voters by nearly two-toone. (Rodriguez voted for North River Farms.)But retired nuclear plant administrator Dan Dominguez, who is also running in District 2, says he was against North River Farms. Then again, one city hall observer warns that this year's city council election could be the year that "The foxes take over the henhouse." Should Robinson get elected in District 2, and should former Deputy City Manager Mike Blessing follow up on his potential plans to run in District 1 and get elected, then four of the five council members would be ex-City of Oceanside employees. They would join former city manager Peter Weiss and former Oceanside policeman Ryan Keim. Blessing has not yet pulled paperwork.

Rodriguez says he would not rule out other political runs in the future.

ENCINITAS

Hold onto your buttsCity considers smoking ban to lessen litter

The city of Encinitas has taken a step toward banning all public smoking of tobacco, leaving only private property or the interior of a moving vehicle for lighting up. Smoking is already prohibited on beaches, parks, and trails. Now, the Encinitas Environmental Commission is recommending that the city take it to the streets. "On every sidewalk, walking through downtown, North El Camino Real, Encinitas Boulevard, walking down the 101 — all the

estate). Youthful, photogenic and well-spoken, Rodriguez positioned himself as a winner. And sure enough, he won his first race for city council four years ago, besting the second place opponent by 17 percentage points.

Then in 2019, he boasted, "The Republican party asked me to run against Congressman Mike Levin in 2020. I turned them down. I just felt I had too much to do for the city of Oceanside."

Rodriguez eventually did run against Levin in the June primary. But while his pro-life, progun Trumpian platitudes attracted campaign donations from across the country, Rodriguez and his message did not sell well here. He drew an underwhelming 9.7 percent at the polls, putting him in fourth place after incumbent Levin and two other Republican challengers. Then, when Rodriguez ran for mayor in 2020, he lost to Esther Sanchez by 11 percentage points. And on July 22, the "C-ROD" political bus pulled off the road.: he made the surprise announcement that he would not be running for a second term as Oceanside's District 2 city councilman.

When asked for specifics, he says he is not going to be working for Congressman Darrell Issa. Nor does he have any plans to work for any of the developers longing to build out guez says the only way he would change his mind and run again is if Fire Chief Rick Robinson changes his mind and decides not to run. Robinson is retiring as Oceanside fire chief on July 29, and he has announced he will run for the District 2 seat, which covers the northeast quadrant of Oceanside. "When I heard that Rick was running, that was when I decided to pull out," says Rodriguez, who says he thinks the fire chief is well suited for the job. "I am endorsing Rick Robinson." For his part, Robinson says he accepts the endorsement: "I welcome anyone who lives in District 2 who wants to support me."

While it might seem that Rodriguez would be the sort of fresh face that could become the darling of the Republican establishment, GOP love eluded the ex-Marine. He did not get the endorsement of local or state GOP central committees when he ran for congress. In fact, two fellow Republicans on the Oceanside city council, Peter Weiss and Ryan Keim, decided to endorse Brian Maryott over their own city council colleague. And Rodriguez has many detractors. The Oceanside Votes Facebook page regularly proclaims that Rodriguez is an "unscrupled former house flipper," and documents his legal issues, noting that he has had his city council wages garnished and has had

his position as a city council aide, which pays between \$80,000 and \$103,000 annually. Some contributors to Murray's Assembly race included developers who sought and received city council approval for their projects.

This year's Oceanside city council election could alter its pro-developer direction. Mayor Sanchez often votes on the losing side of a 4-1 vote, with the majority supporting high density projects with inadequate on-site parking. Fire chief Robinson has previously

New COO unsmudged by Ash Street debacle, still has to handle homeless crisis

On July 28, San Diego Mayor Todd Gloria revealed his longawaited pick for a permanent Chief Operating Officer for the city: Eric K. Dargan, former Chief Operating Officer of Public Works for the city of Houston. The

announcement came close on the heels of last Tuesday's 6-3 city council vote in Gloria's favor to sign the controversial Ash Street high-rise settlement, loudly backed by interim COO Jay Goldstone, who held the city's permanent COO spot during the reign of Republican Jerry Sanders, Gloria's longtime mentor. Goldstone went 19 months under Gloria. "In this instance," said Gloria, "I'm excited to welcome someone who will come to the city unburdened by the way we've always done things in the past and instead bring a fresh perspective to the way that we operate."

In a news release from the mayor's office, Dargan said, "I have a genuine passion for tackling significant challenges and making municipal operations as effective as possible for the people they serve." though he offered no specifics. A cvideo of the mayor's announcement event was later posted to the city's YouTube page. "I pledge to be transparent," says Dargan in the video. "I pledge to be innovative; I pledge to enable staff to do what they do on a daily basis, and to really run their organizations. I'm here to serve them. I'm here to assist them, hopefully to remove any obstacles that stand in their way." Referring to his departure from Houston after two decades, Dargan said, "Retirement is just a name for a new chapter in life. I'm looking forward to this new chapter."

Current acting Chief Operating Officer Jay Goldstone is also a public agency

retiree, pulling two public pensions, one due to his service as COO for city of San Diego — \$55,829 in 2021 according to the *Transparent California* website — and the other from the city of Pasadena, where he was finance director — amounting to \$111,059 last year. Those numbers, combined with his 2021 acting COO salary of \$272,642, total \$439,530.

When the city advertised for a new COO in February, the salary spread for the permanent position was given as between \$300,000 and \$400,000. According to GovSalaries.com, which lists his title as Chief Operating Officer, Dargan's 2019 City of Houston compensation was \$220,626. "This salary is 269 percent higher than average and 273 percent higher than median salary in City of Houston," per the site. Neither Gloria nor Dargan spoke regarding the amount of his compensation during the video. The mayoral news release was also silent on the matter. During the video, Gloria said a city council confirmation hearing is set for September 12. Until then, Goldstone will continue his acting tenure. Dargan is scheduled to take over on November 1, according to the mayor.

Regarding the mayor's sputtering efforts to deal with the city's burgeoning homeless crisis, Dargan said, "If I had an answer to the homeless situation, I'd probably be a millionaire by now. I don't have an answer for you today, but that will be on of the top items on the list that we will be evaluating...Stay tuned."

More on Dargan from the release: "An Arkansas native, Dargan attended college in Texas, earning his bachelor of science in electrical engineering from Prairie View A&M University. He went on to earn his masters of science in electrical engineering at Michigan State University in 1991. While working at the City of Houston, Dargan received a Certified Public Manager accreditation through Sam Houston State University in 2007."



Weeklies masquerading as dailies When is a daily newspaper no longer a true daily? That's the too-close-to-home question that's been raised by the Medill School of Journalism at Northwestern University in Chicago. "Across the country, rising costs and shrinking demand for printed publications have changed the very definition of 'daily' newspapers," notes a July 27 online account of the move to so-called e-newspapers, being touted by San Diego's *Union-Tribune* as the paper's inevitable

future. But industry skeptics told Medill that the adoption of PDF replica papers risks killing the business. "Wall Street has told newspaper chains that they have to be digital and give up on print. That is a big mistake," Medill quotes Oklahoma print publisher **Phillip Reid** as saying. "How do you have a newspaper with no paper?" After *U-T* publisher and editor **Jeff Light** revealed in early June that his paper would not



away. As a subscriber myself, I'm happy to know that." Whether or not Vore's sunny take proves correct, as the specter of becoming a movie studio looms over the site of the Los Angeles Olympic Boulevard plant where the long-suffering *U-T* has come to be printed alongside its *LA Times* sister, those wishing to bet on the San Diego paper's future as a going concern face a narrowing range of dire options. Contributing

to the recent gloom are the departures of *U-T* staffers **Beto Alvarez**, the paper's Digital Creative Director, who went to work at the *LA Times* in June, and Black columnist **Charles T. Clark**, who also announced he was leaving the paper the same month. "This will be my final column as a regular columnist at the *Union-Tribune* as I am stepping away to attend law school," said a Clark June 3 missive. "Frankly, I expect things are going to get worse before they get better. There are times when I look at

our political parties and our judicial system and feel that the house is already on fire and there are no exits."

Ward heeler San Diego Assembly Democrat **Chris Ward** took off on a summer junket to Israel, per a July 19 report by Sacramento-based *CalMatters.com*. "The Israel trip is among a handful of junkets on which state lawmakers have embarked during their month-long summer recess, which ends Aug. 1. These trips are

typically funded not by taxpayers, but by special interests that lobby the Legislature," noted the item. "The trip was sponsored by the California Jewish Legislative Caucus Leadership Foundation, a nonprofit affiliated with the Legislature's Jewish caucus, and funded by the Koret Foundation and the Jewish Federation of Greater Los Angeles. Lawmakers were also asked to contribute \$1000 to the caucus' foundation to help

cover expenses." Van Nuys Assembly Democrat Jesse Gabriel, who also went along for the sort-of-free ride, told *CalMatters* the payment would come from his campaign fund. Lasting from July 5 through July 12, the junket's members included, in addition to Ward and Gabriel, Assembly members "Buffy Wicks, Isaac Bryan, Evan Low, Robert Rivas, Luz Rivas, Blanca Rubio, Freddie Rodriguez, Matt Haney, and Richard Bloom; and state Sens. Ben Allen, Scott Wiener, Steve Glazer and Susan Rubio. The CEO of the Koret Foundation also joined, and two staff members of the Los Angeles Jewish Federation were there for most of the trip." Gabriel was quoted as say-

ing purpose of the travel was to "learn about developments in Israel and the region; explore opportunities for partnership on issues of mutual concern such as water, the environment and technological innovation; and help lawmakers better understand the Jewish community and our relationship to Israel." Koret has also given UCSD \$1.3 million to study marine archeology in Israel. "This three-year award

cigarette butt can end up in the sea. As proof of the problem, O'Connor showed the commission a one-gallon container stuffed with his findings over just two days on walks around Encinitas: over 2000 butts.

O'Connor proposed the idea of a citywide ban, along with commissioner Katie Cramer, after learning about the local impacts of cigarettes, and how the city of Manhattan Beach (for one) has enacted a full ban. An ordinance could reduce the city's cleanup costs, a staff report said, because cities are required to maintain streets, storm drains, inlets, and other infrastructure. The State Water Resources Control Board requires cities to develop strategies to address trash in state waters, and by far, the cheapest way is to reduce the use of plastics. That duty allows the city to develop measures that target litter sources; Encinitas has already

tobacco products. Now, having been first to pass a plastic bag ban, commissioners are hopeful the city will extend the current rules.

The commission approved the ordinance as recommended, 4 to 1. "Not allowing people to smoke in any public space in the whole city - I'm not on board with that," said dissenter Christian Adams. The root of the problem, the commissioner said, is the manufacturers of the plastic filters, "and there's not much we can do as a body here to combat that." As for the ban, "I think it marginalizes people. I know smoking a lot of times is lower-income folks, and so if someone doesn't have a yard, now they're having to smoke inside." He added that it's often the homeless who are smoking outside. "They're going to get a ticket for smoking because they can't smoke in any public space, so I'm not for the way this is written. For someone who's walking their dog and wants to smoke a cigar, I feel like there should be spaces where people can smoke." He agreed with others who suggested more outreach and

"I think it marginalizes people... if someone doesn't have a yard, now they're having to smoke inside."

banned plastic utensils, bags, Styrofoam, balloons, and plastic straws. An ordinance that bans the outdoor use of tobacco products will help keep yet another plastic item out of the storm drains. "I think it's a wide perception among people that it's biodegradable," said commissioner Robert Switzler.

A state bill proposed in January 2022 would have banned the sale of all single-use tobacco products. Then in April, supporters felt betrayed when California's Single-Use Vape and Tobacco Ban was changed to remove cigarette filters and cigar plastic filter tips from the bill. Now, with no state action on reducing cigarette butt pollution, O'Connor said it's up to cities. According to data from the County Department of Health, 18 cities and the unincorporated areas ban or restrict smoking in parks, beaches, or trails. Coronado, Del Mar, El Cajon, Escondido, La Mesa, and Oceanside, restrict smoking on sidewalks. A staff report said that El Cajon has the most comprehensive restrictions of any city in the county, affecting multi-unit residence common areas, sidewalks, streets, plazas, stores, stadiums, taxi and buses lines, common areas of shopping malls, and enclosed and unenclosed areas of hotels, businesses, restaurants, bars, and other public venues. But even the strictest allow it in some

In 2014, Encinitas passed a ban on smoking within 20 feet of city beaches, parks, trails or outdoor dining areas of eating establishments. Another local rule, enacted in 2020, required signs at the point of purchase stating that the sale of tobacco products to those under age 21 is prohibited by law. That year, the city also banned the sale or distribution of any flavored

education should come before a ban, a matter on which the city council will decide.

Commissioner Cramer said the enforcement mechanism should be worked on further. "I do definitely see the homeless population typically smoking, and we don't want to penalize those people economically." She pointed out that even though smoking on the beach has long been banned in Encinitas, "every day I'm on the beach, people are smoking, vaping — teenagers on the beach vaping." If the city were to become tobacco-free, it would go a long way toward prohibiting smoking on the beach, she said. "Because if you're smoking on the street, smoking down the steps to Swami's — you're just gonna bust it out and keep pulling the vape out on the beach, too."

Not just cats in trees Rescue report includes lizards, horses, even a sea lion

On July 11, Camo, a five-year-old veiled chameleon, escaped from his indoor-outdoor cage in a Mission Hills home. His owner, Paige Martin, took to social media to ask for help. "I live next to a row of Juniper trees, so he will likely climb to the sunniest spot at the top of the trees," she explained to her neighbors. "He will be hard to spot in the greenery, but he turns bright green and yellow when he sleeps, so it will be easier to spot him at night. I'm asking you all to please keep an eye out for him." Martin, a 28-year-old boat charter coordinator, put up fliers between Washington Street and University Avenue in her neighborhood and passed out photos of the cone-headed chameleon within her two-story apartment complex. One neighbor offered to fly a drone above, and another provided binoculars to help in the search.

Later that day, Martin's neighbor upstairs yelled, "Paige, I see Camo!" Martin ran upstairs to look out her neighbor's window, where she could see Camo hanging out on a branch of a juniper tree. "It's quite a ways down from where he escaped," Martin recounted to me, adding, "He is like my child."

Martin ran to the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department Station 8 on Goldfinch by Washington Street. "I rang their emergency bell and let them know what was going on. I told them, if Camo were a cat, they would

definitely do it. So they immediately followed me back to my apartment with their ladder." She shared photos of the rescue. In the images, a fireman wearing orange gloves climbs a ladder up into the tree's branches, about 10 feet away from the apartment complex. Another fireman holds the ladder still from below. "And the amazing men at the SDFD saved him for me!" Martin concluded.

The San Diego Fire-Rescue Department responded to 67 animal rescue calls over the last couple of years, according to the San Diego Fire-Rescue Foundation. Other rescues involved birds and farm animals trapped in wells, drains, fences, and ditches, or stranded in floodwaters. Animals have fallen down cliffs and hillsides. and have even been rescued from car engines and dashboards. And of course, some cats get do stuck in trees, just like Camo the chameleon.

Notably, the non-profit's site adds that the fire department made seven horse rescues; in five of those cases, the horses were ground-lifted; the other two were rescued by helicopter. At about noon on June 24, Customs and Border Protection requested San Diego Fire-Rescue Department to the Lower Otay Reservoir to help rescue a CBD agent and his horse, General. The two had been stung by a swarm of bees and needed medical attention. The Chula Vista Police Department assisted as well. First, the border patrol agent was extricated using SDFD's Copter 1 and transported

to a local hospital. Then a veterinarian had to check General's condition and see if he required sedation him before extrication, as the loud noise from the helicopter and the wind downforce of the propellor might panic a horse and make it move abruptly. "[Initially] the SDFD technical rescue team tried to walk him out, but General was waiting for the helicopter option," reads the fire department's caption underneath the posted res-

cue photos. "So the backup plan to perform an equine hoist rescue using Copter 1 was implemented. The hoist took place at about 3 pm, and General was successfully taken to the landing zone. No injuries!"

And in January, first responders and Sea World were called about a rogue sea lion roaming about in the middle lanes of Highway 94. Then the same sea lion was captured waddling in a Chollas Creek stormwater channel in April. The sea lion was nicknamed Freeway by his rescuers, and is reportedly under the close watch of the Sea World staff.

There is a person out there, perhaps somewhere in San Diego, who fancies themselves an "MLS writer." That's the opening pitch line for Phoenix House, otherwise known as a large concrete block of a home at 1660 Brahms Road in Cardiff by the Sea. It's also a sentence I've been pondering for an excessive amount of time, and it leaves me wondering if perhaps what the real estate industry needs is more artsy, emotional

ing presentations.

The rest of the promotional verbiage isn't nearly as perplexing, so I won't spend as much time with it as I have in some other Unreal entries. You can, however, find plenty of interesting turns of phrase to describe this week's home on the website of noted East Coast architect Sebastian Mariscal, who contributed design efforts to the 7268-square-foot mansion when it was built

in 2012.

Okay, let's get on to the house. From the front, we see plane after plane of solid concrete with no visible windows. At the base of the driveway, there's a steel-barred garage entry gate instead of a residential garage door. SAN DIEGO IN BOOKS — OUR CITY IS MENTIONED BY AUTHORS OVER THE AGES

IF CALIFORNIAN LAW ALLOWS the Catholic Church to hold a weekly bingo night for its congregation in which the victors are rewarded with a cuddly toy, then the Indians can lay on 24-hour bingo for \$500,000 cash prizes or more.

And that is what the tiny band of Sycuan Indians have done on their meager "reservation" about 40km east of San Diego. Like the City of London, it is a single square mile (2.6sq km). A decade ago, it was an island of poverty surrounded by the increasingly prosperous landscape of southern California. It had abysmal roads, poor health services and sub-standard housing....

There are 95 Sycuans in the band, about a third of whom work for the casino, including the 20-strong tribal police force, who wander the gaming tables with guns at their hips watching the profits flow in. The punters come mostly from the San Diego area: Latinos in the service industry; Chinese small businessmen; Anglo-American retirees who would rather squander their pension on a night at the tables than sit in front of the television.

And the profits are sizable. The tribe is run by a seven-member council, headed by an elected chairman, the modern-day chief. In the past ten years, they have ensured that tribe members receive a tax-free annual income (they will not say how much), free housing, and scholarships for their children.

Around the corner from the casino, there is further evidence of some of the millions frittered away by punters: two sparkling fire engines belonging to the tribal fire brigade, a medical clinic, several small ambulances and a fleet of Sycuan coaches....

If current trends continue, the Sycuans suade the tribal council that you deserve an income for life paid for by the punters of San Diego.



FRIDAY MAY 14, 1849 At 4 pm, weighed anchor & at 4V2 underweigh for San Diego where we arrived soon after noon & 24 hours from Santa Barbara. This is the meanest place of all, not a morsel of fresh provissions & the town is 4 miles from the anchorage. The harbour is good but the tide very Strong. A Ship in entering can pass through the Kelp or can Reef outside of it just as circumstances may govern. I passed round it in 12 fms water. 4 fms I carried until up with the Bluff, then three for about lA mile when we depend into 10 & 12 fms.

In entering, keep within 100 yards of the Bluff on the larboard side & within half your width of the point on the North Entrance of the harbour.

it looks like there's a window looking down at the atrium from the second floor, so hopefully, that bodes well for natural light working its way inside at some point.

Next we see a room that's completely barren, save for a greenish art installation on one wall and a single wooden bench. The floor is grav tile, the walls are walls gray wood, the ceilings are gray concrete. A sliver of light peeks in from the roof and bounces off the top of the canvas, so perhaps this is where the light is creating its art? "Beams of light filter through multiple gaps and skylights to cast cool shadowed transitions between well-thought-out rooms," is how the listing puts it.

Another dark room has one wall of brown wood to contrast all of the gray, and a wall of opaque window panes. Why are the panes obscured like they're a bathroom window? The leather chairs in this room would look more comfy and inviting if there was some light in here, but as it is, we're looking at the waiting room of a private detective's office in some gritty '40s crime noir.

More rooms bring more gray, and a lot of it. Finally, though, we get a shot of a living room and dining

area beyond, which feature massive walls of (nonobscured) glass looking in on the courtyard. And we have at last seen a splash of color, thanks to the flooring and furniture. With the sunlight pouring in, the second floor is actually quite pleasant — even if it still feels a bit like we're in a commercial setting, as opposed to a residence.

The kitchen does a neat trick, in that it doesn't look like anything except a center island and a bunch of wood-paneled walls. But a closer look and a second picture show us that everything you'd expect to find in a kitchen - ovens, refrigerator, counters, microwave - is hidden behind these fold-away cabinet doors. This could be a quick and easy way to hide your mess during a dinner party without actually having to clean up.

An office/library offers a desk tucked into one corner, built-in shelving all around holding all manner of books and knick-knacks. and (so far) the only television we've seen in the house, plus a pair of retro modern leather chairs that are either incredibly comfortable or very awkward to sync up with their respective ottomans. A second office is so spartan that it looks like a prison cell, but there's a pleasant patio with a huge door off to one side that does a great deal to save the vibe.

From there, we get to a bedroom with the same spartan look, but once again, a massive sliding door (this one opening to a pool) saves the space — at least when it's open. The bathroom is a bit confusing, though once again, a wall of doors retracts

to open it to a garden space. The giant jetted tub is nice, but it's surrounded by wood decking, which is a bit worrisome, because wood notoriously doesn't like water all that much. There are also two shower heads poking out of the walls, but no shower enclosures and, as far as I can tell, no drains. Just walk in and let the water spray any-

where? I guess that's one benefit of having a house that's virtually all concrete. We finish the bedroom suite in a massive wood-lined hallway with a vanity at one end and a bench in the middle. I'm guessing these are hidden wardrobe closets that echo the kitchen cabinets, and that this space is between the bedroom and the "entire room is a shower" bath.

After passing through some more rooms outfitted in varying degrees of drab, we pop out onto what's honestly my favorite part of the house: a rooftop patio with an outdoor kitchen. There's all sorts of greenery going on here, from shrubs to flowers to what looks like a grass lawn growing on the roof of the living room. We also get our first glimpse of the ocean, which until now I had forgotten was just a quarter-mile from the edge of the property. On one hand, I very much want to set up a lounge chair on this rooftop lawn and look out at the sea, but on the other hand, this is very high up and there are no railings to speak of, so this is probably not considered living space.

A few more twilight shots of the grounds wrap up our tour, and then we're back out in the street, where I'm as confused as I was before we went in. The quirky skylights do add a bit of interest to the interior, and the outside garden spaces are excellent. But I also can't shake the feeling that I've just been inside a museum or corporate conference center rather than a house.

Binats: a conversation

"Hey, Eduardo!"

Pedro, 16, shouts out some joking conversation that's way too fast for my halting Spanish. Luckily, he's talking to his three pals and not me. The four of them, all 16-year-olds, have plopped down for a coffee at Buona Forchetta's place on Orange Avenue. Eduardo, Diego, Daniel, and Pedro. The thing you can't help notice about Pedro is that he is cherry-cheeked, blond, and very blue-eyed. Which makes all the it more, well, pleasantly shocking,

"There's a lot of people from Mexico City at Coronado High," says Pedro. "But at high school here, you speak mostly English. In the school yard, groups do break down by language." National groupings, it seems, still rule. He says there are differences in the programs they're taught by. "It is a different system here. The math is more advanced in Mexico. Like, your 9th grade here is more like our the 7th grade in Mexico. But here, you can be more flexible with what classes you like, what you don't like. In Mexico,

when he comes out with perfect teen Spanish, interchanging with English, as he joshes away with his friends.

This language thing: I have to say, it really impresses me. These are kids who show a prowess for language, a dexterity with language, and a refusal to be intimidated by it. Pedro comes pouring out in Spanish and then does seamless switchbacks into perfect, cool Californian. And all his pals get it. What *I* get is a tinge of something I haven't felt in a while: envy. It's not just fluency. It's today's science-backed knowledge that you're smarter if you have command of two languages and the cultures that spawned them. I also envy the joy of getting inside thoughts and ideas and expressions that have taken cultures thousands of years to arrive at.

We get talking. These four guys all go to Coronado High School. And they all come from Mexico City. Chilangos. So what's it like, being a Chilango at Coronado High? you have to take your 14 different classes, whether you like them or not."

But they say the big difference is the social atmosphere: "The freedom to move around that you have here, we don't have in Mexico. Like, here, you can go out at night, you can go biking with your friends. In Mexico, you can't. You can't just go walking out of your house, like go to a store to buy some things. Not at night. Because it's dangerous. All over Mexico."

These guys are all from privileged families. They come from private schools in Mexico City, and they're not ashamed to have abandoned Mexico's social experiment with free public education. "Public schools in Mexico are bad. It is really dangerous," says Diego. "People who can't afford private school don't have anything. And if kids like us came to that school, they would want to fight us."

"Public schools in Mexico are really low class," says Daniel. "Here in San Diego, you have like, the highest class goes to public school and it doesn't matter. Our parents haven't brought us up to fear poorer people, because not everyone on the street is [bad], but they do fear us being abducted because we are from wealthy families."

"Yes," says Eduardo, "I guess you just have to live with the fear. Of course, it can happen anywhere. But here in San Diego, it's just not so dangerous."

"In Mexico, there are zones," Daniel says.

"Like, we all live in a certain zone, near each other. We just go to our friends' houses," says Pedro. "We don't go into other zones. It's not safe. That's how we live."

But when it comes to talk, their choice is still Mexico. They're almost bilingual, but if they have a choice of language? "Spanish!" They all say. "It's just more comfortable."

And other languages, indigenous to Mexico? "I had a nanny who talked to me in her language," says Pedro. (It was possibly Mixteco.) "But I didn't learn it. The only language we are encouraged to learn, apart from English, is French. The problem is, they speak so fast."

But here in San Diego, when they're talking away in Spanish, do they ever get pushback from American kids? Like, "Come on man, you're in America. Speak English."

"Yes, at school sometimes," says Daniel, "but only from kids who don't understand Spanish. It's a pity we don't all speak both languages."



In Tijuana, you ride the rollercoaster that is the city and then you wait in line to leave. The journey out of one of the most chaotic cities in the world culminates in an equally chaotic funnel of migrants, border crossers, and adventure seekers. There is always something happening in *la pinche línea*. If you've never experienced it, imagine an open market mixed with a circus amid slowly moving traffic. Businesses and people are similar in both the San Ysidro and Otay *garitas*, or ports of entry: sellers offering a variety of burritos, Clamatos (seafood cocktails),

ice cream (*diablitos* being the most popular), tiger blankets, *zarapes* (ponchos), flags, unofficial NFL gear and other sports clothing, churros... There are curious crafts, from the Grogu-shaped coin bank to the giant figures of Jesus or the saints, to pictures showing *Scarface*'s Tony Montana hanging out with El Chapo and Escobar in a room crowded with poker chips, cigars, and other nonsense. Everywhere, people are hustling. There are beggars with no limbs, while the more ablebodied collect garbage or clean cars. You can hear rappers rhyming

for a coin and live norteño bandas mixing with the noise of honking horns. You can watch jugglers, breakdancers, and mimes like the interpreter "Ferdusol," Tijuana's own Michael Jackson, moonwalking between cars. You may even see Shrek going from car to car with his stuffed Donkey. As for me, my car's windshield wipers are busted, so when the vendors selling wipers notice me, they descend like hawks.

THE SEAGULLS

I have been crossing the border from Tijuana into the United States at San Ysidro since 2012, but I used to cross mostly as a pedestrian. When you're a pedestrian, you get to the queue and you wait. The wait can be painfully long, and sometimes people cut the line. But it's still not as bad as crossing by car. When you're a pedestrian, you don't have to worry about the gaviotas — the seagulls. "They call them gaviotas because they swoop in front of you like seagulls, without care," says Luis López, who regularly crosses the border by car. "I cross daily early in the day through San Ysidro. I either go through the regular or the Ready Lane, depending on what line seems faster. Sometimes, I'll even go to Otay," nine miles away. "Not letting gaviotas cut in front is a struggle. People throw their cars into traffic, not caring if they crash into you. In a way, you have to team up with both the driver in front of you and the one behind you to not let the gaviotas in." Sometimes, the gaviotas pay drug addicts to stand or lay down in front of other cars so that they can cut

the line.

the Ready Lane at San Ysidro, back in 2019. A beat-up old Chevy with an old man behind the wheel cut in front of a newish Mazda CX-3. The middle-aged woman driving the Mazda wasn't having it. She jumped out of her car and stationed herself outside the Chevy's driver side window. "Señor ¡¿Por que me chocó?! ¡Bajesé del carro que ahorita nos vamos arreglar! Ahí está la patrulla y ahorita vemos como le hacemos." The man sank guiltily into his seat, his eyes cast down in shame. The woman was not moved. She tapped the window of the Chevy and kept right on yelling. Back in the Mazda, the passenger took the wheel and kept the car moving forward as the woman made sure the Chevy stayed put. As the line kept moving and I rolled away, I saw the traffic police approaching the scene in my rear

On June 2 of this year, I had another gaviota moment, one I helped to go viral. This time, the fancier car did the offending: a black Mercedes Benz cut the line right in front of a traffic cop by the Hospi-

view mirror.

tal General — and right next to me. The cop, who was on foot, motioned to the driver to get out of the line and into another lane. The driver did not comply, and instead challenged the cop to a fight in the middle of the street. The woman in the Mercedes passenger seat recorded the scene with her phone. So did I. The line moved forward. The driver got back in his car, almost ran over the traffic cop, and resumed waiting in line. The cop called for back-up and caught up with the driver, again motioning for him to pull over or get out of the line. Then suddenly, the driver grabbed the cop, hit the gas, and ran into the car in front of him, dragging the cop with him. The cop and driver fought, and this time, the woman passenger got out of the car and started smacking the cop as well. The line moved forward and I missed the end of the altercation, but reports from Tijuana news sources used the video I posted on social media. They said that the driver and passenger left the scene of the crime with no repercussions.

Gaviotas are the most stressful part of my crossing experience. I still haven't crashed or bumped into another car, though it feels like I come close to it every time. I have had all sorts of experiences in the line — from peeing in a bottle after waiting for over four hours, to making it to work three hours early because the line just wasn't there for some reason. Wild things tend to occur, things that can shut down the border for anywhere from few minutes to more than an hour: car crashes, attempts to smuggle drugs or people, bomb threats or other dangers. Sometimes, it's just that the Border Patrol is understaffed. I cross a couple of times a week, and I try to work my schedule so I travel when the border is not as busy. But it's always a gamble, one I tend to avoid taking on Sundays or long weekends.

THE GROUP

There are two border crossing sites in Tijuana: Otay and San Ysidro. They are both divided into three sections: regular, for everyone with or without documents; Ready Lane, for those who have a passport with a Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) chip in it; SENTRI (or Global Entry) for members of the government's Trusted Traveler GOES system (the best way). San Ysidro also has a Medical Lane for people who have been issued special medical passes. It's a special lane that cuts the regular lane, and it often gets abused, as the passes can be sold to almost anyone for around \$11. I've never used the medical lane. They switch its location from time to time: the most recent location is all the way on the left side of the regular San Ysidro crossing.

When I cross, I usually take a short video of the moment I arrive at the border line and upload it to the Facebook group Como Esta La Linea. It is the largest group devoted to informing members on the current situation on the Tijuana border at San Ysidro and Otay, and it is oftentimes the best source for the most recent information in either garita. I update with comments on how fast I am advancing. It gives me something to do while I wait. Luis Lopez is also a member; every time he crosses, he posts his wait time with a screen capture of a timer from his iPhone.

The group's Facebook page is constantly inundated with posts. Some share memes; some ask about the border; several just comment with a "" so they can keep track of the status updates; some do Live Facebook feeds of their wait times. A few break the rules of the group and try to advertise their services or businesses — in which case, they get a warning. If

they ignore that, they are banned from the group. If you have lost your visa, ID, or passport near the border or in the trolley, there is a good chance that someone will post a picture of your documents (with some of the information blacked out) on the page.

Everyone has their own way of posting information into the group, some more popular than others. One of the most popular posts is by a woman who dubs herself Reporte Biker. She usually posts a selfie, a video, several pictures, or a combination of these, and informs the group about all the lanes in San Ysidro. As she weaves through traffic with her motorcycle, the Reporte Biker sees more than those who sit in their cars and wait. Riding a motorcycle is the fastest and best way to cross the border if you're trying to avoid waiting in line, even better than having SEN-TRI or Global Entry.

If you don't use Facebook or are not a member of the group, there are many other ways to check the border status, though they are not as reliable. There is the CBP border wait application for your phone (and other nonofficial apps). Some radio stations announce the border wait times either every 30 minutes or every hour. You can also dial 7007000 on your phone to hear an automated voice tell you the number of cars per lane after a short advertisement. I find that one of the most reliable ways is to check Google Maps, check the traffic

marker, and see how far back the traffic is backed up (the red line indicates congestion). If the line is as far as Hospital General, I expect the wait to be between an hour to an hour and a half.

THE SIGNS

The border line changes constantly. The Ready Lane through the Vía Rápida had its lanes switched early in 2022. Before 2022, the right two lanes on Vía Rápida went straight to the Ready Lane port of entry, while the left lane took you to a bridge that connects to the road for Playas de Tijuana. Gaviotas used this left lane to cut to the middle lane, while the right lane usually had traffic cops. Now, the two left lanes take you to the port of entry, while the right lane takes you to Playas de Tijuana, crisscrossing with the help of traffic police before Deja Vu, a strip club shaped like a Mayan pyramid. Speaking of the pyramid, there are several landmarks along the Ready Lane to give you an idea of how long the wait time will be. Hasta los tubos amarillos, meaning "all the way to the yellow posts," means that you

are in luck and the border wait will be a breeze (less than 10 minutes). Puente Las Ballenas, the bridge with the painted whales, means that you have 20 minutes or more to go. Pasando el Deja Vu or al principio del puente a Playas means the line is near the strip club; this could mean 45 minutes to an hour. Then there are several landmarks that could be from 1-2 hours: the Nissan Dealership; or Pa-

lacio Blanco, which translates to the white palace that is City Hall; Hospital General, or Parque de las XVeras, the park that is not a park, where girls turning 15 take pictures with their chaperones. If the reports say the cars are past the Motel Premiere, a famous sex motel in the city, the wait is going to be around two hours. If it's past the neighborhood named La Veinte de Noviembre, it could be more than three

hours. Many times, local traffic intermingles with the border line, so that it looks longer than it is. If the line is behind where the two freeways merge, you might as well plan to spend the night in Tijuana, or cancel any work appointments you have. It's not only a very long wait, but it also means that gaviotas will be extra aggressive, and the whole border will become an insufferable mess.

OTAY

Sometimes, the Facebook group informs us it's faster to use the regular lane instead of the Ready Lane. People that have SENTRI complain and call it "LENTRI" (as in slow). SENTRI and Global Entry users also have their own Facebook group to share updates. Other times, the group says it is faster to go through Otay. Though it's nine miles further from downtown

Tijuana, I've gone to Otay a handful of times. Every time, I have gotten a bit lost when trying to find the Ready Lane. To enter the Otay Ready Lane, you have to follow old rusty signs that are almost illegible, drive on the Tecate-Tijuana highway next to the border wall, then take a right on Boulevard de las Bellas Artes, and another left on Boulevard Garita de Otav. There is a barricade separating the Ready Lane from the regular lane, which is on the east side of the same boulevard.

The landmarks in Otay are different. *Bajando el puente*, meaning "at the bottom of the bridge," refers to the last vehicle bridge before the Otay border. That's around a 20-minute wait. *El Monumento Raro* refers to an odd 45-foot monument just a few yards before the bridge — expect a 30-minute wait. (The real

name of the structure is ¡Nosotros Aquí!, or "Us Here," and it represents the dynamism of the Otay region. It was built by visual artist Oscar Ortega in 2010. The metal plate with the text explains that the statue was stolen in 2021.) One hundred vards before the structure, there's el alto, which refers to the stop sign at the intersection of the Boulevard Garita de Otay and Avenida Alejandro Von Humboldt; it indicates the one-hour mark. This is where gaviotas tend to cut in at Otay. Por el hospital is the section before the stop sign, next to a children's hospital. Por la frutería refers to a corner that used to host a fruit store at the intersection of Boulevard las Bellas Artes and Avenida José Manuel Salvatierra — expect an hour and a half. Por el Negro Durazo is by the famous seafood restaurant — around two hours. Before los campos de beísbol means more than two hours, and get ready for it to be a mess.

Even when I'm not in Tijuana or planning to cross the border, I check Como Esta La Línea, just out of curiosity. If it's busy, I sigh out of relief that I'm not there. If it's empty, I wish it was a day that I had to cross to work. The border seems to be always on the news. For border crossers, it's a lifestyle. But as I finish writing this, I am aware that I have to cross the border tomorrow, and the stress from what might happen is already getting at me. The Facebook group is reporting that the lines are slow in both Otay and San Ysidro because of a bomb threat earlier in the day. That should be cleared by tomorrow when I have to go to la pinche línea, but I never know what awaits.

A poem for August by Seamus Heaney

Late August, given heavy rain and sun For a full week, the blackberries would ripen. At first, just one, a glossy purple clot Among others, red, green, hard as a knot. You ate that first one and its flesh was sweet Like thickened wine: summer's blood was in it Leaving stains upon the tongue and lust for Picking. Then red ones inked up and that hunger Sent us out with milk cans, pea tins, jam-pots Where briars scratched and wet grass bleached our boots. Round hayfields, cornfields and potato-drills We trekked and picked until the cans were full Until the tinkling bottom had been covered With green ones, and on top big dark blobs burned Like a plate of eyes. Our hands were peppered With thorn pricks, our palms sticky as Bluebeard's. We hoarded the fresh berries in the byre. But when the bath was filled we found a fur, A rat-grey fungus, glutting on our cache. The juice was stinking too. Once off the bush The fruit fermented, the sweet flesh would turn sour. I always felt like crying. It wasn't fair That all the lovely canfuls smelt of rot. Each year I hoped they'd keep, knew they would not.



Seamus Heaney (1939-2013) was an Irish poet and is considered the greatest Irish poet of the latter half of the 20th century. He was awarded several prestigious literary prizes to support this claim, including the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1995. His profound insights into everyday places and happenings — especially those found in the natural world, a prevalent setting for

many of Heaney's poems — are underscored by a keen eye for detail and equally keen ear for the harmony of words. Heaney also sought to address — or "redress" (as he said in his Nobel Prize acceptance speech — the sectarian violence in his homeland by rising above the political polemics to instead see "The Troubles" through the lens of the poetic imagination, thereby achieving a greater human and historical context by which to understand his country's plight.




The Dog Days are upon us

San Diego's Warmest Weather, on average, should occur in August through early September, according to statistics compiled from several decades of measurements taken near the San Diego International Airport. In an average year, coastal residents enjoy an average daily temperature of 70°, which compares favorably (depending on your viewpoint) with the January average daily temperature of 55°. The range between the high and low is typically 10° or less this time of year. August's warm, semi-tropical weather will eventually give way to September's and October's slightly cooler days interspersed with occasional heat waves brought on by Santa Ana conditions — dry, hot winds that sweep down the mountain slopes from the interior.

The Term "Dog Days" traditionally refers to a period of particularly hot and humid weather occurring during the summer months of July and August in the Northern Hemisphere. This period of



Dial M for Murder

For the uninitiated: Alfred Hitchcock's 1954 film Dial M for Murder, about a man who attempts to blackmail an old schoolmate into killing his wife after he has discovered that she is having an affair with an American crime fiction novelist, was itself based on a stage play. So we're not cribbing from the movies here, people; we're getting back to the single-set heart of things. And what a set: viewers of a certain aesthetic sensibility may find themselves wishing they could slip down the stairs, pour a hearty slug of something brown into a glittering crystal lowball, and ease themselves into one of the elegant Mid-Century seats that dot the stage. Maybe light up a cigarette while they're at it — everybody smoked back then! —and enjoy the elegant action in style and up close. And the action is elegant: fast-talking and intelligent, hurtling forward through its plot intricacies with such energy and aplomb that it sometimes forgoes any sort of pause for emotional effect. For the initiated: the adultery that sets things in motion is here changed to a same-sex affair, and smartly so. An American crime novelist could probably afford to have a bit of personal naughtiness on his resume; but a lesbian romance with a married woman makes for a proper '50s scandal, and a ruined career gives our writer something extra with which to work when it comes to motives and machinations. Even so, this is a Bad Guy's Show — look at his intelligence and cunning, how awful and yet compelling - and Nathan Darrow commands both the role and the stage as the canny cuckold Tony Wendice. Million Dollar Quartet

It's a genius premise: take a real-life Big Moment — the one time that King of Rock and Roll Elivs Presley, Man in Black Johnny Cash, Father of Rockabilly Carl Perkins and The Killer Jerry Lee Lewis met and played together at Sam Phillips' famed Sun Records recording studio in Memphis — and weave a story around it that can serve as a showcase for the music. The odds are pretty good that you know the songs, which include Perkins' "Blue Suede Shoes," Lewis' "Great Balls of Fire," Cash's "Folsom Prison Blues," and yes, Presley's "Hound Dog." It's better than going to see a cover band, because the actors aren't just imitating the real-deal pop-culture giants (the outfits, the hair, the dancing, and oh yes, the music) they're portraying them. And it's better than a biopic, because you get that live-music thrill - doubly so, because it's played in the context of when it was shaking the foundations of society. It's not remember when, it's you are there. The thing is brilliantly designed to feel good, and it does, which is all the more remarkable considering just how sad the story is. (As narrator and protagonist Phillips puts it, "I wish those boys had had a little more happiness in their lives." And he's in for a rough night of his own.) Such is the power of the musical Muse; we clap and cheer at stuff born from poverty and pain. (Phillips again: "I ain't never

heard a rich man make a good record," and dead brothers abound among our stars — for starters.) Ben Van Diepen's Lewis seems designed to steal the show, and he obliges in acrobatic fashion, but Lance Arthur Smith's Phillips grounds the proceedings and keeps it from becoming a Greatest Hits album. The Remarkable **Mister Holmes**

It is surely a sign of Sherlock Holmes' greatness as a character that he can both flourish and entertain in modernized TV adaptations, big-budget action adventures, and here, in a comic musical that still manages to convey his appeal amid the frequently broad jokes and often clever songs. The Powers That Be at North Coast Rep looked back on their history and discerned that their audiences liked Sherlock Holmes and musicals, and so Artistic Director David Ellenstein signed up Omri Schein and Daniel Lincoln to write this, the story of the time Watson left town and was replaced by his

sister Sheila, who admires Holmes but sings that he is "blinded by a vanity/ that borders on insanity/ you also lack humanity/ and haven't got a clue" before turning to the audience and winking, "See what I did there?" She arrives in town at the same time as several other parties: a new manager at the Hotel Magnificent, plus a religious congress and a touring jewel exhibition at said hotel. When the various clerics (all played by one actor) start turning up dead, Holmes is brought on to help with the case, Sheila very much in tow. Leads Bart Shatto and Sharon Rietkerk get the best and smartest of the songs, which is as it should be. (Some of the rest move the plot along and not much more.) There's probably more reliance on bawdy bits and humorous mispronunciation than is ideal ("That's encrapment!" cries an accused foreigner), and the play seems much more interested in the dynamic between Holmes and Watson than the accumulation of corpses — but then, it is a comedy.

The Black Phone — In his first turn as a full-blown villain, Ethan Hawke stars as "The Grabber," a serial killer whose plans are diverted when his latest kidnap victim, 13-year-old Finney (Mason Thames), begins receiving calls from the disconnected phone in his dank basement accomodations from five previous fatalities offering advice on how to bring down the executioner. The first hour affords viewers more genuine nerve damage, not just garden variety jump-scares, than any Blumfield horror outing since Paranormal Activity. As much as I'd like to call it, "It done right," the masked killer's motivation remains too big a mystery. And if phone calls from dead victims weren't a big enough strain on one's critical thinking, we rely on younger sister Gwen's (Madeleine McGraw) telekinesis to solve the crime. It's a great mask — an update on Lon Chaney's toothsome killer in London After Midnight — one that changes expression with the lighting. As much as I admire Hawke, the grinning veil provides most of the chills. Whether she's cursing out ineffectual police or bartering with Jesus for her brother's life, the film belongs to

Dwane Johnson has a ball putting on the dog, and is it me, or has Chris Rock's screeching delivery reached a level of annoyance on par with that of the late Gilbert Gottfried's unremittingly kvetching Iago? With a voice that lands somewhere between "Cuddles" Sakall and Dr. Mengele, Hanks waddles his way through the neon mist like a pregnant Godzilla looking for a gaming table on which to laze, 'Twas a foodie that killed the beauty, and as ludicrous as it is to blame the Col. for all of Elvis' woes - he's no more responsible for the King's drug addiction than Little Richard (superbly brought to life by Alton Mason) - it sure is fun watching the estate of the late singer try. And did we really need "Elvis has left the building" as the film's curtain line? 2022. — S.M. ★★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

Everything Everywhere All At

Once — A film that lives up to its title. Forgive the prudish tone, but for once, I'd have gladly sacrificed the f-bombs and duelling dildos that warranted an R rating so that parents would have felt more comfortable taking the family to a madcap mother-daughter (Michelle Yeoh and Stephanie Hsu) bonding experience that ranks amongst the most emotionally affective to emerge from the endless wash of fantasy adventures. Confusing? You bet. (Can't wait for the detailed knowledge the pause and rewind buttons on my blu-ray remote will bring.) Silly? Yes, but in a good sense. Beneath the lunacy lurks shots that continually offer something fresh to behold. And despite a running time of almost 2 1/2 hours, it never dragged. Whoever came up with the idea of making the center figure in this cosmic action comedy a middle-aged laundromat owner who holds in her hand the fate of the world deserves a medal. The writing-directing team of Dan Kwan and Daniel Scheinert (the team that brought us Swiss Army Man and now fly under the collective billing The Daniels) pushed the genius one step further, doubling down on their moxy by casting Yeoh in the lead. With strong support from prolific character actor James Hong and Jamie Lee Curtis at her least glamorous... if such a thing is possible. 2022. — S.M. ★★★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

Fire of Love — They were the world's only volcanologist couple, and it was their mutual passion that ultimately brought about their demise. The love shared by Katia and Maurice Krafft wasn't going to burn out of them, it was only going to get hotter. They saw a side of the planet few will ever experience, and captured it on film for the world to see. Clad in comical tinfoil suits, they looked like actors in Grade Z sci-fi cast as the first humans walking on mars. They didn't take their work home with them so much as they returned to the real world long enough to pick up cash to finance their next venture. (Katia transformed her images into art books, while Maurice hit the lecture circuit with his short films.) Maurice shrugged off any mention of being a filmmaker, but the imagery he brought back revealed the eye of a consummate artist. It's rare that I judge a film by its trailer, but by the fourth viewing of the preview for this one, my review was written. Sara Dosa was up to the task of shaping Maurice's footage into narrative form, while the narration — written by director Shane Boris, Erin Casper, and Jocelyne Chaput - and

given voice by a decidedly dispassionate Miranda July, perfectly complements the mood of the piece. I couldn't wait to see this in a theatre, and neither should you! 2022. — S.M. ★★★★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

Marcel the Shell with Shoes On -Animation pioneer Max Fleischer was the

first to let audiences in on the creative process; his live-action presence opposite his pen-and-ink prodigy, Koko the Clown, delighted viewers. A century later finds Dean Fleischer-Camp (no relation) sharing the frame with Marcel, a one-eved mollusk with two red shoes. Rotoscoped Koko would do his best to fluster Uncle Max. Giggling in delight at his own stop-motion seashell, Fleischer-Camp made it too easy to spot the pea in his shell game. It began as a YouTube series created by the director and his then-wife Jenny Slate. The shorts hit big and this feature length release plays like a series of videos strung together. Isabella Rossellini delights as Marcel's world-weary grandma Connie while Slate gives voice to the monocular conch. Her squeaky-throated delivery was more in need of subtitles than early Guy Ritchie. Marcel felt like an equally benign, albeit more enlightened variation on Barney with enough topical asides thrown in to appeal to adults. Am I the only one not going slugnutty over Marcel? I wish I was more enthused, but a little moralizing, a lot of sentiment, and a self-aggrandizing celebratory cameo by 60 Minutes' Leslie Stahl did me in. 2022. — S.M. ★★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

My Donkey, My Lover & I - Theonly person more excited about summer break than her students is Miss Lapouge (Laure Calamy), who asks the class to avert their eyes while she slips into something sparkly. The song she selects about forbidden love for the grade-school talent show is racy even by French standards, but it soon becomes apparent they're performing for an audience of one: Vladimir (Benjamin Lavernhe), the father of one of her students, the one with whom she's conducting a torrid affair. Caroline Vignal wisely limits the stubborn mule interplay, all of which we've seen before. Hers is a lovely summer romance, impeccably lit and designed with color in mind. And fans of Howard Hawks' Rio Bravo knew at the mention of the title what song would ring down the curtain. 2020 — S M ★★★ (ANGELIKA FILM CENTER AND CAFÉ: LANDMARK HILLCREST; REGAL SAN MARCOS)

Nope — The time was ripe for Jordan Peele to become the next M. Night Shvamalan, but first a word about a moment in the trailer that piqued my interest. The only black horse trainers in Hollywood, Otis "OI" Haywood (Daniel Kaluuya) and his estranged sister Emerald (Keke Palmer), are the descendants of C. Martin, the driver seated atop The Horse in Motion, Eadward Muybridge's series of 12 sequential photographs that led to the birth of cinema. Rather than using this arcane nugget of film history to kick off a sly commentary on reparations for Black Americans, Jordan Peele (Get Out, Us) sees it as a springboard to a murderously ungrateful chimpanzee sitcom star and alien spaceships that resemble wide-brimmed fedoras when viewed from the crown of your head. The siblings pay a visit to Fry's Electronics in search of electronic surveillance equipment for their horse farm. If every Fry's employee were as attentive as Angel Torres (Brandon Perea), the chain would never have gone belly up. Great directors grow and advance from film to film. Peele hasn't run out of things to say, as proven by his stuffing 20 pounds worth of ideas into a 5-pound turkey. The true horror is that for the first time. his effects budget far exceeded his vision. 2022. —S.M. ★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

Paws of Fury: The Legend of

Hank — It would have been easier to dismiss if it had been the brainchild of a reverent screenwriter pitching an animated remake of Blazing Saddles, instead of a pale echo written, produced, and voiced by the man himself, Mel Brooks. Just 10 minutes into the opening weekend matinee, it became obvious why I had the theatre to myself. To a cat's eye, a dog samurai in Kakamucho (read: much caca) is just as intimidating as a black sheriff in lily white Rock Ridge. Half a century's worth of imitators separates this from its predecessor. The self-reflexive tropes, anarchic and gleefully taboo in their day, are now as forced as the fart humor. (Worse still, nothing here is more cartoonish than a grown man decking a live-action horse with one punch.) For a brief moment, the action was poised to spill off the screen and into an adjoining multiplex, but rather

than break the fourth wall at Nickelodeon Studios, we close, appropriately enough, inside a giant overflowing toilet. At 96, it's doubtful that Mel Brooks has another production in him. Let's hope he does. Mensch Mel doesn't deserve to go out in such a blaze of ignominy. Three men - Chris Bailey, Mark Koetsier, and Rob Minkoff share the director's credit, 2022. - S.M. Novak is more interested in arming his characters with clever cocktail party repartee than he is in shaping a satire. Ben receives a call in the middle of the night, asking that he attend the funeral of Abilene (Analeigh Tipton). an ex-girlfriend whose name he had to Google - that's how close they were. Why not a simple "I'm sorry for your loss, but no" for a reply? Because the victim's doofus brother Ty (Boyd Holbrook) hints that it was murder by O.D., the kind of story needed to help Ben make the leap from writer to celebrity podcaster. Drop a guy who writes for The New Yorker (read: Jewish intellectual) in East Bumfuck, Texas to deliver a eulogy for someone he barely knew? How can you miss with a premise like this? Start with the death of a young woman quickly becoming of secondary importance, and follow it up with a play-it-safe approach, tamping down the satire in favor of hammering

home a one-joke premise. With Ashton Kutcher making a fine substitute for Sam Elliott as the soft-spoken, cowbov-hatted voice of reason. 2022. — S.M. ★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

Where the Crawdads Sing — Olivia Newman makes her theatrical debut with this all for one, one feral period drama. Best-selling novelist Delia Owens is so eager to be the next Harper Lee, she might just as well have named this To Kill a Crawdad. One by one, starting with his wife, Pa Clark's (Garret Dillahunt) family flees his abusive nest, until the last one standing is the youngest, Kya (Daisy Edgar-Jones). Abandoned by dad, the young woman comes of age alone in the swampland of North Carolina, managing on her own until the day she's accused of murdering the town jock. (Why the case ever came to trial is the story's biggest mystery, seeing as how she has an airtight alibi.) What better setting is there for revisionist thinking than the deep South in the 1950s? It's the tobacco capital of America. yet nary a butt is sparked. Apart from Tom Milton (David Strathairn, magnificent as always), the munificent counsel who agrees to defend the "marsh girl," the only decent folk in town are grocers Mabel and Jumpin' (Michael Hyatt and Sterling Macer Jr.), a black couple in the mold of what critic David Edelstein famously dubbed, "Magic Negros." Drinks All Around

The Bar at Moniker General 2860 Sims Road Point Loma



I've just grabbed dinner with a friend at Liberty Public Market, and now I'm meandering toward the sound of a band coming from The Bar at Moniker General, where we are bound to stumble onto another round of drinks. The bar manager, Matt Lopez, informs us that the daytime coffeehouse gives way to a growing night scene on weekends. "We're doing live music every Friday and Saturday night from 6-8 pm, so it's a great place for people to come, have some

cocktails, and be in a relaxing space," he says. "The whole atmosphere changes tremendously compared to Moniker Coffee — the music, the vibe, the lighting, everything."

He guides me to a popular choice from the menu, Guava Clouds, S.A. (for South America). The drink features a guava foam topping — hence the name. "With the foam, it looks like a cloud on top of the cocktail." Sprinkled cinnamon shavings and a rim of black Hawaiian lava salt contrast the pale pink whip floating atop the more vibrantly pink drink. Placing a dehydrated blood orange wheel for garnish, Lopez then slides me the finished cocktail and prefaces my experience with, "You're going to get the flavors of the tequila, you're going to get the guava syrup, and some nice citrus..."

"It was kind of inspired by everyone's love of margaritas," says Lopez. "We were thinking of a play on [the classic]... so we tweaked a few things." A house-made guava syrup balances sweetness with the earthiness of Mi Campo Blanco Tequila. "It's a newer brand. It's a phenomenal 100% blue agave tequila, and

their *blanco*'s great — it's got some notes of pepper, but it's a little bit sweeter on the front end. So, it pairs really well with cocktails in general."

To top it off, Lopez opts for Luxardo Triplum instead of Cointreau. "I love the Luxardo brand, and wanted to do something a little bit different from what everyone else is doing. That also adds quite a heavy nose of orange that connects to the flavor profile of a margarita." A saline solution brightens the overall taste. "It's really simple ingredients you can use to enhance the flavor of cocktails. It pulls out the saltiness of the cocktails, pulls out the citrus notes, and I feel like it pulls everything together."

Whipping that guava syrup with egg whites creates a luscious topping that cushions the sharpness of the spirit and citrus. And there's a textural bonus as well: "I was thinking, as far as the foam goes," says Lopez, "it's somewhat reminiscent of drinking the head of a pint of Guinness. It gives a great mouthfeel and great texture... It's just creamy, in a sense"

THE BAR AT MONIKER GENERAL'S GUAVA CLOUDS, S.A.



- 2 oz Mi Campo Blanco Tequila
- 1 oz fresh lime juice
- ½ oz Luxardo Triplum
- ¾ oz guava syrup
- 1/5 oz agave syrup
- 2 dashes saline solution
- 1 dash blood orange bitters

Rim a rocks glass with Hawaiian lava salt. Combine ingredients, add saline solution, then hard shake and strain over ice into glass. Top with whipped guava foam, sprinkle cinnamon and garnish with a dehydrated blood orange wheel.



Music (plus business) **school** At first glance,

you might not peg guitarist Nate Jarrell as a high school

teacher — maybe it's the modified Mohawk. The heavily tattooed Jarrell still looks every bit the punk rocker he was nearly 20 years ago (and occasionally still is) when he toured with hardcore bands like Born Blind But for the last 17 years, Jarrell has been a fixture at Canyon Crest Academy, a perform-

ing arts mecca in Carmel Valley. "Anyone from the district [San Dieguito Unified] can go there, although there is sometimes a lottery if it's too full," he says. "It was built specifically as an arts and science school. So, we have a huge campus with music, theater, dance, cinema, humanities, and a full science department."

Jarrell is one of three full-time music instructors. "Amy Villanova leads the wind ensemble, orchestra, and everything on the classical end of the spectrum. Anne Whatoff directs all of our vocal ensembles, and I teach Recording Arts, Digital Composition, a Jazz Band class, a Rock Band class, and an afterschool instrumental conservatory." (Everyone chips in on that last one, the conservatory, which runs until about 5 pm.)

"For the Recording Arts class, we have a whole studio that we've built that is pretty substantial, especially for a high school. The Digital Composition class has the students writing their own music, mostly inside a computer environment. It's an amazing place to be, really forward-thinking."

By way of example, Jarrell notes that "We try extremely hard to afford the kids a lot autonomy, as scary as that might be. We want them to be as hands-on and real-world as possible. We have them

run their own rehearsals, put together their own recording projects and concerts, and deal with the business side of things.

The Monroes, mended

Although 1981's "What Do All the People Know" by The Monroes was one of the most popular New Wave hits ever to come out of San Diego, the band found it difficult to follow it up. Founded by local bassist Bob Monroe and Lansing Michigan-born keyboardist Eric Denton, the lineup that performed "What Do All the People Know" on The Merv Griffin Show included singer

Motels, Rick Springfield, Toto, and others. They were invited to record a song for a Yoko Ono tribute album, got listed in Billboard as a "Top Album Pick," and landed a tune called "Stones against the Rain" on 91X's Sand-Aid album (a benefit for African famine relief) However after getting tied up in record label red tape and weathering internal conflicts, the band

split. Denton went on to run Music Power and Guitar Trader. In 2007. former Monroes singer Jesus "Tony Monroe" Ortiz turned up in North County, performing with old Monroes mate Rusty Jones. Summer 2014 found Bob Monroe and Ortiz teaming up to promote the iTunes debut of music by The Monroes, along with the launch of the band's first official website

Bob Monroe announced a new band called The Remnants in 2017 Monroe soon renamed that group The Monroes, despite having no other Monroes members, and even retitled previous Remnants recordings to appear as if they were by "The Monroes." Many

Love-death deathmatch

I'm not sure how the conversation started, but an opera friend of mine asked if I had ever heard soprano Leontyne Price's rendition of "The Liebestod" or "Love-Death" from Richard Wagner's Tristan und Isolde. I admitted that I had not, and that I was surprised Price had recorded it

As far as I knew, Leontyne Price had never performed any German opera, let alone anything by Wagner. I gave her version of "The Liebestod" a listen. It was pretty. but I thought it sounded overly careful and lacked character. However, the experience launched me on a search for the ultimate "Liebestod" a love-death deathmatch. if you will.

I decided to find a soprano for the 1930s, '40s, '50s, and '60s: that pretty much covers the golden age of Wagnerian

singing. Each version of the "Liebestod" presented here comes at the end of a complete performance of the role.

Kirsten Flagstad dominated the Wagnerian repertoire in the 1930s. Her performances opposite heldentenor Lauritz Melchior are the stuff of legend. But the recordings from the 1930s require an ear that is acclimated to the hazy sound quality, and that might keep many from enjoying the miracle of Flagstad's singing. Also missing from all those recordings is the size of the voice. Flagstad had. by all accounts, the biggest voice of the 20th Century. Her fame was such that she has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, even though her presence in the movies was almost nonexistent.

After Flagstad's controversial decision to return to her native (and then Nazi-con-

trolled) Norway in 1941, the Missouri-born Helen Traubel stepped into the gap at The Met. There can be no denying the power of her voice. Traubel's voice has more steel in the tone than Flagstad's warmer sound, but that does not diminish her accomplishments. But Met general director Rudolph Bing did not renew Traubel's contract in 1953 because he thought she was making too many radio and TV appearances. That seems counterintuitive on Bing's part, as Traubel became a household name by singing cabaret and popular songs of

The 1952 recording of Tristan und Isolde live from The Bayreuth Festival is, by far, my favorite. When I first listened to it, I thought, I would have no problem paying \$10,000 and traveling halfway around the

world to hear that kind of singing live. Money aside, the real problem is that no one can sing like Martha Mödl these days. Mödl's career was more diverse than Traubel's and Flagstad's. She often sang Italian opera in addition to the great Wagner heroines. So it is no surprise that her version of the "Liebestod" sounds more Italian. The 1952 sound quality can still be a challenge, but the beauty of Mödl's singing stands out from the harsher tones of

many Wagnerian singers.

Finally: I do not consider myself to be a big Birgit Nilsson fan, as her high notes are often icv and cold. However, I have never heard anything more impressive than her "Liebestod" from Bayreuth in 1966. The voice sounds warmer here. The orchestra attempts to overwhelm her. but Nilsson's voice bowed to no orchestra. Hers is the most impressive of the "Liebestods," even though Martha Mödl remains my favorite.

Booming Balkan BBQ

"People are loving it, because it reminds Southern Californians of carne asada fries."

y grandfather was Archduke Ferdinand," says Laura casually. "He was assassinated in Sarajevo in

1914." Whoa. The assassination that started World War One? Her grandfather? Laura and Bosko, her husband, definitely hail from the Serbian and Austrian part of the world, even though they were born here in the U.S.

My buddy Kim is sort of interested, but we're standing in the sun beside Bosko's giant smoker, and this is an Escondidohot Saturday. We've just driven up from San Diego in Kim's Toyota Tundra. And, okay, like me, he's suffering from drymouth. We're hankering for a nice sparkling cold one. They're limited to cans here when it comes to beer, but \$5 is a good price for Kim's Modelo, and so's \$6.50 for my Stone IPA.

This is on East Valley Parkway. It took us a while to locate, because the actual cafe is dog-legged back from the road. But once you see it, you see it loud and clear. Red and white walls, a cute patio, a large sign — "Old World Meat Company" — and flames from Bosko's outdoor rig. This place only happens Friday, Saturday, Sunday. "The rest of the week, Bosko's running his tiling business," says Laura. Bosko has a bunch of fans watching him from the patio. They're all talking BBO, through the smoke. "The thing about Balkan BBQ," Bosko's saying, "is the meat and the

sauce. We usually combine beef and pork, and we have our own sauces."

I see plates — okay, polystyrene boxes — coming out to waiting customers. One that's open looks like it's holding a giant square torta with bright red and white salad or veggies leaking out. Another dish looks like a flatbread, laden down with meat and more red and white veggies, and a third looks like a lush hot dog with coleslaw. I check that first item on the menu: "half-pound pork and beef patty on ciabatta." But it gets interesting when I read what wraps the meat up: "with onions,

marinated bell peppers, roasted bell pepper and eggplant spread, feta, cream cheese, and butter spread (think it's called Kajmak, pronounced

> "kaymak,"), with a side of coleslaw." Costs \$11.99. That feta/ cream cheese/butter spread looks like it's a defining (and wicked) heart of all the main dishes, such as the Old World Sausage Plate (\$10.99) and the surprisingly cheap hot dog (\$5). (You can

have it American style, or "Balkan Dog.") Separate plates of pork or chicken go for \$10.99.

Then, a little confusingly, they have these two plates: the Cevap, a kebab-like grilled minced meat dish, and the Bljeskavica, basically a burger patty. "Normally, too, we offer 'Balkan Fries,'" says Laura, "They go

Kim and I split two dishes: his burger and my Cevap. They're both good, with that same feta, cream cheese, and butter base. Shamelessly scrumptious. "They're also good for people with allergies," says Laura. What we do is a beef and pork mix. We cut the meat up here, we grind up all the meat, we do everything

here. It's basic Serbian, Balkan food. Montenegro, Croatia, Hungary, all over that region. How we become involved is we used to serve at the Serbian Orthodox churches that we go to, and they had a contest back in 2008. I said, 'I'm not doing it. My husband can enter. I'm not doing it.' So of course, I did it. I basically had to cook 10 pounds of meat, put cheese in it, go there, and serve it. I never tried it. Nothing. But I wrote everything down. Next thing I know, I won the contest. Ever since then, we've been swamped. Everybody who eats that type of food knows that we made the best one. And

that's how it took off. There are about 2000 families from the Balkans in the San Diego area. We decided to build a commissary so we could expand [our production], and finished that in 2019. Then covid hit. All the catering jobs went by the wayside. Postcovid, we started cooking for people again in July of 2020."

She gets into the meaty deets: "Basically, the burger, the hot dog, and the sausage plate are the exact

same meat. They're just different shapes and sizes. They have no casein in it. Also, they're not certified gluten-free, but there is nothing in there that will hurt anybody who has a gluten

intolerance, and me and my youngest daughter have that. The first one you ordered had onions on top of it, and then you had marinated, roasted red bell peppers, which I mix. And then our other sauce is Ajvar ('eye-var'). That is roasted eggplant and roasted red bell peppers. And that Kajmak, and the combination of butter, cream cheese, and feta. That combination has become very popular. We put it on everything we make. We also put that on a bed of fries. People are loving it, because it reminds Southern Californians of carne asada fries. We call that the 'Balkan Fries.' We sell out of that like crazy."

Laura says Bosko has been a tile contractor for the past 34 years. "But he has just finished the last of his jobs that he's committed to, and then we go full time to this restaurant. And when it comes to allergies, I have a lot of people come in, and they say, 'You're the only place I can eat and feel comfortable at and know what I'm eating. You take to my concerns."

All I know is that this Kajmak flavor is da bomb, if you'll pardon the military reference. ■



Roast ducks in a row at Tom's Chinese BBQ

Tom's Chinese BBQ; 4414 University Avenue, City Heights. My plan for the day had been to check out a roast duck shop I wanted

to write about, one that recently opened up in the suburbs. But first, my wife insisted, I needed to get acquainted with an old roast duck shop, the place her refugee mom often mentions. So, Poway would have to wait; instead I charted a course for City Heights, and finally, belatedly, paid a visit to a local institution, Tom's Chi-

nese BBQ.




plug away with relatively little notice. I'm not sure exactly how long Tom's has been open, but long enough that it hasn't been featured in the *Reader* for the better part of a decade. It's been a favorite of the immigrant community for what must be at least 30 years. My wife remembers going there in her youth. She explains that, on celebratory occasions, her family would forego the likes of birthday cake

of a whole duck from Tom's.

According to her, little has changed about the place. It's still a hole in the wall on University Avenue, still all take-out, still cash only. Whole ducks still hang by the neck, browned and glistening, behind the counter.

It's not all ducks here, by any stretch of the imagination. I suspect my wife only intervened because she was actually craving the shop's crispy pork helly (\$17 50/lb)

belly (\$17.50/lb). And, when a door



Not that I needed proof this was a whole hog sort of operation. The *Reader's* own Ed Bedford

notoriously tried the pig rectum here back in 2008. That's still offered (\$13.95/lb), and the menu likewise features the intestine (\$13.45/lb), stomach (\$13.45/lb), and head (\$16/lb).

But I don't want to give the impression that the less conventionally popular parts of the pig are the reason to visit. Tom's proves an excellent, old world-style source not only of roast pork (\$17.50/lb), but also BBQ pork (\$13.95/lb) — two options where familiar cuts from shoulder to loin might wind up. You can pick up a hind leg for \$3.50, a foreleg for \$4.50, and best of all, spare ribs for \$13/pound.

We stuck to a quarter pound of the pork belly, and it was as succulently fatty as its skin was crispy, all as simply rendered as could be, and hacked into pieces with a large cleaver by the small yet strong woman working behind the counter.

She similarly got to work chopping up the whole duck we split with my mother-in-law, (\$33, or a half duck for \$17). That cleaver cut through the bones like they were breadsticks, quickly turning an intact fowl into dozens of discrete, just bigger than bite-size pieces. Once we took it home, I rarely knew which part of the bird I was eating at any moment, only that it was always that ideal mix of gamey and aromatic, the skin nearly always crispy, and the meat rich and juicy without fail.

Now I feel as though I've gotten a solid base-

line for roast duck in San Diego, and may proceed accordingly to try it elsewhere. Though it's becoming more and more clear that family will keep me coming back to Tom's Chinese BBQ for many years to come.

numbers and were not disappointed. Although the more tropical yellowfin tuna and dorado can create a fuss when they start showing with warmer water, yellowtail continue to be the main catch, with a total of 24,865 caught over the past two weeks.

In one day, Sunday, July 24th, and just counting pelagic species that migrate into our area, there were 3369 yellowtail, 546 dorado, 75 bluefin, 321 yellowfin, and one striped marlin caught by 1,301 anglers. On one day in late July 2017, 1147 anglers caught 3268 yellowtail, 709 dorado, 114 yellowfin, 71 bluefin tuna, and 1 striped marlin. Historically, the large number of yellowtail caught with a slight mix of both tropical and cooler-water pelagic species is more common during light to moderate La Niña years, which is the case now and was the case in 2017.

During the last El Niño years of 2018-2019, classed as 'weak' El Niños, the yellowtail counts were much lower in late July, while yellowfin, dorado, and bluefin counts were similar. In strong El Niño years with warmer sea surface temperatures in our area, such as July of 2016, vellowfin tuna far outnumbered yellowtail by the end of the month, and bluefin were few and caught mostly around the cooler Cortez and Tanner banks 100-plus miles west of Point Loma. Still, with hurricane season just beginning, warmer water pushing north can change things in a hurry.

Inshore, sand bass and calico bass are the bulk of the catch, with occasional halibut, white seabass, and yellowtail showing up off of local kelp beds. Halibut and spotted bay bass fishing in San Diego and Mission Bay has been very good for anglers targeting holes in the eel grass and channel edges. On the beach, surf perch, yellowfin croaker, and corbina have been biting well on Gulp Sandworms and sand crabs, while a few anglers have caught halibut using spoons or stick baits in the deeper cuts in and just behind the breakers.

Working down the peninsula, Baja anglers are enjoying a great Summer season along the cool coastal eddies off Ensenada, San Quintin, and along the Vizcaino Biosphere, where the last areas of San Diego-type kelp bed and inshore fishing. Ensenada operators are reporting good catches of bluefin tuna 10 to 15 miles out, while yellowtail and calico bass are biting well inshore. Yellowtail and dorado are also biting off kelp paddies offshore and as near as within a few miles of Punta Banda.

San Ouintin operators are getting excellent calico bass. very good white seabass, and a few halibut near San Martin Island, while the 240 and 15 banks just 12-20 miles offshore are producing limits of yellowtail along with occasional shots at dorado and both bluefin and yellowfin tuna. Dropping deeper on those banks, anglers are also reporting great whitefish, sheephead, and lingcod action on the bottom.

Further south, action is heating up from Tortugas to Abreoios, with vellowfin tuna and dorado biting well in warmer water outside. while inshore yellowtail and calico fishing that had been spotty in June, is improving. The high season for yellowtail 400 to 600 miles south along central-coastal Baja begins

a couple months after ours does here in San Diego. August through February is the best time to target the central Baja Pacific coast, with the better fishing coming after the end of hurricane season in October and continuing through the end of winter. While stifling hot in the Sea of Cortez and inland along the peninsula, air temps along the central Pacific coastal area of Baja are quite pleasant year-round, with prevailing onshore cool Pacific breezes keeping the average daytime highs in the high 70s and low 80s through most of the Summer/Fall.

With great fishing and so many viable options from our sportfishing fleet to within a days drive of San Diego, deciding what to target and where to fish can be the hardest thing about catching this time of year.

They're out there, so go get 'em!

7/24 – 30 anglers aboard the Legend 2-day run scored Mexican limits of 300 yellowtail along with 36 dorado.

7/26 - The Tomahawk called in with 75 vellowtail (limits) 9 dorado. 3 bluefin tuna. and 3 yellowfin tuna for their 15 anglers aboard for a 1.5-day run. The Pegasus extended 1.5-day trip resulted in 190 yellowtail (2-day Mexican limits) and 8 dorado caught

7/27 – 35 anglers aboard the San Diego for a full-day run caught 175 yellowtail

7/28 - The Daiwa Pacific called in from their full-day trip with 13 anglers aboard catching 65 yellowtail, 10 dorado, 1 yellowfin tuna, and 1 bluefin tuna.

7/29 – 11 anglers aboard the *Voyager* 1.5-day trip boated limits of 55 yellowtail, along with 18 dorado and 1 make shark.

7/30 – 223 yellowtail, 100 dorado (limits), and 27 yellowfin tuna were caught by 25 anglers aboard the Poseidon 1.75-day trip.

But for Bob Salem, 53, the journey is nuttily complicated: he's pushing a peanut up the mountain using his "nose": customized headgear made of a CPAP mask with a black plastic serving spoon attached to it, NPR reported. "Basically, I'm just going to ... low crawl my way up there," he said. "I mean, there's not really much to it but just to keep flicking." It's all part of the Manitou Springs 150-Year Celebration, and Salem is raising money for a local charity that works to house people experiencing homelessness. Oddly, he's not the first to achieve the feat, but he'll be the first in the 21st century. Salem is wearing kneepads and elbow pads, and a spotter carries his backpack with a snowsuit inside for the higher elevations.

Picky, Picky

- Penguins at the Hakone-en Aquarium near Tokyo are turning their beaks up at a new variety of fish after officials switched because of an increase in price, United Press International reported. The cost of their standard fare, aji, increased more than 30% over last year, so the aquarium tried a cheaper variety of mackerel. But the penguins aren't biting: "Even if they'll take it in their beaks, they'll just spit it out," head zookeeper Hiroki Shimamoto said. If the keepers mix in a bit of aji, they'll eat it, but without enthusiasm. The zoo's otters have the same impression of the new menu item. Shimamoto said they could raise admission prices, but "we would like to do our best to keep our facility a comfortable place for our guests

Recurring Theme

- Well, it's happened again: An American tourist at Mount Vesuvius near Naples, Italy, dropped his cellphone into the volcano's crater on July 9, the Associated Press reported, and then slid into the crater trying to retrieve it. Four volcano guides lowered a rope 50 feet into the crater, where Philip Carroll, 23, of Baltimore, was in "serious difficulty," and pulled him out. After officials administered first aid, Carroll and two family members were cited by police for going off the authorized trail to snap a selfie. He suffered only abrasions - and the humiliation of a trip to the police station. No word how the phone fared.

More Like 'Stupider Things'

- Thanks to the quick reaction of a semitruck operator, a teenage driver sustained only minor injuries after she allowed her car to drift into the oncoming lane of a suburban Minneapolis street and crash into the trailer, The Smoking Gun reported. During questioning after the mid-July incident, the girl denied being on her phone at the time of the crash, but Anoka County Sheriff's deputies noticed that her car's Bluetooth system was "still streaming the audio to Stranger Things on Netflix." She

then admitted to watching the popular series while driving.

CSI, Skeeter-Style

- The Global Times reported that in China's Fujian Province, investigators on a burglary case got a hot tip from a pesky source: a smashed mosquito. As police checked out the scene, they believed the suspect may have stayed overnight in the apartment; among other things, they found a piece of mosquito coil, used to deter the insects. One skeeter met its bloody demise on a wall, and investigators took DNA samples from the smear there. Analysis showed the blood belonged to a man named Chai, who had a criminal record and was arrested 19 days later for that burglary and three others.

That Sucks

- Former vicar John Jeffs, 74, was found guilty on July 13 in Northampton Magistrates' Court in England in an incident that happened in September 2020, Metro News reported. A churchgoer at the Baptist Centre in Middleton Cheney came upon Jeffs as he stood between two chairs, wearing only ladies' stockings and being intimate with a Henry Hoover vacuum hose. Although Jeffs saw the onlooker, he reportedly continued thrusting toward the Henry, which is known for its powerful suction. Jeffs was fined about \$1000 and added to the sex offender registry; he also was ordered to pay about \$240 to the person who witnessed the act.

Crime Report

- In Ann Arbor, Michigan, a serial pharmacy robber identified as Kristopher Kukola, 37, allegedly hit five CVS stores between May and July, demanding narcotics and displaying a gun, MLive.com reported. In the latest incident, on July 7, a fast-thinking pharmacist dropped a decoy pill bottle containing a GPS tracker into the bag. Police found Kukola escaping in a Jeep and followed the car to an apartment complex, where the thief jumped out and tried to flee on foot. When officers caught up to him, Kukola told them, "The guy you are looking for ran that way." 
