

Blade switch

Perpetrators replace their swords with axes, machetes

Last year, swords seemed to be the big blade of choice for San Diego's criminals. In October, news outlets reported a samurai sword-carrying man in Carlsbad, which brought out the SWAT team to intervene. A month prior, in City Heights, another man reportedly packing a sword stole a child's scooter. "My brother chased him down and got our stuff back," the scooter rider's father wrote on NextDoor. And in July, news outlets covered the story of a 63-year-old woman who was "scalped" with a sword at the Officer Jeremy Henwood Memorial Park in City Heights.

This year, axes and machetes seem to be gaining in popularity. Last week, Lonnie T. of Normal Heights posted photos on NextDoor of "18 cop cars" surrounding a white truck at the Arco gas station at 33rd and El Cajon Boulevard, and wondered, "What's going on?" Linh Mai posted the answer online: "He [allegedly] carjacked / someone with an axe in Balboa Park, and they tracked the vehicle to the gas station. The K9 jumped through the window and bit him, and the cops arrested him." I direct messaged Mai, and she said that she was "watching the whole

And on the weekend of March 10, an axe-carrying man wearing a red face cover and a hoodie was captured on multiple Ring and Blink cameras as he prowled Hillcrest and Mission Hills, checking doors of homes and peeking through car windows.

"I posted Friday night about a man with an axe," posted one local online. "He came to my door at 10:40 pm; he tried to open someone else's door at 12:30 am and was seen at another complex at 6:00 am. I called police, and the person at 12:30 pm called the police. The police told the second person no one had called before, which I did. Last night, Saturday, he was back and seen three more times on Ring videos in Mission Hills. Cops have been notified again Saturday night and did nothing. They apparently made contact with this individual and talked to him, [but] he went back on prowling."

for avocado and citrus. "It's one of the ugliest bugs I've ever seen in my life," said mayor Tony Kranz when the city council met to discuss their counterattack. "They walk in a way that really intimidates me a lot. Their back end is up high. And they move very slowly. It looks like a little robot."

Inland, the Coachella Valley is home to a thriving date palm industry. And fruit growers throughout southern California are keeping tabs on the bug's spread. Since the weevil was first detected in San Ysidro in 2011, it has built up a body count of about 20,000 trees. And

recent victim Encinitas has been particularly hard-hit. In January 2023, the city had 280 Canary Island date palms in the public right-of-way. After dozens were removed due to infestation, it's down to 236. (Mission Bay is another battleground.)

Biological control, a method that uses a pest's natural enemies like predators, parasites, and pathogens, is years away in development, said arborist Katrina Burritt, who has worked in the field in San Diego since the infestation tree's crown coats the tissue the pest attacks and kills the bug. But chemical treatment is a last resort for cities like Encinitas that enjoy healthy bee populations, as the chemical is highly toxic to the pollinators. Treatment occurs four times per year, and overlaps many plants' blooming season, city staff said. But the city settled on option three; treating only palms identified as heritage trees. The city has just one: the postcard-perfect palm that casts its tropical sliver of shade over Moon-

began. For now, palms must be treated with chemicals if the city wants to save them, Burritt said.

A consultant for Encinitas came up with three possible treatment options. The first involved no chemicals — an approach favored by many locals — and removal of infested palms. The second — treating every Canary Island date palm — would result in the lowest tree mortality. A chemical applied to the

light Beach. (For each option, pruning the trees from November through April — the overwintering period of the weevil — was recommended during dry weather, when tree mortality is highest.)

Council members suggested turning away from non-native species wherever possible to encourage more natural pest resistance. The city's only native palm, Washingtonia filifera, is less susceptible to infestation, but most palm species are considered at risk. So far, the others haven't been a target. And controlling the weevil population won't be simple. The city counts public trees, but has no idea how many are on private property. "We could guess that there are a lot more privately owned than public," said councilmember Bruce Ehlers. "So if we treat our 1/4 [or however many are in the public right-of-way], "there's still a whole bunch of bugs" munching their way through the trees. "We're not gonna control this through our actions — and we don't have the ability to make private people do it, either."



According to Burritt, as the Canary Island palm population dwindles, the threat will shift to other trees, from palms to avocados and citrus. "They [have] hit the *Phoenix canariensis* first, and as the population declines, they will start moving on to other species."



Third time for harm Slow justice for man who attempted to kill police officer

Last February, Roberto Ignacio Flores, 32 — who was convicted by two different juries of the attempted murder of an Oceanside cop, only to have both convictions overturned — made a plea deal in which he a California appellate court gave him a new trial, finding that his defense attorney should have presented Flores' preferred defense: that he was not even driving the car. Instead, the defense had argued that Flores mistakenly struck the officer.

A second jury declared Flores guilty of the same charges in 2021, and Flores was continued on page 4

versity policy by conducting simultaneous operations in the institution's array of surgical suites? "The Policy defines Overlapping Surgery as an 'operation or procedure in which the actual operating time overlaps with the actual operating time of another operation or procedure performed by the same surgeon," says a newly-posted November 6, 2023 report by the university's department of Audit & Man-

agement Advisory Services. "However, the key and critical components [of the operation] do not overlap." If they do, it's called concurrent surgery, a big-no, the document says. "Overlapping surgeries that are reasonably expected to be concurrent (where critical elements of the two cases will be occurring simultaneously) are expressly not allowed except in [emergency] situations."

Says the report, "Based on our review, we noted instances where documentation of the requirements for transparency, identification of backup surgeon, or presence for key and critical portions [of a given operation] was not always present in the files reviewed, or did not always conform to the Policy." A chart included in the audit report defines "Skin Time" as the period between the first incision and the complete closure of the surgical wound. The period of time in the operating room before Skin Time is called "Patient Prep Time" and, afterwards, "Clean Up Time," per the report. Of 29 surgeries that were "judgmentally selected" by auditors from UCSD operating room records over the period

from September 2022 through February 2023, "21 [or seventy-two percent] of these cases were actual overlapping cases based on Skin Time. We noted gaps in documentation for the required elements for overlapping cases."

The auditors went on to say, "We evaluated our sample of 29 cases based on surgeon in and out of room times to verify when the primary attending surgeon left the OR


to perform another surgery and whether the surgeon engaged in another billable event. We noted that, in some cases, the surgeon left the OR prior to the completion of incision closure, otherwise known as the procedure stop time. Perioperative Services explained that it is not unusual for surgeons to leave the OR when an incision closure begins as residents complete the incision closure process; however, it is expected that the primary surgeon remains in the vicinity to be immediately


available, or that a backup surgeon has been designated to oversee the non-critical portion of the procedure."

The report goes on to say that "perioperative Services is still in its early stage of monitoring compliance and has not included consideration of billing in their monitoring process." In addition, "we also noted some areas where policy interpretation was inconsistent, including whether Skin Time is considered key and critical, which can impact

the determination of whether a case is concurrent."

sent to prison again. But in May of 2023, the same threejudge panel in the Fourth District Court of Appeals that overturned his first conviction granted Flores another trial. This time, the appellate court noted that in hearings for his second trial, Flores objected to appearing by video monitor. (His pre-trial hearings had begun in 2020 during the pandemic.) The appellate court judges found that the judges hearing the case should have appointed a different public defender for Flores.

In both of his trials, Flores sometimes demanded to act as his own attorney, but he proved so disruptive that each judge appointed the same public defender, John Wilschke. In their written decision, the appellate court judges noted that during one closed-court hearing, Flores allegedly told the judge that he "would kill" court-appointed attorney Wilschke if he did not win the new trial. The appellate court declared that re-appointment of Wilschke as defense attorney for Flores was "an abuse of discretion," because there had been

a breakdown in the attorneyclient relationship. The appellate court declared there was irreconcilable conflict, and the attorney-client relationship became "non-existent" because Flores stopped speaking to his own attorney. The appellate court declared that Flores had a fundamental mistrust of counsel and ordered a new, third trial, which had been expected to begin this month.

As part of the plea deal, Flores admitted purposely driving his car into Officer Hunter, and to committing this crime while out on bail for a previous felony. Plus, he admitted to being a felon unlawfully in possession of a firearm. In the plea, Flores agreed to a "stipulated" term of 18 years in state prison. "It just gives a certain prison term rather than a life sentence which subjects him to parole board hearings," prosecutor Keith Watanabe explained. "He will get out, and there won't be a parole hearing. Not sure when, since we can never predict the credits by the prison anymore."

The California prison website now shows that Roberto Ignacio Flores is in the Centinela prison, and that he will first be eligible for parole in December of 2031.

Big money grudge

State Coastal Commissioner Dayna Bochco of Los Angeles came up with a \$10,000 contribution to the gubernatorial campaign of state Senator Toni Atkins on March 29, a freshly filed disclosure report says. The wife of wealthy TV producer Steve Bochco once pulled aside Los Angeles Times writer **Steve Lopez** to lodge a complaint. "She was irked by a column of mine, and she told me so," wrote Lopez in August 2016. "I'd written about a political fundraiser for the incoming state Assembly speaker, Anthony Rendon. It was hosted by, among others, Bochco and a hired gun who represents developers seeking commission approval for their projects. Other lobbyists/consultants were there, too, as were reps from companies with projects in play. Some of them wrote

checks to the incoming speaker,

who would have the authority to appoint new coastal commissioners. It was all way too cozy and an example of why we should all fear the clout and political connections of those who want to build on what's left of the undeveloped coast."

Not to worry, Bochco told

Lopez, who wrote, "Bochco often commutes to commission meetings in her husband's private jet, along with other LAbased commissioners. Some commissioners hold or aspire to public office, and the unpaid job is a great way to build connections with potential donors, deal-makers and others. But Bochco isn't running for anything, so far as I know, and I wondered why she took on a job that eats up a lot of time and brings no shortage of second-guessing." Lopez reported that Bochco told him, "'I can't defend any given behavior that may have crossed a line.' But she stuck up for her colleagues. She conceded that some are more political than others, but added: 'I don't think any of us is in the sway of anybody."

Beer man and food guy explore Ensenada

Ten years ago, someone snagged me a ticket to the Ensenada Beer Fest, and I attended, boldly resolving to sample every brew being poured. It didn't take long for me to realize the quixotic nature of my quest, yet I pressed on, eventually managing around 30 samples — roughly a quarter of my goal. But even a losing effort has its consolations, so when the Fest offered me couple of press passes for this year's event, I contacted my friend Pablo Gastelum, who is making a name for himself as a brutally honest food critic on TikTok (pablo_rgg, 139K followers). "If you got tickets, I rented a house for 8 people, and I'm driving down," he replied.

Pablo showed up at my place in Tijuana on Friday morning in his red Mustang. We picked up his childhood friend Bryan and made Ensenada in under an hour. The Airbnb was 10 minutes south of the city: a rickety, three-story, three-bedroom house with plenty of space for a party. After drinking a *caguamón* each (40 oz beer) in a nearby bar, we took an Uber to the Fest.

We got to the parking lot of the Riviera Cultural Center close to 4 pm. They were still announcing the winners of Copa Cervecera del Pacífico — over 260 breweries and over 1000 samples of beer had been judged before the festival, which boasted more than 120 breweries as well as over 30 food establishments, plus a plethora of bands and DJs

on 5 different stages. Our first food stop was at Exxe, an Argentinean *choripanes* (hot dogs) joint. "It's dry and shitty," said Pablo as he threw it in the trash after one bite. Brutally honest! The first beer was better: Straight to Haze from Cardera Brewery — one of my favorites and winner of five medals this year alone. The beer server recognized Pablo from his TikTok and murmured, "A ti te conozco." Pablo chugged his beer as Bryan recorded, as young influencers are wont to

jokingly asked if he had some. He took out a gigantic Ziploc bag and gave me a handful. "Be careful, they are powerful," his girlfriend warned me. In my drunken stupor, I thought WWHSTD? (What would Hunter S. Thompson Do?) I dropped a couple of mushrooms in an unknown hazy IPA and drank it in one gulp. The night turned as hazy as the beers.

We were back at the Airbnb by 9 pm after a stop at Oxxo for energy and sports drinks

In my drunken stupor, I thought WWHSTD? (What Would Hunter S. Thompson Do?)

do. The head brewer at 93' Beer, Abraham "el Ham" Rodríguez, was spray painting a black canvas, and when he recognized Pablo, he handed over the can like a proper fanboy. He then gave us two full pours of beer: their gold-awarded Cream Ale, and their Hazy IPA.

We kept jumping from stand to stand, trying tasters and getting full free pours thanks to Pablo's minor celebrity status. Colmena (one of the favorites), Laguna Mental, Santa Clara, Pocima, Teorema, Averno, Cuatro Palos, Edens Sins, Fauna, Cardera, and more. Before it was dark, I was already a dozen beers in and was ready to pass out, a la ten years ago. But once night fell, I saw a friend who grows magic mushrooms. I

and two twelve-packs of Tecates. Then we Ubered to La Bête Noire, a pretentious bar in Bodegas de Santo Tómas. The night started to play like a Terry Gilliam movie in my mind. They handed me a beer that I recognized as Astillero IPA by Agua Mala, but it could have been another Tecate. We jumped barricades to walk through the destroyed streets of Ensenada and headed to La Camorra, a bar known for its alternative after-parties. On our way there, I noticed that the smoked fish shop Ahumadera del Pacífico had been demolished. I had always made a point of swinging by to get some smoked tuna snacks, and now it was gone. Ensenada is changing as rapidly as Tijuana. I almost cried. Pablo didn't give a fuck.

Close to midnight, some cute DJ was playing house music at La Camorra as we settled in with a bucket of beers and a pepperoni pizza. Forty minutes later, the beer was gone but the pizza remained untouched. We took it to go. A few steps after leaving the bar, Pablo had a slice and said, "Está culerísima." Declaring it garbage for the camera, he tossed it on the ground. Bryan picked it up, ate a slice, and gave it to a homeless guy nearby. We walked through the crowded and noisy nightlife of downtown Ensenada toward Hussong's Bar, the oldest cantina in Baja. It was too crowded to go in. The nearby alternative was "Bar Mutualista," a bar from 1919 that I had

never been to. It too was too crowded to get a table, but a mustachioed gentleman let us join him near the entrance. The bar was lively and colorful, with people playing pool and others singing karaoke. Every table had a bucket of beers. Pablo texted his fans while Bryan danced with a chubby local.

We went back to La Camorra for more Tecates at 1:30. I sat and slowly nursed a beer, feeling exhausted. The Uber that took us back got lost several times, but we finally made it back to the Airbnb at 3:11 am. I woke up the following morning at 11:00 am feeling like shit. We went to Casa Marcelo for breakfast. Pablo ordered a couple of Victoria beers, Bryan had a tall glass of orange juice, and I went for coffee and water. For the three to share, we got lengua en salsa verde. Pablo thought it was trash, calling it too acidic. I thought the plate needed more lengua and fewer nopales. They also served us complimentary bread and Ramonetti cheese from a ranch in Ojos Negros. Again, Pablo disliked it. I thought it was bliss.

Back on the road, we stopped for more beer in Wendlandt at El Sauzal, winner of four medals at the festival. Pablo kept on drinking, so I ordered their gold-medal IPA, Flying Jerry. When in Baja... 



dignified life. But the thing is, I am not supposed to live here. It's supposed to be just my daughter and my mother and her cat. Those are the only names that the office knows about. But my daughter is here, and my mother needs help, so here I am.

Actually, it's not only the three of us living in this very small apartment. There is also my brother and his girlfriend. Too many people for such a small place. But that is what happens when rent goes so high: adult siblings, living together with their mom, like it is not supposed to be. At least now I know that you can learn to live all jammed in a small place, with your things always packed or loaded into your car, and no privacy.

daughter has a twin bed in my mother's bedroom, and some space for her things in the closet. The good part is that she has to keep it tidy and learn to be organized. My mother has a king-size bed. I'm so glad, for that is where I sleep too. I have only a tiny place to put my things, so I keep only my work clothes. I work in San Diego, and I am always working.

How did we get here? When she was 14, my daughter decided to live with my mother, who was at the time living alone after her divorce. Covid was not much of a threat anymore, and schools had just reopened. Both of us used to live in Mexicali, in Baja California, just on the border with Calexico. But when the pandemic hit,

was born here but had never lived in the United States. I staved alone in Mexicali for a whole year before I decided to come after her.

Bella Vista Apartments are located at South 47th Street between the 805 and Logan Ave. The apartment complex is in the city of San Diego, but it is very close to National City.

A lot of people live here. There are one-bedroom and twobedroom apartments, and it is mostly for



seniors. I see hardly any children. There is a playground next to the office, but I have never seen anybody playing there. The girls at the office are nice people. They know everybody and I absolutely believe they have noticed all the people living here that are not supposed to. But they don't say anything. I really like it here, because you don't hear loud music, or loud children, or loud mothers for that matter, and it is clean. Maintenance here is quite something. The gardeners are always Mexican, and sometimes they wake you up with the noise of grass being cut and the smell of it. I really like it.

Actually, now that I think about it, there is some noise. Our next door neighbors are quite noisy. They like rap music and smoking weed and having friends and family over. But I don't mind them, and neither does my mom. When I first got here, I wondered if she knew what so many of her neighbors were smoking. She doesn't seem to care; she really believes in being respectful to neighbors. "Smells and music don't bother me," she says. So I guess they are okay.

So my mother lives in


this one-bedroom apartment. "Why is it that you don't live in a two bedroom place?" I once asked her. She replied, "I once wrote my name on a list to get a bigger apartment, only it was not my name on the list, but that of my ex-husband. It happened that once, when we were at the office, I asked for a bigger place, and the lady there asked me to write my name on the list. But at that moment, I was busy writing down a check, and it was easier to ask him to sign us up, so he wrote down his name. Eight years later, we are divorced, and he lives in a two-bedroom apartment and I am still in the same one."

The place in which we live is located on the east side of the complex. The parking lot is almost al-

ways empty, because only residents are allowed to park there. Outside on the street, a lot of cars park — a sign that a lot of people live here. And some people even live in their cars. I've seen some of them just go into some relative's apartment, I guess to use the bathroom. Life is hard for those who don't have enough money for a place of their own.

Luna is my mom's white cat. This place has become Luna's kingdom. There are several cats living at Bella Vista, but their owners don't allow them to go out. Luna does go out, and she strolls all over the place with an air of certainty that she is beautiful and unique. Everybody knows her. And she really nails the cat walk. But once in a while, she runs for her life. Sometimes, there are stray cats that chase her, and even go into the apartment to steal her food and beat her up.

One day, I was coming from work, and my mother was upset because she said that an orange male cat, huge and frightening, came in, bothering Luna and going after her food and pissing all around,

marking territory. When I first saw him, I was amazed at how huge and beautiful he was. I was wondering who he belonged to, or how he had survived. But still, I had to make him go away, so I put some water with a little vinegar in a spray bottle and whenever we saw him, we sprayed him all over. That made him stop going after Luna and into our house. I never saw him again.

There are coyotes in the area. Once, I was talking to a friend who was dropping me off after work in the parking area, and we saw a huge coyote walking around. That was when it hit me: we have coyotes living all around, and obviously, they eat cats and dogs and anything they can find. I told my mom, but she refuses to lock Luna up. "She must smart up", she says. And she does. The other day, she was chased by not one but two young coyotes, and she ran like hell.

Now, I should explain that every first floor apartment has this little patio surrounded by a green fence where people can keep their things, or plants, or whatever. My mother likes to have

plants and a round table with a shade and some chairs. That's where she drinks her coffee in the mornings. She is alone and listens to her favorite music: "Alexa..." We are all out to work or school. Her best of times, she says. Well, one day, Luna came running through the patio all scared, her

white, beautiful, long hair all bristled up. She was being followed by these two handsome young coyotes. They were too small to jump the fence, so they went away. I went out to look at them. I like coyotes: they are beautiful and smart. But I never want them to eat our Luna, of course. Perhaps

they already ate that huge, orange cat. I definitely hope not.

* * *

I mentioned that our next door neighbors smoke pot. A lot of people here do. They are a couple; she works all day, so she is never home, and when she is, she talks on the phone so loudly and turns the TV on so loudly and cooks and laughs. She is a very noisy lady. He is in a wheelchair and is much older than she is. He is always here, and he smokes a lot. "Let the man have his marijuana in peace" is all my mom says. They are nice people with a lot of family too. He is hardly alone. A lot of times, they have family over — "just like us" mother says. Everybody has the right to look for a space to stay during the night. They also have a white cat like we do, but theirs is male and with short hair. He is huge and beautiful, but

they never let him out. It is a shame. I would really like to pet him.

There was another couple that lived across the walkway. But they split up. "She went with another man and left me," the man explained while he was giving away his beloved plants. "Now I can't live here no more." But he took his cat. Another white cat. So there was a time when there were three white cats in three apartments together. So unusual. I wouldn't know who's got a cat if it weren't for the nice people from an organization that gives food to house cats. Every three weeks, there's a knock on the door, and when you open it, there is a bag of cat food - and some cans, too. Sometimes, you even get a toy. They are definitely going to heaven. Cat heaven, at least.

Sometimes, I have to take the trolley to go to work, so I walk up 47th

Street towards Logan Avenue and wait at the corner for the 3 or 955 buses that take me to Euclid trolley station — one corner for the 3 bus, another corner for the 955, and sometimes another corner for the 955 but towards the 8th Street trolley station. That usually happens when I am headed towards San Ysidro and Tijuana.

Once, I was waiting there when this man came along and stood right next to me and started saying a lot of things that, honestly, I couldn't understand. I tried not to appear frightened, so I stayed casual. He got mad and started saying all sorts of bad words. I said something in Spanish so he would believe I didn't speak English and leave me alone. When the bus came, I got in and sat down. As he appeared to be a street person, I thought he would not get on the bus, but he did, and stood next to me. The only thing I understood was "Bitch this" and "Bitch that." It didn't matter. It must have been a mental health case — one of so many here in San Diego. I guess he got tired, because he got off the bus. I've seen him again a couple of times, and he seems to recognize me, but he hasn't bothered me again.

Homeless people are everywhere. I mean, I would be homeless if it weren't for my mom and her Section 8 government help. I would have to go back to where I am from. But in San Diego — and I guess in a lot of places — it is almost impossible to pay rent. There is this guy who lives in this old truck outside Bella Vista; he parks it on 47th street. He is polite and clean. He's got lots of things on his truck that he collects from everywhere,

but he is always cleaning and making everything look, I suppose in its own way, nice. At least he tries.

Once, I was throwing away some trash, and I also had a bag with things that someone at work gave me. I left it next to the recycling bin for someone to take. As I walked toward my car, I heard someone calling

me, and it was this man. He was carrying the bag, believing I had lost it, I suppose. I told him I didn't want it and that he could keep it, but I also told him that it was full of women's things — creams and hair spray and perfume and some lady clothes. He took it with him, only to give it away to some of his female ac-

quaintances, I later found out. So righteous and polite. I started looking for him and saying hello. That lasted for six months until January 27 of this year, when he suddenly disappeared. I was driving home, and when I pulled towards the parking lot, there he wasn't. Only an empty space where he had parked his truck for all those months. I felt sad. Where could he have gone? To park on some other street, I suppose.

* * *

"Why do they wear pajamas to school?" I asked my 17-year-old daughter one day as we were waiting for the green light at 47th and Imperial. I was taking her to school. She doesn't dress that way at all; being raised in Mexico, that would be out of the question for her.

"I don't know!" she replied. "Why would you ask me that!!?" I find it very odd, a little disgusting perhaps, but I understand that fashion among American teenagers is almost impossible to comprehend for a lady like myself.

"Just don't ever do it, please," is all I can say.

"Ewww!" she shrugs.

She doesn't like it when I snoop too much into her life. I guess kids suddenly grow up and expect us parents not to be worried, but I worry. She walks sometimes towards Lincoln High School. And I worry. She walks back to the house and I still worry, but I have to keep that to myself and hope that she takes really good care of herself, and that the neighborhood — all those people we see on a regular basis — stands behind her. Like the nice lady that sells the most delicious tamales in San Diego. She smiles a lot and starts selling her tamales on 47th Street at 5 am, and by eight she hardly has any. Working people always know where the good food is.

My mother has been living in Bella Vista Apartments for 12 years now, and my daughter, almost three years. I have

been here for only two years, but I have seen lots of things. There are lots of people here. There is this apartment where an old couple live that has a Christmas decoration on the door. It is there all the time. I mean all the time, like June, July, August. Every year. All the time. There is this old man who can hardly walk, but he still rides his bicycle to go nobody knows where, and he likes to sharpen knives. So my mom takes hers to him once in a while, and he happily sharpens them, no charge. He is a sweet old man who lives alone. "I must go and pay him a visit soon," says my mom, "I am afraid he falls and no one notices." That is the thing with this kind of community. You think you live alone, but you really don't.

Once, we received a package that wasn't ours. The mail person had made a mistake. So I took it to the right address in the complete opposite part of Bella Vista. Although it was part of the same complex, it felt strange. The lady was so relieved; she had thought she had lost the package, and it was full of medicine. I like to be of service.

My mother loves to cook. Sometimes, she gives some of her food to take this man who is her friend. They talk about his illnesses and his daughters. Mom likes to keep an eye on him. He also cooks, but my mom doesn't like his food. He is from the very southern parts of Mexico. Too foreign for her taste, as she is from Sonora. You can't change old people. Sometimes, we hear a knock at the door and there is our other neighbor, the one in a wheelchair, asking for some food. She gives him a plate proudly. "He's

starving, the poor man, he is always so alone," she claims. We tell her not to worry too much for him, because he eats well at his house. His wife cooks, too. But we know he can't resist the smell and goes and asks for some of my mom's Mexican cuisine. We know he is not starving, he's just got the munchies. There is this young man who is always washing his car in the parking lot. I have never seen him do other things. Just washes his car and listens to rap music almost every day. Perhaps he also lives in a crowded apartment.

I also like to watch the crows. There are lots of them. I like to believe they know me, because I am always calling them. I like them. They are incredibly smart, and I really think they recognize me. That is what I like to believe.

47th street runs from the 805 freeway to the 94. Bella Vista is next to 805, and it is a wide street that allows for cars to run fast from the light at the 805 to the light on Logan Ave. And when you want to walk across the street or exit the parking lot in your car, you must be very careful, because the street has these little hills that don't allow you to see very well whether or not a car is coming, and the cars tend to go fast. So there have been accidents.

I was living here when a man was hit and killed by a passing car. He was crossing the street towards his car early in the morning when suddenly a speeding car appeared and killed him instantly. It was awful. His crying young wife had to move out. They were new at Bella Vista. "This already happened some five years ago," said my mom. "Son, don't park across the street please, it is so dangerous," pleads my mom to my brother. He is not allowed to park his car inside the parking lot. Neither is his girlfriend. They are not allowed to live here. Neither am I, but here we are.

I once saw a hit and run. I was walking towards the bus when I saw a truck hit a car that was parked on the street. He drove away and I couldn't see the plates. I stayed for a while to see if someone came out, but nobody seemed to notice. So I went away. I didn't

have much information to give anyway.

It is so easy to believe that people are all the same. But they are not. Once you live in a community like this for some time, you learn to see differences between personalities, backgrounds, cultures. You meet people who don't talk to you, ever, and you meet people who talk a lot. Some people just say hello, and some people become part of your life. Living in Bella Vista Apartments, I have come to see that in San Diego, everybody can come from another country, another culture — it widens your eyes and mind a lot.

Once, I met a woman in the parking lot; she was parked right next to where I was parking, so we made some small talk. I had already seen her a couple of times. She was with a young woman, very attractive, with the darkest skin I had ever seen. The woman told me that the dark-skinned girl was her daughter. "How can your daughter be so dark and you are not?" I asked her. That night, we talked a lot. I learned her name, and that her father was Mexican but her mother was black and that she was my exact same age. It is always a pleasure to see her around. I really like her.

But my favorite person in all of Bella Vista Apartments is this lady named Rosie. She lives upstairs from my mother, just above her. Rosie lives alone. She is my height, approximately five feet tall, but she must weigh half of what I do. I have

never seen her outside her apartment. Rosie makes noises all night long, and sometimes all day long. She is intriguing. My mother claims she never hears a peep out of that apartment, but I know she is just being polite.

When my brother first arrived, he was all upset. "The lady upstairs makes a lot of noise all through the night!" he said. "I'll go and talk to her!" My mother asked him not to, because she likes it to keep it cool with the neighbors, but my brother couldn't take it anymore. So he went upstairs. Nobody knows what happened next, but he never complained again. "Let her be," was all he said. When he and his girlfriend are out of town, I sleep in the living room, and I hear the noises he complained about. A chair is being pushed, steps, someone dancing and jumping, more loud steps. It is impossible to know just what is going on.

to all that noise, I thought of going upstairs, too. I was so mad at her. But then one day I saw her. As I was coming from work, tired and hungry, I saw this beautiful, tiny old lady, with the widest of smiles and brightest of eyes, looking out of her window right at me. "How are you sweetie?" she called to me. I heard her musical voice and couldn't help but wonder how this nice, small and polite lady could make all that noise! And all through the night!

Next time I saw her, I was coming from the laundry room, carrying lots of clothes. There she was, in her window again. "Do you need some help sweetie?" Every time I see her, it is the same. "Do you need something sweetie?" "Can I help you sweetie?" "You look so nice today sweetie!" "Do you need me?" But every time, just when I am about to answer, she disappears. She never waits for an answer. But she leaves this glow that covers you for the whole day. The days that she appears has become my lucky days. She is like a unicorn. Mysterious, selfish, and so beautifully strange that she gives you this weird magical feeling.

I wonder what her story is. I know she never goes out. I know she can't stay still. I know she doesn't sleep, at least not at night. And once, I saw this very handsome man, all dressed up, looking like a professional with a good job or something like that. He was carrying some grocery bags, and took a key out of his pocket and opened her door. The only thing I can think of is that he is her son. I have only seen him once. But now I know someone cares for her. I also care for her, but I have never got the courage to go upstairs. And I like it like that.


Stew

As the play begins, Mama, still in her housecoat, sings the old hymn, "This is the day, this is the day, this is the day, this is the day that the Lord has made." Sweet, except pay attention to that repetition. Also to her reaction when the neighbor's dog starts barking:

"I'm gonna kill that dog. Cut it up and cook it." A bit violent and even unsettling, especially given that Mama is making stew here in the kitchen. Well, not just Mama. Her daughters Lillian and Nellie are on hand — Lillian for the first time in a long time — as is Lillian's tween daughter Lil' Mama, and Mama's real job is to tell them what to do and why they're doing it wrong.

But don't let my talk of ominous hints and familial tensions fool you: Common Ground Theater's revelatory co-production with Scripps Ranch may not be a comedy, exactly, but it is funny. Funny in the layered, interior way that families are funny. The humor keeps conflict from boiling over — most of the time — but it also inflects ordinary interaction. Now and then there are explicit jokes, as when the younger generations start to mirror Mama's familiar speeches. But mostly, it's hidden in the cock of head and look in eye and tone of voice - "None of your business" delivered without venom or condescension, but with an almost friendly warmth. It's people being natural with one another - really, a marvel of acting all around.

Why is Mama making stew? Well, It's for a very important occasion at the church, and things need to be done sooner than later, and why is the phone always ringing, and why isn't Lillian's husband here yet and what's wrong with Nellie's belly, and ...? Well, if you believe Mama's claim that Richard III, for which Lil' Mama is auditioning, is really all about the women, then you might want to pay attention to the speech that everybody practices. Dune Part Two — Lawrence of

Arrakis meets Dr. Sandworm, or, How

I Learned to Stop Worrying and Love the Bene Gesserit. Paul Atreides, who left the green and pleasant land of his home planet for the desert wastes of Dune, finds himself eager to avenge the death of his royal father at the hands of the rival House Harkonnen (with a little help from a subtle and sinister Emperor). The best way to do that is to harness the "desert power" of the native Fremen. And the best way to do that is to convince the religious skeptics among them that what he wants is their freedom, and the true believers that what he wants is to fulfill the prophecies about a savior from another world. Yes, his visions warn him that the latter might spark a holy war that kills billions, and yes, he's pretty sure that the prophecy is just something cooked up by his mother's religious order to further their own ends — but dang if he doesn't keep doing stuff that makes him look like The Man. He chooses the right name. he rides a huge sandworm, he...well, he does what saviors do. By this point, it should come as no surprise to learn that director Denis Villenueve is very good at shots and scenes that capture scale and scope — big images for big stories for the big screen — and he keeps the long and layered story rolling along like windswept dunes in a desert. He's a little less surehanded when it comes to getting up close — maybe too many close-ups of stars Timothée Chalamet and Zendava, and maybe too few conversations to illuminate Paul's (gradual?) acceptance of his destiny - and the action at the very end saps the impact of what's come immediately before. (It plays almost like a TV teaser: tune in next time!) Anyway, about those references to '60s classics at the outset: the real news here is that our hero is not exactly a good guy. His father may have been noble, but his father was also defeated. The result is a blockbuster space opera that plays like a downbeat drama — we're a long, long way from that famous galaxy far, far away. (2024) — M.L. ★★★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

Christian has a whole world of wonderful visuals in the old Italian convent for old Italian nuns at which Sister Cecilia has arrived - what with the reliquary holding one of the nails that pierced Christ, the pristine countryside stretching for miles in every direction, the catacombs upon which the whole place rests — and he makes the most of his setting. But getting back to the that bit about "fun if flawed." The fun is the flaw, or rather, the lack of it. This is a horror film in which divine rape is treated as a miracle, and in which the second coming is hastened in highly unorthodox fashion, but for much of the runtime (and her mysterious pregnancy), Sweeney is content to shed silent tears over her predicament instead of making legitimate war on the patriarchy. And when the Enemy is revealed, he utterly flubs his big speech. What should be a declaration of war on heaven is instead pitched as a twisted sort of piety. It's as if the film doesn't see the glorious silliness in a woman taking perpetual vows on her first day at the film's outset, or in attempting to make her escape in the midst of labor pains. By the end, you get the feeling that Mohan was so intent on making the (admittedly bonkers) final moments hit that he tried to tamp down everything that came before. 
Elisha Christian's camera doesn't

Love Lies Bleeding — What is there to say? That Kristen Stewart can act - that she can inhabit a character perhaps more naturally than any actress of her generation? Okay. That if you want some raunchtastic talk and desperate, grindy onscreen sex in the current cinecultural climate, you're more likely to find it between same-sex partners? Okay again. That Ed Harris' face has become such an unforgiving landscape of craters, caverns, and ravines that it spookily echoes the brutal desert outside of town in which the bodies have been piling up lo these many violent years under his bug-lovin' reign? I say again, okay. And one last affirmative: there is good grit and texture here — perhaps exemplified by the loving attention paid to the world of women's bodybuilding — and a nasty, unsentimental reality that makes the loopy fantasy imagery at the end either a triumphant break from or a goofy undoing of all that's gone before. (The audience at the screening laughed heartily; I'm not sure that was the effect for which the story was going.) But after all that, there isn't much more to say, except that bad people tend to do bad things, and that whatever happens to love, lots of people wind

up bleeding as a result. Not exactly a revelation. Once you get the interior ugliness of everyone involved, you may be able to chuckle at some of the violence, ha ha. (2024) — M.L. ★(IN WIDE RELEASE)

Monkey Man - Early on in director, co-writer, and star Dev Patel's madcap mashup of a movie, his protagonist Kid sets out to buy a gun. "You like John Wick?" asks the salesman. "This is the same gun he had, except made in China." You know: a cheap knockoff. A cleverly self-conscious pre-emptive strike against those who might dismiss this revenge drama — with its black suits, its secret sects, its exotic clubs, and its long, loving depictions of brutal hand-to-hand combat - as John Wick, except made in India. You know: a cheap knockoff. Because it aims to be much more than that. The revenge sought here is against the man who killed Kid's mother - but since that man was the local chief of police, and since the killing was part of a brazenly corrupt land grab by evil forces operating under the guise of restoring Mother India - well, one mother quickly starts to stand for another. And even more than that, as evidenced by the juxtaposition of word and image during our hero's moments of whispered prayer. (Who really makes you happy?) Which moments bring us back to that "mashup" bit: the scenes between mother and son look and sound like Terrence Malick's Tree of Life. Other scenes recall Guy Ritchie cheekily working the collision of higher and lower classes. And yeah, there's some John Wick-y stuff. (Why yes, our club is hosting an event honoring India's next president, but no, none of our security guards have guns, so all disruptions will need to be resolved with punching; why do you ask?) It makes for disconcerting, uneven ride, sort of like a tuk-tuk that is mysteriously equipped with turbo, threading its way through the streets before slamming on the brakes so as to avoid crashing into a little girl. About those streets: they - or rather, the suffering they contain, and the blunt sympathy with which Patel depicts it - are the film's real strength. That, and the rich imagery and theme provided by the traditional story of Hanuman - the original Monkey Man. Much stronger than his order of transgender warriors in exile, who talk of their devotion to a god who is both creator and destroyer, but don't seem to teach our hero much beyond rope-a-dope rhythm. (The Cruel Tutelage of Pai Mei this ain't.) Their leader mentions fighting with purpose; that much, the Kid already had. (2024) — M.L. ★ (IN WIDE RELEASE)

Degher and his daughter duo "W.H. Auden said that reading your own poetry is like smelling your own farts," says singer/songwriter, producer, and published poet Darius Degher. For some reason, I imagine the noxious

fumes flowing into and then being served in a brandy snifter. Sniff sniff! "You know, they have lyric-writing contests, and the winner is usually a Nashville songwriter who can say something pithy about romance in three verses and a chorus. That's not really what interests me most."

When I ask him about favorite lyricists, he responds by asking how many hours I have. "What I respect most are song lyrics that do something wholly new, that boldly go where no man's gone before, that bring some real poetry into the songwriting form. And for that, I'd probably answer your question with the old masters: Dylan, Cohen, Joni

Mitchell, Elvis Costello."

I mention Roger Waters and David Bowie, and he acknowledges their influence. "That kind of bold risk-taking is what I hope happens in my own lyricwriting, too. Though of course, it's hard to know what your own lyrics are like." When I request a lyric sheet, Degher seems surprised that someone would care specifically about the words. But lyrics can make or break a song for me. The man delivers on songs like "Good News" from his latest album Open Question to the Sky, in which he untangles the misinformation highway with lines like, There's good news, but it don't E sell soap, the screens are off and I can feel the hope. What a place our world is at, there's good news too, but you don't

"But, hey," says Degher, "I do write pop lyrics now and

hear about that.

then, too, if you can call them that, like the ones I wrote for the Stark Shay songs for their album Treasures." Wait. Pop lyrics? "Stark Shay is my daughters Cleopatra and Cordelia singing some of my songs. Because I love to hear them sing together,

and because I wanted to hear what my songs sound like with real singers singing them. So I wrote the songs, recorded all the instruments, and then they sang on the tracks when they were home on holidays. It's just me doing my mad-scientist writer-producer thing, with the girls as vocalists. Like that Avicii guy. Except we're all in the same family."

His daughter Cleopatra was 20 when she released her own debut EP in summer 2012. His other daughter Cordelia dropped her debut EP Open Up in 2015. The sisters joined together as Stark Shay in 2020, with a debut single and video, "We Begin Again." The song, which was about climate change and climate activism, released on Earth Day, and was dedicated to "Greta Thunberg and all of the young climate activists out there." Their single "USA/ Mexico Borderline" covers a song from their dad's album

Garage Sale of the Soul. Says Degher, "I'm thankful to be able to record with my dear ones. That it's been nominated for a Best Pop Album San Diego Music Award is beautiful icing on the cake." (Degher himself is no stranger to the SDMAs, having been nominated for his CD The Coyote Cantos.)

Given that the man is so passionate about words, it surprises me to learn that he has also released instrumental surf music. But then, I realize the ocean is a source of inspiration,

and he describes surfing as "pure fun." It's not surprising that many of the themes on his latest record concern the environment - with lyrics more akin to a protest punk album than granola munching pseudo-hippie music — demonstrating a clear passion for protecting the earth and his beloved Encinitas. You can see that approach on the new album in songs like "Open Question," with lyrics like, Is there some central mystery in intermolecular space? Are there multiple dimensions in any given place? What is really lurking at the center of the earth?

How can someone ask how much a human life is worth? Don't bother asking why. These are open questions to the sky.

"I suspect that approach is what's gotten me the critical notice that I have had over the years," says Degher. "Interestingly, most of that praise came before I got a master's degree in poetry-writing in England and taught creative writing for years. So, these days, I'm even more focused on the craft side of things. And, you know, I also write poetry-poetry, without music, which has been published in many literary magazines, and a poetry collection." Sounds much better than sitting around smelling one's

"I'm an artist with my own cannabis company." All this action and smoking and I hadn't made my way inside yet. Stoned was the way of the walk to

Once inside, I ordered a Pabst Blue Ribbon from my bartender Mikey for \$5. As I was enjoying my beer. Bakes was just finishing up his set. Head chef Suga Bear came up to me to say hi and tell me about some of his food. "Fish

Fry Fridays, brisket, and my world-famous chicken wings. I cook soul-based food!" After he walked off, a bewitching platinum-haired woman and her friends sat next to me. We got to talking; it turned out her name was Nori and she also ran a local cannabis company: Smyle Co. Through the high, I was sensing a theme. She invited me to a drum circle on Sundays in Balboa Park. I ordered another Pabst. This time, bartender Travis hooked me up for \$2.

DJ Wake&Bake was spinning old school NWA jams as I wandered about, noting the honeycomb shapes on the walls filled with

greenery and flashing lights that changed colors. If bowling is your thing, there were four bowling lanes, shoe rental included. Closed for the event this evening.

Michael Gabriel and his entourage came on next. After they finished, it was time to head outside for fresh air and whatever else might be fresh out there. Right as I walked out: "Gabriel!" It was Michael Gabriel, holding up a joint and motioning for me to come join him. I noted that he could perform almost any genre of music because of his flow and falsetto voice — even hard rock. He said, "Bring it on!" As we were discussing the future, a big dark figure moseyed up to us: DJ Symphony. I found myself standing with him, Michael Gabriel, and a photographer whose name I didn't catch. At one point, the photographer looked at me and said, "I'm going to give you a hint. The wisdom of Bach

I have often considered myself to be the most awful sort of philistine when it comes to musical taste. That is to say, I have a general misunderstanding of music. I know what I like, but I know not why. I do not have a natural inclination to the nuts and bolts of music. (I might be tempted to say that I'm not interested in the nuts and bolts of anything, but that isn't the case. I dare you to ask me how to swing a golf club. You'll get an entire hardware store full of nuts and bolts. Although, I do base everything on feel as opposed to technical feedback.)

I can perhaps explain this by a look to my lack of musical education at an early age.

Like many in my generation, the movie Amadeus had a profound and, in my case, lasting impact. After seeing it around the age of 16 or 17, I headed over to our dormant upright piano and began to compose. I hunted and pecked out a little tune and gave it some harmonies that I liked. I showed my opus to the choir teacher, who inadvertently laughed out loud at the sight of it. After apologizing, she recommended I take her music theory class, since I clearly had no concept of something called a key signature.

I took the class — and struggled. I took music theory in college, and struggled there as well. Halfway through my second year of theory, I dropped my music

more useful philosophy major. That is where I have remained — a philosophy major who listens to music


My taste in music did not evolve in the structured manner of a student studying an instrument. It evolved based on what I happened to like at the moment and what operas had a chorus in which I could sing. I went from Mozart to Tchaikovsky to Beethoven to Handel to Schubert to Mahler to Puccini to Bruckner, to Wagner, to Victoria to Verdi to Borodin, to Brahms — but never truly to Bach. Until now, 35 years later.

Of course, I knew and liked Bach's popular pieces such as Air on the G String, Jesu Joy of Man's Desiring,

At Flour Atelier, cupcakes are in full bloom

Flour Atelier, 4240 Kearny Mesa Rd #116, San Diego. "Look at those pretty flowers!" I hear, followed by, "Oh! There are pretty cupcakes too!" I'll hear some version of this conversation several times in the fifteen minutes I'm seated outside Flour Atelier, a recently opened shop next door to Mitsuwa Marketplace, the Japanese grocery store in Kearny Mesa.

Customers coming out of the grocery are marveling as they walk past, and I'm marveling with them. I'm trying to take pictures of a half dozen of those cupcakes, and finding it more challenging than usual to resist putting down my camera and just eating everything already.

This new bakery arrived with a compelling backstory. In search of creative outlet, Chrisell "Selly" Gonzales Nguyen spent four years baking photogenic cakes in her garage, and taking orders through Instagram, building a loyal following in the process. One of those followers turned out Evelyn Itsumi Ozburn, a Japanese-American

who expresses herself through floral arrangements. When Selly started posting vacation photos from Japan, Evelyn knew just the café she should visit, and sent a message. That sparked a fast friendship, a creative kinship, and eventually, a business.

Together, they have

launched a brick and mortar bakery, café, and boutique florist, named with both a flower pun and the twenty-five cent word for an artist's studio. But even sweeter than the wordplay at Flour Atelier, are the cupcakes. These include familiar flavors, such as chocolate or carrot cake. But most are unique and beautiful to behold,

often accented by an edible flower.

Even the aforementioned Milo chocolate cupcake (\$8) brings intriguing touches, from the

contrasting bright pink of the blossom perched on top, to the graham cracker crumbs sprinkled over a malted cream frosting made with Milo, a malted and fortified chocolate malt powder, made by Nestle, that we're told is popular throughout Southeast Asia. All the chocolaty satisfaction, with a twist either nostalgic or novel, depending on where you're com-

Flour Atelier's nut-free pastries frequently reference the owners' respective backgrounds and interests in this manner. Gonzales Nguyen

combines a pair of culinary staples from her Filipino culture in the Ube Leche Flan (\$7.50), a cupcake flavored and colored by the archipelago nation's popular, purple sweet potato. It's capped with the shop's signature buttercream, which is topped with a miniature circle of flan, which in turn is topped by an icing flower of ube jam. Conversely, there's Itsumi Yuzu (\$7), relatively understated with a matcha cake, and a single, tiny bloom centered on a spread of yuzu cream, infused with Japanese citrus and peppered with more of the powdered green tea.

If I'm forced to pick a favorite, though, it has to be the Halo-Halo Especial, named for a colorful shaved ice dish layered with colorful sweet treats such as jellies, sweet beans, and fruit. In cupcake form, Flour Atelier delivers a creamy, rainbow polka dot cake made with evaporated milk, filled with flan, iced with ube cream, and topped with sweet beans, cubed jelly, and a candy straw.

It's perhaps the most unexpected delight in a glass counter filled with them. Tough decisions include whether to pair your Mostra roasted coffee with a calamansi or lavender cheesecake tart (\$8); the traditional or ube crème brulee (\$9); or a positively statuesque triple layer white cake (\$10), the flower atop it arranged alongside a strawberry and macaron. Spoiler alert:

fresh berries are tucked between

First-timers may want to steer straight into Flour Atelier's signature puff pastry (\$6), dressed to impress with artfully arranged dollops of cream, berries, merengue, and edible flower, of course.

And I'm here to tell you

eating the flowers is
optional. And when
longtime fans show
up — the ones who
backed the nascent

that — they order custom cakes to accent their most memorable celebrations. It's easy to understand why: they get much the same artistry as you'll find in the cupcakes, but on a

bigger canvas.

Bluefin disappear but should soon return – Good yellowtail bite down south – Lake level lowered at Lake Jennings for repairs

Dock Totals 3/31 - 4/6:

889 anglers aboard 36 half-day to 3-day trips out of San Diego landings over the past week caught 65 bocaccio, 1 calico bass, 20 halibut, 6 lingcod, 4098 rockfish, 90 sand bass, 33 sanddab, 200 sculpin, 17 sheephead, and 262 whitefish.

Saltwater: There was quite a leap in rockfish numbers over the previous week, even with a couple unfishable days for the fleet due to weather on the week of the rockfish opener in U.S. waters. The concentration of efforts

for the deeper-dwelling groundfish eased pressure on the sculpin and sand bass that tend to haunt shallower more inshore areas, so those numbers dropped substantially. This is no real surprise, though going from a few hundred fish to over four thousand is an impressive change, especially with new limits reduced from four fish to two fish for vermillion rockfish.

What was surprising was the disappearance of bluefin tuna from the grounds off northern Baja to the Corner. What looked to be the beginning of an excellent bite, with fish to nearly 200 pounds, turned to *nada* in the span of two days. Given the choppy, rolling seas, which meant fewer boats getting out looking for them, a drop of numbers was expected, but that they seemed to just drop out of sight even for the spotter planes sent out to locate schools is a bit confounding. Some folks think maybe the weather or bait movement drove them deeper, as the bluefin's endothermic system allows it to feed throughout the water column regardless of temperature changes.

That said, very few bluefin were metered, and those that were seemed tight-lipped and did not hit the jigs or baits offered them. As bluefin tend to work their way up the line as spring progresses toward summer — when they can be found further north around the high spots off San Clemente Island out to the Cortez and Tanner banks — maybe they are north of where they were looking. But either way, I have confidence they will show again soon. After all, we didn't get any in the counts until mid-April last year, so this year's bite, which came within striking range of the 1.5-day boats in March, was a bit early. As the seas settle and more trips get out there, we should see them in the counts this week — or at least by the time folks get their taxes done.

The weather also accounts for the lack of yellowtail in the reports, though *pangeros* working out of Ensenada south to past Bahia Asuncion have been getting steady action on the powerful jacks. With that going on, the 1.5- to 3-day trips coming up will probably concentrate their efforts first

on bluefin, and if that produces no action, they'll go coastal and target yellows. Anglers are often more finicky than the fish, and with the bluefin missing in action, ticket sales will probably drop on those trips, but in every season, there will be that trip folks regret not taking. With the prospect of loading up on yellowtail and rockfish if no bluefin are found, it seems likely that only bluefin-or-nothing diehards will await more favorable reports.

Given this year's wet and windy start to the season, that we got on them so early is impressive, and given the bluefin's migratory habits, it's safe to say that they are always out there somewhere within range. Its just a matter of locating a hungry school; then things can turn on a dime. Let's hope for that to happen sooner than later. Until then, you can always head over to fish vendors like Tommy Gomes at Tunaville Market and Grocery and get some fresh steaks, or even try some of his excellent dry-aged fish or fish sausage, made from species he sources fresh from the commercial boats. We San Diegans who love fresh fish on our tables are lucky to have not only an amazing fishery and sportfishing fleet, but also several vendors, including fishmonger Gomes and the folks at the Tuna Harbor Dockside Market

at the Embarcadero on Saturdays.

Freshwater: Trout season is nearing its end here in the San Diego area, though fishing has been steady on the stockers for those targeting them. Lake Jennings will have their last plant of 1500-pounds of rainbow trout on April 15 and just received 1500-pounds this past week, so that is one of many options for those wanting to make the best of the last couple weeks of the season. Also, I should note that they will be dropping the lake level about 23 feet for access to needed repairs this month. With the drawdown, the stockers may be more concentrated, but some shoreline access may be limited.

As per their website notice: "The Helix Water District will temporarily lower Lake Jennings by approximately 23 feet starting in April. The drawdown will facilitate maintenance of the reservoir's outlet tower and allow for the construction of a new pipeline during the summer months to deliver water from the East County Advanced Water Purification Program to the lake starting in 2026. The lowering of the lake may impact access and activities in and around the lake at various times. Please go to hwd.fyi/lake before you visit and read posted signs at the lake for updates regarding water levels and access to the fishing dock, boat dock, boat ramp and shoreline fishing. Helix will restore the lake to full capacity by November."

Whether fishing saltwater or freshwater, they're out there, so go get 'em!

Democracy in Action

 As the November presidential election looms, with incumbent Joe Biden, 81, and former President Donald Trump, 77, squaring off again, some American voters would like to see literally anybody else on the bal-lot – and Literally Anybody Else, of North Richland Hills, Texas, wants to give them that chance. A 35-year-old seventh-grade math teacher and U.S. Army veteran who legally changed his name from Dustin Ebey, the candidate says his goal is to inspire change. "America should not be stuck choosing be-tween the 'King of Debt' (his self-declaration) and an 81-year-old," reads the declaration on Else's campaign website. "Literally Anybody Else isn't just a person, it's a rally cry." NBC-5 Dallas Fort Worth reports that Else needs the signatures of 113,151 registered voters who did not vote in the presidential primary by May 13 in order to run as an independent candidate.

Ssssurvivor!

■ We've heard of dogs and cats going missing, only to turn up at their owners' doorsteps weeks, months or even years later; now we can add snakes to that list. The BBC reported that the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals were recently called to a residence in Spennymoor, County Durham, to rescue a 3-foot-long corn snake atop a garage roof; the snake had escaped a crow that attempted to carry it off. When a neighbor came by to see the rescued critter, she recognized it as her pet snake, Agnus, who had been missing for a year. RSPCA

inspector John Lawson was surprised the snake had survived out in the cold for so long. "The vet believes Agnus had gone into brumation mode, similar to hibernation, and her body had shut down in order to survive," Lawson said. Agnus received treatment for a respiratory infection before being reunited with her owner.

Have It Your Way, Pal

- Some people go to extremes to get a great deal, but on March 31, one disgruntled customer at a Burger King drive-thru in Willowick, Ohio, pulled a firearm on an employee who was trying to give him a discount on his breakfast items. The employee, Howard Vernon, 38, told WOIO-19 News that when he gave the customer his total, the man argued that it should cost more. "I'm, like, trying to explain to him that we had a promotion going on ... and he started cussing and getting all loud," Vernon said. The enraged man drove his gray Honda sedan out of the drive-thru but quickly returned, then stepped out of his car and pointed a gun at Vernon. After threatening him and calling him racial slurs, the man returned to his car and sped away. "It was about some bread and sausage sandwiches at 9 o'clock in the morning on Easter," Vernon said, "and you're that mad that you'd put a gun in somebody's face?" Authorities are still searching for the customer.

Male Pattern Boldness

- Hey, fugitives have feelings, too! After the Avon and Somerset Police posted a wanted no-

tice on Facebook on April 1 describing Daniel Kellaway, a wanted fugitive, as "white, about 5 ft. 9 in., of average build, with brown eyes, receding hairline," Kellaway (or someone claiming to be him) replied, "No need to mention the hairline, guys." A comment posted by the same account the next day reminded the police that Kellaway's birthday had passed since the information was compiled for the notice, and that he was now 29. Kellaway is being sought in connection with driving offenses, criminal damage and threatening behavior, so while social media users got a kick out of Kellaway's comical posts, authorities have warned the public not to approach him and to call authorities if he is spotted.

Ghastly

 After having lurked quietly on the shelves of Harvard's Houghton Library for the better part of a century, the philosophical meditation Des Destinees de l'Ame has undergone a facelift, according to a statement issued by the library in March. The book was acquired by the school in 1934, along with a note explaining the process of preserving human skin. The book's previous owner, an eccentric French bibliophile named Dr. Ludovic Bouland, claimed to have added the "human touch" (read: human skin) to his prize because "a book about the human soul deserved to have a human covering." The cover's origin could not be confirmed until 2014, and NBC News reported that this eventually led to an ethical review in 2023 and the recent decision to rebind the book in something less macabre.

Youth Inaction

— Young people are cutting loose and losing their blues in Cambodia, but rather than embracing the Footloose of it all, the Guardian reports that Prime Minister Hun Manet is cracking down on the source: vehicle owners and operators who replace their cars' standard horns with ones that blast popular tunes. So enticing are these familiar retrains that young Cambodians are literally dancing in the streets, which the prime minister says poses a traffic hazard. He has directed the ministry of public works and transportation, along with Cambodia's police force, to crack down on vehicle operators whose horns emit anything other than the standard honk.

- Students and parents at Alston Ridge Elementary in Cary, North Carolina, have been dealing with a unique carpool annoyance: an aggressive pest of a turkey. WTVD in Durham reports that the bird pecks at cars, windows, people – any perceived threat in "his" territory. "This was a young male turkey who probably was looking for a mate ... and was unable to find one," said Cary Animal Services Officer Beth Wilson. 
