

#### **Covid-Con?**

#### **Exhibitors exit over pandemic** protocols, but some still succumb to virus

Over the weekend of July 21-24, Comic-Con International returned to the San Diego Convention Center for its first full-blown fourday show since 2019. But it did so without at least one long-time attendee and vendor: CJ Smith. "I've been attending since I was almost 12," said Smith, who has missed only three Cons in the last 40 years. "This year, I sat out," because "they forced us to wear masks, show proof of vaxes, and a [covid] test. It's totally un-American! If the scenario became a comic book, we'd call it What If: Comic-Con Went Communist? I'm not getting vaxxed, period. And honestly, the test is not always accurate. I personally won't go back

Palm 1 and 2 spaces at the Con itself.) Either of the two would get attendees the orangecolored wristband needed to enter the Con. Well, that and the badge that marked them as one of the lucky few to snag a ticket to the pop culture extravaganza.

until it's the way it was before November of 2019 — meaning, no bullshit rules to get in." Smith even said there was talk of a "backup Con" at a local community center.

Smith is correct in saying that the Con requested proof of vaccination against covid, or, failing that, proof of a negative covid test taken within the past 72 hours. (If the person hadn't a test, they could get tested in the

Like others who didn't want to adhere to the Con's covid protocol, Smith gave up his right to both attend and sell product at the event — likely losing rights to his booth and tickets for next year as well. Smith said four of his close buddies did not participate in the Con, and that conversations within his network had informed him that "about 70 dealers and acquaintances bowed out, too."

> David Glanzer, Chief Communication and Strategy Officer for the Con, said in a recent Forbes interview: "A few exhibitors pulled out but their spaces will be filled with new booths, and maybe some lounge space to give people a chance to sit down and rest." He added that "there are some entities that decided they don't want to do the show. [So] them losing their space is something they don't care about."

And it's not like there aren't plenty of people eager to take their places. Some fans wait years to get tickets via a lottery system; many of them are surely pleased to see people give up their grandfathered spots — for whatever reason. Teek Hall, a rapper and comic collector from Phoenix, was one Shredder and April O'Neal made an appearance. of the attendees who got access to the

San Diego Con for the first time this year; he hopes to bring more friends in the future. "I've always wanted to attend," he told me on July 21. "I've been an artist, and I drew smaller comics when I was younger; I also have tried my hand at script writing." Hall accessed the show as part of Geekscape, a group of writers and readers who adore geek culture - movies, video games, comics, and more — and talk about it on their social media pages and podcasts.

"They are strict here about the masking protocol," Hall continued. "In Arizona, most people don't wear facemasks. With all of these people, I understand and respect that.

convention I've attended," he concluded. "I hope I can return." While attending, Hall met one of his heroes: film director and podcaster Kevin Smith.

The covid protocols sparked considerable discussions on social media sites, including the San Diego Comic-Con Unofficial Blog

After the Con, Weaselbrau1, another dealer at the show, posted on Reddit: "My wife and two other people and I run an exhibitor booth at SDCC — we've had that booth for over a decade. We were worried about covid at this Con, but decided to go anyway. We were hyper-vigilant on care — masks, handwashing, bathing in Purell, etc. Two of us just tested positive this morning. [The] symptoms started between Saturday night and Sunday morning." Many commenters also admitted to testing positive for covid days after attending the Con. The thread was quickly closed down.

#### **Build Better by spreading** the spend

#### New initiative aims to move money where it's needed

On August 1, the City Council approved Mayor Todd Gloria's Build Better San Diego, an initiative that will improve services and infrastructure in lower income communities. Last summer, the city took action on parks. This time, the focus is on fire stations, mobility, and libraries. The initiative creates a new citywide developer impact fee program, meant to distribute funds more equitably, and set to go into effect on July



#### **Mission: save Mission Bay**

**Audit warns of empty coffers** and poor oversight

When the flow of lease revenue once used by the city to maintain Mission Bay and its environs dried up during the Covid-19 pandemic, the cash wasn't replaced, leaving the one-time municipal jewel vulnerable to a cascade of maintenance failures. Exacerbating the situation, two citizen committees tasked with protecting the



"The Mission Bay Park Improvement Fund's Oversight Committee and the San **Diego Regional Parks Improvement Fund's** Oversight Committee are responsible for overseeing revenues and expenditures associated with leases and capital projects within the boundaries of Mission Bay Park and San Diego Regional Parks," according to the document. But committee chairs told auditors they had received inadequate data. "Specifically, they requested the City provide more detailed project information regarding the cost for each phase of the project. For example, a breakdown between planning, design, and construction costs. The Committee Chairs also requested a cost breakdown within each phase to show the portion expended for City labor (inclusive of fringe and overhead) versus

consultant and contractor costs. Without this information, the Committees are currently unable to assess the relationship between actual construction costs and the costs associated with planning and designing the facilities. Additionally, they are not able to assess what factors are driving cost increases."

With shortness of funds, the urgency for more transparency is growing, Hanau's report suggests. "Whenever a request is made to increase funding/budget of a project that requires committee approval, detailed project estimates including factors driving cost increases should be provided to the [oversight] committees," says the document. But some key information isn't available, even to city staff. "The City does not have documentation to show routine site visits of leased properties are occurring," according to the report. "Without these site visits, the City may be unaware of lease violations, including any potential safety hazards, poor maintenance conditions on properties that could have been visually identified, or any potential liability






#### UNDER THE RADAR

Fat cats' voting scheme Proponents of an "instant runoff" voting scheme that once appeared destined for San Diego's November ballot ultimately failed to convince the city council of its merits - despite the influence of some big out-of-town money. A city-wide vote on whether to adopt so-called ranked-choice voting, as it is also known, was delayed at least until 2024 after the council's Rules Committee balked at rushing the proposal to a fall vote. The city currently holds city council, mayoral, and city

attorney primaries in June, with the top two vote-getters facing off in November. The so-called instant runoff system is more complicated and controversial. "Generally, with [instant-runoff voting], voters rank candidates in order of preference," explains a June 2, 2022, report by the city's Independent Budget Analyst. "A candidate can win outright by receiving the majority of firstpreference votes. If no candidate receives a majority, then



understand the voting system." Costs to implement the scheme are estimated at \$3.5 million, per the analysis, including "\$2.8 million in ongoing costs per election for voter education and outreach, additional ballots, and voter information. The County [Registrar of Voters] noted that the robustness of the \$1.65 million outreach campaign included as part of this total amount may taper off as [ranked-choice voting] becomes more socialized,

but expects a high-level of outreach to be required through at least eight election cycles."

So why consider such a radical switch? "Voters and candidates are tired of divisive and toxic campaigns," ex-councilman Mark Kersey told the Rules Committee, per an April 20 City News Service report posted online by KPBS. "[Rankedchoice voting] incentivizes more civility in politics. Because candidates need to win second, third and fourth place votes in ranked-choice voting elections, candidates run more positive campaigns focused on the issues." Lori Thiel of the League of Women Voters told the committee, "Communities that use ranked-choice voting see more women and people of color run for office and see more women and people of color elected."

A campaign finance disclosure covering the first half of this year reveals that much of the cash behind the proposal is from out of town, including \$50,000 on March 17 from Denver, Colorado-based Unite America. Kathryn Murdoch, wife of James Murdoch, the liberal-leaning

> son of conservative Fox News proprietor Rupert Murdoch, cochairs the board and is a major financial backer of the group. John Palmer of San Francisco private equity boutique Hanover Partners had given a total of \$30,000 by March 28. "Prior to forming Hanover Partners, John was a Vice-President with Wells Fargo Bank, having held operating roles in strategic finance, ning," says Palmer's online bio.



More of the money to drive the effort flowed from the Independent Voter Project, which came up with a total of \$60,000 in March and April, and its affiliated Independent Voter PAC, which kicked in \$50,000 on February 14. That committee, associated with Democratic ex-state Senator Steve Peace, has been heavily funded by utility giant Sempra Energy, which furnished a total of \$135,000 in December of last year.

risks to the City that may have arisen on properties," notes the audit. In addition, there may be instances of unapproved change in business operations or unapproved sublease operations."

Pointing out that not all leases involving so-called inwater improvements require inspections of the properties, the audit advises. "Given the nature of Mission Bay land [and] a saltwater bay, the City should improve its oversight and ensure inwater improvements are being properly maintained."

The integrity of two other committees vital to keeping the park intact is also called into question by the report. "The Mission Bay **Park Committee currently** has 1 vacancy, and of the 10 remaining members, 6 are serving under expired terms," according to the document. "The Park and **Recreation Board is currently** fully staffed; however, eight members are serving under

With plunging lease revenue, the concerns are growing. "The Mission Bay Improvement Fund saw a 68 percent reduction in revenue from FY2019 to FY2020, from \$7.4 million down to \$2.4 million. In FY2021, the [Mission Bay Improvement Fund] did not receive any lease revenue. Without adequate funding, capital improvements in Mission **Bay and San Diego Reginal** Parks will be hindered. A possible source [of replacement funds] would be additional allocations from the General **Fund, since the General Fund**

city law "requires that an interval of four years must pass before a person who has served eight consecutive years on the Mission Bay Park Committee can be reappointed," the auditors wrote that they "found the Mission **Bay Park Committee has two** members that are currently serving beyond eight consecutive years, in violation of the Municipal Code."

in older urban neighborhoods.

The developer fees, which range from a few thousand to over \$100,000 per home, are just one of several fees the city uses to support infrastructure. "The fees are very high in some communities and very low in others," said city planning director Heidi Vonblum. When they're low, very little infrastructure can be provided. And when they're high, there are few opportunities to provide affordable housing, "creating two realities in the city." So the goal is to make all developer impact fees consistent across the city. An annual report will keep track of the fees and amount collected.

Libraries will benefit from a developer fee that will be used to fund various library capital improvements. The fee replaces the of hoarding."

The new fees won't solve the deficit, noted Jillian Kissee, deputy director with the Office of the Independent Budget Analyst. That's because the program doesn't increase funds; rather, it prioritizes projects.

Jesse O'Sullivan, the policy counsel for Circulate San Diego, praised the fact that the new system incentivizes building smaller homes. Before, the fee was based on a building's total volume rather than its total number of units, creating what councilmember Joe LaCava called "the era of large-scale master-planned communities in San Diego."

Chris Cate, the only council member to vote against the program, said he hoped the city would prioritize communities targeted for density. According to Vonblum, the program will target investments in areas experiencing the most

existing library component of community planning area-based development impact fees. It authorizes spending up to \$500,000 in citywide funds to help deliver infrastructure "where needed." And it's needed in lots of places: under the old Library Building Plan, more than half of the city's 35 libraries were neglected. A 2016 facilities assessment found several branches in poor shape due to a library maintenance backlog: Kensington-Normal Heights, Linda Vista, Logan Heights, Ocean Beach, Paradise Hills, Rancho Bernardo, San Carlos, Serra Mesa, Skyline Hills, and University Heights.

Planning director Vonblum said the new program will create more efficiency and get projects done sooner. There is \$220 million waiting to be unlocked for certain communities, she said, and the Build Better program allows the city to use these funds. Those unspent funds come from fees that were placed into dozens of separate neighborhood funds over the years, money that never quite stretched to cover planned improvement projects. "Over time, the idea is we spend down that money," Vonblum said, and "get out of the business

growth. Thomas Mulvaney, with Livable San Diego, criticized the city for "pushing huge amounts of density in the college area — taking developer fees with no guarantee any of it comes back."

## Water woes Dam damage leads to

TIIIIANA

serious shortages
The National Water Commission has declared a state of emergency due to a

declared a state of emergency due to a drought that has hurt five states in Mexico. Baja California is on the list. One month ago, an outage at the El Carrizo Dam, which stores water extracted from the Colorado River, affected its pumping machines. Tijuana's local government deployed cut-offs in the residential water system to manage the reduction in the dam water. The rationing of water is taking place all around the city, including the outskirts, downtown, and Playas de Tijuana.

For Oscar Alvarado, who lives about 12 miles east of Tijuana's downtown in the Estadio Toros neighborhood, those cut-offs

increased during the pandemic and haven't stopped since. "You woke up ready to start the day, you want to take a shower, you think the water is flowing, and then nothing. It ruins your whole day. Can't do the most basic stuff, like cleaning your house. A friend of mine had to install a water cistern in his house because cut-offs were so frequent in his area."

Oscar said that neighbors have helped each other when this happens, especially

hygeine. Out on the east side of the city, in areas like Playas de Tijuana, inhabitants are struggling with the water situation. The water system infrastructure there is often less developed, so they use bottled drinking water instead of regular tap water for all their activities. But even for someone like Elena Flores, who lives in the private upper middle-class complex of Punta Bandera, there are difficulties. The complex has its own sewer and pipe system to provide

older people. "I've seen people who store water in tanks sharing buckets of it with neighbors next door. Right now, we just have a small water stream coming out of the tap, but then we can be out of it for the next two or three days straight."

Unlike San Diego, tap water is not safe for human consumption in Tijuana. So people there supply their need for drinking water with vessels of 20 liters each, or with smaller bottles. That's the water that gets used for drinking, doing the dishes, and for pesonal water and treat waste, but it is having serious problems getting enough water to supply its cistern. "Because we don't have water, we buy disposable cookware, which is not good, but we have found no other way," she explained. "Then we have this terrible smell of stagnated water or sewers everywhere." Elena noted that they have no water for half of the month, and thinks moving out of the neighborhood is the only way to avoid this situation.

has received funding from the Coronavirus State and **Local Fiscal Recovery Funds** program under the American Rescue Plan Act to compensate for lost revenues and associated impacts of the pandemic." To avoid a growing fiscal crunch, the report recommends that "the Department of Finance present an option to compensate the Improvement Funds for lost revenue to the Mayor for consideration as part of the mid-year budget update."

In a July 29 response, the city's Chief Operating Officer Jay Goldstone agreed with the audit's findings. "The Department of Finance will evaluate replenishing the Park Improvement Funds after considering the Mayor and Council's budgetary priorities and in compliance with the use of COVID-19 federal relief funds," wrote Goldsmith. "If approved by the Mayor, the budget amendment will be included in the

Fiscal year 2023 Mid-year Quarterly Budget Monitoring Report for Council consideration. Target Implementation Date: February 2023"

## Pecunious police still depleted

Throwing money at the problem of reduced ranks Last week's San Diego city council vote to hand out \$15,000 hiring bonuses to cops — funds poached from other government agencies - is just the latest public money-throwing action in the city's costly panic over diminishing police ranks. Notes a July 17 dispatch by TV station KNSD, "More officers have left SDPD this past year than in any year in the last decade. In fiscal year 2022, which ended June 30, 241 officers left the force. Another 12 officers have left since July 1.

About 31% of those depar-

tures were retirements: 76

officers retired last year. But

66 of the officers who left

didn't retire; they just went to work at other law enforcement agencies."

Now comes California state Controller Betty Yee with her annual public agency salary survey, including selfreported 2021 data gleaned from "cities and counties on the Government Compensation in California website," according to Yee's June 28 news release. "The newly published data include 460 cities and 51 counties," the release notes. No names are named, but the figures alone are impressive. A police sergeant made the top of San Diego's list by pulling down a whopping \$359,138, including regular pay of \$119,798 and overtime of \$219.805. along with something called Lump-Sum pay of \$5,107 and Other Pay of \$14,428. A Police Officer II came in second at \$345,336. An **Assistant Police Chief was** third with \$336,250, including a Lump-Sum of \$93,42 and Other Pay of \$35,127.





#### **Swinging for the King**




Stewart talked to me over the phone from the road; she is currently in Tempe, Arizona. She says she loves traveling with the production, a group of people that includes the eight others who were cast at the same time she was, so the cohort has a special bond. She tells me about the first rehearsal that the current group completed together, remarking that their first time "being able to sit and watch the show was very emotional for many people." It was, she says, "a magical experience, noting that in

her world, "it's a lot of people's dream to be in *The Lion King*."

Stewart says that she has been singing and performing since she "came out of the womb", but that for a long time, she had "a hesitancy to do it professionally. Fear, if we're being honest." But at a certain point in her life — after

her time in college and graduate school, and after working for a number of years with college students, whom she encouraged to pursue their dreams and use their talents — she figured, "I should probably take my own advice."

## Signs of the (bygone) times

Anyone who has been in downtown El Cajon has probably noticed the large El Cajon Typewriter Co. sign at 130 E. Main that, alas, no longer announces a real live typewriter shop. Though the internet is surprisingly short on any information about the place, its demise, whenever that happened, has been noted by a single (unhappy) Google review for the business, which awards it one out of five stars: "NOT A TYPEWRITER STORE, anymore."

No, it's not. Instead, the nicely painted sign survives atop a number of small art galleries. But I think we should be glad that the lettering is still there. Old signs almost always outdo their more recent competition, and when they

remain as part of a neighborhood, they keep up some small sense of historical continuity.

When I first walked by, I thought the sign was the only remnant of the old business, but as I kept walking, and turned right on Magnolia, then right again into El Cajon's Arts Alley behind the building, I found myself facing a mysterious window on its weathered white back.

From the middle of the alley, you can't see much of what's inside, other than a large twocolored neon sign: "Office Machines." Underneath the window, hanging on the outside of the building, is a large rectangular sign: Smith Corona Factory Outlet.

I walked up closer to get a better look inside,

and was delighted to find a well-preserved, cozy, low-ceilinged office, so filled with nostalgic feeling and alluring objects that it could have been an art installation. Maybe it was one. The atmosphere was mostly circa the early '70s. Back against one wall, past the Absocold fridge and under the Office

Station Zebra and one for 1970's Airport. A couple of tortilla-warming pouches from El Indio were hanging around as well. A clock with hands stuck at 8:40, two baseball hats (Heinz, Simpson's Nursery), more old signage from the typewriter business. There were also six chairs spread around. The desk supported a rotary phone, a barbell, and An Introduction

to Physical Geography. Behind the desk chair stood an illuminated globe.

Then there was all the Pittsburghiana: a black and white art photo of its skyline; banners for the Pirates, Steelers, Duquesne and Saint Francis University. Clearly, this guy left at least part of his heart in his old hometown.

Machines neon, stood a work table sporting a vise and a beat-up industrial lamp, plus various parts and gizmos for fixing typewriters, and a single-burner hot plate. Whether it was used for lunch or for some repair-related heating, I'm unsure.

The most intriguing Pittsburgh items were a church bulletin on the desk from Blessed Trinity parish, which sat next to a calendar from the same. The calendar was open to July 2022 and the bulletin was from May 1. Someone was still using this place, at least sometimes. San Diego schools enlist Paula the Penis as part of gender-identity instruction

Last week, conservative social activist Christopher Rufo - who attracted national attention with his crusade against Critical Race Theory in public school curricula before pivoting to what he terms "radical gender theory" — published a report on San Diego Unified documents that outline an effort to, in his words, "dismantle 'heternormativity' and break the 'gender binary." Part of that effort included a sex-ed training module produced jointly between San Diego Unified and Planned Parenthood that advised teachers to call biological males "people with a penis," because, says Rufo, "according to the district, some women can have penises."


"That's where I come in," says Paula the Penis, a biological female who regularly dons an inflatable penis costume and performs for schoolchildren all over California. "Though I was assigned a sex - female - at birth by a gender-binary-dominated societal structure, and though there is a powerful cultural association

with being female and not having a penis, by putting on this costume, I can become a person with a penis, no matter my sex, or gender, or sexuality. I'm a walking, talking visual aid, doing my part to take the trauma out of childhood."

## A Pox on the Pox





#### The whale

As we pass the furthermost finger of Hospitality Point, where the cobbled jetties are populated with pelicans and cormorants, a gray whale erupts from the waters and draws sudden breath. That's when Yippers, in what seems like a stubborn rejection of the magnificent moment, asks me, "Do you get seasick?" Yippers is actually Yip — Keith Yip (though everyone refers to him as Yippers) — and he is piloting the boat. Our boat, anyway; there are two in this particular caravan. Yip and I have a pelican *en tote*, the boat ahead of us carries three

sea lions and a team of videographers from somewhere out of the country. In reply, I cock my head in a fake "Lemme think for a sec" gesture, but what I say is, "I dunno." Truth is, I've never been out on the open ocean before. Harbor excursions, sure, and kayaking around the same-said point we're now exiting, but never a venture too far beyond

the breakwater or past the white buoys that bob in cautionary stop-sign fashion: "Now Entering the Ocean."

This is ironic, because I've lived on the coast all of my life, and have worked at SeaWorld for half that time. Yippers registers surprise at my greenness; he has stories about weathering violent

waters in half the world's oceans, while I, in comparison, just had a pretty good day, once, catching the surf at Tourmaline and landing a sunburn. But regardless of our experience gap and there being a jury out on whether or not I have sea legs, or, more importantly, a seaworthy stomach, Yip and I are on a mutual mission: we're out here today to release rehabilitated animals back out into the ocean. He's the charge of the sea lions. I've got the pelican.

There's linguistic play here. Sea lions are pinnipeds, which, when you boil down the Latin, means "feather-footed." My pelican is obviously and fetedly plumaged. So our adventure today is a return-to-the-ocean celebration for all manner of feathered things. The sea lion pups: they were nursed back to health after having been rescued — debilitated and dehydrated — from San Diego shoreline. The pelican was rescued, too, but has proved stubborn about returning, flying back to SeaWorld often and therefore needing this final deep-sea release to remind him of his home out among the waves. We named him Murph. Because of the Law and all.

I don't get seasick upon exiting Hospitality Point, and it's a grand gesture that a gray whale has arced its back in acknowledgement.

#### The shark

Fifteen minutes past the wave-breaks, there is only horizon: blue sky met by the denser blue of water. Well, not only horizon: there's something of a curiosity eddying the waters, and we cut our motors and circle the boats to investigate. It's a shark — or rather, half of one — something dredged up from somewhere deep, floating and purple at the top of the waves. The carcass is from somewhere in the cow-shark family — neither Yippers nor I can exactly identify it — but it's come a long way to the surface, seeing as it most certainly was a trenchdwelling thing. What's amazing is not only the fact that we came across this rarity (and quite by accident), but also the play of sunshine in this aqueous moment. The light is of remark: directly overhead and soundly noon-ish. We can see down and beneath this open-mouthed carcass to approximately thirty feet below the surface. With the motors of our Sea-World boats extinguished and us just floating, there is the lapping of water against the hulls, unmistakable in its hollow, slapping sound, and there is

thirty feet of vision, revealing a virtual cyclone of blue sharks swimming below. They circle, scything tail fins cutting an underwater ballet made up of simple and practiced pirouettes. Occasionally, one breaks formation to nibble at the cow-shark which, though dead, is still the conductor in all of this: the carcass gives up meat. It's nature in its most present tense, and we're accidental witnesses to it. Yippers hauls the carcass halfway onto the boat — for a picture, at least — because despite our awe, we also want to document our find and report back to the shark experts at the SeaWorld campus. What're we seeing exactly? What type of shark is this?

#### The gull

Our photos taken, our curiosity piqued, the boat plows forward; it's now half-past noon. While lurching at the bow, I repeat to myself over and over like an excited school-child: "This is amazing, this is amazing..." The salt and iodine run their negative charge, and grebes dive into the swells, their redfeathered bottoms disappearing suddenly, just shy of the boat's edges. The grebes: they take advantage of the boat's surge and pulse downwards when the boat's wake lifts upwards. I see bottoms of feet and the constant disappearing act the grebes manage, pink toes folding accordion-fashion, green-water enveloping them. Occasionally, they surface, wide-eyed, pupils pinned, with crest feathers exaggerating their surprised expression. Then they simply dive again. It's only a clumsy gull that actually takes to the boat's wake, dumbly

shaking its feathers and clapping its red-spotted bill. Clap-clap. The gull is smart and lazy all at once, certainly expecting a meal out of this, expert at looking unperturbed in the white-froth aftermath of a motor. There are flashes of metallic fish along the sides of the boat, but otherwise, the ocean is calm. The gull constantly preens its feathers in the incessant back-spray, and, in doing so, looks fairly ridiculous. Murph the pelican taps at the front of the crate with his hooked bill. We're almost home. In the boat ahead of us, the sea lions bark.

The boats stop twelve miles off the coastline. To my eye, it seems a random place, because — left and right — it's just anonymously blue. In a way, though (and you would know this, were you to cast a weight on a milelong string over the boat's

rig), we're suddenly much further out than we were mere minutes before. Below us, there's an unexpected and precipitous drop. The ocean space beneath our hull is now thrice as deep: there's a trench made evident by SONAR. It can otherwise be known by aid of a precisely illustrated underwater topographical map, which we don't have at present. This is all to say, we're actually SOMEwhere, despite the above-water feeling to the contrary.

The gulls wheel overhead as if circling an abandoned Funyuns packet left on the beach as we bob up and down on a very specific coordinate in the middle of a blue nothing. We're miles away from the shoreline, yet the gulls don't seem to know it. To them, skiff equals shore. But we don't have fish, nor Funyuns. I begin feeling a slight bit nauseous.

#### La Jolla

Twelve miles to the right of us is La Jolla, out of sight at present, where I went to school. There are limestone cliffs there that run down to hidden beaches. Unlikely eucalyptus trees cap the insedges that can cut the hand in wintertime, and softer springtime flashes of mustard grass and sea fig. La Jolla is pretty. Some guidebooks translate "La Jolla" as "the jewel," which is an appropriate and touristfriendly description. It's a misnomer, though: "la hoya" is what translates to "the jewel." "La Jolla" is more properly rendered as "The Hole," perhaps in reference to its coves and caves, or perhaps to its mostly hiddenness: an oceanfront made up of reclusive pockets, despite the fact of its famous mile of shoreline — public and well-visited — just north of the SeaWorld campus. Twelve miles out, though, guidebooks don't matter: La Jolla serves only as a triangulation point, this time the easternmost one. Usually, for me, it serves as the westernmost one, given that I have been generally inland-bound most of my San Diego life. Also because I spent a lot of time on La Jolla's cliffs, looking out to the horizon, where our boats are currently staid. That horizon is actually only a mile distant. There's a

simple math to this, but it's a math confounded by the arc of water, which feels big enough to defy measurement. It means I'm twelve times away from what I can see from the shore, and further out than I imagined I could be.

#### The blues

There's a sudden whalespout, and Yippers and I take note. We don't see the exhalation; rather, we hear it. I'm fighting the nausea that sets in when a boat stops. The skiff is floating atop the waves rather than cutting through them, and the loss of momentum has my stomach acting like a bolo bag: bloated and certainly changing shape. I'm without Dramamine. Yippers is at the wheel and my head is resting on my knees when the whale spout sounds north and to the right of us. We both look. "Lookit that, willya," Yippers says, quietly. We do, expecting another gray. An exhalative cloud breaks the surface, plumed. Then there's another. Two backs arc out of the ocean: leathery, smooth. The respirative spray dissipates and what seem like miles of backbone course the surface. We are in awe as the great mammals slip at last into the ocean. We spot the telltale caudal fins. "Blue whales. Those were blue whales." Yippers whistles. It's a moment. My stomach, in knots, flattens briefly. There's a long-ness to a blue which is an incomparable sight: the gray, in contrast, was warted, knobby and small, should you consider a school bus small. The blue is a feat of flesh, aquiline and steelcolored. Rivulets of water eddy about those last fins, telltale signs that there are

twenty extra feet of caudal mass piloting some submerged tail flukes.

This is the largest animal on the planet. Nothing else has been as big. When you see one, you know. The blue is big, and effortlessly so. And we're seeing two at once. In terms of cardiacsize, there are two VW Beetles afloat in sacks of blood and corpus, pumping away just yards from our boat. A person feels diminutive, a thimble to a large and impossible embroidery. I forget my stomach.

The crew Murph is increasingly impatient. I can see the hook of his bill through the carrier's wire grating, poking curiously through. He's necessarily tucked back in his nook, the encumbrance of his beak and gular pouch taking up the majority of the space, but I peer in and see his eyes, placed comically on either side of his narrow head, like soap bubbles halved and affixed to his face, a googly-eyed cartoon. He doesn't blink. The graybrown tuft atop his cranium is erect - and comical, too, a millenary mistake. It will be yellow two years from now, but at present, it is a dusty color and more of a cowlick than a coif. It grazes the roof of the carrier.

"It'll be just a few minutes," Yip says as he rests an arm on the boat's throttle. Across the water, camera crews — they're from the UK, I think — are readying cameras, adjusting light diffusers and reflectors, whipping up a busyness of charcoal scrim shades and tripods to capture the imminent release. The boat neighboring ours has three carriers, one sea lion apiece, arranged in a row at the back. I can't see them from where I sit, arms still wrapped around my midriff in pretend insouciance (I'm feeling every air bubble in my stomach), but I can envision their sea lion faces, vibrissae at attention and eyes all of dark soporific liquid. They are the epitome of cute: canine, with pointed faces, unlike the harbor seals which also frequent these waters. Their distinctive ear flaps are nominal things, like the ends of balloons tied off, and the auricles rest back on their skulls.


Jody is Yipper's counterpart on Boat #1, and she has donned a Sea-World jacket and gone from contrapposto to camera-ready as the videographers give her the signal. Microphones are trained. Though we are only a few yards distant, Jody's words are lost in the oceanic lull. Sounds are erased out here in the soundless deep — the opposite of white noise. It's a clear afternoon, one o' clock now, and the marine layer is non-existent. The sky is cloudless, the sea not glassy but ripe for Fata Morgana as the horizon is thermally inverted; there is a band of haze above the miledistant water. I do catch

I know this speech: I've heard it many times, and have experienced its import in full. Releasing healthy animals back into the ocean, back into the skies, back into whatever blue, is the best part of a rehabilitator's job. This is my first time with pinnipeds, but I've let loose hundreds of pelicans; plus ducks, a number of gulls, egrets, and Great Blue herons. The main culprits for debilitation in my line of work are twofold, and they are opposite: savvy and the lack thereof. Pelicans fill their pouches with fish, and what better place to find food close to surface than at the end of a fisherman's line. Savvy, kinduv. I've disentangled scads of Pelecaniformes from nylon and barbed hooks, twists of wings and pierced gulars like grotesquely knotted marionettes. Snip-snip, scissoring wires and boltcutting hooks. As to the lack of savvy: the majority of pelicans that come in are juveniles who have not vet learned to fish. Nor have they found the convenience of the wharf or bait station. They plunge-

dive fruitlessly, especially when the waters are warm and fish have run deep, and wind up emaciated for lack of nourishment. Two kilos sometimes — a third their weight down before becoming torpid and land-bound. Murph is the latter. Well actually, a little of both.

#### Murph

In true My Fair Lady style, Murph had grown accustomed to our faces. After a stint in rehab, he was released not once, not twice, but thrice — each release further away from the

SeaWorld campus. And each and every time, he would stubbornly return to perch atop the outdoor pens, floppy feet slip-slapping along the chain-link mesh, forever eyeballing the food trays of capelin. Let me in, let me in! He knew where to go - where to go to "diet," at least. He'd be allowed readmission once his weight dropped enough to warrant another round of calories. Murphy's Law: free bird doesn't like freedom.

The moment comes. I see Jody kneel to release the pins on her pinni-

ped carriers, so I ready myself at Murph's. The grates swing open for the sea lions and, on cue, the pups hobble out in goofyflippered fashion. They wriggle with their little hind ends until they're at skiff's aft, then slip into the water seamlessly, as if transforming once aqua-bound. Suddenly, they are streamline and grace. I hope for similar grace from Murph, perhaps a winging away in low camber over the water. The pups take to the sea with aplomb, poking their heads above water in quick reconnaissance — or perhaps an impish good-bye — then as quickly disappear. There is applause.

"OK, Murph — your turn." Yippers looks and dolphins. Murph misses his cue as I swing the gate open. He slaps his feet — once, twice — then cocks his head. I have to wrest his beak gently and coax him out. He half-opens his wings in complaint, then acquiesces as I slide him from the carrier. Yip chuckles. The cameras are still, so there's no documentation as I pin Murph by his humeri and steady him over the ocean. I have one hand on his bill, finger slid in between his mandible and maxillae to allow him to breathe. I halfhoist him outwards and let go. I hope for some drama, but Murph just plops unceremoniously into the deep and sits. He bobs impotently and paddles his feet as if treading water (though he's perfectly buoyant), goes absolutely nowhere. I imagine he blinks, but I see only his back, and it takes him both gumption and a good three minutes to scoot. Well, I guess I gotta go. He swims toward the open sea. Then he stops and bobs again. It's the most undramatic release ever, but while it lacks theater, Murph is at least where he belongs. There is that.

#### The dolphins

We ready the boats to leave, camera equipment and refractors folded. I'm thankful to feel the thrum of a motor: movement will settle my discombobulated stomach. Carriers are stowed, and the sea lions have disappeared. Only Murph remains steadfastly motionless as the skiffs rev into an about-face and head back toward land. Twelve miles return trip; should take an hour or so. Another twenty minutes and we'd be in Mexican waters, the golden coastal bull ring and Tijuana glinting like a rhinestone tiara. Yip accelerates and we pull alongside Jody and crew as we cut across the glassy surface. We leave a wake, the only whitewater this far out, until — seemingly out of nowhere and behind us — tiny crests appear in the distance.

Jody is the first to notice, as she's not piloting, but taking in the view. She signals to Yippers, who peers over his right shoulder and smiles. "You're in for a treat," he drawls as he slows the boat. He knows this is my first time — though he never tires of oceanic wonder, despite his veteran status — so he doesn't explain, just keeps peeking over his shoulder. "You'll want to lay down in front," he directs. I oblige, taking



my place on the bow, and looking over my shoulder, too, as the crests materialize and multiply outward. Soon the horizon is glittery with flecks of white, and — wow — there are scything fins cutting the water, blunted gray triangles cresting and falling sinuously. They look like penny arcade horses, operating as if on rigs, updown, up-down, fast approaching. We collectively decelerate, our own wakes slo-churning twin trails. We are beacons.

Quick as silver, they are upon us! Hundreds — literal hundreds! — of dolphins fast-tracking through the sea, metallic bombers with hourglass signatures on their sides. "Commons," Yippers laconically says. Delphinus delphi, and a super-pod of them! They overtake us and we gas the motors slightly to keep up. I cross my arms beneath my chin and lay parallel with the water. There are dolphins within reach, all pulsing aquiline muscle, just feet from the bow. In, out, through: they dart intrepidly, no time for acrobatics, blurs of gray and white just speeding in one collective direction. I see their caudals pump up quick exhale-inhale, backs occasionally cresting the surface, eyes determinedly open against the flow. They move like the hands of kahiko dancers, but in fast-motion: a perfect sine wave, graceful, lithe, and exceedingly able. I am dumbfounded. I remember something seemingly unrelated, something from adolescence: I saw the Grand Canyon when I was younger; the endless ravines of silt and ash and sedimentary rock; the limestone and basalt. It was too much for me to take in: sitting on the East Rim and looking out across the Canyon, the whole thing didn't fit my eye. And I'm used to things fitting in a viewfinder: <click>. I like taking pictures. But the Canyon scared me, kind of like looking at the sky and knowing it goes on forever, and feeling suddenly infinitesimal. The thing was just too big, with nothing to define the corners. Surrounded by the dolphins in their vast juggernaut forwards, I feel like I did then, not knowing in which direction to look. One can only be in it.

#### The feeding

The dolphins are echolocating something, it seems. They swing right, slightly east, but unwaveringly south. Jody and Yipper exchange shrugs, and off we tack to follow. It's apparent that we weren't their destination. We have time; we adventure. The dolphins lead us on a diagonally, then straight ahead for about twenty minutes. We're not too far off course, and the contagion of dolphins has us not caring either which way. This is a gift.

In the distance, a shape? This is Fata Morgana now, striations of lines — not static, though. Whitewater reflected up and down in the sky, floating waves — something is moving. Black specks rise and fall relative to the horizon. What is it? As we draw closer, the image snaps into focus. We are approaching a froth of water out here in the middle of nowhere. The black specks grow wings, and there is a flurry of activity close to surface. It is a feeding frenzy, and every animal in the area has somehow been alerted. There is probably some shallow-dwelling school of sardines or mackerel in

transit which has piqued the interest of not just the dolphins, but sea lions, harbor seals, and their aerial neighbors, the pelicans. The sea dogs somersault in the foam, creating hundreds of individual splashes, and the dolphins, too, are leaping and twisting back and forth, their acrobatics finally at play. Pelicans fold their wings tight to their bodies and plummet, seemingly buckshot from the sky, their pouches fully open and extended to swallow the water and whatever fish come with it. They break the surface post-dive and wing upwards, making a yo-yo of aviiformes, plunging and rising, plunging and rising. The gestalt is incredible, and we stop our motors at a respectful

distance to gawk.

from all directions - not just the pod we followed. How could a school of fish be so big as to sate so many appetites? The scope of the frenzy is big: Taj Mahal big, Mt. Rushmore big, just as monumental and just as beautiful, the animals competing in a mutual trapeze, a real-life Cirque de la Mer. We watch the water until it calms slightly, a boiling pot turned to simmer, and — respectfully — we idle away slowly, our senses having been satiated by this accidental and serendipitous feast. We tack left and return home.

How could this be, I ask myself, that so much splendor was afforded us in three short hours? A gray whale, two blues, a trenchdwelling shark, a megapod of commons, and the menagerie of every feathered and finned thing in the surrounding environs descended on one spot: it was

as if Poseidon himself were orchestrating a thank you for returning his children to the kingdom, the languorous Murph included. Speaking of: I look over my shoulder to see if our wayward pelican is hot-tailing it in pursuit of our wake, but no: just the erstwhile gulls again as we approach terra firma. They *clap-clap* their bills, the vermillion spots on their maxillae like red flares of greeting. Again, no Funyuns, sorry. We dock anonymously enough, empty crates and full hearts. My stomach is even normal by this point, and my legs have proven seaworthy. I de-boat comfortably, take one last look at the horizon. That faint black speck could be Murph. Maybe? The day has proven that, if anything, more fantastic things can happen.

Postscript: Yes, Murph did return.

## **Extreme Low Tides for Sanderlings and Willets**

Sandpipers Are Now Being Seen in considerable numbers within San Diego County's coastal wetland habitats and along the ocean beaches. Some have just arrived from the north; others are juveniles that have bred locally. You'll find sanderlings and willets scurrying along the wet sand on the beaches. Several other members of the sandpiper family can be found in mudflat areas such as the Tijuana River Estuary, the south end of San Diego Bay, the San Diego River flood channel near Sea World, and the margins of most North County lagoons.

**Extreme Low Tides** early next week occur during the wee hours of the morning. Thursday, August 11, features a -1.56 foot tide at 3:43 am. On Friday, August 12, there's a -1.49 foot low tide at 4:23 am.

Ocean Water Temperatures are probably peaking now, the

result of many weeks of summer sunshine and warm coastal air temperatures. While the water offshore seldom exceeds 70° Fahrenheit, shallow-water temperatures of 70°-80° are not uncommon on gently shelving beaches late in the day. Wide, sandy beaches such as Coronado, south Mission Beach, and La Jolla Shores are now at their best for comfortable bathing.

August 11th's Full Moon has many names, one being the Sturgeon Moon, and it rounds out this year's parade of four supermoons, which started in May. Supermoons are ever-so-slightly closer to Earth than the average full Moon, which technically makes them extra large and bright from Earth's perspective. August's full Moon was traditionally called the Sturgeon Moon because the giant sturgeon of the Great Lakes and Lake Champlain were most readily caught during this part of summer. Other names include: Corn Moon, Harvest Moon, and Ricing Moon, and signify the time to gather mature crops.

Clad in comical tinfoil suits, they looked like actors in Grade Z sci-fi cast as the first humans walking on mars. They didn't take their work home with them so much as they returned to the real world long enough to pick up cash to finance their next venture. (Katia transformed her images into art books. while Maurice hit the lecture circuit with his short films.) Maurice shrugged off any mention of being a filmmaker, but the imagery he brought back revealed the eye of a consummate artist. It's rare that I judge a film by its trailer, but by the fourth viewing of the preview for this one, my review was written. Sara Dosa was up to the task of shaping Maurice's footage into narrative form, while the narration - written by director Shane Boris, Erin Casper, and Jocelyne Chaput - and given voice by a decidedly dispassionate Miranda July, perfectly complements the mood of the piece. I couldn't wait to see this in a theatre, and neither should you! 2022. — S.M. ★★★★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

Free Chol Soo Lee — At the time of his arrest. Chol Soo Lee had 41 rounds of live ammo and a 357 Magnum in his room and he was on probation for felony theft. He was a Korean punk living in Chinatown, but the gangs never bothered him. Lee confessed to firing a gun in his hotel room that accidentally killed the gang leader next door. All of that may be true, but was it enough to convict him of murder? In spite of an inaccurate ballistics report, the prosecution copped an "all Asians look alike" defense. Lee was found guilty and sentenced to prison. While in stir, he copped a selfdefense plea to a second murder. The reason filmmakers Julie Ha and Eugene Yi never interviewed Lee and that his narration is spoken by someone else will surprise you. At the one hour point in the picture, and after a decade of retrials, the jury had finally decided on Lee's fate. The 30 minutes that followed are what separates this from an episode of Dateline NBC. One bright moment: a group of yahoos mistook a "Free Chol Soo Lee" sign to be a promotional offer for Chinese Food. 2022. — S.M. ★★★ (IN WIDE RELEASE AUGUST 17)

Mack & Rita — It's 30 going on 70 when a *Freaky Friday* wild weekend in Palm Springs goes vice versa and young Mack (Elizabeth Lail) transforms into her senior self, Rita (Diane Keaton). O originality, where is thy sting? 2022. (IN WIDE RELEASE)

#### Marcel the Shell with Shoes On -

Animation pioneer Max Fleischer was the first to let audiences in on the creative process; his live-action presence opposite his pen-and-ink prodigy, Koko the Clown, delighted viewers. A century later finds Dean Fleischer-Camp (no relation) sharing the frame with Marcel, a one-eyed mollusk with two red shoes. Rotoscoped Koko would do his best to fluster Uncle Max. Giggling in delight at his own stop-motion seashell, Fleischer-Camp made it too easy to spot the pea in his shell game. It began as a YouTube series created by the director and his then-wife Jenny Slate. The shorts hit big and this feature length release plays like a series of videos strung together. Isabella Rossellini delights as Marcel's world-weary grandma Connie while Slate gives voice to the monocular conch. Her squeaky-throated delivery was more in need of subtitles than early Guy Ritchie. Marcel felt like an equally benign, albeit more enlightened variation on Barney with enough topical asides thrown in to appeal to adults. Am I the only one not going slugnutty over Marcel? I wish I was more enthused, but a little moralizing, a lot of sentiment, and a self-aggrandizing celebratory cameo by 60 Minutes' Leslie

Stahl did me in. 2022. — S.M. ★★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

Mrs. Harris Goes to Paris — The lengths some women will go to for a Christian Dior is the topic at hand. Lesley Manville stars as the titular cleaning lady, suddenly stricken with haute couture flashes, who will wash a million floors if it means getting her foot in the door of the House of Dior. 2022. (IN WIDE RELEASE)

My Donkey, My Lover & I — Theonly person more excited about summer break than her students is Miss Lapouge (Laure Calamy), who asks the class to avert their eyes while she slips into something sparkly. The song she selects about forbidden love for the grade-school talent show is racy even by French standards, but it soon becomes apparent they're performing for an audience of one: Vladimir (Benjamin Lavernhe), the father of one of her students, the one with whom she's conducting a torrid affair. The promise of a romantic getaway is monkey-wrenched by unexpected news of a family vacation: a six-day hike through the Cévennes on which Lapouge impulsively books passage. She's the only one in the group to rent a donkey, a perspicacious ass called Patrick. By the time the group catches up with Vladimir's clan, Lapouge's inexperience with the sport, compounded by an eagerness to blurt her ulterior motive, makes for a pleasing running gag. Inspired by Robert Louis Stevenson's "Travels with a Donkey in the Cévennes," writer-director Caroline Vignal wisely limits the stubborn mule interplay, all of which we've seen before. Hers is a lovely summer romance, impeccably lit and designed with color in mind. And fans of Howard Hawks' Rio Bravo knew at the mention of the title what song would ring down the curtain. 2020. - S.M. ★★★ (DIGITAL GYM CINEMA)

My Old School - My high schoolEnglish teacher cautioned the class of graduating seniors never to return to the nest once they had taken flight. Brandon Lee could have profited from the advice. He walked away from the documentary halfway through production and his refusal to allow the right to use his likeness left writer-director Jono McLeod in quite the lurch. Here's something you don't see everyday. If imagination is key to originality, credit McLeod with the idea of introducing audiences to the ground-breaking concept of hiring an actor (Alan Cumming) to convincingly lip sync the role of his protagonist. (It isn't until well into the picture that we get around to seeing the actual Lee in file footage.) Lee, if that is his name, was the son of a famous opera singer who moved around a lot and a college professor from whom mum was separated. Or was he? The narrative unfolds in part from Lee's classmates - all interviewed in classrooms - and when there's no photographic evidence to draw from, McLeod relied on Wild Child Animation to fill in the gaps. It's a tale of what happens when a life doesn't go as planned. One key revelation was a bit creepy, but what McLeod uncovers isn't so much sinister as it is tragic. 2022. — S.M. ★★★★ (LANDMARK HILLCREST)

**Nope** — The time was right for Jordan Peele to become the next M. Night Shyamalan, but first a word about a moment in the trailer piqued my interest. The

only black horse trainers in Hollywood, Otis "OJ" Haywood (Daniel Kaluuya) and his estranged sister Emerald (Keke Palmer), are the descendants of C. Martin, the driver seated atop The Horse in Motion, Eadweard Muybridge's series of 12 sequential photographs that led to the birth of cinema. Rather than using this arcane nugget of film history to kick off a sly commentary on reparations for Black Americans, Jordan Peele (Get Out, Us) sees it as a springboard to a murderously ungrateful chimpanzee sitcom star and alien spaceships that resemble widebrimmed fedoras when viewed from the crown of your head. The siblings pay a visit to Fry's Electronics in search of electronic surveillance equipment for their horse farm. If every Fry's employee were as attentive as Angel Torres (Brandon Perea), the chain would never have gone belly up. Great directors grow and advance from film to film. Peele hasn't run out of things to say as proven by his stuffing 20 pounds worth of ideas into a 5 pound turkey. The true horror is that for the first time, his effects budget far exceeded his vision, 2022. — S.M. ★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

**Summering** — A group of small town teens happen across a corpse in the woods and try to solve his murder. Let's hope this time James Ponsoldt (Smashed, The Spectacular Now) stepped away

from the sermonising long enough to tell a story. 2022. (AMC FASH-ION VALLEY)

Vengeance — B.J. Novak the actor stars as Ben Manalowitz, a character who doesn't want to be a writer so much as he wants to be a voice. For his first feature as writer-director, Novak is more interested in arming his characters with clever cocktail party repartee than he is in shaping a satire. Ben receives a call in the middle of the night, asking that he attend the funeral of Abilene (Analeigh Tipton), an ex-girlfriend whose name he had to Google — that's how close they were. Why not a simple "I'm sorry for your loss, but no" for a reply? Because the victim's doofus brother Ty (Boyd Holbrook) hints that it was murder by O.D., the kind of story needed to help Ben make the leap from writer to celebrity podcaster. Drop a guy who writes for The New Yorker (read: Jewish intellectual) in East Bumfuck, Texas to deliver a eulogy for someone he barely knew? How can you miss with a premise like this? Start with the death of a young woman quickly becoming of secondary importance, and follow it up with a play-itsafe approach, tamping down the satire in favor of hammering home a one-joke premise. With Ashton Kutcher making a fine substitute for Sam Elliott as the softspoken, cowboy-hatted voice of reason. 2022. — S.M. ★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)



#### Cabaret

Karson St. John returns to the role that won her a San Diego Critics Circle Award 11 years ago. Her Master of Ceremonies at the decadent Kit Kat Club in '30s Berlin is also very much the Master of Ceremonies for the Cygnet Theatre in '20s San Diego, drawing the audience in with the promise of distracting naughtiness before baring her teeth and reminding them that you can't ever really leave your troubles at the door. It's one of the great and terrible parts in musical theater; not just amoral, but convincingly resolute that morality is little more than a luxury of the comfortable — rather like love. Not for nothing is her big torchy song titled "I Don't Care Much." She is the heartless world, the one set against lovers both young and old, the one that grinds the weak under its heel as it rewards the powerful. And Ms. St. John nails it. Not that the lovers both young and old don't do their best: otherwise, what would we do for a story? The production takes its time gathering the threads, but from the time the lederhosen-clad vouth waft their angelic rendition of "Tomorrow Belongs to Me" from the balcony on. the show marches with energy and purpose toward the inevitable. A couple of missed motivations and throwaway subplots (Bobby?) serve as minor stumbles, more than made up for by the versatile cast and creative staging. #### Dial M for Murder

For the uninitiated: Alfred Hitchcock's 1954 film *Dial M for Murder*, about a man who attempts to blackmail an old schoolmate into killing his wife after he has discovered that she is having an affair with an American crime fiction novelist, was itself based on a stage play. So we're not cribbing from the movies here, people; we're getting back to the single-set heart of things. And

what a set: viewers of a certain aesthetic sensibility may find themselves wishing they could slip down the stairs, pour a hearty slug of something brown into a glittering crystal lowball, and ease themselves into one of the elegant Mid-Century seats that dot the stage. Maybe light up a cigarette while they're at it — everybody smoked back then! —and enjoy the elegant action in style and up close. And the action is elegant: fast-talking and intelligent, hurtling forward through its plot intricacies with such energy and aplomb that it sometimes forgoes any sort of pause for emotional effect.

For the initiated: the adultery that sets things in motion is here changed to a same-sex affair, and smartly so. An American crime novelist could probably afford to have a bit of personal naughtiness on his resume; but a lesbian romance with a married woman makes for a proper '50s scandal, and a ruined career gives our writer something extra with which to work when it comes to motives and machinations. Even so, this is a Bad Guy's Show look at his intelligence and cunning, how awful and yet compelling - and Nathan Darrow commands both the role and the stage as the canny cuckold Tony Wendice. #### The Remarkable Mister Holmes

It is surely a sign of Sherlock Holmes' greatness as a character that he can both flourish and entertain in modernized TV adaptations, big-budget action adventures, and here, in a comic musical that still manages to convey his appeal amid the frequently broad jokes and often clever songs. The Powers That Be at North Coast Rep looked back on their history and discerned that their audiences liked both Sherlock Holmes and musicals, and so Artistic Director David Ellenstein (who also directs here) signed up Omri Schein and Daniel Lincoln to write this, the story of the time Watson left town and was replaced by his sister Sheila, who admires Holmes but sings that he is blinded by a vanity/ that borders on insanity/ you also lack humanity/ and haven't got a clue — before turning to the audience and winking, "See what I did there?" She arrives in town at the same time as several other parties: a new manager at the Hotel Magnificent, plus a religious congress and a touring jewel exhibition at said hotel. When the various clerics (all played by one actor) start turning up dead, Holmes is brought on to help with the case, Sheila very much in tow.

Capable leads Bart Shatto and Sharon Rietkerk get the best and smartest of the songs, which is as it should be. (Some of the rest move the plot along and not much more.) There's probably more reliance on bawdy bits and the comedy of mispronunciation than is ideal, and the play seems much more interested in the dynamic between Holmes and Watson than the accumulation of corpses — but then, it is a comedy. 
#### **NITE LAPSE**


#### TIM FLANNERY

# Dark Euphoria leads to dim melancholy

Bondage, bitches, and Divine talk at Queen Bee's

Alma Rodriguez, owner of Queen Bee's, escorts me into the North Park venue for "Dark Euphoria." Before the end of this July 23 night, the pulse of gothic electronica will have carried me through lessons in BDSM, speed bonding with a fellow John Waters fan, a man showing off his handmade "bitch," and — when the music stops — an unexpected emotional crash.

The volume of said music makes it impossible to have a casual conversation, but no one is talking anyway. There's a light show that pulsates with the undercurrent of layered rhythms, and we're allegedly entertained by two go-go dancers in cages, except no one bats an eye in their direction because they're all lost in their own go-gos. I see Jason, a professional sort from Texas who recently built a giant spider for a gaming company at Comic Con, transformed from the person I just met outside into a writhing mass of go-going energy. I know it's him, because he's the only other person besides me who's wearing white.

After I assure the stationary attendee who spearheaded the event that I'm not a cop, Alex Gonzales, singer for headliner Matte Blvck, is gracious enough to chat with me amidst the chaos of putting on a show. I remark that the scene has changed a lot since the subdivisions of the early days, when goths, punks, and metalheads rarely mingled without punches being thrown. "Everyone is welcome here," he assures.

"You'll see 21 year-olds that are more well-versed in the [musical] history than most people. Pretty much anyone that doesn't fit in gets to feel comfortable here."

When I ask about the connection between goth culture and BDSM, Alex doesn't answer directly — until I point out that the show was promoted with the promise of "submission demonstrations," and attendees have embraced that theme with fetish clothing, bondage gear, and lots of chains. He tells me that the creative minds behind the event thought it would be a good visual, and that some patrons like to indulge their voyeurism. He then introduces me to Matt Johnston, a practitioner of shibari, a rope

bondage art form that he learned in Japan, where it originated. Just thirty minutes earlier, I'd seen Matt expertly tying and manipulating the limbs of a tall, thin woman named Muse, putting her into a suspended position. A little nervousmaking, maybe, but the kiss he gave her in the midst of the exhibitionistic session radiated pure trust between the couple. Johnston notes that he manufactures his own rope in order to avoid contributing to the production of petroleum used in most commercially available rope. Also that until his retirement five years ago, he was in the closet about his lifestyle, because of the (understandably unnamed) conservative corporation that employed him.

A man in line for drinks is pulling hair from atop a faceless and only vaguely human doll that he has apparently brought as his date, then spreading the tufts ritualistically while mouthing something. He tells me it's his bitch, and I ask if that's why he's pulling her hair out. "One of the reasons," he responds, dismissively. After he tells me the 'do was made of masking tape and Korean hair, I'm relieved when he clarifies that the hair came from the salon floor of a Korean beautician, and not from a reenactment of the grindhouse

film *Maniac*. (The title character in that one scalps his victims and dresses his mannequin collection with their hair and clothes.) He takes his hat off, and shows me how the doll doubles as a headdress, but my attention is drawn to a woman named Camilla who's reading (in a nightclub?!) a copy of *Role Models* by John Waters that she fished out of the library

trash. We share our joy over the fact that Waters' seminal film *Pink Flamingos* finally received the Criterion Bluray treatment, ensuring that star Divine's dog shit-eating triumph will be preserved for future generations.

I leave after several attempts to get the perfect picture for this article. Eventually, I accept that it's beyond my skill and walk to my car, but at least my photo seems to mirror the fever dream atmosphere. The further I get from the event, the more the fever fades, and the less magic seems to pervade the air. There's music, but it all muddles together as I pass eateries and clubs. There are people, but

no one seems to be doing anything or being anything different from a typical Saturday night. The inebriated posturing, the complaining about not being drunk enough to go home, it all seems so fucking pedestrian. Though I'm unlikely to go to another such event for pleasure instead of on assignment, I have experienced Dark Euphoria, and now the night is not dark enough.

#### IMMORTAL BEAUTY

#### John Williams, last of the great movie composers?

The 90th birthday of John Williams will be celebrated by the San Diego Symphony on Saturday, August 13. In a previous article, I mentioned the lack of well-known composers after World War II. The one exception was John Williams

With his 90th birthday in mind, I considered the topic further. I realized that John Willimas might be the last of the great movie composers. I began wracking my mind for the last movie I had seen with great music — John Williams-level music. Could Hollywood be following contemporary composers into musical obscurity? I would argue that this is indeed becoming the case. Let's try a thought experiment. Think about a movie that has original music that you love. Not music that you like. Music that you love. Got it in mind? When was that movie

made? I rest my case.

For me, the most recent movie with lovable music is Gladiator, I think. Maybe. I did buy the soundtrack back in 2000. But while Gladiator was great, the music didn't quite have the lasting power of other movies with symphonic soundtracks.

In 2001, Peter Jackson's Lord of the Rings: The Fellowship of the Ring came out, accompanied by a sweeping soundtrack by Howard Shore. That is music that I love. In the same year, Harry Potter and the Sorceror's Stone came out. The composer for that one was John Williams.

Since then, I have struggled to find film scores that offer music compelling enough to warrant listening to on their own. Even the music of John Williams seems to have lost its way.

He composed the music for the Star Wars sequel trilogy, but for the life of me, I can't recall the music from those movies outside of the established Star Wars music from the original trilogy. Williams also composed the music for the Disney+ Obi-Wan Kenobi mini-series. (That show was more Disney Channel than Star Wars. It was written by children for children.)

Of course, it's fair to argue that the point of a film score is to support the film, not to live on its own apart from the film. So I'm not here to find fault. But in decades past, it felt like every few years, a movie came out that had music that nevertheless exceeded the confines of the movie itself. The 1960s had The Magnificent Seven, Doctor Zhivago, El Cid, and Lawrence of Arabia, along with the obvious musicals

such as The Sound of Music. West Side Story, and My Fair Lady. The 1970s brought film scores such as The Godfather, Fiddler on the Roof, Cabaret, Jaws, Star Wars, and Superman. The 1980s had Chariots of Fire, Raiders of the Lost Ark, E.T., Out of Africa, and Glory. Glory might be the most underrated film score of all time. The hit parade continued in the 1990s with Dances with Wolves, Schindler's List,

The Lion King, The English Patient — a towering accomplishment of film scoring — Aladdin, Titanic, and The Red Violin.

Once we get to the 2000s, the number of movies with great music starts to go down. In the 2010s, it almost stops. Don't believe me? Take a look at the list of Academy Award winners and nominations for Best Original Score and decide for yourself.

## **Turkish Eggs delight**

## Wild style, but also a kind of Cheers feeling

othing demoralizes an aspiring escoffier faster than requiring him to cook eggs over easy." That's Anthony Bourdain, quoted on the menu I'm looking at. Happily, I can see that this is not going

to be a problem here. The menu looks, well, exciting. The whole place looks exciting.

I'm standing at the top of the stairs, overlooking Little Italy's Piazza de la Famiglia. It's 10 am. I had noticed this line of people standing on the stairs leading up

above Farmer's Table, the eatery on the corner of India and Date. I joined them, and finally got to

the top, where I found cool folks sipping coffee

beneath salmon-pink umbrellas. Now a gal on the balcony leans over her iPad. She's assigning tables to customers as we reach the top of the steps.

"Thirty minutes' wait," she tells me.

"Is it always like this?"

"It's always like this."

So half an hour later, I'm back again, and being led into this pretty spectacular space. Or spaces. One big red starburst dominates the middle, but tops of trees reach in, while what look like live hanging gardens ring an alcove with clusters of tall slim lamps that look like Martian bean sprouts. But what you notice is the pink. Salmon-colored copper, ruffled pink umbrellas, even the beansprout lamps. And it works! Despite the hue, the space

doesn't look like a boudoir. It's muy original!

So now I sit, facing the tiled roofs over India Street, and oh yeah, Savanna the barkeep, as she mixes wicked-looking breakfast drinks, like two "Orange Joolius" cocktails with flowers sprouting

> out of them. Or a clever Ramos Gin Fizz, a kind of milkshake cocktail which grows vertically out of its glass — and holds! (\$13 each.)

But hey: this is about breaking fast, and quick. The joint's open only until three in the afternoon.

Still, even at this hour, it's acting like a pub. Most folks seem to be drinking something exotic and alcoholic. Me: cawfee. And have to say, their coffee

> (\$3.50) is so beautifully presented - in a stylish old mug, all in its own coffee set — that you want to keep on slurping. On the other hand, you're sitting among downtown's Beautiful People, so you're not expecting bargain prices. Like, we're talking around \$15 for a main breakfast dish.

> Eventually, I am down to a couple of choices. First is the Morning Glory Fried Rice. Love fried rice, but as a breakfast idea? I see it's a combo of pork belly, peas, bok choy, sesame seeds, broccolini, scallions, and a sunny side up egg. Perhaps with

a dollop of hot sauce, a fellow could fill up well on that one. Savanna says it's their most popular breakfast dish. A "French omelette" with goat cheese, salad, toast and chives costs \$15 too. "Top toques will tell you a chef should be judged by the caliber of his/her omelet," says the menu. "We're trying to be more vulnerable in 2020. So we're admitting that on our worst day, our execution is less than perfect. If we blow it, let us know it."

I like their attitude. And I'm tempted to test them, but then Savanna pipes up about the last item. "Turkish Eggs is our latest and greatest," she says.

"We've just added it. It's poached eggs in a garlic herb Greek yogurt plus roasted cherry tomatoes with crunchy garlic, dill and mint." Huh. Original. It turns out I know who the owner is, a guy who has set up a string of this town's remarkable eateries. Think Neighborhood, Ironsides, Craft and Commerce, Born and Raised, Invigatorium, on and on. He's Arsalun Tafazoli. I talked to him once, soon after he'd opened his first place, Neighborhood, downtown. He's Turkish-American, and that year, 2007, his parents thought he was going back to grad school. Instead, he ditched all that to pioneer his idea of what an eatery and pub should feel like: wild style, but also a kind of Cheers feeling. You might call it Turkish flair.

So now that I see "Turkish Eggs" are on this menu, I'm interested. "This is Day Three for that item," says Savanna. That's it. I order it. And the yogurt says it all: Turkish. Then I see the menu has a "pro-tip." "Add bone marrow!" it advises. Love bone marrow. Savanna says it costs \$7. What thu heck. I ask for that, too. And I ask for an add of crispy scalloped potatoes (\$6), because

they look so golden and, well, crispy. Marrow needs a touch of salt, but then it becomes squelchy and irresistible. And healthy!

Yes, I have spent way above my pay grade, but it's worth it for the yogurt, garlicky eggs and tomatoes. Oh man, they are delicious. The scalloped potatoes are perfect for dipping in the eggy mess, and the bone marrow adds another layer of taste. The one mistake I make is to fall for the temptation of a breakfast beer. Honestly, the coffee was the perfect accompaniment to this food. The beer? Too much.

It dawns on me: it's not just Turkish. This food has a Southern feel to it. Rich, gunky, addictive, a comfort-food way to start the day. Also, it turns out the Michelin spies have paid a visit, and given their seal of approval. Incredible, because Michelin was never known for taking San Diego food seriously.

Of course, this ain't bargain eating. With tax, I end up spending, ulp, \$44.71. And yet it feels

worth it, even though I should have stuck to that one \$16 Turkish Eggs dish and a \$3.50 coffee. That would have been a pricey but proper \$20 brekky. Sigh. Next time. And there will be a next time. Why? Because there's just enough fantasy in these surroundings and the slightly exotic food to make you feel part of a heightened, more colorful life.

In the pink, you might say. ■

## Jay's Southern Café brings BBQ and soul food to the outskirts

Jay's Southern Café; 2169 Arnold Way, Alpine. As I drive around Alpine, it starts to dawn on me that there are a lot more restaurants out here than I thought. Chalk that up to a decade-plus of going up that hill only for beers brewed by the McIlhenney family, I guess. Whenever I take the Tavern Road exit off the 8 East, I might as well be one of Pavlov's dogs, drooling at the thought of a decadently hopped IPA.

walls of stained wood, and there's maybe a halfcord of chopped oak, stacked in one corner, just outside the kitchen.

That would be fuel for the smoked BBO side of

That would be fuel for the smoked BBQ side of the menu, which covers chicken, brisket, pulled pork, and hot links. For \$17.59, I ordered a plate of the largest pork ribs I've ever seen, each some 9 or 10 inches long. Coated in a tasty dry rub, they didn't need any BBQ sauce, so it proved a wise move to have requested it on the side.

The same can't be said about the chopped brisket sandwich (\$14.50), which boasted juicy, flavorful meat but ate more like a sloppy Joe, due to loads of sweet BBQ sauce that spilled out onto the plate from a brioche-style bun. In

> hindsight, I would have preferred the spicy version of the sauce, which subdues the sweetness with a fair amount of kick.

Sides available with each order include coleslaw, baked beans, and potato salad. I can personally recommend the collard greens, and so can my

dining companion, who finished mine when I wasn't looking.

I couldn't rightfully call these Alpinesmoked meats the best example of San Diego County BBQ, but the soul food

side of the menu might make a case. My most memorable order turned out to be a basket of chicken wings (8 for \$12.99). Southern fried, they came out superbly seasoned and crispy as could be. Again, I didn't make much use of the spicy sauce on the side, and that crispy batter crust left me wishing I had taken the counter clerk's advice to try the fried sea bass — served with fries (\$14), on a sandwich (\$10) or over grits (\$12 from 11am-2pm). It's something I'll think to do it next time I make it to Alpine. Because for me it's not just a beer destination any more.

Finally, with food on my mind, the blinders have come off, and I can see there are just enough options to be choosy. In addition to a bevy of taco shops, I pass an Italian restaurant, a sushi spot, and noodle bar. But how am I going to say no to Jay's Southern Café, a restaurant promising BBQ and soul food, out here, a half-hour east and a third of a mile above sea level?

Apparently, it's been around since 2015 or so, and just hasn't been on my radar. (It also managed to get left off of those Support Black-Owned Restaurants lists that were passed around a couple summers ago.) The counter shop is owned by a local bishop and his wife, and appears to be a family affair: their kids were the ones to bring food and drinks out to our table. And every ten minutes or so, the young daughter would reappear to rather sweetly ask whether everything was to our liking.

Most of it was. The dining room has a rustic look, only better organized. It's got wagon wheel chandeliers and a checkerboard tile floor. Framed posters from the New Orleans Jazz Festival line

# Another successful Bisbee's Tournament

Dock Totals 7/31 - 8/6: 4936 anglers aboard 227 half-day to 3-day trips out of San Diego landings this past week caught 124 barracuda, 1 black seabass (released), 917 bluefin tuna (to 207 pounds), 16 bocaccio, 45 bonito, 1248 calico bass, 4691 dorado, 1 halibut, 6 lingcod, 2 mako shark, 1065 rockfish, 102 sand bass, 42 sanddab, 59 sculpin, 47 sheephead, 1 thresher shark, 95 whitefish, 1 white seabass, 324 yellowfin tuna, and 15,760 yellowtail.

Saltwater: The ongoing yellowtail and dorado frenzy greeted anglers who made it out to the banks from the 9-Mile down the coast of Baja to about mid-peninsula. Bluefin tuna are still around our area and haven't vacated the near-coastal high spots for the cooler offshore areas of Cortez and Tanner banks, while yellowfin tuna have been slowly creeping into the counts. It is almost odd to catch so many dorado while yellowfin remain sluggish, as both usually stick to similar conditions and run together, but with yellowtail picking up the slack, nobody is complaining. La Niña, albeit a weak one, has been good to the San Diego fleet thus far in 2022.

6894 dorado and 30,454 yellowtail have been caught by the full-day to 3-day fleet over the past two weeks, and though most of those caught were school-sized fish averaging maybe 10 pounds per dorado and 12 pounds per yellowtail, that's still a lot of meat. Considering most of these fish were

from Mexican waters and Mexican limits are 5 yellowtail and 2 dorado per angler per day, the counts could have been much higher if in US territory. The bag limit (total catch) in Mexico is ten fish, and no more than 5 of any one species

Marlin, shark, grouper, bluefin tuna, and dorado all have lower limit numbers, with bluefin and dorado limit being two fish, and marlin, shark, and grouper limit at one fish. Any of the above species' per-angler-per-day limit counts as five fish, so for example, five yellowtail and two dorado equals the total bag limit of ten fish for the day. In U.S. waters, an angler may keep up to ten yellowtail (five must be 24" fork length or longer) and ten dorado per day. Thus, many of the boats fishing in Mexican waters over the past couple weeks had to pull in lines and head home early due to catching limits. Once dedicated to fishing Mexican waters, Mexican limits apply for the duration of the trip, so no stopping when back in U.S. waters to add to the catch once Mexican limits are met.

Further down Baja at Buena Vista Resort, Bisbee's East Cape Offshore Tournament was held this past week. Hot weather and great fishing are the usual highlights for the mid-summer event, and this year was no different.



The big winner of the Bisbee's East Cape Offshore Tournament was Team Stella June with this solid 375-pound black marlin worth 1.28 million dollars in prize money.

The billfish division was won by Team Stella June, with angler Hugo Pino landing a 375-pound Black Marlin, the only qualifying marlin of the tournament. The jackpot award for the fish was a whopping \$1.28 million dollars

A 43.1-pound yellowfin caught by Emanuel Bernal of Team Crudo took the heaviest tuna for the tournament, fetching a prize of \$124,920, while Roberto Omar Garcia Formestic of Team Altamar grabbed \$50,000 for an impressive 54,7-pound dorado. Other notables included a firstday 52.5-pound dorado caught by Gilbert Castro of Team Tiger Spirit worth \$38,875. First place in the billfish release division went to Team Will To Win with 1,000 points earning them \$50.830, while second and third places went to Team Suertudo with 900 points, and Team Freebird with 700 points for a total of \$44,665 respectively. After 42 years, the Bisbee's tournaments are still growing, with a record of \$1,614,125 in prizes awarded to the 2022 tournament winners. Whether fishing for fun on the beach, for dinner from the boat, or for cash and prizes in an elite tournament, they're out there, so go get

8/6 – 19 anglers aboard a 3-day Pacific Voyager trip caught limits of 190 yellowtail and 38 dorado, along with 16 bluefin tuna and 14 yellowfin tuna. The Alicia 1.5-day run with 10 anglers produced 32 yellowtail and limits of 20 dorado.



 Big Ben, the London Eye, Buckingham Palace ... now tourists can add Wet Wipe Island to their lists of must-see attractions in England's capital. The Times of London reported on June 24 that an island the size of two tennis courts and composed entirely of used wet wipes has appeared in the Thames River that meanders through the city. Government ministers have asked people to stop using the wipes and are considering a ban on those that contain plastic. - Neruno Daisuki, a Japanese illustrator and manga artist, stumbled into a new hobby as he tried to pass the time during the COVID lockdowns of the past year, Oddity Central reported. He started collecting the various little items that become stuck in the tread of one's shoes -- pebbles, glass fragments, etc. -- and laying them out neatly on boards with grids. "When I was removing the pebbles caught in the groove on the back of my newly bought sneakers," he said, "I felt that it was a waste to just throw them away, and I thought, 'It would be interesting to collect them." He ended up with 179 pebbles,

32 glass fragments, and one nut. Now he's considering further categorizing his collection between his left and right shoes.

## **Latest Religious Message?**

- A family in Uttar Pradesh, India, believe they have been blessed by the gods after the mother, Kareena, gave birth to a baby with four arms and four legs, the New York Post reported. The otherwise healthy boy arrived on July 2 and weighed 6.5 pounds, doctors reported. Some believe he may be the reincarnation of the four-armed Hindu goddess Lakshmi, who rules wealth, fortune, power, beauty, fertility and prosperity. The extremely rare condition is called polymelia and results in extra, unusable arms, leas, hands or feet.

#### **Weird Weather**

- On July 5, residents of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, got a weather show that "felt like being in a teaser for Stranger Things' Season 5," one Twitter user posted. Because of a phenomenon known as a derecho, the sky turned bright neon green as thunderstorms moved through the area, People.com reported. "The green in this thing is insane!" tweeted storm chaser Tanner Charles. The green occurs when blue light from the rain clouds combines with red and yellow light from a sunset, the National Weather Service explained.

## **Government in Action**

 Victor Roy, Oceanside, California's elected city treasurer, is in hot water after an

email from Treasury Manager Steve Hodges to Roy surfaced, Voice of San Diego reported. The June 6 email includes several allegations against Roy, but the most titillating details, in an anonymous complaint filed in June 2021, allege that Roy looked at pornography on the Mission Branch Library computers. The complaint stated that Roy was "looking at magazines that when he clicked on the cover, the images inside the magazine were full nudity." Roy was told by library staff that he couldn't view nudity on public computers, and he replied that "he knew, that is why he came when it was slow and that he was being cognizant of his surroundings," the complaint continued. Assistant City Manager Michael Gossman, who confirmed that the leaked email was authentic, said Roy had not repeated the inappropriate behavior at the library.

# **Least Competent Criminals**

- In Salt Lake City in mid-June, a couple of geniuses rolled up next to a company box truck in a parking lot in their own pickup truck. While one waited, KSL-TV reported, the other got under the company truck and drilled a hole into the gas tank, presumably hoping to steal fuel. But the perp's shirt caught on fire while he was under the truck, causing him to roll around the parking lot while trying to remove his shirt. He then jumped into the pickup, and the pair of would-be thieves drove away; the company truck still had flames and smoke billowing from underneath, as seen on a surveillance video. No arrests have yet been made.
